

Brother Delaney, Was Provincial

Brother Harold Michael Delaney, C.F.C., who served as provincial of the Congregation of Christian Brothers' Eastern American Province for 10 years, died Feb. 13 at St. Joseph's Residence, New Rochelle. He was 94.

Brother Delaney was provincial, 1975-1985, and served as chairman of the Iona College Board of Trustees while provincial. He worked at St. Joseph's Residence, New Rochelle, 1993-2005, and served the Eastern American Province as Edmundian co-moderator, 1986-1998; director of development, 1985-1998, and councilor, 1972-1975.

Brother Delaney was headmaster at Iona Preparatory School, New Rochelle, 1967-1975, and principal and

superior at Msgr. Farrell High School, Staten Island, 1961-1967. He served at Power Memorial Academy, Manhattan, 1951-1961, and Cardinal Hayes High School, the Bronx, 1950-1951.

Born in Manhattan, he served in the U.S. Army before entering the Congregation of Christian Brothers in 1949 and professing final vows in 1957.

He earned bachelor's and master's degrees in economics from Fordham University. He received master's degrees in administration and guidance, from Seton Hall University.

His brother, Richard, survives him.

A Funeral Mass was offered Feb. 19 at Holy Family Church, New Rochelle. Burial was in Christian Brothers Cemetery, West Park.

Sister Marie, Was Principal in Manhattan

Sister Marie Cafferty, C.N.D., who was a teacher and principal at St. Columba's School in Manhattan, died Feb. 12 at Lourdes Health Care Center in Wilton, Conn. She was 94.

Sister Marie served at St. Columba as a teacher, 1945-1950, 1952-1957, and as principal, 1967-1972.

She also served in Connecticut, Illinois and Rhode Island.

Born in Providence, R.I., she entered the Congregation of Notre Dame in 1943 and professed final vows in 1949. She earned a bachelor's degree from Manhattan College and a master's from Hunter College.

A Funeral Mass was offered Feb. 16 at Villa Notre Dame in Wilton, Conn. Burial followed at St. Peter's Cemetery in Danbury, Conn.

Sister Mary Ann, Founded Mercy Center

Sister Mary Ann Dirr, R.S.M., the founder of Mercy Center, the Bronx, which provides family outreach, died Feb. 1 at White Plains Hospital. She was 74.

She served as executive director of Mercy Center from 1990 until 2003. There, she helped women recognize the power they have to change their lives and provided programs and services to help them achieve those goals.

She served in administration at Lifeway Ministry, 2010-2015. She was also in parish ministry in the Bronx at Our Lady of Victory, 1989-1990, and St. Pius V, 1985-1989.

A math instructor, she taught at Mercy College, 1983-1985; Our Lady of Victory Academy, Dobbs Ferry, 1974-1980; and St. Clare Academy, Hast-

ings-on-Hudson, 1970-1974.

She also served on the Mercy formation team, 1990-1994.

Born in Queens, she entered the Sisters of St. Francis in 1961 and professed final vows in 1969. She transferred to the Sisters of Mercy in 1980.

She earned a bachelor's degree from the College of Mount St. Vincent and three master's degrees: in math and religious education from Fordham University and in counseling from Long Island University.

She is survived by a sister, Bernadette Dirr, and three brothers: Peter, Joseph and Jack.

A Funeral Mass was offered Feb. 6 at Marian Woods Chapel in Hartsdale. Burial was at Gate of Heaven Cemetery, Hawthorne.

Father Anderson, Brother of Bronx Sister

Father Arthur T. Anderson, a retired priest of the Diocese of Camden, N.J., died Feb. 17. He was 86.

He was the brother of Sister Margaret I. Anderson, O.P., of the Bronx.

He served in parishes across South Jersey as a parochial vicar and pastor and served on the faculty at Catholic high schools.
