2017 WILLIAM C. LASSITER AWARD

SINCE 1988, THIS ANNUAL AWARD HAS GONE TO FIRST AMENDMENT PROPONENTS IN MANY WALKS OF LIFE. SOME OF THE PAST WINNERS INCLUDE CONGRESSIONAL REPRESENTATIVES, STATE LAWMAKERS, PROFESSORS, LAWYERS.

This special award was named in honor of the late William C. Lassiter, a former NCPA general counsel and recognizes members of the public who have made significant contributions in support of open government.

Cody Henson arrived in the General Assembly in January 2017. And that first tour of legislative duty can only be described as one of unsurpassed political bravery.

In short order, he emerged as a strong proponent for a free press and open government. For it was early in the '17 session that bills were filed that would have effectively eliminated the legal notices in newspapers statewide and would have burdened newspaper circulation contractors with additional taxes. The combined effect of these

bills could have crippled readers' right to know about government activity through public notices appearing in newspapers and could have seriously impaired newspaper circulation across the state.

Despite tremendous political pressure brought to bear on state House and Senate members to pass this legislation, Rep. Henson stood firm in opposing the measures. No small feat for a first-year lawmaker, who found himself being asked to pass the bills by ranking members of the House, many in his own political party.

With Henson among a small group of firm opponents to the bills, the original legislation was stopped and later whittled down -- in an October 2017 special session -- to a local bill limited to a single county. And even then, another House member hinted at running a similar bill to apply to part of Henson's home district. Once again, Rep. Henson voice his opposition and stopped an effort that would have hurt his constituents' right to know.
