

Italian Cardinal Paolo Sardi, Served in Vatican Secretariat of State

Italian Cardinal Paolo Sardi, a former official in the Vatican Secretariat of State, died in Rome July 13. He was 84.

Pope Francis, offering his condolences, praised the cardinal's "edifying witness," intelligence and wisdom. His "tireless and careful work" at the Vatican contributed greatly to articulating and sharing the teaching of St. Paul VI, Pope John Paul, St. John Paul II and retired Pope Benedict XVI, he said.

A "good and watchful servant," he was faithful to his episcopal motto, "Esto vigilans," (Be vigilant), the pope said.

State, he coordinated the office that edited papal texts and speeches.

Cardinal Tarcisio Bertone presided over Cardinal Sardi's Funeral Mass July 15 in St. Peter's Basilica and Pope Francis presided over the final commendation and farewell.

Cardinal Sardi had served from 2004 to 2011 as vice chamberlain of the Holy Roman Church, a position that involves special duties when a pope dies. In fact, he was among those present for the ceremony verifying the death of St. John Paul in 2005.

In 2009, Pope Benedict named Cardinal Sardi the pro-patron of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta, a position that involved promoting the spiritual in-

terests of the Knights of Malta and their relationship with the Vatican. He held that role until 2014.

He was born in Ricaldone in northern Italy and was ordained to the priesthood in 1958. After earning a licentiate in theology, he earned a degree in canon law and jurisprudence from the Catholic University of the Sacred Heart in Milan.

He taught moral theology in Turin until 1976, when he was called to the Vatican to work in the Secretariat of State. In 1996, St. John Paul named him an archbishop and an apostolic nuncio with special responsibilities in the Vatican Secretariat of State.

St. John Paul personally ordained him a bishop in 1997 while Pope Benedict elevated him to the College of Cardinals in 2010 when he was 76.—CNS

Brother Hildreth, Vocations Director

Brother John Baptist Hildreth, S.A., who served as a vocations director and a culinary staffer with the Franciscans Friars of the Atonement in Garrison, died July 2 at Cabrini of Westchester Nursing Home in Dobbs Ferry. He was 80.

His last assignment was at Paul Wattson Friary in Toronto, 2003-2010. He was an assistant at Our Lady of the Rosary parish, Yonkers, 1997-2003. He served as vocations director and worked in the retreat department at Graymoor, 1988-1997.

After serving briefly as pilgrimage coordinator at Graymoor, he joined

the staff of Catholic Central Library in London, 1983-1988. He also served in the culinary department of St. Paul Friary at Graymoor and at a novitiate in Cumberland, R.I., 1960-1978.

Born in New Haven, Conn., he entered the Franciscan Friars of the Atonement in 1957 and made final vows in 1965.

He is survived by two brothers, Donald, his twin, and Eugene.

A Funeral Mass as offered July 12 at St. Anthony of Padua Chapel at St. Paul's Friary. Burial was in the friars' cemetery.

Sister Marie Angelique, Teacher

Sister Marie Angelique Dryden, O.P., who taught at six schools in the archdiocese, died July 12 at Dominican Convent in Sparkill. She was 84.

She taught at Aquinas High School, the Bronx, 1980-1984; St. Helena, the Bronx, 1979-1980; Rosary Academy, Sparkill, 1976-1977; Albertus Magnus High School, Bardonia, 1974-1976; St. Theresa, the Bronx, 1957-1958; and St. John Chrysostom, the Bronx, 1955-1957.

She served in preaching ministry in parishes, 1980-1983, and was a member of the sisters' executive team, 1992-1994,

and novice director, 1977-1979.

Born in St. Louis, she entered the Dominican Sisters of Sparkill in 1953 and professed final vows in 1960. She held a master's degree in speech and drama from The Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C.

Her sisters, Sister Frances Dryden, O.P., Sister Constance Eleanor, R.S.C.J., Geraldine, Clotilda, Carmelite and Anne survive her. A Funeral Mass will be offered at 10:30 a.m. Friday, July 19, at Our Lady of the Rosary Chapel, Sparkill. Burial will be in St. Agnes Cemetery, Sparkill.

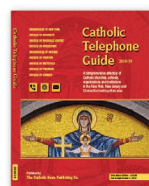
