

the mother of two sons in the 15th century. Her husband was killed and her boys vowed to get revenge by killing the person who took their father away from them. 




This Valedictorian's Story Is Worth Listening To

won't soon forget my first experience with John Evans, and I sincerely doubt that it will be the last time I hear his name. In fact, we all may be hearing from the young man quite a bit in the future.

Editor's Report

I wanted to note his accomplishments before his blindness, not because it isn't significant but because John has a lot more to his story than his disability.

He was only 5 when he lost his sight. For more than a decade, he believed the cause was a rare genetic disorder, which was his official diagnosis. About two and a half years ago, he learned that his blindness was caused by a brain tumor that presses upon his optic nerves.

You might imagine that his new diagnosis raised questions of his mortality, his place in the world and the immortality of his soul. Those aren't my words. They were the way this very devout Catholic expressed his response during our phone conversation late last week.

He can cover a lot of theological ground in a short period of time, telling how he steeped himself in the Old and New Testament and read St. Teresa of Avila's spiritual masterpiece, "Interior Castle," while preparing for his surgery.


He said he spent a number of post-surgery hours in total darkness before light finally began "seeping in."


"My first thought was, will I ever see something as simple as light again?"

He knew that his goal of becoming a professor of medieval literature would be possible only if he could resume his classes amid the trials of his medical exams and testing as he endured the recovery period after surgery.

As Evans explained in his valedictory address, he was not able to accomplish the great things he did by himself. At the crux of his speech, he said, was a theological lesson based on the definition of the Greek word for church, or *ecclesia*.

"We are all called out to help one another, as people helped me for the past four years," he said. "From the students who held a door for me, to students who guided me to class, they proved they CONTINUED ON PAGE 34

Yonkers Teen Constructs Living Rosary for Eagle Scout Project

ttending a Living Rosary service at neighboring Christ the King parish inspired Colin Nowak to create a similar evening for his home parish, St. Anthony's in Yonkers.



we would repeat it regularly."

Father Mastrolia said the rosary is on display for all to see in the church and will be used again when a date is set in October to celebrate the month of the Rosary.

"That would be very exciting," said Nowak of his pastor's plan. "I do want it to be used as much as it can. I put a lot of work into it and want it to be used in the community."

Five percent, or more than two million Boy Scouts, have become Eagle Scouts since 1912, according to the National Eagle Scout Association. To become an Eagle Scout, a Boy Scout must earn 21 merit badges, 13 required and eight elective, and complete a community service project. The requirements must be met before the Boy Scout turns 18.

"What helped is when Zach was working on some of his badges, Colin was able to work on them too and achieve some of his merit badges at a younger age," said the boys' father, Joseph Nowak.

Nowak has to finish his written summary of the project before being interviewed by a board of review, comprised of up to five adult leaders. His recommendation for Eagle Scout will be sent to the Boy Scouts of America in Irving, Texas, for final approval.

Nowak hopes to join his brother and a long list of well-known Eagle Scouts, including Gerald Ford, 38th president of the United States; Steven Spielberg, Academy Award-winning film director; and Bill Bradley, a retired New York Knicks player and former U.S. senator from New Jersey.

"It was a very long process, but we were able to succeed," Nowak said. "I learned a great deal of leadership skills, and it requires a great deal of patience.

"If you concentrate on it, you can work towards your goal, and it's a beautiful thing to see."

were called out to greatness."

The same could be said for Evans, who does not plan to slow down any time soon. He will pursue his master's degree and doctorate in medieval studies at Fordham University, beginning in September.

Evans' family, including his parents Robert and Eileen, and his brother, Brian, who just completed his freshman year at Manhattan, have played a major role in his victories.

His full name is John Casey Solanus Evans, and one of the first things he told me when we spoke was of his grandparents' devotion to the Capuchin friar who will be beatified later this year. His family's parish is Sacred Heart in Yonkers, where Father Solanus served for 14 years in the first part of the 20th century.

He and his family pray regularly at the friar's shrine in their parish church, and he said that he hopes one day to be healed of his blindness through the intercession of Father Solanus.

Evans has a wisdom that is well beyond his years, and a personal faith that is inspiring on many levels. At the close of our conversation, he said his thoughts and prayers were with me that morning and that he would be grateful, no matter if I wrote a sentence, or five, about our exchange.

"My way of reaching other people has been through my story," he said. "If God is the primary storyteller, He tells His story through our lives."

As School Year Ends, Pope Tells Students: Don't Fear Goodbyes, Unknown

ife is a long series of hellos and goodbyes, so don't be afraid to let go of the past; remember old friends, but keep moving and be open to the new, Pope Francis told students as the school year was coming to an end.

"We have to learn to see life by seeing the horizons," not the walls that can make people afraid because they don't know what is on the other side, he told thousands of adolescents during a 45-minute encounter at the Vatican June 2.

The middle-schoolers were part of Communion and Liberation's "The Knights of the Grail" educational initiative.

In the informal Q-and-A, a teen named Marta told the pope how scared she was to be leaving middle school and most of her best friends as they head on to high school next year. "Why do I have to change everything? Why does growing up make me so afraid?" she asked him.

"Life is a constant 'Good morning' and 'Farewell," he said, with the goodbyes sometimes being for for-

"You grow by encountering and by taking your leave," he said. "If you don't learn to say goodbye well, you will never learn how to encounter new people."

This moment of change in life is "a challenge," he said, but "in life we have to get used to this jour-

ney of leaving something behind and encountering something new."

Noting that Marta had used the word "afraid" a number of times in her question, the pope said the risk that comes with the challenge is that fear will render a person immobile, "too serene" and unable to grow.

Those who give up, settle down and say, "Enough," close off the horizons that are out there waiting for them and do not grow.

"Look at that wall? What's behind it?" he asked the girl. "I don't know," she said.

"But if you go outside, to the countryside, what do you see?" he asked. "I see everything," she replied.

"Everything! You see the horizon," the pope said. "We have to learn to see life by looking at the horizons" that are always open, always lying ahead, by meeting new people and having new experiences.

Instead of framing the future with terms like "fear" or "afraid," he added, try "using the word 'a challenge' more," he said.

Remember to call and visit old friends, he said, "but live and journey with the new ones."

When asked how kids their age could change the world when it has so many problems, the pope told them they have to begin with the people and situations in their daily lives.

Think of what happens to a person's hand when sharing a piece of candy, for example: It's open and moves toward the other person, the pope said. Now think of what happens when a person wants to keep that candy for himself or herself: The hand closes up tight and moves away from the other.

One's heart has to be like the hand that is responding in a positive, generous way, not the negative, self-centered approach, he said.

"You can begin to change the world with an open heart," the pope said, and by listening to others, welcoming others and sharing things.


