Steve Ewing Band Kicks Off First Summer Concert

The Hillsboro Summer Concert Series will kick off its first concert of the season this Saturday, June 4, with *The Steve Ewing Band*. The concert will begin at 6 p.m. at Sherwood Forest Campground, 920 City Lake Rd. in Hillsboro.

St. Louis based musician Steve Ewing is best known as the golden voice behind the seven piece powerhouse *The Urge*. Formed in high school back in late 80s, *The Urge* took their eclectic mix of punk, reggae, hip hop, ska and sent a sonic shockwave from the Midwest that can still be felt to this day. State Police To Conduct ACE Patrols During June

Lieutenant Timothy Tyler, District 18 commander, announced that the Illinois State Police (ISP) will conduct Alcohol Countermeasure Enforcement (ACE) patrols during the month of June.

Racheed recruits and trains several fellow terrorists to help him carry out his mission, which will hit some of America's most cherished tourist and historic sites. He contacts Juan Rodregus, a ruthless Mexican drug cartel leader, to help him move the terrorists across the border.

The crossing, hence the name of the book, will travel through a sophisticated tunnel under the Rio Grande River that Rodregus uses to smuggle drugs.

However, the plan is revealed during a routine traffic stop in central Illinois, where Rodregus' top aide is pulled over while carrying over 400 kilos of narcotics. The aide becomes an informant, and the FBI, CIA and DEA overcome multiple challenges to try to thwart the attack.

Clear Springs Cemetery Assn. Meets Sunday

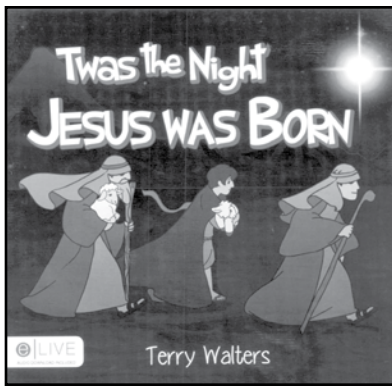

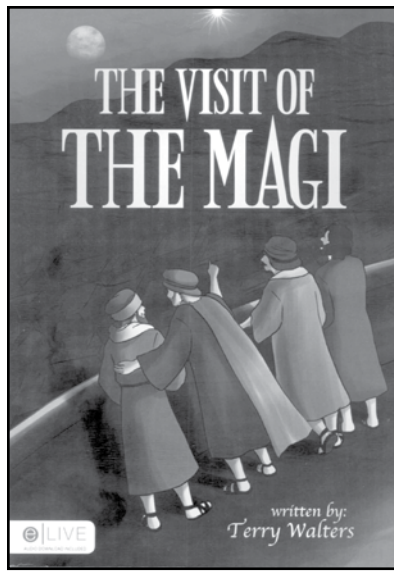

Anyone 18 years or younger is eligible for the free lunch, however, all children ages six and under must be accompanied by an adult. Last year, the program averaged around 25 students each day.

"We know that no child would starve without our program," Dawson said. "But they might not have a chance to always eat healthy things. We hope to teach life-long health habits about nutrition."

This year, they are also working to add more fresh fruits and vegetables to the daily menu. They also offer a backpack program to send food home with the kids over the weekends.

Lunch is served every day on the campus at Hillsboro Area Hospital, located at 1200 E. Tremont Street. In addition to the meal, the hour-long session also includes daily activities.

Children who attend will have the chance to swim at Fusion Fitness and Aquatics two days a week, which Dawson says is always a popular day to attend.

Other activities include a library day, where Beckmeyer teachers have volunteered to come in and read to students and Merle Imler will teach keyboarding skills one day.

Children will also have the chance to participate in service days, which include helping in the Hillsboro Community Garden this summer, and working with the Pack A Hope Box organization, which helps refugees in other countries.

Free transportation is also provided to and from the program on a Hillsboro School District bus. The program provides funding to the school district to pay for the transportation costs.

Pick-up times include 11:25 a.m. at Hillsboro High School, 11:30 a.m. at the Taylor Springs Community Center, 11:35 a.m. at the Beckmeyer gym doors, 11:37 a.m. at Dearborn and Oak streets, 11:39 a.m. at the apartment complex by Lomas del Sol, 11:42 a.m. at the Red Rooster Inn,

11:45 at Central Park Pool, 11:48 at Douglas Street, 11:52 at the Hillsboro Housing Authority and 11:58 at Hillsboro Area Hospital.

A complete list of those pick-up times is available on both the Hillsboro Area Hospital and the Hillsboro School District websites.

Dawson said she has the schedule of volunteers pretty well set for the summer, but she could always use some substitute helpers. Members of the Hillsboro Area Hospital Junior Board also help out each day to make the program a success.

"We couldn't do this without the support of the hospital," Dawson said. "They really help keep it going."

Although the cost of the food is covered throughout the summer through a grant, donations are always needed to help cover the cost of transportation and other items. Donations marked for the Summer Lunch Program may be sent to the Hillsboro Area Health Foundation at 1200 E. Tremont, Hillsboro, IL 62049.

Raymond Remembers On Memorial Day

Panhandle area residents gathered Monday, May 30, in Raymond Memorial Park to remember those brave men and women who gave their lives in the effort to keep America free.

Following welcoming messages from Phil Hampton and Mayor Denny Held, and an invocation by Aaron Myers, guest speaker Kendal Elvidge took the podium. Elvidge is the Lincolnwood Junior/Senior High Principal.

"I firmly believe that Panhandle School District does a fine job

of educating our youth," Elvidge said. "However, we need to do more to educate students about the true meaning of days like today, about self-sacrifice and what it means to be a true hero."

He then spoke about the history of Memorial Day and shared the story of Staff Sergeant Robert Mayfield, an Army Air Force B-17G radio operator. While returning to their base after a bombing run Mayfield's crew attempted to make an emergency landing near Sheffield, England, and as their plane came through heavy fog, the crew realized they were too close to the village. In an attempt to avoid the loss of civilian lives, the pilot navigated the plane away from the village and into a woody area killing all members of the crew. Their self-sacrifice is still honored in the community of Sheffield today.

"This is the true meaning of Memorial Day. This is the true

meaning of self-sacrifice. These are true heroes," Elvidge said. "Day after day, year after year, the men and woman of our armed forces sacrifice their own freedom to project ours. They leave their home, their loved ones, their lives here at home to protect our freedom and the freedom of others around the world. Many of them never return home to those lives they left behind. Today, we gather to recognize these soldiers, pay homage to their sacrifice, and remember that all things in life come at a cost."

"Sadly the cost of freedom is that of human life. So today, Memorial Day, I say thank you to the men and woman of our armed forces who have given their lives here at home and abroad for our freedom," he continued. "On beaches, open plains, deserts, in jungles, on the sea and in the air above foreign land these heroes paid the ultimate price."

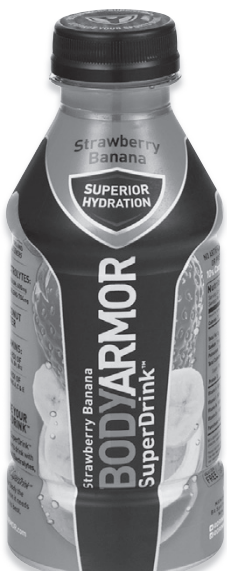

Accidents

Carlock Reports For 3-Year Prison Sentence

He will serve a one-year mandatory supervised release period following incarceration.

Carlock was charged on Dec. 3, 2013, after members of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office discovered an indoor cannabis grow, scales, suspected cannabis sativa plants, several bags of packaged cannabis and an amount of methamphetamine in some outbuildings at 20293 North 23rd Avenue in Rural Nokomis.

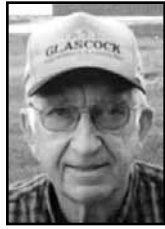
