Town Republicans sweep

Entire Brookhaven Town board re-elected for first four-year term

Brookhaven Town Republicans celebrated yet another year of victory at the Stereo Garden in Patchogue late Tuesday night. Later that evening, Suffolk County Republican chairman Jesse Garcia announced the winners.

All Brookhaven Town incumbents were re-elected to their first four-year term after a referendum passed last year changing the term from two years to four.

"Let's kick off this party with our hometown. An amazing sweep here in Brookhaven," Garcia said, announcing the big win. "With well over 60 percent, Edward Romaine!"

Supervisor Ed Romaine was re-elected to his fourth full term with a total of 51,155 votes, making up just over 61 percent of the vote, over his opponent William Ferraro III. Earlier that day, Romaine started off with

his usual breakfast at the Moriches Bay Diner.

"Thank you Brookhaven for this over-

Women are veterans, too

Suffolk County forms first-ever Women Veterans Advisory Board

Hide no more. Women veterans finally have a voice at their own table—in Suffolk County—with the latest installment of the Women Veterans Advisory Board.

"As chairwoman of the Legislature's Veterans Committee, I work to ensure that the voices of all of our veterans are heard and their concerns are addressed," said Legis. Susan A. Berland, explaining the reasoning behind forming the new board. "I sponsored this resolution to provide female veterans with a protected space to discuss issues that pertain to them. I look forward to the great work this advisory board will to do on behalf of Suffolk County's female veterans."

Patchogue resident and Marine veteran StaceyAnn Castro-Tapler was recruited by Berland (D) to help form the new board, after she couldn't figure out why there was a lack of women veteran participation.

Castro-Tapler, who by day works closely with veterans at the Economic Opportunity Council of Suffolk Inc., said the answer was simple: women veterans will not self-identify as veterans, especially in front of an all-male board.

"The entire veteran organization has been built men-centric. Not that it's a bad thing, but we have this demographic of women who aren't getting the services they need," she said, explaining that women weren't going to attend without their own board. "They are tired of explaining and justifying their needs, as women."

Now, she is on a mission to help drag women veterans out from hiding. She

whelming re-election, and thank you for re-electing our entire team," he said to the cheering crowds. "We are going to go back to work tomorrow. The reason we ran is so that we can govern, make Brookhaven move forward, so we can fix the finances and get rid of the zombie homes, and do the things necessary to build a better town and the things that are right for the Town of Brookhaven."

The mostly Republican board was held with only one incumbent Democrat, Valerie Cartright, re-elected in a close race earlier in the night against Republican Tracy Kosciuk, who fell short by over 2,000 votes.

Also, as part of the town Republicans' almost-clean sweep, councilman Neil Foley (District 5) was re-elected with just over 60 percent of the vote. Councilman Michael Loguercio (District 4) was also re-elected with just over 50 percent of the vote, and councilman Dan Panico (District 6) was re-elected as well with an overwhelming 72 percent.

"Patchogue! I can't thank you enough," said Foley on stage addressing the crowds.

Earlier on Election Day, Foley woke up bright and early to vote and made phone calls reminding people to do so; then he and his family had dinner before heading to the party. Loguercio started early as well, voted, and then headed out with his volunteers. Panico spent the day with his 5-year-old son Grant, who was with him to celebrate later in the evening as well.

Republican councilmembers in surrounding districts, Kevin J. LaValle and Jane Bonner, also won re-election, both with over 60 percent of the vote.

Highway superintendent Daniel Losquadro was re-elected by just over 58

percent, with 48,624 votes, against Democrat Anthony R. Portesy, who came in with over 41.5 percent, 34,514 votes.

"We can now begin to plan long term and I certainly will continue to move Brookhaven forward," he promised.

Legislative win

Suffolk County Legis. Rudy Sunderman (District 3) was re-elected for his second term with just over 62 percent of the vote (6,938 votes) against his Democratic opponent Daryl Edelstein. Earlier that day, he responded to a structure fire, had breakfast with his family and voted at the Mastic Fire Department.

"I have to thank my family, friends and the community that came out and supported me," he said. "I'll tell you, you can take any shot that's given to you, but it is about my community and it has always been about my community."

Steve Bellone was re-elected to a third term as Suffolk County executive, defeating Republican challenger John Kennedy, who earned 55.42 percent and 43.38 percent of the

vote, respectively. Bellone said in his victory speech at IBEW Local 25 in Hauppauge that he looks forward to working together across the aisle and improving on the progress Suffolk has made.

"It's amazing what a \$2-million campaign full of lies can do," said Kennedy, bitter about his loss. "I want to thank everybody and chairman Garcia for putting his faith in me."

Democrat Ed Hennessey won a seat on the bench of the first district court. Democrats also won six seats on the 10th district Supreme Court; those candidates were endorsed by the Republican and Conservative lines as well. Andrea Schiavoni and Victoria Gumbs Moore won seats as family court judges.

Dems keep county

Suffolk County executive re-elected to a third term; Calarco takes over 58 percent

Democrats had a bittersweet night on Tuesday, as they kept control of the Suffolk County Legislature and executive branch, but lost races in Brookhaven and Islip towns.

Steve Bellone was re-elected to a third term as Suffolk County executive, defeating challenger John Kennedy, who earned

55.42 percent and 43.38 percent of the vote, respectively. Bellone said in his victory speech at IBEW Local 25 in Hauppauge Tuesday that he looks forward to working together across the aisle and improving on the progress Suffolk has made.

In the county Legislature, deputy presiding officer Rob Calarco defeated challenger Dominick Thorne in District 7, earning 58.86 percent of the vote.

"Thank you to everyone for the incredible support," Calarco wrote on Facebook after the results were announced. "Tonight we celebrate and tomorrow we go back to work serving the residents of the 7th [District]!"

Prior to the results, Calarco went through his annual Election Day routine. One of his first stops was grabbing a coffee at the Patchogue 7-Eleven, then headed to his favorite breakfast joint in town, Peter's Luncheonette, with his wife, Laura, and three kids, an Election Day tradition, said Laura Calarco. At about 8:30 a.m., he voted at Patchogue Knights of Columbus, bringing along his good-luck charm and friend Matt, who has been with him every Election Day, and his family. Then he knocked on doors for the remainder of the day.

In Brookhaven Town, Democrats lost key races in hard-fought campaigns for supervisor and superintendent of highways. Challenging supervisor Ed Romaine was Will Ferraro, who earned 37.42 percent of the vote. Challenging superintendent Dan Losquadro was Anthony Portesy, who earned 41.51 percent of the vote. The newly elected incumbents will now have four-year terms for the first time in over 15 years, due to last year's referendum, which approved the change.

"Losing sucks," Ferraro said in a video posted to his Facebook channel. "It's never a good feeling to lose a race, especially when you put everything into it."

In Districts 4, 5, and 6 in Brookhaven, Democrats lost to Republican incumbents. The closest race was in District 4, where challenger Cheryl Felice earned 46.61 percent of the vote to incumbent Michael Loguercio's 53.33 percent.

"I'm at a loss for words right now because our 10-month campaign concluded tonight with us coming up a little short," Felice said in a statement online. "There are so many people who worked so hard for this win, but it just wasn't meant to be."

In the 5th District, challenger Andrea Stolz lost to incumbent Neil Foley, earning 38.84 percent of the vote. And in District 6, challenger James Gentile earned only 27 percent of the vote against incumbent Dan Panico. Valerie Cartwright remains the only elected Democrat in Brookhaven Town, after being re-elected in the 1st District, which covers northwest Brookhaven.

"It's really difficult putting your name out there; they deserve a big round of applause," said Suffolk Democratic chairman Rich Schaffer Tuesday.

Democrat Ed Hennessey won a seat on the bench of the 1st District court. Democrats also won six seats on the 10th District Supreme Court, though those candidates were endorsed by the Republican and Conservative lines as well. Andrea Schiavoni and Victoria Gumbs Moore won seats as family court judges.

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

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

'Tommy'

50th anniversary concert at Patchague Theatre

"Tommy," the electrifying album released in 1969 by The Who, will be celebrated by Patchogue Theatre for the Performing Arts as a 50th anniversary concert on Saturday, Nov. 16.

Wonderous Stories will perform the heart-pumping rock opera about Tommy Walker, a deaf, dumb and blind boy who becomes a pinball champion and religious leader


"It's not the first rock opera," explained PTPA executive director Gary Hygom. "Sorrow' by Pretty Things was the first in 1968, but it went nowhere. The Who got recognition for creating rock opera and that genre. At the time, Peter Townshend [The Who's co-founder and principal songwriter] was known for creating short operatic pieces. The band did the album before the film [1975], then someone adapted it for a Broadway rock opera [1993]."

Broadway actors Justin Matthew Sargent ("Spiderman," "Rock of Ages," "Jesus Christ Superstar"), Michael Wartella ("Charlie and the Chocolate Factory," "Tuck Everlasting," and "Wicked") and Lana Gordon ("Chicago," "Jesus Christ Superstar," and "The Lion King") will pump up the concert vocally.

Gordon was the hit entertainment at PTPA's recent cocktail party.

(She sang "All That Jazz." Woooeeee!)

Gordon will perform "The Acid Queen," the raucous Pete Townshend song. The album's other iconic melodies include "Pinball Wizard," "Smash the Mirror," "I'm Free"

and "Sensation."

"There will be more character to the vocals," Hygom explained. "Lana will act the part [of 'Acid Queen'] and kick the hell out of it."

Another Broadway star, yet to be announced, will join the roster.

Hygom has partnered with Broadway producer Stephen DeAngelis again, who's known for his PTPA Broadway concert series. "He's not only casting it, but he's directing it," he said.

Hygom said he tried to obtain rights for a "The Who's Tommy in Concert" musical, but "it's the 25th anniversary of the Broadway show and they're bringing it back," he said. (Playbill just announced a new production of "The Who's Tommy" will open on Broad-

way in 2021.)

So instead, this concert will offer the exact lineup of the album's song list with Broadway stars and Wonderous Stories belting it out. "I reached out to musical director Tommy Williams and he connected me to Wonderous Stories," Hygom explained. "I've worked with several of the band members and the concert idea started with pulling them on board." Hygom said there would be 10 musicians.

Wonderous Stories, a kick-butt Long Island band, has five core members: Kenny Forgione (guitars, bass vocals), Kevin McCann (guitar, bass), Mark Bonder (keyboard, vocals), Ricky Martinez (drums) and Tommy Williams (guitar, bass, vocals, keyboards)

Hygom said New York City rehearsals have been scheduled; the whole show will be rehearsed the full day leading up to the night performance.

The thing I'm really excited about is creating concerts like this one that people won't see anywhere else. It's a one-night experience."

Pablo Cruise to rock it

Top pop/rock band's first Suffolk County gig

Pablo Cruise, the band originally from

Pablo Cruise, the band originally from San Francisco that exploded on the pop rock scene in the mid 1970s with top ten hits along with chart-busting albums will perform their exuberant music at Patchogue Theatre for the Performing Arts on Sunday, Nov. 10 at 8 p.m. The band includes founding members Cory Lerios (keys, vocals), Steve Price (drums, percussion), and David Jenkins (guitar, vocals), along with newer members Robbie Wyckoff (vocals, percussion) and Larry Antonino (bass, vocals).

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Pablo Cruise band members Robbie Wyckoff, Larry Antonino, David Jenkins, Cory Lerios and Steve Price will perform at Patchogue Theatre for the Performing Arts on Nov. 10.

The group established a highly successful legacy from 1975 to 1985, touring about 200 gigs a year, appearing on hit television programs, and becoming the first rock group to play a major casino showroom as well as The Grand Ole Opry. In 2005 they rejoined after successfully veering into other ventures. Founding member Cory Lerios spoke with the *Long Island Advance* by phone.

Long Island Advance: The website excerpt about your first album, Pablo Cruise, and sticking a huge gorilla in the forefront of the album cover with no band members was pretty funny, an obvious hint at your infectious playing.

Cory Lerios: Well, there's a little back

story here. We took a long break and then got back together. We had a lot of great songs and a great fan base. We're pretty good friends and like to spread joy and fun in our shows, especially in this time of turmoil. It's our mission. So there's a lot of comedy in our performances, and we engage the audience. When we leave, the whole place is up and everyone is smiling.

LIA: Your band started in San Francisco. Where is everyone now?

CL: Three of the original five live in the L.A. area; I'm in Thousand Oaks; two are in Woodland Hills. Of the other two, one lives in San Diego and Montana and one lives between Nashville and San Francisco. But

with communication the way it is, we're in touch all the time. We'll do about 45 shows a year in the U.S. now, which is enough. We all have families and good home lives, and I'm grateful we still have Pablo Cruise.

LIA: The band has had a lot of high points. Which one did you say, "Oh my God, I think we made it!"

CL: When we broke Elvis Presley's attendance record at The Sahara Tahoe Casino. We were pretty much at the peak of our success. We'd just got back from the sellout tour in Japan. When those Sahara Tahoe tickets for our three-day performances went on sale, they sold out in an hour.

LIA: Cory, you've written and produced countless theme music and underscores, including for the TV show "Baywatch" and the hit theme from Disney's "Kim Possible," as well as other prestigious endeavors. As a kid, what did you play musically?

CL: Actually, we just rereleased all the "Baywatch" episodes in January, repurposing the music and songs. It's a pretty big deal, because new networks are screaming for content. For my musical background, I grew up in Palo Alto and took to the piano at age 6 even before I took lessons and then took them on and off, and in college studied with a really inspirational teacher. My mom was a retired singer; she was a contender in the Judy Garland genre, and my dad was a businessman and played guitar.

LIA: Describe your concerts.

CL: A lot of the fans that come out are die-hard fans. Many fly in, and we don't take it for granted. Every show is a little different, and we play from 90 minutes to two hours and our audiences are up standing and dancing the last quarter of the show. We're looking forward to playing Patchogue. ■

Vets Day ceremony to take place at 10:30 a.m. at the Four Corners

Veterans Day is unique in the fact that it is the only holiday that celebrates, honors and recognizes all living veterans regardless of whether they were combat or non-combat vets, women or men, across all branches of service.

This year, the Patchogue United Veteran Organization, including the American Legion Post 269, AMVETS Post 111 and

the VFW Post 2913, will host its annual ceremony on Monday, Nov. 11 at the Four Corners in Patchogue Village, starting at 10:30 a.m. Directly following at 11 a.m., a second round of medallions will be unveiled honoring the three veteran organizations. Last year, a medallion for the five branches of service was unveiled and installed at the Four Corners in front of Arooga's.

The stones were purchased earlier this year as part of the Lights on Veterans program, in addition to a grant secured by Legis. Rob Calarco (D-Patchogue). The total cost for all four medallions was about \$8,000. The remaining three medallions, to be unveiled on Monday, will be temporari-

Third annual Veterans Day commemoration

The third annual Veterans Day Commemoration of the new headstones — replaced from the Civil War on — will take place on Veterans Day, Nov. 9, at Patchogue's Lakeview Cemetery.

For the past three years, the Cemetery Restoration Committee of Patchogue has worked with the U.S. Veterans Administration to replace damaged or missing headstones for a number of Civil War veterans, and raised funds to professionally re-set the stones in the historic Lakeview cemeteries. Three new Civil War stones and two restored Revolutionary War veterans stones will be unveiled in this year's ceremony at 11 a.m. The headstone re-dedication ceremony will be hosted by the CRC and conducted by the Richard J. Clark Camp 210, Sons of Union Veterans of Patchogue, re-enactors of the 67th NY Infantry who will render funeral honors with a rifle salute in period uniform, and Mike Amodio, past commander of the VFW and AMVETS, who will play taps.

Color guards for the ceremony will be provided by Patchogue veterans' groups from VFW Jayne-Lattin Post 2913, American Legion Patchogue Post 269, AMVETS Hammond Biggs Post, and scouts from Boy Scout Troop 540 and Cub Scout Pack 543.

CRC is part of the Greater Patchogue Foundation, a 501c3 not-for-profit organization. CRC has worked for a number of years to restore and maintain the property at the corner of West Main Street and Waverly Avenue, commonly called Lakeview Cemetery, that contains five historic cemeteries dating to the late 1700s.

ly installed at the Veterans Memorial Park on South Ocean Avenue with the hopes of obtaining grant money to move them permanently to the four corners.

According to VFW commander Dave Rogers, the stones cannot be placed at the four corners just yet. The entire curb will have to be replaced to meet ADA compliancy, a costly project.

"Veterans Day is celebrated on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, but

it really is a celebration of all veterans," Rogers said, hoping people will come out to show their support.

Restaurants like the Village Idiot and others will be offering discounted or free meals for veterans. Another way people can help, Rogers said, is to donate to the local veteran organizations to help them maintain their many community service programs.

Local residents, first responders, veterans, and elected officials came out on Saturday to honor Pfc. Anton "Tony" Albert Bugala by dedicating a street corner in his

Bugala was born on July 6, 1921 in a tenement building in Manhattan. His parents emigrated to the United States around the turn of the century from Slovakia. He had eight siblings. In the early 1930s, his parents moved to Dunton Avenue in East Patchogue, to a small family farm where they added electricity and indoor plumbing to the grounds. In 1936, Bugala graduated from St. Francis de Sales Elementary

School in Patchogue, and eventually was a member of the first Bellport High School graduating class in 1938.

At 19, Bugala enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and completed training at Parris Island in 1941. In World War II, Bugala fought six battles in five weeks of early fighting against Japanese forces on the British Solomon Islands. Bugala was a heavy machine gunner with the E Company of the First Marine Division. During the Battle of Edison's Ridge on Sept. 13, he suffered mortal wounds and died a day later. He was

21 and buried with honors on Guadalcanal. It would be a month before the Navy was able to report his death, though his family knew his fate once his

After the war, Bugala's remains were removed and relocated to the National Cemetery in Pinelawn in 1948. His niece, Anita, who was only 10 years old, remembers the day as "snowy, cold, and very sad," according to his family. He is laid to rest next to his two brothers, John and Steve and nephew Billy. ■


Eugene King Krakaur Jr.

'Parasite'

"Parasite," written and directed by Bong Joon-Ho ("Snowpiercer," "Okja"), is by far one of the best films I have seen, not just in the last decade, but in my lifetime. Coming from South Korea at a time when the zeitgeist of economic class upheaval is prevalent in just about every country in the world, the title raises a question in every alarming moment in this film. Does it refer to the working class getting a free ride off the wealthy? Or is it just the other way around? As Bong says in creating this character-driven satire, "Even I was surprised as I was writing."

Opening with a shot of socks hanging in front of a basement window in the slums of a South Korean city, a poor family of four struggles to win a pizza box-folding contest. They leave their window open to take advantage of a street fumigation that brands their clothing with a horrific smell. As they lose the contest, the son, Kim Ki-woo (Woo-sik Choi), talks the Pizza manager into hiring him to replace an empty position. Fortunately enough for him, a friend Min (Seo-joon Park) steps in to present his family with a box containing a rock that carries charms of wealth, a metaphor that hangs over the rest of the story. Min pleads with Kim Ki-woo to take his position as a tutor for the daughter of a wealthy family, something Bong himself did as a college student. Min is in love with his student and can't stand the thought of anyone else "slavering" over her.

And so the scam begins. Kim Ki-woo changes his name to "Kevin," presents himself to the beautiful gullible matron of the rich family, Park Yeon-kyo (Yeojeong Jo) and lessons begin with love-smitten Park-dahye (Ji-s Jung). Recognizing the adorable, out-of-control,

spoiled child, Park Da-song (Hyunjun Jung), Kevin convinces Park Yeon-kyo to hire an art teacher to nourish his amazing artistic talent. Enter his sister Kim Ki-Jung "Jessica" (So-dam Park) as art teacher. She's the kind of free spirit that when a monsoon rain floods their basement quarters, as the waters rise in Titanic style, she digs in the ceiling above the toilet for a hidden pack of cigarettes for a last smoke. Yet she is able to train the spoiled child to march around like a polite little buddha. She scams in a family chauffeur replacement, her father Kim Ki-taek (Kang-ho Song), who always has a plan, but soon realizes that the best plan is to have no plan at all; instead, he depends on the unpredictable survival techniques of his children. It's all about family love. He asks the wealthy father, Dong-ik Park (Sun-Kyun Lee), about his wife, "But you love her?" And Dong-ik answers with a long pause, followed by a telling giggle. It's not about love.

Jessica discovers the current housekeeper is allergic to peaches, sets her up to appear that she has tuberculosis, and scams in her mother Moon-qwang (Jeong-eun Lee), who is swift to adjust to her new position. While preparing a meal in one hand, she kicks the old housekeeper Kim Chung-sook (Hye-jin Jang) down the hidden basement stairs with one blow. Chung-sook came unexpectedly to rescue her husband, who has been hiding in the basement for many years with the job of turning on and off the lights as a human light sensor as the wealthy patrons obliviously wander around above.

Brilliantly filmed by cinematographer Hong Gyeong-Pyo with artistic direction by Lee Ha Jun, this is satire at its best, where tragedy is played at high speed in a plot that has so many unpredictable and surprising twists and turns you find yourself on a rollercoaster ride in a house of mirrors. Do you dare to stop and self-reflect? Bong dares you to do so before pulling the carpet out from under you with a laugh, as you tumble toward the next scary awakening. I not only encourage you to partake in this feast of a satire. I dare you.

'Laughter on the 23rd Floor'

Neil Simon has been too pigeonholed. Yes, his plays are riotously funny. Yes, his comebacks (otherwise known as "one-liners") are among the most brilliant in the world. Yes, Simon's situations have proved that he is a worthy successor to Molière. Ah, but Simon's characters are far from stereotypical—the unique quality of each of his characters sets them firmly apart from the stereotypical. Whether or not all their lines are funny, the audience must take them as individuals, highly distinguishable from one another.

Nowhere is this truer than in "Laughter on the 23rd Floor." The characters are indeed all funny, mainly because they are almost all comedy writers, whose relationships to one another somehow magically transfer to the overwhelming zaniness of their scripts. (I don't think I'm the only old-timer who remembers laughing loudly at the sketches for "Your Show of Shows.") Neil Simon, having written for Sid Caesar, is a graduate of that school of hilarious insanity. However, his merits are not those of the satirists. He is the crown prince of funny, breathing characters, almost all of whom know what to say, as surely as do Shakespeare's people.

My attendance yesterday at the Playcrafters production of "Laughter on the 23rd Floor" found me bellowing, giggling, guffawing, and howling at character after character, line after line. Rather than "rank" the performances, I will refer to them "in order of appearance." There is first the gifted young



man Christian Leigh playing Lucas (is he Woody Allen?), who comments on the job and his fellow writers with sardonic affection. He utilizes just the right tone. Next is Milt, played with expert timing by Dan Love, last seen as Nicholas in Playcrafters' "Over the River and Through the Woods." One comes next to John Simpson as the Russian-accented Val. Simpson is truly a professional who swallowed this part whole. What is special about his performance, besides the humor, is the genuine projection of his fear of the rampant McCarthyism that threatened in particular the entertainers

of the time. Bryan McGowen, who plays Brian, the only Irishman in the lot, displays a professionalism that has resulted from his many years of roles, funny and evil, all over Long Island. Dan Roehrig, a newcomer to Playcrafters but a veteran of 25 years of acting, plays Kenny with a smooth assurance that is convincing in a comedy writer role. Christine A. Cavagnet plays the only female writer, Carol, in such a way as to support women in their desire to be considered as professional as men. Simon has given her a rousing speech, which she proclaims with amazing passion, reminding the

men that her gender has nothing to do with her equality as a writer. Matthew O'Connor, who has given Playcrafters Harry Brock in "Born Yesterday" and has been on Broadway and in films (including a recent role in Scorsese's "The Irishman") for years, does magnificently as the troubled and ingenious Max Prince (modeled on Sid Caesar?). Helen, the troubled secretary and writer wannabe, is played convincingly by Jessica Howard. Finally, there is Rick Peters, playing Ira, who seems to be the last word in hypochondria. He executes the overwrought role with gusto.

I would be greatly remiss if I did not mention the director, Bob Kaplan, who has directed — expertly — many plays and musicals all over Long Island. "Laughter" has proved him a continued master of dramatic arts.

Taking in the view of the set, one is instantly transported to a well-worn writers' office during the early 1950s. The set represents the combined efforts of Jim Hazard, Annette Maillard, Chrisa Burke, Kevin Clyne, Vincent Rasulo, Skip Pope, Catherine Clyne, and Laurie Atlas. Costuming by Kathy Loizides further enhances the characters' realism. Playcrafters veterans Joseph Skelly and Dennis Conroy do their usual expert jobs on lighting and sound.

For a delightful two hours of raucous banter and great one-liners, go to the Boys and Girls Club of the Greater Bellport Area.

Performances are on Friday, Nov. 8 and Saturday, Nov. 9 at 8 p.m. and Sunday, Nov. 10 at 3 p.m. ■

'Time Stands Still'

"Time Stands Still" explores the mental and physical damage suffered by journalists in war zones, which has only gotten worse since the play was written. Authored by Yale professor and Pulitzer Prize-winner Donald Margulies, this powerful drama is said to be his best work yet.

The story of Sarah (Lisa Meckes), a photographer, and James (Mike Cesarano), a journalist, unfolds around their past reporting from the world's deadliest war zones. Their worlds are turned upside down when a bomb in Iraq sends Sarah home with a new perspective on life, shaking up their lives and forcing them to recognize their addiction to the adrenaline and chaos, as well as to distinguish the importance of their work from the importance of their lives. James now looks forward to resuming a more peaceful life, helping Sarah recuperate, while she desperately wants to recover quickly, so she can return to the frontline.

Attempting to dissuade her is the couple's longtime friend and editor, Richard (Michael Shanahan), who shows up with his new and much younger girlfriend Mandy (Tara Shaw), an event planner.

Director Sister Grace Rowland achieves perfection of dramatic tension in this production by finely tuning moments of conflict among the actors. Rowland brings a talented cast of four to the stage for moments of volatile compassion that erupt with a fierce force throughout the show, demonstrat-

ing great emotional intensity. Interactions between the characters are always driven with clear purpose and intention.

The story is formed around Sarah and James's long romantic involvement as it weaves their lives together through the war-torn and devastated countries of the world. Meckes and Cesarano are two convincing actors with raw emotions and a keen sense of dramatCourtesy photo ic work. The relationships that they share not just with each other, but with the other two actors, make them truly multi-dimensional and complex.

As counterparts and catalysts, Shanahan brings a lusty energy and ample humor to the couple's shared editor and friend Richard, and Shaw offers a surprisingly grounded take on Richard's young, unworldly girlfriend Mandy. She

is touching and funny as the woman who can't understand what drives Sarah and James to live their lives on the edge.

Meckes's performance is stunning. Her steely determination grounds the production, and her body language is convincing at every stage of her recovery. Meckes superbly conveys Sarah's ambitions, drive and unwavering commitment to what she does, which sends shockwaves out to the audience. Her partner, James, is less convincing. Cesarano's take on James is at its best when he is supporting Sarah. He is moving as a man who feels his significant other pulling away from him. His outrage, especially in Act II, rings false, as that of an actor playing someone who is angry.

The attractive set, created by Frank Grabowski and the St. Joseph's College production class, replicates a comfortable loft apartment in Brooklyn, which makes you wonder why James and Sarah would want to leave home.

"Time Stands Still" is compelling in its truth about the resonance of battle trauma. The performances of these actors are moving and riveting and will leave you with a good deal to contemplate, capturing the essence of lives torn apart and put back together and everything in between. It is said that a picture is worth a thousand words, but this picture asks, "At what cost?"

A celebration for the trees

Long Island Pine Barrens exceeds preservation goal

Long Island Pine Barrens Society executive director Richard Amper made his official announcement last week that 57,676 acres of the Pine Barrens Core and 52,000 acres of the Compatible Growth Area have been protected, at a location that illustrates protection the best: the 2,550acre Wertheim National Wildlife Refuge in Shirley. Twenty-five years after New York State passed the 1993 Pine Barrens Protection Act - legislation led by Assemblyman Steve Englebright (D-Setauket) along with NYS Sen. Ken LaValle (R-C-I Port Jefferson) — the nonprofit's preservation goal has been met and exceeded, he said. Amper was joined by Englebright and other officials including Suffolk County Planning, Central Pine Barrens Commission executive director John Pavacic, Riverhead supervisor Laura Jens-Smith, and John Turner, one of the Pine Barrens Society's original founding members. While the nonprofit celebrated its goals, preservation goals still continue, Amper and Turner said. Turner commented that Brookhaven Town had passed a resolution last week to preserve a hole in the donut property owned by Bob Tucci in Eastport, a key Pine Barrens parcel. Another area they were hoping to address was some of the EPCAL property in Calverton. ■

Raimond Street zombie house demo

On October 28, Supervisor Ed Romaine (right) and Councilman Michael Loguercio (left) were at 76 Raimond Street in Yaphank for the demolition of an abandoned "zombie house" that had become dilapidated after many years of neglect by the owner. The property was in violation of numerous Brookhaven Town building codes and the source of resident complaints. The house was demolished in accordance with Chapter 73 of the Town Code which provides a "fast track" to rid neighborhoods of unsafe structures. The cost of demolition and debris removal is the responsibility of the property owner, and the Town places a lien on the property that is then placed on the tax bill. The County reimburses the Town and then they collect the money from the property owner. Councilman Loguercio said, "A house like this one lowers the property values of nearby homes and has a detrimental impact on everyone in the neighborhood. I commend our law department for their efforts to remove this eyesore and help clean up neighborhoods in my district and throughout the Town of Brookhaven."

Brandon Ballengée is a visual artist, biologist, and environmental educator based



explained that she wants to help them have a voice while also getting the services they need.

Castro-Tapler served in the Marines from 2001-2004 and is currently the president of the Long Island Women Marine Association. She said she originally enlisted for education purposes, but went on active duty after Sept. 11 to "be there for her country." She then served as a firefighter and went on to a deployment in Kuwait and served in OIF-OEF.

After coming home, she soon became pregnant, and tried to adapt to civilian life believing there were few women veterans in the area. Then, after being pushed to attend an event at the VA, she checked herself in as what she thought to be the only woman Marine. To her surprise, she was met with 10 others.

Purpose of the board

The Suffolk County Women Veterans Advisory Board was created to discuss issues of importance to women veterans and to make recommendations regarding proposed legislation, policies and programming to the Suffolk County Legislature. To advocate on behalf of women vets, to encourage civic participation at all levels of government, to promote governmental interaction with women vets to provide information necessary to enable them to have equal access and opportunity to be heard and to improve understandings between women vets and Suffolk County government.

"That opened up a whole new world for me," she said.

Then, after talking with some of the vets and being particularly taken with a WWII woman veteran, she found out the Women's Marine Association had been recently disbanded due to lack of members.

"But what was really a kick in the [butt], was that I found out that women lived a block down from me and all this time these women needed me, they

were my sisters and they were alone,' she said, inspired to promise to do whatever she could to be there for women veterans. "Being connected to each other is the best healing we are going to get.

Fast-forward to about four months ago, and the Women Veterans Advisory Board was unanimously signed into legislation on June

18. Now, each branch of the Legislature is tasked with finding a veteran to serve as a member. Castro-Tapler was Berland's first pick. Berland and Suffolk County executive Steve Bellone announced her new position at her third annual 5K for Fighters race held last month in Patchogue in support of homeless women veterans.

Castro-Tapler lives in Patchogue with her husband, two stepchildren and son, and will now serve as a member of the first-ever Suffolk County Women Veterans Advisory Board. The board will meet quarterly. All meetings, she said, are open and all women veterans are encouraged to join.

"It's time to have their voices heard," she added. "I want them to stop hiding and have their needs met.'

Patchogue resident Cathie Norton Doherty was also among one of the first of the 11 members to be appointed by Legis. Tom Cilmi. She served active duty in the Navy from 1990-92 and the reserves until 1998. She is also a Navy veteran's wife and the mother of a Navy vet. Together,

they have two children.

"For years now we have been trying to speak out and raise attention and awareness to the different issues we face," she said, happy to finally have a women's board.

The goals of the board, she hopes, will be to establish a women's veteran shelter in a nice neighborhood in Suffolk County where women can bring their children, as well as better counseling services and a woman gynecologist at the VA (currently there is only a male doctor).

"Finally we have been heard. Not only did we get a seat at the table, but we got our own table, that we earned," she added, proud of their accomplishments.

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

Phase I approved for library

The former Ursuline Center renovation project, the new Bayport-Blue Point Library home, is making its way through the journey of critical approv-

The library has received a green light to start the Middle Road location's Phase I site work.

"We heard Sept. 30 from New York State Education Department Facilities Planning," said BBP Library director Michael Firestone. BBS Architects, Landscape Architects & Engineers prepared the paperwork. As for Phase II, "it went to the State Education Department in September and so far, their comments have been pretty benign."

In anticipation, although a definite yes hasn't been announced for Phase II approval, Firestone said bids for both phases of the 35,000-square-foot building will be sought by December's end, or beginning of January, as suggested by Park East Construction, the Huntington-based firm BBP Library is using.

All totaled, \$13,197,800 in renovation plans were applied for to the state. The BBP Library purchased the property officially from the Ursuline Sisters of Tildonk U.S. Province on Feb. 11 for \$3,650,000, after the local community voted for the project.

The approval for Phase I came just in time, Firestone commented. "We needed that to apply for a New York State Library Construction grant by Oct. 3," he said. "The state Legislature ultimately has to approve the grant, but it has been recommended that we receive \$300,000."

Firestone said he thought the construction work might begin on mechanical necessities, like the new HVAC system, or in the children's wing, where the stacks planned would be accessible to youngsters once the bids are decided on. "Phase I is exterior work, which we got approval for," Firestone explained. "Phase II is the interior work, but because we're bidding them together, the interior work might start before because of possible weather issues. Phase I involves raising the septic systems above the water table and addressing handicap sidewalks.'

BBP Library board president Ron Devine Jr. said, "It probably takes 30 to 60 days for the bids to come back."

The original 1930s building is in good shape. "BBS and Park East did a thorough analysis of the building and if there was anything of note, they found it," Devine commented. "The basement is in pretty good shape; the chapel area will be the showpiece and usable. Our goal is to complete the renovation work as soon as possible.

Devine said the county and the town wanted to partner on a couple of hopeful collaborations. That includes building sharing and a possible open-space purchase.

"We're definitely adhering to the timeline," Firestone said. "We anticipated bidding out late 2019, early 2020. That gives us 16 months for the construction

As Devine said of the project, "It will be a lasting legacy." ■

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

Suffolk 311 handles more than 6,000 service calls

Constituent response system receives about 100 requests per day

Suffolk County executive Steve Bellone recently announced that Suffolk311 has assisted more than 6,000 constituent service requests since its inception. Trained call operators have fielded 6,639 service requests and receive approximately 100 such calls per day. Residents have called to report phone scams, obtain assistance with social services benefits, pay traffic tickets, purchase Green Key Cards and permits, file tick complaints, and report potholes – all of which are filled within 48 hours.

"We are implementing best practices and embracing modern technology to transform government and better serve the needs of our residents," said Bellone. "The system is clearly working as intended and as more people become familiar with it, they will get to see their questions, answers and needs met in a timelier fashion."

The 311 system is currently configured to directly accept, route and report on service requests for Constituent Affairs, Public Works, Parks Department, Health Services and Social Services. Over the coming months, there will be additional Departmental linkages to the system.

By dialing 311 or 631-853-6311, residents are able to speak with a trained call operator Monday through Friday between the hours of 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Residents can also message the Suffolk311 Facebook page and have their questions answered anytime between 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Suffolk311 is designed to improve residents' interactions and overall experience with county government. In addition to connecting residents to the government that serves them, the system is a premier management tool, which will help officials to better allocate resources and taxpayer dollars. The system will capture critical details on each call, question, or request, allowing the county to gather valuable insight into the issues communities across the county are facing in real-time. The system will also improve public safety by reducing the burden on 911 county emergency call centers that receive tens of thousands of non-emergency calls each year. This will allow emergency call centers to be better positioned to respond to true emergencies.



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Board makes plans for vacant seat

Selects new VP and honors legacy of Jeananne Dawson

At the regularly scheduled meeting on October 29, the Board of Education appointed a new vice president, announced that the seat will remain vacant until 2020 and honored the legacy and service of longtime trustee and former vice president, Jeananne Dawson, who passed away on September 26, after 40 years of dedicated service to the William Floyd community. The Board announced that they will not appoint a new trustee, nor will they hold a special election to fill the remainder of Dawson's term, which expires on June 30, 2019. With just eight months left in the term, the Board feels strongly that the community should decide the next trustee in May. "Following in the footsteps of Mrs. Dawson is going to take several months and the community to decide," said board president Robert Vecchio.

The annual budget vote and trustee election is scheduled for May 19, 2020. The Board of Education unanimously selected April Coppola as their new vice president. She will serve as the vice president for the remainder of this school year through June 30, 2020. Each July, Board officers are selected by their fellow trustees at the annual reorganizational meeting

Coppola recited the oath of office administered by district clerk, Carolyn Visintin. Vecchio also took the opportunity to thank the members of Coppola's family who were in attendance for their shared sacrifice as she continues to devote countless hours to the betterment of the district's schools and community. This moment was extra special to Coppola, as not only was Dawson a dear friend, but

she was a mentor.

"I will be forever blessed to have known Jean and will embrace all that she has taught me," said Coppola.

To honor and memorialize the dedicated service and love that Jeananne Dawson had for her schools and community, the Board of Education voted unanimously to rename the William Floyd High School library as the Jeananne Dawson Memorial Library

"This room that we are sitting in, after tonight, will be known as the Jeananne Dawson Memorial Library," said Vecchio at the meeting, to tears and applause from many of those in attendance. "We, as a Board, thought it was a fitting tribute to name the high school library in her honor since this is where the Board meets twice per month and, more importantly, a place where kids come to learn and read."

Vecchio also addressed members of Mrs.

Dawson's family who were in attendance. He concluded the presentation by reading a proclamation detailing her legacy of service and dedication to the district's schools and community and presenting a copy of it to her daughter, Michelle, who accepted it on behalf of the Dawson family. A dedication ceremony and formal plaque unveiling will take place at some point in early 2020. ■

Lisa Stoia, a native of Shirley and a William Floyd graduate, was named to the 29th class of honorees in the West Virginia University Sports Hall of Fame. Stoia was inducted into the William Floyd Athletics Hall of Fame in 2007.

Stoia is a senior associate head coach of the WVU women's soccer team. Stoia helped guide WVU — her alma mater — to multiple Big 12 and Big East titles, as well as to 12 consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament and the 2016 NCAA College Cup Final. In 2018 Stoia helped the Mountaineers reach another title, as WVU claimed the Big 12 Soccer Championship title in November with a 3-0 showing at the league tournament, finished by a win over Baylor in the title match. WVU finished the

season with a 15-4-4 mark and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, according to the university's website.

Stoia earned her bachelor's degree in sports management from WVU in 2005 and her master's of business administration from Jacksonville in 2007.

During her playing career with WVU, Stoia earned Big East Midfielder of the Year honors in 2002 for leading West Virginia to its first regular season championship. She also assisted on 10 of West Virginia's record-breaking 53 goals in 2003, tying her for the season record, according to WVU. Stoia was a NSCAA/adidas and Soccer Buzz second team All-American in 2002 as a junior.

Stoia continued in her senior season, breaking the season assist record she had tied the season before on her way to becoming West Virginia's all-time assists leader with 33. She became the first midfielder in Big East history to earn midfielder of the year honors in consecutive

seasons by winning the award for the second time in 2003. Due to her record in 2003, Stoia earned first team All-America honors from Soccer Buzz and the NSCAA. Stoia also earned NSCAA/adidas third team All-Mid-Atlantic region and Big East co-Rookie of the Year honors as a freshman in 2000, according to WVU. ■
