Living shoreline to be implemented on South Breeze

Grant and town funds will go toward \$700K project

Back in 2019, the Town of Brookhaven was awarded a \$250,000 Suffolk County water quality grant to build a living shoreline on empty parcels on South Breeze Drive in Patchogue. The project will help alleviate flooding in the areas of Grove and Bay avenues as well as Clifton Drive and Smith Street.

As part of the project, two fallout pipes, according to Brookhaven Town highway superintendent Dan Losquadro, will be removed to help mitigate backflow flooding and all the existing water drain infrastructure will be modified to flow directly into the newly structured living shoreline.

The reason for disconnecting the two pipes, he explained, is when the tide comes up the backflow prevention typically fails and is stuck open due to clogs. This causes more flooding from the backflow rather than its designated purpose to help the outward flow.

“What really happens in the area are the pipes allow the water to backflow and the existing draining system is contributing to the flooding,” he said. “[We will] disconnect these two pipes and put this bioretention area in where water can naturally be filtered and spill out into the bay.”

The living shoreline will expand

Public hearing set for gas-powered landscaping equipment

Village to distribute COVID-19 test kits

The Village of Bellport held its board meeting on the evening of Tuesday, Feb. 22 and discussed a number of important topics.

Two important public meetings were set for March 21. For the first meeting, a public hearing was set to discuss code changes for gas-powered landscaping equipment as recommended by the newly convened Bellport Environment Committee, led by Marc Rauch. The committee's suggestions are available for viewing on the village's website. The March 21 meeting will allow public input before the board votes to accept the recommendations.

The other public hearing set for March 21 will discuss piercing the 2 percent tax cap.

In other news, the village board approved the use of \$20,000 to make painting repairs to the ferry, specifically the hull and top deck. It also approved another five-year agreement to run the village's lifeguarding services as part of an intermunicipal agreement between the village and Brookhaven Town.

The village board also gave a number of updates about upcoming projects, some of which have been in the works for months. Mayor Ray Fell gave an update about the \$2.8 million that

Sen. Chuck Schumer earmarked for the village for repairs to the marina. The money is being allotted as part of the \$3.1 trillion federal relief package. Fell spoke with a Schumer representative who said the funds are not available now, but should be coming down the pipe soon.

"Hopefully sometime this summer, we'll get that and be able to design our waterfront dock area," said Fell.

With a decision about the fate of the pavilion at Ho-Hum Beach already made, the village board discussed the next steps. The village will have the pavilion removed by the lowest responsible bidder, who said the job can be done for \$74,350.

In an effort to combat COVID-19, Suffolk County Legis. Jim Mazzarella sent the village masks and COVID-19 testing kits. The village will distribute these in two ways. Residents can visit Village Hall for kits, which include the tests. The kits and masks are also being passed out to seniors in the village program, according to Fell.

Fell and village clerk John Kocay updated residents on the status of Mothers' Beach. The Bellport Village Program Fund offered to donate 75 percent of the funds needed for a new automatic gate. The gate is needed, as it's a security feature that stops people from entering the beach after dusk. The village will procure security cameras to work in tandem with the gate because, as Kocay said, the village has had issues with damage to gates in the past. ■

Democratic forum held for new 1st Congressional District

Three Democratic candidates introduced

On Thursday, February 24, a virtual candidate panel was co-hosted by the Southampton and Brookhaven Town Democratic Committees so voters could hear from the three Democratic prospects for the new 1st Congressional District.

The 1st Congressional District is currently held by Republican Lee Zeldin, who will not seek re-election and is running for Governor against current Gov. Kathy Hochul. With the new redistricting that occurred earlier this year the 1st Congressional District now stretches from Montauk to Blue Point and north into Smithtown. The three candidates seeking the Democratic ballot are Bridget Fleming, Jackie Gordon and Kara Hahn.

Fleming, currently the Suffolk County legislator representing the county's 2nd District, noted that she comes from a working-class family with seven siblings and learned that nobody gets anything done by themselves and we all have an obligation to look out for one another.

"I've lived in the Noyack neighborhood of Sag Harbor in the district for over 20 years with my family," Fleming said. "For about half of that, I've served in local public office. I was the only Democrat on the Southampton Town Board and then I was elected to the county legislature where I've served since 2016."

Fleming noted that she served as an assistant district attorney for over 10 years and was a sex crimes prosecutor and then the chief of a unit that prosecut-

ed fraud in public programs.

"I am known as someone who is a reliable champion for our common democratic values and at the same time I can connect individually with working people across the district," Fleming said.

"I'm running for Congress because I believe that everyone has the right to the American dream. I believe in a health care system that's accessible and affordable for everyone and a tax system that doesn't just benefit those at the very top; that Medicare and Social Security should be available to those who've paid into it all their lives. And as a former prosecutor, that every neighborhood has the right to safety and that we have to end the epidemic of gun violence, and now more than ever, I believe that every woman must have the right to make her own decisions about reproductive health care. I believe that if we bring this message across the district from Montauk to Plainview, from Port Jefferson to Copiague, we're going to win this race, but we cannot take it for granted."

Kara Hahn is a lifelong Long Islander

who was born and raised in New York's 1st Congressional District. Hahn is currently a Suffolk County legislator in Suffolk's 5th Legislative District. Hahn spoke of her background as a social worker and how she found out she was pregnant with her oldest daughter when she was a senior in college. Hahn also shared that she experienced and survived domestic violence.

"To know my background is to understand me and what my campaign is all about, and that's service," Hahn said. "I can relate to the challenges families in NY 1 are facing because I've been there. I know what it's like to work at McDonald's and clean rooms at the inn and rely on waitressing tips to put food on the table. I know what it's like to have an increase in gas prices blow a hole in your monthly budget. I've been there."

"As a member of Congress, I will keep the tough challenges families face at the forefront of everything I do."

Candidate Jackie Gordon is a veteran, educator, public servant, and community leader. When Gordon was 20 years

old, she joined the military, and after 29 years and four deployments serving as a military police officer in combat zones in Iraq and Afghanistan, she retired at the rank of colonel. Gordon also spent over 30 years teaching and mentoring young people and spent a dozen years on the Babylon Town Board.

"Today there are many new battles facing our country and our community, and we will defend them on new front lines. We have faced an unprecedented pandemic made worse by misinformation, distrust, and division," Gordon said.

"We need a leader who is strong, who will speak the truth, who will fight for our families, who will work every day to defend us. I am that leader. I will go to Washington and I will deliver for Long Island."

Whichever candidate wins the Democratic primary will be up against Suffolk County Republican nominee Nicholas LaLota, the Suffolk County Legislature's chief of staff and a former Republican county elections commissioner.

Insight into last year's voting enrollment

After filing a Freedom of Information request with the Suffolk County Board of Elections, enrollment numbers based on party lines in our area was found:

Numbers were rounded to the whole for clarity.

BROOKHAVEN TOWN

With over 334,000 registered voters, Brookhaven Town has a total of 106,767 Democratic voters and 106,838 Republican voters. It also has just over 7,000 conservatives, 1,400-plus working party, 41 green party, 14,000 independent and 20 and 2 libertarian and SAM voters.

ISLIP TOWN

With over 212,000 voters, Islip Town has just nearly 77,000 Democratic voters and 63,500 Republican voters. It also has 4,000 conservative, 770 working party, 300 green, 7,770 independent, 350 libertarian and 14 SAM.

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 1

Congressional District 1, which will see an open seat this year due to Rep. Lee Zeldin's announcement in running for Governor, has a total of 164,500 Democratic voters to their 166,000 Republican voters, 11,350 conservative, and 21,900 independent voters.

CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT 2

Congressional District 2 has 130,450

Democratic voters, 96,950 Republican voters, 12,000 independent voters and 6,200 conservative voters.

SENATE DISTRICT 3

Senate District 3 has 69,900 Democratic voters, 57,250 Republican voters, 7,450 independent voters and 4,000 conservative voters.

SENATE DISTRICT 4

Senate District 4 has 75,000 Democratic voters, 64,250 Republican voters, 7,700 independent voters and 4,000 conservative voters.

ASSEMBLY DISTRICT 3

Assembly District 3 has 27,700 Democratic voters, 25,500 Republican voters, 3,450 independent voters and 1,850 conservative voters.

ASSEMBLY DISTRICT 7

Assembly District 7 has 27,300 Democratic voters, 34,000 Republican voters, 4,050 independent voters and 2,400 conservative voters.

LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 3

Legislative District 3 has 17,000 Democratic voters, 15,100 Republican voters, 2,100 independent voters and 1,100 conservative voters.

LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 7

Legislative District 7 has 17,700 Democratic voters, 15,100 Republican voters,

2,250 independent voters and 1,150 conservative voters.

LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 8

Legislative District 8 has 17,000 Democratic voters, 22,750 Republican voters, 2,600 independent voters and 1,450 conservative voters.

LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 10

Legislative District 10 has 17,300 Democratic voters, 19,990 Republican voters, 4,050 independent voters and 2,180 conservative voters.

LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11

Legislative District 11 has 18,000 Democratic voters, 19,700 Republican voters, 2,300 independent voters and 1,150 conservative voters.

2021 NOVEMBER ELECTION ASSESSMENT:

Suffolk County Republicans came out in full force, taking control of the Suffolk County Legislature, unseating the Democratic majority leader Rob Calarco and taking control of the 18-seat body.

Republican candidate Dominick Thorne unseated Suffolk County presiding officer Rob Calarco with 54 percent with 6,611 votes, to Calarco's 45 percent of the vote, 5,627 votes, for District 7. This would have been Calarco's final term as legislator after serving a total of 10 years in the seat.

Also, special election incumbent Republican James Mazzarella took the

win for Suffolk County's 3rd district against former Legis. Kate Browning with 66 percent of the vote and 7,525 votes to her 32 percent of the vote, and 3,708 votes.

Trish Bergin, a former councilwoman for Town of Islip, won in a wide margin against Carla Simpson in former legislator Tom Cilmi's term-limited seat in the 10th Legislative District. Bergin had gained 7,260 votes, or 67.07 percent, compared to Fidelia's 3,559, or 32.88 percent.

According to Suffolk County Board of Elections data, residents who just recently enrolled to vote include a total of 810 new Democratic voters and 166 new Republican voters in Brookhaven Town, and 121 new Democratic voters and 48 new Republican voters in Islip Town. Legislative District 7, which saw an upset, had a total of 31 new Democratic voters and 10 new Republican voters. The 3rd Legislative District saw an almost equal number of new voters at 24 and 17, respectively, and the 10th Legislative District had 25 and 19 new voters as well.

VOTER TURNOUT

Taking an overall look at some of the 2021 voting numbers, voter turnout was extremely low.

There were barely 11,000 voters in the 10th Legislative District compared to the over 56,500 registered voters. Legislative District 7 had over 12,000 voters with over 51,500 registered voters, and the 3rd Legislative District had over 11,000 votes with over 51,100 registered voters.

Don't miss the decoy collectibles show

This weekend, on Saturday, March 5, the Long Island Decoy Collectors Association will be hosting their 50th annual Antique Decoy, Fishing and Sporting Collectibles Show.

The event will take place from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the IBEW Union Hall in Hauppauge and will be dedicated in memory of Dick LaFountain.

"He has been into the decoy world for as long as I can remember," show organizer Dick Richardson said, recalling his old friend who recently passed in November of last year.

LaFountain was a world-class carver who obtained many awards. He was also a veteran of the U.S. Navy, a building contractor, and the secretary of Long Island

Decoy Collectors for 12 years.

Along with his love for family and Long Island shorebird decoys, layout gunning, fresh seafood and coffee, LaFountain had a passion for wildfowler collecting. He was known by many as the wildfowler man and even wrote a six-part series on the articles of the factory in *Decoy Magazine* and wrote a book, "Wildfowler Decoys."

Richardson will also be donating a bird carved by LaFountain's neighbor, Lem Tucker, in his memory.

Featured at the exhibit will be Long Island shorebirds and their carvers, with a display of contemporary carved shorebirds.

Additionally, this year's show will have beetleheads, tattlers, and robin snipe, and a dozen of antique birds that have not

been hunted in over 100 years. The decoys, according to Richardson, are incredibly rare and valuable because many were discarded and even burned once hunting was outlawed in the early 20th century. The artistry of the surviving examples has endured.

The Long Island Wildfowl Heritage Group will also provide updates on its local waterfowl research with a tribute to one of Long Island's venerable waterfowling families, honoring Paul W. "Perry" Bigelow, of Bellport.

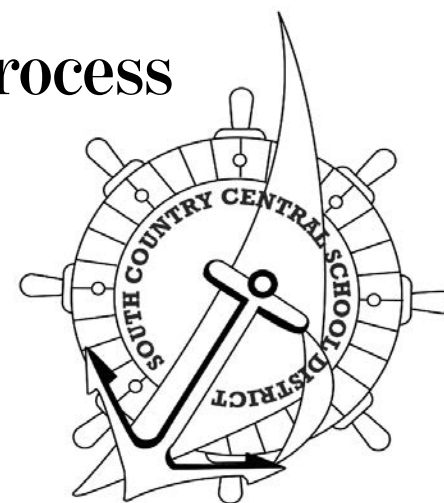
"The district encourages all community members to follow the budget development process and stay informed," said superintendent of schools Dr. Joseph Gianì.

Pineyro took the idea and created a series of pouches, applying the design with a cricut machine. Each pouch has the sparkly saying: "Have a lucky day."

Now they're gaining in popularity. Local moms are ordering for their children, just in time for the upcoming holiday.

Pineyro is excited by the interest, and even said she may be considering another pouch design in time for Easter. As for St. Patrick's Day, Pineyro says, Who cares if you haven't kissed the Blarney Stone or found a four-leaf

Trustees seek reelection

Patchogue elections are March 15

Trustees up for reelection for another four-year term include Joseph Keyes and Susan Brinkman. Also, recently

appointed trustees Lizbeth Carrillo and Patrick McHeffey will be seeking a two-year and four-year term, respectively.

Opponent and resident Dennis Ross will be seeking election for his first four-year term against incumbents Keyes, Brinkman and McHeffey; Carrillo will run unopposed.

The election is at-large, meaning the trustees who receive the most votes are elected to all seats. Village judge Patti Romeo is also up for reelection.

The election will take place on Tuesday, March 15. Voting will take place at Village Hall, 380 Bay Avenue (Parks & Recreation Department) and the Knights of Columbus from 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. As of press time.

THE INCUMBENTS

Joseph Keyes

Trustee Keyes was appointed to the board in 2009 and elected in 2010. He was then reelected in 2014 and 2018. He has been married for over 48 years and a Village of Patchogue resident since 1975 with four sons and four grandchildren.



"In my 12-plus years of serving the residents of Patchogue, I am proud to say that I've had a role in many major decisions which have improved the quality of life in Patchogue," he said of why he should be reelected for another term.

His accomplishments include the approval of the New Village complex at the Four Corners, ArtSpace, expansion of the sewer plant, Copper Beech, the introduction of Fabco Filters in the catch basins reducing harmful elements from the waterways, liquid brine as opposed to salt for snow on roadways, facilitated a partnership with Pedal Share, applied for grants to acquire recycling pails at all village parks, legislated an engine idling restriction, and helped bring the Johnson Controls project to the village.

However, he said he is most proud of legislating the village's Green Fleet policy, which ensures that all vehicles purchased by the village will be designed to reduce toxic fossil fuel emissions. As such, he also facilitated the purchase of the first electric vehicle in the village and the installation of a charging station.

He also founded the Protecting the Environment in Patchogue Committee, which has made environmental improvements including a single-use bag ban, Styrofoam ban, the buffer in a bag project, the Patchogue Green Business Program and the Microplastics Assessment of the River, Bay and Lake Ecosystem, a partnership with students from St. Joseph's College.

Apart from that, he is also the liaison for the Parks & Recreation Department,

helping bring the walk-through petting zoo, goat yoga and a fitness program to the village.

His latest trustee collaboration is ensuring the safety of pedestrians with vests and a "road diet" to help slow down traffic.

"I'm running again because I believe we still have more work to do, and with this particular team [Brinkman, McHeffey, Carrillo], I'm confident that we can achieve much," he said. "I love Patchogue because we have a little of, well, actually enough of, everything. It's a 'Storefront to Shorefront' community. There's a rebounding vibrancy downtown—food, music, entertainment and retail, the theatre. There's a Cultural Arts District, local parks and playgrounds, 26 acres of parkland right on the Great South Bay! What else can one ask for?"

Susan Brinkman

Brinkman has been on the board since November 2015, elected to a two-year term to fill a vacancy in 2016 and reelected to a full term in 2018. She has a husband and three children. Her dad, Hans Henke, is the village historian.



She is currently the library media specialist at Sylvan Avenue Elementary School in Bayport since 2008. She has also served as commissioner of the village's zoning and planning board as well as member.

She is proud of the teamwork the current village board has established.

"Our diversity of backgrounds and talents enables us to brainstorm and problem solve in so many important ways," she said. "We each have served on the various committees and boards in the village and it enables us to bring an important skill set to the table. We know the village from the ground up!"

She is also proud of her work using her technology skills to keep all the village public meetings functioning during the pandemic. She is credited for researching and creating the means to effectively use Zoom and YouTube to broadcast meetings remotely. Then, once they were able to return to Village Hall, she also established the technology and procedures required and trained village personnel to assist her so that they could continue broadcasting the meetings. During the last year, she was also a member of the team that designed and implemented the village's new website.

"I am also very proud of the walkway that we created through the parking lot from Roe Walkway to ArtSpace," she added. "To help fund it, I wrote a Suffolk County Downtown Revitalization Grant and won a substantial amount of money. Prior to this walkway, crossing the parking lot was not easy, nor safe."

The walkway, she said, enables everyone, but most importantly people in wheelchairs and families with strollers, to cross through a busy parking lot safely—especially at night.

Also, by working together with Marian Russo, executive director of the Community Development Agency, and Beth Giacommo-Lachacz, executive director of Patchogue Arts Council, they further brainstormed and created a "Call to Artists" during the designing phase of the walkway project. As a result, they were able to create a public walkway containing original works of art contained in the paver stone circles interspersed through-

out its length.

She also noted her work in helping restore the Civil War Soldier statue at the American Legion's Veterans Memorial Park. She worked with the local Society of the Grand Army of the Republic Post 210 and helped secure a grant from Legis. Rob Calarco enabled them to restore the statue.

She is running for a third term to continue her passion of working for the residents.

"As a trustee, I have completed great projects and created new ways to communicate important information with our residents, but there is more to accomplish," she said.

The newest project she is working on is to digitize the village's records and make them easier to manage and retrieve. She hopes to finish the project.

"I feel that my experience and skills will benefit our village and enable me to continue giving back to the community I love," she added of why she should be reelected. "I love everything about Patchogue! We have the finest residents, an exciting downtown, and a beautiful shorefront. There are so many amenities for the diverse population that we have, with the potential for even more." During her campaign, she is looking forward to meeting more residents and communicating the board's goals for the future of Patchogue.

Patrick McHeffey

McHeffey, 34, a Center Moriches High School graduate, is the youngest person now serving the board. He has experience having served on the CDA board with a core belief of creating a good, strong community. He lives on Cedar Avenue with his wife Sophie and two children. Together, they moved to the village in 2017.



McHeffey, who has also served as a member of the Village of Patchogue Community Development Agency, is a member of the Protecting the Environment in Patchogue, Strong Towns and Congress for the new Urbanism. Professionally, he works in his family's bakery, Nettie's Country Bakery, in Center Moriches, where he does everything from baking and packaging to managing long-term business development strategies. Prior to that, he spent several years in the world of finance and accounting, serving as controller of Blue Point Brewing Company.

McHeffey holds a Bachelor of Science in accounting at Roger Williams University and a master's of urban affairs from Boston University, where he focused on city planning and local economic development.

He now seeks election to his first full-term after being appointed to fill a vacated seat last year. He is running because he said he believes in the work Patchogue has begun and that there is more to do.

"I envision a Patchogue that is walkable, sustainable, and resilient," he said of his platform. "Mayor Pontieri and the Board of Trustees have built an unbelievably strong foundation for this community. It's upon my generation to learn all that we can from them, and to then keep the ball moving forward."

He prides himself on listening to the concerns of neighbors and the thoughts of people throughout the community during his short time on the board.

He plans to campaign with the rest

of the Patchogue 2022 team, getting out onto the streets to catch up with neighbors, meet new people, and listen to ideas about how to keep Patchogue moving forward.

"What I love most about Patchogue is that it is not just a town, it is a true community made up of a diverse group of people willing to put in the work to make it a great place to live," he said. "While the outside world seems to be driven ever farther apart, here in Patchogue we find ways to bring people together. That's the key to our success, and it's also what makes it a great place to raise a family."

Lizbeth Carrillo

Carrillo, 34, was appointed as the village's first Latina trustee in December of last year, replacing former trustee Sal Felice. Carrillo is originally from Ecuador and has a B.A. in sociology from Dowling College. Carrillo also serves as outreach director for St. Francis de Sales Church since 2015, and in 2018 she was tapped for a Suffolk County Police Department community liaison position. Carrillo developed outreach and education strategies for Suffolk police.



Since being on the board for a little over a month, March 15 will be her first election.

During her time on the board, she said she is proud of being part of a team that works together and is in "constant communication" with each other.

"As well, I am proud of working with my colleagues to create a safe environment for our pedestrians. 'Be Seen' was a community effort and I am lucky to be part of this amazing project," she added.

She said she is running because she loves Patchogue.

"I love seeing our small businesses thrive, our parks filled with children on sunny days, and feeling safe," she continued. "I would love to represent my community, as I have a diverse work experience, CDA and zoning experience, as well as personal challenges that provide a perfect foundation to run as a trustee."

To campaign, she plans on knocking on doors introducing herself and getting to know the community and their needs. Her platform for the village is "Diversity, Safety Environment, Economic Development and Sustainability."

NYSDOT issues warning to owner of dumped boats for removal

Supervisor Ed Romaine calls for swifter action

Shirley residents should soon have some visual relief, as the New York Department of Transportation has promised to have the property visible from Sunrise Highway, which was recently littered with dumped boats, cleaned up.

BROOKHAVEN TOWN

“The Department of Transportation has been in touch with the owner of these illegally stored items and issued a timeline for their removal,” said NYSDOT spokesperson Stephen Canzoneri.

A few months ago, Town of Brookhaven supervisor Ed Romaine reported the discovery of several private boats on New York State Department of Transportation property located at the end of Maple Avenue in Shirley.

The lot is littered with at least 20 boats, Romaine explained, also noting that the town was able to write tickets and have a few of the boats on neighboring town property removed. Last month, the NYSDOT responded for comment about the situation, noting that they were aware of

the property concern and were working to resolve the issue.

The property is fenced and marked with “No Trespassing” signs and several trees. Behind the trees, numerous boats, cars, trailers, and related equipment were dumped on the property.

According to the Town of Brookhaven, the parcel is zoned A-1 and the storage of such is a non-permitted use.

Romaine’s major concern with the dumping is that it has become home to a homeless encampment.

“It’s a quality-of-life issue and just because it’s a moderate to low-income area, they don’t care,” he said of the NYSDOT’s inefficiency of clearing up their property last month. “This is shameful.”

According to the NYSDOT, they have

surveyed the property and spoken to the adjoining residential property owners in an attempt to identify the owner of the unauthorized stored materials. Additionally, a sign was posted on the property giving the owner of the boats until Feb. 28 to remove them.

Soon after the sign was posted, a lawyer contacted the NYSDOT stating his client will be removing their private property from the area with a detailed timetable for the actions, the NYSDOT recently wrote in a letter addressed to Romaine. Even still, after 60 days, if the owner does not comply, the NYSDOT said they will work with the New York State Attorney General’s Office on formal eviction proceedings.

However, Romaine pointed out that it is March and the boats are still there, and that giving the owner of the dumped boats 60 days is “unacceptable,” he added.

“They don’t want to do the work needed; they are not community friendly,” Romaine added, demanding the NYSDOT remove the boats from their property immediately. “The boats are on your property—get the job done.”

Since the boats have still not been removed, Romaine added, he will be reaching out to the NYS Comptroller’s Office and Governor’s Office for action. ■

approximately 400 feet on the south side of South Breeze Drive with native vegetation, rock and sand, allowing the shoreline to act as a natural buffer. The new area will encompass three parcels currently empty with rotting bulkhead, creating a visual improvement as well, he said.

“This will be very helpful for this community,” he continued.

The total project, Losquadro said, will cost about \$700,000. The remaining \$450,000 will be split between the town and the Village of Patchogue, as determined by engineers, depending on how much stormwater is produced by each street.

During the Patchogue Village board of trustees meeting last month, the board passed a resolution to waive all permitting fees in association with the Town of Brookhaven’s Living Shoreline project including fees for the following permit applications: right-of-way opening, public

sidewalk encumbrance for construction purposes, sidewalk or curb and apron cutting, floodplain development, and any other fees associated with the project.

“I think anything they do along the shoreline in connection to what we’re doing is a plus and really enhances Patchogue,” said mayor Paul Pontieri in regards to the neighboring project.

All permits have been submitted and the project is currently awaiting approval from New York State, which could take up to six months. After engineering plans are in and the design of the project is complete, the project will go out to bid by the fall of this year, 2022. Losquadro said he anticipates breaking ground in early 2023 and having the project completed before the hurricane season by the summer of 2023.

“This is a win for the environment,” added councilman Neil Foley. “Natural vegetation and man-made structures will work together to protect our shorelines.” ■

Bayport man pleads guilty to terrorizing LGBTQ+ community

Defendant mailed letters threatening mass shootings and bombings of individuals affiliated with LGBTQ+ organizations and businesses

On Wednesday, Feb. 23, in federal court in Central Islip, Robert Fehring, 74, from Bayport, pleaded guilty before United States District Judge Joana Seybert to mailing more than 20 letters threatening to assault, shoot, and bomb LGBTQ+-affiliated individuals, organizations and businesses.

SUFFOLK COUNTY

When sentenced later this year in June, Fehring faces up to five years of imprisonment.

Breon Peace, United States attorney for the Eastern District of New York, and Michael J. Driscoll, assistant director-in-charge, Federal Bureau of Investigation, New York Field Office, and Rodney K. Harrison, commissioner, Suffolk County Police Department, announced the guilty plea.

"In pleading guilty today, the defendant admits that he sent hate-filled communications that threatened mass shootings, bombings, and other fatal attacks, to members of the LGBTQ+ community," stated United States attorney Peace.

"This office will use all of its available law enforcement tools to protect the safety and civil rights of the LGBTQ+ community and every other community. We will not tolerate hateful threats intended to invoke fear and division, and we will hold accountable those who make or act on such threats."

Peace also expressed his gratitude to the Suffolk County District Attorney's Office for their assistance in the investigation.

"Today's guilty plea further highlights Fehring's intentions, and underscores the FBI's commitment to vigorously investigating civil-rights violations. Anonymous threats against members of our community will eventually be uncovered, and those who are responsible for them will be held accountable," stated FBI assistant

director-in-charge Driscoll.

"We have absolutely no tolerance for hate incidents of any kind here in Suffolk County, and I hope that this guilty plea gives peace of mind to both the victims and the entire LGBTQ+ community," stated SCPD commissioner Harrison. "Our department remains laser-focused on holding individuals who carry out acts of hate accountable, and I thank all of our law enforcement partners who helped bring quick closure to this case."

As set forth in the court filings and the proceedings from the Feb. 23, from at least 2013 to 2021, Fehring sent letters threatening violence to individuals associated with the LGBTQ+ community. In those letters, Fehring threatened to use firearms and explosives against the recipients. One such letter threatened that there would "be radio-cont[r]olled devices placed at numerous strategic places" at the 2021 New York City Pride March with "firepower" that would "make the 2016 Orlando Pulse Nightclub shooting look like a cakewalk," referencing the 2016 attack in which 49 persons were killed and dozens wounded at Pulse, a gay nightclub in Orlando, Fla. Fehring mailed dozens of additional threatening letters to individuals, businesses, and elected officials associated with the LGBTQ+ community both in Long Island and New York City.

On Nov. 18, 2021, the FBI's Civil Rights Squad and the New York Joint Terrorism Task Force executed a search warrant at Fehring's home in Bayport and recovered copies of letters containing threats, supplies used to mail threatening letters, 20 LGBTQ+-related Pride flags that appeared identical to flags stolen from flagpoles in Sayville in July 2021, and reconnaissance-style photographs from a June 2021 Pride event in East Meadow. Law enforcement officers also recovered electronic devices owned by Fehring that contained internet searches for Fehring's victims and related LGBTQ+-affiliated individuals, events, and businesses. Law enforcement officers also recovered from Fehring's residence legally owned two loaded shotguns, hundreds of rounds of ammunition, two stun guns, and a stamped envelope addressed to an LGBTQ+-affiliated attorney containing the remains of a dead bird.

The government's case is being handled by the Office's National Security and Cybercrime Section, Civil Rights Section,

and Long Island Criminal Division. Assistant United States attorneys Francisco J. Navarro, Rachel A. Shanies, and Andrew P. Wenzel are in charge of the prosecution.

Among Fehring's many victims were Greater Sayville Chamber of Commerce president, Eileen Tyznar and Patchogue Chamber of Commerce president David Kennedy.

Both chambers have shown dedication to the LGBTQ+ community and held events, including parades and family days, to honor and celebrate LGBTQ+ members and supporters in their respective coverage areas.

Tyznar has vowed to attend the sentencing hearing on June 17 to demand the judge pass the harshest sentence possible for Fehring.

"I feel that until this man is locked away, I will never feel safe and I will always look over my shoulder in fear," she said. "It is

unbelievable to me that he is not in prison after eight years of mentally torturing all of his victims, myself, and our board members for three years. This man also needs intensive mental help, which I hope he gets wherever he is. Justice will not be serviced until he is behind bars, as far as I'm concerned."

"On behalf of the Greater Patchogue Chamber of Commerce, I am grateful authorities arrested the individual responsible for the threatening letters our chamber received, aimed to prevent us celebrating our LGBTQ+ community at Alive After Five, in 2019," said Kennedy, echoing her statements. "We are also thankful the individual admitted his responsibility and pled guilty. We are hopeful a just punishment will be applied at his upcoming arraignment. I look forward to continue celebrating our LGBTQ+ friends and neighbors and supporting the Pride movement!" ■

IRISH RECIPES FROM OUR FAVORITE IRISH VETERAN, DAVE ROGERS

IRISH SODA BREAD

This four-ingredient soda bread leaves out all the fancy stuff, according to Rogers, who claims the key to the recipe is using currants rather than raisins. Rogers said the trick is to cook soda bread in a cast iron.

Four cups of flour, 1 tsp. of baking soda, 1 tsp. of salt, One and a half cups of buttermilk.

First make sure there are no lumps in flour add the baking soda by crushing it in palm of hand over the flour. Create a hole in the middle of the flour mixture and slowly mix in buttermilk making sure it doesn't get too wet. Be gentle and

don't overmix or knead. The consistency should be doughy and sticky. Knead on floured countertop into a smooth ball, then cut a cross on the top. "[To] keep away those evil Irish spirits," he said, though really, it's just to allow the bread to rise. Brush with a little buttermilk on top and bake.

Optional: Add in a quarter stick of butter and crush into flour mixture into pea-sized amounts. Add in an optional egg and the currants. Then, add buttermilk and continue recipe as follows. For it to be really good, he added, you want to cook it in a cast-iron pan about 7 inches wide.

Cooking directions: Electric oven at

400 degrees for one hour. Gas oven 350 degrees for 45 minutes. He said when you take it out, turn it over and tap on the bottom. If it sounds hollow, it's done.

CORNERED BEEF

Take corned beef out of package, wash it off and add the seasoning package. Rogers suggests adding a little more pickling spice as well. Then put in a pot of water to boil. Add 1 pint of Guinness for every two pounds and one tablespoon of brown sugar for special flavor and cover.

Cooking directions: Boil for one hour per pound. ■

While a kingdom centered around Kyiv has been in existence since the 900s, the Ukraine nation as most Americans know it came into existence with the Ukrainian Republic of Kyiv in 1917, shortly thereafter becoming one of the initial republics of the USSR in 1922.

It did not take long for Ukraine to experience the cruelty that was experienced in many Soviet states in an event called the Holodomor. This man-made famine was the direct result of decisions made by politicians in Moscow, including Joseph Stalin, to punish Ukrainians and to stamp out their resistance to Soviet farm collectivization, a process which had begun in 1929.

In the fall of 1932, Ukraine was going to miss its Moscow-imposed grain quota by roughly 60 percent. Rather than allowing the grain to remain in Ukraine, it was confiscated as punishment and sent to other Soviet states. As a result, famine fell over the country with roughly 3.5 million people, or about 10 percent of the population, perishing between 1932-1933. One additional important item to note during this early period is that Ukraine did experience some territorial modifications as the result of WWII, the largest of which came from land that was formerly in eastern Poland. However, by 1954, Ukraine occupied the territory that you see on maps today.

Fast-forward to the fall of the USSR in 1991. As with any newly independent nation, Ukraine set about addressing its national security. With the collapse of the USSR, due to nuclear weapons that had been stationed there by the Soviets, Ukraine became the third-largest

nuclear power in the world at the time. In 1994, Ukraine met with the U.S., the U.K., and Russia to discuss the nation's nuclear disarmament. The resulting agreement, known as the Budapest Memorandum, provided for security guarantees and respect of Ukraine's territorial integrity by the other signees in exchange for nuclear disarmament. The implication of this agreement, particularly from the U.S. and U.K. perspective, was that having been signed by the respective heads of state, Ukraine would not be left to stand alone in the face of an attack.

Many people have been surprised with what seemed like a sudden act by President Putin to invade Ukraine. Both Russian policy decisions in addition to several external factors have gradually built to this moment. As far back as 2003, when a pro-Western government came to power in Georgia, tensions built with Russia. This culminated in 2008, with Russian military intervention in Georgia in conjunction with the self-proclaimed republics of South Ossetia and Abkhazia. During this intervention, Russia claimed to be undertaking a "peace enforcement operation," and recognition by Russia of South Ossetia and Abkhazia separated them from Georgia, and from 2009 onward, Russia expanded existing military infrastructure in both regions, effectively occupying them both.

Similar tactics have been used by Russia in Ukraine, both in 2014 and today. Following the 2014 Euromaidan protests, which saw substantial public demonstrations and intense standoffs with security forces in Kyiv, then-President Yanukovich, who was a Russian ally, was removed and replaced with a pro-European government. Almost immediately following Yanukovich's removal, Russian military presence

appeared on Ukraine's Crimean Peninsula and completed the annexation of the territory by recognizing it as a Russian federal subject, further increasing military presence after it was annexed. Immediately prior to launching the invasion of Ukraine, President Putin recognized two regions of eastern Ukraine, Luhansk and Donetsk, as independent, which paved the way for a Russian "peacekeeping mission," following the strategy previously used in Georgia. However, this time rather than the occupation of these territories, a full-scale invasion of the country is ongoing, with troops advancing directly from Russia, from the occupied Crimean Peninsula, and from neighboring Belarus. The support Russia is receiving from Belarus appears to be payback for President Putin helping to quell protests in Belarus surrounding the 2020 Presidential election, in which President Lukashenko was reelected for a sixth term, a result which is widely disputed.

Whether this war ends in Ukraine or is the start of something larger remains to be seen. War is often romanticized with tales of heroics in the face of death. War brings suffering. Thousands of Ukrainian refugees are fleeing to neighboring countries, leaving behind their homes which may be destroyed in the fighting. They leave behind those that have stayed to fight who they may not see alive again. Those that stay simply because it is their home run the risk of becoming civilian casualties. None of that is romantic, but it is the harsh reality of war. The world is holding its collective breath, and we hope that our leaders can navigate an ever-changing and deeply complex situation. Whatever the level of U.S. involvement ends up being, I hope that it puts us on the right side of history. ■

Twenty years of impressive accomplishments

Bayport Civic Association celebrates two decades

The biplanes always made an impression.

They'd appear overhead, especially in the afternoon, heralded by a soft droning sound, a plane that looked like it emerged out of the 1930s and '40s, with glam movie stars like William Powell and Myrna Loy in the cockpit as it headed out to the Great South Bay. There were Fleet biplanes, vintage Cessnas, Piper Cubs and Stinsons. And they were all housed in hangers at the Bayport Aerodrome.

Bob Draffin used to watch them take off with his dad as a kid. Thanks to his efforts and those of the Bayport Civic Association, he still does. He now resides a few hundred feet away.

Twenty years ago, the aerodrome's 60-acre property was in danger of being sold for development, prompting the impetus for the civic's formation with Draffin, who remains its president. The civic fought for the historic airfield's state landmark and national registry, resulting in its preservation. The 24 hangars of vintage aircraft remain, leased to the Bayport Aerodrome Society members from Islip Town, along with a museum; the aerodrome remains the last remaining public grass field on Long Island. The Bayport Civic Association's two-decade history was celebrated Tuesday night at Stella Trattoria & Bar.

Talk about joyous! Seventy-five people attended, including officials like Islip Town councilwoman Kate Mullen, a member herself. "They care about the community," she said of the civic. I came into office six years ago. QuickChek had their application in and I made the Hamlet Zoning Study a priority. Hopefully it will keep Bayport, Bayport."

Several projects have been successfully tackled over the years; the latest included the finalization of the Bayport Hamlet Zoning Study, which was approved by Islip Town late December 2020.

The former downtown on Middle Road, where Shand's was the main draw, is now the 1.25-mile stretch on Montauk Highway from San Souci Lake east to Nicolls Road.

"We'd been advocating for this for years," Draffin said. "It came to a head with the QuickChek application. (QuickChek is a New Jersey-based company

who proposed a sprawling gas station on the land of former Bayport Transmission). Through the years, there were different development proposals before the Planning Department. Many were fine, but some were not in the nature or character of Bayport. We'd find ourselves constantly battling without a master plan. Even the town board made it clear after QuickChek."

Draffin explained the objection. "We have four gas stations already and the location (end of Snedecor Avenue and Montauk Highway) is one of the busiest high school crossings." He gave kudos to councilwoman Kate Mullen for her urging of the \$91,000 funding for the study and to Islip supervisor Angie Carpenter.

"That application goes back to 2013," Draffin said, referring to a text message he received about QuickChek while on a cruise. The study was conducted by BFJ Planning. The last hamlet study had been conducted in 1978.

The new study offers the civic backing for rejecting developments that don't adhere to the hamlet study; other inclusions in the study were landscaping and consistent tree planting, uniform signage, and using such elements as hedges and ornamental fences to obscure frontal parking.

The Bayport-Blue Point Chamber weighed in, as well as comments elicited from the community. Significant suggestions for historic preservation came

from D.J. Seigny, a 2007 Bayport High School graduate, now an architectural historian for the U.S. Army at Fort Bliss.

Seigny, who wrote several robust suggestions, included this one:

"The Bayport Planning Study has successfully identified challenges these areas are facing and provides some recommendations to improve the existing zoning ordinance. Unfortunately, Bayport's cultural resources are not being adequately represented in this report, nor are there practical solutions to the economic challenges the historic commercial center is experiencing. Recognizing and fostering good preservation in Bayport is crucial to conserving the hamlet's storied built environment for current and future generations to enjoy. Historic preservation is about more than saving old buildings; it is about creating resilient communities that retain its sense of place." Seigny provided contact information for federal, state and local programs.

"The study included D.J.'s comments," said Draffin.

After Boy Scout Troop 329 marched in with the flag, Islip Supervisor Angie Carpenter pointed out the civic's importance after she swore board members in. "If we don't have people like this in the community, we can't do our job as well," she said. Brookhaven Councilman Neil Foley added, "We raise our families here, that's why we do this." Assem-

blyman Gandolfo and Congressman Andrew Garbarino were also represented by Community Affairs Coordinator Lindsay Ekizian.

Draffin, a lifelong Bayport resident who grew up on South Ocean Avenue, said his Facebook page is up to 1,500 people and email is at 300, but keeping the vitality of the civic going has been a challenge.

A stalwart worker along with others, Draffin was in the middle of Bayport issues early on with the civic's volunteers; he was employed in the Suffolk County Sheriff's Office as employee relations director (now retired).

"I had a 4-year-old son and a 5-year-old daughter then," he said of his efforts over the 20-year period. Other involvements have included past president of Sayville Rotary, past president of the Bayport-Blue Point Little League, and former grand marshal of the Bayport-Blue Point St. Patrick's Day parade.

"Some of the members I started out with have died or moved away, and COVID has made it tough," he said. "But there is a core of 25 people I can count on." He credits his wife, Janet Draffin, with her efforts as advisor to the Bayport Junior Civic Association, in passing the gauntlet to the younger generation.

"The past president of the junior civic is now a member of ours: Julia Drago," he said. "She's coming to the dinner." ■

taking every effort to fix it.

The story also notes that a resident was "unable to get a home health aide," implying a management failure, without noting that Conifer Village at Patchogue is not an assisted living facility. While we have a Senior Service Coordinator on site to provide individual resident support in navigating social and medical needs, we do not provide home health aides ourselves. The article additionally contains secondhand accounts that are false and unverified.

We take issue because we take great pride in our work. Our team works hard to provide a great place to live for our residents, many of whom would not be able to afford alternatives. Each community offers a community room,

indoor mailrooms, laundry rooms, recreation rooms, and an Onsite Service Coordinator. There are also beautifully professionally landscaped outdoor spaces that reflect on the care we take in our community.

Our onsite management and maintenance teams go the extra mile to make this not simply a great place to live, but a community with support and activities. Conifer is very proud to be a collaborative and responsive manager and we look forward to working with our residents to find additional ways to improve and provide an even better quality of life.

executive director David Kennedy said he's looking forward to bringing the parade back after its two-year absence due to COVID-19. The last parade was held in 2019.

As the longest-running grand marshal in Patchogue history, the chamber will finally be celebrating Village Business Improvement District executive director Dennis Smith. In 2020, the chamber announced its 2020 St. Patrick's Day parade grand marshal; however, due to several COVID cancellations, the parade had been rescheduled a number of times, including past plans to host a halfway parade in September.

ABOUT THE GRAND MARSHAL

After a visit to the motherland years ago prompted a DNA test, Smith recently found out he was more Irish than he originally believed to be: 97 percent to be exact, with the other 3 percent English and Northern European. He also learned that Smith means "truth" and "strength," among other adjectives.

His mother was once a DeMontt —

more of a French name taken from a small European country once occupied by the French, he said, but the women before her were McManns and McMurphys.

Smith has been with the BID over 15 years; he was a grocery store manager before that. However, since his move to the Patchogue area from Brooklyn in 1955 (just after his 5th birthday), he has stayed within three miles of the village.

Currently, he resides in East Patchogue with his wife, Patty Smith (formerly Hanlon). Together they have three children — Jeanine, Dennis and Daniel — and four grandchildren. All live nearby — a blessing, Smith said, all in itself. ■

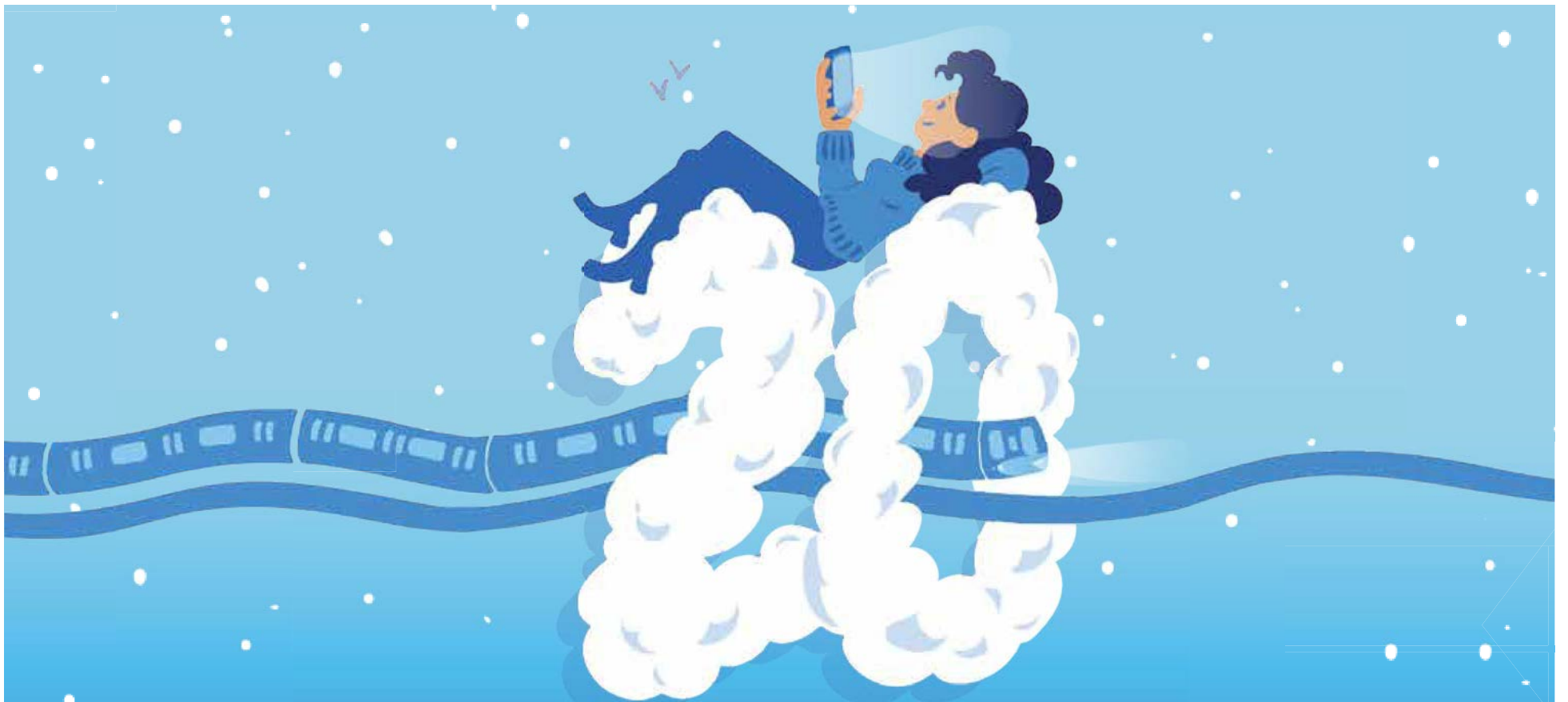
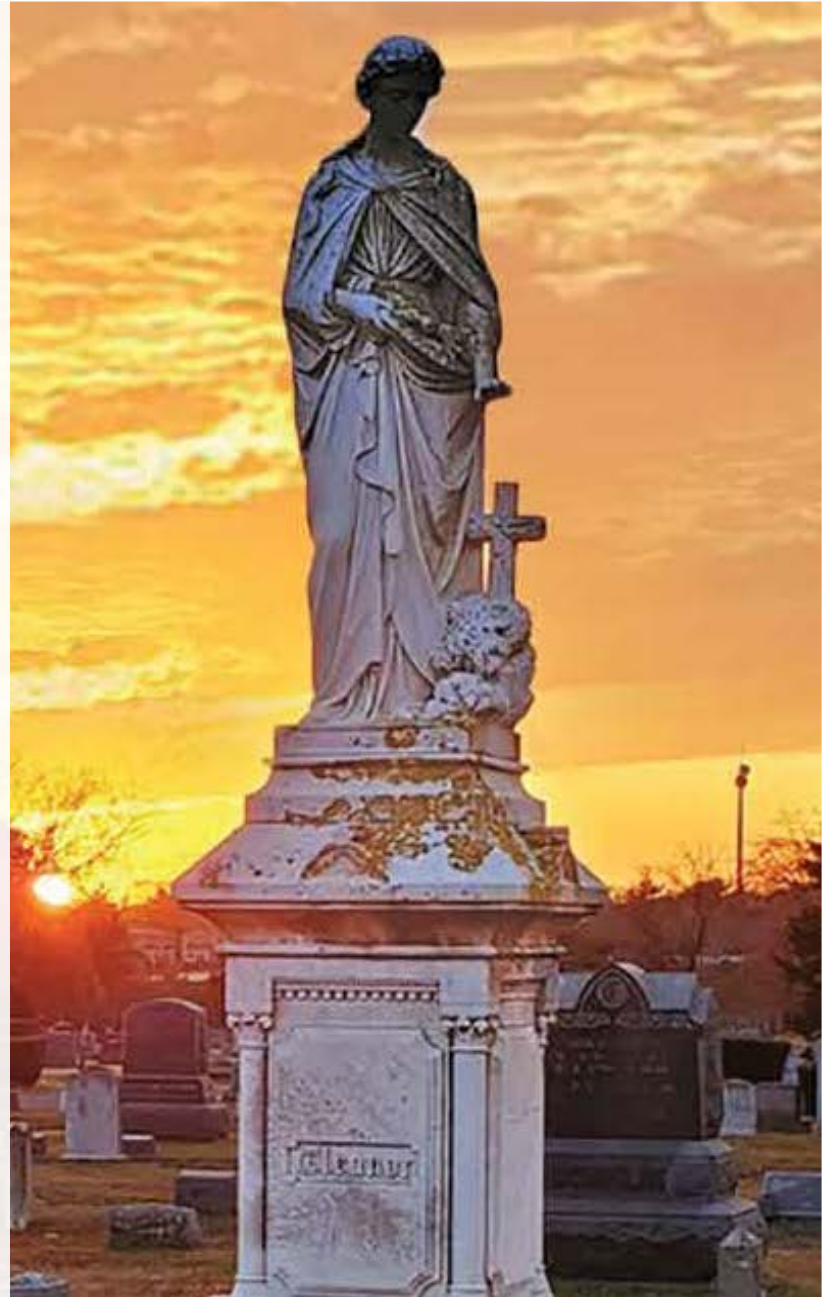

Going all-in on infrastructure

It was late last summer when, heading west on the expressway, I hit a pothole so deep it sent my hubcap careening into the adjacent lane. Keeping pace with my beloved 2012 Ford Focus, the round piece of plastic traversed three lanes of traffic—defeating any distance record the epic hula-hoop rolls of my youth ever set—before finally crashing into the median and being lost to the graveyard of blown-out tires that is the shoulder of the LIE.

Here, the ordeal of a pothole-riddled expressway cost me the price of a cheap piece of plastic; according to our Governor, however, such pothole experiences can cost the average New Yorker more than \$500 in car repairs annually—and more than \$600 according to Newsday (Governor’s Jan. 18, 2021 Budget Address; “Pothole Island,” Newsday, Feb. 15, 2022). Hundreds in personal expenses was lost as a result of roadways our hard-earned tax dollars are supposed to be maintaining. While some of our fellow Long Islanders have opposed bipartisan infrastructure projects, criticizing members of their own party who support them (do these folks really enjoy paying for everything twice?), those of us in the middle know that in order to protect our wallets and improve our public resources, cooler heads must triumph over divisive political extremism.

There was a time when investment in infrastructure was anything but controversial or partisan. To the contrary, public investment in infrastructure—in roads, bridges, sewers, and clean water—is a key underpinning of American capitalism, allowing goods and services and consumers and laborers to move through our economy efficiently, safely, and effectively. It was therefore historically embraced by both parties as a means to stimulate our economy and improve our

public resources.

President Roosevelt, a Democrat, undertook large-scale infrastructure investments to move our country past the Great Depression, and President Eisenhower, a Republican, invested public resources to create the Interstate Highway System, which, in part, led to one of the most romanticized periods of economic growth in our nation’s history. Unfortunately, at a time when economic stimulus is sorely needed and when the cost of borrowing is relatively low, we are straying from these storied and gloried days of our past and instead see our elected representatives chastised for trying to bring hundreds of millions of dollars to the communities they serve. (It is also worth noting that, despite being a major talking point, only 15 percent of the funding included in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 went toward infrastructure and is perhaps one of the reasons the rate of economic recovery after the Great Recession was so slow.)

Beyond improved roads and the direct savings we stand to gain, infrastructure investment is widely understood to be one of the most effective ways in which government can stimulate our economy, ensuring we remain competitive on the world stage for generations to come. As noted in a recent report released by the Economic Policy Institute, “infrastructure investment is routinely estimated to be a much more efficient fiscal stimulus than almost any form of tax cut,” and, moreover “each \$100 billion in infrastructure spending [will] boost GDP by \$150 billion... [which], in turn will boost employment by over 1 million workers (The Potential Macroeconomic Benefits from Increasing Infrastructure Investment, Economic Policy Institute, 7/18/17).”

These are good—and often union-represented—jobs, too. It’s no wonder

then that the Long Island Federation of Labor’s new executive director Ryan Stanton “plans to focus on projects such as expanding sewer infrastructure in Suffolk County (“Stanton to Succeed Roger Clayman at LI Federation of Labor,” Newsday, Jan. 12, 2022).” In the short-term, private-sector jobs are created in the design and construction of these large-scale projects. In the long-term, public-sector jobs, represented by unions like Suffolk AME, are created for the operation and maintenance of these public resources. And, indirectly, even more jobs are created through the increased economic capacity such projects provide.

Kudos, then, to our elected leaders who understand the value of infrastructure. Mayor Pontieri, whose grandfather literally helped build Route 112, and his team at the Village of Patchogue, have worked with county leaders like former Legis. Rob Calarco and county executive Steve Bellone to secure millions in water-quality infrastructure funding. In fact, as reported by the Advance, Patchogue will soon be using \$7.7 million in grant funds to expand Patchogue Sewer District’s capacity—even more impressive is the fact Pontieri had the foresight to ensure the district was “designed with room to grow... no need to tear up the streets,” for this project (“Happy New Year, environment,” Long Island Advance, Dec. 30, 2021).”

Allowing for such additional connections not only means more Patchogue residents and businesses can be sewered, increasing property values and spurring regional economic development in the process, but Patchogue Village will also benefit from the revenue generated by external sources connecting to our district, helping keep taxes under control here locally. Further, this increased capacity will be useful as we regionally pursue a bipartisan, multi-jurisdictional

effort to revitalize the East Main Street Corridor (“Working across the aisle, they got good things done,” Long Island Advance, Dec. 30, 2021).

Patchogue benefits from additional revenue, our neighbors benefit from access to wastewater infrastructure, and we all benefit from improved water quality. This last point cannot be overstated. Living on Long Island, where our cesspools leech into our water table regularly, water quality is imperative for storm resiliency, clean drinking water, our heritage industries, and our aqua-focused tourism industry, which, island-wide, employs 100,000 Long Islanders and generates \$760 million in state and local tax revenue annually, according to Discover Long Island, our region’s official destination marketing organization.

With so much to gain from strategic infrastructure investment, it’s hard to imagine why anyone would stand in opposition. But, of the 27 congressional representatives from New York State, six failed to vote in favor of the infrastructure bill last year. Perhaps not coincidentally, two are extremists on the left, the others are hard right-wingers. Political extremism may generate headlines and help politicians fundraise, but for the rest of us living here in the middle, we understand the value of jobs, of economic growth, and of a strategic investment in our community’s future. We in the middle are therefore thankful to those who have gone all-in on infrastructure. ■
