# Free sewer hookup for residential homes

Patchogue River Watershed Sewer Project meeting


Sewers are a ubiquitous yet subterranean necessity of modern life, which most people rarely—if ever—think about, as these wastewater devices typically flow smoothly, unnoticed, and underground. Perhaps, if playing a word-association game, looking for a pop-culture reference associated with this type of drain or pipe, it would evoke the "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles," the late-80s mega-successful comic book franchise and animated series. The premise was roughly that four baby turtles were transformed, by sci-fi magic, into humanoid superheroes who would fight crime (and eat pizza) while dwelling in the sewers of New York

As it turns out, the new opportunity for sewer hookups available to all residential single-family homes in the Patchogue Village area, will enable participants to fight a real-life evil: environmental toxins and contaminants in the water supply.

Those at the well-attended Patchogue River Watershed Sewer meeting learned more about this new ecologically and budget-friendly option while at the Patchogue Theatre for the Performing Arts on Tuesday, Sept. 20. The informative event was hosted by the Village of Patchogue for those residents of the village whose homes are included in the first phase of the Patchogue River Watershed Sewer Project. At the meeting, representatives of the Village of Patchogue, H2M architects + engineers (the company handling the Patchogue River Sewer Project in tandem with the village) and representatives from Pioneer Asphalt Paving Contractors were all on hand to help explain the project.

The Watershed Sewer Project will use grant funding from the state government to connect 238 homes to the existing village sewer system, including the installation of a grinder pump unit (GPU) on each property. The project will reroute the existing home-drainage line from the on-site sanitary disposal system to the GPU, and then connect the GPU itself to the sewer line in the roadway. Upon the completion of the connections, the village will maintain the GPU. If the pump ever requires repair or maintenance, the village will manage those activities, with no separate cost accrual

# Site of George Washington's visit confirmed

# Investigators to search for foundation of Hart's Tavern

In 1790, George Washington, the new President of the United States, embarked on a tour of war-ravaged Long Island. Many historians believe the tour was

Washington's version **PATCHOGUE** of a "thank you" to the members of the Culper Ring, a network of spies

active during the Revolutionary War. One of the stops on this tour was in Patchogue, which was then a sparsely populated area, with fewer than 30 families. This stop was documented in George Washington's diary, in which he wrote that he "dined at Hart's Tavern." The following year, Thomas Jefferson's diary also mentioned Hart's Tavern as a stop on the way to the home of William Floyd in Mastic Beach, now part of Fire Island National Seashore.

These visits were little known until 1925, when Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), Col. Josiah Smith Chapter, placed a monument on the along West Main Street in Lakeview Cemetery. In 1999, the Greater Patchogue Historical Society (GPHS) added a New York State historic marker at the site. Since then, historians and local citizens have debated the identity of the owner and actual location of the tavern, since there is no record of Hart's Tayern anywhere. However, in the same vicinity on West Main Street, there once stood a large home owned by Elizabeth Oakes Smith, a well-known writer, lecturer, and women's rights activist who is buried in Lakeview Cemetery. The presumption has been that the home, often called The Willows, stood to the right side of the present-day entrance to the cemetery, and one theory has Hart's Tavern and The Willows as the same building.

Recently, Friends of Lakeview Cemeteries and GPHS volunteers Arlene Capobianco, Lynn Davis, and Steve Lucas embarked on an investigation to finally answer the questions: Was there a Hart's Tavern, who was Hart, and was The Willows the same building that Washington visited? After months of research work and interviews at the Suffolk County and Town of Brookhaven historian's offices and the Patchogue-Medford Library, the team has confirmed that the property where Washington stopped was in fact owned by Gilbert Hart, an active citizen in the Town of Brookhaven. They believe that Washington stopped at what became the Elizabeth Oakes Smith house and was there to meet a member of the Culper Ring. In addition, John Dilerack, the oysterman who served Washington at his stop, was also identified as part of this research project.

To pinpoint the exact location of the building, GPHS has contracted with a pro-

fessional investigator to review the site using ground-penetrating radar. If successful, the foundation of the home will be found, to settle the mystery once and for all. This project will be conducted Monday, Oct. 3 at 8 a.m., and the event is open to the

Friends of Lakeview Cemeteries (FLC) is a volunteer committee of the Greater Patchogue Foundation, committed "to the restoration, improvement and preservation of the historic cemeteries located on West Main Street in the Village of Patchogue." Dating to the 1700s, these five cemeteries include the graves of local citizens and veterans from the Revolutionary War to Vietnam. The committee is restoring and improving this historic site, repairing and replacing headstones and working to create a park-like setting for all of the community to enjoy and learn from.

The Greater Patchogue Historical Society has as its purpose "the discovery, preservation and dissemination of knowledge about the history of Long Island, particularly the Greater Patchogue area, and the preservation and posterity of places, buildings, landmarks and objects of historical interest on Long Island." The Greater Patchogue Historical Society Museum is located at Patchogue-Medford Library's Carnegie Library at 160 West Main Street (lower level), open Friday and Saturday 12:00-3:00 p.m.



She chose "bilingual" as the theme so that no one feels out of place and the English-speaking community can feel more inclusive, as a learning and educational experience about the Hispanic culture.


This year will solely feature the parade with expectations to make the event even bigger and better next year, possibly with food, music, and other attractions. ■

# Public hearing to be held on Thursday, Sept. 29

The Town of Brookhaven has taken into account suggestions made by this publication in an editorial suggesting better implementation of the redistricting

As per Brookhaven Town code, town lines must be redistricted every 10 years,

after council districts were formed in 2000. The requirement, according to town

officials, ensures equal representation as a reflection of the most current population data. In May, the Town of Brookhaven appointed a redistricting committee

comprising three Democratic representatives, three Republican representatives, and two other party representatives. Since then, several public meetings have been held throughout the town.

According to the town, with the currently proposed maps, the vast majority of residents in Brookhaven will see no change in representation under the map of least change. (90.55 percent will remain in the same council district from the last cycle). The map will also improve compactness, with 100 percent of North Bellport now existing within District 4; currently, a portion is in District 5. The change, according to the town, was done in response to the community's request over the past several years to be represented by a single council member, and the minority population increased in every district when compared to the 2010 population.

The new map has 10 split hamlets in comparison to the current 13 split community. The communities to remain split will remain so, due to community requests to maintain likeminded neighborhoods rather than zip codes. These communities include Coram, which will remain split in order to maintain Gordon Heights as a community, while 11720 will remain with Centereach, including South Setauket Park. Also, the new map reduces the number of school districts that are split from nine to four.

"This proposed map is the result of a robust, transparent public process after a dozen publicly advertised meetings resulted in highly attended meetings, hundreds of comments and suggestions, written testimony and suggestions from residents across the town, and numerous suggestions for alterations, and changes,'

said a town's spokesperson. "The maps embrace the concept of least change, as was repeatedly recommended by residents attending public hearings.

A public hearing to discuss this proposed map was set for Thursday, Sept. 29 to amend Chapter 27 entitled "Procedures for Ballot Propositions Proposing Ward (Council) Districts and Reapportionment Thereof" by amending Section 27-8 entitled "Reapportionment" of the Town Code of the Town of Brookhaven. The town board has until Dec. 15 to approve the new map, which will set council district lines for the next 10 years. ■

# Suffolk County victim of cyberattack

# Restoration expected to be 'meticulous'

On or about Sept. 8, Suffolk County officials determined that the county's systems had been affected by a cyberat-

tack. The attack has disrupted legislator emails, postponed the date of civil service examinations and

forced the county to hire experts to help. On Sept. 13, Suffolk County executive Steve Bellone held a press conference during which he said that the county experienced a "cyber intrusion" and that malware was detected and had "the hallmarks of ransomware."

The issue affected county emails as well as websites, so the county created a temporary landing page that housed information for residents. During the press conference, Bellone stressed that 9-11 was still operational, along with 3-11, and that parks remained open to

According to Suffolk County Legis. Steve Flotteron, the emails are patched up and the legislators can now receive information, but Suffolk County Legis. Dominick Thorne said that he encouraged his constituents to call his office and any office within the county rather than emailing.

"We were hacked; it's very serious," Thorne said. "Homeland and the FBI are looking into it."

On the county landing page, a statement reads: "While the cyber assessment remains ongoing, we believe that the threat actors accessed and/or acquired certain personal information from one or more county agency servers. The county promptly hired multiple cybersecurity firms to conduct an examination to protect employees and residents as well as restore online services.'

The statement continued to state that the county will notify any affected individuals and anyone affected will be offered free identity theft protection ser-

The attack also affected the upcoming Suffolk County Civil Service examinations that were scheduled for Oct. 1. The exams have been postponed with no date set. The county said that candidates will be notified of any reschedule dates. In addition, news outlets such as the Long Island Advance, Islip Bulletin and Suffolk County News have been unable to look up police incidents and write out police blotters.

Michael Balboni, the president of Redland Strategies, a company brought on by the county to assist them, noted that there has been an uptick in the number of ransomware attacks in recent He said the county must use the old adage, "measure twice, cut once," when looking to restore their cybersecurity enterprises. Restoration of the county's information will be meticulous, as to make sure that no attacks that could pop up again. Flotteron said he expects everything to reopen up in stages as they are cleaned and fixed.

"If anything, I think it shows us that we're becoming too reliant on some things in this computer cloud that people can grab onto and cause havoc," Flotteron said of the attack's effect.

# How to protect yourself

The county released steps residents can take to keep their information safe as well as what to do if they believe their information has been compromised.

The county noted that residents should regularly review account statements and periodically obtain their credit report. If anything looks suspicious, call the credit reporting agency listed in the report or report the matter to law enforcement. Fraud alerts should be placed on credit files so that users are alerted if anything is amiss. Residents can also put a security freeze on their credit report that prevents most potential creditors from viewing credit reports and restricts the opening of unauthorized accounts. by the homeowner. This project is being funded through grants obtained by Patchogue Village mayor Paul Pontieri and the Village Board, all who worked to make the project possible at no cost to homeowners.

Pontieri was there to offer a brief introduction before the technical presentation was given by Timothy M. Nordberg, senior project engineer at H2M. Residents were able to sign up on the spot for the project, with many lining up and taking advantage of the opportunity, even before the presentation began, while others waited until reviewing all the information shared during the detailed PowerPoint presentation and subsequent question-and-answer session, where all questions posed were answered, many involving the length of construction time and ensu-

Pontieri is extremely optimistic about the project, while also wishing that there were additional funds to do even more toward the aim of sustainability and progress regarding this issue.

"It's huge for the bay. The nitrogen that's extended out into the bay, from the homes that are along the water, is incredible," said Pontieri, adding, "I'm frustrated because five years ago, we would have been doing five or six homes for the same amount of money. Because over time, between the COVID situation, and just prices went this way, and the numbers of houses went that way, and initially it was 600 homes for \$18 million. Now, it's 238 homes for \$22 million. We do with it what we have, and I'll keep begging for more money.

Legis. Dominick Thorne, of the 7th Legislative District, spoke briefly.

"You don't have to be an environmentalist to know there are all sorts of bad things in our water system," said Thorne while thanking the mayor and his team and pledging his support in the endeavor. "First and foremost, some of this had been started by my predecessor [former longtime Legis. Rob Calarco].'

The former elected official was also in attendance.

"The project started, and it's going to be [fully completed] within the next 18 months. Our plan is once we know more from the agreements and the clustered areas that we start with, we'd like to be giving a 30-day notice to those areas that it's coming, and then when we're there we'll be knocking on doors," Nordberg said of the voluntary initiative, which residents have the choice to opt out of at this time.

The project will take four to six weeks per house to be completed, with all work being done on the outside of the house. Once the plan is approved by each homeowner, they are not required to be on premises as the project is coming to fruition.

Many questions from the audience included inquiries about why the homeowner is responsible for paying for the pumping being done from the house to the street, and what the owner could possibly do that would compromise the new system.

"We at the village are responsible, from the pump station on. As the homeowner, you're only responsible for from the exit of your house into the pump station," Nordberg responded. He added, "[It's] because we can't control what gets flushed down there once it lands in the pump station.'

The onus of what goes down the pipe is on the homeowner, he explained. A "no-no" list of items, such as grease and sanitary wipes, which are not to be put down the drain, will be disseminated to all who participate in the plan, which will incur a flat fee of \$650 per year for all single-family homes, regardless of size or number of occupants. The yearly rate may be subject to price increases, as are most things, in the future. "It's not required. If the \$650 doesn't make this kind of a no-brainer, then it's up to you."

If all goes well, the 1858 Swan River Schoolhouse's exterior will soon be scraped, sealed, and a spanking-new

coat of white paint will replace its peeling façade, along with other renovations.

Among plans is a new foundation. "The south wall has bowed out, the floor joists are not being supported, and underneath is supposed to be a concrete slab or footing," explained Greater Patchogue Historical Society treasurer, Steve Lucas. "The cedar shake roof also needs attention. There must be an inch of moss on top, so it's constantly damp all the time."

"I'm wondering if the moss is holding it together," Guy DiLauro joked, but maybe not. Trustee DiLauro was cited by Lucas as GPHS's unofficial construction and home remodeling expert.

A resolution introduced by councilman Neil Foley and passed by Brookhaven Town earlier this month was approved to address these and other issues; \$360,000 from the general fund balance was okayed, with \$350,000 to be funneled towards construction and \$10,000 towards engineering costs.

Foley estimated work would start in 60 to 90 days.

'Our parks commissioner, Eddie Morris, will work with Steve." Foley said. "Depending on the project inside we can plan for what's needed, but the bigger projects will be put out for a Request for Proposal. Every year we pushed for this, but we finally had extra funds to utilize,

and also, we're racing against the clock." "Steve has been fighting for this for years and without his passion, it wouldn't

have taken place," he added. This little historical jewel, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, is an endearing fixture on Roe Avenue in East Patchogue. It welcomed schoolchildren until 1936, then was used as a shelter to protect them from the weather while waiting for school buses. (It was also used as a polling location in 1962 after plumbing, heating, and electricity were added, Lucas said.) A Town of Brookhaven property, the schoolhouse was utilized by Brookhaven from 1962 to 1970 as a local history museum; exhibits highlighting the town and its inhabitants were frequently displayed. A new brick walkway, replacing the crumbling concrete, as well as a new railing for those who need a bit of extra support, was installed by the town in 2015.

The 50-pound bell that sat atop the steeple (both were swept off during the hurricane of 1938; the bell is now inside) signaled kids that classes would begin. Many worked on their family's farms, and the bell could be heard for miles.

To emphasize the point, DiLauro rang the bell. "Cover your ears," he said.

Yep, it was loud.

On the wish list was replicating the steeple with the bell in it.

Interestingly, the inside was in good shape. Painted white to reflect outdoor light through the seven original glass windows when electricity wasn't an option, there were eight wood beams, the original wood floor was painted gray, and a pot-bellied stove sat in the middle of the 25.6-by-19.6-foot-wide room. (It's now

in the back.)

All grades assembled into 11 wooden benches with attached desks and a shelf underneath for books. Three children could easily fit together.

The hole for inkwells when quill pens were used are still there.

The small alcove in front, with a desk for the teacher and bookshelves, displayed the original books used, like readers for spelling, arithmetic, geography and history.

A display case sat in the back with black-and-white photos that included John Venk's Class, Oct. 1921, as well as items like a metal folding lunchbox and an Arithmetic Inductive Method of Instruction from student Leo E. King, dating back to 1893.

A few years ago, two teachers got permission to hold their wedding here with a minister.

"They were big into history," Lucas

Open houses have been offered in July and August, as well as tours by request and appointment.

School tours of the schoolhouse used to be part of the fourth-grade curricu-

"The first question we always got was what grade was taught here, and when we told them it was first to eighth, it took a while to wrap their heads around that," Lucas said.

"When they hear students had to use an outhouse, that was surprise," offered DiLauro. Lucas said school tours stopped 20 years ago. He had approached a former Patchogue-Medford school superintendent, who was enthusiastic, to resurrect them, but the tours never materialized.

Lucas was hoping to ask the school district again and bring them back. ■

# Rechler submits self-conducted traffic study

# Neither the county nor town have record of it

Back in July, the developers for the Greybarn site at the former Mediterranean Manor, located at **EAST** 303 East Main Street in East Patchogue, **PATCHOGUE** sought site-plan

approval for the redevelopment of 3.42 acres of land. Both the Town of Brookhaven planning board and zoning board have since approved the site plan.

The plan includes demolition of all existing structures, including the former catering hall, barber shop and photo studio, as well as several vacated and boarded surrounding buildings. The neighboring building to the east, including Miller's Mint and the old antique mall, will remain, with the construction of a three-story, 91-unit (mix of one-bedroom and two-bedroom) multi-family rental apartment building complex, which includes associated parking, a swimming pool and outdoor amenity area, dog park, landscaping, and drainage.

According to the developer Greg Rechler, of Rechler Equity Partners LLC, the development will conform with the neighborhood while providing a much-needed revitalization as a luxury apartment complex. The site, he said, will include all the amenities Long Islanders are accustomed to, including washers, dryers, and additional commu-

nity kitchens, an outdoor pool, and billiard and screening rooms. Rechler also noted the similarities with Amityville Greybarn, which has a 99 percent occupancy rate and an 80 percent resident retention rate compared to the market average of 55.

"Rechler Equity Partners is excited to begin work on Grevbarn Patchogue. This location will serve as the first major redevelopment project in East Patchogue and build on the economic development success of Patchogue Village," said the developers.

East Patchogue resident Joseph Lucas, who was one of two speakers during the July public hearing, noted concern over traffic in the area and specifically referenced plans for three separate apartment complexes in the East Main Street area between Washington Avenue and Route 112. He also questioned if a traffic study was done, referencing his inability to acquire one despite multiple requests to both the town and county.

A traffic study, according to Rechler Equity, has been conducted by a consul-

tant hired by the company and is still under review by the county. However, as of print, this publication has been unable to obtain said traffic study. Additionally, neither councilman Neil Foley or Suffolk County Legis. Dominick Thorne have seen the study. According to Thorne, Department of Public Works commissioner Joe Brown confirmed the study had not yet been submitted; however, because demolition has not yet been done, there is plenty of time to conduct the study. Additionally, Lucas said during the planning board meeting he was told the county DPW had approved the traffic plan and that the town wasn't required to do the traffic study.

According to the Town of Brookhaven, the road is a state highway, and as per their files, the site requires Suffolk County DPW approval for signalization. However, contrastingly, according to an email in an effort to obtain a document through a Freedom of Information request, provided by Lucas, the county DPW suggests traffic studies in question are under the jurisdiction of the Town of Brookhaven. As per James O'Connell, local law compliance coordinator of the SCDPW, SCDPW doesn't have the authority to approve these traffic studies. He then suggested that Lucas contact the town's law department.

According to Rechler Equity, a traffic study for the project was submitted to the SCDPW as part of the application process. Currently, they are filing an application for a building permit as the next step of the process. ■

"First, I would ask them their preference and their sizes, and this and that, and then I would FaceTime them in the boutique and select clothing for them, and then I would deliver downstairs curbside," Boyd said.

During the pandemic, Dress for Success also continued to facilitate their job readiness programs through Zoom, which has inspired them to continue more of an in-person and online hybrid curriculum, to be as inclusive and accessible to as many women as possible, who may not have transportation to get to the physical location for support.

"So, our big goal and our big announcement will be that we are going to take it on the road and get a mobile career center," she explained. "That will be our next plan."

Boyd explained that each one of their clients has a mentor, in addition to all the sartorial assistance given to the women. In addition to mentorships and the job program, there is the Dress for Success centerpiece, the Chic Boutique, which is at Brookhaven Town Hall and evokes a high-end personal shopping experience, which is very different from what one would experience sifting through racks at a thrift shop, for instance.

"We prepare the ladies for their interviews, and once they get their job, they're able to come back for the clothing," she added. "It's really head-to-toe [including] accessories, shoes, handbags, whatever it is that they need for their upcoming job."

Dress for Success is a 501(c)3 not-forprofit organization that empowers women to achieve economic independence by providing a network of support, professional attire, and the developmental tools and skills to assist them in thriving in a competitive 21st-century workforce. 

This first annual event enjoyed a tremendous success with 84 cars featured, with the oldest car being from 1928: a Model A Ford pickup truck owned by Patrick Perry, a dispatcher for the Patchogue Village Fire Department, Ambulance and Code Enforcement. He shares ownership of this remarkably restored

piece of history with his father, Eugene Perry, also a member of the Patchogue Fire Department, and his brother, Chris Perry. Patrick shared the incredible story of how this automobile, hailing from the first decade when Henry Ford innovated mass-production techniques that set the standard for car manufacturers, ended up in his family tree.

It's the BGC's 91st year, and their first garden show in five years.

"We chose botanical arts as our division for a theme," said BGC Flower Show committee member Jean Coakely. "We went out on a limb for this one. Instead of just a regular vase with an arrangement, botanical arts challenges the way you use the plants. The Moriches Garden Club used photography and jewels in their show in the past. The Southampton Garden Club has utilized shoes."

Division II is horticulture, "The Secret Garden," with Sections A, flowering shrubs and trees; B, perennials; C, bulbs, corms, tubers and rhizome; D, succulents; E, herbs. There are eight classes among them in the lower level.

Photography, the Special Exhibit, "Gone With the Wind," will take place in the café. It's eligible for a People's Choice Award.

Serious rules for the show abound. "The reason there are rules is that we belong to the National Garden Clubs Inc.," Coakly said of the not-for-profit formed in 1929 that fosters the love of gardening and floral design, but also civic and environmental responsibility. Projects include community gardening, educational programs, college scholarships and grants for youth clubs, and planting pollinating

"We have National Garden Club judges," said South Country Library trustee and BGC Flower Show committee member Lorraine Kuhn. "They'll be here, and we pay for their lunches." Top winners get engraved silver and pewter trays. ■

# **Protect** yourself during the cyber attack

n or about Sept. 8, Suffolk County officials determined that the county's systems had been affected by a cyberattack. The attack has disrupted legislator emails, postponed the date of civil service examinations, and forced the county to hire experts to help.

Addtionally, our news outlets such as the Long Island Advance, Islip Bulletin and Suffolk County News have been unable to look up police incidents and write out police blotters.

The issue has affected county emails as well as websites, so the county created a temporary landing page that housed information for residents. Thankfully, phone numbers including 9-11 and 311, as well as parks, remained functional. However, according to local legislators, they are encouraging their constituents to call the offices rather than email for safety and immediate assistance.

Additionally, the county released steps residents can take to keep their information safe as well as what to do if they believe their information has been compromised.

The county noted that residents should regularly review account statements and periodically obtain their credit report. If anything looks suspicious, call the credit reporting agency listed in the report, or report the matter to law enforcement. Fraud alerts should be placed on credit files so that users are alerted if anything is amiss. Residents can also put a security freeze on their credit report that prevents most potential creditors from viewing credit reports and restricts the opening of unauthorized accounts. The county noted that restoration will be meticulous as to make sure that no attacks happen again. Everything is expected to reopen up in stages as they are cleaned and fixed.

# 'HALLELUJAH': Leonard Cohen, a journey, a song

The documentary "Hallelujah," directed by Daniel Geller and Dayna Goldfine, explores the life and times behind Leonard Cohen's most famous song, first released in 1984,



and performed and recorded to date by over 350 performers with over 60 instrumental recorded versions. The song, as Cohen confesses, comes from a place "no one knows, that is grace. That is a gift." But it took him seven years to write it, condensing 80 to 180 different verses down into four that were finally recorded. Columbia Records refused to market the Cohen album "Various Positions," on which the song was included on the flip side, neither understanding its religious or musical structure, nor its appeal to an audience in search of romantic spiritual/sexual enlightenment.

Cohen knew his work was good, and wanted it to be seen as secular, not bound by religious doctrine, and so Columbia's rejection was devastating. Then Bob Dylan performed it live in 1988 in Hollywood, a raunchy rendition full of passion, emphasized by his own personal unique phrasing that initiated the importance of this song in live performance. In 1991, John Cale released a recording of it on his album in his own style, rendering every line of poetry with full-throated melodic lines, which were then picked up by the golden voice of Jeff Buckley, son of Tim Buckley, to render it in its current, most popular rendition on his album titled "Grace." Buckley said he would be embarrassed for Cohen to hear it, as it was probably "too boyish." Boyish? Or sounding

like the song fell out of the sky full of "grace," like an Icarus with singed wings?

Documentarians Geller and Goldfine ("Ballets Russes") recall their interview with Dominique Issermann when trying to reveal Cohen's creative process, describing the song "Hallelujah": "It's like a bird that is touching the walls of culture. It is very symbolic. It is very mysterious." Recently there's the live performance of the song at the Patchogue Theatre for the Performing Arts by Chris Judge and the Red Hot Chili Pipers that lifted the ceiling off that old classic theatre with a full choir of bagpipes.

Cohen's journey to fame began when Judy Collins pulled him out of the dark shadows of his poetry and urged him to join her in a live performance of his first big hit song, "Suzanne." He got stage fright and walked off, only to return to great applause. "Suzanne" went on to induce many youths, including myself, to follow Cohen's muse in search of love with all its highs and lows. I dropped out of college and eloped to Europe.

In 1994, Cohen spent five years at Mount Baldy Zen Centre to "get straight with himself" after a bout with alcohol. He left the center

to return to his poetry and music with renewed faith. Cohen's personal rabbi, Mordecai Finley, recalls: "We all spoke about feeling that we were in the service of the Muse [the Bat Kol].'


Having studied piano under Dr. Ted Alexander, master jazz pianist from Denver, I learned various positions for jazz chords, and for years I wondered over the secret chord mentioned in this song. In the piano's heptatonic scale, there's a half-step between the third note (E) and the fourth note (F), and again the seventh (B) and eighth (C). Cohen points out this secret chord that "pleased" his Lord David, that baffled him. The eight-note scale, like a ladder with two broken rungs leading first a halfstep down into a minor (despair), and then reaching the top with a final half-step up to a major (delight), could be what the poet James Stevens might call "Strict Joy."

Looking at Cohen's life through the lens of his "Tower of Song" about relations and the "Various Positions" album that Columbia refused to promote, perhaps he simply means for us to climb this broken ladder in our own lives. In the face of a world vou cannot make sense of, "you either raise your fist, or you sing Hallelujah." ■

# **Voices Rising Film Festival at Plaza MAC**

Film Festival is playing Sept. 30 through Oct. 2

Roman, the co-organizer of the Babylon Pride Parade, will walk the red carpet on Friday, Sept. 30 at 5 p.m. She'll perform

PATCHOGUE before "Knock Out Blonde" debuts at Plaza Cinema & Media Arts

Center. It's one of three selections being shown that night as part of the Voices Rising Film Festival, a weekend offering through Sunday, Oct. 2, celebrating independent, new, and alternate filmmakers. Other performers include Andrew Vass and Raquel Castro with the poignantly heartfelt "You Will Be Okay," as well as Chris Milo and Tim Eletto.

"Twenty-five people are flying in for the 'Knock Out Blonde' opening from London, a mix of film crew and family friends," said Jaret Martino, who envisioned Voices Rising in association with Awareness Media, Love Wins Productions, and My Mind Enterprises. "They will be in the audience and will participate in our question-and-answer panel."

Patchogue will have lots of visitors, Martino pointed out. "We have people coming in from Belgium and other locations, and they'll be looking for places to eat and stay," he said.

Plaza MAC executive director Catherine Oberg was asked if she envisioned film festivals when the nonprofit was formed over 10 years ago.

"I knew film festivals were a full-time job," she said. "As a filmmaker, I'd send in my entries to upcoming festival organizers to be judged and knew the process was overwhelming. I met with Jaret in February, and he already had a platform. It's a good partnership. We offer quality

mainstream and independent films. But these are truly independent, and the topics are important and engaging. What's unique is getting the artists as well as the audience to discuss the topics. And there are panels with resources to improve their worlds."

Oberg thanked the Greater Patchogue Foundation for its financial support and Patchogue Arts Council.

The first film, "Knock Out Blonde," chronicles the life of Kellie Maloney, formerly Frank Maloney, a famed boxing promoter who guided Lennox Lewis to become the heavyweight boxing champ of the world

Two subsequent films to be shown that evening include "Saving Mary Alice," about an abuse survivor, and "O'Kelley Legends: 2E Behind the Scenes," about 13-year-old Jordan O'Kelley, who adapts his book into a show fundraiser supporting the emotional needs of the gifted.

The films range from one and a half hours to 19 minutes. With some, it's less.

"It's a mix between feature and short films," Martino explained.

What's particularly pivotal with this film festival is that advocates will be in the audience to discuss the films' topics. Eric Lella, DO RPCV Senegal, assistant clinical professor, family medicine, and neuromusculoskeletal medicine and medical director of the Edie Windsor Healthcare Center at Stony Brook, will be on hand Friday night and for "Saving Mary Alice"; Amanda Myczkowsk from The Safe Center and Vicki Cooper, Lily Cooper, and Sarah Sampson will be there from The Retreat - All Against Abuse; as well as Ashlev Nicolls from EOC-Suffolk. Also, Robert Vitelli and Brian Rosen from LGBT Network will attend.

Four more films will be shown Saturday, Oct. 1: "Bring Her Home," which follows three Indigenous women who fight to vindicate their missing and murdered relatives; "Culture and Community," which shows an American Indian family near San Francisco who dance and participate in pow wows to honor their ancestors; and "Resilience," which chronicles an Indigenous family's efforts to rebuild their sacred gathering place after a huge wildfire destroys it. Martino has reached out to local tribes for their representation and was waiting to hear who their speakers would be. From "Darkness to Light: The Peter Krueger Clinic," tells the story of this amazing clinic and its HIV efforts over three decades.

"Stony Brook University Hospital has connected with us, and several of their professionals will attend," Martino emphasized. That includes Adam Gonzalez, Ph.D., director of behavioral health; Allison Eliscu, MD, FAAP, associate director of clinical pediatrics (Dr. Eliscu is very involved in LGBTQ+ health care for adolescents); and Rose Cardin, M.S.N. R.N., director patient education, Stony

Brook Medicine.

Four more films, "Look In My Eyes," "Uprooted," "After Laughter," "A Paid Connection" and "This is What New Yorkers Say," are scheduled for Sunday. Plus, there are bonus shorts.

Martino said there has been much more support since the Love Wins series in June at Plaza MAC. "We continue to climb and get support," he said.

Suffice it to say, there's a lot of hard work involved. Oberg pointed out that operations manager Rick Eberle works to convert every film to top quality, and they're audio checked. (Eberle has a wide breadth of experience including publicist, agent, musician and marketing.) "It takes a lot of time to do the digital work," she said.

Voices Rising was specifically targeted towards Black, minority filmmakers, and trans individuals, Martino said. But with the multitude out there, how are the films chosen?

"We have 25 assistant programmers that judge in 12 technical categories," Martino said. "They write notes on overall quality. Then industry professionals take a look." As for the Plaza MAC venue, "Voices Rising needed a safe and inclusive space to be heard," Martino said. "The filmmakers can walk away feeling empowered and move on to their personal journey."

The Voices Rising General Film Festival is playing Sept. 30 through Oct. 2. Admission is \$9 a film; members pay \$9 per day; an all-access pass is \$125.

# 'I'd rather have my dad in a dress than a box'

Documentary of legendary boxing promoter premieres at local film festival

Being a public persona grants you a wide audience, a gift artists and influencers can spend a lifetime chasing, but it also burdens you with unabashed opinions, a burden that can rattle even the most steadfast of minds.

For Kellie Maloney, the United Kingdom's top boxing promoter who represented Lennox Lewis at his peak and became a well-known British personality, her journey as a trans woman was made public against her will.

At the Voices Rising Film Festival in Patchogue on Terry Street, an authorized biography of Maloney will premiere on Sept. 30, aptly titled "Knock-Out Blonde."

The *Long Island Advance* interviewed Maloney about her thoughts on the film, reckoning with her controversial past (and present) that has put her at odds with the LGBT community, and the parts of her transition and journey that were not put out for public consumption.

What does the film show of your story, your transition, that has not been captured publicly?

It also shows the struggle that the family goes through. What a lot of peo-

ple forget—I'm a big supporter of my community and do as much as I can to help them—we think we're the only ones on this journey, and you don't realize your family is in it, too.

You've said your biggest supporters are your mother and three daughters—how did they help you?

Unfortunately, my mother is now in the throes of dementia. But when I told her, she was brilliant. My oldest daughter, Emma, she was my rock from the start. Her words, "I'd rather have my dad in a dress than a box," were the most comforting words said to me. My two younger girls struggled. They only knew their dad as the No. 1 boxing promoter. My youngest daughter struggled for a long time. They did support me.

You said you felt like an actor, playing the role of the boxing promoter. How did you go about putting that together? Was that a conscious choice putting together such a masculine bravado?

I think a lot of it was the neighborhood I was brought up in. Rather rough. No one wanted to be an outcast; the football team I followed in south London had a bad reputation. If you met my dad, he was a real character; he said 'A boy is a boy, and a boy does this and a boy does that.'

You said you were very supportive of your community—a found family. Is that something you find that reso-

nates in your journey?

Some people I've met have not completed their journey, and sadly are now in another world. Some lost their family, some kept their family. I don't think many are as open as I am in the community. It was not my choice to be open, as much of a public figure as I am because of my family. Your duty as a parent, no matter what your gender is, is to protect your children, and a very important part of being a parent.

When you first transitioned and came out publicly, what were your biggest fears of being out in the public?

Being rejected by them. Being seen as a pervert. I used to read all these websites and forums, and I read about other trans people being crucified. That was the reason I wanted to transition privately and disappear as Frank. My plan was to move to Portugal and live my life privately there.

# How were you first approached about the film series?

I met Rick when he was doing the film about Lennox. I was in Florida giving a talk about trans issues. A couple of months later, Rick called me and said, 'You're in all the footage and your story is fantastic. Would you be interested in us doing documentary?' I'm very pleased they have done it... there was one in the U.K., but it was more of a tabloid, because the U.K. loves tabloids, sensationalism, and it never got the message across.



I'm happy to do to things as long as they're educational and they help people. I feel my mission is now—though I will retire some time next year from all public engagements—I just feel that I've been given the chance to help people and I want to get the right message across.

Would you say that the versions you've seen of the film capture that battling of two sides?

Yes, one of the things in there, which I didn't really want in there, was when I attempted suicide. I had recorded a message on my phone to my daughters and dogs, and my dogs have been part of my journey.

I think it's the most important part of the film. I've never had the courage to delete it. When I'm weak, I go back and watch that video and think of my daughters, and how could they go through life?

# Bellport alum signs with Canadian Football League


High School alumnus has signed a contract with the BC Lions of the British Columbia Canadian Football league.

Nate was the leading rusher for Bellport Football in 2010-11 and 2011-2012. He was inducted into the Bellport Football Hall of Fame in 2021. He graduated and continued his education and football career at Sacred Heart University in Fairfield, Conn. There he achieved all conference for two of the four years he played.

After Sacred Heart, Nate went to Cedar Rapids River Kings of the Indoor Football League (IFL) as a kick returner and running back in 2018. He was the number one running back on the team with an average 5.5 yards per carry and 13 touchdowns. Kickoff return, Nate gained 699 yards on 34 attempts and 20 receptions for 162 yards for a total of 3,715 all-purpose yards. Then the pandemic hit.

After the pandemic, Nate signed a contract with the Sioux Falls Storm in Sioux Falls, South Dakota in 2021. He was the kickoff return specialists and starting running back. He was awarded the IFL special team's player of the year. Nate amassed 1,239 yards on 58 attempts and ran 3 for touchdowns.

Nathaniel Chavious a 2012 Bellport He was the first player in the IFL to be honored for two different positions. He had 19 touchdowns as a running back. He continued to play for the Storm in

Using her connections to the National Park Services, the Village of Patchogue, and St. Joseph's University's Biology and Sustainability clubs, Jackson soon started the well-known yearly event on the island to try and make a lasting change.

In the past two years alone, the Patchogue River Cleanup Event has cleansed the area of over 550 pounds of waste that would have further polluted the beautiful park area. Items normally found by volunteers include dozens of cigarettes, plastic bottles, beer cans, ditched clothing, and even diapers, according to concerned citizen Don Wachsmuth, also known as "Mr. Volunteer." With dozens of citizens volunteering their time at the event this year, hundreds of pounds of waste will be gathered to make the nearby park and lake area just a bit cleaner from environmental neglect.

"It is really great every year to see the community come out," Jackson exclaimed. "It proves how communities can come together to bring a larger impact on their environment than the individuals themselves." ■






