St. John's turns 125

For 125 years, St. John's the Evangelist Roman Catholic Church in Center Moriches has been inspired by their patrons with a mission to bring the light of Christ to a world in need.

"From the celebration of the Eucharist, we are sent forth to serve God and neighbor through ministries of formation, education and outreach," their mission reads.

Originally a Catholic church in the parlor of an East Moriches home, to a wooden church in the same town, the church we all know today was built on Montauk Highway 125 years ago.

The church's first Mass was celebrated on Aug. 1, 1897, although it was not a formal dedication because Bishop Charles McDonnell of the Brooklyn Diocese was in Europe at the time. The church was dedicated a year later on Aug. 7, 1897.

The church was built by architect R.L. Daus of Brooklyn, the president of the Brooklyn Institute Department of Architecture. Messrs. Stevenson and Company were the builders of See ST. JOHN'S on page 4

Waterdrinker Family Farm hosts Tulip Festival

There's nothing prettier than a field of freshly bloomed tulips, seriously. You can check it out for yourself at Waterdrinker Farm's annual Tulip Festival, which will likely extend to the first week in May.

This year there were approximately

two million tulips planted, more than ever before (the first festival took place in 2019). The nearly monthlong event is considered Long Island's largest tulip festival and it brings out thousands of people. This year, visitors were invited to pick their own tulip bouquets for \$1 per stem. Also new is an interactive tunnel designed to showcase the beauty and provenance of tulips.

"New this year is our tulip tunnel. It's kind of like a mini museum about the Netherlands, so visitors can learn a little bit about what makes tulips so special," said Marc Weiss, manager at Waterdrinker Farm.

From the Netherlands to Long Island and everywhere in between, tulips seem to pop up everywhere this time of year. So, what makes tulips the flower of choice for so many local green thumbs? Brittney Weiss, manager at Waterdrinker Farm, has a theory.



At The Writer's Table, good writing is always up for discussion

Words are having a moment. From spoken word open mic nights to poetry slams, to the popularity of "The Moth Radio Hour," good writing is all the rage. But for the members of The Writer's Table in Center Moriches, words have always been hip.

One Saturday a month, they gather at the Center Moriches Public Library to read their writing to each other. The group numbers about 10 people, who range in age from 60s to 80s. The Writer's Table offers a judgment-free space in which writers can share their work and receive appreciation, gentle feedback, and encouragement.

"You just feel like you're in the presence of a lot of talent," said Angela Werner, 61, of Center Moriches, the group's moderator for the past 10 years and a self-described "word person."

The group is sponsored by the Friends of the Library. It started more than 20 years ago, with a focus on poetry. These days, the work is as varied as the life experiences of the group's members. On a recent Saturday, the writing ranged from Lorna Coppola's science fiction to Betty Brown's autobiographical reminiscences of growing up near the Mississippi River, to David Fredette's poetry to Len Slatest's domestic drama between a husband and wife.

"Our writing deserves respect," said Jane Tintle, 76, an artist and recently retired real estate agent from Center Moriches. "Where else am I going to experience this? Nowhere else."

The work can sometimes be deeply personal and for some, a way of coming to terms with life's challenges. "Everything I experience in life, I write down," said Dorothy Mato of Hampton Bays, whose husband died four years ago. "I write about grief and self-discovery and living alone now.'

Mato, 81, is working on a memoir about her life growing up in Jersey City, including the years she and her sisters spent in an orphanage.

Diane Morelli, 60, of Hampton Bays, read her poem reflecting on her experience of working in Lower Manhattan in the weeks and years after the Sept. 11 attack on the World Trade Center. She's hoping to have the poem published.

"I haven't found the right venue for it, but I will," said Morelli, who, like several members of the group, have had their work printed in various publications.

Other members have self-published their novels or short stories.

Several also belong to a writer's group that meets at the Hampton Bays Public Library.

Will Hill, 70, of Medford, read a short story he wrote about a condemned prisoner walking his last mile to his execution. The story packed an incredible amount of detail into two short pages.

"I don't want it to be too obvious," he said of the story's ending.

Writing can be a solitary pursuit, but being part of a community of writers makes it easier to keep putting pen to paper or fingers to computer keyboard.

'It gives us a push to get those creative juices flowing," said Werner. "Because you know you're going to get together next month." ■

the gothic building and originally had a seating capacity of 400, 82 feet long by 46 wide. The stained glass was manufactured by Hensleiter & Company, also from Brooklyn.

By 1914, Fr. John Donlan was in his fifth year as pastor when St. John's was incorporated. At that time, the exterior was updated and a porch was added. Pastor Donlan then began a school building fund in 1920 and the school opened in 1926. The church continued to expand over the years with Fr. Thomas Schlan, Fr. Stanislaus Kowalski and Fr. Andrew

In celebration of the anniversary, the church is hosting a cocktail dinner party at Rock Hill Golf Club on June 9. The church will also be holding an anniversary Mass on Saturday, June 11 at 5 p.m. with Bishop Robert J. Coyle, the vicar for the Eastern and Western Suffolk Vicariates.

St. John's has parish office rectory hours in the blue house on Ocean Avenue. This is where people can make appointments to meet priests, pick up a Mass card, drop off materials, and is usually the first stop at SJE. Hours are 9:30 a.m. to 9 p.m. from Monday-Thursday and from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. from Friday to Sunday. The staff closes each day at noon for break.

Other band members include AJ Horton, lead guitar, from Albany; bassist Chris Alvarado, from Brooklyn; and vocalist and rhythm guitarist Bella Phinney, from Watertown. The band was formed by four SUNY Oneonta musicians known for their energy and dedication to the audience with their upbeat performances.

The up-and-coming band has opened for the nationally touring act Flo Rida and is currently on a New York tour promoting their recent singles. Rib & The Bones takes influence from The Strokes, Peach Pit, and Cage The Elephant, while adding their own funky grooves into the mix.

For those looking for a night of dancing and great music, you can catch the band back home at the Long Island Music and Entertainment Hall of Fame on June 18. Part of LIMEHOF's mission is to spotlight up-and-coming local Long Island talent.

ABOUT LIMEHOF

Founded in 2004, the Long Island Music Hall of Fame is a 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to the idea that Long Island's musical heritage is an important resource to be celebrated and preserved for future generations. The organization, which encompasses New York State's Nassau, Suffolk, Queens, and Kings (Brooklyn) counties, was created as a place of community that inspires and explores Long Island music in all its forms. To date, the organization has inducted more than 100 musicians and music industry executives, and also offers education programs and scholarships, and awards to Long Island students and educators.

The first exhibit features replicas of clubs, with videos of artists performing, ads, posters, instruments, and an exact replica of a typical 1970s stage, with vintage equipment and sound system. There is also a permanent "Hall of Fame" with plaques and exhibits recognizing over 120 inductees, as well as areas for a library, classrooms for educational programs and master classes, a surround -sound theater and a gift shop with music and entertainment themed memorabilia.


Drama club musical a hit

CM student completes service project

Center Moriches student Meghan Bukowski recently completed a community service project, collecting more than 100 letters from elementary school students for veterans traveling on the annual Honor Flight.

Bukowski said she decided to help because last spring, her uncle was one of the veterans on the Honor Flight.

"He was so impressed with the organization and the trip that he brought my cousins and I to the commemorative ceremony in August," she said, noting they met several veterans he flew with and were presented with memory books from the trip. "I knew I would be working on a community service project this year, so I asked my uncle for their contact information."

Once she got in touch, she offered to create letters for their mail call.

"I knew my uncle appreciated the letters he received. There are some veterans who don't have family to send cards, and so I thought I could help fill that need," she explained.

She also prepared a slide show about the organization and teamed up with her 12th-grade social studies teacher, Dr. Flynn-Trace, and her former third-grade teacher, Mrs. Volo. She then visited their classrooms and helped the students write thank-you cards for the veterans.

"She did an awesome job!" added mail call coordinator Jane Koropsak.

Koropsak coordinates "mail call" for the veterans flying on Honor Flights by contacting their family and friends and allowing them to write letters to their veteran. A mailbag is then created for each veteran to read during their flight.

Also, they collect photos of the veterans from their time serving. The photos are then shown on the bus as they travel around Washington, D.C.

The most recent Honor Flight event took place recently, on April 29. 152 acres preserved in Manorville

The Town of Brookhaven recently acquired 152 wooded acres in Manorville as open space. According to councilman Dan Panico, the preservation will help protect multiple species, including horned owls.

The parcel is located on the corner of Moriches-Middle Island Road and Weeks Avenue. The preservation came as a transfer of development rights trade with a developer for the Meadows project on William Floyd Parkway in Yaphank.


"If we've learned any lessons during the past few decades, perhaps the most important is that preservation of our environment is not a partisan challenge; it's common sense. Our physical health, our social happiness, and our economic well-being will be sustained only by all of us working in partnership as thoughtful, effective stewards of our natural resources," Panico said, quoting Ronald Reagan. "President Reagan said those words in 1984, and they remain relevant and true today. There is a value to open spaces and wooded property. Far too often, people are labeled as pro-development or pro-environment; however, the two goals are not mutually exclusive. You can achieve responsible development/redevelopment and preserve land for future generations by working proactively with a broader view and understanding of land use and zoning."

Panico said he is proud to not only have preserved the large amount of land, but also to do so without costing the taxpayers money. ■

Church celebrates anniversary with piano and organ concert

The Presbyterian Church of the Moriches hosted a piano and organ concert performed by concert pianist Michele Garzo on Sunday, April 16, as part of a year-long celebration of the church's 275th anniversary.

"Longtime members of Presbyterian Church USA at Center Moriches have said [they] have never heard the organ pipes played like Michele plays—there are pipes that have never been heard before," said temporary supply pastor Mark Applewhite.

Garzo played selections written by classical composers such as Frederic Chopin and Franz Liszt on the church's piano in front of a crowd of parishioners. The last composition, Johann Sebastian Bach's "Toccata and Fugue in D Minor," was performed on the church's vintage organ. The event was hosted by a special church committee tasked with organizing the anniversary celebration. The church hopes the concert and subsequent celebratory events will raise public awareness of the church's extensive history and longstanding role in the Center Moriches community.

"The church is a beautiful building with a rich local history at the center of the town," said Herb Fisher, a church member who serves on the 275th anniversary committee as well as the church's property management and finance committees.

Garzo, who hails from Calabria, Italy, has dedicated numerous years of his life to the pursuit of music. He was admit-

ted into a conservatory when he was 11 years old and graduated when he was 15 years old. Garzo has vigorously pursued his career as a concert pianist, but he has also invested his talent into the Presbyterian Church of the Moriches. He succeeded Kamilla Ozman, who played for the church over the span of five years, as the church's organist. Additionally, he also currently serves as the director of music for the church and plays music for the church's weekly 10:30 a.m. Sunday

"Coming halfway around the world, I am deeply thankful for the opportunity, the love, and the warmth I daily receive,' said Garzo. "I [play] with my whole heart because I found a second family. I feel joy playing, I really do, and I hope to convey just as much of [that joy] to the attendees."

The organ Garzo played at the end of the concert has been a feature of the church for over a century. The instrument was designed by the Estey organ company in 1908; Applewhite and Fisher claim employees working for inventor and General Electric founder Thomas Edison installed the organ in the church. A series of refurbishments to the organ were made throughout the 1960s, and the whole construct was rebuilt in 1979. The organ is currently in the middle of a fiveyear refurbishment plan that will allow it to continue enthralling church Masses for decades to come.

"It is one of the very few church organs on Long Island that has not been converted to electronic," said Bill Phillips, a ruling elder of the church and



the chair of the property management committee. "The original bellows are in our basement."

The Presbyterian Church of the Moriches aims to emphasize its deep commitment to the Center Moriches community throughout its anniversary celebration. The church has begun the installation of display cabinets that will showcase antique documents illustrating the church's history with the com-

Other events will be hosted that aim to enrich the bond between the church and the community. An annual three-course Victorian tea will be hosted on May 13, and a fall celebration themed to the War for Independence will be held on Sept. 23. The church will also host a Christmas fair in November. Applewhite, who is the chaplain of the Sons of the American Revolution, will be involved with the dedication of a sign paying tribute to five colonial soldiers buried in Olde Beachfern Cemetery on May 7.

"Our church has a deep relationship with the community," Phillips said. ■



Caputo's players have continued at the college level the hard work and team-oriented attitude they learned at Eastport-South Manor.

"It's team first, not me first," Caputo said. "They're willing to put themselves behind what the team needs."

"Coach McGowan does a really good job of getting everybody ready," said Robles, who graduated from Eastport-South Manor in 2016. "His attention to detail for all aspects of the game really gets you ready for college.'

That attention to detail is paying off on the field at St. Joseph's.

Sanguedolce, an All-League selection in high school in 2019, was selected as the most outstanding player in last year's Skyline Conference tournament. He is hitting .342 this season, with 13 RBIs and 13 stolen bases.

Foran. two-time All-County player in high school, is among the leaders in innings pitched for St. Joseph's and averaging more than six strikeouts per nine innings. Masino, a



The Mastics-Moriches-Shirley Community Library opened the doors to a modern, new 7,000-square-foot Satellite Branch Library at 201 Montauk Highway in Moriches at a ribbon-cutting ceremony on Saturday, April 15.

The public helped mark the launch of the new library by joining local officials at the event. The new satellite branch is, for the first time, providing convenient access to library patrons residing in the library district's northern section.

The opening of the new Moriches satellite branch represents this year's second milestone in an overall multi-project expansion of Mastics-Moriches-Shirley Community Library services.

On Jan. 14, the district opened a new, 7,000-square-foot Mastic Beach Satellite Branch at 369 Neighborhood Road. That facility has quickly generated enthusiastic public support and patronage. Since its opening, 726 patrons have signed up with new library cards at the Mastic Beach branch. An additional 603 patrons have asked that Mastic Beach serve as their "home library."

The two new branches in Moriches and Mastic Beach now join the district's main branch in Shirley, which is presently undergoing code-mandated and safety renovations as well as technological modernization.

As a result, for the first time ever, a streamlined and easily accessible library experience is soon to be available to residents throughout the district.

"Our library system is achieving a level of geographic accessibility that's unprecedented in the district's history,' said library director Kerri Rosalia. " $\check{\mathrm{W}}\mathrm{e}$ are confident that the new Moriches library will be warmly embraced by area

A library district-wide expansion and modernization program was set in motion by local voters on Dec. 10, 2019, through their approval of a \$22.7 million bond referendum. At the time of the referendum's approval, the district's sole library—situated at 407 William Floyd Parkway in Shirley—is 28 percent smaller than the recommended library size for a community with the district's population.

Underscoring the absence of adequate space, attendance at popular programs is curtailed due to lack of capacity. Moreover, the library has been forced to conduct hundreds of classes and meetings at off-site locations every year, which has proven to be costly, staff-intensive, and logistically cumbersome.

In addition to the creation of the two

new satellite branches, the referendum's passage also sets the stage for an extensive upgrade of the outdated main library in Shirley. Once it opens, the new Mastic Beach and Moriches branches will remain in permanent operation.

Main library services have been temporarily relocated to the Town of Brookhaven's Mastic Recreation Center at 15 Herkimer Street in Mastic.

"Library services play a major role in the life of a community, and the Town of Brookhaven is proud to make the Mastic Recreation Center available to the library district," said Brookhaven Town supervisor Ed Romaine. "We congratulate the Mastics-Moriches-Shirley Community Library upon its completion of two new satellite branches.'

The new satellite branch library in Moriches, designed by H2M architects

+ engineers in Melville, was built in the same architectural style as the existing 95-year-old Little Red Schoolhouse, a neighborhood landmark standing adjacent to the new library. The Moriches site offers ample parking and incorporates an expansive outdoor area suitable for both small and large outdoor programming.

A collection of popular reading materials, such as bestsellers, children's books, and DVDs, is housed in the Moriches building. Items requested from the main library, the Mastic Beach branch, and through interlibrary loan are available for pickup.

The library's flexible space includes dedicated areas for children, teens, and adults. All furniture and shelving has wheels so they can be moved to rearrange space as needed. The adult area offers seating for individual quiet work, multiple computers, and three program rooms. The children and teen areas have tables and chairs for students to do homework or study. There are dedicated computers for students to use. A program room within the space is adjustable in size with moveable walls.

Moriches design elements emphasize both cost savings and energy efficiency, according to library officials. Just as in Mastic Beach, the overall Moriches site promotes sustainability by adhering to LEED standards set forth by the U.S. Green Building Council.

Construction work at the Moriches site was undertaken through a competitive bidding process. The selected contractors were all based on Long Island, Sandpebble Builders of Southampton served as construction manager. ■ Courtesy photo







"Tulips are the first to bloom in spring. You plant them in November before the first frost and you have to wait for them to come up. It's the anticipation that gets people excited. It's that first burst of color that really pops,' she said.

Also exclusive to the event is a spe-

cial Dutch pilsner brew, called the "Tulip Fest" beer. The beer is sold only at Long Island Farm Brewery, located on the Waterdrinker Farm property. The pilsner is sold on tap or in a can.

The Tulip Festival is expected to continue until the first week in May, depending on the health of the bloom, according to Weiss.

"It's really up to Mother Nature how hot it's going to get," he said.

A burst of heat will cause the tulips to wilt, but if it stays cool, the life of the flowers will be extended.

The field is open seven days a week and admission is \$20 per person. A great time to visit is the weekend when there is live music and food trucks.

Next up is the Sunflower Festival, which will take place in the farm in July. For more information, check the Waterdrinker Farm website at www. water-drinker.com or on Instagram or Facebook. ■
