Animal cruelty charge for director of animal rescue

Clients shed light on alleged pattern of neglect

At least four volunteers at Ruff House Rescue (RHR) continuously urged director and president Diane Indelicato that Tali, a grey and white pitbull, needed immediate veterinary attention, accord-

ing to charging documents filed by the Suffolk County District Attorney's Office.

Days later, on Nov. 6, Tali was found dead in her kennel.

Formal complaints by RHR volunteers led to an investigation by the district attorney's Biological, Environmental and Animal Safety Team (BEAST). Authorities said in the charging documents that Tali was "in an obvious

danger of physical pain, suffering, and death" during her time at Ruff House Rescue, which is located on Higbie Lane in West Islip.

Tali suffered from multiple large, ulcerated masses on her abdomen that were actively leaking blood and pus; severe and apparent dermatological distress; obviously swollen limbs; noticeable respiratory distress; lethargy and general physical deterioration.

Indelicato was arrested March 17 and charged with one misdemeanor count of "torturing or injuring animals/failure to provide sustenance." She pleaded not guilty during her arraignment on March 31 and was released on her own recognizance.

Despite the details of Tali's condition, many of those who have experience with the nonprofit organization were

Volunteers tackle wetland cleanup

Early Saturday morning, Keep Islip Clean volunteers arrived at the intersection of Brook Street and Milton Street in Islip. Despite the rain, there was no shortage of enthusiasm. The event was part of the Great American Cleanup, a nationwide litter cleanup and beautification initiative organized by Keep America Beautiful.

Each year, Keep America Beautiful mobilizes about 500,000 volunteers nationwide to remove litter from roadways and waterways, plant trees and flowers, restore parks and recreation areas, and promote recycling initiatives.

In 2024, Keep Islip Clean volunteers collected more than 20,000 pounds of litter and planted native pollinators across the Town of Islip. This year, Keep Islip Clean aims to remove at least 25,000

pounds of litter, clean up parks and shorelines, advance recycling efforts, plant native species to enhance community green infrastructure and engage more than 1,000 volunteers.

Keep Islip Clean executive director Madeline Sharrock shared that the Brook Street Wetlands are frequently used as an illegal dumping ground. Over the years, volunteers have found tires, furniture, and car parts. In previous

cleanups, volunteers even stumbled upon a homeless encampment. Hazardous materials, such as used needles, are often discarded in the wetlands.

Sharrock added that some years are worse than others, but by hosting cleanups twice yearly, Keep Islip Clean hopes to deter further littering. She anticipates collecting nearly 250 pounds of garbage, but 300 pounds would be a huge haul.

Islip High School freshmen win Best Project at Long Island Youth Summit

Islip High School freshmen Max Kjeldsen and Sara Pellegrino won an award for Best Project in the climate change category at the Long Island Youth Summit, held April 4 at St. Joseph's University in North Patchogue. The Youth Summit is designed to engage high school students in an exploration of important current socio-medical, environmental and socio-economic issues.

Kjeldsen and Pellegrino created a 12-minute podcast titled "Climate Change Causes Problems on Long Island and Surrounding Areas," discussing the specific impact of climate change on Long Island and the consequences it may cause. The two students were inspired to create the podcast by their experience in Islip's Living Environment & AP Environmental Science course and their desire to find solutions to this problem at a local level.

"I really enjoyed my time at the program collaborating with other students and experts in the field," Pellegrino said. "Winning the award was great, but I think the real win was being able to be part of the learning experience."

"It was a really great experience to be able to discuss this kind of topic with so many intelligent individuals," Kjeldsen said. "I am happy I was able to go, and I hope to go again next year."

"It was such a great moment to see them win an award," counselor Nicole Hall said. "They were sitting in a room with over a hundred finalists, most of them upperclassmen, so to see two freshmen taking charge of their own learning and making a podcast was incredible. I am so proud of them."

'Artists for the Earth'

In honor of Earth Day, the Islip Arts Council hosted the opening reception for its environmental-themed art exhibition, "Artists for the Earth." From 6 to 8 p.m., visitors were invited to view 38 unique art pieces.

Photos, paintings, drawings, and crafts lined the art gallery's walls. **ISLIP** Beside each piece was a small paragraph stating the artist's name and some information about their creation.

Exhibit director and gallery manager Katrina Kuan was inspired by her love of nature. Kuan is also passionate about protecting the planet and living a sustainable lifestyle. She hopes the museum will help people realize the importance of caring for the planet.

Artist Isabella Romano was inspired by her love for turtles when she created a sculpture of a sea turtle crafted from loose-leaf paper, tissue paper, glue sticks, and Mod Podge. The turtle's rounded brown shell features a vibrant aqua patch embedded with fragments resembling ocean debris, conveying the growing threat of pollution. Romano used textured material to create the turtle's head and green flippers.

"It showcases that when we clean up the ocean, we're not just removing debris from the water—we're also helping to protect what's inside, sea life," Romano said.

Artist Ralph Laudona created a detailed painting highlighting the beauty of the green-tailed towhee. The painting showcases the bird's vibrant green wings and red-orange crown. The green-tailed towhee is perched among dry meadow grasses and a single lavender wildflower, capturing the natural prairie landscape.

Laudona's painting calls attention to the recent destruction of North America's prairie grasslands, which has resulted in a more than 40 percent decline in the grassland bird population.

Laudona shared that his love of birds led him to join the Audubon Society, which is currently partnering with local farmers and ranchers to preserve and restore prairie habitats for birds and other wildlife.

Artist Stephanie Geremito displayed two paintings, part of a larger series depicting the apocalypse. The first painting captures a grassy landscape under a bright, shifting sky. Loose brushstrokes and bold colors give the scene an almost dreamlike feel, pulling viewers into the

movement of the fields and hills. The second painting is split into two canvases, both featuring a water tower rising above a tangled landscape. Loose brushstrokes and bold lines create motion, depicting the wind blowing.

Geremito's apocalyptic landscapes were inspired by recurring dreams, fueling her interest in a post-apocalyptic world and science fiction.

"When I was younger, I used to have this recurring dream where I was walking down a service room, and suddenly there would be raid sirens," she said. "I wasn't old enough to have experienced the Cold War, but I'd have these wild Cold War dreams. In the dream, I'm an adult, holding the hand of a child, walking down the bike route."

She shares that the events leading up to what her paintings depict are open to interpretation, but can also be viewed as a cautionary tale.

"Our species isn't going to be around forever. Let's face it—we're kind of messing it up," Geremito said. "To be honest, who knows when the time will come, but there's going to be some sort of ending. This is the world that comes after us."

The "Artists for the Earth" exhibition can be viewed at the Islip Arts Council Gallery through May 9. ■

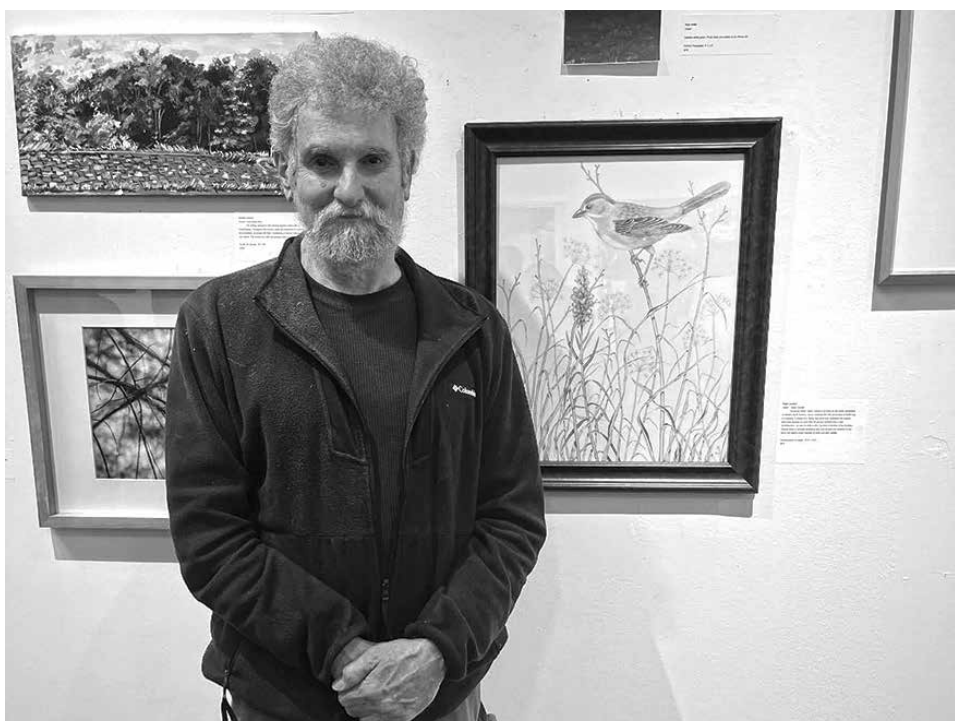

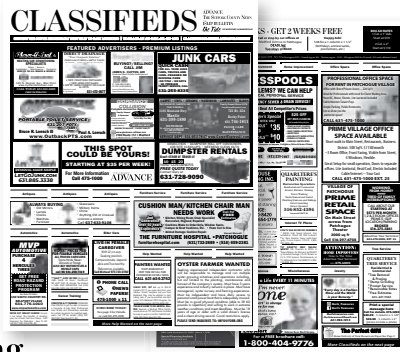

Central Islip resident joins centenarian club

Just yesterday, on April 30, a resident of Central Islip celebrated their 100th birthday. Laddie Reed has joined the centenarian club as she was joined by family who stopped by, some even flying in from out of state, to celebrate with her.

Reed was born in 1925, in Oklahoma City. She attended Douglas High School in Oklahoma City, which was the first African American school to open in the city.

Her mother, Hazel Thompson, was born in Louisiana. She spoke creole and her family moved to Oklahoma City when Thompson was 18. Reed's father, Warren Thompson, lived in Oklahoma City.

Reed got to visit Louisiana with her sister when she was 10. It was for a family reunion in New Orleans.

After moving in with her sister in New York for two years once they were older during the 1940s, Reed went back to Oklahoma City after World War II. Reed decided to move back to the Big Apple for good in 1969 shortly after her divorce.

Here she worked in factories, where she also got to travel a lot—not only throughout her younger years, but once she was older and retired as well. Reed got to meet many wonderful people and one of the favorite places she visited was Madrid.

Once she settled, she started school again, completing her associate's degree at Suffolk County Community College. Reed worked for schools on Long Island and for New York State in civil service jobs with children. She especially enjoyed being a school assistant because she got to work with children and appreciated seeing them learn and pick up things Reed would teach them.

She celebrated her big day with a birthday dinner out with family. One of

Reed's grandchildren who visited flew all the way from right where Reed was born, Oklahoma City. Serena Davis is one of Reed's four granddaughters.

"I'm elated; I mean, this is something that you know, doesn't happen often at all," Davis said. "It's just a blessing that I'm able to celebrate with her, on her birthday, so I'm just really elated."

Reed dedicated her time to those in need in the Town of Islip. She worked at the Central Islip and Brentwood Library along with Mary Reid on Mondays and Tuesdays in Brentwood and Thursdays at Central Islip during tax season. The two helped fill out tax paperwork for individuals over 50 and who were low income.

Reed kept busy after retirement and didn't want to stay at home. She wanted to be able to give her services and provide them to those who were in need. She started off at first helping seniors and then making her way to those with lower incomes.

For those looking for advice on reaching 100, Reed says to be kind.

"[The] only advice I can have is just be kind to people and help people, you know, if they need help," Reed said. "...I didn't have any certain thing that I knew that I did; maybe I was doing it and I didn't know I was doing it, but I always respected people."

These days, Reed spends her time calling her family members and talking to them, watching television and walking around the room as her own form of therapy. She used to spend her time at the senior center in Central Islip and East Islip, participating in senior activities.

Today, Reed's family consists of four granddaughters, seven great-grandchildren and eight great-great-grandchildren.

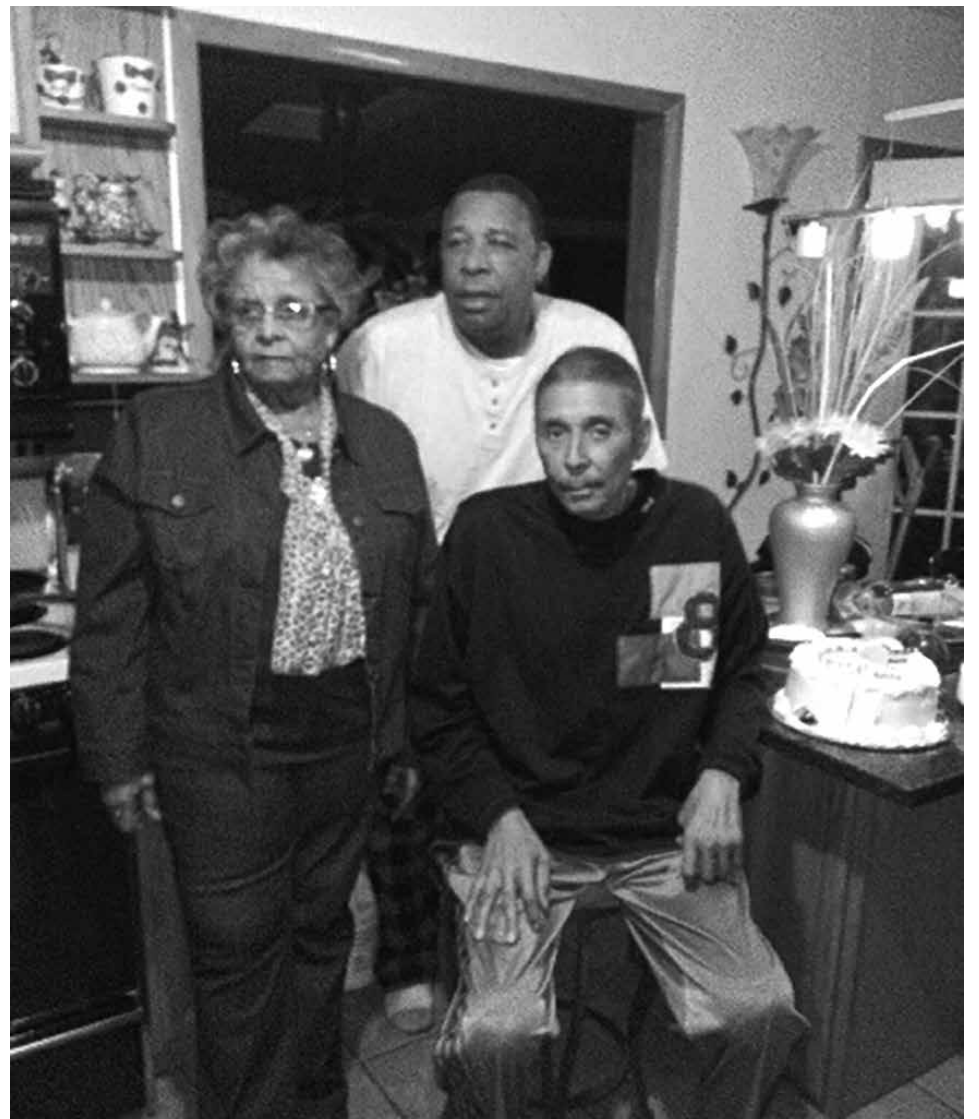
"Be kind to yourself and kind to others and wish that God would bless us all," Reed said. ■

Canine Companions to gain a new wing and help more people

Bay Shore builder donates \$3.5M project

Bay Shore construction company owner Jim Nazzaro is building and donating a new dorm wing at the Canine Companions headquarters in Medford. Construction on the \$3.5 million project has already begun.

Canine Companions is a national organization that enhances the lives of people with disabilities by providing highly trained service dogs at no charge to the recipient. The dogs are either golden retrievers or Labrador retrievers, or a mix of both. Volunteers raise the dogs in their homes for a year and a half, and then they come to the training center for six to nine months of training with a professional trainer.

The project, according to Canine Companions Northeast Region executive director Debra Dougherty, will double the number of service dogs they are able to match with clients by providing additional dorm rooms for their stay during trainings.

The donor, Nazzaro, is the owner of the Construction and Real Estate Development company, J. Nazzaro Partnership LP. He and his wife were also a Canine Companions volunteer puppy raiser.

According to Nazzaro, his passion for

the organization came from being a puppy raiser.

"It's the best thing that ever happened to us," he said of raising a Labrador retriever named Zach, who was later matched with a young man with disabilities in Maryland, of which he remains in contact with today. "Zach was amazing, and from the very beginning we understood the concept that you're saying goodbye to him someday. But we also knew he was going for a greater good."

However, the only reason he said he hasn't raised another dog is because of his travel.

"We didn't think we could properly do the job of raising a future service dog. I said to myself, 'You know what? I could actually make a larger impact doing what I know best, and that being construction,'" he added.

Then, when he learned the organization's need for additional dorm rooms for clients at the Northeast Region Training

Center in Medford, he immediately wanted to provide.

"I hesitated for maybe 30 seconds," he said. "We'll just build them! This is something I can do to make this dream come true and double the number of service dogs that can go to clients."

According to Nazzaro, who is on site nearly every day overseeing the project,

he anticipates a grand opening by the holidays (November/December).

"This is probably the last construction project I'm going to do in my career," he added, proud to end with something so special. "I've been building for 42 years and now I'm ready to slow down a bit. I couldn't leave on a better note."

The project, which will double the dorms from 11 to 22, essentially and eventually allowing the organization to double their output of helping people and bringing down their waitlist, broke ground in March. The location has about 80 to 100 people waiting for a service dog at any time.

Canine Companions currently accommodates about four classes per year, with some side placements, totaling about 60 graduates per year (about 70 pre-COVID). They estimate being able to place over 100 dogs with the additional dorm space.

Thanks to the project, Dougherty said they have also started increasing the breeding program out in California with plans to get more puppies in the next few years.

"And it's all because of Jim," she said. "There was a lot of shock and then gratitude that he made such a generous opportunity for us to be able to serve more people."

Sharrock also spoke about Keep Islip Clean's founding member, former chairperson and longtime Islip commissioner Kay Erwood, who died in February. The Brook Street Wetlands cleanup was a cause close to Erwood's heart.

On rainy days, garbage is often found along fence lines and in the bushes. Additionally, trash accumulates along the trail by the pond—these were the areas volunteers focused on.

Along with Keep Islip Clean members, students, Bank of America employees, and Girl Scout Troop 46 were among the volunteers participating in the cleanup.

Former Keep Islip Clean chairman and current secretary Tiffany DiBenedetto has been a longtime participant in the Brook Street Wetlands cleanup. She began participating in middle school and has continued for the past 30 years.

"You have to be part of the community you live in. It's important—you only get one planet, so you have to treat it right, take care of where you live, and help clean it up," DiBenedetto said.

After Sharrock laid down the ground rules, volunteers made their way down Brook Street, which the Suffolk County Police Department auxiliary blocked off to keep everyone safe. It didn't take long for attendees to find garbage to collect.

Petitions nominating candidates for the office of member of the

Board of Education must be filed with the Clerk of the District no later than 4:00 p.m.

prevailing time on Monday, April 21, 2024, at the Bay Shore Public Schools Administration Office. Each petition must be directed to the Clerk of the District, must be signed by at least 25 qualified voters, and shall state the name and residence of the candidate and the residence of each signer. The term of office is July 1, 2025- June 30, 2028.

The Board of Registration shall meet as follows: on Wednesday, May 7, 2025, at Bay Shore Schools District Office, 75 W. Perkal Street from 12:00 noon to 4:00 p.m., for the purpose of preparing a register of the qualified voters of the school district and for said Annual District Election and Budget Vote, at which time any person shall be entitled to have his name placed upon such register, provided that at such meeting of the Board of Registration he/she is known or proven to the satisfaction of such Board of Registration to be then or thereafter entitled to vote at said Annual District Election and Budget Vote.

The Register to be prepared for the Annual District Election and Budget Vote to be held on May 20, 2025, will use, as a basis therefore, the Register or Registers prepared at the Annual Election and Budget Vote held on May 21, 2024. Such a register to be prepared will also include all persons who shall have registered and voted in any school district meeting or election held at any time during the four calendar years prior to this calendar year, or have registered in the District since May 21, 2024 up to and including May 15, 2025. Such register will also include those persons who are registered and remain qualified to vote at general elections in this school district pursuant to the provisions of Article 5 of the Election Law, as amended.

Only persons whose names appear on the Register prepared by the Bay Shore Union Free School District Board of Registration or on the register for general elections prepared pursuant to Article 5 of the Election Law as amended will be permitted to vote.

heartbroken, but not surprised. According to those that have associated with Indelicato and Ruff House Rescue, Tali's death is not an isolated case; it reflects a long-standing pattern of neglect.

Earlier this year, Hailey Verderosa-Morris sought to adopt a young RHR puppy, Leon. Since he was not up to date on his vaccines, and therefore not available for adoption yet, Verderosa-Morris began fostering to adopt on March 15.

Leon fell ill within the first week. According to Verderosa-Morris, she contacted RHR for Leon to be examined. Instead, she was given unmarked medication for him to take. Within 48 hours of administering the pills, Leon began throwing up frequently.

Verderosa-Morris said she contacted RHR again for an examination, fearing Leon may have had worms, as he had been very bloated upon fostering him and had rapidly lost weight. She claims she was given more unmarked medication in a Ziplock bag and advised to administer the medication once an hour, plus Pedialyte.

"He was losing rapid weight; he became very lethargic. He started pooping blood and throwing up," said Verderosa-Morris. "I contacted them and told them I do not know if he will have 72 hours. She [Diane] said to just keep giving it to him."

The foster mom claims she eventually received approval from the Ruff House Rescue director to take Leon to a veterinarian. While Indelicato insisted on a veterinarian an hour away, Verderosa-Morris went to a nearby animal hospital instead, fearful that Leon would not last an hour's drive.

"She wanted her price for going to her vet, at the cost of him possibly dying on the way there," explained Verderosa-Morris.

At the emergency room, Leon was given a 50 percent survival rate. According to Verderosa-Morris, Indelicato texted her husband in a rage, stating that she should not have had to pay so much money for just one puppy.

Indelicato took Leon from the animal hospital and ended the fostering agreement. Verderosa-Morris said she later learned Leon had Addison's disease, a hormonal disorder. According to Canine Addison's Resources & Education (CARE), dogs with typical Addison's

should not be given Pedialyte or Gatorade-type products because they contain potassium.

"This is what happens when people would rather see the money than bring him in. They diagnose over a phone call, over a text message," said Verderosa-Morris. "He was skin and bones at the end because they said it was just worms."

Others who took in Ruff House Rescue dogs claim to have similar experiences with the nonprofit.

"They did provide me with unmarked medication in Ziplock baggies and liquid wormer in water bottles!," said Kristy Kulynych-Gmelch, who adopted a dog from RHR. "He started getting better when I stopped using what they were giving me to treat him, hundreds to easily thousands or more later."

Like West Babylon Animal Hospital, other nearby businesses are aware of Indelicato's reputation for misconduct. RHR held an unauthorized adoption event from the Ruff House Rescue van outside PetSmart in North Babylon in April of 2024. RHR was asked by PetSmart to leave the premises. The organization continued to hold unauthorized adoption events on the opposite side of the parking lot.

"One time, they parked in front of the bank here, and we called security because we knew it was not authorized," said Brianna Lee, a PetSmart manager.

According to ProPublica, records show that Ruff House rescue has been tax-exempt since November 2010, and Indelicato was compensated \$114,000 in 2023, which is about 18.3 percent of their total expenses.

Multiple sources affiliated with RHR claim the adoption fee is about \$500 per dog.

Indelicato is facing additional legal trouble. A holdover eviction has been filed by landlord Roxy Girl Holding against Ruff House Rescue Inc. to remove the organization from the 467 Higbie Lane property. The eviction was filed April 8, three weeks after the arrest of Indelicato. The case will appear in Suffolk County 5th District Court on May 2.

Indelicato will appear in First District Court at 9 a.m. on May 8 regarding the animal cruelty charge. Indelicato's attorney, Jan Drew Goldman, did not respond for comment at the time of publication. ■

Brightwaters mayor named president of county village association

Suffolk County Village Officials Association welcomes mayor Valdini to presidency

On Wednesday, April 16, Brightwaters mayor John Valdini was honored to be sworn in as president of the Suffolk County Village Officials Association (SCVOA).

SCVOA is a not-for-profit advocacy organization and information resource consisting of the 32 incorporated villages of Suffolk County. **BRIGHTWATERS** The exchange of ideas and strategies within the organization empower

village governments to effectively serve the over 125,000 residents of the county's villages.

SCVOA's executive board meets once a month and organizes two training sessions a year in conjunction with the New York Conference of Mayors, plus the annual Legislative Awards Ceremony, during which Valdini was sworn in this April.

It had been over 70 years since the last mayor of Brightwaters served as SCVOA president.

Valdini has served Brightwaters as mayor for seven years and has served on SCVOA's executive board for three. He looks forward to his one-year presidential term.

"It is something I am happy about," said Valdini. "I am not going to change the world, but there are some things I want to accomplish and reasons for doing

it."

Valdini's presidency was effective immediately, as he stepped into the role previously served by Dennis M. Siry, mayor of the Village of Amityville.

"He has his finger on the pulse of what is going on. He is very active and level-headed and will do great going in," Siry said of Valdini. "It is a great organization, and he will definitely do it justice."

As president, Valdini aims to get as much information out to all 32 villages to keep them informed about common interests, common problems and common solutions.

Valdini shared that the mayors do not get to see each other often due to the vastness of Suffolk County. One of his goals is to host a mayor's summit in October, after elections, for all of the mayors to gather, meet one another, and exchange ideas.

"We come in all different shapes and sizes and all backgrounds. I have a construction background, but there are many with financial backgrounds, some are lawyers, some are professionals. We are not some cookie-cutter group of people," noted Valdini. "So, it is nice just to sit down and listen to other people's issues and hear solutions to their problems."

Valdini's overall goal as president of SCVOA is in line with SCVOA's overarching mission: to maintain home rule.

"Our main theme of SCVOA is to maintain our home rule. The state keeps coming at us trying to take over some of our zoning and dictate to us what we need to do with housing," said Valdini. "The most important thing to villages is to keep control of home rule—to keep our own zoning, to keep our own rules—and that is what makes us a village." ■

Poll watchers will not be permitted behind the voting machines at any time during voting hours.

An area with a full view of the polls will be designated for poll watchers.

Following the recording of the vote by the District Clerk and inspectors of election, poll watchers will be permitted time to view the voting machines prior to the custodian from the Suffolk Board of Elections locking the machines.
