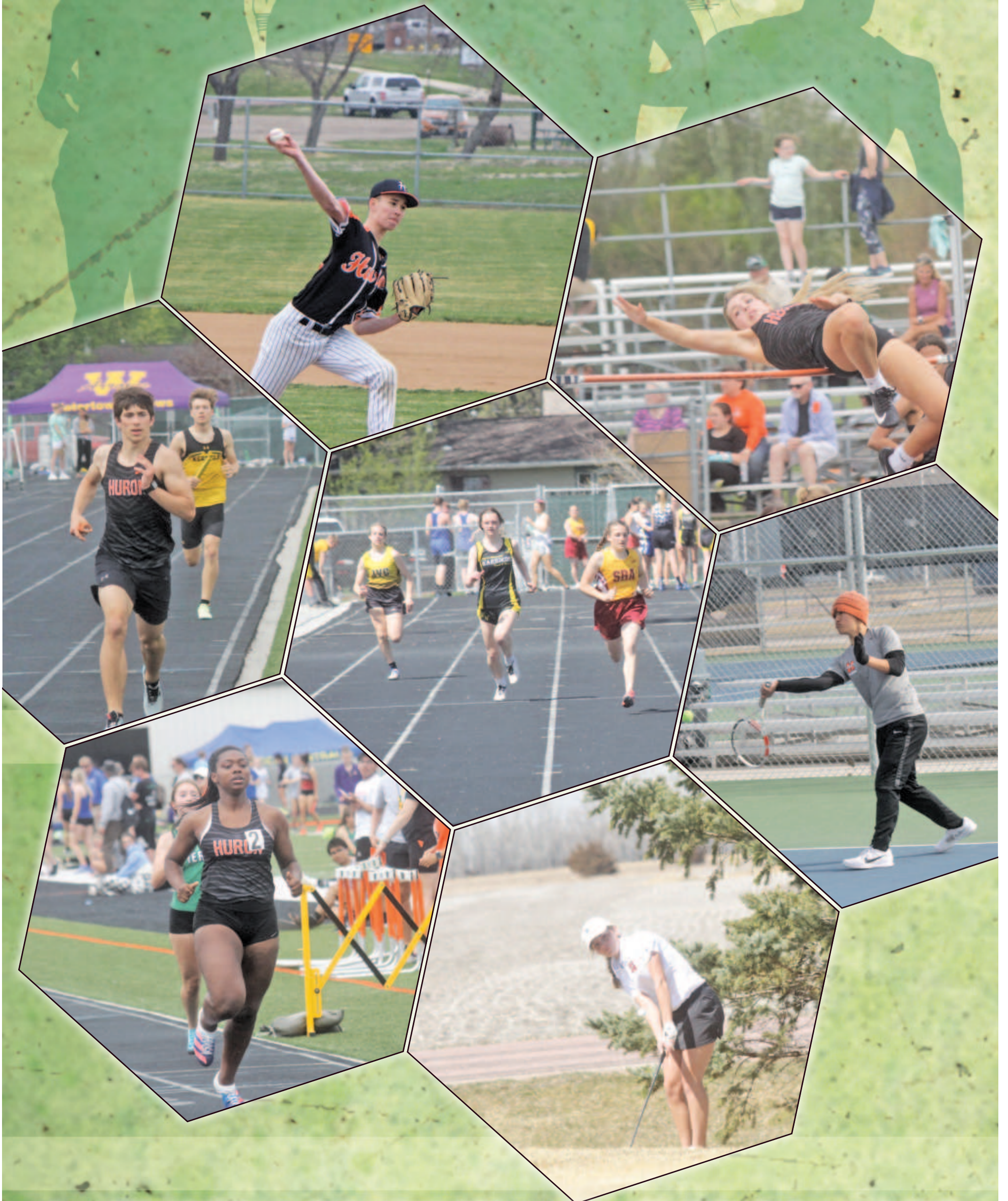

Huron track and field

HURON — To say that the ‘spring’ that residents are experiencing is unusual. An no where is that more magnified that in the run up to the track and field season for Huron High School athletes.

“It’s certainly been challenging,” said HHS head track and field coach Angie Thomas. “Today, the sun is out and we will be able to put spikes on the track. And this will be the third time since we started. By this time of year we are normally out on the track three times per week.”

As the outdoor season began April 11, Thomas had 49 boys and 38 girls on her respective rosters and part of the challenge for her thus far has been keeping practices interesting with limited ability to get outdoors and really put in some work.

The promising numbers and a wealth of returning letter winners - 11 boys and 10 girls - has Thomas cautiously optimistic for the upcoming season.

Girls
The strength of the HHS girls track and field teams lies in its field athletes. A deep well of throwers and jumpers will be the framework upon which Thomas will build a foundation for the season.

Seniors Heavan Gainey (sprints, relays, javelin), Elly Gascoigne (javelin), Brynn Gose (shot put, relays) and Katelyn Radke (pole vault) are all returning letter winners with extensive experience and a history of success.

Javelin will be a strong event for the Tiger girls, as Thomas has a total of eight athletes who are throwing or intend to try their hand at throwing the javelin, led by returning letter winners Hamtyn Heinz, a junior. Fellow junior Jaelyn Hamilton will toss the shot and discus and classmate Elizabeth Heinen is a returning letter winner in the high jump. Hennrich Ireland is a jumper, Jaylee Noyes is a thrower in her first season as a Tiger, while Tatum Peterson is the top middle distance and distance runner on the roster, while Makenzie Siemonsma is a letter winner who will high jump and run sprints and relays.

Thomas’ sophomore class is also heavily tilted toward throws and field events, although Zaniyah

Lanier will be a mainstay in the sprints and relays and Cameron Ruth is among the top pole vaulters. Makeisha Davis (LJ/sprints), Kirsten DeGeest (discus/javelin) and

Emma DeJong (HJ/pole vault) lead a list that includes twin sisters Ashlyn Grace (LJ/TJ) and Madalyn Grace (100m/relays), while Cadence Kogel will add to the depth in the pole

vault pit, Laurelis Feliz Medina will fling the javelin and Samantha Mangmoradeth will compete in jumping events.

Heather Escobar-Reyes will be a middle distance

and distance runner, as will classmate Hannah Schoenfelder, while both Maria Wilson and Alexis Ziegeldorf will both long jump, run sprints and relays.

The freshman class is highlighted by distance runners Ellie Puterbaugh, Josie Fliieger and Molly Whitney, while Jencie Goergen will compete in

Coach Tim Hedblom sees a young Huron Tigers boys’ tennis squad this season, but that also allows for opportunity for any player to really surprise over the course of the year.

“Any one of our top eight players has the potential to be a breakout player,” Hedblom noted. “They all have made so much progress and continue to improve each time they take the court.”

The Tigers will have just two seniors, but Hedblom notes that multiple athletes have varsity experience and provide leadership.

“We are a fairly young team, but we are lucky to have good leadership from Hay Klu Moo Taw, Dah Christ Moo, Lauy Kue Say, Lah Doh Soe, and Hser Wah,” Hedblom raved. “They have 2-3 years of varsity experience which is great for the younger players.”

The weather early on in the season has taken a toll on the practice schedule, as the team had only had one

outdoor practice through April 10. However, Hedblom says the Tigers are blessed to practice at one of the best facilities in the state once they are able.

“Any time you can play at home is a plus,” Hedblom observed. “We have one of the best complexes in the state, so it is always great to be home.”

Hedblom expects Yankton, Harrisburg, Watertown, and Mitchell to be tough in the Eastern South Dakota conference. He also notes Rapid City Christian, Lennox, and Sioux Falls Christian to be teams to beat in Class A.

The ESD meet is May 9 at Hitchcock Park in Mitchell.

Huron golf

HURON — The Huron girls' golf team will be short on varsity experience, but will field two of the top golfers in the state during the upcoming season.

Returning to lead the Tigers during their senior campaigns will be Bryn Huber and Olivia Rink.

"These may be the only two golfers going to meets this year until some younger girls prove they can compete over 18 holes at the varsity level," Huron coach Chris Rozell said. "Both are great athletes in other sports for the Tigers, so that will carry over to their final year on the golf course."

Huber is coming off a year, where she finished third at both the Class AA State Meet and Eastern South Dakota Conference Meet for the Tigers.

"Bryn Huber has her sights set on improving on her great season a year ago," Rozell said. "She is working toward achieving the top position at both events."

"She showed great consistency last year, medaling at each meet she was

attending," he said. "She is a relentless worker at her game, and along with her competitive drive, she will achieve her goals."

Despite not getting the results she was looking for a year ago, Rink was able to put some solid rounds of golf together for Huron. She finished tied for 44th at the state meet.

"Olivia Rink is an experienced player, who showed she can shoot good scores when healthy," Rozell said. "She struggled last season with back problems that hindered her success. Her game is right there to bring home medals from the ESD and state meets."

Other golfers on this year's roster with varsity experience are sophomore Hannah Purintun and Regan Rink. Rozell is looking for them to provide some added depth for the Tigers as the season goes along.

"They are showing in practice they have the swings that could produce some scores that will get them in varsity meets," Rozell said of his younger golfers. "They of course will need to show consistency. If they do, it would

give us the four golfers we need to record a team score."

The lack of depth this season will prove to be challenging for Huron.

"Each team is allowed to bring six golfers to meets. The Tigers will start the season taking two, which eliminated us from teach scores," Rozell said. "In order to qualify for state this year, a golfer must have a 105 average over the span of the season. This will be a difficult task for our No. 3 and 4 golfers, but that has to be one of our goals."

A large group of younger golfers out for the team this season, has Rozell encouraged with the future of the program, however.

"We have a group of younger girls that are mostly beginning golfers that will provide a surge of excitement and willingness to improve in our practices," he said.

Included in the group of newcomers for the Tigers are senior Linh Ha Vu, along with sophomores Jaslynn Horn, Madeline Kleinsasser, Paige Sherron and Valeria Toledo Escudero. Also figuring into the mix are freshmen

throws and Hylton Heinz will run sprints and relays and will throw the javelin as well and both Camdyn Fuchs and Isabelle Kremer, a pair of eighth-graders, will begin working their way into the throwing sorority.

"Without a doubt the field events, particularly the javelin, is our strong suit," Thomas said. "We did well placing-wise in Pierre (the April 11 meet) but what is a better measuring stick is our times and distances. Those numbers were very promising."

Boys

The Tiger boys have a more balanced approach to the upcoming season, however the strength of the team, as it has been recently, will lie in the powerful legs of the team's sprinters.

The speed starts in a diverse senior class. Quinston Luellman will lead the sprinters and relays while long jump and triple jump master Quenton Walls will also lend a hand on a relay team or two. Dylan Lichty leads the pole vaulters, Cheech Harman is the top middle distance and distance runner, along with Cole Oschner, while Aiden Glanzer will also compete in the jumps. All are seniors and all returning letter winners.

"Yes, I think that the sprints and relays are our strong suits for the boys," Thomas said. "We have many sprinters who we can plug in to different roles in the relays."

Ben Ahlers, Cashton Caudell and CJ Gainey will all find spots on relay teams and Gainey is a returning letter winner who will also high jump. Ahlers will compete in sprint events and Caudell is a pole vaulter. Aristeo Escobar will run short sprints, and also high jump and long jump.

Holden Hegg and Tyson Pfitzer will add to a deep well of sprinters, while fellow juniors Ezra Hiles, Lah Ker Paw Htoo, Bryan Ramirez, Jackson Reno and Conner Johnson will seek to add points to the Huron total in the throwing events. Kolton Ogle is a high jumper and Zayne Winson will compete in the sprints and relays for Huron.

The most welcome surprise for Thomas this spring is the arrive of sophomore Thackary Hansen. Hansen placed in the Class B 100 meter dash last year's state meet, running for Iroquois and has had an immediate impact, winning the 100 in a faster time than the one that earned him sixth at the State Meet.

He leads a very deep class of sophomores which will compete in many different events. TJ Lien, Saw Nee Blkut Htoo, Angleo

Medina, Alec Pester, Roel Rodriguez, Edwin Rodriguez and Ichiro Umemiya will all compete in middle distance and distance races, while Kolby Hofer, Micah Larson and Jonathan Peterson will push upper classmen for spots in the sprints and relays, while Jose Feliciano, Nick Florey and Daunte Glanzer are throwers.

The freshmen class is also very deep with a combination of sprinters and throwers in the mix.

The boys' team's depth and the ability to fill most of the events in each meet leads Thomas to a happy problem. Finding the right combination to put athletes in the best position to succeed and putting together the best group for each of the relays.

Thomas is assisted by Tim Buddenhagen (distance), Char Carda (long and triple jumps), Mike Carda (shot put), Kelly Hinrich (hurdles and sprints), Michael Schmitz (pole vault), Lynn Soward (high jump) with help from Courtney Clarke, Shane Hartman, Amy Velthoff and Kent Vliieger.

Huron baseball

HURON — The Huron Tigers spring baseball team started out on fire last season, with a 6-4 record after a victory over Sioux Falls Jefferson on April 22, but the season ended with nine straight losses. A new coaching staff is on board for the Tigers in 2023, and head coach Jason Babl and assistant coach Troy Furbush have their eyes set on the long-term future of the program.

Babl discussed the team makeup with an eye to the future.

"We have a lot of underclassmen; only two returning seniors," Babl said. "We have a lot of new parts to this right now, but we're working on getting something going here."

Coach Furbush echoed the sentiments.

"Jason and I are going to be here long-term," Coach Furbush agreed. "We want to see the program build from the ground up and be something for these younger guys to be proud of."

Babl coached a number of this year's players last summer during Legion ball season, and he intends to continue coaching the Legion team, allowing the players to develop through the spring and summer.

This year's team has faced significant weather issues to get going, but the depth of the team will help navigate the spring schedule.

After the first game of the season against Yankton, Babl was pleased.

"We weren't sure what to expect," Babl observed. "We've been practicing indoors, and it is a different feeling to be outside on the field."

"That depth will help on the pitching side of the equation, where the team is fairly deep with options."

"On the varsity team, we have nine pitchers out of 15 guys, some guys that are starters and some that will be relievers," Furbush noted. "We have lots of options to eat some innings."

The lineup is something Babl will tinker with to find the right mix, but he's eager to see what can happen when the bats get going.

"Once we get everyone in the lineup working together, we can do some damage and pile on some runs in a hurry. It's a matter of getting everyone on the same page."

When asked about leadership on the team, both coaches immediately identified one player.

"Bubba Peterson is the wheel that makes this thing go," Babl remarked. Furbush agreed, "He's the life of the team."

Babl continued by identifying a number of players that have different leadership styles beyond Peterson on the team.

"Our seniors have to step up and do what seniors do," Babl mentioned. "We have a lot of leaders

with different types of leadership on the team."

Babl expressed his desire to see the program use spring to move forward into the summer and long-term.

"It's fun watching these kids develop," Babl observed. "As long as we can keep these guys together on the field for spring and into the summer, we can start to develop something special here going down the road."

He continued, "I have a lot of faith in these guys. Once they see it come together, it will be good. All it takes is one spark. I hope they see that as well."
