MUSKRATS EXTEND WIN STREAK TO SIX

On April 23rd the Muskrats finished off a double header sweep with a 4-1 win over Baltic. Redfield Area would get a strong pitching performance from Keaton Rohlfs tossing a complete

game, surrendering only one run, scattering eight Baltic hits while striking out four, "Keaton was good today when runners were on base. He made a lot of good pitches out there today

and it was nice to stretch him out," commented coach Gregg.

Redfield Area scored one run in the bottom of the first inning. With one out Owen Osborn would reach when he was hit by a pitch, he would then steal second and move to third on a past ball. Easton Millar would single to right center scoring Owen.

Baltic scored one run in the top of the second on a leadoff single to right and then he would steal second. The Baltic run would come on a Jared Valadez single to left center. The second Redfield run came in the bottom of the second. Seth Siebrecht would reach on a error and advance to second. Ashton Remily would sacrifice bunt Siebrecht over to third. Camden Osborn drove home Siebrecht. "I thought the bottom of our line up did a nice job of putting the ball in play and then moving the runner around. Nice bunt by Ashton to get Seth to third. Good contributions all the way around, "said

Coach Gregg.

Pevton Osborn would lead the bottom of the third off with a sharp double down the left field line and eventually score on a Keaton Rohlfs double to left center. The power surge from the middle of the Redfield line-up would be the first time the team would produce backto-back doubles this season. "We have not hit with a ton of power yet this spring. I think the weather and long layoffs between games has something to do with that...But as the season progresses we are starting to see our guys swing it better," stated coach Gregg. After three innings of play Redfield would take a 3-1 to lead.

The last run for Redfield would come in the bottom of the sixth. Nolan Gall reached on an error

and then stole second base. He would then advance on a wild pitch to third. Owen Osborn singled home Gall for the fourth run. "Owen had a heck of a day at the plate for us, he really came through" commented Coach Gregg. With this win the Muskrats go to 6-0 on the season.

They had seven hits in the contest. Camden Osborn led the way with two hits and one RBI. Owen Osborn and Easton Millar each had one hit and one RBI. Peyton Osborn and Keaton Rohlfs each had one double. Erik Salmen chipped in a single.

The Muskrats are next in action as they head to Bryant to take on Hamlin on April 30th at 2:00 pm.

REDFIELD AREA MUSKRATS COMEBACK ON HOWARD

In a region 2B match up on April 18th in Redfield, Fehi Faonelua would come to the plate in the bottom of the sixth inning with two outs and bases loaded. The home team would be trailing by two runs. On a one ball, two strike count, Fehi would launch a grand slam over the left center wall giving the Redfield Muskrats a 8-5 lead. "Big time clutch hit by Fehi! Our hitters had a few chances earlier in the game and we had nothing to show for it. Fehi came up big and got us over the hump" said Coach Gregg.

At the beginning of the game, Howard would get out of the gates early on the home team and their pitcher--Peyton Osborn. Howard would nickel and

dime Osborn for six hits and four runs in the first three innings. Trailing 4-0 in the bottom of the third inning Redfield put one run on the board. Nolan Gall would reach when he was hit-by-pitch, move to second on a walk and to third on an infield single by Camden Osborn. Fehi Faonelua would single to right center scoring Gall. Redfield would trail 4-1 after three inning.

Redfield tacked on one more in the bottom of the fourth cutting the score to 4-2. Easton Millar would lead the inning off, reaching on an error advancing all the way to second. Nolan Gall singled home Millar. In the bottom half of the fifth Peyton Osborn would reach when he was hit by a pitch. He

would move to second on a Camden Osborn infield single. Fehi Faonelua would double to left field scoring Peyton. Redfield trailed 4-3 after five innings.

Howard added one run in the top of the sixth inning, pushing the score to 5-3. The Muskrats waited till the bottom of the sixth to make their move. Howard would bring in relief pitcher Casey Clausen who would take the place of team ace Luke Koepsell--a hard throwing left hander. "Koepsell kept us off balance. Give him credit where its due. He made some big pitches when we had runners on. He did a good job," said Coach Gregg. Erik Salmen reached on an error to start the inning.

Erik would go to third on a Nolan Gall double with one out. Owen Osborn singled home Salmen for the first run of the inning. Peyton Osborn would follow with a single to load the bases. With one out and bases loaded Camden Osborn would reach on a fielder's choice when Nolan Gall would be forced out at the plate for the second out of the inning. With two outs Fehi Faonelua launched a grand slam over the left center field wall to give Redfield an 8-5 lead. "A lot of things happened in that inning, Fehi had the knockout blow, but there were a lot of guys before him that were grinding it out at the plate to make some things happen" said Coach Gregg.

Holding an 8-5 lead going into the top of the seventh inning, Howard would score one run on two hits including a triple and one Redfield error. Redfield pitcher Peyton Osborn was able to hang on and go the distance for his squad. Peyton Osborn would toss all seven innings allowing eleven hits, five earned runs and struck out five Howard hitters. He would hold Howard to three hits over the last four innings. "Once Peyton settled in here was very good. It took him a couple of innings to get going but when he did, he was great. He battled all day," said Coach Gregg.

Redfield had nine hits in the contest. Faonelua had a monster day getting

three hits, including a grand slam and a double. He would drive in six of the eight of Redfield's runs. Nolan Gall had two hits of his own in the contest. Peyton Osborn, Keaton Rohlfs, Owen, and Camden Osborn each added a hit. Redfield is now 4-0 on the young season and will travel to Madison to take on Madison and Baltic as part of a double header on April 23rd, "The was a big win for our guys and the games only get bigger next weekend for us and post season seeding. We need to be ready to go!" said Coach Gregg.


