INSURANCE Are You Covered?

The Huron Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department do not carry medical insurance for the participants of the programs. The cost of doing so would be so high that fees charged for programs would become prohibitive. Exercise Trails

LOCATION: Memorial Park (1.2 miles)

All are welcome to use this 1.2 mile concrete trail, which follows along the James River on the edge of Memorial Park. Replacement sections of concrete trail were installed in 2016 totaling over 2.800 feet in the park itself to allow a good surface for public use.

LOCATION: Ravine Lake Park (5,595' or 1.1 mile)

The Ravine Lake Trail adds a great opportunity to the total trail system in Huron. The Ravine Lake Park is experiencing many positive changes in appearance and usage. A community wide effort has been involved in this project. A trail connection to Riverside Park has been added along Jersey Avenue with repairs to be made this Spring due to flooding. Ideas and donations are welcomed to allow the best use of the area. The Izaak Walton Island trail connection has been replaced.

LOCATION: Riverside Park (Approximately .25 mile)

This trail is also concrete and follows along the James River. Further fishing access is being planned in the future. The 3rd Street Dam Project will promote fishing access on both sides of the river. LOCATION: Southwest Huron starting at Pepsi Soccer Complex (Approx 2.5 miles) to Wal-Mart along Lincoln Avenue, 15th and Arizona, 21st & Dakota Avenue SW up to 27th on Dakota Ave SW.

The concrete trail provides walking and biking access to many businesses and services. The total city trail length is approximately 5 ½ miles, which will hopefully become a part of the city-wide trail system. Further trail opportunities will be considered with the proposed Dakota Avenue/South Dakota Department of Trans-

portation development project.

LOCATION: Central Park (.5 mile) The trail winds around Splash Central

Waterpark.

LEVEL 1: Introduction to Water Skills

Helps participants feel comfortable in the water.

- Enter water using ramp, steps or side
- Exit water using ladder, steps or side
- Blow bubbles through mouth and nose
- Bobbing
- Open eyes under water and retrieve submerged objects
- Front and back glides and recover to a vertical position
- Back float
- Roll from front to back and back to front
- Tread water using arm and hand actions
- Alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on front
- Alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on back
- Combined arm and leg actions on front and back
- Plus age-appropriate water safety topics

LEVEL 2: Fundamental Aquatic Skills

Gives students success with fundamental skills.

- Enter water by stepping or jumping from the side
- Exit water using ladder, steps or side
- Fully submerge and hold breath
- Bobbing
- Open eyes under water and retrieve submerged objects
- Rotary breathing
- Front, jellyfish and tuck floats
- Back glide and recover to a vertical position
- Front glide and recover to a vertical position
- Roll from front to back and back to front
- Tread water using arm and leg actions
- Change direction of travel while swimming on front or back
- Combined arm and leg actions on front and back
- Finning arm action
- Plus age-appropriate water safety topics

LEVEL 3: Stroke Development

Builds on the skills in Level 2 through additional guided practice in deeper water.

- Enter water by jumping from the side, fully sub merge then recover to the surface and return to the side
- Headfirst entries from the side in sitting and kneeling positions
- Bobbing while moving toward safety
- Rotary breathing
- Back float
- Survival float
- Change from vertical to horizontal position on front and back
- Tread water

- Flutter and dolphin kicks on front
- Scissors and breaststroke kicks
- Front crawl and elementary backstroke
- Plus age-appropriate water safety topics

LEVEL 4: Stroke **Improvement**

Develops confidence in the skills learned and improves other aquatic skills.

- Headfirst entries from the side in compact and stride positions
- Swim under water
- Feetfirst surface dive
- Survival swimming
- Open turns on front and back
- Tread water using 2 different kicks
- Front and back crawl, elementary backstroke, breaststroke, sidestroke and butterfly
- Flutter and dolphin kicks on back
- Plus age-appropriate water safety topics

LEVEL 5: Stroke Refinement

Provides further coordination and refinement of strokes.

Level 5 participants learn to:

Public Tree Care

The Huron Parks and Recreation Department supports the proper care of our urban forest trees which includes parks and other public land, and the tree care efforts of homeowners on their private property.

Trees are provided to the third graders every year as health protocol allows at all Huron Schools through our department and through the county with the help of the Beadle County Conservation District. A tree given out to a 3rd grader during the initial start of this program became our state Christmas tree in 2016. These trees are part of the future tree program to make Huron an even better place to live. Trees lost in our city parks due to flooding will need to be replaced as funds allow. Memorial Park, Riverside Park, and Prospect Park continues to need a extensive tree planting program if flooding is not an issue again this spring.



Young trees will need proper pruning and extra water and mulch to provide enough food with the remaining leaf surface to thrive for another growing season. Please call the Huron Parks and Recreation Department for more information on tree care at (605) 353-8533 or contact our local Extension Office at (605) 353-8436.

Emerald Ash Borer

The discovery of Emerald Ash Borer in Sioux Falls, SD three years ago has raised some questions in Huron. Action to be ready for the movement of this insect toward this part of the state depends on many factors that could be anywhere from one year to many years away based on diseased tree controls and any transport of infected wood. The city will continue tree removal efforts on the boulevards to remove the most declining trees.

To best know what we have in our parks and city boulevards an updated tree species inventory needs to be completed. Our local Huron Master Gardeners have agreed to help do what they can to assist the department in identifying species of trees to get an accurate count of declining ash trees and total ash numbers. Estimates in other cities have been over 40% ash trees which would cause a great deal of concern if these are lost. Many American Elms were lost in the 1970's and 1980's in Huron and we are still recovering from that event with maple varieties becoming a more dominant tree number species.

If you see Master Gardener volunteers out on the boulevards in Huron, please work with them as they are helping to create a great local service to our community by placing the tree inventory on modern data devices. The help from the public would be appreciated and contact our office if you have any questions on how to work with your private property trees.

Thank you for your help to better the quality of life in Huron by maintaining a quality urban forest and a qualifying Tree City USA for 38 years.
