Keeping it safe for fairgoers

To say that the preparations for this year's S.D. State Fair have been unusual would be an understatement.

"Yes," said State Fair Manager Peggy Besch during a recent respite in her continuing work toward this year's fall classic, "that would be a fair statement. We've had some obstacles, but we are also being presented some opportunities and are working on making this fair memorable."

Just as did most events on the entertainment calendar, the COVID-19 pandemic threw a curveball at the state fair planners. To make this year's fair as safe as possible for those venturing to Huron the first weekend in September, a long list of precautions have been taken.

⁷ The first line of safety that there is, of course, are the people themselves," Besch said. "We encourage everyone who doesn't feel well, who feels they may have been exposed or believe they pose a risk, with COVID or anything, to just stay home."

Fair staff will have their temperature taken each day and will have individual barriers installed where practical, and while masks will be provided, they are not mandatory. "I have been wearing a mask so much I don't even think about it anymore," she added.

On the grounds, there are additional hand washing stations set up on the





grounds, with more portable stations to be installed. Inside the doors to most buildings there are hand sanitizer stations. Signage, at the gates and throughout the fairgrounds remind people to social distance as well.

"The food court has received additional hand washing stations," Besch pointed out. "Picnic tables and benches are spread out to encourage distancing and food vendors are restricted from using any self-service products or condiments." Besch said that additional cleaning is being required of food booths and other high traffic areas.

Likewise, the carnival will temperature check all of its employees and will clean rides throughout the day, with a sanitation at least once a day. "We may make some modifications to the rides where we need to," Besch said.

The fair had a dry-run of sorts, with the national Big Red Power Round Up, held the second weekend of August. "We had a good weekend for the Round Up," Besch said. "We learned some things that we will address and improve for the fair, to make the entire festival a fun – and safe – experience for all who attend!"


Welcome to the S.D. State Fair

Something new planned this year at S.D. State Fair Grandstand

The COVID-19 pandemic, concert tour cancellations and the passing of a country music icon has presented the S.D. State Fair Board with issues not commonly dealt with, to prepare for this year's fair.

"We were forced to really look at this year's fair through a different lens,"

said State Fair Manager Peggy Besch. "Can we really hold a state fair without grandstand concerts? We looked at things and realized that we have the opportunity to try some different things this year."

In late June, when the announcement was

made that the Big Red Power Round Up, a national event, would be postponed until later in the summer, it was followed by the news that due to cancellation of all national tours, the planned concerts by The Charlie Daniels Band and the Marshall Tucker Band, would be cancelled for the year. Then county icon Charlie Daniels passed away two weeks later.

On tap for fair goers this year will be a blend of activities at the remodeled grandstand.

The fair will open with the Red Wilk Construction/ Tuff Hedeman Bull Bash on Thursday and Friday, Sept. 3 and 4.

The next afternoon, on Saturday and again Sunday afternoon, the S.D. Timed Event Championship Rodeo, featuring some of the area's top young ropers, barrel racers and bull-doggers will take to the big arena at the grandstand.

"Normally, the Timed Event Championship Rodeo is in a small arena to the east of the grandstand," Besch said. "We have the ability to put this year's championship in a much larger venue for people to view these competitors."

In between, on Saturday night the ATV Big Air Tour blows into the state fair, with high fliers and four-wheel daredevils providing free entertainment at the grandstand.

On Sunday night, a laser light and fireworks show, which is free to attend for fair attendees, will take place at the fairgrounds, and on Monday, the Thunder at the

Fair Outlaw truck and tractor pull will close the grandstand entertainment.

"We looked and thought that this might be a chance to see if we could have an activity in the afternoon and reset for something completely different in the evening," Besch said. "We are working, with help from

the city, to make sure that we get things set up for the next grandstand act."

In addition to the grandstand stage, there are six other free entertainment stages spread throughout the fairgrounds as well.

"I'm also really excited about some of the other things we have going on this year," Besch said. "That includes some new rides from our combined carnival vendors, and the addition of a Craft Beer Tap Haus, which will be adjacent the wine pavilion."

As the wine pavilion features a selection of S.D. produced wines, the Tap Haus, will feature a wide variety of beers from S.D. brewers.

"It will be a different fair," Besch said, "but we are all very excited to bring this revamped line up of entertainment to this year's event."

- Frequent sanitation of counters


