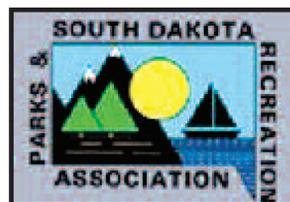

1. SUMMER REGISTRATION START DATES ARE: Monday, March 25, 2024

On-line Registration: To register, use the QR Code or go to www.huronsd.gov. Click on Community, Activity Registration and Proceed to Site. If you have not done any business with our department, then you will need to create an account and enter all family's information. If you already have an account, just login and register or call our office to activate your current account. Please do not create another account if you have previously done so to eliminate duplicate accounts.

2. Registrations are accepted on a first come first serve basis. Online registration is encouraged. All registration fees are to be paid at the time of registration. There will be a 3.12% software transaction fee applied to all credit card transactions in office or online.
3. The Huron Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel, combine, or divide classes; to change the time, date or location of classes; or make other revisions which may be necessary. If a class is cancelled due to insufficient registrants, participants are given the opportunity to transfer to another class of equal value or receive a refund.

Exercise Trails

Location: Memorial Park (1.2 miles)

All are welcome to use this 1.2 mile concrete trail, which follows along the James River on the edge of Memorial Park. The trail runs through the west side of the park.

Location: Ravine Lake Park (5,595' or 1.1 mile)

The Ravine Lake Trail adds a great opportunity to the total trail system in Huron. The Ravine Lake Park is experiencing many positive changes in appearance and usage. A community wide effort has been involved in this project. Follow the extended trail along Jersey Avenue to connect to Riverside Park.

Location: Riverside Park (Approximately .25 mile)

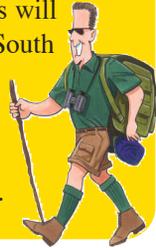
This trail is also concrete and follows along the James River on the south side of 3rd Street.

Location: Southwest Huron starting at Pepsi Soccer Complex (Approx 2.5 miles) to Wal-Mart along Lincoln Avenue, 15th and Arizona, 21st & Dakota Avenue SW up to 27th on Dakota Ave SW.

The concrete trail provides walking and biking access to many businesses and services. The total city trail length is approximately 5 ½ miles, which will hopefully become a part of the city-wide trail system. Further trail opportunities will be considered with the proposed Dakota Avenue/South Dakota Department of Transportation development project.

Location: Central Park (.5 mile)

The trail winds around Splash Central Waterpark.

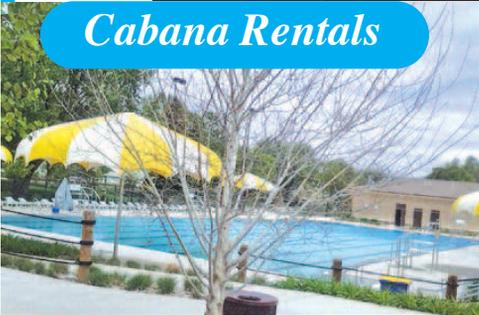

LEVEL 1: Introduction to Water Skills

Helps participants feel comfortable in the water.

- Enter water using ramp, steps or side
- Exit water using ladder, steps or side
- Blow bubbles through mouth and nose
- Bobbing
- Open eyes under water and retrieve submerged objects
- Front and back glides and recover to a vertical position
- Back float
- Roll from front to back and back to front
- Tread water using arm and hand actions
- Alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on front
- Alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on back
- Combined arm and leg actions on front and back
- Plus age-appropriate water safety topics

LEVEL 2: Fundamental Aquatic Skills

Gives students success with fundamental skills.

- Enter water by stepping or jumping from the side
- Exit water using ladder, steps or side
- Fully submerge and hold breath
- Bobbing
- Open eyes under water and retrieve submerged objects
- Rotary breathing
- Front, jellyfish and tuck floats
- Back glide and recover to a vertical position
- Front glide and recover to a vertical position
- Roll from front to back and back to front
- Tread water using arm and leg actions
- Change direction of travel while swimming on front or back
- Combined arm and leg actions on front and back
- Finning arm action
- Plus age-appropriate water safety topics

LEVEL 3: Stroke Development

Builds on the skills in Level 2 through additional guided practice in deeper water.

- Enter water by jumping from the side, fully submerge then recover to the surface and return to the side
- Headfirst entries from the side in sitting and kneeling positions
- Bobbing while moving toward safety
- Rotary breathing
- Back float
- Survival float
- Change from vertical to horizontal position on front and back
- Tread water



+ This symbol indicates a physical activity. The SD Department of Health recommends daily physical activity to enhance heart health.

- *Flutter and dolphin kicks on front*
- *Scissors and breaststroke kicks*
- *Front crawl and elementary backstroke*
- *Plus age-appropriate water safety topics*

LEVEL 4: Stroke Improvement

Develops confidence in the skills learned and improves other aquatic skills.

- *Headfirst entries from the side in compact and stride positions*
- *Swim under water*
- *Feetfirst surface dive*
- *Survival swimming*
- *Open turns on front and back*
- *Tread water using 2 different kicks*
- *Front and back crawl, elementary backstroke, breaststroke, sidestroke and butterfly*
- *Flutter and dolphin kicks on back*
- *Plus age-appropriate water safety topics*

LEVEL 5: Stroke Refinement

Provides further coordination and refinement of strokes.

- Level 5 participants learn to:
- *Shallow-angle dive from the side then glide and begin a front stroke*
 - *Tuck and pike surface dives, submerge completely*
 - *Front and back crawl, elementary backstroke, breaststroke, sidestroke and butterfly*
 - *Sculling*
 - *Plus age-appropriate water safety topics*

LEVEL 6: Swimming and Skill Proficiency

Refines the strokes so participants swim them with ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances.
