

Kooistra enlisted in the Army in 1996 and served a tour in Baumholder, Germany, after which he was commissioned as a Military Intelligence Officer at Ft Benning, Ga., and served with the U.S. Army's First Infantry Division. Upon leaving active duty and entering law school, Kooistra served with the 147th Field Artillery Regiment, South Dakota Army National Guard and, since 2007, has served as a Judge Advocate General (JAG) Officer with the 114th Fighter Wing and Headquarters, South Dakota Air National Guard. Kooistra is currently the State Staff Judge Advocate for Air.

In his civilian capacity, Kooistra serves as the Chief Operating Officer and Gen-

eral Counsel for the Dakota State University Applied Research Corporation (DARC), South Dakota's public/private partnership focused on bringing the cyber industry to our state. Kooistra was in the private practice of law for over 13 years and, from 2018 to 2023, served as the Sioux Falls City Attorney. Kooistra is also the Founder and Chairman of the South Dakota Military Heritage Alliance, a non-profit corporation that has raised over \$12 million toward unifying and supporting veteran organizations, active military servicemembers, their families, and South Dakota's patriotic community at-large. Kooistra and his wife of 26 years, Anna, have four children: Isabel, Oscar, Owen, and Emmett.

Must see exhibits at the South Dakota State Fair

airgoers entering the gates on the first day of the South Dakota State Fair Wednesday, Aug. 28, will be treated to an extravaganza that has been weeks in the making by dozens of behind-thescenes volunteers and staff.

Thousands of exhibits will have

been meticulously, and artfully, displayed in Horizon's Hall (formerly the Women's Building), the Arts and Education Building and the Horticulture Building.

Horticulture Building

One must-see is always the beautiful Mirror Room in the center of the Horticulture Building.

"The Mirror Room will feature dif-

ferent themes each day," said building superintendent Michael Bishop of Alexandria. "We utilize the exhibits that come in. That way we make it interesting, and it changes every day.

"We did that last year and it went over very well," he said. "To ask any one organization to spend the kind of money needed to decorate the Mirror Room is very expensive."

They currently have more than 1,400 entries that will be on exhibit in the building.

Bishop said most people really liked seeing the different daily displays. "People called their friends to come see their exhibit in the Mirror Room," he added. "They were taking pictures and making memories — and

that's what the fair should be, making memories."

New this year will be live tasting and judging of tomatoes Wednesday afternoon.

Guest speakers will talk about everything from alternative gardening, a program planned on Friday, to utilizing raised flower beds.

On Saturday morning and afternoon they will feature Farm to Flowers programs, featuring two groups that will tell their story of how they raise their flowers and create bouquets. People in the audience will be able to try their hand at floral arranging.

"The big feature will be Sunday when we have Dr. John Ball come in and talk about trees — all things trees," Bishop said "How to manage trees, what kinds of trees to pick for various uses, how to plant and how to water."

Horizons Hall

More than 1,600 exhibits are expected to fill Horizons Hall, formerly the Women's Building on the S.D. State Fairgrounds.

"Men can exhibit in this building just as much as women," said Jo Freier of Mitchell, who has been superintendent of the building since 2016. "Our big draw is our guilts."

Quilts customarily line the interior of the large



building in a colorful display, with other displays of baked goods, canning and needlework and crafts.

"We have wonderful cooking demonstrations planned," Freier said. "Pam Linton is coming back this year on Friday morning for a cooking demonstration. She provides recipes and samples of her food. She will also be here on Thursday afternoon in the Auditorium, she has what's called a Cotton Patch Boutique."

Thursday is Value-Added Ag Day at the fair, and they plan to have four back-to-back cooking demonstrations; and each day South Dakota Pork will be providing demonstrations in the kitchen.

On Friday the popular Sew Your Own event will be held with two brand new sewing machines to be presented as sweepstake prizes. A Sew Your Own style show will be held at 3:30 p.m.

"On Saturday we'll give the Bert Stiner Award," she added. Freier said the Stiner family provides that award in memory of their mother. The grand prize winner receives \$250 and their name placed on a plaque displayed in the building.

Sunday at noon they are planning a style show through Diamonds in the Rough, a Huron boutique.

Sarah Fridley of Mitchell will give a presentation Sunday at 3 p.m. on the Quilts of Valor program.

They will again host the Family Heirloom Recipe contest, which is judged by a woman from Illinois who travels to South Dakota each year for the event.

"We again are having our fun homemade wine contest," Freier said. "That's at 12:30 p.m. Monday, that's our last fun exhibit we do in the building."



One window display will feature the County Best in Show, representing an exhibit from each county fair. Those all come in the Tuesday before the fair to be judged and organized in an exhibit.

"Then we open the doors Wednesday, Aug. 28, at 9 a.m.," Freier said. "It's a three-week process, it takes that long to do what we do.

"I have a wonderful crew, I could not do my job without them," she added. "It's a busy job and it's a job I get a lot of pleasure out of. When I lock the door on Labor Day, I go home with a sense of accomplishment."

s superintendent of the Arts & Education Building at the S.D. State Fairgrounds for the past dozen years, Mary Helen Wipf of Huron is always amazed by the creative entries that come

They also added coloring pages, which are pre-printed pages filled with tiny segments to be colored to create a full picture. "We also added paper cutting, but we didn't get any entries for that. A good example would be a silhouette using a tiny scissors or a blade to make fancy cuts."

The Arts & Education Building is filled top to bottom with artwork, including 110 entries from artists in mediums including oil, watercolors and pastels, and 308 photography entries featuring all levels from professionals to youth.

The largest division of entries are children's artwork that is submitted by schools in South Dakota.

"We have 6,131 entries from 30 schools that entered artwork this year," Wipf said. "We also had some home school entries, as well. They're all hung and on display."

They also have a selection of South Dakota Books, which are made by fourth graders, and they hosted an essay contest for students titled, Great State of South Dakota.

Wipf said they will have the Mural of Infinite Variety in the building that people will be invited to help create.

Each day different South Dakota authors will speak and sign books.


