Brookings, prepare for the sound of motorcycles

BROOKINGS — Don't be surprised at high noon Saturday if you see — and hear — hundreds of motorcycles roaring through Brookings. It's all for the 727 DAV's 20th Annual Charity Poker Run, which benefits veterans.

"Come out and enjoy a great, well-organized charity run," Bob Foster, one of the event's backers, said in an interview with the *Brookings Register*. "It's structured and we promote safety and support a super cause — to help the vets get to their VA appointments."

Last year's charity ride attracted 450 motorcycles and brought in \$53,000 for the Disabled American Veterans Hospital Transportation Network, Foster said. It was a record fundraising effort that brought the lifetime total donation to the network to \$449,000 over a 19-year period. The network provides free rides for Veterans to the

VA health care systems and VA clinics.

Registration begins at 10 a.m. for Saturday's event at the Dacotah Bank Center, 824 32nd Ave., and costs \$20 per person. The parade will depart at noon, traveling west on Sixth Street, then turning south on Main Avenue and heading out of Brookings to the following locations:

- Flandreau (sponsored by the Flandreau VFW at the City Park)
- Madison VFW
- Arlington American Legion
- Estelline American Legion

Participants will return to the Dacotah Bank Center in Brookings afterward, where an auction and door prizes await.

"It's kind of the same mixture of different things — there'll be some cash prizes, gift certificates, Jack Daniels barrel head ... we've had that for about 10-12 years," Foster said.

He added that a flat-screen TV and a smart watch are also part of the prize pool, along with an American flag

afghan. Besides that, there's also a \$500 prize for the best hand.

Foster said he hopes the card draw will be done by 5:30 p.m. so the top three poker hands can be awarded; after that, Rolling Thunder, which assists with the charity poker run, will have its annual raffle. Once that's completed, then the door prizes will be awarded.

The event is certainly a popular one, too, with Foster pointing out that it's averaged 700 people in attendance over the last several years.

Don't have a motorcycle and/or it's raining cats and dogs? Hey, no worries. All vehicles are welcome at the charity poker run, and it's going take place rain or shine. And if you have more questions, Foster said folks can contact him at 605-690-1961.

Head Start remains strong in South Dakota

Head Start — a federal program providing early childhood education to children from low-income families — has struggled recently in some states but remains strong in South Dakota.

"We're in a lot better shape than some other programs around the country," Eric Kunzweiler, interim Head Start director and chief executive officer for Inter-Lakes Community Action Partnership, said. "There is a national, I guess, barrier right now or problem with Head Start recruitment of employees due to several things, but one of it is teacher pay. And nationally teacher pay isn't equivalent with what a teacher would make in a school district — it's a little bit lower. But the educational requirements for teachers are pretty close to what is required in a school district."

Kunzweiler is interim Head Start director at ICAP because they're currently hiring a new full-time director. Despite that, he said they haven't experienced some of the recruitment challenges reported elsewhere; they expect to have a new director soon.

Earlier this year, the Alaska Head Start program closed a preschool center to find money for pay increases to address employee turnover.

"The office of Head Start is allowing programs to look at restructuring," Kunzweiler said. "What that can do then is maybe eliminate some staff, but it's also going to eliminate some children that receive services. But in the long run those programs then would be able to keep that funding. They wouldn't lose the funding; they'd be able to keep it, which in turn would allow them to pay staff more."

He said that's not something ICAP is doing.

"We've been pretty lucky as a program here at ICAP," Kunzweiler said. "We do have, you know, difficulties with teacher turnover — especially in Sioux Falls. We've been pretty lucky in our other areas though. But you know, it just comes down to finding those qualified staff. The labor market's really tough right now."

The Department of Health and Human Services responded to those concerns by issuing new rules Aug. 16 that will raise salaries for most Head Start teachers by \$10,000 over the course

of several years.

"Unfortunately, it is an unfunded mandate," Kunzweiler said. "They're going to require it; but as of right now there's no funding tied to it. So it's going to be up to the programs to become compliant with that eventually at some point — whether that's on the program themselves or on the change of scope of the program, like what you've been reading about like they did in Alaska. That's an option. Or my hope is — now that they have this final rule out — now it gives them a little bit more ammo to continue to talk to Congress about funding that mandate."

ICAP administers Head Start for a 12-county region in South Dakota that includes Brookings. They have an enrollment of 375 kids, including 57 in Brookings. They also serve an additional 24 children in Brookings through Early Head Start — a program for pregnant people and kids up to age 3.

"Over the years, the Head Start program has become very well known," Kunzweiler said. "It's proven to be a highly effective early childhood program to have kids ready for school. I think they (Health and Human

Medicaid decision rests with SD voters

An attempt by Republican lawmakers to add work requirements for South Dakotans covered under Medicaid expansion will hinge on two election outcomes in November.

First, voters will decide on Amendment F, a legislative effort to allow employment criteria to be used for able-bodied adults to receive Medicaid benefits as part of the 2022 expansion approved by South Dakota voters.

Medicaid is a joint federal and state program that helps cover medical costs for qualified individuals with limited income and resources.

Even if voters approve the change to the state constitution, it will take a victory by Republican Donald Trump in the presidential election to move the plan forward. That's because changes to Medicaid eligibility need to be cleared through the federal government.

When Trump was in office from 2017-2021, his administration approved work requirement plans for 13 states. Most required working-age recipients who don't have children or other dependents to be employed at least 80 hours a month to stay covered, with exemptions such as full-time schooling or community service.

When Democrat Joe Biden took office in 2021, the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services blocked such requests and rescinded state plans approved under Trump, many of which were tied up in the court system at the time.

State Rep. Tony Venhuizen, a Sioux Falls Republican who helped spearhead Amendment F, told News Watch that Democrats keeping the White House would almost certainly delay implementation of Medicaid work requirements in South Dakota for at least four years.

"Biden has disallowed them. I assume (Democratic nominee) Kamala Harris would do the same," said Venhuizen. "There has really not been enough time to fully implement these plans in any state."

Contrast in political philosophies

Work requirements are already part of the federally funded Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), commonly known as food stamps.

Adding the criteria to able-bodied Medicaid health care recipients highlights a fundamental difference between conservative and liberal political philosophies, not just in South Dakota but

Don't let frost end your garden season

No matter where you garden there never seems to be enough time to grow and enjoy all your favorite vegetables. Start preparing now to extend your growing season and continue enjoying garden fresh vegetables even after the first frost.

Some vegetables like cabbage, broccoli, cauliflower, kale and Brussels sprouts tolerate frost and even taste better after a slight chill. Most of these can tolerate temperatures as low as 24 to 28 degrees F.

Leeks are another vegetable that thrives in cooler temperature. Many tolerate temperatures as low as 20 degrees F. Just mound some protective mulch around the plants and continue harvesting.

Take advantage of the chilly winter temperatures to store some of your carrots, turnips and parsnips in the ground for winter. Just cover the soil with straw or ever-

green boughs after it lightly freezes. Dig as needed or during a winter thaw. You will enjoy their wonderfully sweet flavor.

Those first few fall frosts are often followed by a week or more of mild temperatures. Protecting frost sensitive plants from the first few fall frosts is one way of extending your season. Cover the plants with old bed sheets, mattress pads, or similar items in late afternoon and remove them as soon as the temperatures climb above freezing. Keep these handy and be ready to cover whenever frost is in the forecast.

Make it easier by using floating row covers. The spun material allows air, light and water through while protecting the plants from frost. You will find different weights of row covers that provide different levels of temperature protection. Just loosely cover the plants and anchor the edges with stones, boards or garden pins. You only need to remove the fabric to harvest ripe vegetables. Otherwise, it can stay in place until the vegetables stop producing or you decide it is time to end the season.

Create a high tunnel over garden beds filled with large plants. Use hoops and row cover to allow easy access for harvesting while protecting the plants.

Cloches have long been used to jump start the season or extend it beyond the first fall frost. You'll find a variety of shapes and sizes available. Select one large enough to cover your plants and protect them as needed. Look for those with vents to prevent plants from overheating and those that allow water through while trapping in the heat.

Don't let unripe tomatoes go to waste if you are unable or unwilling to protect them from frost. Harvest any that are starting to show color before the killing frost and finish ripening them indoors. The bottom of the tomato should be greenish white or starting to color up. Store your green tomatoes in a cool (60 to 65 degrees) location to extend their storage life.

Spread out the tomatoes on heavy paper or wrap them individually in newspaper so the fruit do not touch each other. They'll ripen over the next few weeks. Speed up the process by moving a few tomatoes to a warm bright location a few days before they're needed. Enjoy green tomatoes fried, in relish, salsa, pies or many other ways.

And when your season ends, begin planning for next year. Enlist some of these strategies to jump start the season for an earlier harvest.

Sioux Falls man sentenced on child porn charges

PIERRE — A Sioux Falls man has been sentenced to 15 years in prison after pleading guilty to three counts of possessing, manufacturing or distributing child pornography.

Cory William Wendt, 32, was sentenced Aug. 22 in Lincoln County Circuit Court. He had originally been charged with 10 counts of possessing, manufacturing or distributing child pornography.

Wendt was charged in January 2023 following an investigation conducted by State Division of Criminal Investigation agents who are assigned to the South Dakota Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force. The Lincoln County State's Attorney's Office prosecuted the case.

The South Dakota ICAC Task Force is led by DCI and consists of state and local law enforcement agencies located throughout the state that work together to combat the online sexual exploitation and sexual victimization of children.

"This is an example of the strong, cooperative working relationship between state and local government entities," said Attorney General Marty Jackley. "These are horrific crimes that continue to be prosecuted at all levels."

Lincoln County Deputy States Attorney Amanda Eden, who prosecuted the case, said the evidence collected in the ICAC investigation played an essential role in the conviction and sentencing of the defendant.

"Without the ICAC's hard work and dedication to track down offenders like Wendt, the Lincoln County State's Attorney's Office and other prosecutors across the state would be unable to secure convictions of those who choose to exploit children for their own sexual gratification," she said. "The Court in sentencing Wendt highlighted how every click Wendt engaged in on his electronic devices contributed to the revictimization of society's most vulnerable individuals, our children."

Name released in fatal crash near Edgemont

EDGEMONT — A 44-year-old man died Friday, Aug. 23, from injuries sustained in an Aug. 3 crash near Edgemont.

Preliminary crash information indicates Adan Zavala-Lopez, the driver of a 2011 Yamaha motorcycle, was traveling east on US Highway 18 near mile marker 20. The motorcycle left the roadway to the right and Zavala-Lopez became separated from the motorcycle in the south ditch. Zavala-Lopez sustained serious, life-threatening injuries and was taken to a Rapid City hospital. He passed away from his injuries on Aug. 23.

The South Dakota Highway Patrol is investigating the crash.

Tribal prioritized law enforcement training graduation Sept. 3

PIERRE — South Dakota Attorney General Marty Jackley announces that 21 officers, including nine tribal law enforcement officers, will graduate from the state's tribal prioritized law enforcement class course on Tuesday, Sept. 3.

The 13-week course, which started June 3, included instruction in the law, arrest control tactics, firearms, vehicle handling, and criminal investigations.

Graduation begins at 11 a.m. Tuesday at the George S. Mickelson Criminal Justice Center in Pierre. The ceremony will include opening remarks by Gov. Noem and the keynote address by Attorney General Jackley.

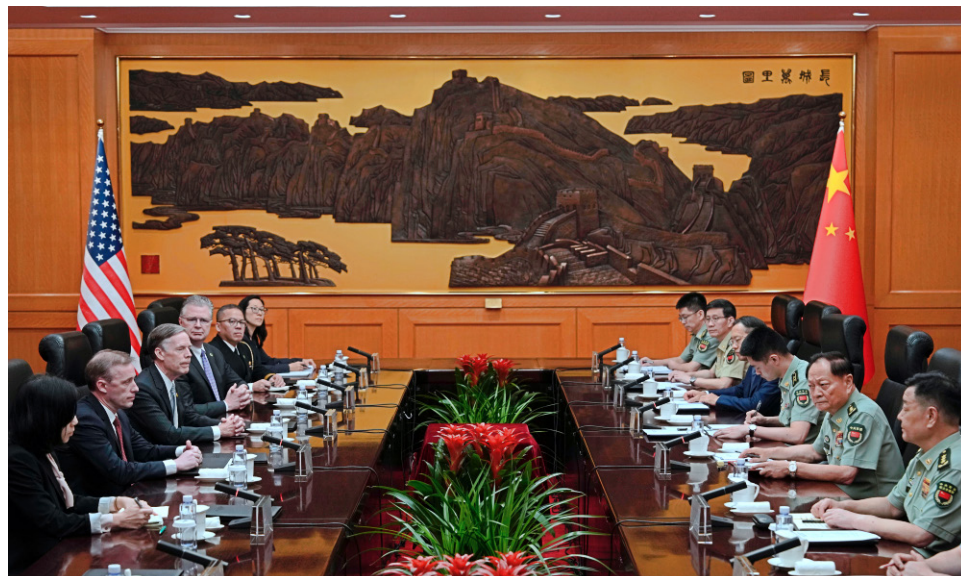
Chinese leader Xi meets U.S. national security adviser

BEIJING (AP) — Chinese leader Xi Jinping met with U.S. National Security Adviser Jake Sullivan on Thursday as the latter wound up a three-day visit with the stated aim of keeping communications open in a relationship that has become increasingly tense in recent years.

Sullivan, on his first trip to China as the main adviser to President Joe Biden on national security issues, earlier met with Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi and a top general from the Central Military Commission.

Starting with a trade war that dates back to 2018, China and the United States have grown at odds over a range of issues, from global security, such as China's claims over the South China Sea, to industrial policy on electric vehicle and solar panel manufacturing. Sullivan's trip this week is meant to keep the tensions from spiraling into conflict.

"We believe that competition with China does not have to lead to conflict or confrontation. The key is responsible management through diplomacy," he told

reporters at a news conference shortly before leaving Beijing.

Both governments are eager to keep relations on an even keel ahead of a change in the U.S. presidency in January. They said they remain committed to managing the relationship, following up on a meeting between Xi and Biden in San Francisco last November.

"While great changes have taken place in the two

countries and in China-U.S. relations, China's commitment to the goal of a stable, healthy and sustainable China-U.S. relationship remains unchanged," Xi said.

"President Biden is committed to responsibly managing this consequential relationship to ensure that competition does not veer into conflict or confrontation, and to work together where our interests align," Sullivan said.

The two countries agreed to work toward a phone call between Xi and Biden in the coming weeks, and Sullivan indicated the two could meet in person at the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation or Group of 20 summits later this year.

"The likelihood is they'll both be there and if they are, it would only be natural for them to have the chance to sit down with one another," he said.

ABBA wants Trump to stop using their music

NEW YORK (AP) — Swedish supergroup ABBA has asked Donald Trump to stop using their music at campaign rallies, but the Republican presidential nominee's campaign says it has permission.

"ABBA has recently discovered the unauthorized use of their music and videos at a Trump event through videos that appeared online," said a statement to The Associated Press from the band, whose hits include "Waterloo," "The Winner Takes It All" and "Money, Money, Money."

"As a result, ABBA and its representative has promptly requested the removal and deletion of such content. No request has been received; therefore, no permission or license has been granted."

A spokesman for the Trump campaign said it had obtained a license. "The campaign had a license to play ABBA music through our agreement with BMI and ASCAP," the spokesperson told the AP.

ABBA joins a long list of performers who've objected to Trump using their songs. Ahead of the 2020 election, that included Bruce Springsteen, Rihanna, Phil Collins, Pharrell, John Fogerty, Neil Young, Eddy Grant, Panic! at the Disco, R.E.M. and Guns N' Roses.

Meat plant broke food safety rules dozens of times, records show

(AP) — A Boar's Head deli meat plant in Virginia tied to a deadly food poisoning outbreak repeatedly violated federal regulations, including instances of mold, insects, liquid dripping from ceilings, and meat and fat residue on walls, floors and equipment, newly released records show.

Government inspectors logged 69 instances of "noncompliance" with federal rules in the past year, including several in recent weeks, according to documents released through federal Freedom of Information Act requests.

Inspections at the plant have been suspended and it will remain closed "until the establishment is able to demonstrate it can produce safe product," U.S. Agriculture Department officials said in a statement

Thursday. Boar's Head officials halted production at the Jarratt, Virginia, plant in late July.

The plant has been linked to the deaths of at least nine people and hospitalizations of about 50 others in 18 states. All were sickened with listeria after eating Boar's Head Provisions Co. Inc. deli meats. The company recalled more than 7 million pounds of products last month after tests confirmed that listeria bacteria in Boar's Head products were making people sick.

Between Aug. 1, 2023, and Aug. 2, 2024, inspectors found "heavy discolored meat buildup" and "meat overspray on walls and large pieces of meat on the floor." They also documented flies "going in and out" of pickle vats and "black patches of mold" on a ceiling. One inspector detailed blood puddled on the floor and "a rancid smell in the cooler." Plant staff were repeatedly notified that they had failed to meet requirements, the documents showed.

Bridge

By PHILLIP ALDER

Albert Claude, a Belgian biologist who shared the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine in 1974, said, "In the name of the experimental method and out of our poor knowledge, are we really entitled to claim that everything happens by chance, to the exclusion of all other possibilities?"

At the bridge table, there is an element of chance. But you can often improve the likelihood of making your contract if you consider all of the possibilities.

This deal contains several possibilities. South is in four hearts. West leads a low trump. Declarer wins and returns a heart, West taking his ace and playing a third round, while East discards two diamonds. How should South continue?

North might have rebid four hearts.

There are four potential losers: two spades, one heart and one club.

A tempting line is to cash dummy's club ace, return to hand with a diamond, and take the club finesse.

It is better to cash both of dummy's top clubs before playing a third round. If West has the club queen, South is always safe because West cannot attack spades with effect. With this layout, though, both of those lines fail, assuming East shifts to a spade when in with the club queen.

The correct line is to play a diamond to dummy's king, then to lead a spade to, say, the jack. West wins and shifts to a club, but declarer wins and plays another spade. Dummy's 10 is estab-

Walking soccer offers safety and health benefits

Move over pickleball, the next sports trend for the older athlete is walking soccer.

We love the idea that you can modify a sport, like what happened when tennis morphed into pickleball, and still retain the excitement of participation and the health benefits.

Whether you are a soccer veteran or a newbie, walking soccer's rules are designed to protect you from endless running, head injuries, and strained or torn muscles and tendons, while retaining the competitive fun. One foot must be on the ground at all times — no jogging or running; all free kicks are indirect; and the ball must never go up in the air above the height of your head. There are only six people on the field from each team and the field is smaller than the regulation

one; matches last 60, not 90, minutes.

As for the health benefits, one study found that for guys ages 50 and older who had osteoarthritis of the knee, high blood pressure or Type 2 diabetes, playing the game for two hours a week for 12 weeks reduced body mass and total body fat. ORDINANCE 24-027 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 72 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS AND PERTAINING TO STORM DRAINAGE.
 BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS, STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA, AS FOLLOWS:
I.
 THAT CHAPTER 72, ARTICLE I. and II. of the Code of Ordinances and pertaining to Storm Drainage is hereby amended to read as follows:
ARTICLE 1 - IN GENERAL
 Sec. 72-1. Title.
 These regulations may be referred to as the "Storm Drain-

age Ordinance" of the City of Brookings and the area of extraterritorial jurisdiction. (Ord. No. 21-10, 6-8-2010) Sec. 72-2. Purpose. The purpose of this chapter is to provide for the health, safety and general welfare of the City of Brookings with respect to storm drainage to the maximum extent practicable and as required by federal and state law by:
 (1) Establishing methods for controlling the introduction of pollutants into the municipal separate storm sewer system (hereinafter referred to as the "MS4") in order to comply with requirements of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit process.
 (2) Prohibiting illicit connections and discharges to the municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4).
 (3) Establishing legal authority for the City of Brookings to carry out all inspection, surveillance and monitoring procedures necessary to ensure compliance with this chapter.
 (4) Establishing a drainage fee structure for funding public storm drainage infrastructure improvements within the City of Brookings.
 (5) Establishing stormwater design standards for the City of Brookings. (Ord. No. 21-10, 6-8-2010) Sec. 72-3. Authority. In accordance with the South Dakota Water Pollution Control Act and the Administrative Rules of South Dakota (ARSD) Chapters 74:52:01 through 74:52:11, and any other authority provided by law or as such statutes may be amended, the city does hereby exercise the power and authority with respect to storm drainage in the city and for the area of extraterritorial jurisdiction. (Ord. No. 21-10, 6-8-2010) Sec. 72-4. Inspections by authorized city staff. As part of the city's stormwater pollution detection and elimination program, the city engineer or designee reserves the right to inspect and monitor all facilities which discharge into the MS4. All inspections may be documented and may include photographs of violations and potential problem areas. (Ord. No. 21-10, 6-8-2010) Sec. 72-5. Definitions. The following words and phrases used in this chapter are defined below:
 Best management practices (BMPs) mean various activities, prohibitions of practices, maintenance procedures and other management practices, either structural or non-structural, for the purpose of preventing or reducing the discharge of pollutants to the municipal stormwater system and/or waters of the state. Examples of structural BMPs may include permanent detention or retention ponds constructed to control and minimize stormwater runoff rates and volumes and to prevent, control, and minimize stormwater pollution. Non-structural BMPs may include ongoing treatment requirements, operating procedures, and practices to control site runoff, spillage or leaks, sludge or water disposal, or drainage from raw materials storage. BMPs may also be temporary, such as BMPs put into place during construction and maintained until the site is permanently stabilized. Clean Water Act (CWA) means the 1972 amendment to the Federal Pollution Control Act which provides the statutory basis for the NPDES permit program and the basic structure for regulating the discharge of pollutants from point sources to waters of the United States. Concrete washout means any wash waters derived from the cleaning of concrete trucks and/or equipment. Control measures means any BMP or other method used to minimize erosion and sedimentation, and thereby minimize the discharge of pollutants to waters of the state. Detention basin means a structure or facility, natural or artificial, which stores stormwater on a temporary basis and releases it at a controlled rate. Development means a parcel of land or two or more contiguous parcels of land where grading work is performed as a single unified operation on an area equal to or greater than one acre. Disturbed area means an area of land subjected to erosion due to the removal of vegetative cover and/or earthmoving activities, including unstabilized fill and soil stockpiles. Drainage way means any channel or conduit that conveys stormwater runoff. Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) means the average impervious area for a residential property. The square footage of an equivalent residential unit is deemed to be 4,573 square feet. ERU financial charge means the unit financial charge established by resolution of the City Council. Final stabilization means one of the following:
 (1) All soil disturbing activities

at the site have been completed and a uniform perennial vegetative cover with a density of 70 percent of the native cover for unpaved areas and areas not covered by permanent structures has been established, or equivalent permanent stabilization measures (such as the use of gravel, riprap, gabions, geotextiles, etc.) have been employed; or

(2) When background native vegetation will cover less than 100 percent of the ground (e.g., arid areas, beaches), the 70 percent coverage criteria is adjusted as follows: if the native vegetation covers 50 percent of the ground, 70 percent of 50 percent (0.70 x 0.50 = 0.35) would require 35 percent total cover for final stabilization. On sites with no natural vegetation, no vegetative stabilization is required; or

(3) For construction projects on land used for agricultural purposes, final stabilization may be accomplished by returning the disturbed land to its pre-construction agricultural use. Areas disturbed that were not previously used for agricultural activities, such as buffer strips immediately adjacent to waters of the state, and areas that are not being returned to their pre-construction agricultural use shall meet the final stabilization criteria in subsections (1) or (2) immediately above.

Flood means an overflow of surface water onto lands not normally covered by water. Floodplain means the area of land adjoining a lake or stream which is inundated when the flow of water exceeds the capacity of the normal feature. For mapping purposes, floodplains are designated according to the frequency of the flood event, such as the 100-year floodplain (one percent chance of occurrence in any given year) or the 500-year floodplain (0.2 percent chance of occurrence in any given year).

General stormwater permit means the South Dakota Department of Environment and Natural Resources (SD DENR) general National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Construction Stormwater Permit covering anyone conducting a land disturbing activity which disturbs one or more acres of land.

Grading means any stripping, clearing, stumping, excavating, filling, stockpiling, or any combination thereof, including the land in its excavated or filled condition.

Grading permit means a permit obtained from the City of Brookings to perform a land disturbance activity.

Infiltration means the downward movement or seepage of water from the surface into the subsoil and/or groundwater. The infiltration rate is typically expressed in terms of inches per hour.

Illicit discharge means any direct or indirect, continuous or intermittent discharge to the MS4, except as exempted in article III of this chapter that is not composed entirely of stormwater, and has not been authorized under a discharge permit issued by the State of South Dakota.

Illicit connections means either of the following:

(1) Any drain, conveyance, or component of an MS4 (as defined below), whether on the surface or subsurface, which allows an illicit discharge to enter the storm drainage system, including, but not limited to, any conveyances which allow any non-stormwater discharge including sewage, process wastewater and wash water to enter the storm drainage system; or

(2) Any connections to the storm drainage system from indoor drains and sinks, regardless of whether said drain or connection had been previously allowed, permitted, or approved by an authorized agency.

Infiltration means the process of percolating stormwater into the subsoil.

Jurisdictional wetland, or wetland means an area that is inundated or saturated by surface water or groundwater at a frequency and duration sufficient to support a prevalence of vegetation typically adapted for life in saturated soil conditions, commonly known as hydrophytic vegetation.

Land disturbing activity is any land change that may result in soil erosion from wind, water or melting, resulting in the movement of sediments into or upon waters, lands, or rights-of-way within the City of Brookings, including but not limited to building demolition, clearing and grubbing, grading, excavating, transporting and filling of land. Larger common plan of development or sale means a contiguous area of one (1) or more acres where multiple, separate and distinct construction activities are anticipated to occur at different times on different schedules under one plan, commonly referred to as a "development." Individual lots within the development which are sold to another party for the purpose of construction are still considered part of the "Larger Common Plan of Development" even after the sale.

Municipal separate storm sewer system ("MS4") is defined in 40 CFR § 122.26(b)(8) and herein to mean a conveyance or system of conveyances (including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins, curbs, gutters, ditches, swales, manmade channels or storm drains) which are:

(1) Owned and operated by a state, city, town, county, district, association, or other public body having jurisdiction over disposal of sewage, industrial wastes, stormwater or other wastes, including special districts under state law such as a sewer district, flood control district, or drainage district or similar entity, or an Indian tribe or an authorized Indian tribal organization, or a designated and approved management agency under section 208 of the Clean Water Act (CWA) that discharges to waters of the United States; and

(2) Designed or used for collecting or conveying stormwater; and

(3) Not a combined sewer; and

(4) Not part of a publicly owned treatment works (POTW) as defined at 40 CFR §122.2. Municipality means a city, town, district, sanitary district, or other public body created by or under state law with jurisdiction over the disposal of sewage, industrial wastes or other wastes.

Nonpoint source means a source of pollution that is not defined as a point source by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

Non-stormwater discharge means any discharge to the storm drain system that is not composed entirely of stormwater.

Notice of intent ("NOI") means an SDDENR form that must be filed by anyone disturbing one or more acres of land prior to the commencement of any land disturbing activity in order to be covered by the SDDENR general permit.

Notice of termination ("NOT") means an SDDENR form that must be filed after final stabilization of any land disturbing activity that was covered by the SDDENR general permit. The NOT notifies the SDDENR that permitted coverage is no longer required and that the site has been permanently stabilized.

NPDES or National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System means an EPA permit program that controls water pollution by regulated point sources that discharge pollutants into waters of the United States.

Phasing means clearing a parcel of land in distinct phases, with the stabilization of each phase completed before the clearing of the next phase.

Point source (as also defined by the EPA) means any discernible, confined and discrete conveyance, including, but not limited to, any pipe, ditch, channel, tunnel, conduit, well, discrete fissure, container, rolling stock, concentrated animal feeding operation or vessel or other floating craft from which pollutants are or may be discharged. This term does not include agricultural stormwater discharges and return flows from irrigated agriculture.

Pollutant means any dredged spoil, solid waste, incinerator residue, sewage, sewage sludge, garbage, trash, munitions, chemical wastes, biological material, radioactive material, heat, wrecked or discarded equipment, rock, sand, cellar dirt or any industrial, municipal or agricultural waste discharged into waters of the state.

Receiving body of water means any lake, pond, creek, wetland or groundwater into which stormwater runoff and conveyance systems are directed.

Responsible party means the person, developer or contractor who is responsible for performing all provisions and requirements of a grading permit or SDDENR stormwater discharge permit for construction activities, or the person or entity who is responsible for industrial or commercial discharges into an MS4.

Sediment means mineral or organic solid particulate matter that has been removed from its point of origin by soil erosion, suspension in water or wind, or water transport.

Sediment control means BMP's that prevent eroded sediment from leaving the site.

Soil erosion means the wearing away of land by the action of wind, water, gravity or a combination thereof.

Stabilization means the use of practices (BMP's) that prevent exposed soil from eroding.

Stormwater means water runoff, including snow and ice melt, which is the direct result of a precipitation event.

Stop work order means a notice issued by the city engineer or the city's designated representative, or a state or federal agency to a person, permittee, contractor, developer or property owner to immediately cease construction, grading or development activities.

Stormwater pollution prevention plan ("SWPPP") means a site-specific plan which identifies potential sources of stormwater pollution at a construction site and specifies structural and nonstructural controls (BMP's) that will be in place to minimize negative impacts caused by stormwater discharges associated with construction activity.

Stripping means any activity which removes or significantly disturbs the vegetative surface cover, including clearing and grubbing operations.

Total maximum daily load ("TMDL") means the maximum daily sum total of the individual waste load allocations (WLAs) for point sources, the load allocations (LAs) for nonpoint sources and the natural background levels of pollutants that a watercourse can receive while still meeting federal or state water quality standards. TMDLs can be expressed in terms of either mass per time, toxicity, or other appropriate measure.

Vegetative cover means grasses, shrubs, trees and other vegetation which hold and stabilize

soils.

Watercourse or waterway means any body of water, including, but not limited to, lakes, ponds, rivers, streams, and bodies of water delineated by the city, state or federal governments.

Waters of the state means all waters within the jurisdiction of the State of South Dakota, including all streams, lakes, ponds, impounding reservoirs, marshes, watercourses, waterways, wells, springs, irrigation systems, drainage systems, and all other bodies or accumulations of water, surface and underground, natural or artificial, public or private, situated wholly or partly within or bordering upon the State of South Dakota.

Water of the United States means all waters as defined in 40 CFR § 230.3(s). (Ord. No. 21-10, 6-8-2010; Ord. No. 17-031, 1-9-2018) Secs. 72-6–72-16. Reserved.

ARTICLE II. STORM DRAINAGE FEE
Sec. 72-17. Fee.

(a) The purpose of this chapter is to establish a charge against real property within the City for the operation, maintenance, public education, and capital expenses of the storm sewer and drainage system.

(b) Annual fee; basis. All parcels within the city shall be charged an annual fee for the operation, maintenance, public education, and capital improvements of the storm sewer and drainage system. The fee for each such property shall be based on the impervious lot area, and an Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) financial charge. The storm drainage fee is determined as follows: a) Single family parcels will be charged a storm drainage fee based on 1 ERU; b) For all other parcels the storm drainage fee shall equal the impervious area (in square feet) divided by 4,573(ERU)) multiplied by the ERU financial charge (in dollars per ERU). Each parcel will be charged a storm drainage fee based on a minimum of 1 ERU.

(c) Exemptions: parcels that do not convey stormwater runoff to a MS4 as determined by the City Engineer are exempt from paying the annual storm drainage fee.

(d) Request for site study. Upon written request and payment of the processing fee by a property owner, a site study will be conducted by the City Engineering Division to determine the amount of impervious area a parcel contains and the appropriate fee. This written request must be submitted to the City Engineer on or before February 1 of the year the fees are charged to the subject land parcel. The site study will include a calculation of the impervious area for the subject parcel which contributes stormwater runoff to the MS4. If after completion of a site study, the storm drainage fee is determined to be incorrect, the property owner will be eligible to request an amended property tax bill. No refunds of the storm drainage fee will be issued for previous years.

(Ord. No. 21-10, 6-8-2010) Sec. 72-18. Collection. The storm drainage fee established in section 72-17 shall be an annual charge. The first one-half of such fee is due on or by April 30 and the second one-half is due on or by October 30 of the same year, payable at the office of the county finance department.

(Ord. No. 21-10, 6-8-2010) Sec. 72-19. Fund established. The drainage fees paid to the city shall be maintained in a separate fund to be known as the drainage and storm sewer fund. This fund shall be used to pay the cost of financing the operation, public education, maintenance or construction of the drainage and storm sewer system.

The ERU financial charge may be reviewed annually and revised as necessary so that revenues are reasonably in balance with anticipated expenditures. Excess funds may be carried forward from year to year in order to build sufficient funds for large drainage construction projects which are scheduled or programmed for the near future, and to provide sufficient monies for unanticipated repairs, public education, replacements or maintenance of the MS4.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 82 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BROOKINGS AND PERTAINING TO THE COVERING OF VEHICLE LOADS IN THE CITY OF BROOKINGS.**

I.

THAT SECTION 82-567 of the Code of Ordinances and pertaining to covering of vehicle loads is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 82-567. Covering of vehicle loads; spillage.
(a) No person may drive or move a vehicle on a street or highway unless the vehicle is so constructed or loaded as to prevent its contents from dropping, sifting, leaking, blowing off, or otherwise escaping from the vehicle. This requirement does not apply to a vehicle transporting agricultural or horticultural products when hay, straw, silage or residue from a product, but not including the product itself, or when materials such as water used to preserve and handle agricultural or horticultural products while in transportation, escape from the vehicle in an amount that does not interfere with other traffic on the highway. The tailgate, faucets and taps on a vehicle shall be securely closed to prevent spillage during transportation, whether the vehicle is loaded or empty, and the vehicle must not have any holes or cracks through which material can escape. Any County highway or City maintenance vehicle engaged in either ice, snow or waste removal or citywide cleanup or emergency operations shall be exempt from this section.

(b) Actual spillage of material on a street or highway or proof that that spillage is not necessary to prove a violation of this section.

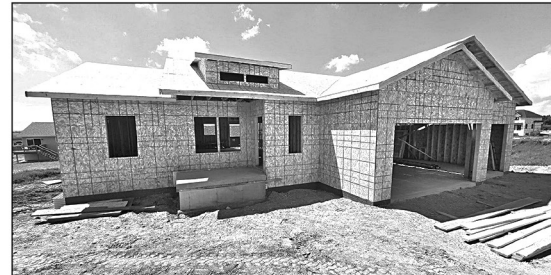

RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION OF TAX INCREMENT FINANCING DISTRICT #16, CITY OF BROOKINGS

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has recommended the District Boundaries for Tax Increment Financing District #16, City of Brookings, and has rec-

ommended its creation; and WHEREAS, the City of Brookings has the powers, pursuant to SDCL 11-9-2, to create Tax Increment Financing District #16, City of Brookings, and to define its boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED:

1. Authority and Declaration of Necessity. The City of Brookings declares the necessity for the creation of Tax Increment Financing District #16, City of Brookings (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "District"), pursuant to SDCL Chapter 11-9. Further, the City finds that the improvement of the area within the District is likely to enhance significantly the value of substantially all of the other real property in the District and is necessary for economic development within the city.

2. Findings. The City Council makes the following findings with regard to affordable housing:

- a. The proposed improvements will create new jobs and diversity the overall economic base of the City of Brookings through industrial development.
- b. The South Dakota Department of Revenue has reviewed the TIF Plan and classified the Tax Increment District #16 of City of Brookings to be Industrial Development.
- c. At least 50 percent of the real property within the district will stimulate and develop the general economic welfare and prosperity of the state through the promotion and advancement of housing opportunities.
- d. The improvement of the area is likely to significantly enhance the value of substantially all other real property in the district.
- e. The aggregate assessed value of the District plus the tax incremental base of all other existing Districts in the city does not exceed 10 percent of the total assessed valuation in the City.

3. Boundaries of District. The Boundaries of the district are determined to be as follows: Outlots, That Portion of SW ¼ Lying S of C & NW RR, INC. Meyers Subdiv. EXC Lot 5A, 5B, 6B, & 7B & EXC S .84 AC of L. H-11, EXC L. H-8 SEC 30-110-49, Also N ½ NW ¼ EXC H-2, & EXC .43 Acres of Lot H-5 (113.06 AC)

All located in the City of Brookings, Brookings County, South Dakota including within and adjacent rights-of-ways.

4. Findings of Annual Appropriation TID. Tax Increment District #16 will be designated as an Annual Appropriations TIF to ensure that it does NOT count against constitutional debt.

5. Creation of Tax Increment Fund. There is hereby created, pursuant to SDCL 11-9-31, a City of Brookings Tax Increment Financing District #16 Fund, which shall be a segregated asset account. All tax increments collected pursuant to Tax Incremental District #16 shall be deposited into the Tax Increment Financing District #16 Fund. All funds in the Tax Increment Financing District #16 Fund shall be used solely for those purposes expressly stated and reasonably inferred in SDCL Chapter 11-9.

7.0 Communication/Discussion Items
A) Board Communications
7.1 Performance Oversight Committee – Deb mentioned that they met in May to review bills that had been paid. Since then, they have been waiting for Stacey to start. Teresa added that Stacey had requested a review of documents up to June 30th.
7.2 Facilities and Construction Committee – Keli Books provided an update from Pierce Koch with Hausmann Construction on the progress of Hillcrest and Medary. Both schools are focusing on site work, with paving expected to be completed by the end of the week. Hillcrest School is finishing its punch list and final tasks, while Medary's new square footage is nearly complete, with the renovation expected to be finished in two weeks. Despite community concerns about potential flooding at Hillcrest, the recent heavy rain showed no issues at either school, and the team is confident in their water management preparations.
7.3 Policy and Governance Committee – Deb DeBates provided an update on the review of several district policies after a brief hiatus. Some policies related to activities are currently under review by Mr. Dvorak, with further discussion scheduled for tomorrow. Additionally, the first reading of fourteen policies, including new policies DJ, DJC, DK, DLC, and DN, is also on the agenda. Stacey has reviewed these policies and offered suggestions, but the board members are encouraged to provide any further feedback. These new policies originate from the ASBSD.

7.6 General Board Member Communications – Wes Tschetter toured the bus garage and CTE building, noting that it had been years since his last visit. He also attended a session on data usage at the ASBSD Convention, which emphasized aligning data with district goals. Keli Books mentioned that the Brookings Childcare Collaborative has met twice since the last board meeting, and she has shared the minutes with board members. Deb DeBates attended the ASBSD Convention as well, highlighting the importance of monitoring upcoming legislation that could signifi-

cantly impact education. She stressed the need for all board members to stay informed and to engage with legislators early. Teresa Binkley thanked everyone who participated in Bobcat Night at Downtown at Sundown and expressed gratitude to the Lion's Club and Optimist Club for their donation of vision spot cameras and printers. She also mentioned that the Board has been considering the future of Fifth Street Gym, given the new gymnasiums at the new schools and the ongoing maintenance issues with the old facility, and is exploring potential new uses for it. Deb DeBates announced that the VFW Breakfast Fundraiser on Sunday, August 18th, will support the Brookings School District Foundation. All proceeds will benefit the Bobcat Innovation Grant Program, which is funding the district's first Innovation Grants for teachers, made possible by the foundation's successful shed raffle fundraiser.

New OCs have coaching journeys converge at SDSU

BROOKINGS – When South Dakota State takes the field for its season opener at Oklahoma State on Saturday, the Jackrabbits’ offense will have plenty of new faces.

With eight new starters on offense, it will be easy to notice the changes on the field. But a subtle change is in the coaching booth where Ryan Olson and Danny Freund take over as co-offensive coordinators.

At first glance, Freund and Olson are a duo that merged to get the most out of the SDSU offense. But it’s another meeting point for a pair of coaching journeys that have dated back to their upbringings in southeastern Wisconsin.

Freund grew up in Kenosha, a town just under an hour from downtown Milwaukee. He spent most of his early years around the game of football as his father, Bob, embarked on a coaching career that led him to Western Michigan in the 1980s and the Wisconsin Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame after leading St. Joseph Catholic Academy to a WIAA state title and 11 straight playoff appearances in the 1990s and early 2000s.

Danny spent his time as a ball boy for the Lancers but eventually played under his father, setting a WIAA single-season record with 40 touchdowns during his senior season. While Danny went on to play for UND and ranks third in school history in passing yards (5,239) and touchdowns (47), it was his father’s influence that led him to coaching.

“My dad was my biggest influence,” Danny recalled. “Just kind of

being around games on Friday nights, being around the sidelines and just kind of seeing the impact he had on people, not only on the field winning games, but how he affected and molded young men off the field, I think that was a big thing for me.”

Freund’s coaching career began as a graduate assistant at Carthage College in Kenosha for the 2011 season and he joined the UND coaching staff the following year. But the same time, Olson was starting to build his coaching career just over an hour away from Kenosha at the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater.

An offensive lineman on three D-III national championship teams (2009, 2010, 2011) under Lance Leipold, Olson graduated with a health and human performance degree and originally pursued a career as a strength coach.

When Olson went back to his hometown of Stoughton, he started out as the strength coach at his alma mater before he was asked to be a coach on the football team. Olson helped throughout the summer and became the offensive line coach in the fall before realizing that coaching was his passion. But finding a job after that season was easier said than done.

“I just started trying to work the phones and asking ‘Hey, does this place have an opening?’” Olson recalled. “When you have no experience, you’re just trying to really get your foot in the door any way you can. ... Nowadays, we have all these quality control positions, but they weren’t as prevalent back then.”

Olson’s search eventually led him to Joel Nellis,

a former tight end who played for the Wisconsin Badgers and became the head coach at Brookfield Central High School just outside of Milwaukee. Nellis was a student teacher at Stoughton while Olson was a student and the two remained connected throughout Olson’s collegiate career.

When Nellis suggested he give Freund a call, the two connected instantly.

“I thought he was really bright initially,” Freund said of the first exchange with Olson. “When I talked to him, it’s a lot what you get now. Hard-working, really into football, played for a national championship-winning program at UW-Whitewater...you knew he had a bright future.”

Olson was also impressed by Freund’s willingness to help him, even though he was just getting started in coaching.

“That just blew me away,” Olson said. “Just talking to someone you’ve never met, trying to break into a profession you don’t know much about and have no experience in and just how helpful and open he was to sharing information with me and coaching me up for interviews just in that short phone call was kind of disarming and like ‘Wow, that’s awesome.’”

Freund tried to get Olson a quality control job at UND. While it didn’t materialize, the advice helped Olson get started and he spent the 2013 season as a graduate assistant at Missouri Western State.

Olson was elevated to a full-time position as a tight ends and tackles coach the following season and was a graduate assistant on the Iowa State (2015) and Buffalo

(2016) offensive coaching staffs before becoming the co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Bemidji State for the 2017 season.

At the same time, Freund was thriving at North Dakota, coaching the Fighting Hawks’ running backs (2011-12) and quarterbacks (2013) and wide receivers (2014-18) before running into Olson during his first week on the job at Bemidji State.

“Our whole offensive staff drove to Grand Forks and had a clinic with the North Dakota staff and we were just talking football, talking situational football, talking scheme and all kinds of different things,” Olson recalled. “That’s kind of where the relationship was rekindled for us.”

With the two sharing the same recruiting footprint, Olson and Freund crossed paths frequently and followed each other’s careers.

Olson was promoted to offensive coordinator at Bemidji State in 2019 and joined the SDSU staff as a tight ends coach during the 2020-21 spring season. Olson became the Jacks’ offensive line coach in 2022 and oversaw one of the most dominant offensive lines in the FCS on the way to back-to-back national championships.

When offensive coordinator Zach Lujan took the same position at Northwestern, Olson was a candidate to succeed him and he was approached by SDSU head coach Jimmy Rogers about the possibility of bringing Freund on the staff.

Rogers’ decision to pursue Freund was based on coaching against him the past five seasons as Freund’s offense averaged 21 points per game

– including over 21 points three times – since the Fighting Hawks moved to the Missouri Valley Football Conference in 2020.

“When you look at who scored the most points on us the last several years, it’s been UND and it’s been Danny finding the nuances in our defense and making it so unique with splits, alignment and leverage,” Rogers explained. “I thought they did a really good job of competing and being multiple and the skill set they had too. Over the last several years, we haven’t had anybody really score more than 20 points in a game against us but he’s done it multiple times.”

With Freund’s experience also potentially lending a hand to Mark Gronowski, Olson believed that adding him to the staff would be “a no-brainer.” But it was still a question of whether he would be interested.

Freund had deep roots to UND, becoming the offensive coordinator in 2019 and the associate head coach last fall. But he also knew that a move to SDSU would be a special opportunity because of what the coaching staff has built in Brookings.

“I love UND. I spent years there playing and coaching there and my wife was from there, so it was going to take a special opportunity to leave that place,” Freund said. “But there’s a certain feeling you get when you talk to Coach Rogers and talk with the staff.”

“Brookings is very similar to Grand Forks and they’re very supportive of the university. It’s made the transition very easy but I think the biggest thing was just kind of getting outside the comfort zone, allowing

myself to grow. Sometimes you have to take risks to do that. The players and coaches here have built something special, and I just wanted to be a part of that.”

With that, the Jacks’ offensive braintrust was formed. While Olson is set to call plays and bring the same physical foundation it has established over the years, Freund’s input has added new wrinkles to the SDSU offense.

“He’s the same guy that I talked to on the phone 12 years ago,” Olson said of Freund’s addition to the staff. “He has tons of great ideas and he’s an extremely bright coach, but he’s also super understanding that this place has been successful and we don’t need to reinvent the wheel. We don’t need to start over. But he’s brought in some great compliments, some great wrinkles and added some tremendous coaching points to the concepts we already have.”

While the combination of Freund and Olson is set to help the Jacks get another level out of their offense, it’s also another meeting point in two coaching careers that were forged roughly two hours away over a decade ago.

“When I was at UND, we’d always visit before the games and now it’s just kind of come full circle where you have a professional relationship and work together,” Freund said. “...Just being from the same area and recruiting down in Wisconsin, we always had that relationship and when you’re from that same area, people have a certain amount of respect for each other. And when you look at the guys that have gotten to this program, I think we’ve done really well.”
