Back before the settlers and the railroad, this was Native land. Chief Drifting Goose was a prominent figure. That way of life, as we know, was forcibly removed. Yet we still have reminders. Council Rock was an important meeting spot for tribes. It was located roughly where the energy plant is now. We cannot amend the past, but we can honor those who came before by respecting the land and our neighbors.

The list of former townships includes many names most residents probably haven’t heard of. There is a lot of history here. The colonies - Camrose, Clark, Glendale, Hillside, and Spink - take us back in time a bit, as they focus on simpler ways of life.

Don’t get me wrong - I appreciate open spaces. I believe that they can help heal the soul. But at what point does an open space become merely empty?

For thoroughness’s sake, I want to include all the places that may or may not still exist. But that’s a lot of place names. If you’re the 1 person left living in a township, here’s to ya. (It’s unclear whether Athol and Crandon are townships.)

Redfield School



Redfield School District has an enrollment of 242 students in Grades K-5, 241 students in Grades 6-12, and 11 students at Turtle Creek High School.

ELEMENTARY

Redfield Elementary proudly supports Pre-School through 5th grades with a Positive Behavior Support program, full time school counselor and nurse. Our pre-school program offers a morning and afternoon session with about 15 students in each. We serve 242 students in JK- 5th grade. We use a Walk to Read intervention program for reading in grades K-2. This program has also helped up reach students at the level they are ready to learn. 3-5 have math and reading intervention groups to help every student succeed. Every student in grades 3-5 has a computer and every student in grades K-2 has an iPad.

MIDDLE SCHOOL / HIGH SCHOOL

As we prepare to embark on another exciting school year, we are thrilled to challenge our students to take an active role in their education and the community. The teaching staff has adopted an “All In” theme for the year, emphasizing the importance of getting involved and leading through service.

For our high school seniors and juniors, we encourage them to explore ways to serve and build their leadership skills. Opportunities include applying to be a Teacher Assistant, enrolling in leadership or internship classes, and working on a senior project. Students considering careers in education, science, or music are especially encouraged to apply to become a Teacher's Assistant. Miss McCarthy, our FACS teacher, begins her second year of teaching Educator's Rising classes, providing further opportunities for students interested in pursuing a career in education.

We are proud of the success of our dual credit

Chemistry program, taught by Mrs. Mara Fredrick, and look forward to offering this valuable opportunity again this year.

At Redfield Middle School, we will continue to enhance our math, science, and English skills through programs like the FLEX class, which provides additional support in these core subjects, and the Read Naturally class, which focuses on improving fluency, comprehension, and confidence. Additionally, students will have extra support during homeroom and study hall periods.

As a PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Supports) focused school, we are dedicated to creating an environment where students feel encouraged to get involved and lead by serving. One of the first events of the school year is Redfield Community Clean-Up Day, where both students and staff work together to prepare our community for the winter months.

Our faculty and staff take great pride in helping students rise to the challenges before them, celebrating their accomplishments along the way. We continue to focus on “Celebrating the Wins,” recognizing student achievements each quarter. Through this, we maintain our commitment to excellence in academics, arts, athletics, and attitude.

We look forward to a year filled with growth, service, and leadership. Thank you for being a part of the Redfield School District family.

SPORTS

In the Fall sports, Boys Golf qualified 2 members for the state tournament, Conner Zens (77) and Micah Zastrow (T-88). The Girls VB finished with a 6-20 record and the Football team went 0-8, after joining 9-AA classification. The winter sports had the Wrestling team advance five grapplers to the State Individual Tournament, placing four: Maddon Odland--5th--106; Conner Zens--6th--138; Collin Dean--165--DNP; Dylan Murray--7th--190; Camden Murray--4th--215. The Girls Basketball team finished their season with a record of 3-18, while the Boys record was 2-19. Last spring, Addisyn Evans finished 74th at the State Golf Tournament and the Softball(fastpitch) had a successful first campaign going 7-8 but lost to Deuel in the SoDak 16. In Track & Field no boys or girls qualified for the State Tournament.

Hitchcock/Tulare School



The Hitchcock-Tulare School District currently has 231 students enrolled in the district PK through 12th grade. Hitchcock houses the PK-6 attendance center with 114 students; the junior and senior high is located in Tulare with 19 students in the junior high and 55 in the high school. The district also has two colony attendance centers with Spink Colony having 21 students and Glendale Colony with 22 students in K-8. We are in our 15th year on a 4-day calendar, which utilizes Friday's for classroom enhancement and professional development. Staff and students both utilize Friday's to work on improving themselves through additional work, collaboration, and professional development offerings.

We have a Pre-school program which is available to 4-year-old students on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Students go all day and transportation is provided for those living in our district.

Our district is 1-to-1 with technology from Kindergarten through 12th grade. Our K-2 students all have their own iPad to use throughout the day and students in grades 3-12 have their own Chromebook or laptop to use at school as well as at home for the older students.

Some projects that involve the K-6 students are the accelerated reading program, 3rd - 6th grade basketball, 3rd - 6th grade volleyball,

4th-6th football, grades 1-6 spelling bee, the Geographic Bee and our annual track and field day. Our elementary students are in self-contained classrooms where they receive instruction in all the core content areas and also have PE and Art two times per week.

The 7-12 attendance center, offers a wide variety of academics including advanced placement classes over the DDN as well as dual credit courses through a variety of post-secondary schools. The district also has strong participation in FFA, FCCLA, art, sports, oral interpretation, class plays and yearbook. We also offer an Audio-Visual Class, which manages the Hitchcock-Tulare School TV Station that is sponsored by Venture Communications. H-T TV can be found on channel 384 for those people that subscribe to cable TV from Venture Communications.

We will also be entering into a shared services program for CTE courses with Huron, Wolsey-Wessington, and Sanborn Central starting with the 2025-26 school year. This will bring mobile labs for Meat Processing and Small Engines to our school district throughout the year. It will also open opportunities for our seniors to take CTE courses in Huron at their high school that are not offered at our school. Some of these courses may include Building Trades, Culinary Arts, Automotive Tech, Diesel Tech, Aviation, Fashion Design, Interior Design, Intro to Education, Intro to EMS, Intro to CNA, and Accounting.

All of these things help us provide a well-rounded education and opportunities to grow for the students that attend Hitchcock-Tulare as we help them become college, career, and life ready.

Northwestern Area School District, located in Mellette, S.D., provides a friendly, small-town atmosphere for 393 students from the surrounding communities in grades K-12. Students receive a top-notch education with highly regarded academic programs and extra-curricular activities.

The school features a large competition gym with a full-length basketball floor and increased seating capacity, locker rooms, coaches and officials rooms, and a wellness center with brand-new weight and cardio equipment in addition to a renovated band room, science classrooms and lab, as well as updated lighting, flooring and paint in the classrooms.

Academically, Northwestern offers elective courses in art, business, music, agriculture, and wellness in addition to the core curriculum. Students enjoy one-on-one attention with staff members, while they also can take high school, dual-credit, and AP classes online.

Northwestern has been 1:1 with technology devices in grades K-12 since 2010 with the release of the iPad. The school issues iPads to students in grades K-8 and laptops in grades 9-12. Nearly every classroom features large, flat-screen television screens, while elementary classrooms feature interactive whiteboards.

Organizations such as Future Business Leaders of America, Journalism, Drama Club, Visual Arts, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, FFA, E-sports, Robotics, and Student Council provide

students with additional learning opportunities outside the classroom. The Visual Arts team has won five state titles and two runner-up finishes. FBLA advances several students to the national convention each year. The screen-printing business run by the students encompasses both the art and business programs to make high-quality apparel for organizations inside and outside of the school. In addition to performing a spring play, the Drama Club advances thespians to the state competition in oral interpretation and one-act play. The Journalism class produces the yearbook, live streams school events, and produces digital media. The Student Council organizes and manages all homecoming festivities. The FFA program allows students to explore agricultural interests and attend several events around the state each year in addition to the national convention in Indianapolis. E-sports expanded its offerings this year to include a drone racing team.

Athletically, Northwestern has played in 25 state championships, bringing home 15 state titles. Northwestern possesses a strong tradition of volleyball, cross country, football, football sideline cheer, basketball, track and field, and wrestling.

A consolidated school district, Northwestern provides educational services to the towns of Ashton, Athol, Brentford, Chelsea, Conde, Cresbard, Mansfield, Mellette, and Northville. With tremendous support from parents, staff, patrons, the Booster Club, the Northwestern Community Foundation and the Plains Lions Club, Northwestern students receive a first-rate education and are the pride of their communities.

Redfield Schools are the largest in the county. Redfield is the county seat, so the courthouse and county offices are here. Redfield Lake and Turtle Creek/Spillway cut through town. Recreation spots are available at the lake. A parks and rec dept. sponsors many activities, including adult and youth baseball leagues. The city pool is busy in summertime. It is located in Redfield City Park, formerly Packard Park, which was donated to the city by a resident long ago. Of historical interest are the Museum, as well as the Redfield Depot, which holds the Spink Co. Historical Society and its collective trove of knowledge. Other sites can be found, including markers and memorials. Many events and athletic games are held at the Armory. There are small businesses, as well as a handful of chain stores in town. The Chamber of Commerce is active. A couple of annual events include Harvest Fest and Parade of Lights.

Historical markers and memorials can be found throughout the county. Just north of Redfield, off I 281, are markers for Council Rock and the introduction of ring-necked pheasants. These markers were put up decades ago by the Daughters of the American Revolution. East of Mellette, a memorial bridge for Chief Drifting Goose crosses the James River. Just outside of Ashton, a marker commemorates the homestead site. In Redfield City Park, a marked stone stands for the land donation by Harlan Packard. Another marker stands across the highway from Fisher Grove, which was also known as Belcher's Ford.
