



#### Christos House

hristos House, 125 Jefferson Ave., serves victims of domestic and sexual violence and has provided emergency shelter in one form or another in Howell County since 1982.

The organization began as a grass-roots effort by concerned citizens who saw a need for emergency services and housing for those seeking refuge from domestic violence, including physical and sexual abuse. It now provides outreach services to not only Howell, but also Carter, Douglas, Oregon, Ozark, Shannon, Texas and Wright counties.

The organization, which operates a resale store in West Plains to help fund its services, will soon be moving that store from its previous location on Washington Avenue to its new, larger location in the former Quill building on Jefferson Avenue.

"We're very excited about the new location and this will allow us to improve our services to our clients and the community," said Executive Director Moiria Seiber. She added that not only will the new location house the resale store, it will also hold the organization's offices, storeroom and a computer lab for those who need assistance.

Christos House has 16 paid employees and a yearly operating budget of about \$750,000. That budget has to cover the cost of running and maintaining a facility that includes 36 beds, a kitchen and dining room, community room, indoor and outdoor play areas and outreach services.

For 2021, Seiber said Christos House will focus on updating and expanding its emergency shelter services to those experiencing domestic and sexual violence.



CDS is designed for individuals with disabilities to have control over their own care. It

that developed during the Independent Living movement which grew out of activism in the 1970s. The movement eventually led to passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) which was signed into law by President George H.W. Bush in July 1990.

The purpose of the ADA is to ensure that individuals with disabilities have the same rights and opportunities as everyone else. It prohibits discrimination in all areas of public life, including jobs, transportation, schools and private places open to the general public. Some highlights include:

• Helps people with disabilities access the same employment opportunities and benefits available to people without disabilities. Defines disability and establishes guidelines for the reasonable accommodation process.

- Prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability by "public entities" such as government agencies.
- Prohibits places of public accommodation from discriminating against individuals with disabilities. This includes privately owned, leased, or operated facilities like hotels, restaurants, retailers, doctor's offices, private schools, day care centers, health clubs, sports stadiums, movie theaters, etc.
- Requires telephone and Internet companies to provide a nationwide system of telecommunications relay services to allow individuals with hearing or speech disabilities to communicate by phone.



In October, the university received a \$960,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Labor and Delta Regional Authority (DRA) to support its new advanced fabrication and welding technology program. Officials will enroll their first students for the program in fall 2021.

In April, the volleyball team won its 17th Region 16 and district titles and placed ninth at the NJCAA Division I National Volleyball Tournament on its home court, finishing the season with a 20-6 record.

Other highlights of the year:

- \$130,000 DRA grant for welding and robotic training equipment.
- Dedication of the Arch W. Shaw Foundation Writing Center in August.
- Approval of an Associate of Science in Computer Science degree for students interested in pursuing a bachelor's degree in computer science.
- Approval of an Associate of Applied Science in Community Behavioral Sup-

port degree to train community support specialists in behavioral and mental health.

In addition, campus officials continued to manage the coronavirus pandemic during the fall and spring semesters to ensure that classes would continue and essential services would be available to students.

After completing the 2020 spring semester virtually, including a virtual commencement in August, officials developed a plan based on local, state and federal guidelines that allowed the campus to reopen just in time for the 2020 fall semester. This included a cleaning and sanitizing plan, masking policy, and offering seated, hybrid and online courses. Even with the concerns from the pandemic, enrollment for the fall semester only dropped by 2%.

With the number of coronavirus cases dropping in the spring 2021 semester, students, faculty and staff began looking forward to a new, and more normal, academic year full of new beginnings and endless possibilities.


