They are a blessing as they serve the Lord and His church. Where there is work to be done, they can be counted on. They are a comfort to those who are ill or who have lost a loved one and work to keep the family of faith together in fellowship and praying for one another.

All are invited to worship with us each week as we give thanks and praise unto God. Service


begins at 10:45 a.m. each Sunday. You will be greeted by a friendly group of Christians who


love the Lord. We also live stream our service on Facebook for those unable to attend .

Presbyterian Church, Willow Springs

he Willow Springs Presbyterian Church is at the corner of Third and Center Streets in downtown Willow Springs. Sunday worship begins at 9:30 a.m. every week. This congregation has a long history of faithful service to Jesus Christ.

The Willow Springs Presbyterian Church was first organized in 1879 as a Cumberland Presbyterian Church. This congregation shared a building with the Methodist Episcopal Church, located where the current YMCA building stands.

In 1884, the two churches went separate ways, and the Presbyterians moved to their present location. They built a new church building on land donated by Elder Christopher Harkey. One of the building committee members was David Ferguson, great-grandfather of current church members Barbara Easley and Mary Knott.

Many improvements were made over the years and the fellowship hall was added in 1949.

The original church bell is still rung on Sunday mornings, and the original wooden spire from the steeple is displayed in the sanctuary. This spire pointed heavenward for more than 100 years. Today the cross on the steeple can be seen throughout the town.

Our church is part of the Presbyterian Church of the U.S.A., and it is a Protestant denomination with its roots in the Reformed tradition. This faith emphasizes our belief that the Bible is the Word of God and the only rule for faith and practice. Our congregation is governed by its elders, elected by the congregation. Worship is led by the Rev. Diane Cooke, pastor. Our worship and hymns are traditional in style, and we practice open Communion, inviting all baptized Christians to share in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

irst Free Will Baptist Church was organized on Dec. 20, 1956, with 28 charter members. The first services were held on Garfield Avenue in West Plains with plans to build a new church as soon as possible.

Shortly thereafter, the new congregation purchased three lots at the corner of Thornburgh Avenue and Garfield Avenue and soon began construction of their new church.

In the years that have passed, God, has greatly blessed the church with many souls saved, and at least 10 men from the church answered the call to preach.

In 2003, the church began looking for a new location because the church had outgrown the Thornburgh property and in April 2004, five acres of land were purchased at 1814 County Road 6460, one block off Worley Drive in West Plains.

The church planned to pay off the new property before starting construction of the new church building. Again, God greatly blessed the church. The property was paid off, construction of the new building began and the Thornburgh property was sold in August 2014.

The first service was held in the basement of the new church on Sunday morning Oct. 5, 2014. God continues to bless with new families attending the church. We moved into



our new sanctuary upstairs in September 2019.

In August 2018, Ron Blanks retired after 31 years. His son-in-law, Ben Ryan took over as pastor in August 2018. He and his wife, Jennifer moved here from Batesville, Ark. They have three children, Evan, Ella and Eli. Jennifer went to high school in West Plains. Ben is from Illinois.

Dakota Bates is the youth pastor and has been serving in this capacity since October 2019. Dakota leads the youth group during services on Wednesday and Sunday evenings. Dakota, along with his wife, Hannah, also teach a teen Sunday school class on Sunday mornings.

Growing up in the small community of Alton, Missouri, Dakota graduated with his high school diploma from Alton High School in 2010. Shortly after graduating high school, Dakota began taking classes at Missouri State University-West Plains where he earned his Associate of Science in Business degree in 2012. Dakota currently resides in West Plains with his wife, Hannah.

Both Dakota and Hannah have a heart for the youth of our community and look forward to continuing to





Jehovah's Witnesses Returning to In-Person Meetings

After Two Years Virtual, Congregations Will Meet Together Again Beginning April 1

ll congregations of Jehovah's Witnesses across the world are being encouraged to begin holding in-person meetings during the week of April 1.

For most of the last two years, buildings for worship have remained closed globally due to the risks associated with meeting in person. Jehovah's Witnesses in the U.S. also suspended their public ministry on March 20, 2020. Since that time, they have carried on their ministry through letters and phone calls while holding twice-weekly meetings in a virtual format. Average attendance at these meetings exceeded 1.5 million each week in the U.S., even though there are fewer than 1.3 million Jehovah's Witnesses in some 13,000 congregations.

"There is a collective shout of joy among Jehovah's Witnesses around the world right now," said Robert Hendriks, U.S. Spokesman for Jehovah's Witnesses. "While we have prospered in many ways as individuals and congregations using technology to bring us together, nothing can adequately replace being together in person. We have longed for this moment for the better part of two years."

The move back to in-person meetings coincides with two global events being held in all 120,000 congregations of Jehovah's Witnesses. The first is a special lecture scheduled in most congregations for April 10, 2022, entitled, "Where Can You Find Real Hope?"

Additionally, the annual commemoration of the death of Jesus Christ will be held on April 15, 2022, the very day he sacrificed his life 1,989 years ago. Both of these gatherings will be held in person at local Kingdom Halls with live speakers. No collections are ever taken.

"The timing of resuming in-person meetings could not be better," said

Hendriks. "Bringing everyone back together for these special events will have a powerful effect on the worldwide congregation."

Guidelines for holding "hybrid" meetings have been sent to all congregations in the United States. Over the past six months, many Kingdom Halls have been equipped with the required technology to hold a productive meeting that allows for in-person and remote attendees, all of whom can participate in the discussions. A pilot program was held in October and November in countries around the world to assess how this could be done most effectively. The lessons learned in these pilot meetings have helped form the plan for moving forward with reopening all Kingdom Halls, where the law permits.

"It has been heartwarming to see the peace and unity among Jehovah's Witnesses during this very divisive time," said Hendriks. "We know resuming in-person meetings will bring us even closer together. We're anxious to see one another again."

[Local quote summarizing the feelings of those returning to the meetings] As of now, Jehovah's Witnesses have no plans to resume their public ministry, though their "alternative" ministry continues. In fact, since the start of the pandemic through November 2021 in the U.S. alone, Jehovah's Witnesses spent more than 400 million hours in virtual Bible studies, writing letters of comfort to their neighbors and making

phone calls. They have released 77 new language translations of the Bible and held two global virtual conventions in more than 500 languages.

"No time was wasted in the past two years," said Hendriks. "Our congregants have been busy and productive helping each other and their neighbors through this most challenging time. That's what love and unity are all about."





Mt. Zion Baptist Church

t. Zion Baptist Church on County Road 4870, four miles west of Olden, was organized by a group of men and women in a brush arbor meeting in 1875. There were seven charter members. The church continued to meet in brush arbors and in schoolhouses, some of which were log buildings, for the next 21 years. For 19 years, the church worshipped in the Bridges School.

In 1886, Sarah Perkins donated a tract of land consisting of four acres for the purpose of building a church house and cemetery. The land already contained the grave of her husband, James, who was the first person buried in Mt. Zion Cemetery.

The population of the area was small and there were few churches, causing people to come from as far as Dripping Springs in wagons for services held for a two-day weekend, usually once a month. Some members walked from three to five miles to attend services.

In 1896, the church finally raised enough money to build its own place of worship. This building served as a meeting place until 1946 when it was destroyed by a tornado.

In August 1920, the church membership was 94. The property was valued at \$500. The pastor's salary was \$63 a year. The total expense for the year



was \$78.85.

In 1948, a new rock church with classrooms in the basement was built to house the congregation.

The 100th anniversary was observed Sunday, May 11, 1975.

In October 2002, the church had 166

members.

Sunday school is held at 10 a.m. with worship services at 11 a.m. Interim Pastor Chris Rutledge welcomes everyone. Following recent renovations, Mt. Zion Baptist is now handicap-accessible.





Image Bearers of God

ohn Piper once wrote "Christian living is supernatural or it is nothing." I must confess that, I agree wholeheartedly. When I look at the man that Jesus Christ was and read the scriptures in the bible that detail His life, His ministry and all that He has freely given to us as His beloved, who could arrive at any other conclusion?

What does it mean to say that the Christian life is supernatural? Is it only relating to Gods existence or His nature? Does it refer only to our spiritual being having no connection to our physical and mental existence or the natural world in which we live?

As Christians, we should dig into the truth of what it means to have the Spirit of God alive in us. Exploring the possibilities of what it is to be called "sons of God". I want to ponder and experience living a life that espouses not only living in a natural world that we understand through reason, logic, science and our senses, but also exploring what the scriptures demonstrate and speak of that infuses the supernatural into the natural and the spiritual into the physical. As we search the scriptures we will find the truth that God has created us in His image and we simultaneously live a life that is natural and supernatural, temporal and eternal and physical and spiritual. To understand what it means to live a supernatural life, we must start at the beginning. We have to understand what it is in fact that makes us supernatural beings that live a life that is not summed up merely by mental and biological functions. There is a part of us in fact that is eternal and has its origins in the heart of God.

To understand this, we have to go back to the origin as it is recorded in the Bible. The account of Genesis, is where mankind is taken from the supernaturally exclusive position in the heart and mind of God and breathed into a natural, physical existence.

Genesis 1:26-27 - NKJV 26 Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over [a] all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." 27 So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them.

Almost every Christian is familiar with the previous scriptures. After all, it is the genesis of mankind we are talking about and for all intents and purposes it is a large part of where our religious doctrines have their foundations. I wonder though, how often Christians think on these scriptures and ask what that implies? The simple fact that we are made in the image of God (in His likeness or ashioned after His personhood) should awake an arousing curiosity in our minds.

This is only the foundations of our existence but even in our limited understanding of the magnitude of God's existence in its most basic sense of understanding should as Christians strike awe into our minds

on the realm of possibilities that truth alone offers to us.

Despite this, it amazes me that there are so many people who are opposed to the idea that we are the creative handiwork of an omniscient God.

When you look at just the physical characteristics of our makeup, it is mind boggling to consider the sheer magnitude of

genetics and the intelligent organization and fabrication of our physical being based on these singular things. Our entire body is made up from unique pairings of nucleotide bases. As humans we have 3 billion of these base pairs, which reside in the 23 pairs of chromosomes within the nucleus of all our cells. Each chromosome contains hundreds to thousands of genes, which carry the instructions for making proteins.

The sheer complexity of that construction and the biological programming of each cell to carry out its function in a prescribed manner for a predetermined length of time is something that computer and

software engineers can only dream would be possible in a sense of real-world technological developments

Never mind that we haven't even gotten into the realm of the psyche and how the mind works, encoding and translating information from outward stimuli. Our bodies and brains are thousands of times, perhaps millions of times more sophisticated and adapted than any developed artificial systems, yet so many people will not allow

themselves to embrace even the possibility of any intelligent design behind it.

God in His completion is mind, body and spirit. God has a mind, a soul, or a will if you prefer. He is full of emotions and thoughts and is an intelligent existence. Paul explains to us in his writings in 1 Corinthians 2:11 that it is possible to know the mind of God and what and how God thinks if His spirit lives in us:

1 Corinthians 2:11 - NKJV

11 For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the things of God except the Spirit of God.

In addition to having a mind, God is a spirit. Jesus Himself makes this very clear when teaching the Samarian woman at the well about worshipping God in spirit and in truth:

John 4:23-24 - NKJV

23 But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. 24 God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

Lastly, God is flesh and has a physical body in the form of Jesus Christ:

John 1:14 - NKJV

14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.

Just as Jesus was united with the Father as one before He became flesh, Eve was created and existed in Adam before God took a rib and fashioned a physical body to house the feminine characteristics of God's nature. I also want to explain that my earlier comment "sons of God" includes both men and women. There is no separation in the relational standing we have with the Father through Jesus Christ based on our natural gender, our nationality, skin color or status.

Genesis 5:2 - NKJV

2 He created them male and female, and blessed them and called them Mankind in the day they were created.

Galatians 3:28 - NKJV 28 There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.



Oak Grove Baptist Church

In 1989, Calvary General Baptist was blessed with the location it now enjoys one-half-mile north of Richards School on north U.S. 63.


Several additions and improvements to the church building have been made in the intervening years.

God Is at Work

ach Christmas our church has a massive drive to fill shoeboxes for Samaritan's Purse to distribute to children around the world. In these shoeboxes we place small toys, school supplies, personal hygiene items and other similar things. My wife, Kelly, recently read about an eight-year-old girl who had never received a gift before getting a

Christmas shoebox.

Every year Kelly and I not only give Christmas gifts to our children, we also fill a Christmas shoebox for each of our children. These are

given to the church's shoebox drive. Samaritan's Purse allows those giving a shoebox to track online where our boxes are eventually delivered. Kelly recently learned this year our shoeboxes went to Haiti, Benin and Ukraine. We were especially excited to hear at least one shoebox was sent to Ukraine.

During Kelly's research on the deliveries, she came across a very moving story.

Shoeboxes sent to a church in Moldova did not arrive in time to be distributed last Christmas. This has worked out surprisingly well because Ukrainian refugee children are now staying at that church. Had these boxes been delivered "as scheduled" they would likely have been lost in the chaos of war, but now are providing a small bright spot in a displaced child's chaotic life.

I am convinced God had a plan for these boxes to arrive in Moldova when they did. The church's pastor explained that giving these traumatized children a shoebox helps calm stress and anxiety for both them and their parents. Every shoebox communicates someone cared enough to give this child something to smile about.


Cabool church of Christ

getting these fun gifts right now helps create a happier environment and lets refugee families temporarily forget what they are being forced to endure. Once parents and children are safe, in a warm shelter, and have a good meal, this church also shares the story of Jesus' love.

It is remarkable how these boxes arrived late but came at just the right time to help overwhelmed families when they most needed encouragement. The prophet Jeremiah encouraged God's people when he penned these words during a trying time, "'For I know the plans I have for you,' says the LORD. 'They are plans for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope.'" (Jeremiah 29:11, NLT)

What looked like bad timing in Moldova is currently being used for good. I do not know what is going badly in your life, but, I am convinced God is always at work around us. None of us ever fully grasps all God is doing during personal, national or international tragedies like those currently happening in Ukraine, but rest assured, God is at work even when you and I cannot see it.





Answers from the Word

"What is the unforgivable "And whosoever speaketh a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but whosoever speaketh against the Holy Ghost, it shall not be forgiven him, neither in this world, neither in the world to come." Matthew 12:32

Many different denominations and theologians have speculated about what constitutes the "unforgivable sin."

Although Jesus said that sin can be forgiven "in this world... and the world to come," yet one sin can never be forgiven. That unpardonable sin is offending the Holy Ghost.

Notice, that Jesus said speaking against the Son of God can be forgiven. However, blasphemy against the Holy Spirit is unpardon-

St. Paul warned people to be careful how they represented the Holy Spirit, "Therefore if the whole church comes together in one place, and all speak with tongues, and there come in those who are uninformed or unbelievers, will they not say that you are out of your mind?" 1 Corinthians 14:23

By misusing or misrepresenting spiritual gifts, we might accidentally cause unsuspecting people to speak evil of God's Holy Spirit, which is dangerous. So, we must be very careful.

But why must we respect God's Holy Ghost? The answer is because of the job the Holy Spirit came to do when Jesus returned to Heaven.

The Holy Ghost does many things.

He is a teacher and a reminder, "The Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." John 14:26

The Holy Ghost is a comforter, "And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter." John 16:7

God's Spirit is a corrector, "And

when He has come, He will convict (correct) the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment." John 16:8

But most important of all, the Holy Ghost holds us secure in God's Grace and prevents us from being lost by committing sin after we accept Jesus as our savior, "When you EDWIN WOOLSEY heard the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and when you believed in Him, you were also sealed with the promised Holy Spirit." Ephesians 1:13

Since we are "sealed" or locked into God's Grace, St. Paul said we

should be very careful not to harm the Holy Ghost, "How much more severely do you think someone deserves to be punished who has trampled the Son of God underfoot, who has treated as an unholy thing the blood of the covenant that sanctified them, and who has insulted the Spirit of grace (the Holy Ghost)?" Hebrews 10:29

So, this is the secret of the unforgivable sin. When we first believe in Jesus, we receive the

Holy Spirit to keep us saved. However, if we renounce our faith in Jesus, then we injure God's Spirit that holds us secure in Grace. No sin can keep believers out of Heaven, except for one... offending the Holy Ghost by denying Jesus after we first believed.

According to St. Peter, it would be better for a person to never accept Jesus than to later reject Him and offend God's Holy Spirit, "And when people escape from the wickedness of the world by knowing our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and then get tangled up and enslaved by sin again, they are worse off than before. It would be better if they had never known the way to righteousness than to know it and then reject the command they were given to live a holy life." 2 Peter 2:20-21

Offending God's Holy Spirit is the unforgivable sin.
