



Zizzers Embark on a Fresh Quest After Stellar Season



fter a near-perfect debut season that saw the Zizzers reach the coveted Class 4 Final Four, West Plains' head coach, Joel Wyatt, faces a challenge – rebuilding the powerhouse while keeping the win-

ning momentum alive.

In Wyatt's first season at the helm, the Zizzers notched an impressive 9-4 record, culminating in a loss to St. Dominic in the final hurdle. The legacy of that team will not be forgotten, as it elevated two of its stars to Division One programs and another to the prestigious Missouri S&T.

But as the sun sets on a golden era, it rises with a promise of a new dawn.

Though Wyatt admits, "We lost a lot of returning starters," he remains undeterred and confident about the team's grasp of offensive play, noting, "We are way ahead of the curve on learning the offense compared to last year."

A beacon of hope for the Zizzers will be Briggs Hughston, the basketball sensationturned-football prodigy, committed to FCS heavyweights Northern Iowa. With his commanding 6-foot-6, 230-pound physique, Hughston is poised to dominate as a traditional tight end. He's not the only weapon in the arsenal, though. Senior Rylan Kenslow (6-2, 190) is slated to join Hughston at the receiver spot.

As for the offensive line-up, eyes will be on Dawson Howell. This formidable senior, weighing in at 250 pounds on a 6-3 frame, is set to become one of high school football's most intriguing running backs. Howell, who previously ran a commendable 194 yards with two touchdowns, will be bol-



stered by the likes of Lance Norton and the promising junior Remi Wilson.

Despite a young offensive line, there are stalwarts like all-area sophomore Jaxon Hunter and juniors Peyton Reynolds, Maddox Hawkins, Jeff Edgeller, and Fernando Lopez. Spearheading the charge will be Isaiah Jones, a budding dual-threat quarterback, transitioning from his previous linebacker role.


As for the defense, it boasts names like Alex Judd, an all-area honoree, Lance Norton, and the youthful talent Warren Lawson. A dynamic secondary fronted by Hughston, Kenslow, and the experienced Will Stauffer is set to stonewall adversaries. Still, Wyatt acknowledges the need for bolstering the defense, citing a particular focus on "finding some defensive linemen and safeties." The Zizzers have a legacy to uphold, having clinched district titles in four of the past five seasons, boasting a stellar 50-11 record. But as the torch passes to a new brigade, the goal remains the same: shine under those Friday night lights.

For Wyatt, it's clear. His faith in the team is unwavering. "They have a hunger to get better and prove people wrong," he said, reflecting on the team's unparalleled work ethic.

As summer winds down, the Zizzers are gearing up for the 2023 season, starting with a jamboree at Fair Grove. The true test, however, is set for Aug. 25 when they open their season against Bolivar.

The stage is set, the challenges are known, and in West Plains, a new chapter awaits.

The journey ahead is meticulously charted out. With the Mountain Grove Jamboree scheduled for Aug. 18 and a thrilling face-off against California to kickstart the regular season, Willow Springs is pulling no punches.

To the Bears, this season isn't just another game; it's a statement of intent, of grit, and of relentless pursuit towards excellence. As Coach Payne puts it: "We have the potential to be a great swarming defense and explosive offense."

Willow Springs may be young, but they're ready – ready to charge, challenge, and change the course of their legacy. The Bears are coming, and they're hungrier than ever.

A Homecoming King Ready to Lead Liberty's Football Renaissance

he football heartland of Liberty witnesses a poetic return as Jansen Acklin, once the prodigious all-state receiver and an iconic figure of Liberty's golden era, readies to helm the Eagles' football squad. The torch passing

is more than symbolic, with Acklin stepping into shoes vacated by Brock Kenega, while keeping the shadow of his father, Darin Acklin, alive and thriving.

Having played an integral role in the Eagles soaring to a 31-6 record during his high school years and subsequently illuminating Evangel's football field with his prowess, Acklin's return is nothing short of a grand spectacle. As the 2023 regular season dawns with a much-anticipated clash against arch-rivals Strafford on Aug. 25, the town of Liberty waits with bated breath. For in Jansen Acklin, they don't just see a coach; they see a legacy returned, ready to rewrite history.

THAYER FOOTBALL SQUAD PRIMED FOR NEW SEASON: Fresh Talent and Returnees Hold Promise



merging from a rebuilding year, the Thayer Bobcats, under the guidance of Head Coach Briar Hancock, showcased undeniable potential in their previous season, ending with a 4-6 record. Their impressive victories against teams like

Cabool, Willow Springs, and Pierce City have added a glint of optimism for the forthcoming season.

This summer, the Bobcats have been diligently nurturing their younger players while eagerly awaiting the addition of a promising freshman class. Twelve ninth graders are set to bolster the roster, bringing a renewed vigor to the squad.

"We're fortunate with all the incoming freshmen on the team and some of those guys will have to step up and fill some roles," expressed an optimistic Hancock.

A notable point of attention for the team is their offensive line, which won't feature any seniors this season. Coach Hancock anticipates fierce competition in this area. Returning players like junior Cooper Clark, who has displayed proficiency in both guard and center positions, and sophomore Zeb Dubois are expected to play vital roles. The line-up might further be enhanced by the likes of sophomore Ryan McIntire and freshmen Mason Thornton, Kaleb Tipton, and Christian Pitts.

"Kaleb Tipton is physically way ahead of his years. His stature and capability don't fit the freshman label at all," commented Hancock.

The offensive backfield witnesses a significant change with the 6-foot-6 junior Devin Harrington stepping into the quarterback



position. This transition permits last year's quarterback, sophomore Dawson Harris, to explore other crucial positions. Hancock hinted at a competitive spirit for the quarterback position, indicating that Harris is still actively in the mix, with rotations during practices.

The Bobcats have the luxury of retaining key players, including senior running back Mark Spencer, who delivered commendable stats last season, and senior wide receiver Rowan Spencer, a crucial cog in the team's offense. Both have earned accolades for their performances in the South Central Association.

The defensive aspect sees Mark Spencer transition to the linebacker position from the outside, with Hancock emphasizing the importance of Spencer becoming the "quarterback of our defense". Senior Colt Gonzalez is expected to play a dual role, featuring both as a linebacker and a fullback on offense.

Xavier Gonzalez, a fearless sophomore, and last year's safety, will be more promi-

nently positioned this season after a promising 36-tackle record as a freshman. Clark's return to the defensive line after earning allconference honors, coupled with talents like McIntire, Dubois, Harrington, and junior Brandon Prince, signifies a strong defense.

Rowan Spencer, holding the fort in the defensive backfield after a season of locking down top receivers, is set to play a crucial role. Prospects like Harris, Xavier Gonzales, Tucker Wade, and freshman Thomas Poole are expected to enhance the defensive prowess of the Bobcats.

All eyes are on the season opener at home against St. Vincent, a fresh challenge for the Bobcats this year. Fans can get an early glimpse of the team in action at Mountain Grove on August 18th during a jamboree.

In sum, the Thayer Bobcats, with a mix of young talent and experienced returnees, are poised for an exciting season ahead. Coach Hancock's leadership and the team's budding potential suggest that Thayer's football horizon is bright.


