Because buses present a challenge for social distancing, parents will be asked to provide transportation, McAdoo said.

The district will limit sharing of school devices and reminds students and parents there will be NO sharing of individual school supplies.

Anyone who tests positive and is asymptomatic must complete 10 days quarantine from the date of the test.


