


There is really something for everyone and the dining menu is accompanied by a drinks menu with specialty cocktails, wines from around the world and a full-service bar in the lounge.





orthright Cyder & Mead, a new nanocidery located right in Youngsville, offers a unique specialty drink: cyser. It is a hybrid of hard cider and mead (honey wine) that produces a delicious apple-forward drink.

Their signature blend is the Bossfight, which is a semi-sweet variety with apples and honey. They always have a few options on tap, including seasonal specialties, so you can stop by for a glass or take a bottle to go.

Owners Michelle Eaton and Japheth Fitzpatrick opened up last summer after being stalled due to the pandemic.

We got through the autumn and the winter and we got a lot of local support and also from some of the weekenders that came, so they kept us going," said Japheth. "And now every weekend is getting busier."

They have a New York State farm license meaning everything they offer uses New York-based ingredients.

For instance, maple syrup from Tree Juice in Arkville and honey from Phoenicia Honey Co. adds sweetness to the cyser.

"Our cyders are accessible to lots of different people, if you're a beer drinker or

wine drinker," Japheth said. "Our stuff runs from sweet to dry and in between, so there's really something for everybody."

They also will soon offer New York-based beer and wine and cocktails made with New York spirits as well as snacks and light food.

"We bring all the ingredients here... and ferment them into the alcohol, which is very similar to wine making," Japheth said.

Walk into the tasting room and you are immersed in art deco design and blue wallsan homage to the color of New York State.

A New York State flag hangs on the wall and there is seating available at the bar and in a space next to it where you can play games or watch movies projected on the wall.

There is also outdoor seating and a yard with a fire pit so you can enjoy cyser all summer long.

Eaton and Japheth were living in New York City, she working in marketing and he in the restaurant industry.

Japheth began home brewing cider in their apartment in Queens and began entering competitions and winning.

With family ties to Sullivan County, they moved up here and live next to the cidery.

"It seemed like a great place to give this a try," Japheth said.






