
"Make memories," she ad-

put their minds to, comparing it to herself setting a goal to be tall.

At 5'3", she will never pass her 6-foot tall siblings, "not because I am lacking, because I'm not designed to."

She warned against comparison and striving for a long list of unattainable goals, instead, urging them to live joyfully and to find the different and distinct things that make them come alive.

"We had a plethora of time to just be. Living someone else's life is never going to fulfill you... our lives are supposed to look different," she said.

Kristen Smith, who spoke on behalf of the Board of Education and is the parent of a 2021 graduate, urged the graduates to "go forth and set the world on fire. You are one of the toughest classes in Eldred history, graduating during one of the most trying times. We are so incredibly proud of you. 



R allsburg's 88 graduating seniors had an experience like no other. They have seen the start of the pandemic and saw their school year flip upside down.

They witnessed the seniors before them hold their graduation virtually. And now they have seen the verge of the end of the pandemic and returned back to some kind of "normal."

That was the vibe, the feeling, the message for the graduating class of 2021 Fallsburg High School.

With COVID-19 restrictions lifted, two ceremonies – one Saturday morning and one Saturday afternoon – recognizing the Class of 2021 were held on the front lawn of the high school, under a big white tent, just a few feet from Brickman Road.

Cars would honk as they drove by, acknowledging the special day for Fallsburg.

"The Senior High School Class of 2021 has seen a lot and been through a lot. They are a resilient class," said Fallsburg High School Principal Kyle Roddey.

"They are a class that was able to get it done ... they will continue to get it done, no matter what the world has for them, no matter what comes their way, every one of them is ready to meet those challenges." added Roddey.

chunk of our junior year and our entire senior year under strict pandemic conditions... I think our memories went deeper than this past year and a half. I couldn't be more honored to be representing this fine group of young adults." The class Salutatorian Ennie Li will be attending SUNY Binghamton in the fall to study Biology with interest in Physical Therapy. She was in the National Honor Society, and graduated with a New York State Advanced Re-



gents Diploma.

She was the recipient of the Blossom Cohen Memorial Scholarship, Salon Memorial Scholarship, and the New York State Award for Academic Excellence. She recalled her accident in 2018 when she was struck by a car on Laurel Ave on the way to school. She thought she would be back in school the next day and she was wrong.

She thought the same thing about the pandemic, which caught the world by surprise.

"Nobody really saw this coming. It wasn't planned, just like my accident. It was unexpected," said Li.

"It's been 1022 days since my accident, and I'm still recovering from the trauma. But here I am giving this speech, and here we are coming out of this pandemic, despite the pain, frustrations, anger, and desperation. We are all slowly getting through it. This graduation and this speech are a testament to our strength. We are a class that understands challenges and adversity and rise above it," added Li.

"Graduation day is a very special day in the lives of high school seniors and their families because it marks a single accomplishment," said Fallsburg Central School District Superintendent Dr. Ivan Katz.

He noted that the yearand-a-half has been challenging for the graduating class.

Dr. Katz told those in attendance that the graduates are taking something special with them this day.

"Our graduates have the love, support, and guiding hands of FCSD to take with them as they move forward," he said. "But ultimately, their success depends on their choices, their hard work, and their drive as they move on.


Salutatorian Ethan Hunt spoke about dedication and determination in life, calling for hard work and pursuing your dreams.



Liberty graduates 110 on Friday

tudents around the globe that make up the Class of 2021 are forever alike, through the resilience and perseverance displayed in the past year

during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Liberty's 110 graduates, who were celebrated in a ceremony at Bethel Woods on Friday, will not only remember what challenges they had to overcome, but also what made them a truly

special group.

'The class of 2021 is comprised of future auto mechanics, teachers, nurses, political activists, and fabu-lous drag queens," said Valedictorian Sophia Medina, who will be attending Vassar College in the fall. "We are

revolutionaries, artists, dreamers and some of us are even Dogecoin buyers. And without knowing it, we have left behind legacies unmatched by other graduating classes."

One of these legacies Medina referred to was the fact



that the Class of 2021 was the first in school history where the top 10 ranking members were all female.

Medina reflected on more of the class's accomplishments, which included starting the annual trip to Ellis Island to see the Statue of Liberty in eighth grade; launching the Comfort Closet; making pronoun pins and holding educational sessions to teach district staff about the importance of LGBTQ awareness in the classroom and getting gender neutral bathrooms; starting a plastic initiative that will create benches for the community; and getting a native speakers class in the Spanish department.

"We stepped up the game for all future classes in terms of the Lip Sync Battle at Color Wars, have probably played the most Uno games at lunch ever, and from reading the senior quotes in the yearbook, I would have to bet that we have the highest number of procrastinators the school has ever seen,' Medina joked.

On a serious note, Medina

also discussed topics like police brutality, discrimination against those in the LGBTQ community, abuse of immigrants at the US-Mexico border and more.

Medina said that sitting in the discomfort that the conversation brings is a challenging emotion to deal with, but a necessary one to navigate in order to make real change.

"Despite the enduring negative impacts of racism, police brutality, homophobia, gun violence, and the demonization and abuse of immigrants, Liberty, and its amazing diversity, has the potential to be a model for the rest of the country. We have the power to use what we've learned here," she said.

"The volunteerism, the inclusion, the outreach, and even the lessons learned from failures to not only help each other, but the many communities who are slipping through the cracks. As individuals, we can choose to build upon and modify the past [that] older generations have left for us. We can take the steps to make posi-

tive changes in this world. As graduates, we are already taking that first step."


was of their growth, even in the face of challenges.

t was senior Skylar Blaine who led Superintendent Steve Walker to the Pink Floyd lyric "no one told you when to run, you missed the starting gun."

Since taking the helm of the district, Walker's taken to reaching out to the senior class before starting his speech for their graduation, looking for the students' guidance to make their final moments in high school meaningful.

Blaine didn't have advice for his speech, but she did have a challenge — to somehow incorporate some of Pink Floyd's Dark Side of the Moon lyrics into his speech.

Somehow the superintendent managed it, noting that it's been his experience that "life isn't about waiting for someone to tell you when to run, but instead it's about trusting your instincts and the advice

of those closest to you and about knowing that there is no perfect time to try something new or take on a challenge."

It was a similar gauntlet as that thrown down by graduate Jessica Schwalb. This year's valedictorian of a class of 66 students — one of Sullivan West's smaller graduating classes — Schwalb asked her classmates to venture down memory lane to her second grade birthday party, when the theme was her obsession of the moment — Indiana Jones.

The fictional professor implored good archeologists to "get out of the library," and that's exactly what little Jessica did, turning over rocks, covering herself in mud, and investigating everything that the terrain of western Sullivan County had to offer.

"My elementary brain was loaded with questions," Schwalb explained to the audience. "Why do earwigs have forceps on their abdomens? How are worms strong enough to dig deep holes? How do they see? Why are frogs green? Why are they afraid of me?"

But from all these ques-

tions, Schwalb said she realized there's a challenge for everyone to find the thing that excites them — maybe that 'something new' was what Walker was talking about.

"We each have a passion, and maybe it's hidden inside of us," she assured her classmates. "But don't go through life without finding it."

As for where to find it, that was a bit of advice offered up by Salutatorian Abby Gaebel.

Growing up in the hill above Youngsville, Gaebel reflected on the challenges — and advantages — of being raised in a small, rural school district.

"When Sullivan West students graduate," she noted, "they often cannot wait to get out of Sullivan County or go to a bustling city and experience new things."

But while there's value in that, there's what Gaebel labeled a "charm and sense of identity" that exists in the corners of their childhood, at Skinner's Falls or Crystal Lake. "These locations are much

more than arbitrary destinations in the woods," Gaebel reminded her classmates. "They are all laced with a sense of magic. To be in the great outdoors, there is a whisper in the wind that brings a tranquil breath of life to every individual." Relating her community to

a grapevine, her fellow graduates to the grapes that burst forth from the vines, Gaebel called upon the Class of 2021 to "carry the spirit of our com-

munity with us." And while no one told them when to run, the members of the Sullivan West Class of 2021 have always carried this spirit with them, the spirit they uncovered turning over rocks and getting covered in mud.

Seventy-three Bears move on to next chapter

o you all want to play a game? Of course you do. So here's the scenario. You have \$86,400. Now imagine that \$10 of those dollars are taken away. Do you risk losing your remaining \$86,390 to get back those \$10? Or do you let them go and keep the rest?"

Tri-Valley valedictorian Rebecca Musa, who will be heading to Virginia Tech in the fall, posed the question to her peers, family and friends in attendance at Saturday's ceremony honoring the 73 members of the Class of 2021 at the Iatauro Sports Complex.

Musa said people would likely let the \$10 go and keep the rest. She then went over previous experiences from her past such as obsessing over one bad test grade, worrying about what others would think if she and friends chose to join her parents on the dance floor or preparing for the dreaded Fitnessgram PACER test often part of the gym class curriculum.

These stories all led back to that initial question, but instead of money, she asked them to imagine it being time, something so many of us waste each day overthinking and obsessing about things in our lives.

things in our lives. "The Dalai Lama said it better than I can," explained Musa, "'There are only two days in the year that nothing can be done. One is called yesterday and the other is called tomorrow, so today is the right day to love, believe, do and mostly live.'

"Classmates since we are soon to be leaving each other my one hope for you all is that you live in and cherish the moment," Musa continued. "Whatever your

future looks like, don't be apprehensive ... go all out and waste zero seconds. Because we're not here for a long time (approximately 2,400,000, 000,000,000 seconds) but a good time. Like graduating high school baby! So congratulations Class of 2021, enjoy it."

In his address to peers, Salutatorian Jeremiah Steinhilber, who will be attending Elmira College to study psychology, talked about a health scare he experienced earlier in his high school career. While being rushed to the hospital due to suffering a seizure, his thoughts were racing. However, in spite of what he faced, his worries left him because his family

was with him.

"I knew they would help and support me through the time to come after this whole ordeal," he said. "And as they came in a few at a time, I was reassured by hand holding, and calming words.

"Now you're probably wondering, 'But Jeremiah, what does your seizure have anything at all to do with us?'"

He explained that over the years at Tri-Valley, the Class of 2021's experiences - good and bad - shaped them as people.

"We need to learn and change from these experiences, and not only move on from them but grow as well," he said. "Understand that no matter how bad it gets, and whatever awful things we go through; as long as you surround yourself with people who love you, you will be alright."

In addition to the valedictorian and salutatorian addresses, another notable moment was the Armed Forces Presentation, where each year, all T-V graduates entering the military are recognized. Class Advisor Brenda Sloan was joined on stage by T-V Class of 2015 graduate and member of the U.S. Marine Corps, Sgt. Christopher Regina. This year's honoree: Regina's brother and 2021 T-V graduate Taylor Gonsher, who will follow in his footsteps and serve our country as a Marine.

Following that presentation, Sloan introduced a new scholarship honoring the late Alan Moss, a Tri-Valley graduate who passed away last year. Moss' parents joined on stage as the first recipient of the memorial scholarship in their son's was announced. name Lorna Bragg is the inaugural recipient and she'll be attending Northeastern University to study political science and mathematics.

Shortly after, it was time for the main event. Following the receipt of their diplomas, graduates turned their tassels and threw their caps in the air in celebration. Before exiting and joining family and friends for photos, Class of 2021 Vice President Celest Ibarra closed out the ceremony with one last message for her peers.

"We definitely had some low points over the last 15 months, but we overcame it all to get here today," she said. "The German philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche famously said, 'That which does not kill us makes us stronger.' And we are stronger, Class of '21. And we will always be strong - Tri-Valley strong."


The Monticello Central School District held three ceremonies on Sunday to recognize the 179 members of the Class of 2021.

Love of small town. Coach Ahart, resonate as Roscoe graduates 22

They sat beneath a sign dedicating their gymnasium to Coach Fred Ahart, and they offered up a plaque to the former Roscoe athletic director as a class gift.

Ahart passed away in June, just before the Class of 2021 could start their senior year, but it was graduate KJ Feeney who spoke the words everyone was thinking in his closing remarks at graduation.

"I want to look up at Coach, because I know he is looking down at us this evening," Feeney said, "and I want to thank him for everything he has ever done for Roscoe and everything he has ever done for this class."

For more than 50 years, Fred Ahart was the face of Roscoe Central School, the face on the sidelines at sports games and a face peeking in on graduations to wish his kids a final farewell.

He was always there, and he was there on the Friday night that the Class of 2021 said their final goodbyes too. Feeney certainly wasn't the only graduate to pay tribute to Ahart during the first graduation after his passing.

As Valedictorian Cole DeRosia spoke of the importance of perseverance for his classmates, he noted that they didn't have to look very far for the model of who it was they might want to strive to be. Working summers with the custodial staff at Roscoe Central School, DeRosia had a special chance to see a bit of the be-

hind the scenes of Ahart's life, to see the coach who just wanted to get back into his office and get back to work serving the kids of the Roscoe district.

"Each day during work, Mr. Klein and I would hear him on his phone down the hallway talking to other schools and planning the upcoming football season," DeRosia recalled.

His advice to his classmates? "Take a page from Coach's book. Push for what you love, and give back to your community wherever that might be."

That focus on community has echoed over the years at RCS graduations. The county's smallest school district, its senior class size has varied over the years from as little as 10 to this year's 22.

But each year seniors speak about the love of their small town, the support, and the dedication to giving them the advantages of schools far larger than them — exactly the sorts of things Fred Ahart worked to provide year after year, decade after decade.

"Thank you to the teachers and staff who over the years have become therapists, friends, mentors and coaches," Salutatorian Hunter Appley said to the crowd and those teachers and staff members of Roscoe Central School. "We could not be here today without your combined efforts to teach us, shape us and push to this point in our lives."


