# S-C adjusting to new normal in CMAC

Get ready for some 'Maction.

After two years independent of a conference, Smith-Cotton kicks off the inaugural season of the Central Missouri Activities Conference this fall and hosts its first CMAC opponent Week 2 against Rock Bridge.

Any other season, a new conference is the marquee attraction. But new practice, travel and contest guidelines are front and center in 2020 as the coronavirus pandemic reshaped organized sport around the nation.

Suffice to say, the Tigers are adjusting to a new normal.

Smith-Cotton football head coach Charlie McFail said given the preseason adversity presented by the virus and the team's upcoming CMAC challenge, the Tigers have earned some hometown support in rebounding from a 1-9 campaign in 2019.

"S-C football players have shown great poise and perseverance in the face of this uncommon time," McFail said. "Tiger football players have put in great work all summer long. Weights, conditioning, skill training, all of it has happened with great success because of their ability to adapt to whatever regulations and protocols are thrown at them."

The CMAC, made up of Capital City, Helias, Jefferson City, Rock Bridge, Hickman and Battle, helped replace matchups with Lawrence Free State, Smithville and old West Central Conference rivals in Clinton and Center.

Winning two games against Hickman in 2018, the Tigers finished 0-3 against CMAC opponents last year.

Non-conference opponents on the schedule include Moberly, which has been a season-opening fixture since 2016. The Tigers travel to Warrensburg to continue the Silver Tiger showdown in Week 3 and host Hogan Prep, assigned to Class 2 in 2019, to finish the regular season.

The Tigers bring back talent in the trenches, at linebacker and in the secondary.

S-C seniors Joe Rodriguez, Jackson Hazel and junior Elias Washington return to the

offensive line in support of junior running back Chase McMullin and sophomore quarterback Lane Simmons.

Kolby Thomas, senior, is the eldest returning pass rusher on a defense that last year fielded several first-year starters.

On defense, junior Everett Wood, Kole Scott, Braxton Houchens and Devan Scroggins are the top returning tacklers at linebacker, while classmates Jaren Washington and Stefan Scroggins saw plenty of snaps last season at safety and cornerback, respectively.

The Tigers project to surmount their one-win total from last year's campaign. But new starters at skill positions, special teams and a youthful defensive group — combined with a 'Maction-packed schedule — will make for a challenging inaugural season in the CMAC.

McFail said the Tigers have established a resilient nature as the new normal.

"I am proud of how they faced the challenge without excuses," McFail said. "They are preparing mentally and physically everyday to be great. They deserve your support."





# **Kaysinger Conference may see increased parity**

Combining for two district titles, 14 all-state selections and hosting an all-Kaysinger Class 1 state quarter-finals matchup, the Kaysinger Conference has quite the act to follow in 2020.

Should the upcoming campaign fail to recapture last season's unprecedented success, given the firepower returning, the four-team Kaysinger Conference projects to be as competitive as it has ever been.

LINCOLN hopes what it has established as the norm — a five-year undefeated conference record, a two-year streak of state championship appearances — continues under head coach Brad Drehle.

"In a program that has experienced the success that Lincoln has, the tradition is not just winning it is the work that goes into it," Drehle said.

All-state selection Gabe Mehrens joins senior classmates Emidio Linares and Ricky Rios to protect newcomers taking over skill positions in the backfield. Lincoln sophomores Kyle Eckhoff, Connor Lynde and Ross Johnson are stepping in as the first option at quarterback, receiver and running back, respectively.

All-conference senior Levi Betts, linebacker, is the leading returner for a defense that last season allowed fewer than 12 points per game.

WINDSOR brings back five starters on defense and six on offense after capturing its first district title since 1989. Kenton Sargent, who last season passed for more than 1,300 yards and rushed for another 300. In the absence of all-state running back Jonah Roberts (Benedictine College), junior tailback Dalton Witherspoon and senior receiver Jacob Berube look to keep pace with the Greyhounds' offense of seasons past. Sargent, Berube and juniors Dylan Witherspoon and Corbin Terry are also major contributors on defense.

Replacing four starters up front, Greyhounds head coach Jake Vencill said Windsor will rely on its speed.

"We need to use overall team speed and athleticism to our advantage in offensive and defensive schemes," Vencill said. "And use last year's playoff experience to advantage."

**COLE CAMP** graduated a host of talent after a better-than-advertised 2019 campaign. Of the team's five losses, four occurred against opponents that totaled at least nine wins. Sophomore quarterback Ethan Shearer and senior receiver Jamison Farrar replace all-state options at their respective positions. Cole Camp seniors Garrett Strathman and Austin Bunch round out the three-man class of 2020, with the former a returning leader in the backfield and the latter an anchor on sides of the line. Bluebird juniors Gage Cross, Wyatt Bryan and sophomore Preston Oelrichs are newcomers tasked with protecting their first-year signal-caller, while

the linebacker corps also received a facelift for 2020.

Cole Camp head coach Kevin Shearer said the team will rely on young players gaining experience quickly. "We need good leadership out of a small senior class," Shearer said.

TIPTON has reason to believe its team can end a Kaysinger Conference losing streak dating back to 2017. The Cardinals' backfield features four seniors in tailbacks Blake Arnel, Dylan Kuttenkuler, Dylan Whisler and quarterback Blake Fischer. Fischer passed for more than 800 yards in about six games, while Whisler is the Cards' top returning rushing leader. Arnel and Kuttenkuler are also expected to produce at defensive end and linebacker, respectively.

Tipton head coach Tony Braby said the Cardinals want to play fast and throw deep. However, the air attack will stretch as far as the offensive line — which returns two starters — allows.

Citing team speed and defensive experience, Braby said the Cardinals are not only aiming for their first conference win since 2017, but their best season since 2012 — when Tipton finished 13-1 and claimed a district title.

"We want to attack, play fast, and use lots of stunts to help with our lack of size," Braby said. "Utilize our speed on offense and defense. ... Don't be afraid to take chances and be aggressive."







# MIZZOU'S DRINKWITZ GETS ALABAMA, LSU ADDED TO 1ST-YEAR SKED

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — It won't take long for Eli Drinkwitz to learn just how far he has to go in building a "New Zou."

The new Missouri coach should have had a relatively soft opening game against Central Arkansas on Sept. 5, then three more winnable non-conference games against Eastern Michigan, BYU and Louisiana-Lafayette. But when the pandemic caused the Southeastern Conference to go with a league-only schedule, those four schools were dropped entirely.

In their place? Perennial powerhouse Alabama in the opener Sept. 26 and national champion LSU two weeks later.

"Y'all are trying to get me in trouble," Drinkwitz said with a grin, when asked about the formula the SEC used to adjust the schedules. "I would just defer to the SEC. I would defer to the league to find out what the formula was or was not. At this point it's sour grapes. They revealed who we're playing and that's who we will play."

Drinkwitz did acknowledge a recent conference call among SEC coaches got a bit testy. But he also promised that the Tigers will not back down from anybody on the schedule, whether that's an FCS school or the mighty Crimson Tide.

"We made every effort to create a schedule that is as competitive as possible and builds on the existing eight conference games that had already been scheduled for 2020," SEC commissioner Greg Sankey said in a statement. "This schedule is a one-year anomaly that we have developed under unique circumstances presented by the impact of COVID-19."

Not just a unique schedule but, at least for Missouri, one of the toughest in college football.

"It's not like any team you got is going to be a bad football team," Drinkwitz

said. "I think the candidness of the conversation was understanding how the teams were divvied out. But put it on the schedule, let's rock and roll."

That outlook might best sum up the bright, positive approach that Drinkwitz has brought to the Tigers.

The program had reached rare heights under Gary Pinkel, a big reason why it was invited to leave the Big 12 for the SEC. But it grew stagnant — and arguably regressed — under Barry Odom, and that was reflected not just in a declining win total but an increase in empty seats at Faurot Field.

Enter the 37-year-old Drinkwitz, who was given a \$24 million, six-year contract in December despite having just one season of head coaching experience. But what a season it was at Appalachian

State: He led the team to a 12-1 record with wins over Power Five schools North Carolina and South Carolina, an SEC school, and a victory in the New Orleans Bowl

Drinkwitz also inherited a loaded team at Appalachian State, though. He

takes over a program at Missouri that went 6-6 and failed to reach a bowl game, and that must replace its starting quarterback and plenty of other crucial pieces.

That work was delayed three days into spring football by the coronavirus pandemic. The Tigers also missed the majority of their voluntary summer workouts, putting Drinkwitz in a tough spot when fall camp began in earnest this week.

"I think the assumption with life is if you got a shorter amount of time, you have to speed up the process. But there's no speeding up the process," he said. "You have to lay the foundation. You can't skip a step. It's like we're putting together a toy, throwing away the directions and getting to the end as fast as you can. If you skip steps you're going to get burned."

That's why the Tigers spent the first couple of days at practice this week going over fundamentals, time and time again. It got to the point that some players were exhausted by the repetitive nature of the workout, though they also were pleased to simply be back on the field.

"It's very repetitive," Tigers tight end Daniel Parker Jr. acknowledged, "but it's a lot easier to learn when it's very competitive. ... (Drinkwitz) is a smart coach. He understands the ins and outs of the game. It's just a blessing to have him here."
