Friends of Boonslick is seeking new members

Everyone needs friends. Friends want to be involved, have one's best interests at heart and show support. Boonslick Regional Library has those types of friends.

Barbara Tavener, president of the Friends of Sedalia Boonslick Regional Library, said the group has been around since the 1980s on and off, but it has been active for the last 10 to 12 years. Tavener and her late friend Janice Simpson reactivated the Friends and they now have 10 members. She said on Wednesday she is seeking additional Friend members to enhance the group's outreach.

"We are always looking for new members," she noted. "What we do is we fundraise for the

library. And we use those funds for things that the library needs, but doesn't necessarily have the funds to pay for.

"We contribute to the summer reading program, both with funds and with volunteer help," she continued. "We purchase items for the library and we've done things like rearrange books on the shelves."

The Friends also purchase books for the library. Their most recent purchase was some of the Wonder Books. The books are interactive and allow children to read along with the books' audio feature.

Tavener, a retired teacher, said the Wonder Books come in different levels, such as high-interest low-reading levels, for readers who have difficulty reading, and for young

children who can't read. "There's an in-between (level for) kids too," she noted. "No matter how old you are, it's nice to be read to."

WireCo produces first 5-inch rope in 20 years

Mining growth requires massive wire rope

Thursday, employees at WireCo WorldGroup in Sedalia proudly posed with newly produced spools of 5-inch wire rope produced for the mining industry.

"We haven't made a 5-inch at WireCo North America in nearly 20 years," Operations Manager Mark Blankenship said. "It's for a customer in Wyoming for coalpit mining, so it goes on a dragline. It is a good contract, it's getting back into some of the markets that we weren't in for a while. We have an expansion coming focusing on infrastructure, crane, and other general-purpose ropes, there's a good margin in it for us."

WireCo twists wire rope for clients in the oil and gas industries as well as for mining, cranes, and for slings and winches. Recently they even produced a specialty rope used to hoist the SpaceX spacecraft.

WireCo WorldGroup Inc. in August announced a \$15 million expansion of its facility on Oak Grove Lane in Sedalia.

"The governor was here announcing Missouri works, then. Pettis County extended our Chapter 100 tax abatements so that eases us financially a little bit on the investment in new machinery in the facility," Blankenship said.

Capital improvements will allow WireCo capabilities of manufacturing more diverse products in an expanding market.

"It's an old industry," Blankenship noted. "Ropemaking has been around a long time. A lot

of our machines are old but still do the job. We've recently seen investment in new machinery to be able to serve the markets with better velocity."

WireCo sources smaller spools of wire from its plant in Chillicothe, from Oklahoma and plants in Mexico and custom manufacture wire rope from the smaller cables. The massive 5-inch wire rope is the largest WireCo can produce.

"To my knowledge, it is the largest rope produced by any ropemaker in North America," Blankenship added.

Many of the employees who were at WireCo the last time 5-inch rope was made have retired, but Production Manager Jerod Johnson remembers the last order of the mammoth cable.

"It brings back a lot of good memories," Johnson said. "The last time I saw it here I was actually involved in a little bit of running it myself."

Johnson said there is no difference in the manufacturing process of the oversized rope.

"Just the size and the weight," Johnson said. "You have to pay close attention to safety and the equipment needed is much larger than for our standard ropes."

It requires several operators on different machines around 100 man-hours to produce one 925-foot length of the cable which is then wound onto 20,000-pound spools for delivery to a mine in Wyoming.

An order of this size signals a recovery for WireCo after suffering a downturn during the pandemic.

Youngblood receives Female Athlete of the Year

A Smith-Cotton High School freshman was named the Missouri Lottery - Show-Me State Games 2021 Female Athlete of the Year during the homecoming assembly on Oct. 15.

Camden Youngblood, 14, started swimming before she was even a year old after her family saw just how well she did in the water and how much she loved it.

What her family didn't expect was for Camden to be diagnosed with neuroblastoma when she was 17 months old.

"It was really hard on my family and I was too little to understand so I really didn't know what was going on 'til all these things started happening and it

just went downhill from there," Camden said.

Camden underwent 10 rounds of chemotherapy, 12 rounds of radiation and had surgery to remove a tumor on her aorta.

Camden's mother, Shawna Youngblood, said Camden had her port placed and her first round of chemo right before Christmas that year.

"We got to stay home for Christmas that year and then the very next day she spiked a fever and we spent a week in Children's Mercy," Shawna said.

Shawna added that the earlier cancer is detected, the better the prognosis, and Camden was right on the line where it could have been good or bad.

"Things just fell in place for us, she managed to get through

chemo without any real issue," Shawna said.

The hospital then did a stem cell harvest that was sent off to California to make sure there weren't any cancer cells. Once that was cleared, they got the OK.

"We did a stem cell transplant and she was in the hospital for a month and a half. She spent her second birthday in the hospital and she did really well," Shawna said.

Camden was announced cancer-free in August 2011 when she was just 3 years old.

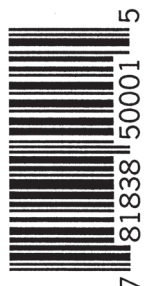
"I'm just thankful she was so little and really doesn't remember much about it. What she says she remembers is from us talking about it than really her remembering it," Shawna said.

PAC uses Missouri governor's attack on paper to raise money

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. (AP) — A political action committee backing Republican Gov. Mike Parson is raising money with a new video highlighting his attacks on a Missouri newspaper that discovered a flaw in a state agency's cybersecurity and waited for it to be fixed before publishing a story.

The 55-second video released Thursday by Uniting Missouri praises Parson for standing up to the state's "fake news factory" and criticizes the St. Louis Post-Dispatch. It suggests that a reporter for the newspaper was "digging around" in personal data about teachers.

Uniting Missouri promoted the video in an email urging recipients to help fund Parson's efforts to "hold the liberal media accountable." It includes a link to a form that allows people to contribute. The PAC declined comment Thursday.

The newspaper last week found a security flaw that allowed the public to view the Social Security numbers of thousands of teachers through the state Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's website. The Post-Dispatch alerted the agency and held off on reporting on the problem.

Instead of focusing on the agency's problem, Parson attacked the newspaper, and announced a criminal investigation. Parson then faced criticism for failing to appoint any members to a commission set up three months ago to identify cybersecurity risks in state government.

Sheriff investigates after shots fired at Missouri abbey

GOWER, Mo. (AP) — Workers began digging holes this week to erect an 8-foot wall outside a northeast Missouri abbey after shots were fired into the abbey's walls at least four times in the last two years.

The Clinton County Sheriff's office said it is investigating the shootings at the abbey for the Benedictines of Mary, Queen of Apostles near Gower but has not identified any suspects.

No one has been injured.

The last shooting in March sent bullets into Mother Abbess Cecilia's bedroom, KMBC reported. Two other shootings were in February and the first was reported in July 2019.

Mother Cecilia said she doesn't believe the shots were from hunters or nearby property because they happened late in the evening.

"There's more to life than shooting at sisters," Mother Cecilia said. "We're just trying to live a life given to God, praying for them, praying for the world."

Gower is about 37 miles north of Kansas City.

Social Services warns of fraud scheme

The Missouri Department of Social Services warns Missourians to be alert of new fraud activity involving Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funds. Individuals are reporting that they are now getting messages from social media profiles that impersonate their friends or family asking for a \$500 gift card in exchange for a large sum of money through CSBG funds.

"The Department of Social Services will not email, text, call, send a message on social media, or ask anyone else to contact an individual to ask for money or gift cards in exchange for more money," said Robert Knodell, Acting Director of the Department of Social Services. "We want to make sure Missourians are aware of this fraudulent activity and remind them that it is important to report any suspicious emails, texts, messages, or calls immediately to prevent this from happening to others."

Greenpeace chief warns of 'greenwashing' at UN climate talks

BERLIN (AP) — The head of environmental group Greenpeace on Thursday warned against efforts by countries and corporations at the forthcoming U.N. climate talks in Glasgow to "greenwash" their ongoing pollution of the planet.

The summit hosted by Britain has been described as "the world's last best chance" to prevent global warming from reaching dangerous levels, and is expected to see a flurry of new commitments from governments and businesses to reduce their emissions of greenhouse gases.

But climate campaigners say behind-the-scenes lobbying before the summit could hamper efforts to achieve an ambitious deal that would ensure the world stands a chance of capping global warming at 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 Fahrenheit) as agreed in Paris in 2015.

"This Glasgow meeting really is a vital moment where governments need to be courageous," said Jennifer Morgan, the executive director of Greenpeace International.

"They need to show they've understood the science, listen to their people and go much further than they've been stating thus far," she told The Associated Press in an interview.

By doing so, governments would "give that kind of hope and confidence to their people that they got this and that they're willing to do things that their corporate interests don't want them to do," she added.

Morgan pointed to leaked documents showing how countries such as Australia, Brazil and Saudi Arabia are apparently trying to water down an upcoming U.N. science panel report on global warming as evidence of the way in which some governments' public support for climate action is undermined by their efforts behind closed doors.

Documents obtained by Greenpeace indicate how those countries wanted the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change to remove references to the need to shut down coal-fired power stations, reduce meat consumption and focus on actual emissions cuts rather than ways to capture carbon already released into the atmosphere.

A spokesman for the IPCC's secretariat in Geneva downplayed the impact such lobbying efforts have on the panel's final reports.

"Review by governments and experts is a fundamental part of the IPCC process for preparing reports," said the spokesman, Jonathan Lynn. "The IPCC principles are designed to ensure that this review contributes

to a comprehensive, balanced and objective assessment in an open and transparent way."

Greenpeace's Morgan said much of the lobbying is driven by corporations, some of which will also be at the so-called COP26 talks — including as part of government delegations.

"They'll try and use this COP to show that they care, that they are really doing a lot," said Morgan. "There'll be a big greenwashing effort in Glasgow that needs to be called out and recognized."

Governments, too, are likely to use the U.N. talks to announce new climate measures, even as they lobby against others, she said.

"If you look at what they're doing to try and hold back the world from moving forward, it's stunning," she said. "It's immoral, it's unacceptable."

Greenpeace and other environmental campaign groups have been critical of a wave of announcements by countries and industry groups, ranging from airlines to shipping firms, to aim for 'net zero' emissions. Rather than cut greenhouse gas emissions to nil, those aiming for net zero pledge to release only as much carbon dioxide or other pollutants into the atmosphere by a certain date as can be captured again.

Mistrial declared in lawsuit against Kansas City police

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Jurors were unable to reach a verdict in a federal civil rights lawsuit brought by a Black man who was wrongly arrested when he was 15 and held for three weeks without charge.

Arthur Benson, an attorney for Tyree Bell, told The Kansas City Star on Wednesday that they are looking forward to a new trial after the mistrial was declared earlier this month.

Officers Peter Neukrich and Jonathan Munyan said they arrested Bell on June 8, 2016, because he resembled another teen who had run away from officers earlier in the day, discarding a gun as he fled. Bell was walking home about a mile from where that happened when the officers stopped him.

Oct. 22 is Buckle Up Phone Down Day in Missouri

Gov. Mike Parson has proclaimed Oct. 22 as Buckle Up Phone Down Day in Missouri in an effort to encourage Missourians to take two simple actions to save lives on the state's highways – fasten their seat belts and put their phones down while driving.

For the fifth straight year, the Missouri Department of Transportation and the Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety, along with safety partners throughout the state, will mark Buckle Up Phone Down Day to encourage better driving behaviors.

Since the program began in 2017, the BUPD initiative has spread steadily across Missouri and into more than a dozen other states. More than 14,000 individuals

and businesses have accepted the BUPD challenge, and several other states are actively sharing the messages along their highways.

"Keeping momentum behind this challenge will help us reinforce the two easiest and most effective ways to stay safe and save lives on our highways," said Robert Brinkmann, chairman of the Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety Executive Committee. "I encourage everyone to take today as an opportunity to make these actions a part of your routine every day and challenge your loved ones to do the same."

Missouri's 2021 Seat Belt Usage Survey showed 88% of vehicle occupants use a seat belt, matching the highest rate the state

has ever recorded. But the unbuckled 12% make up a majority of the state's roadway fatalities, which spiked in 2020 despite a decrease in traffic volume. More than two-thirds of the drivers and passengers killed in traffic crashes last year were not wearing a seat belt.

"The simple act of buckling up has proven time and time again to be a person's single greatest line of defense in a crash," said MoDOT State Highway Safety and Traffic Engineer Nicole Hood. "It only takes a few seconds to make these two simple choices with life-saving results: Buckle up, and if you're driving, put the phone down."

Cellphone use continues to be one of the most concerning behaviors for

all roadway users. In 2020, nearly 60% of the distracted driving fatalities in Missouri claimed the life of someone besides the

distracted driver.

She said the library discovered that since placing the book bins where children can look through them themselves, more books are being checked out.

"Children's books are so thin ... little ones don't read yet, so if you've got (the books) in the bin where they can flip through and see the pictures, then they can select them themselves," she explained.

Tavener said she has always been a big reader and got involved with reactivating the Friends of Sedalia Boonslick 10 to 12 years ago with Simpson. After she died, the Friends purchased a television for the library in memory of Simpson.

"When Janice passed away, we had memorials donated in her name," Tavener noted. "And with that, we purchased the TV ... that they do streaming to talk about the things that are available, and we purchased some of the Wonder Books in her name.

"Memorials are another way that people can donate to us," she continued. "In the past, we had book sales, but we've not been able to do that recently."

The Friends do host silent auctions to raise funds and that has been a success.

"Patrons will donate items and various community businesses have

to this day is amazing. We are a unique operation because it takes all of us to build this product. Collaborating as a team we are able to overcome all the challenges along the way from start to finish. It is a great feeling to be making such a diverse, unique product that we can take pride in at the end of the day."

As the WireCo employees assembled Thursday for a company photo in front of the giant spools of rope they manufactured, their pride was evident.

"I think our operators take a lot of pride in the work that they do," Ka-

tie Albrecht, Human Resources Manager, said. "Knowing the use of the rope is very important to them because they understand the true magnitude of the job that they're fulfilling, and what that looks like. We like to say at the end of the day, every time a rope is used, there's a life on the line."

WireCo officials noted they offer high-paying jobs with benefits and are hiring now in anticipation of the expansion.

The math around net zero is murky and activists say if it's not scientifically rigorous that target risks detracting from the effort to cut emissions as quickly as possible.

"(Some companies) want to continue what they're doing, but they want to pay just to plant trees somewhere else," said Morgan. "That is not the solution to the nature and biodiversity crisis."

She cited a recent report by the International Energy Agency which concluded that there can

be no more new coal mines or oil and gas wells if the Paris goal is to be achieved. Yet last week, a separate U.N.-backed study found that even current fossil fuel production plans for the coming decade would result in over twice the emissions allowed for the world to maintain a chance of meeting the Paris goals.

Morgan said the spotlight being put on the talks in Glasgow and some parties' efforts to bloc agreements on sensitive issues could embolden those countries that want an ambitious deal.

"They have to be ready to move, go beyond their comfort zones and come

together because you can see the level of opposition that's coming in at them," she said.

A group of nine nations, including Costa Rica, Sweden and the Marshall Islands, on Thursday called for countries that haven't yet done so to update their climate targets ahead of the Oct. 31-Nov. 12 talks in Glasgow. They also backed a long-standing demand from poor nations for rich countries to make good on their pledge of providing \$100 billion in aid each year to tackle climate change.

Camden said she thinks she is pretty lucky “I defied the odds, what they told me I wasn’t going to do I pushed through that and survived something not all kids survive,” Camden added.

Shawna still worries about the what-ifs when it comes to cancer but tries to not let it bother her too much.

“I’m honestly on the same page, I’m just like, ‘what if it comes back’ but I don’t worry too much about it,” Camden said.

Due to the chemotherapy, Camden became hard of hearing and has to wear hearing aids.

Having cancer has become a part of what shaped Camden into the

person she is today and she’s not afraid to share her story.

When it was announced that Camden was named the Female Athlete of the Year, she was surprised.

Camden had competed in the Show-Me Games during the summer and medaled in every event, earning three gold medals, three silver and a bronze.

“I didn’t really think I would get a big award that would make me kind of famous I guess,” Camden said.

When they announced the award, officials spoke about her journey with cancer and many students were surprised to hear the story.

“I really think that I really don’t deserve it, that someone else does but the only reason why I got that

Camden swims every stroke but her favorite is the breaststroke and spends a lot of time at practices.

Camden swims for the Sedalia Bandits and the Northland United clubs but will swim for the Smith-Cotton girls team.

“I’m looking forward to all the new places I get to go and the swim meets I get to swim, the new people I get to meet because they’re all in larger

grades,” Camden said.

Her parents believe Camden can make a career out of swimming and push her to be like her favorite swimmer, Michael Phelps.

Camden advised anyone who wants to swim to just go for it.

“It will lead you somewhere where you could achieve a dream or it can take you somewhere you never thought you go, I never thought I would be here to be the Athlete of the Year or to be on two different teams and get the chance to swim in high school,” Camden said. “I never thought I would be able to achieve a dream like that because when I was little I always wanted to be a swimmer and it was something really close to me.”

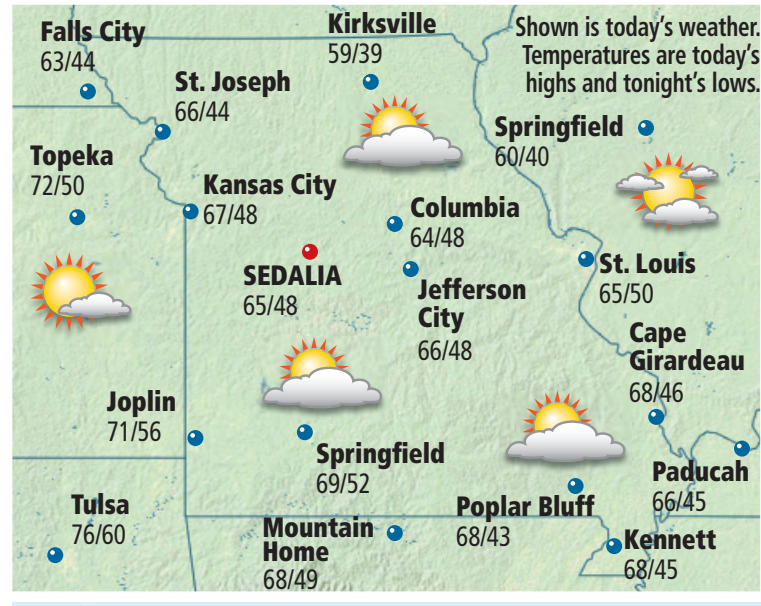

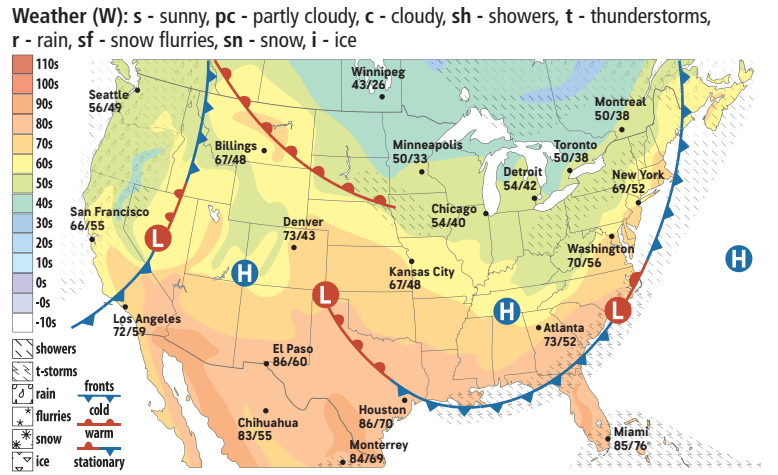

Smithton and head coach Sean Hutchinson were able to breathe easier in the last 10 minutes of Thursday night's game than when they last played Sacred Heart in the Kaysinger Conference Tournament Championship several weeks ago.

The rematch, a 3-0 home victory over the Gremlins, earned the undefeated Tigers the "Kaysinger Double." After winning the conference tourney, the victory clinched Smithton's regular season title, which they hadn't won

Both teams played to a nil-nil opening 40 minutes, as they did when the Tigers were 2-1 winners in Stover on Oct. 8. And Sacred Heart head coach Warren Dey felt more positive about that period of play than in the last meeting.

What code? NASCAR drivers lament lack of on-track etiquette

CHARLOTTE, N.C. (AP) — Tensions are high at every level of NASCAR as its grueling, 11-month season enters the homestretch with three weeks remaining to crown three series champions.

All eyes had been on feuding drivers Chase Elliott and Kevin Harvick, but NASCAR last week demanded they knock it off — a directive that sucked all the drama out of what could have been a nail-biting rivalry capable of derailing Elliott's shot at a second consecutive Cup Series title.

Still, there's been enough bumping and banging through the field in all three series that "driver code" and "etiquette" hang heavy over the championship races.

Should non-playoff drivers literally move out of the way of title contenders? Are drivers taking too many risks trying to make it

to the championship round? Both are viable questions based on the racing of late.

Denny Hamlin and Chase Briscoe have twice tangled on tracks this season and last Sunday's contact in Texas led to a heated back and forth between the two on Instagram.

Tyler Reddick apologized to William Byron earlier this month at Charlotte, where they had an on-track incident and Byron was ultimately eliminated from the playoffs. Byron admitted he was "at a full rage" and Reddick assured him he understood the stakes for Byron that day.

Just a week earlier in Talladega, 21-year-old Tate Fogelman wrecked Truck Series championship favorite John Hunter Nemechek to win his first career national race. Fogelman said "the seas parted" and created a hole for him to make the winning pass, a take hotly contested by Nemechek team owner Kyle Busch.

Chiefs visit Titans in 1st meeting since 2019 AFC title game

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — The Kansas City Chiefs are in catch-up mode while sitting at the bottom of the AFC West they've won the past five seasons. The Tennessee Titans have an opportunity to prove they're a team to be reckoned with in the AFC.

When the Chiefs visit Tennessee on Sunday, it's also the first game between these teams since Kansas City beat the Titans in January 2020 for the first of back-to-back AFC championships.

Ah, the memories.

"When you have a chance to go to the big one and get a ring, not being able to do that rings," Titans quarterback Ryan Tannehill said. "But at the same time, that was two years ago, and we are not going to get hung up on what happened two years ago."

The Titans (4-2) have won

four of their last five and are coming off a big Monday night victory, 34-31 over Buffalo. Hosting the Chiefs and Patrick Mahomes would keep the defending AFC South champs in the early mix for a high playoff seed.

"We're not really concerned about measuring ourselves or trying to beat two explosive teams back-to-back," Titans safety Kevin Byard said. "It's more about trying to get a 'W' this week and finding any type of way to get a win."

Kansas City (3-3) is 1-3 inside the AFC with losses already to Baltimore, the Chargers and Buffalo. This is a crucial point of the season with the Chiefs coming off a 31-13 victory at Washington and this their second straight road game.

"We're still nowhere near where we want to be at," Mahomes said. "We still have a long way to go with

cutting the turnovers down, executing better as an offense and finding ways to score touchdowns and when they're not there, take field goals. It's something we have to continue to get better at and we have a long way to go."

DEFEND DERRICK HENRY

The NFL rushing leader has a career-best five straight 100-yard games and leads the league with 10 rushing touchdowns. Henry has run for three TDs in each of the past two games, the first in the NFL to do that and run for at least 100 yards since LaDainian Tomlinson in 2006.

The Chiefs are giving up 133.2 yards rushing this season, 27th in the NFL. But they may get defensive end Chris Jones back after a wrist injury kept him out of the past two games. Mahomes called Henry one of the best running backs of all time.

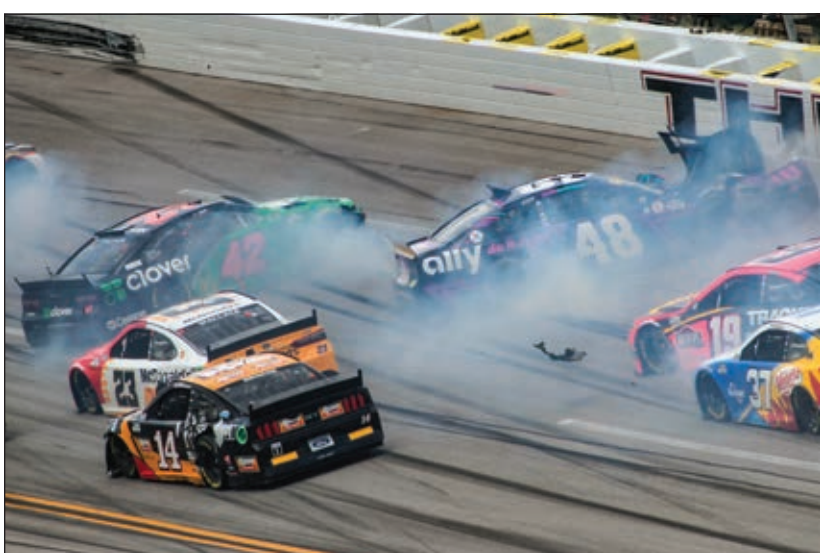

US women tie South Korea 0-0, snap 22-match home win streak

KANSAS CITY, Kan. (AP) — The U.S. women's national team had its 22-match winning streak on home soil snapped Thursday night in a scoreless draw against a surprisingly resilient South Korean team.

The Americans were one win away from matching the longest home streak in team history, set from April 1993 to February 1996.

They are still unbeaten in 61 matches at home, which includes 55 wins and six draws. It was the first time in 60 games on home soil that the team failed to score.

It was the first of two matches against South Korea. The teams meet again on Tuesday in St. Paul, Minnesota.

Goalkeeper Yoon Young-geul made eight saves, including a shot in the 76th minute from Carli Lloyd, who was making her 315th appearance with the team.

Before the game, U.S. Soccer honored Lindsey Horan for her 100th appearance with the team — which she played in Tokyo at the Olympics. Horan was also named captain for the match.

The United States was dealing with a number of injuries. Andi Sul-

livan didn't play because of a minor knee injury announced before the game. Julie Ertz, Alyssa Naehner and Samewis were in camp but unavailable because of previous injuries. Crystal Dunn and Christen Press opted out of the matches.

The match at Children's Mercy Park was a sellout with 18,467 in attendance.

Next week's match will be Lloyd's last with the team. She announced her retirement following the Tokyo Games, where the United States won the bronze medal.

The U.S. had won all 13 previous matches against South Korea.

"I did not see it that way, I saw him hit the apron and turn right," Busch said. "It's pathetic what we're doing these days. Nobody has any self-respect, respect for equipment, nothing. Cup (drivers) are guilty of it, too."

How does that get fixed?
"Unlearn everything you've learned about safety and get people

hurt," said Busch, who said "there's no question" the problem is generational and younger drivers drive as if they are invincible.

"I wouldn't say I'm scared but it's like you're kind of leery going into all these (superspeedway) races, just being able to walk out afterwards," added Busch, who broke both his legs in a 2015 crash at Daytona.

Hamlin, his teammate at Joe Gibbs Racing, has basically had enough and made that clear in his testy online exchange with Briscoe. Hamlin scolded Briscoe for racing championship contenders too hard, to which Briscoe replied: "I get paid to race, just because you guys are racing in the playoffs doesn't mean I'm just gonna wave you by."
Hamlin responded by explaining on-track patience can yield better results.

"Risk management is how you optimize your finish each week," he wrote. "Maybe putting

yourself in others shoes for 1 min would help. You had 25 races to get a chance to race for the post season. Respect is a underrated trait in today's world it appears."

Now both the Xfinity and Cup series head to Kansas Speedway this weekend for the middle race of the third round of the playoffs and the stakes couldn't be higher. Kyle Larson is the only driver in all three series with a spot locked up in the title-deciding finale. All four slots in the Xfinity championship are still open, same for the Truck Series, which doesn't race until next week at Martinsville Speedway.

Hamlin isn't expecting much on-track courtesy from drivers who are out the title chase.

"I think we have seen in our sport that there is no code," Hamlin said. "I just don't understand the mentality of some of these guys."

Elliott, who goes to Kansas below the cutline, believes NASCAR's playoff format "certainly extracts some desper-

ation at times."

His own spat with Harvick quietly began in September at Darlington, where Elliott said Harvick gave him a flat tire. When it happened again two weeks later at Bristol, Elliott deliberately held Harvick up to cost him the win. Then Harvick intentionally wrecked Elliott at Charlotte, only to wreck himself out of the playoffs later in the same race when he crashed into a wall as Elliott closed in.

Elliott noted drivers have to be aggressive to advance through the playoffs, but also said personal feelings come into play.

"When two drivers mutually respect one another, I feel like you get along and you race each other with respect, and if you have a run-in, typically you have a conversation about it and go on down the road," Elliott said Thursday. "When there might be a lack of respect, or people don't see eye-to-eye, that to me is probably where your problems come from more so than the quote-unquote code."

"It's just more of a respect thing and understanding where the other person's coming from."

Blues beat Golden Knights 3-1 to complete 3-0 trip

LAS VEGAS (AP) — Vladimir Tarasenko's tenure with the St. Louis Blues was a hot topic during the offseason after he requested a trade earlier in the summer, and again after the team left the 29-year-old winger unprotected in the 2021 NHL Expansion Draft.

The organization might be thankful he's still wearing a Blues sweater.

Tarasenko broke a tie midway through the third period in St. Louis' 3-1 victory over the Vegas Golden Knights on Wednesday night.

"Happy for him. He's been working so hard," said Blues goalie Jordan Binnington, who made 42 saves. "He's been through a lot and it's really nice to see him be rewarded. Can't say enough about that guy and his work ethic. We're all happy for him and hopefully there's more to come."

Brandon Saad and Ivan Barbashev added goals for the Blues. St. Louis won all three games on its season-opening trip, also beating Colorado 5-3 and Arizona 7-4.

William Karlsson opened the scoring for the Golden Knights, and Robin Lehner made 35 saves.

After averaging 30.5 shots on goal in their first two games, the Blues fired 38 on net Wednesday.

"You have to win in different ways in this league," St. Louis coach Craig Berube said. "I thought Lehner played an excellent game, and you're gonna run into that throughout the season.

You've got to stay patient. That's the thing I talked to our team (about) in between periods: don't force things and don't get impatient, because that's where you'll make mistakes."

It was a critical mistake that cost Vegas, incidentally by former Blues captain Alex Pietrangolo.

On the tiebreaking goal, Pietrangolo turned the puck over in the neutral zone with a blind pass, giving the Blues a 3-on-0 rush. Taking a pass from Brayden Schenn, Jordan Kyrou fed Tarasenko for a one-timer past Lehner with 10:11 to play.

"It's nice to play the game. I missed a lot of time," said Tarasenko, who's played just 34 games over the last two seasons due to injuries. "I enjoy my time out there with the guys. Goals are nice, wins are nice, make great plays — but there's a lot of ways to improve my game, improve our team's game. So we will focus on this and move on."

Vegas, meanwhile, played its first game without top-line forwards Mark Stone and Max Pacioretty, who are both injured.

But coach Peter DeBoer wasn't about to use it as an excuse for his team's lack of production.

"I think there's a little more onus on us to create offensive opportunities," DeBoer said. "I think the main focus of our group right now is to be able to shut other teams down. We can be hard to play against, and I think that's where our mindset has to be. We need a better mindset and look at these games like they're the

playoffs for us. Teams who are in spots around Thanksgiving, those are the teams that are going to be there at the end of the year, so you can't let these losses pile up."

The Golden Knights didn't get their first shot on goal until nearly seven minutes into the game, then took the lead on Karlsson's goal. After Reilly Smith drew him to one side, Binnington slid across the crease to deny Karlsson's initial one-timer, but he punched home his own rebound.

The Blues eventually solved Lehner in the second period with their continued pressure in the offensive zone. Ryan O'Reilly dropped the puck off for former Knight David Perron, whose initial shot deflected off Vegas defenseman Shea Theodore to set up Saad as he skated in.

Saad, who signed with St. Louis as a free agent in July, buried his first goal as a member of the Blues.

Barbashev had an empty-net goal.

NOTES: Vegas' Nolan Patrick played in his 200th career game. ... Nic Roy, William Carrier and Brett Howden made their regular-season debuts for the Golden Knights after nursing injuries. ... O'Reilly's assist on Saad's goal left him three shy of 400 career helpers. O'Reilly has 16 points (seven goals, nine assists) in 17 career games against Vegas. ... Perron's assist on Saad's goal moved him into an 11th-place tie with Red Berenson, each with 240 assists for the Blues.

"The way he's able to run the football, to get 20 to 30, whatever, 40 carries it is and then he comes back the next week and he seems like he's just as fresh as the week before," Mahomes said. "He's a special talent who works his tail off to be who he is, and so we understand it's going to be a great challenge for any defense to stop him."

TURNOVER ISSUES

Nobody has turned the ball over more in the NFL than the Chiefs, led by Mahomes with eight interceptions.

Mahomes has been

intercepted at least once in each of the past five games, including two in the last two. He has also lost a fumble.

Byard has three of the Titans' four interceptions this season.

HIGH-POWERED OFFENSE

Even with the turnovers, the Chiefs remain one of the NFL's top offenses. They're second in the league averaging 433.5 yards a game and fifth scoring 30.8 points. Mahomes is third with 1,887 yards passing, and he threw for a season-high 397 yards last week.

Travis Kelce leads all tight ends with 38 catches and is tied for the league lead with 468 yards receiving. Tyreek Hill caught nine passes

for 76 yards and a TD last week and is tied for the league lead with 46 catches.

BANGED-UP TITANS

Tennessee has an added challenge with the quick turnaround after the Monday night game in a lengthy injury report. Left tackle Taylor Lewan, carted off the field against the Bills, is in the concussion protocol. Wide receiver A.J. Brown is recovering from a bout of food poisoning, and fellow receiver Julio Jones was on the sideline in the second half after aggravating a hamstring.

Three-time Pro Bowl punter Brett Kern should be back after missing three games with an injured groin muscle, then

a stint on the reserve/COVID-19 list. The Titans already released Johnny Townsend, brother of Chiefs punter Tommy Townsend, earlier this week.

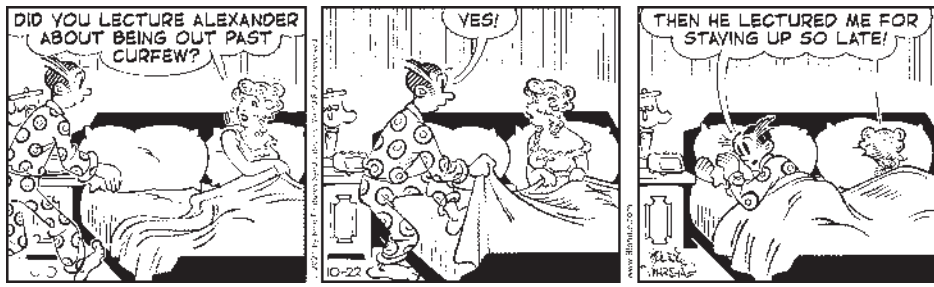
ACHING CHIEFS

“I think we played better in the first half of this game than we did in the last game,” Dey said. “I think what happened in the second half -- and I kind of thought it would happen -- was that whatever team scored first of the second half...for us, it took the wind out of our sails, so to speak. We just couldn't fight back.”

Both teams had opportunities to get that coveted first goal soon after half-time. Smithton senior Lewis Page forced Gremlins goalkeeper Alex Karigan to push a shot out of harm's way, then

some awkward bounces led to a chipped shot that bounced off the post roughly a minute later. Eleven minutes into the second half, Smithton goalkeeper Skylar Perry was called on as he rushed off his line to snuff out an attempt from Gremlins sophomore Jackson Manning near the top of the 18-yard box.

Less than a minute after that, Derick Shull took advantage of a ball that couldn't be cleared well enough out of danger and finally put the Tigers ahead, 1-0.

Cairer's moment that extended the lead arrived with 15:17 remaining in the match, and Devon Hand poked another in less than 1:30 afterward to all but confirm Smithton's achievement.

“Once we get a goal in, that just fires us up, and the fact that it was

senior night and a senior got our first goal really amped everyone up,” Hutchinson said.

The Tigers were relatively successful as district champions last season, when they finished with a 12-7 record. This year, though, they're allowing just a half-goal per game and scoring at a much higher rate. The senior trio of Shull, Walsh and Trip are all first-year players, with the exception of Walsh, who played as a freshman. Those additions have significantly increased Smithton's degree of size and athleticism, and allowed several who were skillful on the ball that played along the back line in 2020 to move up into the central mid-field. It's a puzzle that no team has been able to solve so far this fall.

“Number one, it's size, but they've got

speed, they're very skillful, and Cairer, he's pretty special,” Dey said.

The Gremlins (12-8-2) had several game-time decisions due to injury and were missing key junior Oz Garcia. They're looking to turn things after three losses in a row and just two games to go before districts begin.

“It would have helped us tonight -- and I'm not an excuse guy at all -- but we've had starters hurt and gone for whatever reason,” Dey said. “I'm hoping we get things back in order. We've got to get rolling.”

Smithton, meanwhile, has its sights set on rolling into the history books, past the pair of Final Four appearances the program made in the mid-80s.

“A state championship is the team goal this year,” Cairer said.

“We do it every summer,” Martin said of the offseason gathering at his crib, “probably twice in a month. This time we did it the first four weeks, without question, and that was scripted, just so our guys could be around our families and around our staff just in building relationships.”

Such is the nature of college basketball these days: The Tigers hit the transfer market to replenish the roster.

Dajuan Gordon probably waved at Mark Smith as they crossed paths with the former Kansas State guard headed to Columbia. Ronnie DeGray III arrived from UMass, Boogie Coleman from Ball State and Amari Davis from Green Bay, giving the Tigers an instant influx of veterans — even if they hardly know each other.

The Tigers also brought in a talented recruiting class headlined by guard Anton Brookshire, forwards Yaya Keita and Trevor Brazile and Kaleb Brown, the 6-foot-6 brother of Kobe Brown who should be intimately familiar with the program.

Asked what his new-look team needed to work on most, Martin replied: “There’s a lot of things.”

“And I say that respectfully,” he quickly added, “because you don’t know until you go through

it and we haven’t been through it yet, so you don’t really know who’s your leading scorer, who’s the guys going to do this and do that? You know Javon and Kobe are battled tested. You know they’ve been part of the program. But the other guys you don’t really know until you go through it.”

LEADER BY DEFAULT

Kobe Brown, the Tigers’ junior forward, is the top returning scorer after averaging 8.0 points last season. But he showed some scoring potential with a 21-point outburst against Georgia in the regular season and a 16-point, seven-rebound game against the Bulldogs in the second round of the SEC Tournament.

TRANSFER TALK

Davis averaged 15.9 points two years ago and 17.2 last season, though the competition he faced with Green Bay will be much different than in the SEC. DeGray and Coleman will experience the same step up in class. But in Gordon’s case, he started 22 games and averaged 9.1 points and 5.5 rebounds against Big 12 opposition for Kansas State.

STYLE WITH SUBSTANCE

Martin’s teams have a track record of toughness and defense, but he’s hoping the Tigers this year have another easily identifiable trait: speed. Martin wants to see them get up and down the floor much faster than last season.

“We’re working on it,

no doubt,” he said. “As fast as you can go, almost running through that wall. We want to go fast. You want to be fast, but you want to be efficient. You still have to take care of the basketball. We work toward that every day.”

PREP TIME

The Tigers eschewed a normal exhibition game against a lower-tier college program in favor of closed scrimmages to help prepare for the season. Martin prefers that route because he can better script what happens during the workouts.

“You can play three quarters, you can play 10 minutes this possession, you can do whatever you want to do,” Martin said, “and guys can kind of let their hair down, so to speak. You don’t have to be guarded — ‘We got to win this game.’ Sometimes even an exhibition, somebody has to win and you don’t really get a chance to get better like a closed scrimmage.”

GAMES THAT MATTER

There are plenty of potholes in the non-conference schedule for Missouri: SMU and Wichita State are talented, Utah and Illinois are high-profile games, and there’s the return of the Border War against Kansas to look forward to this December.

“It’s a tremendous schedule,” Martin said. “and I’d be hard pressed to find ten better in the country. In selling you want to come here and play, that’s part of it to, have a quality schedule.”

Finding the missing piece

A daughter learns to cope with her father's suicide

Losing someone to suicide is difficult for any family but when a parent takes their life and the child is in their early teens it can be all the more traumatic.

Katelyn Purchase, now 20 and a CNA at Bothwell Regional Health Center, lost her father Adam Ramey to suicide when she was 13. Purchase said her mother, Erin Purchase, and her father divorced when she was 6. When she was 11 she found out Ramey had a

substance abuse problem.

Purchase said her mother had noticed for years that something was wrong with Ramey and suspected he had substance abuse problems.

"My mom always noticed it," Purchase noted. "Every time she would come to pick me up from my dad's she would always tell me 'something's not right in there ... It's not a healthy household but I don't know what's going on.'"

When Purchase was 13, her father seemed to be getting better from an addiction to methamphetamine. He

was gaining weight, looking healthy and seemed like himself again. Purchase said he was doing so well she told him she wanted to spend the summer with him at his Pilot Grove home. On May 29, 2015, when everyone thought he was alright, Ramey took his life.

Purchase said she was in "shell shock" when she found out about his death but noted the family all came together. That gathering and the closeness of support from family was crucial to her mental health for several years after losing her dad.

The day her father died, Purchase said she "couldn't believe it." When the family gathered at Impact Signs they sat and talked about her father. They remembered the good times and discussed his situation.

"It was really hard, but us immediately coming together as a family helped a lot," she said. "After it happened, days going forward, it was really hard and my mom kind of picked up on that.

"I kind of felt like I lost a piece of me," she continued. "My mom picked up on that immediately and my cousin, who is my age, she came and stayed with me for a couple days."

Purchase said after two years she began "taking her feelings out in an unhealthy way." She was eventually diagnosed with depression.

"I would just cry at random moments," she added. "And feel like this giant weight had been (put) on me, I felt like I was stuck in a hole pretty much."

She struggled with the

loss of her father and depression until she was around 17.

"Then as time went on I have been getting better," Purchase said. "I have an amazing support group behind me."

Purchase said her aunt, Anne Townsend, who is her father's sister, is the president

of DeFeet, a local suicide prevention organization. She noted her aunt and her family are all there for her.

"If I call them up and tell them I'm having a hard time they'll immediately answer," she noted. "They will take time out of their day to talk to me.

"It has gotten better," she continued. "I have been able to handle my depression a little better. I don't notice it as much."

She added the loss of her dad is still especially difficult at family events.

"Because the thought always crosses my mind, like what would it be like if he was here?" she said. "What would he say in this situation?"

She added she believes having family there for support has helped her overcome some of her depression. Before her father died, the family often gathered and after his death, they made it a point to get together to hold his memory close.

"I just made an agreement

with myself that any time I'm feeling sad or down I immediately reach out to my cousin or my family," Purchase said. "And I just talk about how I feel."

Purchase said she has a friend who also lost their father.

"She's my age, she graduated with me," Purchase noted. "I was just there for her as much as I could be. I told her it is going to be hard. Every big event that happens in your life it's going to be hard because you want them there — graduation, marriage, any of that you want them there."

"It's going to be extremely hard," she continued. "But the main thing you need to focus on is that there are people here who love you. There are people here who may not necessarily know what you are going through but they want to help."

Having a support system is important for those who

have lost someone to suicide, and Purchase is thankful for her family and friends. She added it's difficult to talk about her dad's death, but it is necessary for healing to take place.

"It means a world of difference to just be able to

talk and express how you're feeling," she noted.

She said she wants to tell others to remember the good times and to "never take anything for granted."

Recovery Lighthouse offers free counseling services to community

Warrensburg residents seeking substance abuse counseling have a free resource in their community at Recovery Lighthouse.

Recovery Lighthouse is staffed by individuals such as Amanda McCullough, a provisionally licensed marriage and family therapist and drug and alcohol counselor, and Amanda Rowland, a certified peer specialist.

McCullough said Recovery Lighthouse assists patients through walk-ins and referrals from Probation and Parole.

The individual then completes an intake process involving signing forms

and taking part in a computer assessment to gauge where they are at in their life (employment, mental health, etc.).

They then meet with a counselor who completes the intake and those who qualify for its services can then begin attending group sessions.

Recovery Lighthouse offers individual counseling and coaching as well as peer coaching.

The organization operates a women's sober living house and a men's sober living house is in the works.

Recovery Lighthouse also offers educational groups focused on substance abuse, anger management and parenting; family workshops and counseling; and process groups for Recovery Court participants.

The Recovery Court program is a joint effort between numerous agencies such as Recovery Lighthouse and the Johnson County Circuit Court. Through the program, individuals with felony convictions or probation violations involving drugs or alcohol can remove these charges from their records.

Participants are referred through Probation and Parole or by a lawyer to Recovery Court and a team reviews the applications to decide if they'd be a good fit for the program. McCullough said that violent offenders are generally not accepted.

The program usually takes a minimum of 14 months to complete, but individuals doing well may be able to graduate early.

Over the course of the program, participants take part in counseling every week, a meeting with a judge every other week and group sessions.

Once the individual graduates from the program, they no longer have the felony charges on their record.

Recovery Lighthouse also connects graduates with agencies that can help individuals maintain their sober lifestyles post-graduation.

Recovery Lighthouse provides all of its services to individuals for free and is a nonprofit, grant-funded organization.

McCullough said that having organizations that provide services to those struggling with substance abuse and mental

health are integral parts of a healthy and thriving community.

"A community is only as healthy as its least healthy person," McCullough said.

Rowland said Recovery Lighthouse has changed the lives of many Warrensburg residents, including herself.

Rowland is in long-term recovery, having been free of substances since August 2019.

Following her graduation from the Recovery Court, Rowland became a full-time staff member at Recovery Lighthouse and is now helping individuals who are in the same situation she was once in.

"It means a lot to be able to give back to the program that saved me," Rowland said.

Rowland said her past experiences in overcoming her struggles allow her to identify with the individuals seeking the organization's services.

"I can relate to a lot of the people that walk in," Rowland said. "So when they walk in here and they see me on this side, they can think, 'I can do this.'"

McCullough said that seeking out a counselor can be intimidating and having individuals like Rowland representing the organization gives their clients a sense of trust and hope.

McCullough first became involved with Recovery Lighthouse when she did an internship with the organization while studying at the University of Central Missouri.

"I quickly realized there were a lot of people who needed help," McCullough said. "A lot of people didn't have access to counseling or family therapy."

McCullough said substance abuse can often be a symptom of other issues such as untreated trauma, undiagnosed mental health and family dysfunction. She added that becoming addicted to substances can happen to anyone.

"Substance abuse does not discriminate for socioeconomic status, family type, race, religion or any of that," McCullough said. "It's an equal opportunity disease."

Tips to handle everyday mental health needs

Struggling with mental health is a more common issue than one might think. But what are everyday issues people struggle with? And how can these issues be dealt with?

According to Psychiatrist Tim Vuagniaux, of Mefford Vuagniaux & Associates PC in Sedalia, there is a diagnostic classification called adjustment disorder, which can be everyday life stress.

"The loss of a person, or the loss of a job," Vuagniaux said. "... We all have our ups and downs with bad news, interferences in our life, and it may cause us temporary adjustment problems, and that may lead to anxiety, it may

lead into depression... it may actually lead us to act in ways that we normally don't."

"But for adjustment disorder that means it's fairly temporary," he continued.

Vuagniaux said the average person would be able to bounce back from this, which can be accomplished in various ways.

"Either by themselves," he noted. "Or, if they're smart, they're communicating with significant people in their life — families, friends, pastors, sometimes therapists. Sometimes people get counseling just to get advice on everyday kind of problems."

According to Vuagniaux, it is a misunderstanding for people to

think they need therapy only if they have received a "big diagnosis" or have a big problem, which is a perception that he believes has been gradually changing over time.

"The media is getting out the word that people can get (therapy) and it's not as stigmatizing as it used to be," Vuagniaux said. "... An average person would use these resources and then, you know, be able to bounce back fairly quickly."

By doing this, the person would avoid going into serious or clinical depression, according to Vuagniaux, which would have interfered in their life. He explained that this interference could be issues such as not wanting to get out of bed, not

wanting to go to work, or having "no zeal for life."

"The diagnosis then — it becomes more serious," Vuagniaux noted. "They're hopeless, helpless. They actually have suicidal thoughts. I mean, that's obviously a clinical problem. But for the average person, it doesn't lead to that."

Vuagniaux explained an average person may have suicidal thoughts, but this doesn't necessarily mean they are "highly suicidal."

"Everybody, I think, goes through down times," he said. "But it would be very brief, and they would kind of bounce back from that."

According to Vuagniaux, education can be helpful for mental health, noting how a college class taught him to be comfortable with public speaking. Sometimes a person doesn't require getting an education on the subject, he explained, like dealing with confidence, as talking to someone else such as a friend can be helpful. There are also many groups available for support handling certain issues, he noted, which

gives you people to talk to who have had the same experience.

"So, I guess the biggest thing, I would encourage them... if they had concerns would be to start communicating," Vuagniaux said. "Start talking with people. Whether it be friends and family, or getting help from... if it's a student (get help) from an educator. Sedalia Schools not only has counselors, but they have school psychologists. You can get some good ideas and direction to go in for different things as you start worrying about them."

"Sometimes, the worry we have makes things a lot bigger than they really are," he continued.

Other issues besides confidence, according to Vuagniaux, can be things such as decision-making.

"Making a decision that is not normal can create a lot of stress," he said. "Especially if it's risky or it involves money or anything like that."

From there, he noted people can have issues with communicating with people, including with their family members.

Relationships, in general, can be another everyday problem, he added. When forming relationships, he said, as people, we can be impulsive and don't always take a close look at who we are interacting with.

"Do they match correctly, you know, in a lot of ways? And that can involve lots of things," Vuagniaux said. "Matching in the terms of the ways that they view the world, religion, likes and dislikes. Some people don't emphasize that like they should."

According to Vuagniaux, if people are wondering about things they can certainly check in with different professionals. Another big issue is depression, he noted, which is something that clinics are getting better at treating. Personal history can tie into depression, Vuagniaux said, along with other disorders, which can be inherited characteristics and be exacerbated by stress.

"And it's highly treatable these days," he added.

Pettis County Jail housing mentally ill

Not enough beds with the Department of Mental Health

Imagine a scraggly, insane man languishing in a cell. Denied medication, his condition worsens until he is eating his own feces and rubbing them on the cell walls. This disgusting image isn't out of some third-world asylum, it is one man's life behind the walls of the Pettis County Jail.

"We have a lot of people in here that have some serious mental health diagnosis that shouldn't be in jail," Pettis County Sheriff Brad Anders said. "They're here because they have a serious mental affliction and we're not equipped to give them that help."

Anders has been in the office less than a year and the skinny, bearded man has been locked in his cell since Anders arrived, with little hope of a timely exit.

"The whole thing is a disaster and our hands are tied," Anders said. "With our medical contract on what we can and can't do with them, at some point they'll get so bad that the judge will have to get involved."

The catch-22 is that inmates aren't allowed their medications while in jail, and without medication to keep them in balance some slip rapidly into mental illness, making them less likely to be released.

"Being here you recognize and identify so many problems specifically around mental health," Anders said. "Dealing with people that are having withdrawal, or people that have drug addiction issues and there's nothing that we can do about it once they're incarcerated because a lot of the medication that is required for that sort of thing can put them at risk in a jail facility."

The inmate who slipped furthest mentally while in jail was originally jailed for exposing himself on courthouse grounds, a charge that would seem to back up assertions of previous mental health issues.

"You're looking at sometimes six months to a year even to get them to the Department of Mental Health, even though they've been ordered there within a certain amount of time," Anders said. "They just have limited bed space, so, you know, we've got

a guy back there over there we've had for 10 months that's been eating his own feces, smearing it all over the place, that is severely ill with the DMH commitment order still sitting back there."

The lack of beds at the Department of Mental Health, and a Pettis County Jail medical contract that is underfunded and inadequate, leaves Anders and his inmates at a loss.

"Currently we pay roughly \$70,000 a year for our jail medical contract," Anders said. "The contract that I want is roughly \$160,000 to \$170,000 a year. That would have to be funds from general revenue funneled into my budget to be able to pay for something like that, I know they don't have that kind of money."

If the medical contract could be adjusted, and if the Department of Mental Health could take the inmates with standing commitment orders, Anders could begin helping those inmates needing medication

and begin clearing the jail of those better served elsewhere.

"Ideally, once we get that contract and we get everything in place in the jail as far as policy, manuals, and we have our staffing up to where it should be, then we can start looking at federal contracts, and the Marshals are looking for places to house their inmates," Anders said. "If we can present them a legitimate jail that says, 'we've got the staffing, we've got the medical contract with this company that will be able to take care of these people the way they need to be taken care of. But it takes money to handle it.'"

Ultimately, Anders hopes to bring a pre-arrest "Safe Passage" program he worked on at the Lee's Summit Police Department to Pettis County. It would find help for those suffering from mental health issues before they are lost to an incarceration that may prove indefinite.



Burrell offers help understanding behavior

Be Well initiative makes accessing mental health resources easier

Burrell Behavioral Health is a community mental health center that has been serving central Missouri, southwest Missouri, and northwest Arkansas for approximately 45 years, and the Sedalia area for more than 10 years.

“We offer recovery services programs,” Dr. Shelly Farnan, Vice President of Be Well Initiatives said. “Services for across the continuum of needs for mental health illness, and also free resources that we have just launched in the past couple of years, both for commu-

nity health wellness, the prevention of mental health illness, as well as a new suicide prevention program called ONE initiative.”

The new outreach initiatives at Burrell came about during the recent pandemic.

“While Burrell has been offering these professional services for 45 years, we know that we are called to serve our beloved communities and new and different ways,” Farnan said. “As a result of COVID-19, our executive leadership team was looking for a solution to support the mental health needs for a colleague. Alongside using a team, we proposed

what we now call the Be Well Community. The Be Well Community is a brain health wellness program with options for all of us, individuals, families, groups, and organizations.”

Be Well is grounded in science and is facilitated by a team of experts who bring evidence-based practices to life.

“We’re not a ‘go home and do this on your own,’ we’re saying, ‘hey, come be well with us in this community that now spans East Coast to West Coast, and we just welcome the community into that Be Well experience,” she explained.

wellness experiences online at Burrell's Facebook page Monday, Wednesday, and Friday with videos available anytime. Just this week experts discussed living with the effects of ADHD.

"The entire community is welcome," Farnan said, "and what's happened as a result is that businesses, organizations, and groups have started asking for these types of Be Well experiences to be tailored to them personally, so we have launched Be Well Business."

Be Well is excited about the Be Well Community Movement and has teamed up with local artists to design Be Well bells, painted bells to be placed around the city to help bring interested parties to mental health resources.

"Be Well bells will be this visible display within Pettis County that any community member can walk by and have access to resources quickly, crisis lines, reputable resources, if they want to connect with the Be Well community team of experts. It's

going to be visible and available within the community."

Burrell is also excited to offer its new ONE (Our Networks Engaged) initiative designed to help prevent suicide.

"We're working with organizations, businesses, and the community to promote, life-living and likewise preventing suicide," Farnan said. "So we provide a toolkit, an education to help individuals learn how to have conversations about suicide, and understand the role that each of us can play in helping create life's work and hopefully preventing suicide."

Farnan said there is nothing to be ashamed of as mental health issues have touched many during the pandemic, but help is only as far away as the doors of Burrell Behavioral Health or resources found with Be Well.

"I love to say we all have a brain," Farnan said, "and we all deserve to know how to best take care of our brain and brain health."

A PSA to bring suicide prevention awareness

DeFeet and the Pettis County Zero Suicide Coalition have partnered with Best Take Media to produce a public service announcement video about suicide awareness, prevention, and education.

Missouri has the 11th highest suicide rate in the United States and suicide is the second-highest cause of death for individuals ages 10 to 34.

DeFeet board Vice President Robin Balke said the PSA is a joint effort between DeFeet and the Zero Suicide Coalition, with DeFeet spearheading the project.

“The purpose of the video is to raise awareness for suicide and hopefully preven-

tion of suicide,” Balke said.

Balke said they wanted to do something different from the Facebook Live events that have been hosted in the past, so the idea of a short PSA came into motion.

The PSA will feature five individuals from Pettis County who have lost someone to suicide.

“I think it will be impactful, it’s always better to use real people versus actors, of course, to have people share their own stories instead of someone else just reading about someone else’s story,” Balke said. “It’s always very impactful when it’s someone you know or someone knows of.”

Balke said she hopes it gets the point across to those who are contemplating suicide and how it impacts the

family members left behind as well as helping others understand what a suicide loss survivor goes through.

“We’re hoping that this will show people what those families are going through every day for the rest of their lives,” Balke said.

Balke said that as a community, Pettis County has realized that suicide can happen to anyone at any time, and that it doesn’t discriminate.

Videographer, and photographer Yves Exilus, owner of Best Take Media, along with his girlfriend and assistant director Jamie Napier helped produced the PSA.

“I’m honored that they gave us this opportunity to do this, I didn’t know too much about mental health

until we met Robin and the whole DeFeet movement,” Exilus said.

Exilus said the video will give viewers information on signs of depression and suicide.

He added that viewers will hear some of the stories but not all because it is hard for the families and he didn’t want to tap into people’s personal lives too much.

Exilus said people will not hear about what happened but rather about paying attention to people before a situation can happen.

“I feel like a lot of people aren’t educated about it especially in my age group and a lot of people don’t know about suicide prevention,” Exilus said. “I feel like DeFeet has really created this wave.”

Exilus said this is his first time ever filming something like this and having to edit it was very emotional.

“That’s my first time filming something sad like

and just having to edit it and hear it over and over again,” Exilus said. “Watching their pain and hearing their pain, and you kind of get more attached to it.”

Exilus added that he’s hoping viewers know there is an outlet and become a part of DeFeet and the Coalition so they can spread the word and help people.

Napier said she and Exilus have learned a lot during this process.

“We don’t want someone to repeat emotion, you don’t want to be like ‘here’s your script now wait a minute can you redo all that and say it louder,’” Napier said. “When they came in to film they knew the three general questions they were going to be asked but we didn’t stick to that, if they wanted to say something else we let them flow with it naturally that’s why when you watch it, you connect more to it.”

Napier said it was an emotional situation when

she would hear the music throughout the house when Exilus was editing the PSA.

“In the actual documentary, one of the things that are repeated over and over again is ‘you’re not alone,’” Napier said. “For someone who has lost someone, you have the same thing repeated, it may be easy some days or it may not be easy some days.”

Napier added that one thing all the participants had in common is they lost someone close to them but they found a community to cope with.

“At least there this community of support of people who truly understand and that’s another reason this video was created too, they want the community to understand that there are people there who can help you,” Napier said. “It’s not meant for entertainment, this is meant to be impactful in people’s lives who need it.”

Mental health resources available to university students

Stress seems to be written into the margins of every school book, but the university experience has its own unique set of challenges.

Jeanne Woon, psychologist and director of the Counseling Center, said the University of Central Missouri provides direct counseling and online resources to students.

The center is a resource for students at the University of Central Missouri to meet with psychologists and counselors. The center provides individual, couple and group counseling as well as crisis counseling.

The center also provides services beyond direct counseling, including workshops on mental health and information provided through Black-

board, an academic online portal.

“Topics on stress management, better health, healthy relationships, healthier thinking habits, better sleep, things like that, again, gives students information that they can learn and they can incorporate into their practice and enhance their mental health,” Woon said.

Woon said other resources are ULifeline.org, a website designed for college students with information about different conditions and mental health, and bodyu.org, a website with information on eating disorders.

“Another kind of outreach ... if a faculty member has a concern about a student or a student has a concern about another student or are not sure how to handle a situation, they may be coming to us,” Woon said. “Not to get direct clinical services for them,

but for consultation to help them think through what the situation might be, what is a way of responding to this situation. If there is a student they are concerned about, they know how to encourage the student to come to the counseling center.”

Woon said it is not uncommon for students to experience stress, anxiety and depression. Woon said having a center on campus makes mental health services more accessible to students.

“Students, like all people, go through life and the stress and the stress, etc.,” Woon said. “But students are kind of at a unique time in their life.”

Woon said stresses from school affect traditional- and non-traditional-age students.

“For many of the traditional-age

students, they are just learning how to be independent, leaving home, living away from family,” Woon said. “They’re learning kind of how to navigate life and navigate challenges.”

For several students, attending a university is their first time away from their support network.

Woon said students can get support through their on-campus community, but the center focuses on mental health.

“It’s not just on us, but when it comes to situations where they have more distress that maybe talking to a friend or talking to a faculty member is insufficient, then we are another resource to help them because of our focus on mental health,” Woon said. “We have that body of knowledge that we can help them with.”

Woon said a large portion of what the center does is just listen to students through the lens of their expertise.

“A lot of what we do with students is hear about what their concerns are,” Woon said. “They have their experi-

ence, but we bring in our experience and our training with mental health issues so that we can help them learn more about mental health in general and about taking care of their own mental health.”

Woon said it is a collaborative process to help students learn how to better help themselves and recognize what they are feeling or experiencing as anxiety, stress, depression, etc.

“If you feel upset or if you’re angry, that’s kind of normal,” Woon said. “It’s not as if we have to be happy all the time. That’s impossible. Some of it is normalizing the experiences, validating those experiences as well as providing some education about what is realistic, rather than aiming for perfect.”
