

SCJH students start Veteran Donation Drive

Smith-Cotton Junior High's student council is running a donation drive until Nov. 9 that will be donated to the Missouri Veterans Home in Warrensburg.

The council's service group decided to have donation boxes at school for students to donate snacks and goodies for the veterans as a lead-up to Veterans Day.

Heather Parrott, a sixth grade science co-teacher in the Special Education department and council sponsor, said the small group was wanting to do the donation drive since they are not able to visit the veterans home due to COVID-19.

"The rest of the group decided they would like to honor the veterans, most because they don't have a lot of friends and family that are visiting them right now because of being in the home in Warrensburg," Parrott added.

Parrott said the goal was to have the students think outside the box and for them to think for themselves.

Once everything was decided, the sponsors reached out to the veteran's home asking for a list of suggested items. The list was later sent out in a letter to the parents of all the students, in hopes of spurring more involvement in the drive.

Some of the items students can donate are Chester's Puffcorn, chips,

quick bread mixes, honey roasted peanuts, Cheetos, muffin mixes, cake mixes, icing, and cookie mixes. Students can also add their own type of donations like hot chocolate mix, popcorn, and candy.

The student council has been working with the Warrensburg Veterans Home for the last three years.

"We just got partnered with them three years ago because the service group then wanted to go up there and visit some of the veterans that live there," Parrott said.

The students have wanted to continue a tradition to honor the veterans at the home

Students who donate get a coupon to a local restaurant in Sedalia as a way to say thank you for the donation.

"If they donate something, some of our service

sor and a seventh-grade science teacher, said the reason why more snacks and goodies are on the list of items to donate is that the home's residents like to eat sweets.

"I know my papa that used to live at the Veterans Home before he passed away, he had a sweet tooth," Ragus said. "Maybe for them, I don't know if it brings back memories, they just like to eat sweets."

Ragus continued by saying that it may bring them together at the veteran's home but it can also bring joy to a veteran.

"I think it makes them think, 'Wow, people remember me,'" Ragus

said. "I think that's the biggest thing."

Some of the veterans don't have a family, so the drive can show they have somebody thinking about them.

"Everybody has a grandpa or somebody they can think that is older and maybe they relate something special to do for somebody elder and especially somebody elderly that served in the military," Ragus said of the students choosing to help veterans.

Ragus and Parrott said they think this is why the students keep going back to the veterans — there is a special bond or memory that makes them think of the veterans.

Both Ragus and Parrott are hoping to at least get a tote full of items to donate. Donation bins are set up across campus based on where each grade sits in the morning before school starts so they don't have to carry the items to class.

Locations include the sixth-grade area in the FEMA gym, the seventh-grade area in the main gym, the eighth-grade area in the cafeteria, and the main hallway of the school.

People who don't have a student at SCJH can still donate by bringing donations to the front office.

Pettis County First informs public on proposed landfill Calls for ordinance to stop 'waste park'

Thursday night, an open meeting was hosted by Pettis County First, a group of citizens opposing a proposed landfill between Dresden and La Monte.

More than 100 people crowded into the auditorium of Our Savior Lu-

theran Church to become informed on the planned "waste park," and to hear of the considerable efforts by Pettis County First to stop or regulate the site.

Local farmer Bill Taylor is active in the group and said it's necessary to get everyone informed on the landfill and its ramifications

for Pettis County.

"We feel like if we don't, we could have multiple landfills operating here," Taylor said, "because we don't have any ordinance, we don't have any regulations and land's cheap compared to what they get in the city for it.

A year in, Birthday Blessings is doing well Organization is looking for more volunteers

Birthday Blessings, a nonprofit organization that began providing services to foster children in Pettis and Cooper counties a year ago, is doing well.

The Democrat reported last November that Birthday Blessings Director Shannon VonAllmen said the faith-based organization started in West Plains in 2013 by hosting birthday parties for kids in foster care. VonAllmen said foster care is an "underserved demographic because people assume the government takes care of their needs and that's not even close to true." Birthday Blessings provides a cake, frosting, candles, a treat bag, card, and gifts.

VonAllmen said by phone, in West Plains on Wednesday, she was able to begin the program last year in both counties "largely due" to a donation by Hopewell Baptist

Church. She added Hopewell has decided to continue its support this year.

"They have given us \$6,000 to begin this year," she noted. "That's about half of what it costs us to serve the circuit. We're spending about \$12,000 worth of resources."

She added the organization's overhead is low but the funds allow them to purchase items for each child's birthday party. "So, that provided enough money to get us started this year," she noted. "So, since then we've served I think 102 kids. We had 92 birthday kids in Pettis County and then 10 in Cooper County."

She added the organization also provides other services.

"We do Loneliest Child care packages," she said. "And those go to kids that are usually in residential facilities and don't have family connections or social

connections. We sent out 11 of those."

One graduate was also given a gift bag, she noted. The organization also provided 83 duffle bags and backpacks that help stamp out the stereotyping of foster care children having to carry their belongings in a plastic trash bag when they move from home to home.

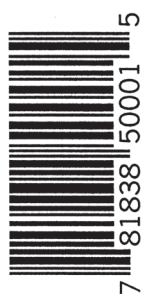
VonAllmen said all of the children have the option of receiving a duffle bag or backpack and if they need both they can have them.

"We also have a volunteer group there now at LifePointe Church," she said. "They meet once a month."

She added Birthday Blessings puts together all the birthday parties and resources at West Plains and then she meets a Sedalia volunteer at Buffalo.

"And she takes the stuff to LifePointe Church there in Sedalia," VonAllmen said.

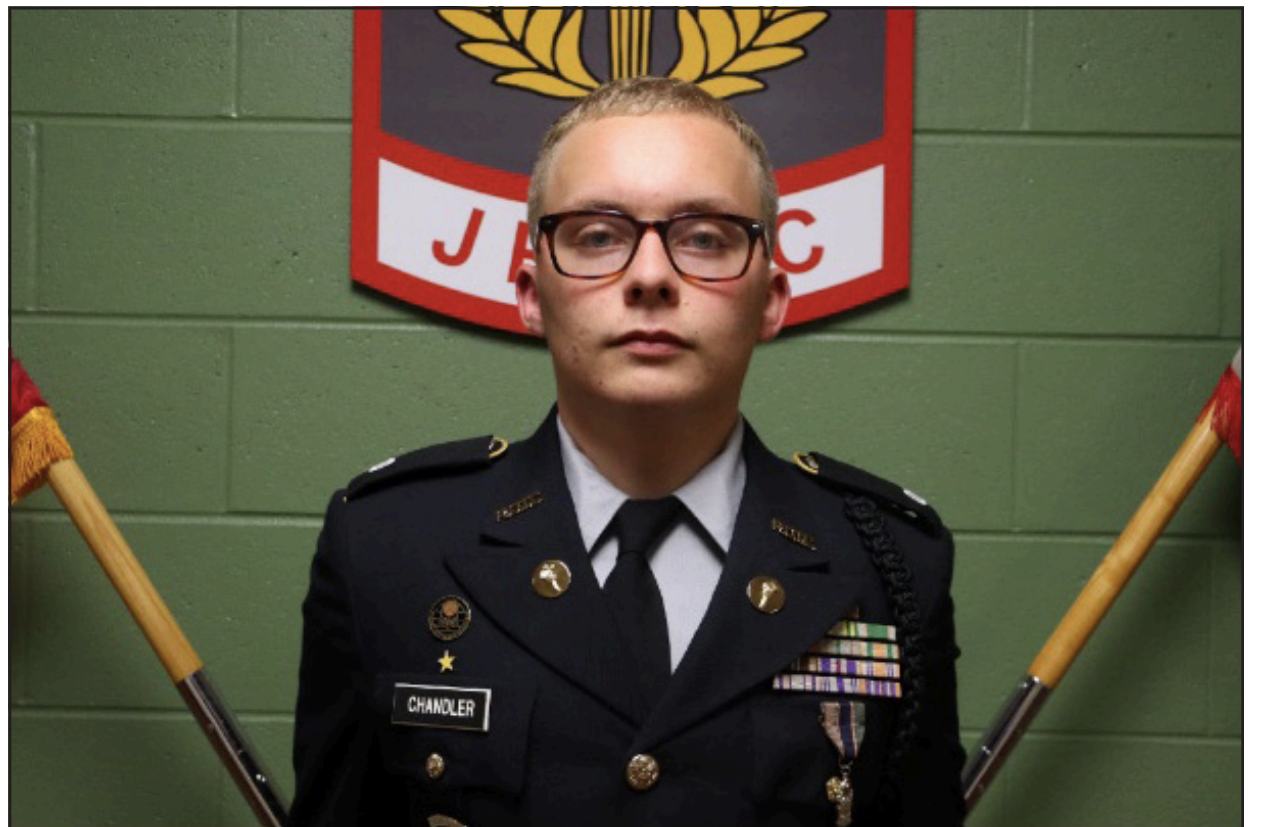

Lawsuit: NRA illegally funded Trump, other GOP candidates

O'FALLON, Mo. (AP) — A federal lawsuit accuses the National Rifle Association of violating campaign finance laws by using shell companies to illegally funnel up to \$35 million to Republican candidates, including former President Donald Trump, Sen. Josh Hawley of Missouri and others.

The Campaign Legal Center filed the lawsuit Tuesday in Washington on behalf of Giffords, a gun control nonprofit founded by former Democratic U.S. Rep. Gabby Giffords. It accuses the NRA of practices dating to 2014 "to evade campaign finance regulations by using a series of shell corporations to illegally but surreptitiously coordinate advertising with at least seven candidates for federal office."

The lawsuit names as defendants Hawley and U.S. Rep. Matt Rosendale of Montana, but the text of the lawsuit also accuses the NRA of "excessive and unreported in-kind contributions" to the campaigns of Trump and Republican Sens. Thom Tillis of North Carolina, Ron Johnson of Wisconsin, Tom Cotton of Arkansas and former Sen. Cory Gardner of Colorado. The contributions to

Rosendale were during his unsuccessful 2018 Senate campaign, according to the lawsuit.

Trump's 2016 campaign received up to \$25 million as part of the scheme, the lawsuit states.

Two NRA affiliates — National Rifle Association of America Political Victory Fund and National Rifle Association of America Institute for Legislative Action — are accused of coordinating with GOP candidates to use the same personnel and vendors for campaign ads.

"Campaign finance law prohibits groups like the NRA from buying influence over elected officials by coordinating spending with those candidates' campaigns," Campaign Legal Center attorney Molly Danahy said in a news release. "When special interests like the NRA secretly collude with candidates, this illegal coordination corrupts our election process and deprives voters of their right to know who is spending to influence their vote."

The NRA responded Thursday with a statement calling the lawsuit "another premeditated abuse of the public by our adversaries — who will stop at nothing in their pursuit of their anti-freedom agenda. This latest action is as misguided as it is transparent. Suffice it to say, the

NRA has full confidence in its political activities and remains eager to set the record straight."

Email messages left with the offices of Trump, Hawley, Rosendale and others cited in the lawsuit were not immediately returned.

Giffords represented the 8th District of Arizona from 2007 to 2012, when she resigned after suffering a brain injury during a 2011 mass shooting in her district that killed six people.

Campaign Legal Center said the Giffords organization first brought the allegations against the NRA to light in 2018 when it filed a series of complaints to the Federal Election Commission. The center said Giffords sued after the FEC failed to take action.

The lawsuit seeks an order preventing the NRA from similar violations in future elections and asks the court to require the NRA to pay a penalty matching the amount that was allegedly spent illegally — up to \$35 million.

The lawsuit accuses the NRA of illegally funneling funds to aid the Tillis, Cotton and Gardner campaigns in the 2014 election, the Johnson and Trump campaigns in 2016, and the Hawley and Rosendale campaigns in 2018.

Missouri attorney general reviewing claims against lawmaker

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — A judge appointed Missouri Attorney General Eric Schmitt as a special prosecutor to consider criminal charges against a state lawmaker accused of having sex with a drunk woman while on duty as a cop years ago, Schmitt's office confirmed Thursday.

An office spokesman said Schmitt, a Republican who is running for U.S. Senate, is reviewing whether to press charges against GOP state Rep. Chad Perkins, of Bowling Green.

The Missouri High-

way Patrol launched an investigation after the allegations became public in May, and a patrol spokesman in October said the agency turned over a report on the claims to Pike County Prosecuting Attorney Alex Ellison.

Ellison said he asked a special prosecutor to take over the case because he knows Perkins personally. Pike County Circuit Judge Patrick Flynn last month ordered Schmitt's office to take on that role.

"We've been made aware of the Court's order and are reviewing the matter," Schmitt spokesman Chris Nuelle said in a statement.

Perkins worked in law

enforcement in northeast Missouri before he won election to the state House in 2020.

Just a few months after Perkins assumed office, a local police chief sent documents detailing allegations against him to the Missouri Highway Patrol, the House speaker and other law enforcement agencies.

The woman involved told The Associated Press in June that she had fallen asleep in her car at a park around April 2015 when she was 20 years old and woke up to Perkins knocking on her car window.

She said Perkins drove her around in his police car for what seemed

like a long time before he had sex with her in the backseat. She said she was still drunk and remembers only bits and pieces.

Perkins has said the relationship was consensual but denied they had sex when he was on duty or she was drunk.

The Missouri House is also investigating the claims against Perkins.

Kansas City leaders rescind mask mandate outside of schools

The Kansas City, Missouri, City Council has rescinded its order requiring masks in public places to stop the spread of the coronavirus, but masks will still be required for both kids and adults in schools, and private businesses still can choose to require them.

The City Council voted 11-2 on Thursday to continue to require masks in school buildings and on school buses through Dec. 2, The Kansas City Star reported. A mask order for everyone 5 years and older expired Thursday afternoon.

Mayor Quinton Lucas said the COVID-19 case numbers for adults have trended down, while numbers for children have gone up. Nearly 49% of Kansas Citians have been vaccinated, according to the health department.

There continue to be mask rules in place for city buildings, federal buildings and the Kansas City International Airport.

KCUR-FM reports the move puts Kansas City's guidance at odds with the Jackson County Legislature, which voted on Monday to extend

the county mask mandate for another three weeks.

Legionnaires' disease case at Missouri mental health center

FARMINGTON, Mo. (AP) — State health officials said Thursday a case of Legionnaires' disease has been confirmed in a patient from the Southeast Missouri Mental Health Center in Farmington.

Debra Walker, a spokeswoman for the Department of Mental Health, said the mental health center was told about the case on Wednesday after a 66-year-old man was taken to a hospital.

She said the man remained hospitalized Thursday in stable condition. No other cases have been found at the center, she said.

The Department of Health and Senior Services was at the Farmington center Thursday testing its water system.

Legionnaires' disease is a serious form of pneumonia, which is generally spread through breathing in droplets of bacteria in water. It is not typically spread from person to person.

After arriving in Sedalia, all the gifts are wrapped by volunteers who make everything look "beautiful."

"We always want these resources to be visually impactful," VonAllmen said. "For a lot of our kids, it's the first time they ever had any kind of a birthday party. A lot of our kids have never had a birthday cake or a birthday card. So, we want to make everything look fantastic."

She added most of the circuits the organization serves tend to be in more rural communities.

"What we find in these circuits, there aren't as many resources for the foster kids," she noted. "So, a lot of times if you go to a bigger city they might have already established things. So, we are meeting needs that aren't otherwise being taken care of through another program."

Birthday Blessings is interested in finding people who will be willing to part-

ner with the organization. "We have half of our support from (Hopewell) last year, but we're not anywhere near the \$12,000 that it costs us to serve the two counties," VonAllmen said. "So, if there's any church groups or civic groups or individuals that are interested in donating or getting involved we'd love to visit with them about that."

VonAllmen added they also need more volunteers in Pettis and Cooper counties.

"We actually have a Facebook group linked to our page," she added. "If anyone in the Sedalia area are interested in joining these ladies to help with the wrapping, they can join our volunteer group."

Searching for balance in our lives

Balance can be elusive in our lives. People are incredibly busy with a variety of things. Commitments and responsibilities can be overwhelming. The amount of information at our fingertips is almost unbelievable. Relationships can be closer if we work at it, thanks to technology. The wide range of tools we have to communicate and catch up with friends who live all over the world can consume our time. Work demands all that we have and the very best of our time and abilities. We can end up feeling like we have given all that we have and there is nothing left. Life can fall out of balance because of the decisions that we make or by things out of our control. How then do we regain balance?

Kearney officer fired after plea in sex crimes case

KEARNEY, Mo. (AP) — A western Missouri police department has fired an officer after he pleaded guilty to two felony sex crimes involving children that occurred nearly 20 years ago.

The Kansas City Star reports that 40-year-old Alan Hale of Kearney entered the plea Tuesday. Sentencing is scheduled for January. Prosecutors are recommending a suspended sentence and five years of probation.

The Kearney Police Department said in a statement posted Wednesday on its Facebook page that Hale had been fired. He had been on administrative leave since the offenses came to light in November 2020.

COVID policies prompt suit against county health department

ST. CHARLES, Mo. (AP) — A lawsuit accuses a suburban St. Louis health department of violating state law because of its COVID-19 quarantine policies and recommendations for wearing masks in public schools.

The St. Louis Post-Dispatch reports that the lawsuit was filed Oct. 27 by the St. Charles County Parents Association. It claims that the St. Charles County Health Department broke a new state law giving elected government bodies the authority to review public health orders. It also accused the department of violating the state's open records and meetings law by imposing quarantine recommendations for schools in closed meetings.

The suit said that school officials following the health department recommendations "have sent healthy children home from school with mandatory quarantine orders," actions that the suit says deprive "parents of their right to children's public education without due process of law."

Countries pledge to cut heavily polluting coal, with caveats

GLASGOW, Scotland (AP) — In the fight to curb climate change, several major coal-using nations announced steps Thursday to wean themselves — at times slowly — off of the heavily polluting fossil fuel.

The pledges to phase out coal come on top of other promises made at the U.N. climate summit in Glasgow, Scotland, that the head of an international energy organization said trimmed several tenths of a degree from projections of future warming. But outside experts called that "optimistic."

Optimism also abounded in relation to the promises on coal, which has the dirtiest carbon footprint of the major fuels and is a significant source of planet-warming emissions.

"Today, I think we can say that the end of coal is in sight," said Alok Sharma, who is chairing the conference of nearly 200 nations, known as COP26.

Critics say that vision is still obscured by a lot of smoke because several major economies still have yet to set a date for ending their dependence on the fuel, including the United States, China, India and Japan — which was targeted outside the summit venue Thursday by protesters clad as animated characters.

What nations have promised varies. Some have pledged to quit coal completely at a future date, while others say they'll stop building new plants, and even more, including China, are talking about just stopping the financing of new coal plants abroad.

The British government said pledges of new or earlier deadlines for ending coal use came from more than 20 countries including Ukraine, Vietnam, South Korea, Indonesia and Chile.

Some came with notable

caveats, such as Indonesia's request for additional aid before committing to bring its deadline forward to the 2040s.

Meanwhile, Poland, the second-biggest user of coal in Europe after Germany, appeared to backtrack on any ambitious new commitments within hours of the announcement.

"Energy security and the assurances of jobs is a priority for us," Anna Moskwa, Poland's minister for climate and environment, said in a tweet, citing the government's existing plan which "provides for a departure from hard coal by 2049." Earlier in the day, it had seemed that Poland might bring that deadline forward by at least a decade.

Campaigners reacted angrily to the apparent U-turn.

"Moskwa has underscored that her government cannot be trusted to sign a postcard, let alone a responsible climate pledge," said Kathrin Gutmann, campaign director of the group Europe Beyond Coal.

Separately, more than two dozen countries, cities and companies joined the Powering Past Coal Alliance, whose members commit to ending coal use by 2030, for developed countries, and no later than 2050 for developing ones. Banks that are members pledge not to provide loans for the worst types of coal-fired power plants.

Meanwhile, the United States, Canada, Denmark and several other nations signed a different pledge to "prioritize" funding clean energy over fossil fuel projects abroad.

While not completely ruling out financial support for coal-fired power plants, the countries said they would refrain from any "new direct public support" for coal except in limited circumstances.

That move was seen as a significant step by environmental campaigners, who said that it could push international lenders to stop providing loans for new fossil fuel projects.

A U.S. official, speaking on condition of anonymity to discuss officials' thinking, said that while the U.S.

hadn't opted to join the coal phase-out pledges, its commitment to a clean energy future was clear. The Biden administration wants to reach 100% carbon pollution-free electricity by 2035.

Underlining the urgent need for action on coal, a new analysis by scientists at Global Carbon Project found emissions from the fuel increased dramatically in 2021, not just from pandemic-struck 2020 levels, but even when compared to pre-pandemic 2019 levels. The world spewed 14.7 billion metric tons (16.2 billion tons) of carbon dioxide from coal burning, 5.7% more than last year, said the group, which tracks annual carbon pollution.

That was mostly spurred by a dramatic increase in China, which hit a new peak of coal emissions this year of 7.6 billion metric tons (8.4 billion tons) of carbon dioxide, more than half the globe's coal emissions, the report said.

Still, experts said the announcement and others made so far at the summit showed the growing momentum to ditch coal.

"Today's commitments will help to shift whole continents on their journey to phase out coal," said Dave Jones of the energy think tank Ember.

Ukraine, the third-biggest coal consumer in Europe, is bringing forward its coal deadline, from 2050 to 2035.

Coal production in Ukraine has already dropped significantly over the past few years: From 40.9 million metric tons in 2016 to 28.8 million in 2020 (45 million tons to 32 million), according to the Energy Ministry.

The figures do not include production in the coal fields of separatist-controlled eastern Ukraine, which accounted for about half of Ukraine's mines prior to the 2014 uprising.

"The progress on coal being shown at COP26 demonstrates that the conditions are ripe for a global coal exit," said Leo Roberts, a senior researcher at the environmental think tank E3G.

"We now need to see the

incoming massive scale-up in clean energy finance made available quickly to ensure all countries can confidently move from coal to clean," he added.

But some environmental activists said the commitments didn't go far enough.

"Emissions from oil and gas already far outstrip coal and are booming, while coal is already entering a terminal decline," said Murray Worthy of the campaign group Global Witness. "This is a small step forwards when what was needed was a giant leap."

The agreements on coal are not part of the formal negotiations at the U.N. talks in Glasgow. But British Prime Minister Boris Johnson, whose country is hosting the conference, had said he wanted to see deals on coal, cars, trees and cash.

Fatih Birol, head of the International Energy Agency, said Thursday that a new analysis by the Paris-based body shows that fully achieving all the emissions-reduction pledges made on previous days — including for the potent greenhouse gas methane — could allow the world to limit warming to 1.8 degrees Celsius (3.2 degrees Fahrenheit) above pre-industrial levels.

The goal that countries set at a previous conference in Paris is to limit temperature increases to 1.5C (2.7F). A United Nations analysis showed that before Glasgow the world was heading to a 2.7C (4.9F) increase while other analyses showed warming in the mid- to upper-2-degree range also.

Niklas Hohne, of the New Climate Institute and Climate Action Tracker, called Birol's figure "optimistic" and noted it was based on countries achieving pledges to only emit what can be absorbed — so called net-zero plans — when they haven't yet implemented any actions that would get them there.

Everywhere we go and put on a presentation people are just appalled that it's even happening, but they don't know anything about it until we tell them."

The grassroots organization that began opposing the landfill with signs on fences has gained members, bought billboards, and discussed the pros and cons of the dump at any opportunity.

Pettis First hired environmental lawyer Steve Jeffery, drafted an ordinance and presented it to the Pettis County Commission in an effort to give Pettis County means to resist the landfill, but progress in refining the draft ordinance has been frustratingly slow, Jeffery said.

"They were told last June that they had the authority by (Pettis County Attorney) Phillip Sawyer to write a waste management ordinance," Jeffery said. "They still haven't done it and it would look to me that if they were really wanting to do it, they would have."

Jeffery points to the Missouri law which seems to give the ability to pass

ordinances on handling solid waste to county government:

"Any city or county may adopt ordinances or orders, rules, regulations, or standards for the storage, collection, transportation, processing, or disposal of solid wastes which shall be in conformity with the rules and regulations adopted by the department for solid waste management systems. Nothing in sections 260.200 to 260.245 shall usurp the legal right of a city or county from adopting and enforcing local ordinances, rules, regulations, or standards for the storage, collection, transportation, processing, or disposal of solid wastes equal to or more stringent than the rules or regulations adopted by the department pursuant to sections 260.200 to 260.245."

The Pettis County Development Company, the developers of the proposed 95-acre landfill, were contacted by the Democrat for comment but did not respond by press time.

Phyllis Hitaffer lives next to the proposed dump and attended Thursday's meeting to join the effort to stop the influx of trash into Pettis County.

"I think maybe there's a lot they're not telling

us," Hitaffer said. "A lot that we have been thinking on our own that could possibly happen, where it's located. There's a lot of different things that they could do, for instance, the railroad, they could transport things."

Mark Edwards addressed the auditorium and spelled out the intent of the meeting.

"I want to make sure Pettis County has a voice in how big a project comes in," Mark Edwards said. "We need landfills here in the United States, but my concern right now is that it's overkill. You're trafficking in trash from about 11 different counties."

Edwards pointed out that the proposed 95-acre landfill could easily be expanded to over 600 acres with no way to stop it once the Missouri Department of Natural Resources gives the initial permit.

"What we do now," Edwards said. "It will be 10 years before you see it fully impact us. But our kids and our grandkids, they're going to live with it. They're going to live with Mt. Sedalia, they're going to live with Mt. Dresden, they're going to live with Mt. La Monte."

Biden administration sues Texas over new voting restrictions

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — The Biden administration on Thursday sued Texas over new election laws that outlasted a summer of dramatic protests by Democrats, who remain unable in Congress to pass legislation they say is needed to counteract a year of Republicans adding restrictive voting measures nationwide.

The lawsuit does not go after the entirety of a sweeping bill signed in September by Republican Gov. Greg Abbott in Texas, which already has some of the nation's toughest voting rules. Instead, the challenge filed in a San Antonio federal court targets provisions surrounding mail-in voting requirements and voter assistance, which the Justice Department argues violate federal civil rights protections.

It now puts two of the Texas GOP's biggest conservative victories this year in court against the federal government, as the Justice Department is simultaneously trying to stop a new Texas law that has banned most abortions since September.

"Our democracy depends on the right of eligible voters to cast a ballot and to have that ballot counted," Attorney General Merrick Garland said. "The Justice Department will continue to use all the authorities at its disposal to protect this fundamental pillar of our society."

Georgia's new voting laws also drew a lawsuit this summer from the

Biden administration, which is under pressure from the Democratic base to take greater action on voting rights, a top priority for the party ahead of the 2022 midterm elections. But time is running out and Senate Republicans have repeatedly blocked federal legislation to change election laws, including another attempt Wednesday.

Opponents of the Texas law known as Senate Bill 1 had already sued the state, accusing Republicans of setting out to disenfranchise minorities and other Democratic-leaning voters. The bill specifically targets Democratic strongholds, and was followed by Abbott weeks later signing new voting maps that fortify the GOP's slipping dominance amid the state's explosive growth.

Abbott and other Texas Republicans say the changes provide safeguards against voter fraud, which is rare.

"Biden is coming after Texas for SB1, our recently enacted election integrity law," Republican Texas Attorney General Ken Paxton tweeted. "It's a great and a much-needed bill. Ensuring Texas has safe, secure, and transparent elections is a top priority of mine. I will see you in court, Biden!"

Under the new Texas law, people assisting voters who need help completing their ballot must take a longer oath that now includes acknowledging a penalty of perjury. It also removes old language about answering voters' questions, which opponents say will harm voters

with disabilities. Mail-in ballots must also now include a driver's license number or the last four digits of a Social Security number, which the Justice Department says raises the chances of ballots being wrongly rejected and excluding some eligible voters.

The law also bans 24-hour polling locations and drive-thru voting, which are not contested in the Justice Department's lawsuit.

The legislation in Texas set off a summer of walkouts by Democrats, for which Republicans threatened them with arrest, and Abbott vetoed the paychecks of thousands of rank-and-file staffers when the bill failed to reach him sooner. At one point, more than 50 Democratic lawmakers decamped to Washington, bringing the Texas Capitol to a grinding halt for 38 days.

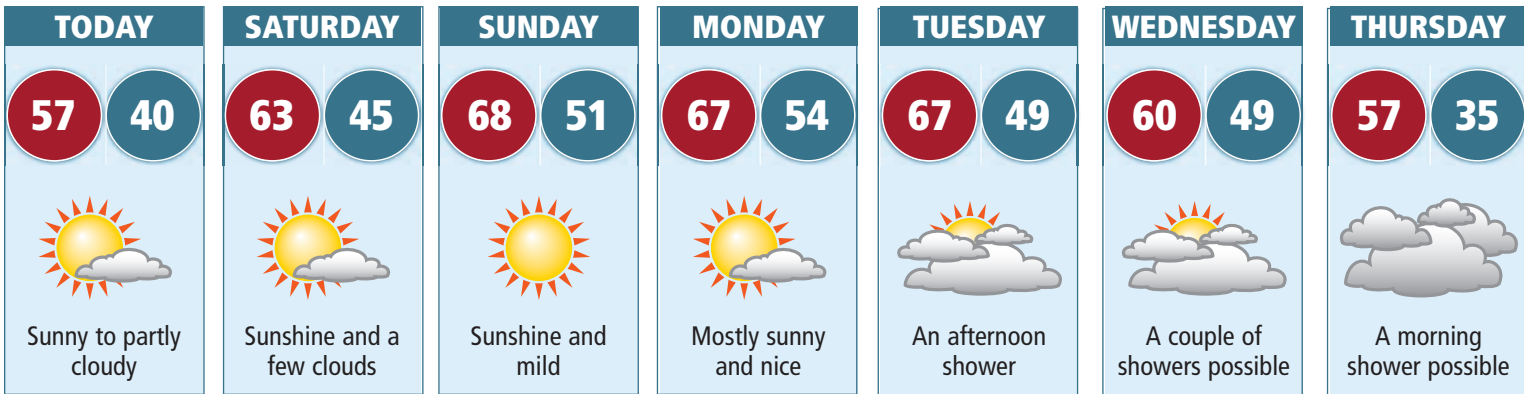
Texas Democrats had hoped the gambit would pressure Congress into passing new voting rights protections at the federal level, but those efforts have repeatedly stalled. GOP senators oppose the Democratic voting bills as a "power grab."

Texas is among at least 18 states that have enacted new voting restrictions since the 2020 election, according to the Brennan Center for Justice. The laws are part of a national GOP campaign, including in Florida, Georgia and Arizona, to tighten voting laws in the name of security, partly driven by former President Donald Trump's false claims that the election was stolen.

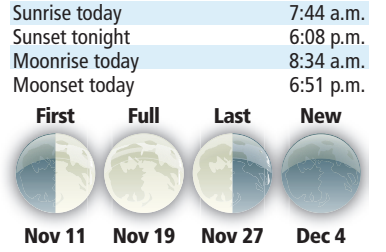

SEVEN-DAY FORECAST



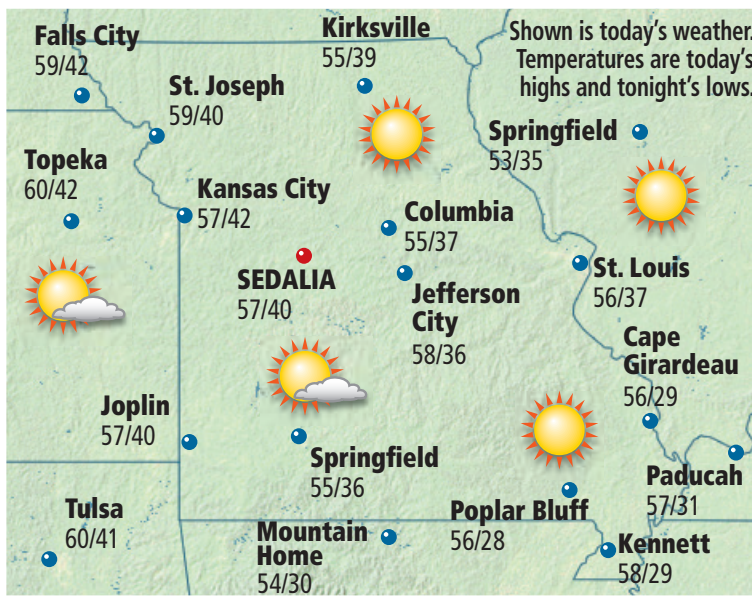

Smithton district champs again with Knob Noster win

Smithton now has a shiny plaque to go alongside its record this season.

The Tigers remained undefeated and secured their place as back-to-back district champions with Thursday night's 2-0 victory over Knob Noster.

Both sides met twice in September, and though Smithton won both times, including 6-0 at its own tournament, early goals were a theme.

"It's funny, because the first time when we played them we scored within like a minute-and-a-half and kept scoring, and when we went to their place, they scored in 30-some-odd seconds," Smithton head coach Sean Hutchinson said.

That theme continued

with the stakes raised. Tigers senior Derick Shull approached from a narrow angle and finished at the near post, then banged in a header from a corner kick for the game's only goals inside the first 10 minutes.

Added Shull, "We knew coming out they were going to be pumped just like everyone else was in a championship game. Once we score early, it helps boost us and gives us that head start to a win."

Conversely, going down a pair of goals early always alters a

team's schematic, as it did for the Panthers.

"It did, and we knew they were going to try and get us early, being 22-0 and the No. 1 seed," Knob Noster head coach Mike Baker said. "But I thought after that we played even with them. Our goal was to stop [Braedon Cairer] and I thought we did a good job with him, but size on the corner got us."

To their credit, the Panthers grew into the game regardless of the deficit and remained poised for the rest of the first half. Afterward, Knob freshman Giovanni Talavera and Shull each had chances to add to the score in the first 10 minutes of the second half, with Shull's header from a corner directed downward into the goalie's hands.

Chiefs hoping Ingram can provide spark to sluggish pass rush

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — The Kansas City Chiefs had seen enough of Melvin Ingram dragging down their quarterbacks over the years that it made sense to chase the three-time Pro Bowl defensive end when he became a free agent last offseason.

They didn't manage to land him then — Ingram ultimately chose to sign with Pittsburgh.

They finally got him in a trade on Tuesday.

The Chiefs shipped a late-round draft pick to the Steelers for a one-year rental, though it's possible if things work out that Ingram could sign an extension or new contract in Kansas City.

But more pressingly, the longtime Chargers pass rusher will be counted upon to instantly upgrade a defensive front that has struggled to do much of anything

right this season.

Even after three sacks against the Giants on Monday night, the Chiefs have just 11 to rank in the league's bottom three.

"First off, I'm glad he's on my team. We play the Steelers later in the year and I'm glad to have him on our side," said Chiefs quarterback Patrick Mahomes, who's been

sacked a couple of times by Ingram during his short NFL career.

In fact, Ingram has 8 1/2 sacks in 15 games against Kansas City.

Missouri's Drinkwitz likes challenge against No. 1 Georgia

ATHENS, Ga. (AP) — Missouri coach Eliah Drinkwitz is preparing to bring the nation's worst rushing defense and an uncertain situation at quarterback against unbeaten Georgia, the nation's top-ranked team led by the game's stingiest scoring defense.

He can hardly wait. "I'm excited ... I love it," Drinkwitz said Tuesday as he prepared for Saturday's visit to Georgia (8-0, 6-0 Southeastern Conference).

Missouri (4-4, 1-3) is coming off last week's 37-28 win over Vanderbilt. The victory did little to impress the oddsmakers. Georgia is favored by 39 1/2 points, according to FanDuel Sportsbook.

Drinkwitz isn't put off by the lack of faith in his Tigers' chances. All he sees is an opportunity.

"Obviously as a head coach I've never gone against the No. 1 team in the country before, so that's a pretty exciting opportunity," Drinkwitz said. "... Are you kidding me? That's what you do it for."

Why else would you do it? I don't want to live life in the shadows."

Georgia continues to lead the AP Top 25 poll and this week also topped the first College Football Playoff ranking.

The game matches Georgia's defense, which ranks second in the nation against the run, against Missouri's Tyler Badie, who leads the SEC and ranks fourth in the nation in rushing.

Badie is crucial to offset the Tigers' weak rushing defense. Missouri ranks last in the nation with its average of 283 yards rushing allowed. Georgia allows 75.6 yards per game on the ground.

Badie has three games with more than 200 yards rushing this season, including 254 yards against Vanderbilt. He also had nine catches for 40 yards last week.

BIGGER GOALS

The Bulldogs beat Florida 34-7 last week and barely celebrated winning the SEC East and clinching a spot in the SEC championship game.

AP source: Browns excuse Beckham for 2nd straight day

BEREA, Ohio (AP) — Odell Beckham Jr. remains lined up outside — way outside.

The polarizing wide receiver was excused from practice for the second straight day on Thursday as the Cleveland Browns figure out their next move with him, a person familiar with the situation told The Associated Press on Thursday.

The team hasn't reached a conclusion yet on what to do with Beckham, according to the person who spoke to the AP on condition of anonymity because of the sensitivity of the situation.

Beckham has likely

played his last game in Cleveland, his exit hastened by his father sharing a video on social media criticizing quarterback Baker Mayfield for not throwing the ball to the three-time Pro Bowler.

Beckham's silence on the matter underscores his divide with the Browns.

And while the team's front office works toward a solution, some players expressed a willingness to bring Beckham back.

"Hopefully we can get him back if that's possible," said safety John Johnson III. "I feel like the majority of this locker room would love to have him in this building. Flat out."

Pulisic returns, Dest out, Scally called up for US-Mexico

CHICAGO (AP) — Christian Pulisic is back but not fully fit, Sergiño Dest is out and Joe Scally was called up for a possible debut.

Gio Reyna remains sidelined, while John Brooks and Tim Ream were bypassed.

As World Cup qualifying nears the halfway point, the U.S. will have a close to a full-strength roster available against Mexico on Nov. 12 at Cincinnati and at Jamaica four days later.

"It's always a combination of what they've done in the past for us and what they've been doing with their teams," U.S. coach Gregg Berhalter said Thursday. "It's not an exact science."

The U.S. has 11 points, three behind Mexico, after six of 14 games. The top three of eight teams qualifies from North and Central America and the Caribbean, and No. 4 advances to a playoff.

Berhalter has used 33 players — five more than in the 10 matches of the 2018 hexagonal — giving starts to 29. Unlike the September and October windows that had three matches in seven days, there are two games in five days.

"It should be reasonable that if we're happy with the performance of players in the first game, that they can continue on and play the second game," Berhalter said.

Pulisic injured his left ankle during the 4-1 win at Honduras on Sept. 8 and returned only Tuesday for the final 17 minutes of Chel-

sea's Champions League match at Malmö.

"It's luxury to be able to bring a guy like Christian into camp," Berhalter said. "Even knowing he's not 90 minutes fit, to have him be able to make an impact in whichever we chose is going to be helpful."

Dest has lower back pain, Barcelona said Thursday.

Reyna remains sidelined by a right hamstring injury sustained Sept. 2 at El Salvador, and forward Gyasi Zardes is out after spraining his left knee with Columbus against Nashville on Oct. 20.

Players will average 23 years, 363 days when training starts Monday.

Scally, an 18-year-old defender from Lake Grove, New York, has started all 10 Bundesliga matches this season for Borussia Mönchengladbach. He was the lone first-time callup on the 25-man roster.

Scally played in five Bundesliga games since he was overlooked last month, including a 5-0 win over Bayern Munich. Berhalter praised Scally's play against Leroy Sané and Alphonso Davies.

"He's being tested and he stood up to those tests," Berhalter said. "We wanted to see him before consistently at a high level, and he's done that."

Defenders Sam Vines of Antwerp and Reggie Cannon of Boavista were picked for the first time since the CONCACAF Gold Cup. Vines returned on Oct. 21 from a broken collarbone that had sidelined him since August and Cannon returned on Oct. 30 from an ankle injury that had

sidelined him since the Gold Cup final.

Usually reticent to announce lineup selections in advance, Berhalter envisioned forward Ricardo Pepi "will play a large portion of these two games" and said midfielder Gianluca Busio "will definitely be pushing for a starting position" after gaining a regular role at Venezia following a transfer from Kansas City.

"He's handled it better than just about anyone I've seen," Berhalter said.

Midfielders Tyler Adams and Weston McKennie carry yellow cards along with right back DeAndre Yedlin, causing Berhalter to pick backups in case of suspension.

Brooks was bypassed but Berhalter expects to pick him at some point.

"A lot of it was based on how we felt his performance was with the team the last time," Berhalter said. "He's working his way back into form."

Defenders George Bello and Shaq Moore were dropped, along with midfielder Luca de La Torre and forward Matthew Hoppe. Ream had dropped out of October camp for family reasons.

Forwards Daryl Dike and Jordan Pefok were bypassed in favor of Jesús Ferreira, a 20-year-old Dallas forward selected for the first time since scoring his first two international goals in January exhibition against Trinidad and Tobago.

"I think he will have a role to play with the national team in the future, but it's just not exactly what

we needed to be right now," Berhalter said of Dike. The coach described Pefok as a "stationary type" of forward and said the two matches required more running.

Midfielder Yunus Musah was picked despite playing just 47 minutes in two substitute appearances with Valencia since the last international break.

Looking back at his rotation in last month's 1-0 loss at Panama, Berhalter admitted "maybe we made wrong lineup choices based on the form of guys."

"We haven't proven anything yet, all we have done is secure a spot in the SEC championship, which is not what we want to do," said Georgia wide receiver Jaylen Johnson. "We want more than that."

QB QUESTIONS

Each team has an uncertain quarterback situation.

Georgia has won five consecutive games behind backup Stetson Bennett, who took over when starter JT Daniels was unable to play due to a lat injury. Coach Kirby Smart said this week Bennett's mobility "is a separator" before adding "there's things that JT is better at

than Stetson."

Daniels, whose edge is his arm strength, may be close to returning.

Missouri starter Connor Bazalak left last week's game with what Drinkwitz called a "soft tissue" injury. If Bazalak can't play, Tyler Macon or Brady Cook or perhaps both would fill in.

"We're going to play the best person who gives us the chance to win the game," Drinkwitz said. "So if we felt like multiple quarterbacks gave us a better chance to win the game then we would do that. Up until this point that hasn't been the case."

RANKING GEORGIA'S DEFENSE

Drinkwitz said the Bulldogs' defense, which leads the nation while allowing 6.6 points per game, can be compared with the best

he has seen. He used the defenses of Clemson in 2017-18 and Alabama in 2010-11 as the units to be measured against.

"These guys are right there," he said of the Bulldogs' defense. "They've got some really good players. Can really affect the quarterback."

The defense is led by linemen Jordan Davis, Travon Walker and Devonte Wyatt and linebackers Nakobe Dean, Adam Anderson and Nolan Smith.

"I got a lot of worries. I got to figure out how to block Jordan Davis and multiple other guys on that defensive front," Drinkwitz said.

HONORING RICHT

Former Georgia coach Mark Richt will be honored at halftime. The Bulldogs won 2002 and 2005

SEC championships, and played in three other SEC title games, in Richt's 15 seasons. He posted a 145-51 record from 2002-16 and ranks 10th all-time in wins among SEC coaches.

Smart coached running backs while serving on Richt's staff in 2005.

"I learned a lot about being the right kind of person and how to run an organization the right way, and it's meant a lot to my career," Smart said.

Richt announced this summer he has been diagnosed with Parkinson's disease.

It can still be considered a successful season for Knob (8-14) after winning the first postseason game in program history Tuesday night thanks to junior Carlos Betancourt's overtime goal.

"This is a process, and we kind of fast-forwarded the process by getting to this game this year," Baker said. Report: Suns owner Sarver has history of racism, misogyny

PHOENIX (AP) — The Phoenix Suns have strongly denied a report published Thursday that says owner Robert Sarver has a history of racist, misogynistic and hostile incidents during his 17-year tenure in charge of the franchise.

ESPN said it talked to dozens of current and former team employees for the story, including some who detailed inappropriate behavior by Sarver. Most of the allegations are from anonymous sources but a few are on the record.

In ESPN's report, Sarver denied or disputed most of the allegations through his legal team.

"I would entirely welcome an impartial NBA investigation

which may prove our only outlet for clearing my name and the reputation of an organization of which I'm so very proud," Sarver said in a new statement issued through the team Thursday.

Among the allegations: Former Suns coach Earl Watson said Sarver was upset that Golden State forward Draymond Green used the N-word during a game in 2016 and that the owner repeated the N-word several times when voicing his displeasure. Watson said he told Sarver that he can't use that word.

Watson was the Suns' coach for all or part of three seasons before being fired three games into the 2017-18 season.

Sarver said in his statement that Watson

was "clearly not a credible source."

"While there is so much that is inaccurate and misleading in this story that I hardly know where to begin, let me be clear: The n-word is not part of my vocabulary," Sarver said. "I have never called anyone or any group of people the n-word, or referred to anyone or any group of people by that word, either verbally or in writing. I don't use that word."

The report also details a story about how Sarver passed around a picture of his wife in a Suns bikini to employees. The report says more than a dozen employees also said Sarver had a history of "making lewd comments in all-staff meetings."

In ESPN's story,

league spokesman Mike Bass says the NBA has not "received a complaint of misconduct at the Suns organization through any of our processes, including our confidential workplace misconduct hotline or other correspondence."

Sarver has owned the Suns since 2004. The 59-year-old Phoenix businessman also owns the WNBA's Phoenix Mercury.

The Suns are coming off one of the most successful seasons in their history, making the NBA Finals with stars Devin Booker, Chris Paul and Deandre Ayton before losing in six games to the Milwaukee Bucks. The Suns have made the Finals three times, in 1976, 1993 and 2021, but have never won a championship.

College Football Playoff expansion talks to continue Dec. 1

DALLAS (AP) — The administrators in charge of the College Football Playoff plan to meet again on Dec. 1 to continue expansion talks, which need to reach a consensus by the end of the year if a new postseason format is to be implemented for the 2024 season.

Executive Director Bill Hancock released a statement Thursday after two days of meetings in Dallas with the CFP management committee that he called "productive."

"The support for

expansion is evident, but there are several crucial details that remain under discussion," Hancock said.

The most crucial detail facing the management committee, comprised of 10 conference commissioners and Notre Dame's athletic, is how big should the expansion from the current four-team format be?

A 12-team format was unveiled in June and there was hope it would be approved in September for for implementation before the end of the current 12-year contract with ESPN that runs through the 2025 season.

Instead, the process has bogged down since it was revealed in July the Southeastern Conference planned to add Big 12 flagship schools Texas and Oklahoma by 2025.

SEC Commissioner Greg Sankey was part of the four-person group — along with Big 12 Commissioner Bob Bowlsby, Mountain West Commissioner Craig Thompson and Notre Dame athletic director Jack Swarbrick — that worked on the 12-team plan.

Sankey's involvement in both CFP expansion and conference realignment caused relatively new conference commissioners in Atlantic Coast

Conference, Big Ten and Pac-12 to become more skeptical of the process and push to revisit the possibility of expanding to eight instead of 12.

There are obstacles to eight that would make it difficult to ever pass and plenty of details to work through even if the commissioners do coalesce around 12.

Hancock said after the last meeting in late September that if the management committee can not reach a consensus on an expansion plan by January, expansion would be put on hold and the four-team format would remain in place through the length of the ESPN contract.

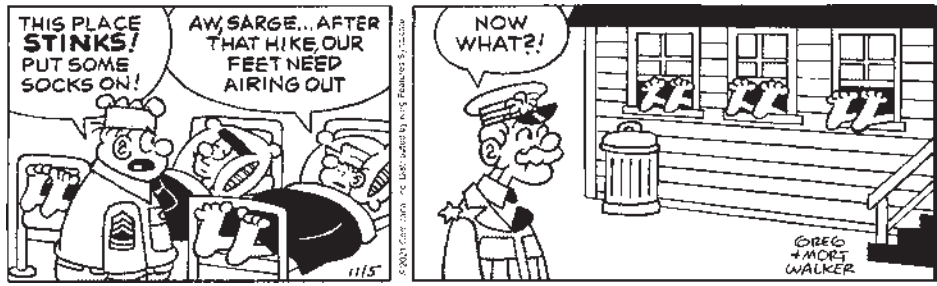

"He's smart. He's a vet. He's crafty how he does things," Mahomes said. "He has all the moves and he's very good against the pass, but he's also very good against the run as well."

Good thing. Truth be told, the Chiefs defense needs help with just about everything.

Nobody expects the 32-year-old Ingram to be the devastating force he was early in his career, but he did show signs early this season that he could still get the job done. He had his lone sack along with three quarterback hits against the Raiders, and he started and played every

defensive snap against the Bengals, before his playing time slowly diminished.

That led him to ask for a trade. The Steelers, content with their other young pass rushes, ultimately obliged.

The timing worked out well for the Chiefs, who are starting to realize their experiment moving perennial Pro Bowl defensive tackle Chris Jones to the edge hasn't been working out quite as well as they hoped. Jones has been his usual force when he's lined up over the center, but he doesn't have the same dynamic impact when he kicks outside.

Then there's defensive end Frank Clark, one of the highest-paid defensive players in the league, who acknowledged last week that off-the-field issues have been weighing on his mind. But he finally began

to show some impact against the Giants with his first sack of the season to wrap up Monday night's come-from-behind win.

Throw in the fact that Jones has missed two games with injuries, and Clark has missed three, and it made sense that Chiefs general manager Brett Veach would be working the phones at the trade deadline for some pass-rushing help.

"I was excited, man. I've watched him from afar — we're both SEC guys — and I've always like the way he plays the game," Chiefs safety Tyrann Mathieu said. "I think the talent speaks for itself. I'm more excited for his leadership and what he's going to provide on that front. The guys up front have another guy they can utilize and rely on."

Chiefs coach Andy Reid said he didn't plan on putting Ingram in a "bad situation" by forcing him onto the field before he's ready, but picking up the defensive playbook isn't quite the same animal as an offensive one. So even though Ingram only arrived in Kansas City on Wednesday, there's a chance he could be on the field against Green Bay on Sunday.

"He's very smart. We've competed against him a number of times and watched him play," Reid said. "He's getting older, he's moved around a bit, but we brought him up in the offseason and we felt like he'd be a nice addition to the room. We were able to get him this time. It gives you another player that can rush the passer."

"I guess the leaders in this building feel like we can do it without him. Some guys might have a different opinion. So moving forward, hopefully we can get him back somehow. But if not, we've got to keep it going. We've got a big game coming up, another division game, that's what my mindset is, just get ready for this week."

Browns left guard Joel Bitonio, one of the team's most respected players and leaders, said there is confusion over Beckham's status.

"Yeah, it's hard because we don't know what the situation is," he said. "We think he's

a great player when he's on the field, but we don't know what the situation is. We don't know what's really going on.

"We probably know as much as you guys know from outside the building. But if he wants to come back and be part of the team, I'm sure we'd welcome him with open arms."

Cleveland could waive Beckham if it doesn't see a reconciliation, which seems like a long shot at this point.

Beckham turns 29 on Friday. He's making \$15.75 million this season, and the Browns would have to pay him more than half of that if he was waived and not claimed by another team.

Beckham is under contract for two more seasons, but doesn't have any guaranteed

money on his contract after this year.

Amid a major distraction, the Browns (4-4), who have fallen into last place in the AFC North, visit the Cincinnati Bengals (5-3) on Sunday and can't afford many more losses if they hope to make the playoffs.

Browns coach Kevin Stefanski doesn't speak to reporters on Thursday, but his coordinators were all available and said he's handling the circumstances with aplomb.

"Kevin has done a nice job as a leader of the coaching staff and of our football team," said special teams coordinator Mike Priefer. "The guys in the locker room, we have a bunch of professional football players who really know what their job is and what the task at hand for the

Cleveland Browns this week against the Cincinnati Bengals, a very, very good football team on the road.

"That is where our concern is."

One of Beckham's closest friends, Browns wide receiver Jarvis Landry, normally speaks with reporters on Thursday but did not hold a session.

Beckham's stormy tenure in Cleveland appears to be coming to an end after a disruptive few days.

On Tuesday, Odell Beckham Sr. shared an 11-minute video highlighting plays in which his son was open and Mayfield either missed him or ignored him completely.

The Browns told Beckham not to report to practice Wednesday and afterward Mayfield said he had not spoken to his teammate. Mayfield said he was caught off guard by the personal attack, which came a few hours before the NFL trade deadline.

"I've had conversations with his dad before, man to man, face to face," Mayfield said. "I was pretty surprised by the video and the intentions and the feelings behind it. I'd be lying if I said otherwise. But hurt? Nah, I'm good. I'll be all right."

Mayfield is caught in the middle of a potentially divisive situation with players picking sides.

"I don't get that vibe," Johnson said. "I just feel like as a competitor, as a player, you want to see your guys have success, you want to see your guys do as well as they can and when that doesn't happen, you obviously feel a certain type of way, but I don't think it's dividing the team any type of way."

Stefanski also said he had not heard from Beckham, who hasn't produced as expected since coming to the Browns in a 2019 trade from the New York Giants.

Beckham has had only two 100-yard games in 2 1/2 seasons with Cleveland. When he was hurt and sidelined last year with a knee injury, Mayfield played his best, the Browns ended their playoff drought and won in the playoffs for the first time since 1994.

On Sunday, Mayfield threw just two passes toward Beckham and that seemed to be a tipping point for the 28-year-old.

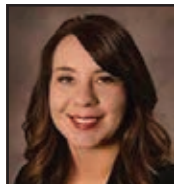

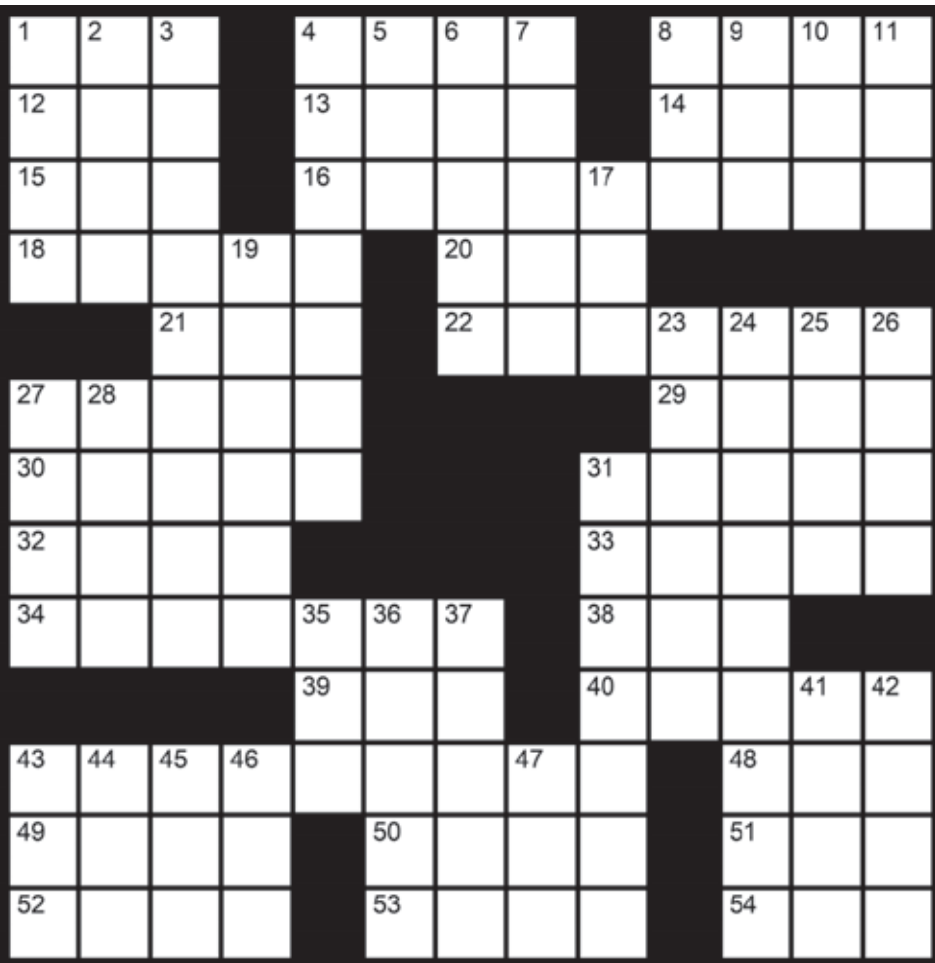

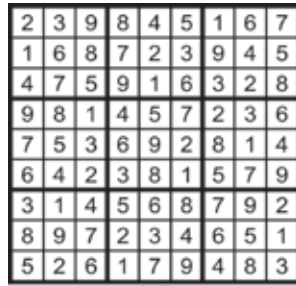
