Whiteman Air Force Base bomb squad destroys with C4

A Facebook post by Pettis County Sheriff Brad Anders late Wednesday evening may leave Sedalia residents with more questions than answers.

Anders' Facebook post read, "Information on the event on Mimosa: A resident discovered a believed to be live grenade that was in a relative's home.

Deputies responded and contacted Whiteman Air Force Base who sent out a group of extremely professional, very knowledgeable specialists. The grenade was moved to a safe place near Walnut Hills Golf Course after a decision was made not to drive it through town to another location to detonate it.

C4 was buried with the grenade and the blast was likely heard along Y Highway corridor between

Country Club Estates and Hunter's Ridge. The grenade is no more, and I apologize for startling anyone. Everyone is safe and uninjured. A very special thank you to the United States Air Force that protects not only abroad, but right here in Pettis County. Thank you to Pettis County ambulance district and our team at Pettis County Fire for standing by with us through this three hour event."

Thursday afternoon Anders provided the Democrat with more details on Wednesday evening's bizarre event.

"It came from one of my deputies that he had been contacted by a resident who had located a grenade from her father-in-law's residence as they were cleaning it out, he had passed away," Anders said.

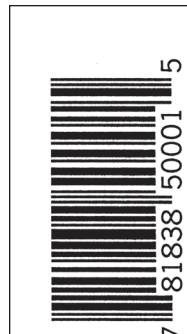

Missouri Veteran Cemeteries to host Wreath Laying Ceremonies

The Missouri Veterans Commission will host Wreaths Across America, a holiday wreath-laying ceremony, to honor and remember the nation's veterans at 11 a.m. Saturday, Dec. 18 at each of the five Missouri Veteran cemeteries. In all, volunteers will place a total of 14,000 wreaths on headstones and in front of the columbarium walls. The Missouri Veterans Commission has partnered with Wreaths Across America since 2009.

Wreaths Across America started in 1992 when the Worcester Wreath Company began donating wreaths to be placed at the headstones in Arlington National Cemetery. Building on this tradition, in 2006, the company began donating seven ceremonial wreaths to each state and national Veterans cemetery in the country. Today, many individuals and organizations host campaigns to purchase additional wreaths to

SHS yearbook staff receives national award

The Sacred Heart yearbook staff for the 2020-21 school year received national recognition as a recipient of the Jostens National Yearbook Program of Excellence Award at the silver level.

To be considered for the award, the yearbook staff has to meet specific criteria in the areas of creating an inclusive yearbook, generating school engagement, successfully managing the creation process, and completing the yearbook on deadline. Over 17,000 schools nationwide partner with Jostens to publish a yearbook.

Sacred Heart's student yearbook staff, under the direction of faculty member Nikki Howell, was among the 2% of schools nationwide to receive the award. This was Howell's fourth year teaching yearbook and the second year to receive the Jostens National Yearbook Program of Excellence Award.

"There's a lot of pressure that can come with creating a keepsake for our student body," said Howell. "Typically, as years away from school increase, so does the appreciation for the memories and moments captured in a yearbook. I'm proud of our team and I'm excited to see their hard work recognized on a national level."

Howell said meeting the criteria to receive this award is challenging under any circumstance, but the pandemic posed some unique obstacles.

"Certain school events were either canceled or virtual, and photographing students in face masks isn't ideal," said Howell. "We had to get creative in how to capture student life

and fill pages that our school family could be proud of."

Despite the challenges, Howell said the yearbook team still set out to create a book that would connect with every student. The yearbook includes photos and quotes from every student that more than triples the industry average for yearbooks.

"It's not an easy task,

but we're able to make sure everyone is featured because we know everyone and have a sense of what they're doing and where to find them in their photo-worthy moments," said Howell. "It's that kind of personalization that really comes through in our books."

Howell said yearbook sales falling just shy of 70% was the difference between the team's silver

and gold, which is the highest honor for a Jostens-produced yearbook. Plans are already in the works to increase sales.

"Yearbooks last forever but Snapchats don't," said Howell. "A gold award would be nice, but the bigger reward is having a student body who is excited to own a one-of-a-kind history book."

At least 5 dead as Midwest rocked by hurricane-force winds

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — At least five people died as a powerful and extremely unusual storm system swept across the Great Plains and Midwest amid unseasonably warm temperatures, spawning hurricane-force winds and possible tornadoes in Nebraska, Iowa, and Minnesota.

In southeastern Minnesota, Olmsted County Sheriff's Lt. Lee Rossman said a 65-year-old man was killed Wednesday night when a 40-foot tree blew onto him outside his home. In southwestern Kansas, blinding dust kicked up by the storms Wednesday led to two separate crashes that killed three people, Kansas Highway Patrol trooper Mike Racy said. And in eastern Iowa, a semitrailer was struck by high winds and rolled onto its side Wednesday evening, killing the driver, the Iowa State Patrol confirmed.

The storm shifted north of the Great Lakes into Canada on Thursday, with high winds, snow and hazardous conditions continuing in the upper Great Lakes region, the National Weather Service said. More than 400,000 homes and businesses were without electricity in Michigan, Wisconsin, Iowa, and Kansas, according to poweroutage.us, which tracks utility reports.

A tornado was reported in southern Minnesota on

Wednesday and, if confirmed, would be the state's first on record in December. The small community of Hartland, Minnesota, might have been the hardest hit, with a reported 35 to 40 homes sustaining minor damage and a few businesses severely damaged, county Emergency Management Director Rich Hall said.

The destructive weather system developed amid unprecedented warmth for December in the Plains and northern states. That included temperatures that rose to 70 degrees Fahrenheit (21 degrees Celsius) across southwestern Wisconsin on Wednesday evening. The Weather Company historian Chris Burt compared the heat to that of a "warm July evening."

"I can say with some confidence that this event (the heat and tornadoes) is among the most (if not THE most) anomalous weather event ever on record for the Upper Midwest," Burt wrote in a Facebook post.

The winds knocked down trees, tree limbs and nearly 150 power lines in northern and western Michigan's Lower Peninsula. In the western Michigan village of Fruitport, high winds peeled back a portion of Edgewood Elementary School's roof, leading officials to close all district schools Thursday.

There were more than 20 tornado reports Wednesday in the Plains states, scattered mostly through eastern Nebraska and Iowa, based on preliminary reports to the Storm Prediction Center. The storm system led to the most reports of hurricane-force wind gusts — 75 mph (120 kph) or higher — on any day in the U.S. since 2004, the center said.

"To have this number of damaging windstorms at one time would be unusual any time of year," said Brian Barjenbruch, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service in Valley, Nebraska. "But to have this happen in December is really abnormal."

The governors of Kansas and Iowa declared states of emergency.

The system came on the heels of devastating tornadoes last weekend that cut a path through states including Arkansas, Missouri, Tennessee, Illinois, and Kentucky, killing more than 85 people.

On Wednesday, there were at least 59 reports of hurricane-force wind gusts regionwide, which exceeded the 53 recorded on Aug. 10, 2020, when a rare derecho wind-storm struck Iowa, the Storm Prediction Center said. The destruction on Wednesday, however, was far less severe than from last year's derecho, which caused billions of dollars

in damage.

The winds also whipped up dust that reduced visibility to zero in parts of Kansas and caused at least four semitrailers to blow over, leading officials to temporarily close much of Interstate 70, as well as all state highways in nine northwestern Kansas counties.

Kansas deployed helicopters and other firefighting equipment to help smother at least a dozen wind fueled wildfires in western and central counties, officials said Thursday.

That dust and smoke was carried north by the storm and concentrated over parts of Kansas, Nebraska, and Iowa, causing a dramatic drop in air quality in those areas late Wednesday. That spawned a glut of calls to already-taxed emergency dispatchers from people reporting the smell of smoke.

The system blue into the plains from Colorado, sending gale-force winds across a swath from New Mexico to Minnesota, Wisconsin, and upper Michigan. The weather service recorded a gust of 107 mph (172 kph) Wednesday morning at Lamar, Colorado, and gusts of 100 mph in Russell, Kansas.

What the baby in the manger didn't do

Apart from school, she could only attend their church, West Bowles Community Church in Littleton, Colorado. Cassie reluctantly went on a weekend youth retreat that changed her life. Her dad said she went away as a gloomy, troubled teen and came back transformed by the power of Jesus Christ. She discovered the joy of salvation that she carried to her early grave. Her transformation can be summarized by the words she shared on a video just two days before her death. She said, "You really can't live without Christ. It's like, impossible to really have a really true life without him." Just two years earlier, Cassie Bernell was in a very similar situation to Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold, but Jesus Christ changed all of that.

How is Jesus destroying evil? He is destroying evil one life at a time!

Because of Jesus' birth, death and resurrection there will be a day with no more suffering for those who call Him Lord. "Ronnie has done so much for our community," McCown said. "He and I kind of grew up together, he was a little younger than me, not much. But we spent a lot of time together."

McCown is not new to hosting fundraisers — 10 to 12 years ago he hosted golf tournaments that raised money for the Sedalia Dialysis Clinic. He said the first guy that he called was "Ronnie."

"We had to get sponsorships to make it pay off," he said. "(Ditzfeld) said, what do you need Larry? Just send me a bill and I'll have Shirley send you a check."

McCown added his wife Shirley worked for Ditzfeld and often took care of personal things for him.

"You wouldn't believe the amount of money he gave to people for hospital bills,

that people don't even know about," he continued. "Rent, utilities — I mean he did so much for our community."

He added the July race was hosted to memorialize Ditzfeld.

"We had an auction the night before and people and businesses all donated," he explained. "I just wanted to do something special for him because he was special to me and so many people in our community."

McCown said for about 20 years he hosted large fundraising dinners at his business, located on South Hancock Avenue. The dinners brought in 700 to 800 people and Ditzfeld was always there to help.

"We ended up donating money to different organizations," he added. "(Ditzfeld) would come by here, and he'd throw \$500 down there and he'd say, 'here that's to help buy stuff for your dinner.'"

"He always helped us," he continued. "He didn't

have to do that, but he did so much stuff like that for the community. Not only with me, but so many other people ..."

McCown said Ditzfeld was also known for providing buses along with Don Weaver to State Fair Community College and SCHS when they needed to travel for events.

"He never charged them a dime," he added. "Don Weaver and Ronnie owned that bus company (Ditzfeld Weaver Charter Service)."

"They're both great guys," McCown added. "It just broke everybody's heart that knew Ronnie very well (when he died)."

McCown said although it's been a tough time for many in the community the past two years, he is thankful for the strength of the Sedalia community and how everyone works together to help others.

There are great things you can take from business," he continued. "Lessons in customer service and things like that, but if you think about the economics of it in times of downturn your demand for your services is going to be highest and at the same time you have a decrease in tax revenues so the ability to meet those demands is limited, whereas in a business when your demand is at its highest you're making the most money and you can continue to meet that demand because things are happening."

Dawson also sees a difference between private business and public service in the relationship between the servant and the client.

"In the (mayoral) role I think it's important to be a servant leader," Dawson said. "It's not about you, it's about the people you're serving."

The Servant-leader model is different from a traditional leader model where you've got the guy at the top of the pyramid, the leader, and then the employees, and then the customers underneath them," he went on to say. "It's the exact opposite, the guy who's the leader is at the bottom, and you have the employees and then you have the constituents that you serve on top."

Dawson said Sedalia is currently making a lot of the right moves.

"I think we're doing a

lot of things really well like with the Redevelopment Corporation residential 353," Dawson said. "Those are steps in the right direction, but there are always things we can do better. I think communication is something we can do better, transparency, and being open. As far as sidewalks and roads I think we could also do a better job with that stuff and allocate more resources towards that."

Dawson sees Sedalia growing and wants that to continue, but also wants to retain the city's small-town feel.

"I think responsible growth," Dawson said. "You're not going to be able to stifle growth and you can't keep everything the same, but I think you can do it responsibly."

One of the areas in need of responsible growth would be the fire department.

"That's quite an undertaking," Dawson said. "They were talking about two or three new stations and some long-term goals. I think then that's going to be important especially with what you got going on north of town with the rail park, you need to figure out a way to service that and again that goes back to responsible growth while making public safety a priority."

Being the mayor means tending to problems both macro and micro with equal dedication, keeping big and small problems on his to-do list.

"As far as what I've done in my ward, when you get a call it can be stuff that seems really minor but to

that person it's important," Dawson said. "Maybe it's a missed trash pickup or maybe you have an elderly person that needs to get on the list for disabled pickup, or it can be as big as long-term planning like we're talking about with the fire department."

"It is kind of an interesting thing because you're running in both lanes there, stuff that seems small but is important and then really big stuff and being able to do it all."

Dawson realizes one person can't do it all and it's important for those on the City Council and their committee meetings to be active and get things done, for everyone to be functioning at their highest level.

When asked what he thought of Sedalia there was little hesitation.

"Home," Dawson said. "Everywhere has got problems, I don't care where you live, you're going to have some problems but Sedalia is home, I think it's awesome."

"You think about living in the big city, you're dealing with a whole other host of problems but then you're in your car for two hours a day driving back and forth to work and commuting," he continued. "That's miserable, here everything is here right close. You can jump in your car and drive across town in five minutes. You can't beat that in my opinion."

"They were packing up his stuff and came across this grenade and thought they should tell somebody. The resident had it in her hand and there were some children in the house, so the deputy took it from her and placed it outside by a tree and we cordoned off the area and called Explosive Ordnance Disposal, EOD."

Anders contacted the Sedalia Country Club who was gracious enough to allow them to dispose of the grenade in an area to the west of their maintenance building.

"They put it in a blast case from the side of the residence and drove it over there," Anders said. "They placed it in a hole just wearing their normal

combat fatigues, stuck a brick of C4 on it, buried it and charged it."

Inert grenades, which this may or may not have been, may be purchased from military supply stores or on Amazon for around \$15 and may be used as paperweights or decorative items. They appear quite realistic yet, cannot be made live. An abundance of caution is never a bad decision in dealing with found, potentially live, weaponry.

In an unrelated incident on Oct. 25, Flagler County, Florida Sheriff's deputies pulled over a Florida man for expired registration and searched his trunk, finding a grenade in his trunk. The man said he found it while cleaning out a veteran's home. The grenade was x-rayed and found to be live so it was removed and detonated, according to News 6 in Orlando.

Live grenades are considered 'destructive devices' and are illegal under the National Firearms Act (26 U.S.C. § 5801.) and may not be possessed by non-military people.

"It's not unheard of, there are times in the past that we have used Whiteman Air Force Base EOD to come out and get a hand grenade or some kind of an ordinance that was found," Anders said, advising strongly against moving any found firearms or ordnance.

"Contact 911 or call the Sheriff's Office, or the police department and tell them what it is that they have and let us take it from there. Everybody was fantastic, those guys that came from Whiteman were the utmost professionals, it was very neat to watch them."

Police: 3 killed when SUV, firetruck collide in Kansas City

KANSAS CITY, Mo (AP) — Three people were killed when a firetruck collided with a sport utility vehicle, then plowed over a sidewalk and into a building in a Kansas City entertainment district.

Police said the collision happened Wednesday night in the Westport area as the firetruck was headed to an emergency call with its lights flashing and sirens blaring. The impact forced the truck and the SUV over a sidewalk, where a woman was hit. The vehicles came to a stop in a building that had been home to the Riot Room, a bar and music venue that recently closed.

Two of the victims were found soon after the crash in the sport utility vehicle. The pedestrian's body was

found buried in the rubble Thursday, police said.

No firefighters were injured. Police have not released the names of those killed.

Kansas City Fire Chief Donna Lake said in a tweet that the department's "hearts, prayers, and thoughts are with the families, friends and loved ones of everyone involved."

Bankers say the rural economy remains strong in 10 states

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — The economy remains strong in rural parts of 10 Plains and Western states, but some of the bankers surveyed this month said they are worried about how inflation will affect farmers.

The overall index for the region slipped from November's 67.7 reading but the report released Thursday said the

index remained firmly in positive territory at 66.7 for December. Any score above 50 suggests a growing economy, while a score below 50 suggests a shrinking economy.

Creighton University economist Ernie Goss said the region continues to benefit from low interest rates and strong exports. The USDA estimates that agricultural exports are up 23% over last year.

But the persistently high inflation is a concern as land costs and the price of supplies farmers need are expected to keep growing next year.

"Inflation is real and affecting folks in our service area," said Jeff Bonnett, CEO of Havana State Bank in Havana Illinois.

Yet the bank CEOs are optimistic about the next six months. The survey's confidence index rose to 55.2 in December from November's weak 48.4 reading.

Towns in mourning while digging out from deadly tornadoes

DAWSON SPRINGS, Ky. (AP) — Tightknit communities still digging out from the deadly tornadoes that killed dozens of people across eight states in the South and Midwest are turning to another heavy-hearted task: honoring and burying their dead.

The storms that began Friday night destroyed lives and property from Arkansas to Illinois and in parts of neighboring states, carving a more than 200-mile (320-kilometer) path through Kentucky alone. The National Weather Service recorded at least 41 tornadoes, including 16 in Tennessee and eight in Kentucky.

Along the violent storm path, a funeral home in western Kentucky prepared to serve the families of those who lost loved ones while grieving losses of its own.

Beshear Funeral Home in Dawson Springs was preparing for at least four services in coming days for storm victims, while

also catching up with funerals delayed by the massive storm, said funeral homeowner Jenny Beshear Sewell, a second cousin of Kentucky's governor.

The storm related deaths include those of two sisters who had worked at the funeral home, the only one in town.

Eighty-year-old Carole Grisham and 72-year-old Marsha Hall decided to "ride it out" in their home as the tornado barreled down in the dark of night, Sewell said by phone Wednesday. The home, which lacked a basement, was demolished.

Hall, a fixture at the funeral home, had a hard day's work Friday, hours before she died in the storm, Sewell said. As she left work, Hall's parting words were: "Well, I'll see you."

As the tornado approached, Sewell texted Hall with an update on the storm's path and urged the sisters to shelter in the funeral home's basement or a

church basement. Hall replied "OK" — the last communication Sewell received from the long-time employee whom she considered a member of the family.

Arrangements were still pending for Grisham and Hall, but a double funeral is expected, Sewell said.

Meanwhile, the funeral home is also preparing services for other storm victims and for a woman whose funeral was delayed since last Saturday, the day after the storm hit. If the building's natural gas hasn't been restored once services resume, "everybody will just need to bundle up," Sewell said. "That's the best we can do."

Kentucky Gov. Andy Beshear has pledged \$5,000 payments to each of the victims' families to help with burial expenses. The state was the hardest hit, with 74 deaths reported so far.

In the western Kentucky town of Madisonville, family and

friends were mourning a couple killed when the twister ripped through nearby Dawson Springs.

Jeffrey Eckert, 70, was remembered as "mysterious and cool" by his nephew Mike Eckert, who recalled his uncle playing in various bands, always owning a boat and buzzing his home after he'd earned his pilot's license to let the family know it was time to meet him at the airport.

Many of the mourners wore animal prints in honor of Jeffrey Eckert's wife, Jennifer Eckert, 69, who loved to wear them and was remembered by her niece Kathy Moore for her chocolate meringue pies and the love of her grandchildren.

Moore said her grief was tempered by the memories and the relationships Jennifer Eckert left behind.

"When it's all said and done, relationships are all that matters," Moore said. "Life has to end. Love does not."

The grieving, meanwhile, has extended beyond the states hardest hit and into Florida, the home of a father and son killed while staying at a west Tennessee resort.

Steve Gunn and his 12-year-old son Grayson were staying at the Cypress Point Resort, a popular destination for hunters and anglers. They will be buried in Florida this weekend.

"You couldn't go to Walmart with him without a hundred people stopping him," said Steve Gunn's sister, Sandy Gunn. "His son was the kid you grew up dreaming to have."

Sandy Gunn's brother-in-law, Jamie Hall, also was part of the hunting group and remains missing.

"Our world has been shattered," she said. "I'm terrified each time I hear the phone ring. My brother-in-law was the kindest and most gentle man you would have ever known."

"So being able to show off what we have right now and use it as a jump forward going into next semester which is really a lot busier semester for the choirs," Hesterman said.

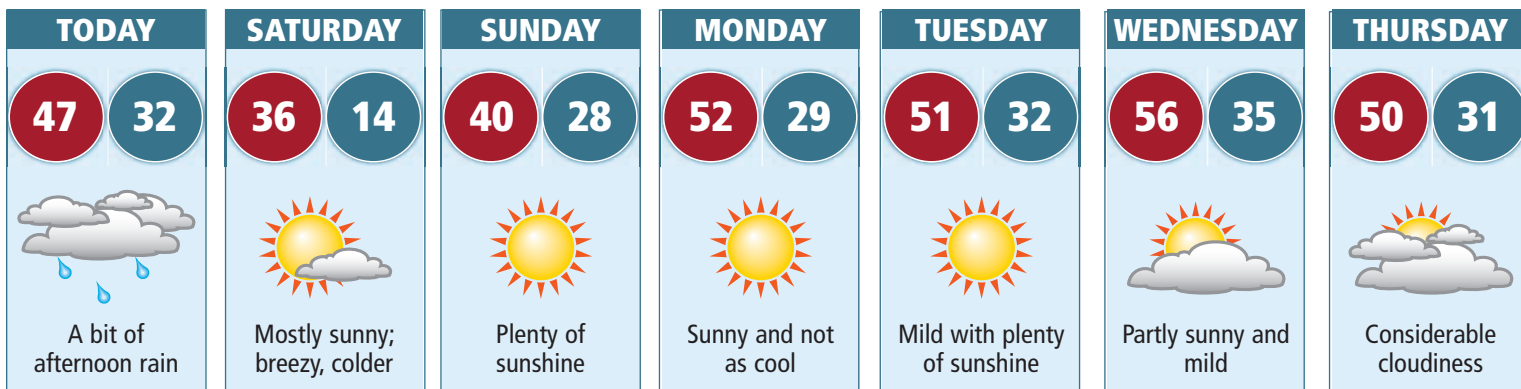
Hesterman added that they are looking forward to being able to perform in the auditorium again.

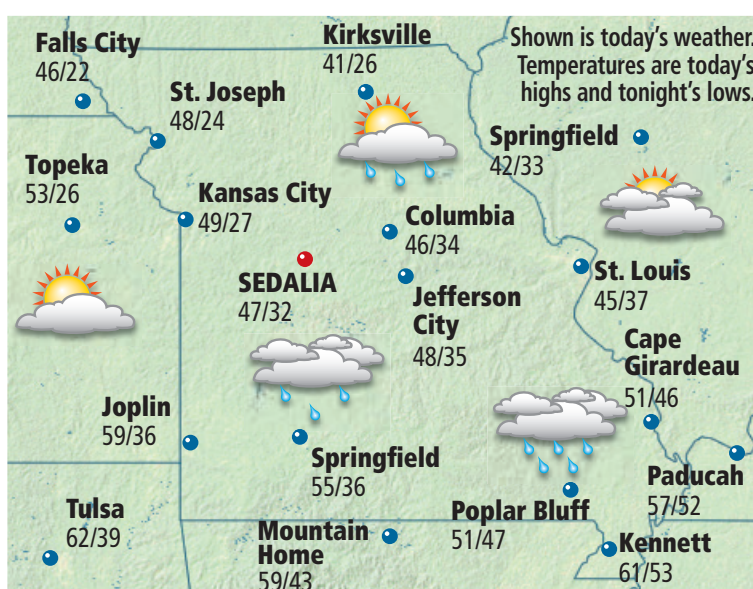

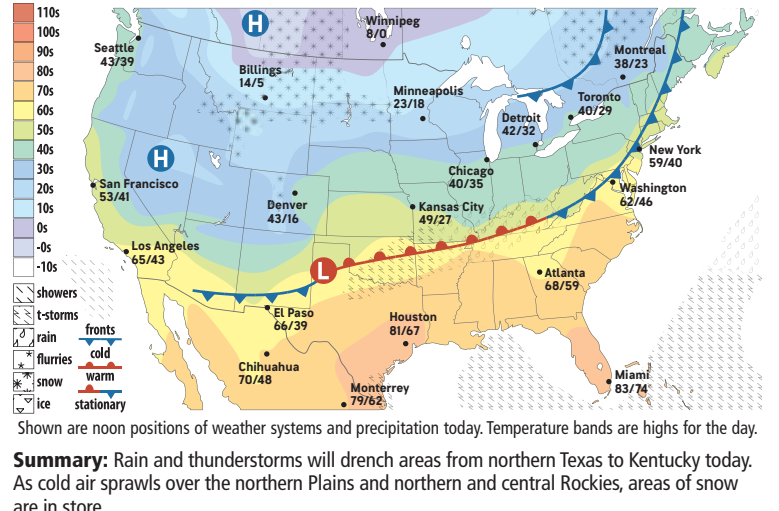

Eli Gulayev pushed the lead back to three after he was fouled immediately after, but a layup by Washington got it down to one yet again before Weymuth was forced to foul in the final 10 seconds.

NFL updates protocols in response to COVID-19 cases

In moves reminiscent of the environment for the 2020 season, the NFL has updated its protocols and advocated for booster shots in reaction to an increase in COVID-19 cases around the league.

As part of its protocol changes, it is requiring masks regardless of vaccination status, and remote or outdoor meetings. It also is stopping in-person meals, adding restrictions on activities outside the facility, prohibiting outside visitors while on team travel, and limiting the amount of people in team weight rooms.

"Finally, and based on expert advice, we will adjust the return-to-participation requirements for those who have recovered from COVID-19," the league said in a statement.

"All of these changes are grounded in our data and science-backed approach, with safety our No. 1 goal for the entire NFL community."

The updated protocols will be enforced through Week 15 games, but are likely to continue or even be strengthened after that point.

Chargers' Parham in stable condition after slamming head

INGLEWOOD, Calif. (AP) — Los Angeles Chargers tight end Donald Parham was in stable condition and being evaluated for a head injury after being removed on a stretcher during a game against Kansas City on Thursday night.

Parham appeared to lose consciousness and was helped off the field on a stretcher early in the first quarter. He was taken to Harbor-UCLA Medical Center, where he was undergoing further tests and imaging.

Parham, in his second year with Los Angeles, got his hands on a 5-yard pass from Justin Herbert in the back of the end zone on fourth-and-goal, but he dropped the ball when the back of his head slammed into the ground.

A camera zoomed on his face showed his eyes closed and his mouth open. A teammate briefly tried to move Parham's left arm, but it was frozen in a bent position.

Trainers and medical personnel removed Parham's facemask from his helmet and placed him on a backboard. The 24-year-old's arms were shaking as he was wheeled off while concerned players from both teams watched.

Study: Former NFL receiver Vincent Jackson had stage 2 CTE

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — Researchers diagnosed former NFL receiver Vincent Jackson, who was found dead in a Florida hotel room in February, as suffering from stage 2 chronic traumatic encephalopathy.

Jackson played 12 seasons with the San Diego Chargers and Tampa Bay Buccaneers before retiring in 2018. Jackson, a three-time Pro Bowl selection, was 38 when he died.

The late player's family on Thursday released the findings of a study conducted by the Boston-based Concussion Legacy Foundation's brain bank in hopes of raising awareness of CTE and the risks of the disease.

"Vincent dedicated so much of his life to helping others. Even in his passing, I know he would want to continue that same legacy," Jackson's widow, Lindsey, said in a statement released by the foundation.

"We hope to continue to see advancements in CTE research, enabling physicians to diagnose the disease in the living and ultimately find treatment options in the future," she added. "There is still a lot to be understood about CTE, and education is the key to prevention."

The Concussion Legacy Foundation describes CTE as a "progressive degenerative brain disease caused by repetitive head trauma," adding stage 2 CTE is "associated with behavioral symptoms like aggression, impulsivity, depression, anxiety, paranoia, substance abuse, and suicidal ideation, along with progressive cognitive symptoms."

Stage 4 is the most severe stage and is usually associated with dementia, the foundation said.

"Vincent Jackson was a brilliant, disciplined, gentle giant whose life began to change in his mid-30s. He became depressed, with progressive memory loss, problem solving difficulties, paranoia, and eventually extreme social isolation," Dr. Ann McKee, chief of neuropathology for the VA Boston Healthcare System, said.

"That his brain showed stage 2 CTE should no longer surprise us; these

results have become commonplace," the doctor added in the foundation statement. "What is surprising is that so many football players have died with CTE and so little is being done to make football, at all levels, safer by limiting the number of repetitive subconcussive hits."

Jackson was found dead by a housekeeper, four days after checking into a hotel east of Tampa.

The Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office said at the time there were no signs of trauma and that the medical examiner's office was looking into the cause of death.

Jackson began his pro career with the Chargers and signed a five-year, \$55 million contract with the Bucs in 2012, finishing with 540 receptions for 9,080 yards and 57 touchdowns.

Jackson was a four-time nominee for the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year award and continued to be involved in numerous charitable causes after he retired, including his own Jackson In Action 83 Foundation, which supported military families.

Liverpool wins, Chelsea held as EPL teeters amid virus surge

If the Premier League is to take an enforced break amid another surge in coronavirus cases, Trent Alexander-Arnold gave it quite a send-off.

The Liverpool full back has the perhaps the most dangerous right foot in English soccer and he used it to devastating effect with a late long-range strike to seal a comeback-from-behind 3-1 win over Newcastle on Thursday.

"A stunner. Unbelievable," Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp said. "The boy's shooting technique is on a different level."

The victory meant Liverpool stayed on the shoulder of league leader Manchester City in what is shaping up to be an exciting title race. Chelsea couldn't keep pace, though.

A 1-1 draw at home to injury-hit Everton was Chelsea's latest disappointing result in the league and left the European champions four points behind City.

On current form, the title race is looking like a two-team race, even if it could soon be halted as the league approaches a busy program of festive fixtures.

The growing number of infections among Premier League squads as the omicron variant spreads is being reflected in the number of matches being postponed, almost on a daily basis. Just before kickoff in Thursday's games, the league announced half of the weekend fixtures have been called off because of coronavirus outbreaks in many teams.

There have now been nine postponements in a week.

Thursday's games went ahead, though both Liverpool and Chelsea each had three players unavailable because of positive cases. Virgil van Dijk and Fabinho were among them for Liverpool, while Chelsea was forced to do without strikers Romelu Lukaku and Timo Werner.

Liverpool coped better despite conceding a seventh-minute goal to one of its former players, Jonjo Shelvey.

The hosts replied in the first half through Diogo Jota — somewhat controversially while Newcastle midfielder Isaac Hayden was down with an apparent head injury — and Mohamed Salah's league-high 15th goal of the season.

Alexander-Arnold capped the comeback with his ferocious shot

from 25 meters that flew high into the net, just missing referee Mike Dean as he skipped to one side to avoid the ball hitting him.

CHELSEA STRUGGLES

Everton was missing as many as 12 players because of injury and illness, forcing manager Rafa Benitez to start a makeshift lineup containing three youngsters. Two of them combined for the 77th-minute equalizer.

Jarrad Branthwaite, a 19-year-old defender who has had loan spells at Carlisle and Blackburn in recent seasons, poked in at the far post from a free kick from 20-year-old winger Anthony Gordon.

That canceled out a goal scored seven minutes earlier by Mason Mount, who has now netted in four straight league games.

Chelsea's slump — the team has won just two of its last five league games — has coincided with the absence of star midfielder N'Golo Kante because of injury, and he was only fit enough to take his place on the bench as an unused substitute.

Kante is likely to make his return when Chelsea visits Wolverhampton on Sunday.

Provided, of course, the league hasn't been shut down by then.

Durant carries Nets past 76ers for another short-handed win

NEW YORK (AP) — With so much of his team missing, Kevin Durant probably needs to play great for the Brooklyn Nets to win.

He might be playing as well as ever.

Durant scored 34 points, making a four-point play with the game tied and 1:46 left, and the Nets beat the Philadelphia 76ers 114-105 on Thursday night for another short-handed victory.

The Nets were missing seven players because of coronavirus health and safety protocols but still had Durant, the NBA's leading scorer who added 11 rebounds and eight assists.

That follows games of 51 points, nine assists and seven rebounds, and 34 points, 13 rebounds and 11 assists in the previous two.

"It's a challenge knowing how you're going to come in to the games because a lot of these teams, they scheme for me a little different," Durant said.

Whatever the 76ers' scheme was, it didn't work well enough.

"I mean, that's what he does on a nightly basis," guard Seth Curry said.

Blake Griffin and Nic Claxton both added a

season-high 17 points for the Nets, who had just nine players available. Patty Mills scored 14 points in Eastern Conference-leading Brooklyn's fourth straight victory.

Joel Embiid had 32 points, nine rebounds and six assists in the 76ers' third straight loss, dropping them to 15-15. Curry scored 29 points for a team that was angry that Brooklyn wasn't called for any fouls in the fourth quarter.

"I don't remember the last time that happened, but still had a chance there," Curry said.

It was Brooklyn's second straight game without starters James Harden, LaMarcus Aldridge and DeAndre' Bembry, along with reserves Bruce Brown,

Paul Millsap, Jevon Carter and James Johnson.

"We can all hoop," Claxton said of the young players forced into extended action. "A lot of attention is going to KD so we're just making plays."

The Nets built a 20-point lead but the 76ers, playing for the second straight night, tied it at 103 on Embiid's basket with 1:55 to play. Durant answered with a 3-pointer while being fouled by Tobias Harris, who had a nightmarish game on both ends.

Griffin followed with a 3-pointer to make it 110-103 and rookie David Duke Jr. added two free throws to put it away.

The Nets shot 65% and led 39-25 after one and

pushed it to 54-35 when Griffin, who had fallen out of the rotation entirely but is now starting, converted a three-point play.

The Sixers trailed 66-46 late in the half but outscored Brooklyn 31-19 in the third, with Embiid and Curry combining for 25, to cut it to 85-79.

TIP-INS

76ers: Harris shot 3 for 17, missing all five 3-point attempts. ... Coach Doc Rivers said there was an organizational discussion about some unspecified policy changes to be more vigilant against the coronavirus. Embiid and Harris were among the Sixers who were sidelined by the virus earlier this season. "We want to be the team with the least (cases)," Rivers said. "We lead still, I think, in COVID games off. That one stretch was brutal for us and now other teams are going through it. So it's no fun."

Nets: Veteran guard Langston Galloway, signed to a 10-day contract Thursday, had three points in nine minutes. ... With Durant playing about 37 minutes a game, coach Steve Nash said there is a "lot of consideration" to getting the All-Star forward a break. The Nets play a home back-to-back against Orlando and Denver this weekend.

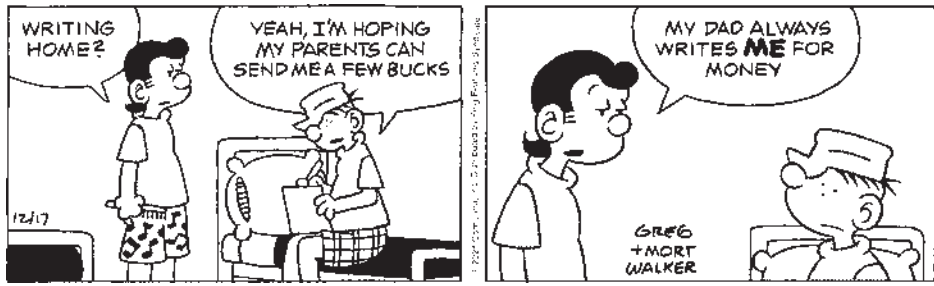

"I wish our decision-making was better defensively," Franklin said of overtime. "I think we gambled and they were able to get easy shots. We weren't closing out on shooters as much [as we had earlier]. I also think we rushed some shots and took some tougher ones than we did in regulation."

S-C extended the game after Versailles was called for goaltending on a putback with 7.7 ticks remaining in the fourth to tie the game at 76, and James Bennett blocked a potential game-winning shot that sent it to OT.

Smith-Cotton built a lead that reached a dozen at one point in the second quarter, but the pace of Versailles (6-2), who entered averaging 93.6 points in victories, played into the visiting Tigers' hands, and the advantage evaporated to one by halftime.

"I was really wanting to keep [the score] to 70 or lower," Franklin said. "We were trying to slow it down and get them out of that transition offense they like to run and make them play a half-court game...late in the second quarter we really started to navigate away from it, so that was the main talk at halftime, to stick to the original plan and take care of the ball. I think we did a great job in the third quarter of doing that and kind of resetting."

Back-to-back 3-pointers by Carson Hunolt and DaMareon Poindexter followed by a Versailles turnover that led to a Poindexter layup got the second

half off to a rousing start for S-C. That cushion reached as much as 13 points on a basket by sophomore Dominick Glover in the third quarter before Versailles rallied again.

Thursday's loss came three days after an 18-point loss at Marshall where S-C trailed by just

two at halftime. Encouraging for Franklin was that it was the best shooting night of the year so far. Poindexter gave Smith-Cotton the team's second 20-point effort of the year, and Smith-Cotton, shooting just 13% from 3-point range, made nine as a team in the defeat.

Dr. Allen Sills, the league's chief medical officer, said the omicron

variant is "in many ways (like) addressing a new disease." Omicron is responsible for the significant uptick in positive COVID-19 cases, according to Sills, which are emanating from within team facilities. That is the opposite of where previous positives had come from right after Thanksgiving.

The league and the players' union, advised by independent infectious disease officers, have developed a mechanism in the protocols that might lead to shorter stints on the sidelines for people testing positive.

Previously, a vaccinated person — players, coaches, executives and staffers — who tests positive must then have two negative tests 24 hours apart and be asymptomatic before being cleared to return. Beginning immediately, the new protocols relax that requirement a bit, allowing for two PCR tests or two Mesa tests — one of each — being negative. The logistics for that could speed up the return of sidelined players.

"We have to think differently about this phase of the pandemic," Sills said. "We are facing a different set of challenges and in some ways almost a different disease ... and it is going to require a different (strategy) from us."

Earlier Thursday, the Chicago Bears were missing all three of their coordinators because of COVID-19 protocols as they prepared for Monday night's home game against the Minnesota Vikings.

Bears coach Matt Nagy said offensive coordinator Bill Lazor, defensive coordinator Sean Desai and special teams coordinator Chris Tabor were participating remotely in meetings this week. Their status for the game is uncertain.

COVID-19 has hit the Bears hard this week, one of many teams experiencing positive tests. Approximately 100 players across the 32 teams have

tested positive.

Chicago put five players on the COVID-19 reserve list since Monday and have six on it overall. And now the coordinators are in the protocol.

Players on the COVID-19 list are tackle Larry Borom, tackle Elijah Wilkinson, nose tackle Eddie Goldman, cornerback Artie Burns, defensive tackle Mario Edwards Jr., and practice squad linebacker Sam Kamara.

As a result, along with other more conventional illnesses and injuries, Nagy decided to hold a walk-through practice on Wednesday rather than a full practice.

Nagy missed a game earlier this year against San Francisco, a 33-22 loss, because of COVID-19 issues, and Tabor coached the Bears.

Washington placed three more players on the COVID-19 list Thursday, following eight Wednesday. The team total is 21, including two players on injured reserve and two on the practice squad. Safety Sam Curl was the only starter added to the list, and was joined by centers Keith Ismael and Tyler Larsen.

Curl joins fellow defensive starters in lineman Jon Allen and cornerback Kendall Fuller on the list. Washington could be down to its fifth option at center because of coronavirus and injury problems.

Also:

—Seattle might be without one of its stars, receiver Tyler Lockett, who was put on the COVID-19 list Thursday along with running back Alex Collins. The Seahawks had no players test positive in the 2020 season, but have had three this year: Tight end Gerald Everett was the other in September.

Lockett has a team-high 62 receptions for 1,023 yards and six touchdowns. Last week Lockett became the second player in franchise history with three straight seasons with at least 1,000 yards receiving, joining Hall of

Famer Steve Largent.

Lockett had five catches for 142 yards and a touchdown last week against Houston and is 35 yards short of setting a career high for a season.

Collins has served as a starter for most of this season after Chris Carson was lost to a season-ending neck injury in Week 4. But Collins has played through several ailments.

—Cleveland tight end David Njoku was activated from the COVID-19 list, adding a playmaker heading into Saturday's game against Las Vegas. On Wednesday, the virus shelved coach Kevin Stefanski and quarterback Baker Mayfield, whose status for this week remains in question. The Browns had 17 players, including 10 starters, on the COVID-19 list and are placing safety Ronnie Harrison there. Starting safety James Johnson III and nickel back Troy Hill both tested positive on Wednesday and rookie cornerback Greg Newsome II has been ruled out with a concussion.

—Saints coach Sean Payton returned to practice on Thursday after staying home on Wednesday, when the team said the coach was "under the weather," but had tested negative for COVID-19.

Payton had participated in a conference call with reporters on Wednesday morning without mentioning he'd be missing practice later that day. The Saints said Payton worked from home and participated in meetings via video-conference on Wednesday before returning to team headquarters on Thursday.

—Miami rookie receiver Jaylen Waddle's sensational season could be on hold. Waddle has been placed in the coronavirus protocol. The sixth overall draft pick already set a franchise record for receptions by a rookie with 86. He has 849 yards receiving and four touchdowns.

The Dolphins host the Jets on Sunday.

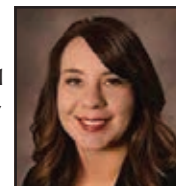

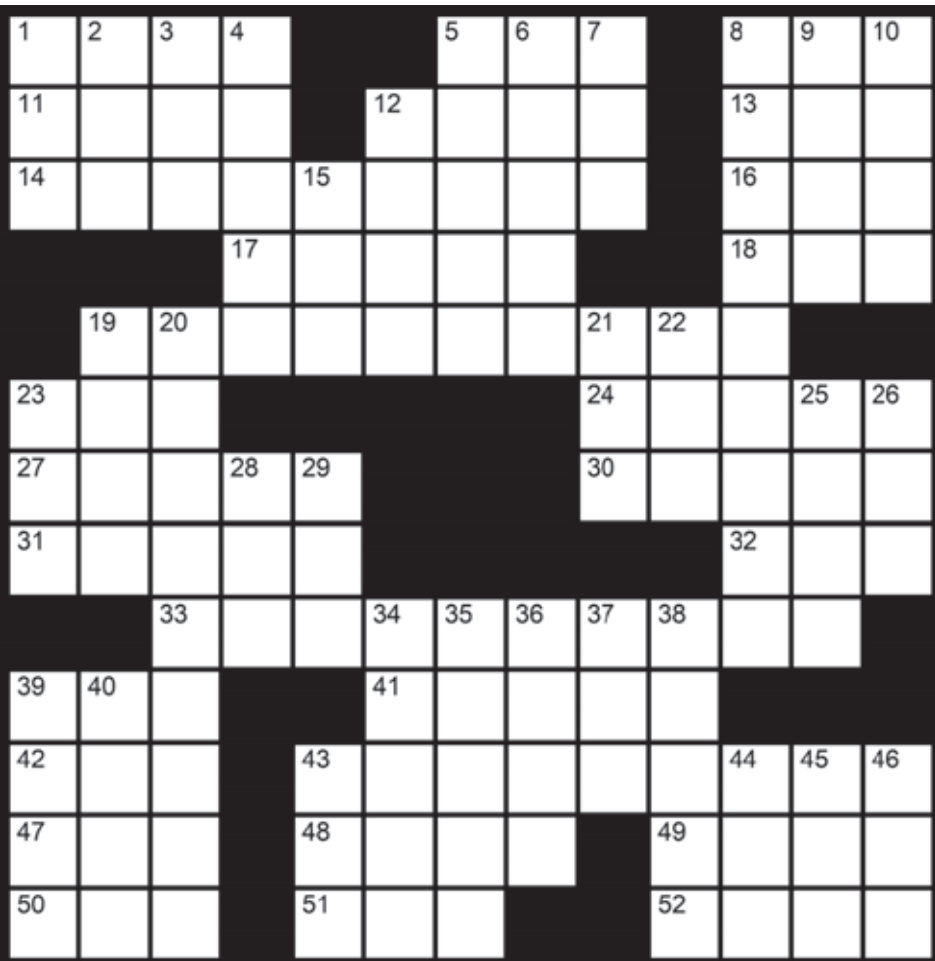

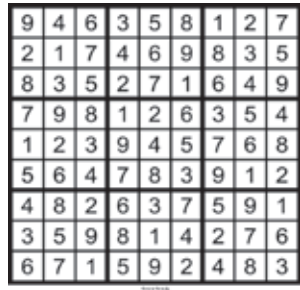
