## Convention Hall will still get used after Heckart opens

As the Grand Opening for the Heckart Community Center draws near, Parks and Recreation Director Amy Epple already has a plan for restoring Convention Hall to its former glory.

"Convention Hall is a great piece of park property," Epple said Thursday. "The building was built in 1911, it's not going anywhere."

With all eyes on the opening of the Heckart on March 18, users of Convention Hall are also anticipating the move.

"I can't wait, on the way here I'm thinking, 'two more months, two more months,'" Nanci Bergmeier said during a break from pickleball Thursday. "I mean, it's awesome here, I can't imagine

what it's gonna be like over there."

Bergmeier enjoys using the Convention Hall and wonders how it will be used in the future.

"I don't know what they're going to do with it, hopefully they have a

plan," she said.

Convention Hall carries a sort of familiarity for Bergmeier, even though she isn't from Sedalia, and has only been playing Pickleball here for two months.

"An old building like

this brings back memories of growing up," Bergmeier said. "It reminds me of the auditorium that I played in a lot, you don't know if you'll make it back over, so I'm sure some people are going to be sad."

## Citizens voice concerns over Mercy Rest Stop

About 50 people gathered in the Council Chambers at the Sedalia Municipal Building on Thursday night to voice concerns regarding the proposed Mercy Rest Stop project planned for downtown Sedalia.

Plans are to construct the Mercy Rest Stop at 314 W. Benton St. next to the Open Door Kitchen. The Democrat first reported about the Mercy Rest Stop and Information Center almost exactly one year ago, in January 2021. At the time, the plans were to "provide the homeless and nearly homeless with the 'necessities of life' such as 24/7 sanitary restroom facilities, a 24/7 water source, showers, laundry, cooling and warming stations, and a place for resources and communication, plus a place to meet agency caseworkers to obtain assistance."

In 2022, the plans remain largely the same, but citizens living in the area are concerned about its placement and potential to bring unwanted issues to their neighborhood.

Those in attendance included members of the Sedalia City Council, city department directors, Mercy Rest Stop board members, business owners, representatives from organizations who have partnered with Mercy Rest Stop, and dozens of citizens either concerned or curious about the project. Mayor John Kehde and Ward 2 Councilwoman Tina Boggess, who represents the area where Mercy Rest Stop is to be located, helped moderate the forum.

The forum began with a presentation from Mercy Rest Stop Board President Bill Turner, who said the faith-based organization plans to construct a 6,000-square-foot center to create "a place to obtain professional assistance toward reaching a stable life."

"One of the misconceptions we often hear is 'homelessness' being assigned to the project in a very narrow perspective," Turner said. "That's not the case at all. We expect more patrons to be not homeless than to be homeless. There are so many people barely retaining their homes, don't have enough money to turn on utilities in many cases and so on. We're there to help them from becoming homeless and establish a more secure lifestyle."

Turner explained many local and state entities have committed to helping. Katy Trail Community Health and Burrell Behavioral Health

will both have full-time employees at the center. For the first three years, Catholic Charities will fund the director's salary and a "significant portion" of operations. The Job Center will provide information on job training, how to apply for a job, and other assistance for seeking employment. The Pettis County Ministerial Alliance plans to have someone at the building to help with spiritual needs.

"We expect more social service folks will join as we become operational," Turner added. "The whole idea is to connect people with the services they need."

Mercy Rest Stop will employ one person, a director, who will be hired later this year. Turner said other employees would depend on need and funding.

In addition to being an information center, Turner said the building could help during a natural disaster, serving as a shelter for people displaced by a tornado or after their home burns down. It will also serve as a warming/cooling shelter, allowing people to stay in the building temporarily when the weather dictates it; during these times, it would operate like the current warming shelter at St. Patrick Church.

Turner said the board is "committed to this not being a homeless shelter" and showed excerpts from various board documents and bylaws stating as such.

He said donations have come in from individuals, families, civic groups, churches and businesses. So far, \$350,000 has been raised, plus \$500,000 in in-kind donations from construction contractors. Another \$500,000 needs to be raised, partially due to increases in construction costs throughout the pandemic.

Turner closed by saying the board hopes to complete the project as soon as possible and said they are on track to be operational by early winter 2022. He also encouraged more people to join the board to be part of the discussions and decisions.

Kehde then handed over the microphone to Bishop Paul Jones of the Burns Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, located a half-mile from Mercy Rest Stop. He said many people in the neighborhood approached him with questions, which he didn't have answers to. He said many people knew nothing about the project, despite organizers beginning their work in 2020, and asked if there was somewhere else the center could be built.

### Private Pesticide Applicator Training Dates Set

The private pesticide applicator license issued by the Missouri Department of Agriculture is required for producers wanting to purchase and apply restricted use pesticides. Application by unlicensed workers under the supervision of licensed applicators will no longer be allowed. Agricultural producers needing to obtain or renew certification of this license must take this pesticide safety training every five years. You must be 18 years of age and directly involved in the production of agricultural commodities to obtain this license.

In response to COVID-19, in-person training sessions will have masks and sanitizer available for those who wish to use them. MU Extension plans to offer virtual and in-person events this season.

Each farm must have a copy of the M87 Private Pesticide Applicator Training Manual, which can be purchased for \$25 at [extension.missouri.edu/m87](http://extension.missouri.edu/m87). Participants

must have this manual during training.

This class does not include the annual training required to apply synthetic auxin herbicides (i.e. dicamba) given by the registrants. See [agriculture.mo.gov/plants/pesticides/dicamba-facts.php](http://agriculture.mo.gov/plants/pesticides/dicamba-facts.php) for more information.

This training also does not include the supplemental training required to apply paraquat dichloride. For more information see [agriculture.mo.gov/plants/pesticides/paraquat.php](http://agriculture.mo.gov/plants/pesticides/paraquat.php).

## STATE BRIEFS

### Woman sent to prison, must repay \$7.5 million in fraud case

ST. LOUIS (AP) — A southeast Missouri woman has been sentenced to three years in prison and ordered to pay \$7.5 million in restitution in a Medicaid and Medicare fraud case.

A federal judge in St. Louis on Tuesday sentenced 42-year-old Brandy McKay of Cape Girardeau. She had earlier pleaded guilty.

McKay operated several durable medical equipment companies. A plea agreement stated that the companies paid kickbacks for orders and prescriptions signed by telemedicine doctors and nurse practitioners who in most cases didn't examine or even have contact with patients, and who did not determine those patients needed durable medical equipment.

McKay's companies then submitted reimbursement claims to Medicare and Medicaid. A news release from the U.S. Attorney's Office in St. Louis said that in many cases, patients received equipment they had had not requested or needed.

### 62 Missouri school districts temporarily closed in January

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. (AP) — So far in January, 62 Missouri school districts have closed for one or more days, largely because of a lack of staff caused by a surge in COVID-19 cases, education officials said Thursday.

That number is 12% of districts statewide, said Mallory McGowin, a spokeswoman for the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

The closures came after many districts dropped mask requirements before the winter break in December, partly in response to Missouri Attorney General Eric Schmitt threatening to sue school districts that imposed mask or quarantine mandates, The Kansas City Star reported.

Some of the state's largest districts, including Springfield, Columbia and St. Joseph, have announced various plans to close for a few days because of staff shortages and high student absenteeism.

The Odessa school district east of Kansas City is conducting virtual classes Thursday and Friday, rather than closing.

A state law limits Missouri school districts to 36 hours of virtual learning per school year.

Last week, the Missouri State Teachers Association asked the education department to allow more days for virtual learning.

McGowin said the state prefers in-person learning because it's "what is best for our students."

### Man arrested in suburban St. Louis killings of man, dog

FENTON, Mo. (AP) — A man accused of shooting to death another man and his dog in suburban St. Louis has been arrested, police said.

Tony Hager, 22, was charged Wednesday with second-degree murder and armed criminal action in the Sunday afternoon shooting of 25-year-old Austin Vines in Fenton, television station KSDK reported.

Officers called to a home in the city just southwest of St. Louis found Vines and his boxer mix, Nova, with gunshot wounds, police said. Vines was taken to a hospital, where he died the next day. The dog

also died.

Investigators believe Hager and other people went to the home to confront Vines over an ongoing disagreement, and an argument led to the shooting. Witnesses told investigators Hager was the shooter, police said.

Hager was found in Ozark County on Wednesday afternoon and arrested. He is being held on \$250,000 bond.

### Missouri Congressman Cleaver tests positive for COVID-19

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Democratic U.S. Rep. Emanuel Cleaver II of Missouri has tested positive for COVID-19, the congressman revealed in a statement.

Cleaver, who represents a Kansas City-area district, announced the breakthrough infection in a statement released Wednesday evening, within hours of testing positive. Cleaver said he is fully vaccinated and also received a booster vaccine.

"While I am experiencing very minor cold-like symptoms, because I am vaccinated and boosted, I am confident that I will be protected from severe illness," he said.

### Local student graduates from Lincoln Law Enforcement Academy

Alexander Griggs, of Tipton, graduated from the Lincoln University of Missouri Law Enforcement Training Academy on Dec. 16.

Griggs is a member of the second graduating class to complete Lincoln's program.

Lincoln launched the training center earlier this year, the first historically Black college and university to house its own police academy. Cadets receive hands-on, practical training in a variety of situations including domestic violence calls, traffic stops, burglary scenarios, crisis intervention and de-escalation techniques. The evolving

curriculum will include such innovations as virtual reality simulators for future classes, says Academy Director Gary Hill.

"The vision of this program was designed to help you go into communities with a more diverse mindset, an inclusive skillset and the ability to provide a higher level of community care," Lincoln University Interim President John Moseley told the graduates. "You will be the beacon of diversity that we all need in our nation."

# Dealing with death and dying

My first real job was as a janitor at a funeral home when I was 16 years old. All I remember about my first day was the surreal realization that I was working around corpses. As morbid as it sounds, from that moment on my life has involved dealing with death and dying. When I became a pastor, I ministered at more deathbeds and funerals than I ever imagined. Eventually, death hit closer to home. Within the past five years, my childhood best friend tragically died, my wife and I suffered two miscarriages, and currently a dear, young pastor friend is on his deathbed from a rare and aggressive cancer. As I've personally been forced to wrestle with the reality of death and dying, I've come to learn a few comforting truths.

First, we're not made for this world. Yes, God created enjoyable delights in this world, but those delights at best are

momentary and fleeting. As a child, I used to have a love/hate relationship with cotton candy – I loved the taste yet hated its immediate dissolving. Isn't it true that life is similar, here one moment yet gone the next? The very existence of death bears evidence we're made for something beyond this life. The enjoyments of earth are meant to be foretastes of what's to come. Death and dying certainly are painful, but it's important to remember that this life was never meant to be the apex of our existence. The life to come with the risen Son is why humanity was created.

Second, everything is purposeful. Accidents don't exist in a world created solely for God's purposes. The pain of dying and the finality of death are purposeful. We don't have to fully understand or even enjoy the process of God's purposes, but we must see that God is over all things and working through all things. There has never been an event or moment of human history that God did not

orchestrate in concert with a better plan beyond our comprehension. As the Dutch Prime Minister from the early 20th century, Abraham Kuyper, once eloquently stated, "There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry, 'Mine!'" God owns all things and has a plan for all things. God is purposeful and everything he allows is for a good purpose.

Third, life is not to be wasted. Life is more than our accolades, accomplishments, and possessions. Too many of us learn the hard way that life is about knowing our Creator, loving others, and preparing for eternity. Life is too short to waste on the frivolous trivialities that are ultimately meaningless. I've learned to not waste my days but to try and use them as gifts from God that will echo through the halls of eternity. Friend, don't waste your life on things that won't matter once this life ends.

The final truth I've

learned from death and dying is that there is hope in grief. Among the many comforting passages of Scripture is 1 Thessalonians 4:13, where the resurrection of the dead and heaven's glories are given "so that you will not grieve as do the rest who have no hope." Does that sound strange connecting hope with the grief of death and dying? Hope truly can be given in the process of dying and experiencing the coldness of death. Sound too good to be true? It's not – the Son of God died to give us life. Because of what Jesus accomplished at the cross and in the resurrection, death isn't the end and death hasn't won. Christ has won, love has overcome, and eternal life is the final outcome.

If you're struggling with death and dying, may the final words of 1 Thessalonians 4 guide you to the purposeful God who created you to hope in His Son, Jesus Christ for eternal life – "Therefore comfort one another with these words."

"People in the community are upset because they have the thinking that nobody asked us nothing," Jones said among murmurs of "amen" and "yes" from the audience. "This is a nice community. And don't get anybody wrong because we're here at this meeting, no one is against, that talked to me, is against your mission. But the question keeps coming up, why do they want to put it on the north side? Is there somewhere else this could have been put or have you even looked at other places to put this facility? If you did consider other places, did you go into the community and do a survey? Did you go into the community and pass out information as we're trying to pass it out here now because people like to know what's going on and don't want to feel dumped on."

While a few people seemed opposed to the idea in general, most said they were in favor of a project such as Mercy Rest Stop, but not in their neighborhood.

Turner said the board had not considered other locations, as they felt it was important to place it next to the Open Door Kitchen because they thought the two separate entities would serve many of the same people.

After the crowd began to get restless and frustrated with Turner's answers, Boggess took control of the forum and began asking questions given to her by constituents. One such question was why did the board meet with other entities but not with north side community members to get their input?

"We failed in that regard," Turner replied.

She also asked about the 24/7 water and bathrooms – there will be one men's and one women's restroom with outside entrances available to the public 24/7 even after the center is closed – and what makes the board

believe that won't attract homeless people to gather around it at all hours.

"It never struck me that someone would hang around just for a restroom," he replied.

Jones said people are likely to hang around anywhere there is water access, as they do in public parks with open restrooms. Another citizen noted the Sedalia Parks and Recreation Department had to close some park restrooms due to vandalism in recent years.

Turner said he'd be willing to talk about the hours for the restrooms.

"It is a service to the community, but it needs to be thought out more," Jones added.

One of the recurring themes was regarding the issues currently plaguing the Open Door Kitchen. Countless people offered anecdotes about finding needles in their yards, seeing people urinate outside, people setting up tents or sleeping in vehicles in the kitchen parking lot, and the increased number of people walking around the neighboring houses late at night. Citizens asked Turner how the board planned to ensure those same problems don't happen at Mercy Rest Stop.

"It will be different at Mercy Rest Stop than at Open Door," Turner assured them, although he didn't offer any specifics as to how employees or volunteers would monitor the after-hours issues.

Boggess then asked her own question: has the board considered using the funds to construct tiny homes instead? Turner said the board is not trying to offer housing but rather a one-stop center for information and resources. He said tiny homes would help with housing but not with services.

"I understand that. Once they've filled out an application with Burrell, the health department, all the entities you plan to put in this building, then where do they go?" Boggess asked. "They can't live there, so they're back out on the street. So that's why I thought tiny homes."

Kehde said Boggess

made a good point and noted that he and Boggess have been working with Sedalia Public Housing over the last six months to address the lack of housing in the city and specifically transitional housing. He said a solution was being worked on but was probably three years out.

"I want to emphasize, I'm not against the purpose of the facility. I'm concerned with the position of where you want to put it at," Boggess said at the end of her questions.

Tasha Stokes, who lives in the area, asked if the center would be staffed 24/7 or what security would be used. She noted that "addiction is a 24/7 problem. I've never been an addict, but I assume addicts don't just need help from 8 to 5."

Chris Stewart, CEO of Katy Trail Community Health, then jumped in, saying KTCH will staff the center with a full-time community health worker, but exact hours hadn't been decided.

"They bridge people into care. A community health worker comes from the community," Stewart said. "I will make a pledge right here, right now that the person we hire will come from the north side. That person's intention will be to bridge two services, whether Katy Trail or Compass or Burrell or Open Door or HUD; that's what our job is as a health center. Our new health center is two blocks away across the railroad tracks on 305 W. Main. Our intention and our partnership is to facilitate that."

At one point, a citizen asked if Turner and the board planned to stop working on Mercy Rest Stop now that he'd heard concerns.

"We're going to move forward, but we invite you to join the board, so you feel more comfortable with it," Turner replied. The woman then left the forum, shaking her head as she exited the room.

Later, Ward 3 Councilman Bob Cross asked the crowd, "if it was in the middle of Sedalia, would you be in favor of it then?" Many replied, "yes." "Then I think it would be a good idea for

the corporation to look for a new place," Cross continued.

Turner said the board wouldn't relocate, prompting another person to leave the forum.

Former Ward 2 Councilwoman Bonita Nash said she was opposed to the location as well, bringing up the other recurring theme of the forum: too many things have been "dumped" on the north side, from the banging steel at Nucor late at night to the Open Door Kitchen that residents say attracts unwanted crime and noise.

"I understand what you're saying. Yes, we do need this type of facility," she said. "But, like all of us are saying, we've been dumped on. We have enough problems on the north side. The homeless, drug addicts, mental illness, all those people say, 'we'll go across the tracks because no one cares what goes on over there.' We care. You're telling us you don't care what we think, we'll put it there anyway. That's what we're all hearing from you."

Representatives from Lamy's – Stafford Swearingen, Reid Swearingen, who also lives in the Lamy's apartments, and Scott Benbrook – all voiced opposition.

"I think the community has voiced serious, serious concerns and these are legitimate reasons," Stafford Swearingen said. "I am begging you to tap the brakes here. We need to do more research and work. We have a lot of unanswered questions. Please."

Toward the end of the forum, Turner was asked again by Benbrook if he would consider moving the facility and what other options were available.

"We can talk about it," Turner said.

As people began gathering their coats to leave, Boggess asked the final question: If you received free land somewhere else, would you consider it?

"I'd have to take that up with the board. I can't answer that myself," Turner replied.

But Convention Hall is fully scheduled with activities, and that will only increase.

"Even when we move into the Heckart Community Center, Convention Hall will still be utilized," Epple said. "Football utilizes this and we hope they continue to use it as well, we have a dance and gymnastics program that is maxed-out on how many people we can take, this gives us the opportunity to have more days available and times available that we can begin to grow that program as well."

For a building that is 111 years old, Convention Hall is holding up nicely, and Epple has plans to "give some love" to Convention Hall.

"We already have in mind some things that we'll be doing next fall over here just to spruce it up and give it some TLC," Epple said. "For most people that have lived around Sedalia and know Convention Hall, there used to be out in front a covered patio. We do have it in our master plan 18 years out from now, but we really do hope that we can re-

store this building back to its original look."

Eighteen years may seem like a long time into the future to be planning the restoration of the exterior features, but it may be reassuring to residents that the old building is not being forgotten.

"We've definitely got our money's worth using it, it is full. We use it seven days a week, there's something going on here every day if it's football on Sundays or volleyball on Tuesdays and Thursdays," Epple said. "It's hard for us to do maintenance over here, we've been wanting to do some cleaning and some improvements but we just don't have the ability to be able to stop because we have so many activities that are going on. Right now, people call and we just don't have the space to rent it out, so many people want to come in and use it."

Whether pickleball is played at the Heckart in the future, never to return to Convention Hall, players like Bergmeier suspect there will always be some activity at Convention Hall.

"I don't know what they're going to offer here, so I guess I'll have to wait and see," Bergmeier added.

## Army Corps to spend \$732M on Mississippi River lock upgrade

ST. LOUIS (AP) — The U.S. Army Corps said it will spend \$732 million to expand a lock and dam system to help barges more efficiently transport millions of tons of corn, soybeans and other goods along the Mississippi River.

The lock expansion was part of the Biden administration's broader announcement Wednesday that the Army Corps will have \$14 billion from the infrastructure bill and other sources for Florida everglades restoration, upgrading ports and improving navigation on major waterways like the Mississippi, among other projects.

A second lock will be built next to the one that already exists in Winfield, Missouri. The new lock will allow for two-way traffic and will be bigger than the current one, easing the movement of larger, modern barges.

"By adding a second chamber, you can really ease up that congestion," said Kirsten Wallace, executive director of the Upper Mississippi River Basin Association.

Currently, there is one, 600-foot chamber for barges to pass through. It isn't large enough to allow large 15-barge tows to travel without having to disassemble first. Getting a standard tow through can take more than two hours, according to the Army Corps. When the new, 1,200-foot chamber is added, passage will take 30-45 minutes.

The project is fully

funded and will take roughly five to seven years to complete, according to the Army Corps.

Upgrading the lock and dam on the 1930s-era piece of infrastructure is part of a larger project to improve ecology and navigation. Wednesday's announcement came after decades of planning and preparation. The Army Corps said initial feasibility work began in the late 1980s and design work in 2007. Finally, they can build, officials said.

"Up until this morning, we've never had the authorization to actually construct projects," said Andrew Goodall, a program manager for the Army Corps' long-term navigation and ecology improvement efforts. He said the funding "opens the door" to make a positive effect on the river.

Mike Steenhoek, executive director of the Soy Transportation Coalition, said barges can cheaply move large volumes of products long distances. He said in addition to saving time, the new lock will ensure that river traffic doesn't come to a halt if the old lock has a problem.

"With a barge, if you have a closure at a lock and dam it is not like canoeing or kayaking where you can portage around the obstacle. River transit will close," he said.

Steenhoek said he hopes Wednesday's announcement builds momentum for upgrades to other busy locks on the Mississippi and Illinois rivers.

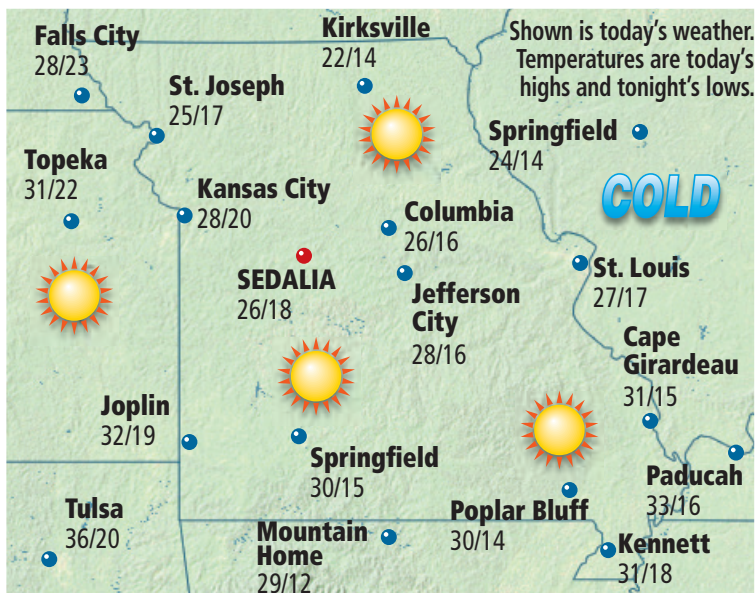

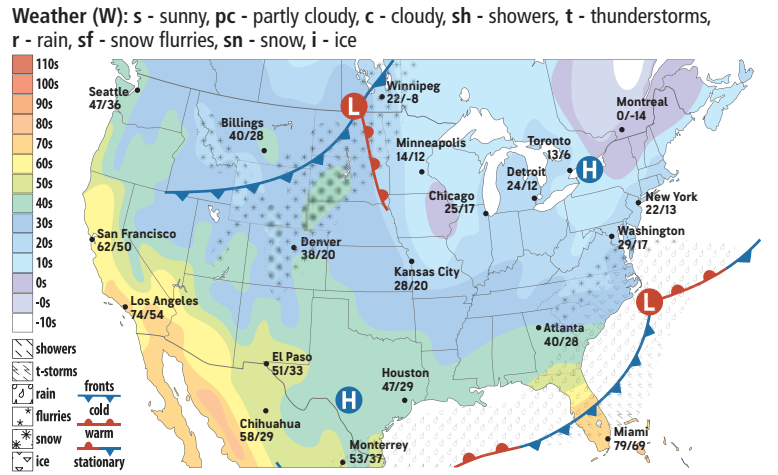

## Kansas City Chiefs linebacker Gay arrested on misdemeanor

OVERLAND PARK, Kan. (AP) — Kansas City Chiefs linebacker Willie Gay was charged with misdemeanor criminal damage to property after he broke a vacuum and other items during an argument, putting his status for Sunday's divisional round playoff game against the Buffalo Bills in question.

Gay pleaded not guilty Thursday and was expected to be released from jail later in the day.

Police in the Kansas City suburb of Overland Park, Kansas, said the 23-year-old Gay was arrested Wednesday night. The total of damaged property amounted to \$225, police said.

No drugs, alcohol or weapons were involved and no one was injured, police said.

Gay's agents, Maxx Lepsettler and Ryan Rubin, said in a statement that Gay was visiting his son when he got into an argument with the child's mother, who called the police. The agents said that Gay would likely pay a fine and replace the vacuum and "all should be resolved today with no further issues."

Gay is not allowed to have contact with the child or his mother, who sought a civil protection order, The Kansas City Star reported.

Gay was not at practice Wednesday and those available to speak with reporters deferred all

questions about his status for the playoff game to Chiefs coach Andy Reid, who does not speak to the media again until Friday.

"I'm going to leave that up to Andy. I'm sure he'll address it," Chiefs defensive coordinator Steve Spagnuolo said. "But if this happened in a game and it was an injury, we'd just operate that way. But we'll see what happens."

Gay, who has made 48 tackles and two interceptions in 12 games this season, spoke about his struggles with mental health earlier this season. Gay said that he was "going through some things, man," but that he wanted to be an example for other NFL players that keep such issues bottled up by being open and honest about them.

"We're taught growing up to just hold it in and go on about your day, and keep distractions away," Gay said. "But I got to the point where I was like, 'I can't shake this,' and I had to tell my coaches, the people that I work with."

Gay was a second-round pick of the Chiefs in the 2020 draft. He started eight games as a rookie and dealt with a variety of injuries, but he's become a dependable part of the rejuvenated Kansas City defense this season.

"All I can say about Willie is I love working with him," Spagnuolo said. "He's been terrific. I think you know he's had a baby; I talk to him about that a lot. I just hope it works out best for everybody."

## Windsor football head coach Vencill to depart

The 2020 Class 1 state champions will be led by a new face when football season rolls around this fall.

News that Windsor football head coach Jake Vencill's position was opening up was confirmed with a posting seeking applicants on Wednesday.

Vencill is expected to take the offensive coordinator position at Washington High School. The Class 5 program, a force in the 1970s under the late Jim Scanlan, has won a combined 25 games over the past three years.

The move is unofficial until his resignation and subsequent hiring at the next board of education meetings for Henry R-1 and

Washington, scheduled for Feb. 10 and 23, respectively.

The Greyhounds alum took over the program in 2016 and rekindled memories of the program's glory in the 1980s under Dave Wanninger as a force in the I-70 Conference.

After a 4-6 year, Windsor went 8-3 in 2017 under Vencill, its first winning season since 2012. An uptick in the offense (34.2 points per game) in 2019 was the start of the recent run of dominance.

That laid the groundwork for the historic undefeated 2020 season that ended with a 43-20 victory over Mid-Buchanan in the Class 1 state final.

Windsor lost just one game in 2021, making a run to the quarterfinals before falling to Thayer.

"I'll always remember 2019," Vencill said in a November interview.

"We'd lost to Adrian in the regular season and it was a pretty rough moment for us. From that moment on, we just absolutely focused on doing whatever it took to be able to get that district championship. Everything we did from then on was a direct focus to put us in position to be successful."

"When we beat Adrian [later that year in the playoffs], that was a great breakthrough, because it'd been 30 years since we'd won a district championship. After we knocked that door down, I think our guys realized we could be one of those programs in playoff contention to play in big playoff games."

Windsor athletic

director Brad Forrest spoke about Vencill's tenure as coach.

"Coach Vencill did a really good job of coming in and building a good program, getting kids to buy in," Forrest said. "They competed hard for him and took care of business. We'll always be grateful for what he did and we wish him the best. You can't blame him for wanting to make that move."

Forrest was reluctant to name potential internal replacements, just saying that the school was seeking the best candidate for the job. "We've already had some applicants," he said. "Once [Vencill's resignation and hiring] becomes official on both sides, we'll get that rolling. We'd like to have someone in as soon as we can."

## Chiefs coordinator Bieniemy once again hot coach commodity

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Doug Pederson lasted five seasons in Philadelphia and Matt Nagy just four in Chicago before they ultimately were fired.

That hasn't diminished the interest teams have in Andy Reid's offensive coordinators.

Passed over several times for head coaching jobs over the past few seasons, Eric Bieniemy is again a hot commodity as the Chiefs prepare for a divisional-round matchup with the Bills on Sunday night. He spoke virtually with the Jaguars, Jets, Chargers, Falcons and Lions about their openings last season, and he's been in touch with the Broncos about their job this season.

"All of that stuff is going to take care of itself," he said. "And do not get me wrong, I am blessed and I

am fortunate to be a part of that chatter, to be a part of some of the things that are taking place, but right now my focus is to make sure that we are ready to play a 60-minute game where we can go out there and play hard and play fast."

Despite their disap-

pointing fates, it's not as if Bieniemy's predecessors in charge of the Chiefs offense were total failures.

After spending three years in the job as part of Reid's initial staff in Kansas City, Pederson was plucked away to rebuild the Eagles.

## Bills enjoy safeties in numbers with Hyde and Poyer

ORCHARD PARK, N.Y. (AP) — Coming off the excitement of a playoff win, while focused on prepping to interview for the Miami Dolphins' head coaching vacancy, Bills defensive coordinator Leslie Frazier couldn't leave his office before sending a congratulatory text to safety Micah Hyde early Sunday morning.

For all the emotions he was juggling, Frazier's mind kept coming back to Hyde's leaping over-the-shoulder interception of Mac Jones' pass intended for Nelson Agholor in the end zone to snuff out the Patriots' opening drive in Buffalo's 47-17 wild-card playoff win on Saturday.

"It was hard to see from the sideline what exactly happened or how he made that catch, so

when I got in my office and had a chance to watch it and ran it back a few times," recalled Frazier. "It was just an incredible play by a very, very good player."

With New England down 7-0 and facing first-and-10 at the Buffalo 34, Hyde was in the middle of the field when Jones saw Agholor burst-

ing past Levi Wallace up the left sideline. Hyde immediately sprinted toward the receiver and snatched the ball away mere inches from Agholor's fingertips, while making sure to land in-bounds before tumbling into the sideline.

Hyde isn't sure how he got there, saying: "I kind of blacked out."

Wallace, believing he was beaten, was surprised to see a flash of Hyde's blue jersey streak past him.

For Frazier, it was a play he has come to expect from his safety tandem rounded out by Jordan Poyer who, along with cornerback Tre'Davious White, have anchored Buffalo's play-making secondary over the past five years.

Exceptional as the trio has been over that stretch in combining for 48 interceptions (Poyer has 18, White 16 and Hyde 14), this just might be the safety tandem's best season with White having missed the final six games with a knee injury.

Poyer, who earned his first All-Pro honors this season, and Hyde, who was tied for third with 10 votes, each finished the season with five interceptions — the NFL's only safety duo with five or more each — and were part of a defense which allowed the fewest yards, yards passing and points in the NFL.

"They are the backbone of our secondary," Frazier said. "I don't know where we'd be without them."

The two-time AFC East champion Bills are headed to play a divisional playoff game at Kansas City on Sunday in what will be a rematch of last year's AFC championship game which the Chiefs won 38-24. It'll also be their second meet-

ing this season after Buffalo beat Kansas City 38-20 in Week 5.

While Hyde had one of Buffalo's two interceptions of Patrick Mahomes in October, he's aware of the daunting challenge the Bills face against a quarterback who threw five TDs in a 42-21 wild-card win last weekend.

"They do it all," Hyde said. "These guys can literally score on any single play." The secondary has been Buffalo's strength by allowing just 12 touchdowns passing in 17 games, one short of the 16-game low of 11 set in 1996.

Hyde and Poyer have played together for so long in the same system, they instinctually read off each other while also being adept at disguising their intentions to keep opposing quarterbacks guessing.

What's no coincidence is how they both landed in Buffalo by agreeing to contracts on the first day of free agency in March 2017.

Hyde, who spent his first four NFL seasons in Green Bay, and Poyer, coming off three-plus seasons in Cleveland, were specifically targeted as players who fit the defensive system being introduced by Frazier and newly hired head coach Sean McDermott. An added bonus was both having leadership potential to oversee a unit being rebuilt with youth.

"Two very fine young men that just handle their business the right way," McDermott said. "They're professional in their approach and they can flip

the switch when they get on the field."

Hyde and Poyer's presence is evident among Buffalo's offensive players.

"Their juice, their energy, it's unmatched," quarterback Josh Allen said. "And obviously, you see the accolades start rolling in for them. In my opinion, they should have been rolling in a lot sooner."

Both safeties have not hidden their displeasure in being overlooked once the annual awards season arrives. They've become masters in using the lack of respect as motivation.

Even upon being honored this season, Poyer said he can always find someone out there who doubts them.

"That's how we're wired. We're always going to carry the underdog mentality with us," Poyer said. "And I think that's part of the reason why we've become who we've become."

Frazier saw the first glimpse of Hyde and Poyer's potential in a 23-17 win at Atlanta in Week 4 of the 2017 season in which Hyde had two interceptions. What stood out to Frazier is how opposing offenses began changing their strategy by attempting fewer deep passes.

Hyde's interception against New England reminded Frazier of that game.

"When he made that play and I watched it again, I said, 'Finally, someone decides to test us with a shot and Micah makes this play,'" Frazier said. "I'm not sure if we'll see many shots down the field like that again."

He went 7-9 his first season before going 13-3 and winning the Super Bowl in Year 2. Two more playoff appearances followed before a 4-11-1 flop in 2020 led to Pederson's firing.

Incidentally, he's interviewed with multiple teams for their current coaching vacancies.

Nagy was fired earlier this month after a roller-coaster ride in Chicago. It included the soaring highs of a 12-4 debut and a pair of wild-card game appearances along with the crushing low of a 6-11 season that led to his ouster.

Pederson and Nagy are just two limbs on the Reid coaching tree, too.

There's Super Bowl-winning Ravens coach John Harbaugh, who nearly had his injury-filled team in the playoffs again this season. Washington coach Ron Rivera also reached the Super Bowl with Carolina. Brad Childress led Minnesota to the NFC title game and his replacement, current Buffalo coordinator Leslie Frazier, took the Vikings back to the playoffs. Todd Bowles, Pat Shurmur and current Chiefs defensive coordinator Steve Spagnuolo also have had head coaching jobs.

And let's not forget,

Bills coach Sean McDermott got his start working for Reid during his days in Philadelphia.

So why has Reid been so successful at developing assistant coaches?

"First of all," Bieniemy said, "he's a father figure. He's been around a number of years, and he's very, very consistent in what he does. He does a great job of delegating and making sure that everybody knows exactly what their roles are. But on top of that, he allows you to be yourself. He wants you to be the expert at what you do.

"So, when you have a coach that's not always just saying, 'You have to do this,' or, 'You have to do that,' it makes it special," Bieniemy explained, "because guys can come to work feeling comfortable in their own skin and going out there and perform up to their best capabilities. Then, another thing is there are no egos. We all work together. I think that's one of the unique parts that makes our coaching staff a very, very strong place, because we all work together. We all get along."

Perhaps all of that has rubbed off on McDermott, too. His offensive coordinator, Brian Daboll, has generated interest and Frazier is again attracting some attention as a head coaching candidate.

Much like Bieniemy, they prefer to keep a low profile and focus solely

on Sunday's game in Kansas City.

"For me, it's all about the game that we have and that's how I approached last week leading up to our New England game," Frazier said, "just making sure I stayed locked in on what we had to get done against that particular time. I'm not the type of person that can divide my mind and switch gears, so I had to stay locked in."

Perhaps the biggest impediment to Bieniemy landing a top job the past couple of years has been his own success. The Chiefs have reached three straight AFC championship games and two straight Super Bowls, which means they've regularly played into February — long past the time most organizations want the hiring process to be complete.

In the eyes of Reid, though, that's a lousy excuse.

"It disappoints me that someone hasn't hired him, obviously, because he's so good," Reid said. "I'm hoping that takes place this year. But you know the guys, they're not going to let it be a distraction. They're going to defer to the team and what that's all about and then kind of let the chips fall where they may. I'm sure between COVID-19 and our long season it hasn't been real beneficial for EB in having the opportunity, but I think this year he's going to end up with one."

MELBOURNE, Australia (AP) — Before Victoria Azarenka had a chance to analyze both players she might meet next, a question was posed to her son about the two-time Australian Open champion's third-round performance.

Five-year-old Leo, wearing his sunglasses in the news conference room and sitting on his mother's knee, responded succinctly: "Awesome!"

Thanks, kid. Azarenka's own highlights from her 6-0, 6-2 win over 15th-seeded Elina Svitolina on Friday included the "amount of aggressivity I could bring point after point, applying a lot of pressure, the consistency. The break points I faced, I played really strong."

"Yeah, taking control of my end of the court," she added. "I think that's what I'm more happy about."

She'll next play French Open champion Barbora Krejčíková, who rallied from a set and a break down against No. 26-seeded Jelena Ostapenko to win 2-6, 6-4, 6-4 and advance to the fourth round in singles at Melbourne Park for the first time.

The 24th-seeded Azarenka, who won the title at Melbourne Park in 2012 and 2013 and has been a U.S. Open finalist three times, is into the fourth round here for the first time since 2016 after extending her winning record to 5-0 against Svitolina.

She accumulated nearly twice as many winners, 17, as unforced errors, nine, and never faced a break point. Svitolina made mistake after mistake, 26 unforced errors in all. Since a quarterfinal run in Australia in 2016, Azarenka lost first-round matches last year and in 2019, and missed the hard-court tournament in 2017, 2018 and 2020.

The 32-year-old former world No. 1 from Belarus is feeling comfortable right now, fulfilling the dual roles of player and mother

in Melbourne.

Azarenka was asked if it was more demanding, distracting or relaxing to have her son with her on the tour.

"All of the above," she said, laughing, as Krejčíková and Ostapenko were playing. "It's definitely not a distraction, I will never say that. Being a parent is not easy. He's full of personality — I don't know where he gets it from!"

Leo flipped his tournament credential around on its lanyard as his mother responded to questions from within the room and online. He yawned at least once and blew air onto the microphone.

"I always feel privileged that I'm able to have him here," Azarenka said. "These kind of moments are really priceless for me. To be able for me to share that with my son is pretty incredible."

In other results on Day 5, fifth-seeded Maria Sakkari beat Veronika Kudermetova 6-4, 6-1 to move into a fourth-round match against 21st seed Jessica Pegula of the U.S., who beat Nuria Parizas Diaz 7-6 (3), 6-2.

# NCAA adopts new policy for transgender athletes

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — The NCAA has adopted a sport-by-sport approach for transgender athletes, bringing the organization in line with the U.S. and International Olympic Committees.

Under the new guidelines, approved by the NCAA Board of Governors on Wednesday, transgender participation for each sport will be determined by the policy for the sport's national governing body, subject to review and recommendation by an NCAA committee to the Board of Governors.

When there is no national governing body, that sport's international federation policy would be in place. If there is no international

federation policy, previously established IOC policy criteria would take over.

"Approximately 80% of U.S. Olympians are either current or former college athletes," NCAA President Mark Emmert said in a release. "This policy alignment provides consistency and further strengthens the relationship between college sports and the U.S. Olympics."

The NCAA policy is effective immediately, beginning with the 2022 winter championships.

NCAA rules on transgender athletes returned to the forefront when Penn swimmer Lia Thomas started smashing records this year. She was on the men's team her first three years, but she is competing

for the women this season after transitioning.

The Board of Governors is suggesting NCAA divisions allow for additional eligibility if a transgender student-athlete loses eligibility based on the policy change. That flexibility is provided they meet the NCAA's new guidelines.

"We are steadfast in our support of transgender student-athletes and the fostering of fairness across college sports," Georgetown President John DeGioia said in a release. "It is important that NCAA member schools, conferences and college athletes compete in an inclusive, fair, safe and respectful environment and can move forward with a clear understanding of the new policy."

# Rays say split-season plan with Montreal rejected by MLB

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (AP) — The Tampa Bay Rays' proposed plan to split the season between Florida and Montreal has been rejected by Major League Baseball.

Rays principal owner Stuart Sternberg announced the news on Thursday.

"Today's news is flat-out deflating," Sternberg said.

The idea of playing in both the Tampa Bay area and Montreal has been discussed over the past several years after attempts to build a new full-time ballpark locally failed.

"Things had progressed nicely and things had been working nicely, and then recently it just sort of took a turn to the south and we don't precisely know why," Sternberg said. "I have no doubt that what we tried to accomplish with our sister-city plan will become accepted in all of professional sports. Major League Baseball simply isn't prepared to cross that threshold right now."

When asked if he felt somewhat betrayed by his fellow owners, Sternberg replied "that's a word."

"The game is peculiar in a lot of senses and things happen for a lot of

reasons," Sternberg said. "Sometimes for the good, but always with good intentions for the game itself. We quite often have differing opinions on what that might mean."

"Sometimes people don't like to be first," Sternberg added. "There was a fellow on this call when we went cashless a few years ago said to me, 'I get it, I understand, but why do you have to be first.' It's just people have different approaches to things. We don't mind being first on things."

Montreal had a big league team from 1969, when the expansion Expos began play, through 2004. The Expos moved to Washington and became the Nationals for the 2005 season.

"They were as, if not more, devastated than I was at the news," Sternberg said.

The Rays' lease at

Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida, where the team has played since its inaugural season in 1998, expires after the 2027 season.

Since Sternberg took control in October 2005, the once-struggling franchise has been a success on the field but not at the box office.

Despite reaching the World Series in 2008 and 2020, the Rays have annually ranked near the bottom in attendance. The Rays averaged about 9,500 for home games last season, 28th in the majors and ahead of only Miami and Oakland.

St. Petersburg mayor Ken Welch said he thought a new stadium in his city remains a possibility. Governmental officials have been working on a redevelopment plan for the Tropicana Field site.

"We are working with

our county partners and city council to put together the best plan possible, which will work in conjunction with my planned evolution of the Tropicana Field master development proposals," Welch said in a statement. "With this collaborative approach, I am confident we can partner with the Tampa Bay Rays to create a new and iconic full-time home for Major League Baseball in St. Petersburg while also achieving historic equitable economic growth."

The city of Tampa is also in the mix.

"All along our goal has been to keep the Rays in Tampa Bay," Tampa mayor Jane Castor said in a statement. "We had been working on both sister-city and full-season proposals, and now we can focus all of our energy on a full season. I am optimistic the Rays will call Tampa Bay home for many years to come."

Sternberg said the team will definitely explore options in the Tampa Bay area. He has no plans to sell the team or request permission to explore relocation from MLB.

"We'll see how the stands look this year and the support we get, and that's going to help inform us as well going forward on our plans," Sternberg said.



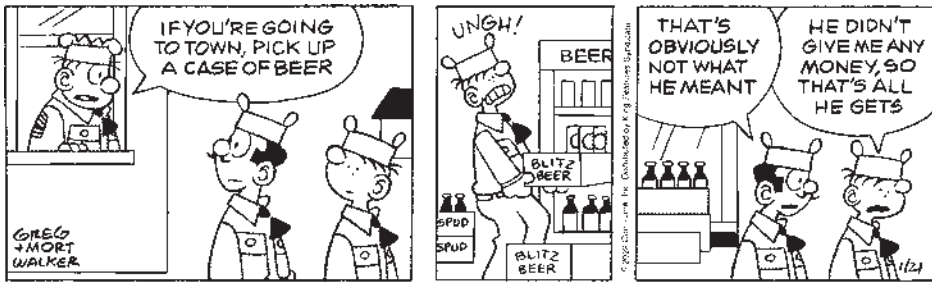

# Phinisee's career game leads Indiana past No. 4 Purdue 68-65

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP) — Rob Phinisee spent four seasons waiting for a moment like the one he celebrated Thursday night.

It even took him two chances to cash in.

The junior guard scored 17 points in the first half and then closed out a career-high 20-point game by making the go-ahead 3-pointer with 16.5 seconds left to send Indiana past No. 4 Purdue 68-65 for Phinisee's first win over his hometown school.

"Every time I go home, people always talk trash to me. I just finally needed to get one," Phinisee said. "It's just something I won't ever forget. Just these fans, they've supported me through everything, so I just want to say thank you."

Phinisee was sensational on a night when the Hoosiers (14-4, 5-3 Big Ten) desperately needed him. He made his first six shots, his first three 3s, had four steals and had a season-high point total — all in the first half.

With All-American candidate Trayce Jackson-Davis limited to just 11 minutes total because of foul trouble, Indiana relied heavily on its perimeter players. Xavier Johnson added 18 points, Trey Galloway scored eight and harassed Purdue guard Jaden Ivey on defense, and Phinisee played his best overall game all season.

As a result, the Hoosiers snapped a nine-game losing streak against their biggest rival, and thousands of screaming fans stormed the court when Ivey's 3-pointer

to force overtime rolled out as the buzzer sounded.

"I had confidence on the one I took, the one I took where it was kind of contested," Ivey said. "I tried to get it high off the glass so the bigs could get a tip-in. My leg was bothering me all game, even before the game I didn't know if I could really play because of my groin. It just sucks losing."

Ivey scored 19 of his 21 points in the second half but missed a go-ahead shot with seven seconds left and the 3-pointer at the buzzer after Jackson-Davis made two free throws to make it a three-point game. Mason

Gillis had 13 points and seven rebounds for the Boilermakers (15-3, 4-3), who lost for the first time in their last six trips to Assembly Hall.

But after Phinisee helped stake Indiana to a 37-28 halftime lead, Ivey went to work. He spurred a 9-2 run that cut the deficit to 59-58 and he finally tied the score at 63 with a mid-range jumper with 3:36 to go.

Twice the Boilermakers had chances to take the lead and failed before Gillis' layup with 1:08 to play gave Purdue its first lead of the second half.

It didn't last.

After Phinisee missed a potential go-ahead 3 following one timeout, first-year Indiana coach Mike Woodson opted for an inbounds play he added earlier in the day and again Phinisee got open. This time, he made it from the corner.

"Rob and I had a beautiful conversation hours before the ballgame and it's just nice to see how he stepped up," Woodson said. "It's a big win for our team. It's been a while since we beat Purdue."

## BIG PICTURE

Purdue: Coach Matt Painter has criticized his team's defense most of this

season and against Indiana, it finally hurt the Boilermakers. Indiana made 10 of its final 17 shots in the first half and Purdue gave up open shots down the stretch. Ten first-half turnovers by the Boilermakers didn't help, especially on the road.

Indiana: The Hoosiers showed their resilience after struggling early with Jackson-Davis on the bench. Woodson has asked his bench to perform better lately and Phinisee delivered in a pinch. Now comes the big question: Can Indiana build from the momentum of this victory?

## POLL IMPLICATIONS

Purdue took advantage of two wins last week — and a bevy of upsets — to return to the top five. It may be a short stay. After escaping with an overtime win Monday at Illinois, the Boilermakers underperformed Thursday. How far they slide may depend on how impressive they look this weekend.

Indiana, meanwhile, has been fighting to reach the Top 25 all season. If the Hoosiers follow this win with another on Sunday, they could finally make it into the rankings.

# Crosby and Malkin score, Penguins hold off Senators 6-4

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Evgeni Malkin and Sidney Crosby scored, and the streaking Pittsburgh Penguins held off the Ottawa Senators 6-4 on Thursday night.

Jake Guentzel's team-best 21st goal of the season was a much-needed empty-netter, as Pittsburgh nearly blew a four-goal lead in the third period.

"It was one of those games where we lacked the attention to detail that our team is normally accustomed to playing with," Penguins coach Mike Sullivan said. "When you play that way, you give up more chances and spend more time in your end. Fortunately, we found a way to win."

Mike Matheson scored twice, Dominik Simon also had a goal and Tristan Jarry stopped 39 shots for the Penguins, who have won three straight and 14 of

16. Pittsburgh has won 10 in a row at home against Ottawa and has points in 13 consecutive home games versus the Senators dating to Feb. 13, 2013.

Drake Batherson extended a four-game point streak with Ottawa's lone goal in the first two periods, and the Senators trailed 5-1 entering the third. But they scored the next three goals, trimming the deficit to one.

Filip Gustavsson made 23 saves for Ottawa. Anton Forsberg stopped six shots in the first period before he was pulled.

Tim Stutzle scored his sixth goal at 1:45 of the third and Josh Norris followed, cutting it to 5-3. Jarry stopped Alex Formenton with a pad save on a penalty shot, but Norris scored his second of the game and 18th of the season at 8:02 to make it 5-4.

Guentzel effectively ended it for Pittsburgh. In his last 22 games, he

has been held off the scoresheet just once dating to Nov. 13.

"Those first two periods, we were playing the way we wanted to play," Senators captain Brady Tkachuk said. "Of course, the score didn't show it. Nobody likes losing, but there are a lot of things to be happy about with our game."

Crosby and Malkin played together in Pittsburgh for the first time since last season's playoff series against the New York Islanders. They scored in the same game for the first time since March 15, a 4-1 home win against Boston.

Malkin, a four-time All-Star and 2012 Hart Trophy winner, made his season debut on Pittsburgh's recent six-game road trip. Malkin, who missed the Penguins' first 34 games after undergoing right knee surgery in June, played his first game in Pittsburgh since May 24.

# Bulls G Ball to have knee surgery, sidelined 6-8 weeks

CHICAGO (AP) — Chicago Bulls guard Lonzo Ball will have arthroscopic surgery on his left knee and is expected to be out six to eight weeks, the team announced Thursday.

Ball has missed three games since a 42-point loss to Golden State last week. Coach Billy Donovan said Wednesday the team had switched up

his treatment, hoping he would avoid surgery, after he didn't respond well to the initial regimen. Ball had the same knee scoped in 2018 when he was with the Lakers.

Acquired from New Orleans in a sign-and-trade deal, Ball has been a major contributor in Chicago's rise to the top of the Eastern Conference. He is averaging 13 points, 5.4 rebounds and 5.1 assists. A disruptive defender on the perimeter, he is sixth in

the league in steals at 1.8 per game.

Chicago (28-15) was tied with Miami for the East lead through Wednesday, after four straight losing seasons. The Bulls visit Milwaukee on Friday to start a three-game trip that also takes them to Orlando and Miami.

With Ball out and star Zach LaVine (sore left knee) sidelined, the Bulls are leaning more on Coby White and rookie Ayo Dosunmu.

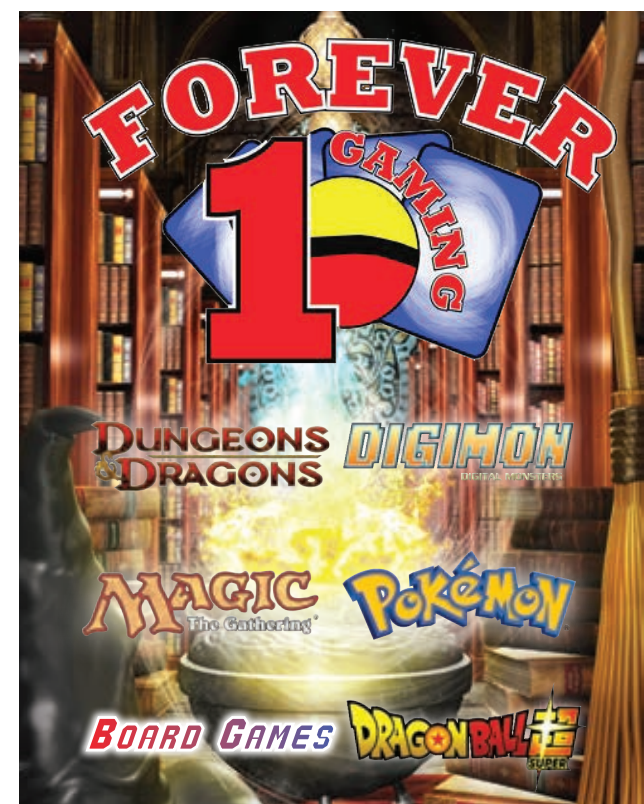

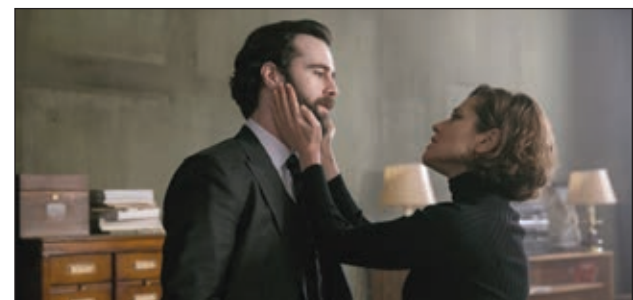

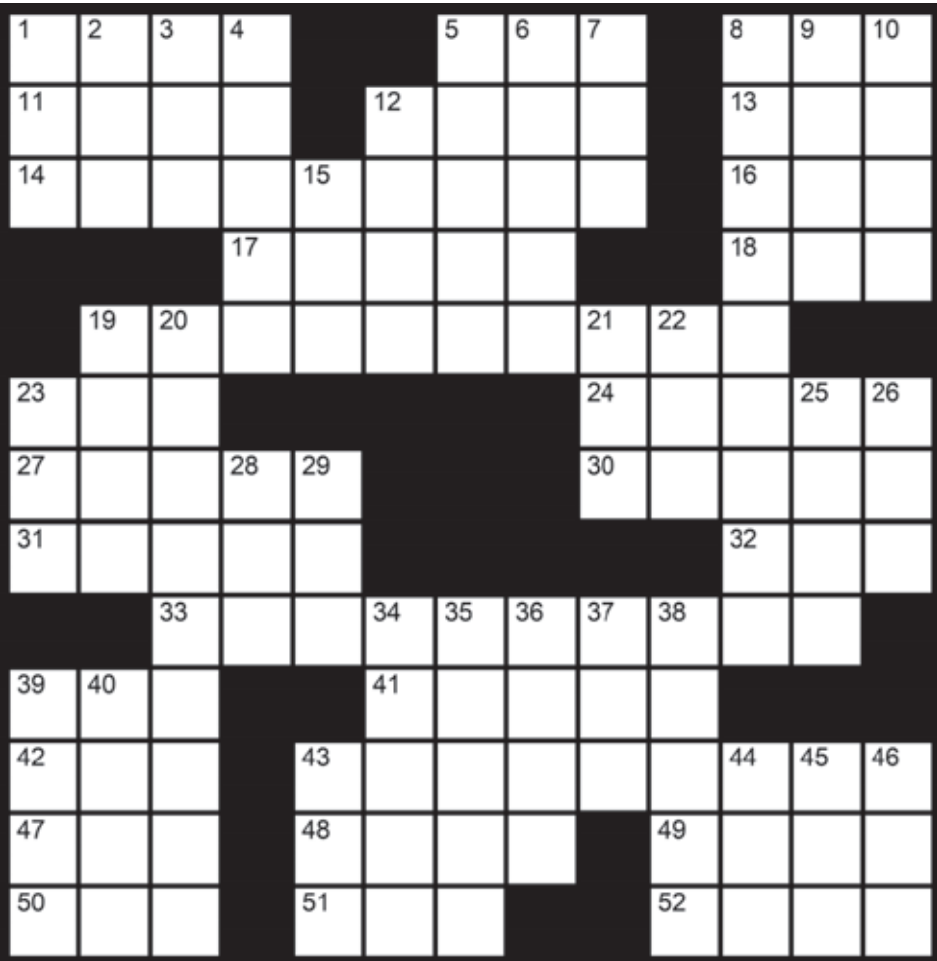
