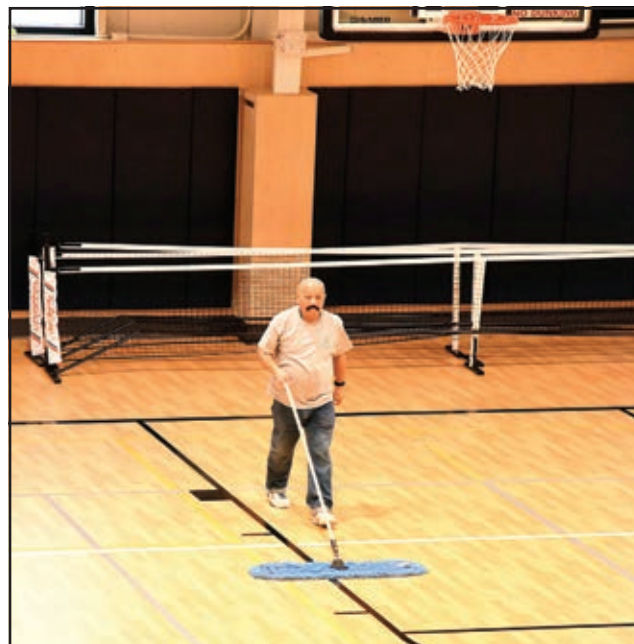
Cold outside, warm inside Community Center abuzz with activity

Jack Robinson to take Ward 1 seat

Jack Robinson is running unopposed for Jeff Leeman's seat as First Ward City Councilman in the April 5 municipal election.

The Democrat interviewed Robinson on several subjects, including his predecessor.

"I know Jeff," Robinson said. "I thought he did a good job, I think the whole council does a good job. I'm not running because I've got an agenda. I would like to continue many of the things they've done and try not to destroy anything that's good."

Robinson has attended some of the City Council meetings to familiarize himself with the processes of Sedalia government.

"I've been to a couple. I've been to two budget meetings. I've been kind of working my way into what's happening," Robinson said. "I've been around the city for a long time, and I've been on the school board, and the hospital board, and the Central Business District board and a bunch of other things, president of the water board for a long time, so I really know a lot about the adjacent operations that feed into the city."

Robinson has multiple degrees; one from Georgia Tech, another from MU and a third from Georgia State.

"I was a Chrysler dealer for 40 years at Bryant Motor Company, and then I worked at Printlynx," Robinson said. "I know enough about the parts of the community that need to work together to get things done."

Asked for his feelings about Sedalia, he thought before he answered.

"I like Sedalia," Robinson said. "A little conservative for me, but on the other hand, national politics don't need to really intrude in local politics. If they do, I think that's a mistake, because local politics should originate and be governed locally."

Robinson is encouraged by the diversity of Sedalia's populace, which was 90% white when he grew up here and now boasts more people of color.

"You also have other ethnicities that have come in which make the whole thing very interesting," Robinson said. "Ukrainians and Moldovans and Mennonites and all the different cultures. It's fun to walk downtown in the summer and maybe hear three or four languages spoken in a two-block stretch."

Robinson lobbied the mayor to get a Ukrainian flag flown as a show of support for the recently invaded nation.

"I thought it was appropriate," Robinson said. "We have a Ukrainian community here and we need to show them we support them."

New program discussed to support kindergarten students

During Monday night's Sedalia School District 200 Board of Education meeting, a new transitional kindergarten program at Heber Hunt Elementary was discussed for the 2022-23 school year.

Transitional kindergarten is intended for students who need additional support in early childhood and have late birthdays; April, May, June and July. These students will receive kindergarten instruction but at a slower pace. It helps build a bridge between pre-kindergarten to the kindergarten year.

Heber Hunt Principal Angie Meyer said they needed a program like this during the 2021-22 school year. The school had 21 students with May, June and July birthdays.

"We were looking at behaviors and the fact that it's not

running smoothly yet and usually by Christmas, it is," Meyer said. "So we really just looked inwardly."

The school looked at its procedures, systems, and routines to see if anything was out of place and then looked to see if it was pandemic related. The school looked at many different factors and it came down to a large number of May, June, and July birthdays and kids who haven't been to pre-school.

"Those are the ones that overall are struggling right now and they need another year of foundation to be set up academically, socially, all of it..." Meyer said.

Director of Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment K-5 Devon Gilmore said a question was asked regarding if a child born in April needs to go to transitional kindergarten.

Improv comedy returns to Liberty Center

The group's last performance was in January 2020, before the pandemic. "We will play the same games both Friday and Saturday," she continued. "But all of what we do is based on suggestions from the audience. We make things up on the spot, it's something new each time — so it can be a little challenging to rehearse for that."

She added the fun of improv is not seeing the same show twice. The show also "heavily relies on audience participation."

Don commuted from there to Cheyenne, WY, where he worked for United Airlines.

Scientists finally finish decoding entire human genome

Scientists say they have finally assembled the full genetic blueprint for human life, adding the missing pieces to a puzzle nearly completed two decades ago.

An international team described the first-ever sequencing of a complete human genome – the set of instructions to build and sustain a human being – in research published Thursday in the journal Science. The previous effort, celebrated across the world, was incomplete because DNA sequencing technologies of the day weren't able to read certain parts of it. Even after updates, it was missing about 8% of the genome.

"Some of the genes that make us uniquely human were actually in this 'dark matter of the genome' and they were totally missed," said Evan Eichler, a University of Washington researcher who participated in the current effort and the original Human Genome Project. "It took 20-plus years, but we finally got it done."

Many — including Eichler's own students — thought it had been finished already. "I was teaching them, and they said, 'Wait a minute. Isn't this like the sixth time you guys have declared victory? I said, 'No, this time we really, really did it!'"

Scientists said this full picture of the genome will give humanity a greater understanding of our evolution and biology while also opening the door to medical discoveries in areas like aging, neurodegenera-

tive conditions, cancer and heart disease.

"We're just broadening our opportunities to understand human disease," said Karen Miga, an author of one of the six studies published Thursday.

The research caps off decades of work. The first draft of the human genome was announced in a White House ceremony in 2000 by leaders of two competing entities: an international publicly funded project led by an agency of the U.S. National Institutes of Health and a private company, Maryland-based Celera Genomics.

The human genome is made up of about 3.1 billion DNA subunits, pairs of chemical bases known by the letters A, C, G and T. Genes are strings of these lettered pairs that contain instructions for making proteins, the building blocks of life. Humans have about 30,000 genes, organized in 23 groups called chromosomes that are found in the nucleus of every cell.

Before now, there were "large and persistent gaps that have been in our map, and these gaps fall in pretty important regions," Miga said.

Miga, a genomics researcher at the University of California-Santa Cruz, worked with Adam Phillippy of the National Human Genome Research Institute to organize the team of scientists to start from scratch with a new genome with the aim of sequencing all of it, including previously missing pieces. The group, named after the sections at the very ends

of chromosomes, called telomeres, is known as the Telomere-to-Telomere, or T2T, consortium.

Their work adds new genetic information to the human genome, corrects previous errors and reveals long stretches of DNA known to play important roles in both evolution and disease. A version of the research was published last year before being reviewed by scientific peers.

"This is a major improvement, I would say, of the Human Genome Project," doubling its impact, said geneticist Ting Wang of the Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, who was not involved in the research.

Eichler said some scientists used to think unknown areas contained "junk." Not him. "Some of us always believed there was gold in those hills," he said. Eichler is paid by the Howard Hughes Medical Institute, which also supports The Associated Press's health and science department.

Turns out that gold includes many important genes, he said, such as ones integral to making a person's brain bigger than a chimp's, with more neurons and connections.

To find such genes, scientists needed new ways to read life's cryptic genetic language.

Reading genes requires cutting the strands of DNA into pieces hundreds to thousands of letters long. Sequencing machines read the letters in each piece and scientists try to put the pieces in the right order. That's especially tough in areas

where letters repeat.

Scientists said some areas were illegible before improvements in gene sequencing machines that now allow them to, for example, accurately read a million letters of DNA at a time. That allows scientists to see genes with repeated areas as longer strings instead of snippets that they had to later piece together.

Researchers also had to overcome another challenge: Most cells contain genomes from both mother and father, confusing attempts to assemble the pieces correctly. T2T researchers got around this by using a cell line from one "complete hydatidiform mole," an abnormal fertilized egg containing no fetal tissue that has two copies of the father's DNA and none of the mother's.

The next step? Mapping more genomes, including ones that include collections of genes from both parents. This effort did not map one of the 23 chromosomes that is found in males, called the Y chromosome, because the mole contained only an X.

Wang said he's working with the T2T group on the Human Pangenome Reference Consortium, which is trying to generate "reference," or template, genomes for 350 people representing the breadth of human diversity.

"Now we've gotten one genome right and we have to do many, many more," Eichler said. "This is the beginning of something really fantastic for the field of human genetics."

S-C seniors receive honorable mention for Missouri Scholars 100

Smith-Cotton High School seniors Caroline Beard and Alisa Sonnik have received honorable mention for the 2022 Missouri Scholars 100, a statewide program that honors 100 of Missouri's top academic students in the graduating class of 2022. The announcement was made by S-C High Principal Wade Norton.

Missouri Scholars 100 is a program sponsored by the Missouri Association of Secondary School Principals. Schools across Missouri nominate candidates, with selection based primarily on a formula using the student's grade point average and ACT or SAT score. Each student nominated had first to meet criteria of an "Academic Decathlon," which included 10 events designed to assure the academic strength of the student. The student also

must be ranked in the upper 10% of the class and have taken high-level courses in mathematics, science, English, and foreign language. The student must also have excellent attendance, be an exemplary school citizen, and be involved in the school activity program.

Beard is the Smith-Cotton Student Council president, performs in the New Score Singers show choir and is active in theater, where she was student director for S-C's Theatre For A Cause production this year.

Sonnik performs with the S-C High orchestra, is a member of the Math Team and is the founder and director of the S-C National Honor Society's Tutoring Committee.

Robinson is impressed with the work the Public Works department has undertaken replacing water mains and then fixing the roads and sidewalks above them. He is also happy the city has torn down many unlivable houses.

"The council has done a great job in tearing down ramshackle houses, old houses that had been there

way too long," Robinson said. "I bike almost every day and I used to run every day. You see a lot more when you're biking and running than when you're driving, so I don't miss the old houses that were in disrepair, but it concerns me a little bit about where are those people that lived there, because obviously there were people living in those houses."

Robinson is complimentary of the work the City and Economic Development Sedalia-Pettis County have done to bring

big businesses to the area but suggests measured growth.

"I think we should have a kind of measured growth," Robinson said. "Economic Development has done a marvelous job. The Nucor plant with the attendant rail spur opens all that land up over there for more development, and is going to be great. It's what we needed, some higher paying jobs, not just one or two, not just management, but in all, they pay very well."

Missouri House slated to pass sweeping new abortion bill

The Republican-led Missouri House is set to pass legislation to defund Planned Parenthood, criminalize mail-order abortion medications, and allow wrongful death lawsuits in rare cases when infants are born alive after an abortion attempt and the infant then dies or is injured.

House lawmakers earlier this week blocked an attention-grabbing amendment to make it illegal to "aid or abet" abortions that violate Missouri law, even if they occur out of state.

Instead, the GOP swapped in another amendment that would make it a crime to provide abortion-inducing medications to women. Doctors could still provide those medicines.

Republican Rep. Brian Seitz, who sponsored the medication abortion bill, said the issue with the proposal to penalize helping women travel out of state for abortions was that it has not been vetted through a committee like his measure has.

If Roe v. Wade is overturned and abortion is banned in Missouri, Seitz's change would prohibit telemedicine abortions through medications.

"It's very important that states, especially typically pro-life states, have legislation already in place for the possible overturn of Roe v. Wade," Seitz said.

House members packed the abortion policies together in an omnibus bill Tuesday in hopes of passing the proposals by lawmakers' mid-May deadline despite ongoing GOP infighting

that's causing work in the Senate to move at a glacial pace.

Advocates of Planned Parenthood of the St. Louis Region and Southwest Missouri spokeswoman Bonyen Lee-Gilmore in a statement called the legislation "a kitchen-sink approach to banning reproductive freedom in Missouri."

"It unlawfully blocks Medicaid patients from preventive care at Planned Parenthood, it spreads inflammatory rhetoric, and seeks to ban common medications used for miscarriages, labor and delivery, and abortion," she said.

Under the amended bill, family members could also file wrongful death suits if infants born alive after an abortion attempt are injured or later die as a result of the attempted abortion. If the pregnancy is the result of rape, the bill would not allow the rapist to sue.

Republican Rep. Hannah Kelly, who sponsored a bill banning fetal tissue donations onto which the other abortion amendments were added, told colleagues during House floor debate Tuesday that the born-alive provision represents a chance for justice.

Democratic Rep. Keri Ingle warned that the threat of lawsuits would pit families against each other.

Instances of babies being born alive after an induced pregnancy termination are extremely rare.

A review by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of infant mortality data from 2003 and 2014 showed 143 deaths were of infants that displayed signs of life after an induced termination. That was a tiny fraction of the 315,000 infant deaths

during those 12 years, a period that also included 49 million live births.

In a majority of those cases, the abortion was induced due to a maternal complication or congenital anomaly in the fetus.

Mary Ziegler, a Florida State University law professor, said current homicide laws could already offer protections for infants born alive after abortions.

She said similar proposals nationally and in other states have mostly been used as a way for Republicans to show their opposition to abortion while forcing Democrats to argue against bills with the stated intent of cracking down on infanticide.

"What they've been historically designed to do is to frame the debate around issues that are really uncomfortable for supporters of abortion rights," Ziegler said of similar proposals.

The Missouri measure also includes yet another attempt by Republican lawmakers to strip Planned Parenthood of any public funding, including clinics that do not provide abortions.

Lawmakers were able to stop money from going to Planned Parenthood in the 2019 fiscal year by forgoing some federal funding to avoid requirements that the clinics be reimbursed if low-income patients go there for birth control, cancer screenings and other preventative care. Missouri instead used state money to pay for those services.

To help address this, when open enrollment occurs from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. July 26 and from 1 p.m. to 7 p.m. July 27, there will be a screening for all kids going into kindergarten. The district will send out a pre-registration form beforehand and make it available on Sedalia200.org.

"Because there are going to be kids that come in day one of kindergarten, they missed kindergarten enrollment, we're going to somewhat of a soft start when we first start school," Meyer said. "Where we don't have set kindergarten teachers, they (kids) will have set place to go for the first eight days but during that time we're going to teach our routines and procedures and observe kids."

This is to see which kids would be better suited for transitional kindergarten and then start contacting parents. This program

isn't meant for all kids but for those who need extra classroom support. There will be one current teacher at Heber Hunt who will work with this class.

"They will receive the kindergarten instruction, but it will be at a slower pace," Gilmore added.

The students in transitional kindergarten will learn social and emotional skills like walking in hallways, sitting at a table or desk, and playing on the playground with other students.

Research shows an increase in academic proficiency in students that attended transitional kindergarten versus students who didn't.

The kindergarten team has met many times to try and figure out what those students need in a classroom setting, such as learning how to use a school restroom. It is all trying to get them ready for a normal school day and to be comfortable and safe on that day.

If the board approves

the program at its next meeting, Meyer and Gilmore will start building the criteria and look at students individually to see what they need.

At the end of the school year, the transitional kindergarten team will assess how the year went for each student and then decide if they should spend another year in a normal kindergarten class or are ready to move on to the next grade. This process will include individual meetings with each parent to make this decision.

If there is a parent who doesn't want their child in the transitional kindergarten, the child won't be part of the program. But, Gilmore noted the team will need the parents' support to make this work.

"Parents are part of our team and we'll be a big part of this process," Gilmore said. "When we talk about a transitional kindergarten team, we have our school, but parents are part of that as well."

Aja Johnson, 36, was charged with second-degree endangering the welfare of a child after the boy was shot at a home on Tuesday in north St. Louis.

According to a probable cause statement, three children were unattended while playing in a bedroom where a

loaded gun was lying on a bed.

The children had played with the gun during previous visits, according to the statement.

A 10-year-old, thinking it was unloaded, pointed the gun at his brother and fired, police said.

Johnson told police

the gun was hers, that she had left it in the bedroom and that "she was to blame for (the victim's) death," according to the affidavit.

Johnson was being held without bail on Thursday at the City Justice Center. It was not immediately clear if she has a lawyer.

'I'm in' to God

I use the voice-text tool on my phone a lot. It is convenient to let voice-text do the typing for me instead of typing my message out on that tiny keyboard. I even use voice-text when I draft emails from my phone. As technology has improved, the voice-text tool has become more and more accurate. It is not perfect, though. When I say names, the voice-text gizmo is likely to spell them wrong or forget to capitalize the first letter. The vagaries of voice-text can be humorous. They can also be embarrassing. It pays to proofread!

Recently, the voice-text gizmo on my phone has struggled to understand me when

I say the word "amen." I use that word a lot, especially when I send a prayer in a text message. Many times, over the last several weeks, when I have said "amen" the voice-text gizmo has typed, "I'm in." At first, I just found it annoying because I say amen a lot and so I have had to correct my text messages a lot.

It has occurred to me, though, that the voice-text gizmo may not be so far off. After all, the definition of "amen" is "so be it." When a person says "amen," they are saying "So be it" or "Yes!" or "I agree" or "I'm in!"

That is a terrific way to think about what we are really saying when we add our "amen" at the end of a prayer or during a sermon. When the preacher or the prayer hits home with the message, I'm in!

Perhaps that is what Peter, James, and John said to Jesus when they pulled their boats ashore and left everything they had

ever known to follow Him (Luke 5:11). It was not an automatic response. Peter needed proof and, even when he got it, he still hesitated. He cried out that he was a sinner and not worthy to follow such a one as Jesus. Eventually, though, he said, "I'm in."

It takes a lot to say our "I'm in" to God. We need to believe that we are taking the right step. We need to have a sense that we are on the right path. We need to be prepared and well-nourished. So, where can we find this right path? Where will we find the kind of food that nourishes our souls and prepares us for ministry? I believe the guidance and nourishment we need may be found in the wonderful communities within our community that we call "the Church."

When we come together as a congregation, we travel together on a path of constant discovery of what God has in store for us.

Within a congregation, we can engage with a community that nourishes us, body, mind, and spirit, joining others in the journey of faith.

The community of faith that is the Church is expressed in many wonderful ways here in our area. By joining the journey of faith shared within a congregation, we are energized to say "I'm in" to God. Singing God's praises, hearing God's Word, and sharing in fellowship with those also on the journey of faith nourishes us for all God calls us to do.

Every day of our lives we wake up with the same calling. It is the call to listen for God and to say our bold "I'm in." The communities of faith we share nourish us for the journey. If you are not a part of a worshiping community, I encourage you to consider attending Church this Sunday or sometime soon.

Got a dime? Businesses seek Treasury help with coin shortage

WASHINGTON (AP) — Got a dime you can spare? Coins are in short supply — again.

Retailers, laundromats and other businesses that rely on coins want Americans to empty their piggy banks and look under couch cushions for extra change and "get coin moving."

A group of trade associations that represent individual businesses including banks, retail outlets, truck stops, grocery stores and more is asking the Treasury Department for more help convincing Americans to get coins back in circulation.

The consequences of the circulation slowdown hit people who don't have an ability to pay for items electronically, they say.

"If retailers are not able to offer change for cash purchases consumers

who rely on cash will be vulnerable," the associations said in a letter to Treasury.

For example, people who do their laundry at coin laundry mats could have a harder time finding change to wash their clothes. And on a larger scale, people who don't have cash access aren't able to patronize certain card-only businesses.

It's not a coin shortage America faces, but a lack of circulation.

"We can't print our way out of this problem," said Austen Jensen, a senior vice president for government affairs at the Retail Industry Leaders Association.

Jensen's group, along with the American Bankers Association, National Association of Convenience Stores, and National Grocers Association, is trying to meet consumer demand and wants a new public campaign to increase coin circulation.

Jensen said his group is also encouraging member retailers to find creative

ways to deal with the shortage of coins, including rounding-up purchases for charity promotions. And he says businesses with multiple locations could send coins from one store to another.

This is not the first time during the pandemic that the issue of low coin circulation has arisen.

The coronavirus disrupted consumers' buying habits and shifted purchases largely to plastic cards to such an extent that in July 2020, the Federal Reserve restricted coin orders by financial institutions.

The Fed also convened a U.S. Coin Task Force, made up of representatives from various federal agencies, which led to a campaign encouraging the public to get coins into circulation.

This February, the task force issued a State of Coin report, which said pandemic lockdowns slowed small transactions that generated change and there was a temporary aversion to cash for

perceived hygienic reasons. The report also said the Federal Reserve and the U.S. Mint contracted with a third party consultant to review the coin supply chain.

Coin deposit volumes began to increase gradually starting in the summer of 2020, but businesses say the problem has come up again as people have stopped using coins and have stuck to plastic cards.

The issue has had the biggest impact on people who don't have bank accounts. An estimated 22% of U.S. Americans were "unbanked" or "underbanked" in 2019, according to the Federal Reserve.

The Treasury Department has yet to respond to the letter. The government encourages people to help get coin moving by spending it with retailers, taking it to their banks and credit unions, or using a coin recycling kiosk like the ones found at grocery stores.

Construction contract for wrestling facility approved

WARRENSBURG — Construction for the Roger Denker Wrestling Facility is a step closer to beginning.

The University of Central Missouri Board of Governors approved the construction of the new facility during its Thursday, March 24, meeting, as announced in a press release Wednesday, March 30.

The board accepted a contract of \$1,054,000 with E&K Construction to provide labor, materials and provisions necessary to construct the room.

"We are extremely excited about the Board of Governors' action to approve a new wrestling facility," Vice President for Intercollegiate Athletics Jerry Hughes stated in the release. "The facility will provide a permanent home for the UCM wrestling program and will help with the recruitment of excellent young men to compete at a high level for Mules wrestling."

The Roger Denker Wrestling Facility, which benefits from gifts from

former UCM wrestlers Dan Power and Gary Ervin, is in memory of Denker, who coached Mules wrestling from 1963-81.

The facility will be located inside the natatorium of the Multipurpose room, replacing the indoor swimming pool.

The pool will be infilled with gravel with a new slab on top. Afterward, a sprung floor system for the wrestling mat area will be installed.

The project will also convert an office into a wrestling center entry, an existing storage room into a coaches' office and renovation of an existing office to relocate entry. A new storefront is also planned.

"It's an honor to receive such strong support from our wrestling alumni," UCM President Dr. Roger Best said in a release. "We look forward to having this dedicated, premier wrestling facility for our student-athletes to compete and succeed in, particularly given it is named for long-time coach Roger Denker."

SFCC Athletics announces 2022 Hall of Fame class

A former basketball standout and a staple of the school's athletics will be recognized by State Fair Community College next month.

Former men's basketball player Kenny Chery, along with Denny Perkins, the longtime voice of the Roadrunners, will be inducted into the SFCC Athletics Hall of Fame as the Class of 2022 at a ceremony on May 13.

Chery, an Honorable Mention All-American and First-team All-Region 16 selection his sophomore year of 2013, helped the Roadrunners to a 20-10 record by averaging 16.4 points, ninth-best for a single season in program history.

That season, Chery led SFCC in an upset of fifth-ranked Iowa Western Community College with 27 points and eight rebounds, and later an upset over 23rd-ranked Mineral Area College with 28 points and eight rebounds. He compiled 105 assists while committing only 51 turnovers that year, and his average of 3.96 assists as a freshman is still 10th-best by a Roadrunner for a single campaign.

Following his years with the Roadrunners, Chery helped Baylor finish 26-12 and to reach the Sweet 16, earning himself an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention from the Associated Press.

Perking was the play-by-play voice for State

Fair's athletics for over a quarter-century before passing away at the age of 55 on Jan. 24, 2018.

"He did everything for our programs," SFCC athletic director Darren Pannier said. "He went to all the away games, even though he had to get up at 4:30 in the morning to be back on the air by 5:00. There were nights that we would get back at 3:00 and Denny would just go back to work. That meant a lot to us, because at the time we were trying to build our program. He was a big part of that. He had the unique ability to make you feel like you were inside the arena, even though you might be listening to the game in your car or your living room."

His broadcast career spanned over 1,080 games, illuminating the action with his signature call of "Splash!" for every made 3-pointer by the Roadrunners. Perking was also an active member of the SFCC Roadrunner Booster Club over the years, and hosted the Coaches' Show to provide a closer look at the men's and women's basketball programs.

"Denny should have been a basketball coach," longtime broadcast partner Alan McCurdy said in a statement following his passing. "I learned a lot just from sitting next to him. He would be calling

the game and telling the listeners what strategies were going to be used in the game or should have been used in the game. He was not only the 'Voice of the Roadrunners' but also deep down he was a coach. He was also a guy who could call a basketball game while eating a bag of popcorn and chewing on a straw. We had a very long relationship and total respect for each

other. He will be sorely missed. He was one-of-a-kind."

In addition, Perkins was a KSIS radio personality in Sedalia and voiced Smith-Cotton Tigers football. He was also involved in a number of community projects, including the Community Santa Program that helped raise money for area children to provide gifts to open on Christmas.

Royals exercise option to keep Matheny through 2023 season

The Kansas City Royals exercised their club option on Mike Matheny for the 2023 season on Thursday, eliminating any uncertainty over whether their manager will remain with the club after the coming season.

Matheny is entering his third season with the Royals, which includes the COVID-19-shortened 2020 season and his first 162-game run as the manager last season. He is 100-122 with Kansas City and 691-596 overall, which includes seven seasons as the manager of the cross-state St. Louis Cardinals.

"Mike is one of the finest leaders I've been around and the Royals are fortunate to have him managing our team," Royals President Dayton Moore said. "He is a tremendous competitor who cares deeply about players, the Kansas City community and this great game of baseball."

The decision to retain Matheny was largely a

foregone conclusion. And they're just beginning to see the fruits of their labors as a talented, young bunch of starting pitchers establish themselves in the big leagues and more young help is on the way.

Brad Keller, Brady Singer and Kris Bubic

are all 20-something pitchers who have taken some lumps but showed plenty of promise, and shortstop Bobby Witt Jr. — the No. 1 prospect in baseball — is elbowing his way onto the opening day roster.

Heading into Thursday, Witt was hitting .476 with two homers and six RBIs in eight spring training games.

The Royals also have outfielder Kyle Isbel and catcher MJ Melendez in the pipeline, and it's possible both could join Witt in the big leagues this season.

Louisville rides Van Lith's energy to women's Final Four

Hailey Van Lith's energy level never seems to wane, mainly because the Louisville guard seems to do everything at full speed.

Maybe Van "Lift" would be a more appropriate spelling for what she does for the Cardinals heading into Friday's women's Final Four showdown against top-ranked South Carolina.

Van Lith has split defenders with quick bursts to the basket, and faked others by stopping on a dime to spot up and shoot. She has outworked taller opponents for defensive rebounds and picked off passes to create opportunities at the other end of the floor.

At the end of games Van Lith looked completely drained walking off the court. But she has walked away happy during the NCAA Tournament victories and has the Cardinals within two

wins of their first national championship.

"I actually train for this, I want this moment and I actually condition after games if I feel like I didn't get enough minutes in," Van Lith said Wednesday. "I want to be in the best shape of my life and I want to be able to outrun people all game and just overwork them. You might be able to guard me for two quarters, but the next two or mine because I'm in better shape."

Top-seeded Louisville

(29-4) is back in the NCAA women's basketball Final Four for the first time since 2018 thanks to four consecutive 20-point performances by the 5-foot-7 sophomore from Wenatchee, Washington. The stretch includes 22 in Monday night's 62-50 Wichita Region final victory over Michigan in which Van Lith earned MVP honors.

As a sophomore, Van Lith has ratcheted up her play this season.

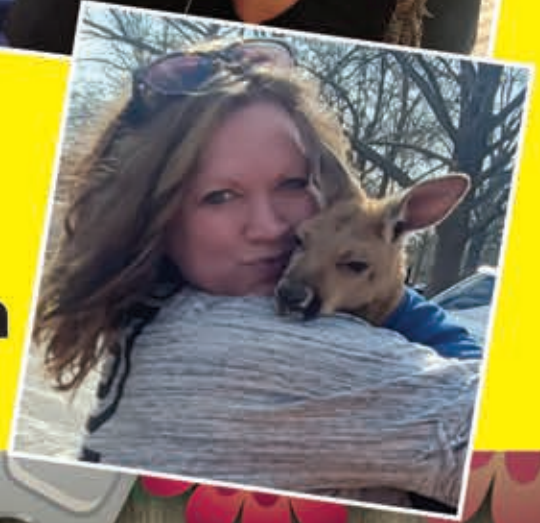

MLB, players keep automatic runners in extras for 2022

NEW YORK (AP) — Major League Baseball finalized the rules change Thursday to bring back automatic runners in extra innings for a third straight season.

Despite an easing of pandemic restrictions, MLB and the players' association agreed to keep the controversial rule that starts each team with a runner on second base during extra innings for the 2022 regular season.

The agreement regarding on-field rules modifications also includes expanding active rosters from 26 players to 28 from opening day on April 7 through May 1 this year,

due to the delayed start of spring training.

Another new rule benefits Angels two-way star Shohei Ohtani. With the designated hitter adopted in both leagues, pitchers who start games in the batting order can remain in the game as a DH after leaving the mound. A DH can also enter the game to pitch. That change will apply to multiple seasons.

"The expansion of the designated hitter and giving two-way players enhanced flexibility to showcase their talents will benefit the game for the foreseeable future," union director of player services Kevin Slowey said in a statement. "The roster and extra-inning adjustments will also serve to protect

the health and safety of players during what will be a unique 2022 season."

The "zombie" runner modification was applied to the 2020 and 2021 regular seasons as part of adjustments due to COVID-19.

There were 78 extra-inning games during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, and the longest by innings were a pair of 13-inning contests at Houston, won by the Los Angeles Dodgers on July 29 and by Oakland on Aug. 7. Every previous season since 1901 had at least one game of 15 innings or longer.

There were 233 extra-inning games last year, and the longest was the Dodgers' 16-inning win at

the San Diego Padres on Aug. 25.

The modification for 2020 and 2021 that shortened doubleheaders to scheduled seven-inning games was not continued for 2022.

Active rosters will be 28 from opening day through May 1; 26 from May 2 through Aug. 31; and 28 for the rest of the regular season. Last season, the limit was 26 from opening day through Aug. 31, then 28.

Rookie qualifications going forward will remain the same as in 2021, when September days were not excluded toward the threshold of 45 days for the exhaustion of rookie status in future seasons.

After a promising rookie debut as the Cardinals' No. 3 scorer behind All-American Dana Evans and Kianna Smith, she leads Louisville at 14.5 points per game to go with 3.4 rebounds. Van Lith was a first team All-ACC selection along with good friend and teammate Emily Engstler.

Since scoring just eight points in the Cardinals' Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament loss to Miami, Van Lith has averaged 21.5 points on 47% shooting while playing 34.5 minutes. During their 68-59 second round NCAA Tournament win over Gonzaga, she scored 10 points to spark a 15-3 third-quarter run, celebrating a 3-pointer by throwing three fingers in the air while appearing to pirouette toward the cheering home crowd.

"Honestly, it's because I love basketball," she said, explaining her emotional reactions after a big play. "That's just the passionate side of me."

Van Lith's intense play reflects the impression late Hall of Famer Kobe Bryant had on her. Van Lith attended his camp while in high school and her Instagram page — with nearly 700,000 followers — features several pictures of her with Bryant and his daughter Gigi. Both Bryant and his daughter flew to Washington to catch one of her games.

Bryant and his daughter died in a helicopter crash in January 2020, and Van Lith embraces the NBA great's "Mamba Mentality" by being passionate and working for daily improvement.

Workouts with her father, Corey, helped toughen Van Lith. Those close to her emphasize her relentless practice ethic to correct any little flaw in her game, even after a good night.

"She just has this motor that just never stops," said Brent Darnell, who coached Van Lith at Cashmere High School

in Washington. "She just wants more and more and more and more. I've never seen a kid, never seen any athlete that pushes themselves as hard as her."

As confetti fluttered down after Monday night's clinching win, Van Lith was asked what Bryant would tell her in that moment. She smiled and responded saying the former Laker would give her profanity-laced advice to point out her job isn't done. The interview clip went viral.

"I told no lies," Van Lith said. "Maybe next time I'll censor the second cuss word."

When Van Lith was going through a slow scoring start during which makeable shots for her weren't falling, neither the Cardinals nor coach Jeff Walz were concerned about her pulling it together.

"That was never the issue for her," said the 15th-year coach, who's entering his fourth Final Four with Louisville.

"We went through a stretch where I think we had four games and had three or four different leading scorers.

"Hailey is playing some great basketball right now. She's been pretty efficient in a lot of our games. She handles the physicality well. She's able to get to the rim. ... The kid is a baller."

And apparently she is a well-liked baller. That seems apparent from Van Lith's social media popularity, which has helped her cash in on name, image and likeness (NIL).

She signed a partnership deal last summer with sports representation firm Octagon and has endorsement deals with sportswear maker Adidas and Dick's Sporting Goods, among others. Opendorse, an NIL company that provides technology to the athlete endorsement industry, ranks Van Lith's Instagram value second to UConn's Paige Bueckers at \$37,231.71 per post among men's and women's basketball players in this year's Final Four.

Right now, though, all Van Lith is looking for is a way to beat the Gamecocks.

Relieved more than joyful, US turns attention to Qatar

SAN JOSE Costa Rica (AP) — Christian Pulisic and Tyler Adams had relief on their faces as they headed straight from the stadium for a charter jet to Europe and weekend club games.

"This is whatever I've always wanted to be, and right now emotions are a bit crazy," Pulisic said, his voice quavering.

Coach Gregg Berhalter had rushed out for a red-eye to New York and a 12 1/2-hour connecting flight to Friday's World Cup draw in Doha.

Recovering from the past and preparing for the future intertwined as the United States clinched a return to the World Cup.

For Pulisic, DeAndre Yedlin, Kellyn Acosta and Paul Arriola, all on that doomed American team at Trinidad 4 1/2 years earlier, the pain had not gone away until now. The 2-0 loss to Costa Rica on Wednesday night was deflating, but by the time players entered the locker room of Estadio Nacional, focus turned to the accomplishment of clinching a return to soccer's showcase for the first time since 2014.

Erik Palmer-Brown started popping open the Duet Mosseux Brut even as Berhalter was giving his speech. Then the new JBL Boombox 2 got to blare.

"We're the youngest team to ever qualify for the World Cup, youngest U.S. team, and we'll be the youngest team at the World Cup," Berhalter said. "That's an accomplishment for these guys. It really is."

They had traveled 25,042 miles on charters — circling the globe adds to only 24,901 — making four trips to Central America, plus one each to Mexico, Canada and Jamaica, plus up to five trans-Atlantic round trips. Forty-four players were called in, of which 38 took the field. In all, 114 players have been used since Trinidad, 88 since Berhalter was

hired in December 2018.

Pulisic had buried his face in his hands at Couva, wiping away tears.

"That was one of the toughest days of my life. I'll never forget it," he recalled. "Now to be in this position. — qualified for a World Cup, we're all extremely proud."

Berhalter admitted the pressure was omnipresent.

"The public was on edge. They desperately wanted us to make it," he said.

All of 23, Pulisic, Adams and Weston McKennie are the team leaders. Right back Sergiño Dest and left back Antonee Robinson became offensive threats. Gio Reyna, at 19, emerged a budding star, just like his dad three decades earlier.

"Now we have to test ourselves against the best players in the world, the best teams in the world," Adams said. "This was only the first stage in our development."

Berhalter is among a 12-person U.S. Soccer Federation attending the draw, mapping out Qatar plans for a tournament that opens Nov. 21, in the middle of European club seasons.

Four games are likely in June, two in the CONCACAF Nations League and two exhibitions, followed by a pair of friendlies in September, possibly in Europe. Major League Soccer players may have a domestic training camp before the tournament.

And if the U.S. winds up in Groups E through G, which don't start play until Nov. 24-25, the Americans might train in Europe for several days and have one more exhibition before heading to the Middle East.

"The starting point is getting out of the group," Berhalter said.

USSF staff locked down hotel and training arrangements on Oct. 1, 2019, the day the portal opened, putting the team in an optimum logistical situation.

Berhalter presumes form will change between now and November, causing roster churn. He was impressed with the growth over 14 qualifiers in temperatures that ranged from minus-3 degrees (minus-16 Celsius) in St. Paul, Minnesota, and 85 degrees (29 Celsius) in Austin, Texas.

"I think we improved our pressing," he said. "But we're going to continue to evolve and to continue to improve. The 4-3-3 system as it's been good for us, we might work with some other systems just to have some flexibility in the World Cup. I think it's important to see who we are playing and start planning out how we can be successful there."

For all the positive feelings, the U.S. dropped to third among eight nations in North and Central America and the Caribbean, behind Canada and Mexico. If not for last week's 0-0 draw at

Mexico, the Americans would have finished fourth and wound up in a June playoff against New Zealand.

"The easy part is over, and now we focus on this draw," said defender Walker Zimmerman, who rose like a rocket from initially off the roster in October to starting nine of the past 11 games. "Ultimately just focus on staying fit, staying healthy, performing for our clubs."

Forward remains a concern. After scoring three goals over two games last fall, Ricardo Pepi has gone scoreless in 19 games for club and country. Strikers produced just four of the Americans' 21 goals, with Jesús Ferreira getting the other.

"We're hoping that one of our 9s gets into a good form by the time the World Cup comes around," Berhalter said Thursday during a lay-over at JFK International Airport.

Midfielders and wingers have been the engine, with Pulisic scoring five of the team's 21 goals, and McKennie, Brenden Aaronson and Robinson two each.

"We can do a lot of damage, man," Pulisic said. "I think we're a confident bunch of guys and I think that country will get behind us and we're going to give everything we got."

"I just like the fight of his team and I think we have a lot of quality, as well," he added. "I think we can be a force going into the World Cup."

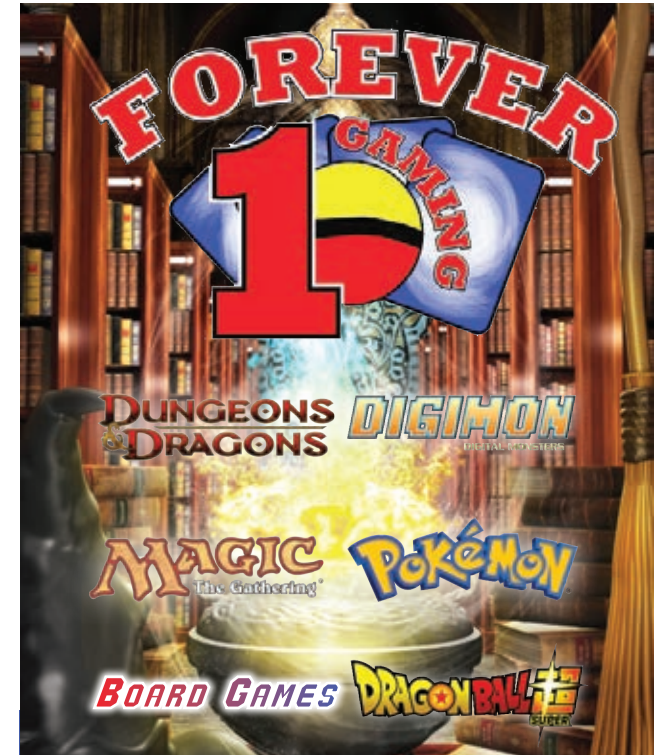

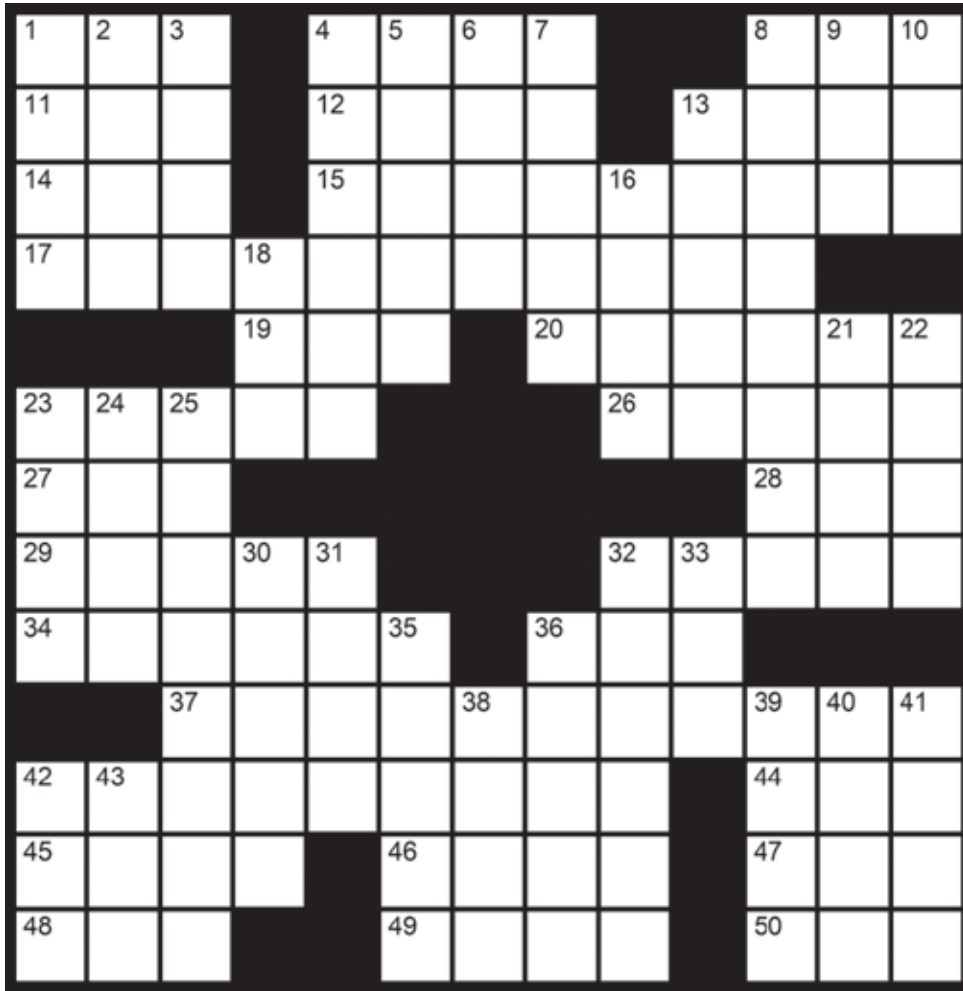

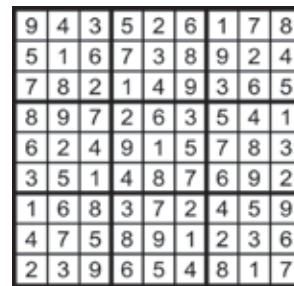
