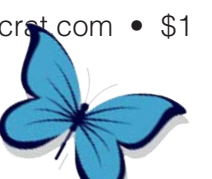

Flying in for the Festival of Butterflies

On Thursday, the 25th anniversary of the Festival of Butterflies opened to the public at Powell Gardens with a focus on species from Madagascar and native or migratory butterflies in Missouri.

The main show of the festival is in the conservatory with butterfly species and plants from Madagascar.

Lead Horticulturist of Children's Garden & Heartland Harvest Garden Eric Perrette, of Lee's Summit, has been a part of the Festival of Butterflies for 16 years and raises native butterflies.

Perrette said that for the festival, the gardens have really tuned into regions of the world for the past few years. Last year, the gardens focused on

Peru, where the largest population of butterflies live.

"(This year) Madagascar stuck because there were some varieties of butterflies and we knew that we could get some different plants from Madagascar to tell a different story," Perrette said.

In the conservatory, guests will see thousands of butterflies that went through the process of eclosion in the conservatory along with tropical plants. The conservatory is where the butterflies will spend their two- to three-week life.

Perrette said the main attraction in the conservatory is the Blue Morpho butterfly, a large vibrant blue butterfly, which is the butterfly recognized the most.

Officer Schmitt named 'Officer of the Year' by Traffic Safety Council

Sedalia Police Officer Kyle Schmitt has been named 'Officer of the Year' by the Missouri Law Enforcement Traffic Safety Advisory Council.

Schmitt began his law enforcement career as a dispatcher in 2016 and became an SPD officer in 2018.

"My whole career has been here," Schmitt said. "I was raised here, spent pretty much my whole life here. My entire family has been very supportive of me being in law enforcement in general. My command staff, the Traffic Unit, and everybody on my shift is very supportive with getting me motivat-

ed to go out, not only for traffic enforcement but specifically impaired-driving enforcement."

Schmitt was surprised when a LETSAC board member told him he had been nominated for the award, but he knew his chances of winning were slim.

"We're considered a large department that goes against Kansas City, St. Louis, all these large departments that have specific DWI enforcement units," Schmitt said. "When I was nominated and told I would be going against them, I was somewhat skeptical because that's a lot of people to compete with."

In 2021, Schmitt made over 700 traffic stops netting almost 90 driving-while-intoxicated arrests.

"Impaired driving enforcement is the most direct way law enforcement saves lives," Schmitt said. "The LETSAC board noted that I made 89 arrests last year, and that

coming from somebody that's not on a specialty unit. I still do calls for service, I still have many other hats that I have to wear because I'm a patrol officer, but when I get the opportunity, I go out and attempt to find either a drunk or drugged driver

to get off the streets."

Schmitt is responsible for making 248 alcohol-related driving arrests in the past three years.

"Kyle is a very motivated, reliable and hardworking officer," Sedalia Police Chief Matthew Wirt said.

Saengerfest returns as Ukrainian fundraiser

After surviving the COVID pandemic, the 29th annual Saengerfest in Cole Camp will return on July 30 with a new focus.

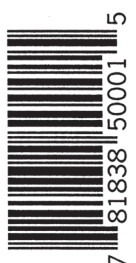

Americans filing jobless claims at highest level in 8 months

WASHINGTON (AP) — The number of Americans applying for unemployment benefits last week rose to the highest level in more than eight months in what may be a sign that the labor market is weakening.

Applications for jobless aid for the week ending July 16 rose by 7,000 to 251,000, up from the previous week's 244,000, the Labor Department reported Thursday. That's the most since Nov. 13, 2021, when 265,000 Americans applied for benefits.

Analysts surveyed by the data firm FactSet expected the number to come in at 242,000.

First-time applications generally reflect layoffs.

The four-week average for claims, which smooths out some of the

week-to-week volatility, rose by 4,500 from the previous week, to 240,500.

The total number of Americans collecting jobless benefits for the week ending July 9 rose by 51,000 from the previous week, to 1,384,000. That figure has been near 50-year lows for months.

Earlier this month, the Labor Department reported that employers added 372,000 jobs in June, a surprisingly robust gain and similar to the pace of the previous two months. Economists had expected job growth to slow sharply last month given the broader signs of economic weakness.

The unemployment rate remained 3.6% for a fourth straight month, matching a near-50-year low that was reached before the pandemic struck in early 2020.

The government also reported earlier in July that U.S. employers advertised fewer jobs in May amid signs that the economy is weakening, though the overall demand for workers remained strong. There are nearly two job openings for every unemployed person.

Consumer prices are still soaring, up 9.1% in June compared with a year earlier, the biggest yearly increase since 1981, the government reported last week.

The number of Americans applying for unemployment benefits last week hit its highest level in nearly 8 months, but the total number of those collecting benefits fell. The Labor Department also reported last week that inflation at the wholesale level climbed 11.3% in June from a year earlier.

All of those figures

paint a divergent picture of the post-pandemic economy: Inflation is hammering household budgets, forcing consumers to pull back on spending, and growth is weakening, heightening fears the economy could fall into recession.

In an effort to combat the worst inflation in more than four decades, the Federal Reserve raised rates by a half-point in May and another rare three-quarter point increase last month. Most economists expect the Federal Reserve to jack up its borrowing rate another half-to-three-quarters of a point when it meets later this month.

Though the labor market is still strong, there have been some high-profile layoffs announced recently by Tesla, Netflix, Carvana, Redfin and Coinbase.

New walking group available for veterans

WARRENSBURG — Veterans and Warrensburg community members now have a new walking group to join.

Warrensburg Walking Warriors was created in April by Natalie Avery, MSN, BSN, BA, Family Nurse Practitioner, and Christina Rush, MSN, BSN, RN; Care Provider for PACT03 at the Warrensburg VA Outpatient Clinic.

Both Avery and Rush have wanted to create a walking group for the community. After the COVID pandemic, they thought it would be a perfect time to start the group and help get people outdoors again.

"It has been a long-term goal of mine to start a walking club for our community," Avery said. "Coming out of COVID and quarantine, it became abundantly clear the need for returned socialization, getting outdoors, and rebuilding relationships. Christina and I wanted to create something that would be outdoors, incorporate all family members, with a focus on health, fun and fitness."

The walking club is also a way to meet new people. Rush is new to Warrensburg, so the club has introduced her to new connections within the community.

"Natalie and I have a lot in common when it comes to health and wellness, and we had been talking about a walking club for a little while and decided to bring these ideas to fruition," Rush said. "It has been such an incredible experience. My family and I are fairly new to this community, but it sure has a very warm

welcome and the people here are so great; we are very fortunate to call this community our home. Starting this walking group has been such an awesome experience and we look forward to seeing what the walking club has in store not only for us but for our community."

The goal of the walking group is to help mental and physical well-being by encouraging members to go outside and exercise. The founders also want veterans to know they are appreciated and have support from the community.

"The ultimate goal is to build camaraderie, break isolation and loneliness, build rapport, establish new friendships, improve mental health, and physical health, all while getting some exercise outdoors," Rush said. "We have an amazing resource in our community, the Warrensburg VA Outpatient Clinic, which includes not only primary care but also optometry and audiology, and want to remind veterans that we are here for them."

The Warrensburg Walking Warriors meet on the first Monday of every month. Eventually, they would like to meet more often and maybe even work their way to a 5K. Avery and Rush coordinate with the Kansas City VA on walking programs and events.

The walk begins at the start of the Spirit Trail, and each walker can choose their own distance.

"Most of us in Warrensburg have a tie to a veteran. Our spouse, child, parent, grandparent, other family member or neighbor have most likely served at one time or another,"

Avery said. "We welcome everyone with all abilities. Everyone picks their own speed and distance, so all are welcome. If someone is unsure of what they are able to do, we encourage them to come and talk to me or Christina, and we can help them pick a distance. We can also help facilitate setting up a walking partner of similar ability."

The group has been a success so far, and they are excited to see it grow more. The two have big plans for the group's future.

"We have had an awesome response and turnout with the walking club and we hope to continue to grow," Avery said. "Long term, we would love to meet weekly if public interest supports this. We would also like to include more information and education in regards to health, fitness and nutrition. We are looking into some fun events, 5Ks (walk or run) and being able to do some fun raffles. We are hoping as we grow, we will have more volunteers to help."

Warrensburg Walking Warriors will be participating in the Veteran Obesity Awareness 2K Walk & Roll on Saturday, September 17 at the National WWI Museum and Memorial.

Veterans interested in joining can speak with their provider at the Warrensburg Outpatient Clinic or contact their PACT team. Veterans can also come by and pick up a flyer and talk to the front desk or call 816-922-2165. There is also a Facebook page that anyone is welcome to join, to stay up to date on the latest activities and get some daily motivation.

GOP AGs ask Google not to limit anti-abortion center results

RICHMOND, Va. (AP) — A month after some members of Congress urged Google to limit the appearance of anti-abortion pregnancy centers in certain abortion-related search results, 17 Republican attorneys general are warning the company that doing so could invite investigations and possible legal action.

"Suppressing pro-life and pro-mother voices at the urging of government officials would violate the most fundamental tenet of the American marketplace of ideas," the attorneys general wrote in a letter Thursday to Sundar Pichai, CEO of Google and its parent company.

The effort was led by Republican Virginia Attorney General Jason Miyares and Kentucky Attorney General Daniel Cameron, and the letter was shared with The Associated Press ahead of its public release.

The Republicans took issue with a June 17 letter to the company from U.S. Sen. Mark Warner, D-Virginia, and Rep. Elissa Slotkin, D-Michigan, which was co-signed by 19 other members of Congress.

That letter cites re-

search by the nonprofit Center for Countering Digital Hate, which found that Google searches for "abortion clinic near me" and "abortion pill" turned up results for centers that counsel clients against having an abortion.

Some of these places, known as crisis pregnancy centers, also have been accused of providing misleading information about abortion and contraception. Many are religiously affiliated.

"Directing women towards fake clinics that traffic in misinformation and don't provide comprehensive health services is dangerous to women's health and undermines the integrity of Google's search results," says the June letter, which was authored after the leak of a draft opinion indicating the U.S. Supreme Court would overturn the landmark 1973 *Roe v. Wade* ruling that legalized abortion nationwide. The court took that step June 24.

The Democrat-led group asked Google to address what steps it would take to limit the appearance of "crisis pregnancy centers" in its search results, ads and maps results for users

who search for "abortion clinic," "abortion pill" or other similar terms.

The group also asked the company if it would add disclaimers to address whether or not a clinic provides abortions. New York Attorney General Letitia James' office also raised similar concerns in a June letter to Google.

The letter from the Republican AGs defends the work of crisis pregnancy centers. It notes that such centers often provide services such as free ultrasounds, pregnancy tests, testing for sexually transmitted diseases, and parenting and prenatal education classes. It also argues that "at least some" Google users who search for information about abortion expect to find information about alternatives.

They wrote that if the company complies with "this inappropriate demand" to "bias" its search results, their offices would respond by investigating whether there had been any violation of antitrust or religious discrimination laws. They also pledged to consider whether new legislation would help "protect consumers and markets."

PASTOR'S PULPIT

Reasons not to pray

In talking with people, they have given a number of reasons they choose not to pray. Yet when everything is on the line, when someone is sick, when they want that new job, or when tragedy strikes, people pray. It makes Jesus into some sort of magic genie who gives wishes as we desperately ask for them. Imagine getting married and never talking to your spouse unless it was an emergency. None of us view that as a healthy marriage or relationship. Below are some of the reasons people give for not praying.

1. I feel no need to pray. The belief here is prayer is not necessary and I can do it on my own. When we look at the Israelites in Joshua 9:14 choosing not to pray and seek God, it ends badly. They felt no need to pray and it created a major issue. Prayer is not about feeling a need to pray. It is about building a relationship with Jesus. We are not in control of all things and so we must turn to the one who is in Jesus.

2. I am too bitter to pray. For some reason, we are so angry and embittered toward Jesus we do not want to talk with him. Bad things happen to good people. There is injustice and unfairness in our lives. Jesus reminds us in Matthew 6:14-15 to forgive others so we might be forgiven. Ephesians 4:31-32 instructs us to get rid of all bitterness,

wrath, and anger. Give your bitterness over to Jesus and allow him to bring joy, hope, and healing into your life through prayer.

3. I am too ashamed to pray. We have done something we know is wrong or evil and we believe we are unworthy for Jesus to hear our prayer. Adam and Eve hid from God in the garden after sinning, Genesis 3:8 tells us. We are ashamed of what we have done or what has happened. Jesus will never turn us away if we humbly come to Him in prayer. He desires a relationship with us. The gospel of Jesus Christ in His perfect life, sinless death, and incredible resurrection offers us forgiveness and a relationship. Repent of your sin and choose to believe in Jesus Christ as your Savior.

4. I am too busy to pray. Our work, family, hobbies, entertainment, and responsibilities consume our time, and we have nothing left for prayer with Jesus. Luke 10:38-42 contrast Mary and Martha. Martha was focused on work and life, while Mary focused on listening and living out Jesus' teaching. Choose not to let life, work, family, friends, and entertainment get in the way. Instead, give time at the beginning of your day to pray and talk with Jesus. Tell him of your fears and dreams and ask him to show you his will for your life. Spend time daily in the Word of God, learning who Jesus is and who

he has called you to be.

5. I am spiritually drained. I have nothing left to give to Jesus in effort or time to pray. In Luke 18:1-8, Jesus commends the widow who is persistent in asking. There will be times that we are exhausted but cutting Jesus out will not improve that. Neglecting prayer is not an answer or solution to any problem we have. Most often, the answer is to spend more time in prayer. Spend time with other believers in a church. Maplewood is this kind of church where you can be encouraged and built up. Where people will love you and help you in your life with Jesus.

"We trust that you will treat this letter with the seriousness these issues require, and hope you will decide that Google's search results must not be subject to left-wing political pressure, which would actively harm women seeking essential assistance. If you do not, we must avail ourselves of all lawful and appropriate means of protecting the rights of our constituents, of upholding viewpoint diversity, free expression, and the freedom of

religion for all Americans, and of making sure that our markets are free in fact, not merely in theory," the letter said.

It asked the California-based company to respond within 14 days and explain whether it has or will take any steps to treat crisis pregnancy centers any differently than before the leak of the draft Supreme Court decision.

The AP sent Google a request for comment on Thursday.

Miyares, who defeated incumbent Democratic Attorney General Mark Herring in November, recently traveled to a Lynchburg crisis pregnancy center that was vandalized

after the Supreme Court's ruling, condemning what he called an act of "political violence."

Google and other Big Tech companies also have faced recent calls for more stringent privacy controls to address concerns that information about location, texts, searches and emails could be used against people seeking to end unwanted pregnancies.

Google announced this month that it would automatically purge information about users who visit abortion clinics or other places that could trigger legal problems in light of the high court's ruling.

House OKs bill to protect contraception from Supreme Court

WASHINGTON (AP) — The right to use contraceptives would be enshrined in law under a measure that Democrats pushed through the House on Thursday, their latest campaign-season response to concerns a conservative Supreme Court that already erased federal abortion rights could go further.

The House's 228-195 roll call was largely along party lines and sent the measure to the Senate, where it seemed doomed. The bill is the latest example of Democrats latching onto their own version of culture war battles to appeal to female, progressive and minority voters by casting the court and Republicans as extremists intent on obliterating rights taken for granted for years.

Democrats said that with the high court recently overturning the landmark Roe v. Wade decision from 1973, the justices and GOP lawmakers are on track to go even further than banning abortions.

"This extremism is about one thing: control of women. We will not let this happen," said Rep. Kathy Manning, D-N.C., who sponsored the legislation. All of the bill's nearly 150 co-sponsors are Democrats. Addressing fellow lawmakers, she added, "Women and girls across this country are watching you, and they want to know: Are you willing to stand up for them?"

In his opinion overturning Roe last month, Justice Clarence Thomas wrote that the court should now review other precedents. He mentioned rulings that affirmed the rights of same-sex marriage in 2015, same-sex intimate relationships in 2003 and married couples' use of contraceptives in 1965.

Thomas did not specify a 1972 decision that legalized the use of contraceptives by unmarried people as well, but Democrats say they consider that at risk as well.

Republicans said the bill went too far. They said it would lead to more abortions, which supporters deny, allow the use of drugs not yet fully approved by the Food and Drug Administration and force health care providers to offer contraceptives, even if that contradicted their religious

beliefs.

"Women deserve the truth, not more fear and misinformation that forces an extreme agenda on the American people," said Rep. Cathy McMorris Rodgers, R-Wash.

Every Democrat supported the legislation, while Republicans overwhelmingly opposed it by 195-8. The House Democrats' campaign committee quickly jumped on that disparity, with spokesperson Helen Kalla saying her party will "fight to protect women's freedoms from the GOP's sinister agenda."

The measure seemed destined to become a campaign issue and not law. Minutes after House passage, Republicans blocked quick Senate approval of a similar bill. Support by at least 10 GOP senators would be needed to reach 60 votes, the threshold required for most legislation to pass in that chamber, which is divided 50-50.

The contraception bill explicitly allows the use of contraceptives and gives the medical community the right to provide them, covering "any device or medication used to prevent pregnancy." Listed examples include oral contraceptives, injections, implants like intrauterine devices and emergency contraceptives, which prevent pregnancy several days after unprotected sex.

The bill lets the federal and state government, patients and health care providers bring civil suits against states or state officials that violate its provisions.

House Democrats have begun forcing votes on several issues related to privacy rights, hoping for long-shot victories or to at least energize sympathetic voters and donors and force Republicans from competitive districts into difficult spots.

The House voted last week to revive a nationwide right to abortion, with every Republican voting no, and voted largely along party lines to bar prosecuting women traveling to states where abortion remains legal. Neither is expected to survive in the Senate.

Yet the House voted Tuesday to keep same-sex marriage legal, with 47 Republicans joining all Democrats in backing the measure. Though 157

Republicans voted no, that tally raised expectations that the bill could win enough support for GOP senators to pass, sending it to President Joe Biden for his signature.

Nearly all adults, 92%, called birth control "morally acceptable" in a Gallup poll in May. A PRRI poll in June showed about 8 in 10 said they opposed laws that restrict what types of birth control can be used to prevent pregnancy.

Even so, anti-abortion groups and Republican leaders oppose the contraception legislation, and there was no immediate sign that significant numbers of GOP senators would be willing to defy them. In contrast, same-sex marriage has such firm public acceptance and is such a clear-cut issue that growing numbers of Republicans have been willing to vote for it.

Susan B. Anthony Pro-Life America said the contraception legislation "seeks to bail out the abortion industry, trample conscience rights, and require uninhibited access to dangerous chemical abortion drugs." The National Right to Life Committee said it "goes far beyond the scope of contraception" and would cover abortion pills like RU486, which supporters said was incorrect.

The measure drew a mixed reaction Wednesday from two of the Senate's more moderate Republicans.

Sen. Susan Collins, R-Maine, said she was "most likely" to support the measure. Sen. Lisa Murkowski, R-Alaska, demurred, saying she was working on bipartisan legislation that she said would codify the rights to abortion and perhaps for contraception.

There are few state restrictions on contraceptive use, said Elizabeth Nash, who studies state reproductive health policies for the Guttmacher Institute, a research organization that supports abortion rights.

Nash said she was concerned that there will be efforts to curb emergency contraceptives and intrauterine devices and to help providers and institutions refuse to provide contraceptive services.

The butterflies that are located in the conservatory can't leave it; the room is climate controlled to help those butterflies flourish. They wouldn't flourish in the Missouri climate.

Perrette raises native or migratory butterflies like the Monarch, Painted Ladies and Swallowtail butterflies.

Perrette noted a fun fact about the Monarch butterflies is that there are many generations of Monarchs that will live and die in the U.S. before the last generation migrates back to Mexico.

That last generation will live for three to four months before laying eggs and dying. Once the new generation hatches from their eggs and morphs into butterflies, they will migrate back into the U.S. So, the average person will never see the same migration twice.

Recently, the Monarch butterfly was classified as an endangered species due to habitat destruction, weather and pesticides.

Outside of the conservatory, Perrette works in

the gardens and, during the festival, tells the life of the Monarch. This year he decided to go a different route and talk about how Monarch butterflies made their way into Australia.

"After leaving that and going all the way down to the Children's Garden, where we have the native butterfly habitat tent," Perrette said. "This is where all the butterflies I am raising and will find are going to speed their lives."

In this area, there will be raised plant beds that focus on the host plants of Missouri's native and migrant butterflies.

"I love watching the kids light up when I tell them things..." Perrette said. "It's amazing to me. I let them feel butterflies' sticky feet because they taste through their feet. I just interact with the kids a lot."

The Festival of Butterflies at Powell Gardens, 1609 NW U.S. Highway 50 in Kingsville, will be open from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. daily until Aug. 7. Admission to the gardens is \$12 for adults and \$6 for children under 12.

"He goes out every day to try and make the streets of Sedalia a little safer."

Schmitt is passionate about reducing impaired driving incidents in Sedalia and seeks ongoing training, specifically in DWI enforcement.

"I've always loved traffic enforcement," Schmitt admitted, "and I've created a very strong passion for impaired-driving enforcement. Every year I'm getting more and more,

and I'm going to a lot of training to better detect and take people off the streets that are impaired driving. I'm soon to go to training to become a drug recognition expert. I keep training to better detect, better help the officers in my agency learn and understand impaired driving."

This training and the hundreds of arrests Schmitt has made build on the experience he uses to recognize impaired driving.

"It's becoming easier for me because I've had significant training in impaired driving detection," Schmitt said. "I'm somewhere around 250

career DWIs and every one gives me that extra bit of knowledge for the next one."

Wirt said Schmitt's arrest numbers end up saving lives as alcohol- or drug-impaired drivers are taken off the road.

"There's a direct correlation between reducing impaired driving and reducing injury and fatality traffic crashes," Wirt said. "It's great to be recognized by such a respected organization."

Schmitt was pleased with the award but amazed by the number of impaired drivers still on the road.

"I was very, very honored to find out

that they had selected me for that," Schmitt said. "There's weekends where I can get six DWI arrests; to me that's insane, thinking that it's so prevalent."

Rather than being pulled over and arrested for drunk or drugged driving, Schmitt has some suggestions.

"We have Uber, we have taxis, we have friends, we have a great community to even walk home," Schmitt said. "So if you're going out and you know you're going to be drinking, make sure you have a sober driver."

The trip will include stops in Frankfurt and Düsseldorf, Germany, as well as Amsterdam and

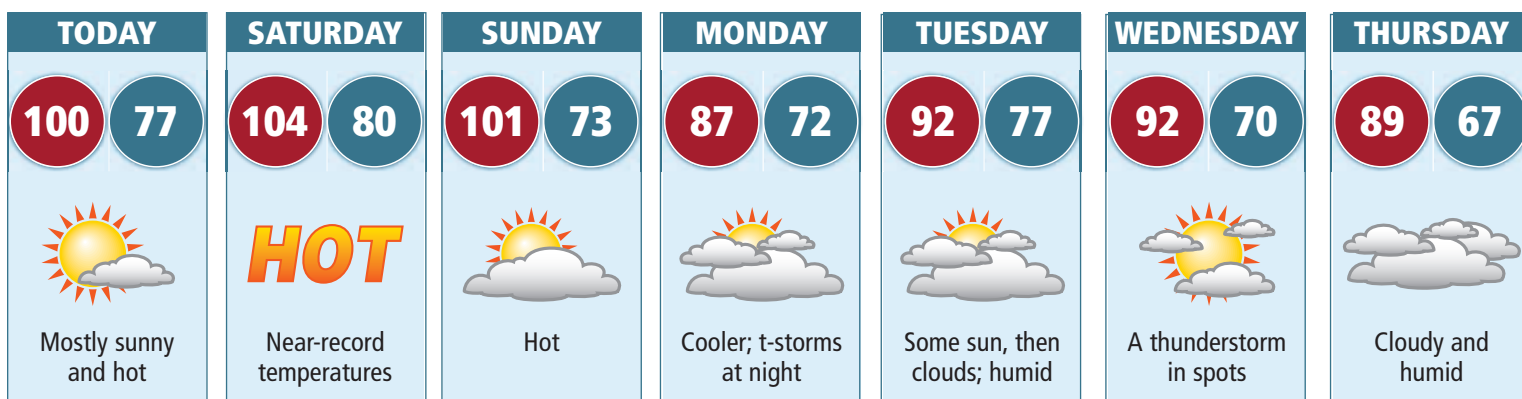
the Hague, Netherlands, where the governor will meet with government officials, diplomats and business leaders to promote Missouri.

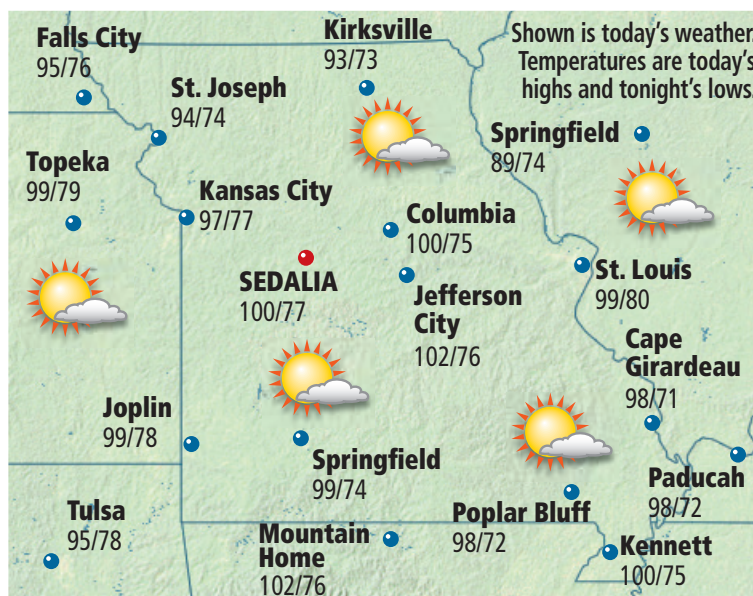

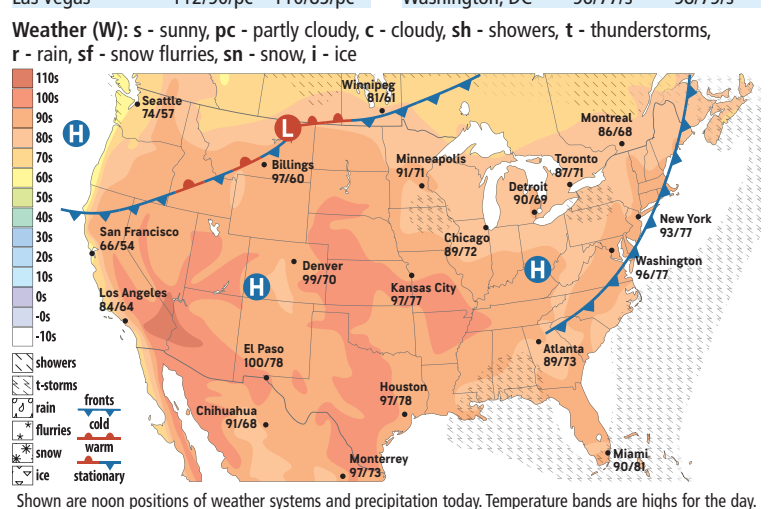

Harsin emboldened by players' support, says Auburn has unity

ATLANTA (AP) — Auburn coach Bryan Harsin took on what he called “the gorilla in the room” when he stood behind the podium at the Southeastern Conference Media Days on Thursday.

Following an offseason of uncertainty that threatened his job status, Harsin insists there is more unity than ever on his Auburn team.

Harsin said an inquiry into his program following his 6-7 debut as coach “was uncomfortable. It was unfounded. It presented an opportunity for people to personally attack me, my family, and also our program. And it didn't work.”

Auburn President Jay Gogue sought answers after the program lost 18 players and five assistant coaches.

A group of players, including defensive end Derick Hall, talked with Gogue and Auburn trust-

ees in support of Harsin.

“It most definitely brought us closer,” Hall said Thursday. “A few of the guys ... talked to the board and talked to the president of the university just to give our respect and our support for coach Harsin. It definitely brought our team closer together after that.”

Auburn lost its final five games last season, leaving Harsin on the hot seat for 2022. He said he enters the season emboldened by what he described as “a silver lining in all of this.”

“What I saw from our players and our coaches was leadership opportunities for them to step up, which is exactly what they did,” Harsin said. “You got a chance to see guys provide leadership. You got a chance to see coaches provide leadership. What it did is it united our football team, our players, our staff, our football team. I'm really proud of our guys.”

Sage Karam returns to Pocono for 1st time since fatal wreck

Sage Karam planned to keep it simple, just a bike ride this week through the first turn at Pocono Raceway. An easy outing, no reporters around to ask questions, no fans wondering how he's feeling in his return to his hometown track.

Seven years ago, Karam triggered a wreck at the tri-oval track that killed IndyCar driver Justin Wilson and sunk Karam so deep into a depression that he doubted he would compete again. On his last visit to the track, his friend Robert Wickens was paralyzed in another

IndyCar accident.

Pocono conjures memories of tragedy for the 27-year-old Karam. He wanted to go alone to remember -- but also reflect on his own, challenging journey.

“I've taken the necessary time I needed to take before I could properly go there,” Karam said. “If I had the opportunity to race there before, I don't know that I would have been ready. If I'm not ready, I'm not going to do it. I don't want to put myself at harm or put anybody else at harm. I feel like now I'm able to maturely go there and do it.”

Murray, Cardinals agree to contract through 2028 season

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) — The drama is over and the decision is in: Kyler Murray and the Arizona Cardinals have made a long-term commitment to each other with a new contract that would keep the quarterback in the desert through the 2028 season.

The two-time Pro Bowl selection was taken with the No. 1 overall pick out of Oklahoma after he won the Heisman Trophy and has largely delivered in his quest to make the Cardinals a better franchise.

The team announced the new contract on Thursday. ESPN reported that the contract could be worth \$230.5 million, with \$160 million guaranteed.

Murray's agent, Erik Burkhardt, didn't immediately return a message

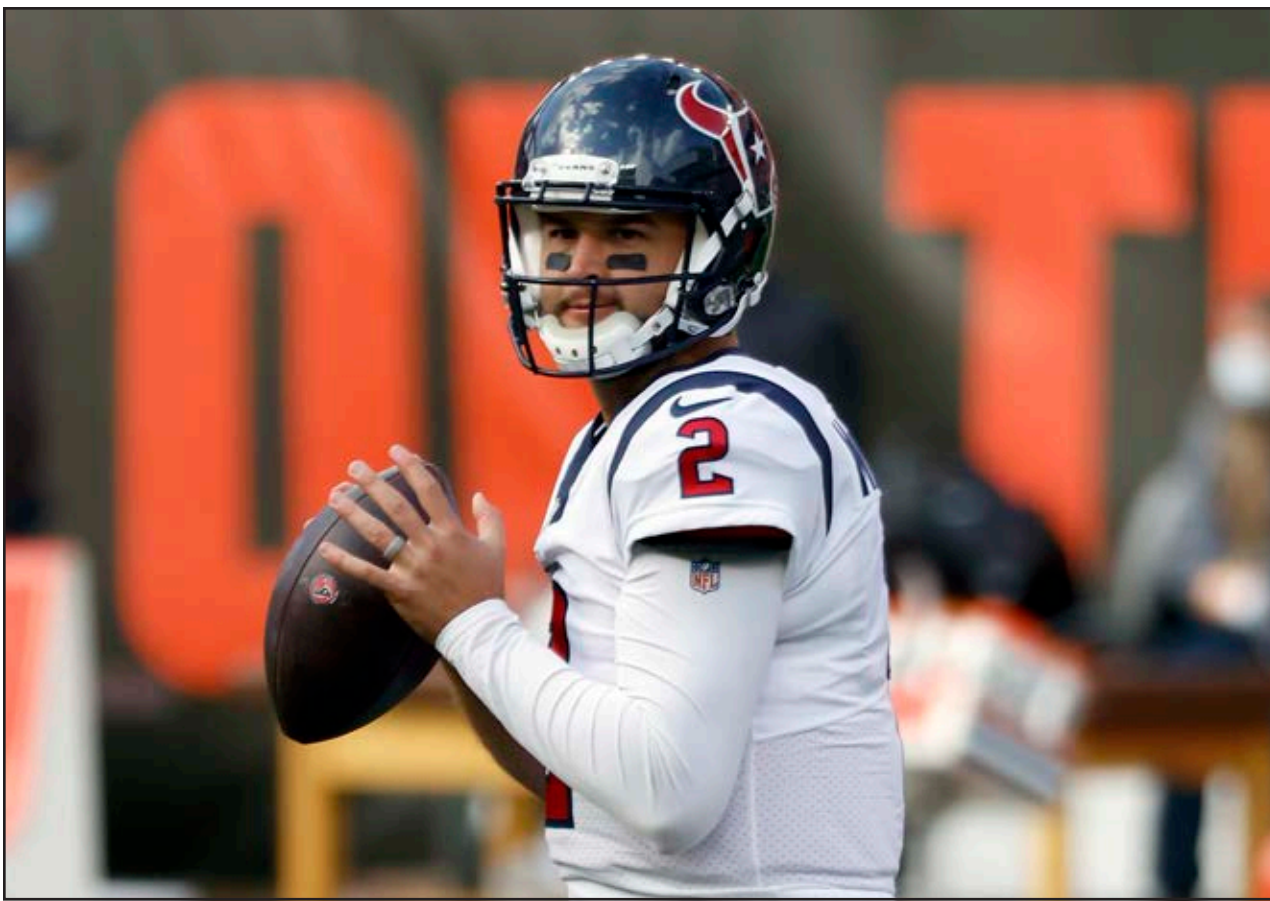
seeking comment.

Murray's new contract puts him on par with other young star quarterbacks throughout the league like Buffalo's Josh

Allen, who signed a deal worth more than \$250 million last season. Murray will make an average of more than \$46 million per season, which is sim-

ilar to other elite quarterbacks such as Green Bay's Aaron Rodgers, Kansas City's Patrick Mahomes and Allen.

AP source: Browns work out QBs while awaiting Watson ruling

CLEVELAND (AP) — While they await a ruling on Deshaun Watson, the Cleveland Browns are working out quarterbacks this week to make sure they're prepared for training camp, a person familiar with the team's plans told the Associated Press on Thursday. The Browns want to open camp next week with four quarterbacks, according to the person who spoke to the AP on condition of anonymity because the team has not disclosed the tryouts.

A.J. McCarron and Josh Rosen, who have been on Cleveland's

radar previously, are among the quarterbacks getting a look, the person said.

ESPN was first to report Cleveland's QB workouts.

Watson is facing a possible NFL suspension after being accused by two dozen female massage therapists of sexual misconduct during sessions while the three-time Pro Bowler played for the Houston Texans.

Former federal judge Sue L. Robinson, the league's disciplinary officer, is deciding whether Watson, who was traded to the Browns in March, has violated the personal conduct policy.

If Watson is suspend-

ed, the Browns intend to go with veteran Jacoby Brissett as their starter. Brissett has started 37 games during his pro career with New England, Indianapolis and Miami. He signed as a free agent one day after Cleveland enticed Watson to waive his no-trade clause with a five-year, \$230 million contract that's fully guaranteed.

Josh Dobbs is also on Cleveland's roster, but the 27-year-old has never started an NFL game and the Browns wanted to bring in another veteran in case Watson is out for multiple games.

The 31-year-old McCarron nearly came to Cleveland in a 2017 trade from Cincinnati,

but the deal was voided when the Browns failed to file the appropriate paperwork with the league on time. McCarron also has played for Oakland and Houston.

Rosen was one of several top college quarterbacks the Browns considered drafting with the first overall pick in 2018 before choosing Baker Mayfield. Cleveland dealt Mayfield to Carolina earlier this month after agreeing to pick up \$10 million of his salary for 2022.

Rosen went 3-13 in starts for Arizona and Miami. He was with Atlanta last season and appeared in four games.

1. ROBE not rope. The clue words "I don't think it'll be a big problem" suggests there might be a certain degree of trouble when "fixing it," which fits well with a ROBE that would have to be hemmed. Usually, it's not considered difficult to simply cut or knot a rope in order to shorten it.

3. AXE not ape. Acting idiotically with an AXE "could" cause an injury. But an ape would probably be in an enclosure with no direct physical contact with the "brother," therefore posing no threat.

Unsurprisingly, Ximines said everything in his arsenal was firing at a high rate, but he also gave credit to his teammates for helping keep his line unblemished for six frames.

"All my pitches were working well, but I had a good defense behind me today that made some crucial plays, that helps keep the pitch count down," Ximines said. "And as a pitcher, the faster you can get your team

back in the dugout and scoring runs, the more it keeps them engaged. You can't score runs on defense."

It wasn't until the seventh that the Renegades got to him with back-to-back leadoff singles. Ximines was pulled with the bases loaded, and was credited with two runs allowed, though reliever Brett Mooney got out of the inning with Sedalia still up by two. The Renegades ended up tying it by punching two more across in the eighth.

Adam Webb doubled Shupe in for a run in the fourth, then the Bombers

extended their lead with three more in the fifth. The Renegades walked nine batters total, whereas the Bombers didn't allow any.

Five days prior, Duffin Makings scored due to an error in the bottom of the ninth and Nick Schmidt slid safely home after a wild pitch in the 10th as the Bombers defeated the Renegades, 4-3.

Those wins helped the Bombers keep pace in the South Division, even if they haven't been able to surpass the Joplin Outlaws, who defeated Carroll for their ninth win in a row Tuesday.

Following a doubleheader at Nevada on Friday, the Bombers will play Joplin at home Saturday, and a make-up to close the regular season at Nevada Sunday. Then, barring the unforeseen, they will host the Renegades in a South Division Wildcard game Monday at Liberty Park Stadium.

"I'm proud of our guys," Bombers head coach Craig McAndrews said. "Yeah, we're 20-20, but I told our guys they're four wins away from winning a MINK League title. That's what we set out to do, and it's achievable."

Listed at just 5-foot-10, some around the NFL worried the 24-year-old Murray was too short to be a dominant pro quarterback, but his stats through three seasons prove otherwise.

He's completed nearly 67% of his passes through 46 career games for 11,480 yards and 70 touchdowns while rushing for 1,786 yards and 20 TDs. Murray is particularly good at extending plays with his feet, using his scrambling ability for

spectacular gains.

Arizona had a 5-10-1 record during his rookie season in 2019 but the Cardinals improved to 11-6 last season before losing to the Los Angeles Rams in the NFC Wild Card round during the playoffs.

The deal brings an end to a strange, passive-aggressive offseason contract squabble. At one point, Murray wiped his social media accounts of all references to the Cardinals and it wasn't clear whether the franchise was ready to make a long-term investment.

The two sides appeared to be on a path toward

reconciliation over the past few months. GM Steve Keim said that there was "zero chance" Murray would be traded and the quarterback put on social media that he wanted to win Super Bowls with the Cardinals and called Arizona "home."

The Cardinals had already picked up Murray's fifth-year option for the 2023 season, further easing tensions, but Thursday's news puts an end to any lingering questions.

Now Murray can take the field for training camp next week knowing his football future is secure. The Cardinals face plenty of

challenges in 2022, including navigating the first six games without star receiver DeAndre Hopkins, who was suspended for violating the NFL's performance-enhancing drug policy.

Murray and fourth-year coach Kliff Kingsbury are under significant pressure to produce this fall after last year's late-season collapse. The Cardinals looked like one of the NFL's best teams in 2021 after starting with a 10-2 record, but lost four of their last five regular-season games before getting beat 34-11 by the Rams in the wild card round.

Karam was a rising star in IndyCar and considered a potential face of the series when a seemingly simple spin as he led the August 2015 race shot his car into the wall. Wilson was struck in the head by a piece of debris from Karam's car that had bounced along the raceway surface. The 37-year-old British driver died a day later at a nearby hospital.

Karam was 20 years old and blamed himself for the freak accident. Riddled by guilt, Karam moped around his house. He couldn't sleep or eat and soon lost his ride driving for Chip Ganassi.

He not only couldn't shake the fatality, Karam's career never reached the heights expected after that

race. He made sporadic starts in IndyCar and took the wheel for rallycross and sports cars races. He eventually landed in NASCAR in 2021 and raced in the Xfinity and Truck series. He'll make his fifth start of the season Saturday in NASCAR's second-tier series race at Pocono.

It's still his hometown track. The Nazareth, Pennsylvania, native, who now lives with his wife in nearby Easton, has prepped himself for an emotional return. And he has backup.

"Everybody that I need around me will be there," Karam said. "Everybody that's been my biggest support group from these last seven years is going to be at this race because it's in our backyard."

His father, Jody, helped Sage reconnect with a sports psychologist and got the former high school wrestler

back involved in the sport as a coach. Karam eventually found the right marketing agency that offered emotional comfort and landed him a NASCAR ride with Alpha Prime Racing.

"My son took on way too much responsibility for that accident," Jody Karam said. "He self-imposed a lot of pain on himself and blame. I admire the way he matured and worked through it. He didn't do it alone."

Slowly, Karam got his life in order. "What I've realized is what we do is a very dangerous sport," he said. "It was a freak thing. A complete accident. I've just realized that. When you're young, you don't realize those things right away. You don't realize there was nothing you could have done."

Karam will race the Indy road course later this month while the rest

of his NASCAR schedule is undetermined. Karam knows the scouting report on a full-time move to stock cars is grim: Danica Patrick, Dario Franchitti and Sam Hornish Jr. are among the open-wheel winners over the last 25 years who failed to find steady success in the bump-and-run world of NASCAR.

Born to race open wheel, Karam said the transition from IndyCar to stock cars "wasn't as massive as I thought it was going to be." But that comes with a caveat, as Karam only made 25 career starts in IndyCar, and six times his lone start each season was the Indianapolis 500 (he finished 23rd in May). Karam made a career-high 12 starts in 2015 and never again received a serious offer for a full-time ride.

GATHERING INFORMATION

Texas A&M coach Jimbo Fisher had no update on the status of senior wide receiver Ainius Smith, who was arrested early Wednesday on charges of driving while intoxicated, unlawful carrying of a weapon and possession of less than 2 ounces of marijuana.

Smith had been listed as one of three Texas A&M players scheduled to attend the SEC Media Days. Instead, two Aggies — safety Demani Richardson and left guard Layden Robinson — represented the school.

Smith was suspended following the arrest, per athletic department policy. Fisher said he couldn't comment on Smith's chances of returning for the season.

"We're gathering all the evidence and the things going on," Fisher said. "We have no comment at this time."

Robinson said he wasn't worried about the effect of the arrest on team chemistry so close to the season.

"Ainius Smith, that's my brother," Robinson said. "We grew up together. He's a great leader. He's a great person. He's been very helpful for our team since day one. He's been an impact since day one."

Smith is Texas A&M's top returning receiver. He had 47 receptions for 509 yards and six touchdowns last season.

Smith, 21, was arrested by Texas A&M police and was booked into the Brazos County jail. He posted \$8,000 bond and was released later Wednesday, according to jail records.

"I'll reach out to him, like check up on him when we get back," Robinson said. "But he knows since we grew up together, he knows I've always got him, I'm always here for him and I've always got his back and will do whatever."

NO ONE TO BLAME

Texas A&M transfer Zach Calzada is a leading contender to win Auburn's quarterback job that was left vacant following the transfer of Bo Nix to Oregon.

Calzada was slowed in spring practice by a shoulder injury. He suffered the injury in Texas A&M's 20-3 win over the Tigers last season.

"We appreciate his leadership," Harsin said. "We appreciate just his work

ethic. He has experience. He's played. The only unfortunate thing is we didn't get a chance to have him in spring because of his shoulder going through all the team periods because we hurt him during the season.

"It's one of those that you go back and look on it, you're like, damn, I wish that hadn't have happened. But he's with us now and he's getting his opportunities in the summer."

Running back Tank Bigsby said Calzada provides toughness, leadership and "everything a quarterback is supposed to bring"

"That dog," Bigsby said. "You want to play with somebody that's got that dog in him, who doesn't back down."

Calzada is competing with LSU transfer T.J. Finley, who started the final three games last season, for the starting job.
