Deerbrook Villas sees demand for expansion

Affordable senior housing draws elderly to Sedalia

Thursday, MBL Development announced it is applying for HUD funds to expand the Deerbrook Villas community on Mitchell Road in Sedalia.

The bright and tidy senior housing facility hopes to expand to meet the hot demand for low-cost housing in Sedalia.

"This is the fourth phase of Deerbrook," Sedalia Community Development Director John Simmons said. "Wildly successful Phase One, Two and Three and a nice waiting list. It just proves there's a huge demand for housing in Sedalia and there are opportunities for people who want to build on this and move more people into the city."

MBL Development President Kim Lingle

said he did not foresee the demand for low-income senior housing when he started building the first units 10 years ago.

"I did not, I did not see it expanding that big because I was unaware of the unbelievable need for housing in Sedalia," Lingle said. "I did not believe we would even do a Phase Two or Three. Now we're trying to do Phase Four."

Lingle will be competing with developers from across the state for the limited federal dollars.

Page: ordinary subjects become polished paintings

Missouri State Fair Artist-in-Residence Cody Page, of north Missouri, will demonstrate his unique painting style through Monday in the Fine Arts Building. Using ordinary subject matter along with narrative, Page paints human interaction with "polished" ease.

Page, 36, formerly of Lee's Summit, graduated from the University of Central

Missouri in Warrensburg with a bachelor's of fine art degree. He said he's always been interested in art, and when people told him he was good at it, he decided to follow a creative path. He noted his work illustrates simplicity and sincerity.

"Ordinary things, that's the heart of it all," he added.

He said he began working with his current painting style after graduating from college. The work, he noted, is inspired by the "golden age illustrators" or early 20th century

illustrators, such as Norman Rockwell.

"Through Rockwell, I found Jason Leyendecker," he said. "He's kind of a 'Saturday Evening Post' guy. All the stereotypical images started with him.

"And I just started copying him," Page continued. "Then I realized I had something to say. Leyendecker chose his covers, thinking of every person in America. People in 1910 Missouri didn't care about cutting-edge art. They just want to see pictures they

recognize, done in a masterful way. And that's my goal."

Page added he wants to "elevate ordinary subject matter" to a larger scale. He said he enjoys taking ordinary subjects and "regular people" and creating large-scale paintings of their actions. For example, Rockwell and Leyendecker realized they could sit at their easels and "be a respected world-class painter while painting a grandmother baking a pie."

Kempton running for Pettis County Prosecuting Attorney

Trial attorney Sam Kempton, of Kempton and Russell, announced in July that he would be running for the Pettis County Prosecuting Attorney seat. As of last week, he's officially on the November General Election ballot.

Kempton's announcement came after filing for the August primary election had closed, so he had to earn almost 300 signatures from registered voters in Pettis County to run in the November election.

Kempton also serves as the Vice President of the Sedalia School District 200 Board of Education.

He explained that he

was employed by the county as an assistant prosecutor in 2018 but also interned in the Prosecutor's Office under former Prosecuting Attorney Jeff Mittlehauser.

"The day I was hired, I hit the ground running and for a year and a half, I dedicated myself to answering the late-night phone calls for search warrants, making sure the office was caught up on filing decisions so cases didn't just linger, and made sure I was always in the courtroom when a prosecutor needed to be there, even if it wasn't my case," Kempton said.

In that role, Kempton successfully handled motions and trials and obtained favorable rulings and maximum sentences, results he said were necessary to protect the public.

"Since I left that office, I have been approached with continuous encouragement and support from so many people in the courthouse and the community to run for prosecutor. It is clear to me that this is my calling, and I am answering that call by giving the voters in Pettis County a choice this November," Kempton said.

For his entire career, Kempton has practiced as a criminal litigator on behalf of the accused and the state.

"As a prosecutor, I never had a search warrant invalidated, never lost a Fourth Amendment suppression hearing, won both bench and jury trials and always obtained the desired disposition at every sentencing hearing I handled," Kempton said.

Two new principals join Smithton School District

Two new principals are joining the Smithton R-VI School District this school year.

Elementary Principal Becca Warren and High School Principal Patrick Treece, both from outside the district, will be stepping into their role as principals for the first time.

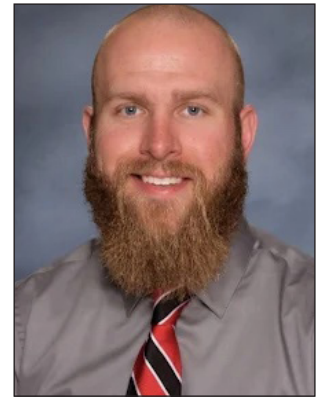

"So through that, the more I've learned and the more I've grown, it felt



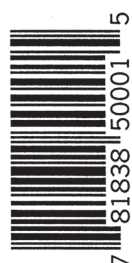

EXPLAINER: Why gas prices are falling

U.S. consumers are breathing a bit easier now that gasoline prices have come down from record levels, but pump prices are still high, and the two-month slide could be nearing an end.

The nationwide average price for a gallon of gas dropped to \$3.99 on Thursday, according to AAA. That's down 20% from the mid-June high, and it's the first time the average has dipped below \$4 since early March.

Gasoline prices usually rise and fall with the cost of oil, and crude has also been dropping. The U.S. benchmark price is down nearly one-fourth since early June.

Other factors are also behind this year's roller-coaster ride in energy prices.

WHAT IS HAPPENING?

Gasoline prices hit a record \$5.02 on June 14. At the time, U.S. crude was about \$120 a barrel and the benchmark international price was even a couple dollars above that. Since then, however, oil prices have tumbled.

Oil prices had been rising since April 2020, as economies around

the world recovered from the shock of the pandemic, and reopened — slowly at first, then more rapidly. Demand for energy outstripped supply, pushing prices higher through all of 2021 and early this year. Then in late February, Russia's invasion of Ukraine caused oil prices to spike, and they remained high into June — although not as high as in July 2008 if inflation is considered.

WHY IS THIS HAPPENING?

High energy prices contributed to inflation, which led the Federal Reserve and other central banks to raise interest rates. Concern has increased in recent weeks about the direction of the global economy.

A recession — or even slower growth — hurts energy demand and usually pushes down oil prices. That is the scenario that oil investors now fear.

Even with prices coming down, OPEC on Thursday lowered its forecast of global oil demand for the rest of this year and next year. The cartel based those expectations on a belief that economic growth in the U.S., China and other key countries will be slower than it previously forecast.

ARE THERE OTHER FACTORS?

It's unusual for gas prices to fall during the summer, because that's the peak driving time for American motorists. Some analysts think the high prices have led drivers to cut back, but the evidence is mostly anecdotal.

Some states suspended their gasoline taxes, shaving more off the final price at the pump, at least temporarily.

WHERE ARE GAS PRICES HEADED?

Most analysts don't think prices will spike in the short term unless something unexpected happens, such as a big storm that shuts down oil production in the Gulf of Mexico or floods refineries along the Gulf Coast. That has happened before, and we are still in hurricane season.

Patrick De Haan, an analyst for GasBuddy, said this week that absent something like a hurricane, gasoline prices should drop another 10 cents to 25 cents a gallon over the next couple weeks.

Tom Kloza, an analyst for the Oil Price Information Service, is a bit less sanguine. He says the 58-day streak of lower nationwide average gasoline prices "may stumble soon."

Besides the hurricane threat, Kloza says refineries — which have been running nearly full-steam — will have to take a breather because they have delayed maintenance work and "that can't be delayed indefinitely."

WHAT ABOUT THE U.S. OIL SUPPLY?

U.S. oil production hasn't fully recovered to pre-pandemic levels; it's still down about 4.5% from 2019, according to the most recent government figures, for May.

President Joe Biden has ordered releases from U.S. oil reserves. Kloza said "even Biden bashers have to admit that the release of over 150 million barrels of (Strategic Petroleum Reserve) crude worked," but he said it's unclear what will happen when those releases end later this year.

WHAT'S ENERGY'S ROLE IN INFLATION?

Higher prices for energy and food have been key contributors to inflation. It works the other way too. When gasoline prices slid in July, it helped slow the overall rate of inflation.

But gasoline prices in July were still 28% higher than a year earlier, and that helped inflation roar along at 8.5%.

Missouri State Fair ready for

The 120th Missouri State Fair kicked off on Thursday, and the morning included an opening ceremony featuring Gov. Mike Parson and other state officials.

This year's theme is "Buckets of Fun," and Missouri State Fair Director Mark Wolfe offered some suggestions from his own list.

"There are some things when the fair starts each year that I must do," Wolfe said. "And even though it's not on the list they put together for me, it's that foot-long corndog. I wait for that all year long for that thing with a lot of mustard on it; that's No. 1. But at the end of the day, my favorite part is an opportunity to go sit in the barns and see these kids exhibit. Because at the end of the day, that's basically what this is all about. We're here to promote Missouri agriculture, it's the No. 1 revenue-generator in the state, No. 1 business."

"What these kids in 4-H and FFA are doing ... they're the future. They're the next governor, the next fair director. ... What they learn in 4-H and FFA is so important to our state and we're proud to be the showcase for what they do and showcase for agriculture."

Wolfe noted a few milestone anniversaries that will be happening this year, including 100 years of the Swine Barn and 60 years of the Missouri State Fair Fire Department. He said the barn was built in 1922 for about \$125,000 and it was expanded in 1960. Wolfe added that swine entries are the highest of the livestock entries, with about 3,000 hogs.

Kevin Roberts, chairman of the Missouri State Fair Commission, said he and the other members are dedicated to the commission's mission of promoting excellence in agriculture. "And we understand

this is a continuing commitment," he continued. "This commitment is a year-round one with the culmination of the efforts of many individuals and our staff coming together each August to put on the fair for all of you."

Roberts spoke briefly about the recent purchase of 200 acres of land adjacent to the fairgrounds and State Fair Community College; funding came from the MSF, SFCC and the state. Not many specifics have been offered, but Roberts said a new covered arena will be built on the new land, and some of the funding from the state legislature will also help with repairs to the Grandstand. Roberts noted state Rep. Brad Pollitt, R-Sedalia, and state Sen. Sandy Crawford, R-Buffalo, helped make the funding and legislation happen.

Missouri Director of Agriculture Chris Chinn is a family farmer and said she not only has memories of being a livestock exhibitor herself but also being an exhibitor mom with her two kids. As the Director of Agriculture, she said she now gets to see even more. She recommended a few "hidden gems" to add to bucket lists, such as going through the Floriculture Building

along with seeing the projects in the 4-H and FFA buildings. She also encouraged people to go off the beaten path while on the fairgrounds to find something new this year.

"Kids have been working year-round on those projects. Some of them have them in the live-stock barns, but if you go into the 4-H and FFA buildings, you're going to see some really amazing projects that are in there as well, too," Chinn said. "It always amazes me every year when I walk into those buildings to see the talent we have in our Missouri youth, but more importantly, the hours of hard work and dedication that they put into each and every one of those projects."

Chinn said agriculture is the No. 1 economic driver in the state and is a \$93.7 billion industry for Missouri that employs more than 450,000 Missourians. She said 96% of the state's 95,000 farms and ranches are owned by families. Missouri is No. 2 in the nation when it comes to the number of farms, second only to Texas.

Chinn noted Missouri farmers have been affected by many difficulties over the past few years.

"It's been a struggle in agriculture. Our farmers have been faced with supply challenges, high feed costs, high

fuel costs. It's been one punch after another when it comes to agriculture. And then when you think it couldn't get any worse, we have a drought in the southern part of our state and in the east-central part of our state, the very same week, we have a flood."

During his speech, Parson said it's important to make sure the "future is bright for a kid that wants to be a farmer. It's going to take a lot of work on our part to make sure we stand up for agriculture."

Parson also recalled the days in his childhood when his family would make the trip to the Missouri State Fair. "It was one of the biggest days for my family to come here and I will tell you, for these kids, it's their biggest day, still today, to be able to do that," Parson said. "It's why we made the largest investment in our state fair in the history of the state of Missouri this year."

Parson mentioned the Nucor Pavilion, which was completed in 2020, and reiterated the 200-acre purchase.

"We're going to build this state fair until it's the best in the United States of America. That's the whole goal," he added.

"I think there's a connection there for me," he added. "That's kind of where I am."

Page said he began working in oil but soon started using acrylic for time's sake.

"The reason I changed was speed," he explained. "I was getting bogged down in oil — it just takes longer. So, acrylic is for speed."

"I can work fast ... but instead of using oil, I use water to thin it all down," he continued. "And that helps me get the energy and movement of a picture."

Page has a full-time job as a picture frame builder at Prairiebrooke gallery in downtown Overland Park, Kansas. He also sells his paintings at the gallery.

"This is a comfortable gallery where I trust the people," he noted. "And

I think that's important for my subject matter and what I want to do.

"I don't paint New York pictures; I don't paint cosmopolitan pictures," he added. "I want people to go to the Missouri State Fair to care and understand what I'm doing."

Ideas for the people in his paintings come from his own experiences, things or people he's heard about, and things he's seen in a movie or heard in a song.

"It's stuff that I think would make a cool little vignette," he said. "And the narrative is important, ordinary subject matter, figurative and narrative, and human interaction."

Page noted his companion, Traci Read, is his muse, and they both want people who view the large paintings to have a good time. He added he enjoys Leyendecker's work because he uses precision, but it's done in an "elegant and effortless way."

"That's what I try to do," Page said. "I want my

brush strokes to be visible, but I want it to look polished; that would be the goal — polished, energetic, natural.

"Viewing a canvas in person is also important to me," he continued. "Which is more difficult, but I would prefer they see it like this (at the MSF) or come to the gallery ... I want you to be able to see the brush strokes. It's intimate; it's human."

When he finishes a piece, Page often leaves drips of paint down the canvas and includes early elements of the art instead of perfecting it.

"The painting is an object," he noted. "Not only the subject matter. I want the physical canvas to be an object."

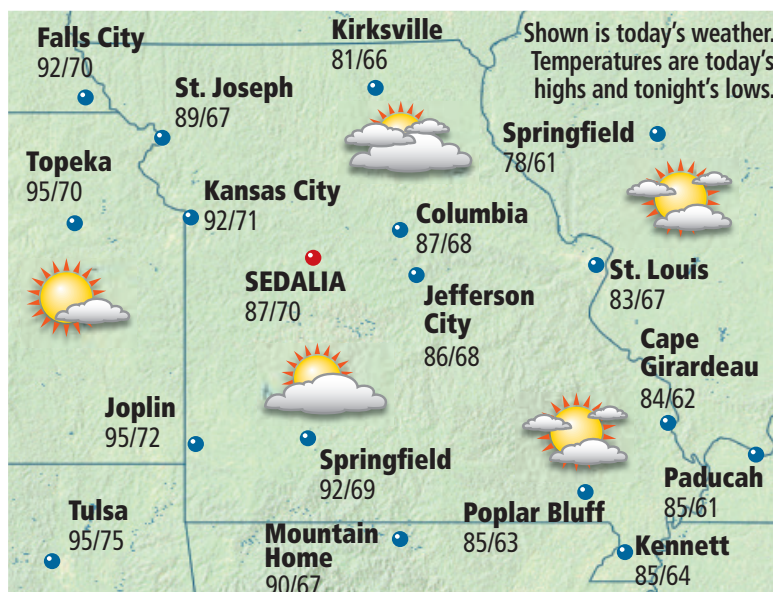

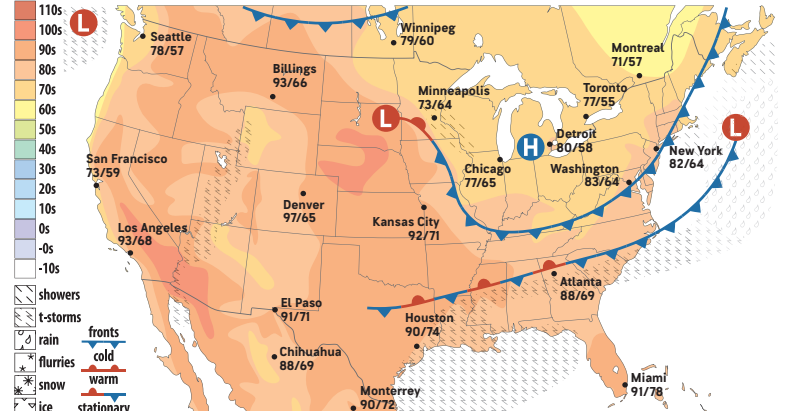

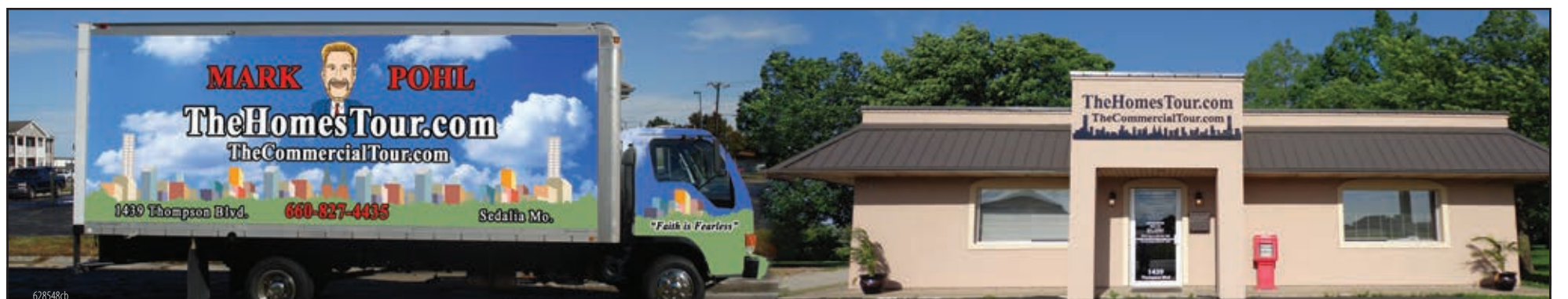

“The applications are due in September,” Lingle said. “The funding and financing is a competitive process with other developers throughout the State of Missouri. We will probably be competing against other towns for this funding because there’s only so much affordable housing funds available.”

Lt. Gov. Mike Kehoe, state Sen. Sandy Crawford, State Rep. Brad Pollitt, Mayor Andrew Dawson and city officials visited the site of the future expansion in a field south of Lowe’s.

“As we learned today, a waiting list of well over 100 just looking for a place, and there are going to be 38 new units hopefully, and there’s still going to be plenty of room for more growth,” Crawford said. “The facilities I’ve toured are top notch and we’re really proud to be here today to talk about this new expansion. This housing is needed and it’s nice to see some low-income housing coming to Sedalia.”

“We have a need all across the state, especially here in Sedalia,” Kehoe said. “I was just talking to the mayor, Pettis County has so much going on right now, economic development-wise, it’s a quality of life place. People want to move here.”

As the dignitaries arrived to look over the planned expansion, resident Elda Bryson stepped outside and offered them a

tour of her villa.

“I love it, it’s absolutely wonderful,” Bryson said. “I don’t have to worry about the maintenance of my home, everything is taken care of for you. They change your filters, they check the smoke alarms, they take care of everything.”

Bryson feels at home in her villa and doesn’t have to maintain her old two-bedroom apartment.

“I had to (maintain my apartment) back onto Grand and it was too dangerous for me,” Bryson said, “I made the decision while my mind was still alert enough to make the

decision on my own. I love it. There are deer and turkey over in the pasture, I absolutely love it.”

“They keep the place very clean and nice,” Kehoe said. “It’s very appealing to folks to come here and it’s a very homey feeling, some people could go into facilities or developments like this and it might not have the same feel, but I think the developer’s done a great job, and the community has really embraced what this can do for the city, and I think that makes a big difference.”

With Deerbrook Villas expanding yet again, Lamm Drive would be

extended another half-mile, providing entrance into an area that could also hold many new businesses. This type of development is making the southeast side of Sedalia desirable property.

“With over 172 folks on a waiting list, we feel extremely confident that our proposal of 38 units will be very successful,” Lingle said. “It tells a story about Sedalia and the need for housing. People are moving into the community or want to move into the community. This area is very hot right now.”

He added that as a defense attorney, he represented clients accused of crimes all across the state.

“On day one, I will establish a practice of accountability and transparency in that office. As your prosecutor, I work for you, the law-abid-

ing citizens of our community,” Kempton said. “I will be diligent and straightforward in advising the county on the various legal issues it confronts. I also would like to start a conversation about the creation of a Veteran’s Court in Pettis County. We could work in conjunction with the Prosecuting Attorney in Johnson County to serve those working at Whiteman Air Force Base and the many veterans who live here.”

US unemployment claims rise by 14,000 to 262,000

WASHINGTON (AP) — The number of Americans who signed up for unemployment benefits rose last week to the highest level since November, though the U.S. job market continues to show signs of strength.

Applications for jobless aid climbed by 14,000 to 262,000 and now have risen five out of the last six weeks, the Labor Department reported Thursday.

The four-week average for claims, which smooths out weekly ups and downs, rose by 4,500 to 252,000, also the highest since November.

The number of Americans collecting traditional unemployment benefits increased by 8,000 the week that ended July 30 to 1.43 million, highest since early April.

Unemployment applications are a proxy for layoffs and are often seen as an early indicator of where the job market is headed.

So far this year, hiring in the United States has been remarkably strong and resilient in the face of rising interest rates and weak economic growth.

The Labor Department reported last week that U.S. employers added 528,000 jobs last month, more than

double what forecasters had expected. The unemployment rate dipped to 3.5% in July, tying a 50-year low reached just before coronavirus pandemic slammed the U.S. economy in early 2020.

The United States recovered with unexpected strength from 2020’s COVID-19 recession, leaving businesses scrambling to find enough workers.

But the U.S. economy faces challenges. Consumer prices have been surging, rising 8.5% in July from a year earlier — down slightly from June’s 40-year high 9.1%. To combat inflation, the Federal Reserve has raised its benchmark

short-term interest rate four times this year.

Higher borrowing costs have taken a toll. The economy contracted in the first half of the year — one rule of thumb for the onset of a recession. But the strength of the job market is inconsistent with an economic downturn.

“Demand for labor remains quite strong,” economists Thomas Simons and Aneta Markowska of Jefferies wrote Thursday. “The modest pickup in claims suggests that turnover may be increasing in weaker firms that are struggling with slowing growth.”

CDC drops quarantine, distancing recommendations for COVID

NEW YORK (AP) — The nation's top public health agency relaxed its COVID-19 guidelines Thursday, dropping the recommendation that Americans quarantine themselves if they come into close contact with an infected person.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention also said people no longer need to stay at least 6 feet away from others.

The changes, which come more than 2 1/2 years after the start of the pandemic, are driven by a recognition that an estimated 95% of Americans 16 and older have acquired some level of immunity, either from being vaccinated or infected, agency officials said.

"The current conditions of this pandemic are very different from those of the last two years," said the CDC's Greta Massetti, an author of the guidelines.

Many places around the

country long ago abandoned social distancing and other once-common precautions, but some of the changes could be particularly important for schools, which resume classes this month in many parts of the country.

Perhaps the biggest education-related change is the end of the recommendation that schools do routine daily testing, although that practice can be reinstated in certain situations during a surge in infections, officials said.

The CDC also dropped a "test-to-stay" recommendation, which said students exposed to COVID-19 could regularly test — instead of quarantining at home — to keep attending school. With no quarantine recommendation anymore, the testing option disappeared too.

Masks continue to be recommended only in areas where community transmission is deemed high, or if a person is considered at high risk of severe illness.

School districts across the U.S. have scaled back their COVID-19 precautions in

recent weeks even before the latest guidance was issued. Some have promised a return to pre-pandemic schooling.

Masks will be optional in most districts when classes resume this fall, and some of the nation's largest districts have dialed back or eliminated COVID-19 testing requirements.

Public schools in Los Angeles are ending weekly COVID-19 tests, instead making at-home tests available to families, the district announced last week. Schools in North Carolina's Wake County also dropped weekly testing.

Some others have moved away from test-to-stay programs that became unmanageable during surges of the omicron variant last school year.

The American Federation of Teachers, one of the nation's largest teachers unions, said it welcomes the guidance.

"Every educator and every parent starts every school year with great hope, and this year even more so,"

President Randi Weingarten said. "After two years of uncertainty and disruption, we need as normal a year as possible so we can focus like a laser on what kids need."

The new recommendations prioritize keeping children in school as much as possible, said Joseph Allen, director of Harvard University's healthy building program. Previous isolation policies forced millions of students to stay home from school, he said, even though the virus poses a relatively low risk to young people.

"Entire classrooms of kids had to miss school if they were deemed a close contact," he said. "The closed schools and learning disruption have been devastating."

Others say the CDC is going too far in relaxing its guidelines.

Allowing students to return to school five days after infection, without proof of a negative COVID-19 test, could lead to outbreaks in schools, said Anne Sosin, a public health researcher at Dartmouth College. That could force entire schools to

close temporarily if teachers get sick in large numbers, a dilemma that some schools faced last year.

"All of us want a stable school year, but wishful thinking is not the strategy for getting there," she said. "If we want a return to normal in our schools, we have to invest in the conditions for that, not just drop everything haphazardly like we're seeing across the country."

The average numbers of reported COVID-19 cases and deaths have been relatively flat this summer, at around 100,000 cases a day and 300 to 400 deaths.

The CDC previously said that if people who are not up to date on their COVID-19 vaccinations come into close contact with a person who tests positive, they should stay home for at least five days. Now the agency says quarantining at home is not necessary, but it urges those people to wear a high-quality mask for 10 days and get tested after five.

The agency continues to say that people who test positive should isolate from

others for at least five days, regardless of whether they were vaccinated. CDC officials advise that people can end isolation if they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication and they are without symptoms or the symptoms are improving.

Also on Thursday, the Food and Drug Administration updated its recommendations for how many times people exposed to COVID-19 should test.

Previously, the FDA had advised taking two rapid antigen tests over two or three days to rule out infection. Now the agency recommends three tests.

FDA officials said the change was based on new studies that suggest the old protocol can miss too many infections and result in people spreading the coronavirus, especially if they don't develop symptoms.

Over \$2B announced for roads, bridges, bike lanes across US

PHOENIX (AP) — U.S. transportation officials announced \$2.2 billion for local infrastructure projects on Thursday, paving the way for new bridges, roads, bike lanes, railways and ports in scores of communities across the country.

The competitive grants are more than double the amount awarded the previous year under the same program. The influx comes from a \$1 trillion infrastruc-

ture law backed by President Joe Biden, which provided an additional \$7.5 billion over five years for the grants.

Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg said the projects would help modernize America's transportation systems.

"This is a program that recognizes many of the most interesting and compelling ideas and designs and plans aren't going to come from Washington, but more of the funding should," Buttigieg said. "That's what we're delivering here."

Buttigieg traveled to Ar-

izona to highlight projects in Phoenix and Tucson, each of which are receiving the maximum \$25 million. In Phoenix, the money will help build a new bike and pedestrian bridge over the Rio Salado, connecting the city's southern area with downtown.

In Tucson, the money will revamp a prominent street and replace a 1960s-era vehicle bridge that's in poor condition. It also will add a separate bicycle and pedestrian bridge as part of what Mayor Regina Romero called "a trans-

formative investment in Tucson's infrastructure."

While the Tucson project will expand the number lanes for motorists, some projects elsewhere will reduce them. For example, a \$17 million grant will help narrow a five-lane road to three lanes in the Chicago suburb of Munster, Indiana, in an effort to decrease traffic crashes. The money also will fund a 10-foot-wide multi-purpose path along the street and plant more than 250 trees.

For many road improvement grants, "we're doing it in mind of also benefitting the bike and pedestrian side," Buttigieg said.

Other newly announced projects in the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity program also provide funding for bicycle and pedestrian paths.

Texas and Kansas are each receiving about \$25 million for hiking and biking trails. Huntsville,

Alabama, is getting \$20 million to improve a pedestrian corridor linking downtown to isolated neighborhoods. Another \$20 million is helping finance a new bike and pedestrian bridge over the Potomac River between Arlington, Virginia, and Washington, D.C.

Buttigieg said the U.S. Department of Transportation received about \$13 billion in grant applications.

A total of 166 projects across the country are getting a slice of the \$2.2 billion. The funding marks a significant increase from the \$983 million distributed among 90 projects in 2021. The allotment is the largest dating to 2009 for a program that has undergone multiple name and emphasis changes during the presidential administrations of Barack Obama and Donald Trump.

Though still substantial, the funding doesn't have quite the buying power as anticipated when the infrastructure legislation

passed Congress last year. That's because inflation has driven up the cost of key transportation construction materials, such as steel plates for bridges and asphalt for paving roads.

This year's projects range from a new seawall and port improvements in Sitka, Alaska, to the construction of a four-lane parkway in the Virgin Islands.

Among other projects, New Jersey is getting \$20 million to elevate a roadway that serves as a main evacuation route for Atlantic City and its casino industry. In Louisiana, \$20 million will go toward the design and construction of two train stations along a planned route between Baton Rouge and New Orleans. Whatcom County, Washington, will get \$25 million to replace a 60-year-old ferry serving rural Lummi Island with an electric hybrid model.

Breyer, Gorsuch join to promote education about Constitution

WASHINGTON (AP) — Recently retired Supreme Court Justice Stephen Breyer has become the honorary co-chairman of a nonpartisan group devoted to education about the Constitution, joining Justice Neil Gorsuch at a time of intense political polarization and rising skepticism about the court's independence.

The National Constitution Center in Philadelphia said Thursday that Breyer and Gorsuch, who has served since 2019, will be spokesmen for civics education and civility in politics.

The justices' decision to work together "is especially meaningful in this polarized time," Jeffrey Rosen, the center's president and CEO, said.

The 84-year-old Breyer retired at the end of June after nearly 28 years as a justice. His seat was taken by Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson, the high court's first Black woman.

Breyer has been a constant voice for seeing the

court as something other than "politicians in robes" even as the court has issued a string of conservative-driven decisions topped by eliminating the constitutional right to abortion and overturning Roe v. Wade.

In recent months, the court with six Republican-appointed conservatives and three liberals appointed by Democrats also has expanded gun rights, weakened the separation of church and state and constrained the Biden administration's efforts to combat climate change and the coronavirus pandemic.

Gorsuch was in the majority of all those cases and Breyer, in dissent.

Challenges to affirmative action in education and key election-related cases highlight the term that begins in October and seem likely to produce more sharp splits along ideological lines.

"Despite the strong disagreements on the court, Justices Breyer and Gorsuch, like all their colleagues, unite around a shared belief that civics are necessary for

the future of the republic," Rosen said.

Recent public opinions surveys have shown a sharp drop in approval of the court and its role as an institution that is above the political fray.

Still, Breyer said last week at a lawyers' convention in Chicago that he remains optimistic about the American legal system.

In a statement, he said, "The nonpartisan work of the National Constitution Center is essential, and I look forward to working with Justice Gorsuch to promote civil dialogue and debate."

Breyer also will return to teaching at Harvard Law School.

Past center chairmen have included President Joe Biden, who resigned when he launched his presidential campaign in 2019, and former Presidents Bill Clinton and George H.W. Bush.

The center's home in Philadelphia is near the Liberty Bell and Independence Hall, where the Constitution was drafted.

Landfill odor: Health problems, but no elevated cancer risk

Missouri's health department on Thursday announced findings of a lengthy examination of the troubled Bridgeton Landfill in suburban St. Louis, determining that the foul odor emitting from the landfill created health problems but did not increase the risk of cancer.

The finding of the yearslong investigation by the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services was validation for people who live near the landfill in northwestern St. Louis County, said Dawn

Chapman, co-founder of the activist group Just Moms STL. "We knew we were facing physical symptoms on a day-to-day basis from exposure to the odors," Chapman said. "We knew it could exacerbate illnesses because that's what we were seeing."

The landfill has been a source of concern for well over a decade for multiple reasons. Weapons-grade uranium refined in St. Louis as part of the Manhattan Project, the World War II-era program that produced the first nuclear weapons, was illegally dumped at the adjacent West Lake Landfill in

1973. Meanwhile, a smolder was discovered underground in 2010 at Bridgeton Landfill, just a few hundred yards away, creating worry about what could happen if the smoldering reaches the nuclear waste. The cause of the smolder remains unknown, but the resulting odor was so pungent that many nearby residents complained of illness and were often forced to stay inside.

Bridgeton Landfill has spent millions of dollars to mitigate the odor, which has decreased significantly in recent years.

The state health depart-

ment, in its "final health consultation document," determined that before the odor-reducing actions, breathing sulfur-based compounds "may have aggravated existing respiratory and cardiopulmonary conditions," and caused headaches, nausea and fatigue. Children, the elderly and those with chronic respiratory conditions such as asthma faced the greatest risk.

"Estimated cancer risks from living and breathing volatile organic compounds (VOCs) near the landfill are similar to the risks from living in other urban environments in the United States," the report

stated. Chapman recalled a day in the summer of 2013 when she took her kids to a nearby Target store. "The odor was so strong it came inside the building," she said. "As we were checking out everybody was gagging. People were puking in the parking lot and moms were trying to put their groceries away with their noses bleeding."

The odor was so bad that then-Attorney General Chris Koster filed a lawsuit in 2013. The suit was settled in 2018 when the current and former landfill owners agreed to pay \$16 million. A spokesman for the

Environmental Protection Agency declined comment on the Missouri report.

The EPA's Superfund project to address the nuclear waste was announced in 2018, but has been delayed while the agency refines its cleanup plan, initially estimated to cost \$205 million. The agency has not issued a new timeline.

The landfill's owner will shoulder the cost along with other "responsible parties," which include the U.S. Department of Energy and Exelon Corp. of Chicago, whose subsidiary once owned uranium processor Cotter Corp.

Garland asks court to unseal warrant for Mar-a-Lago search

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Justice Department is asking a federal court to unseal the warrant the FBI used to search the Mar-a-Lago estate of former President Donald Trump, Attorney General Merrick Garland said Thursday, acknowledging extraordinary public interest in the case about classified records.

The request is striking because such documents traditionally remain sealed during a pending investigation. But the Justice Department appeared to recognize that its silence since the search had created a vacuum for bitter verbal attacks by Trump and his allies, and that the public was entitled to the FBI's side about what prompted Monday's action at the former president's home.

"The public's clear and powerful interest in understanding what occurred under these circumstances weighs heavily in favor of unsealing," said a motion filed in federal court in Florida on Thursday.

Should the warrant be released — the request is now with the judge, and Trump can ob-

ject — it could disclose unflattering information about the former president and about FBI scrutiny of his handling of sensitive government documents right as he prepares for another run for the White House. During his successful 2016 campaign, he pointed frequently to an FBI investigation into his Democratic opponent, Hillary Clinton, over whether she mishandled classified information.

It's unclear at this point how much information would be included in the documents, if made public, or if they would encompass an FBI affidavit that would presumably lay out a detailed factual basis for the search. The department specifically requested the unsealing of the warrant as well as a property receipt listing the items that were seized, along with two unspecified attachments.

To obtain a search warrant, federal authorities must prove to a judge that probable cause exists to believe that a crime was committed. Garland said he personally approved the warrant, a decision he said the department did not take lightly given that standard practice where possible is to se-

lect less intrusive tactics than a search of one's home.

Neither Trump nor the FBI has said anything about what documents the FBI might have recovered, or what precisely agents were looking for. But the former president complained anew Thursday about the search.

Trump, who for years has lambasted the FBI and sought to sow distrust among his supporters in its decisions, said the warrant was served and the search conducted despite his cooperation with the Justice Department over the search.

In a post to his Truth Social platform, Trump said that his "attorneys and representatives were cooperating fully" prior to the search, and that government officials "could have had whatever they wanted, whenever they wanted, if we had it."

The Justice Department has until Friday afternoon to alert the judge about whether Trump will object to the release.

FBI and Justice Department policy cautions against discussing ongoing investigations, both to protect the integrity of probes and to avoid unfairly maligning someone who is being

scrutinized but winds up ultimately not being charged. That's especially true in the case of search warrants, where supporting court papers are routinely kept secret as the investigation proceeds.

In this case, though, Garland cited the fact that Trump himself had provided the first public confirmation of the FBI search, "as is his right." The Justice Department, in its new filing, also said that disclosing information about it now would not harm the court's functions.

Even so, Garland, in a hastily scheduled public statement delivered from the Justice Department podium, appeared to acknowledge the unusual nature of the department's request as he declined to take questions or provide any substantive details about the FBI's investigation.

"Much of our work is by necessity conducted out of the public eye. We do that to protect the constitutional rights of all Americans and to protect the integrity of our investigations," he said. "Federal law, longstanding department rules and our ethical obligations prevent me from providing further details as to the basis of the search at this time."

The Justice Depart-

ment under Garland has been leery of public statements about politically charged investigations, or of confirming to what extent it might be investigating Trump as part of a broader probe into the Jan. 6 riot at the U.S. Capitol and efforts to overturn the results of the 2020 election.

The department has tried to avoid being seen as injecting itself into presidential politics, as happened in 2016 when then-FBI Director James Comey made an unusual public statement announcing that the FBI would not be recommending criminal charges against Clinton regarding her handling of email — and when he spoke up again just over a week before the election to notify Congress that the probe was being effectively reopened because of the discovery of new emails.

The Mar-a-Lago search warrant was served Monday was part of an ongoing Justice Department investigation into the discovery of classified White House records recovered from Trump's home in Palm Beach, Florida, earlier this year. The National Archives had asked the department to investigate after saying that classified records

were found in 15 boxes of records that it retrieved from the estate. Multiple federal laws govern the handling of classified information.

The attorney general condemned verbal attacks on FBI and Justice Department personnel over the search. Some Republican allies of Trump have called for the FBI to be defunded, and large numbers of Trump supporters have called for the warrant to be released because they believe it will show that Trump was wrongly targeted.

"I will not stand by silently when their integrity is unfairly attacked," Garland said of federal law enforcement agents, calling them "dedicated, patriotic public servants."

Earlier Thursday, an armed man wearing body armor tried to breach a security screening area at an FBI field office in Ohio, then fled and was later killed after a standoff with law enforcement.

Jury can't reach verdict in engineers' Flint water trial

DETROIT (AP) — A judge declared a mistrial Thursday after jurors said they couldn't reach a unanimous verdict in a dispute over whether two engineering firms should bear some responsibility for Flint's lead-contaminated water.

Veolia North America and Lockwood, Andrews & Newman, known as LAN, were accused of not doing enough to get Flint to treat the highly corrosive water or to urge a return to a regional water supplier.

The eight-person jury met for roughly seven days after hearing evidence for months. The jury first signaled on July 28 that it couldn't reach a verdict before taking a planned 11-day break. The group returned to work Tuesday.

"Further deliberations will only result in stress and anxiety with no unanimous decision without someone having to surrender their honest convictions, solely for the purpose of returning a verdict," the jury said in a new note Thursday.

U.S. Magistrate Judge David Grand declared a mistrial, rejecting a request by lawyers for four children to allow a verdict that's less than unanimous.

"This is not a focus group," Grand said.

The trial centered on the engineering firms and the effects of lead on the children, not all Flint residents. But the result was being closely watched because there are other cases pending against Veolia and LAN.

The firms were not part of a landmark \$626 million deal involving property owners, thousands of residents of the majority-Black city, the state of Michigan and other parties.

"We don't see this as a defeat," Veolia attorney Dan Stein told The Associated Press. "The plaintiffs were the ones trying to prove their claims to the jury, and they were unable to do so."

Corey Stern, an attorney for the children, said he was only one juror shy from winning the case. The lack of a verdict means a trial can be held again with a different jury.

"I'm fired up for the next

one," Stern said. "I wish the judge would schedule it for Monday. I hated leaving the courthouse. You're an inch from the goal line after totting the ball for 99 yards."

Flint's water became contaminated in 2014-15 because water pulled from the Flint River wasn't treated to reduce the corrosive effect on lead pipes. Citing cost, managers appointed by then-Gov. Rick Snyder stopped using water from a Detroit agency and switched to the river while awaiting a new pipeline to Lake Huron.

The Michigan Civil Rights Commission said the bad water was the result of systemic racism in the city, doubting that the water switch and the spurning of complaints would have occurred in a white, prosperous community.

During closing arguments, attorneys for the children argued that Veolia should be held 50% responsible for lead contamination and that LAN should be held 25% responsible, with public officials making up the balance.

But Veolia's lawyers noted the firm was briefly hired in

the middle of the crisis, not before the spigot was turned on. LAN said an engineer repeatedly recommended that Flint test the river water for weeks to determine what treatments would be necessary.

LAN attorney Wayne Mason said outside engineers were getting lumped in with a "platoon of bad actors," namely state and local officials who controlled all major decisions about the water. The health effects on the four children were also challenged at trial.

Snyder was summoned as a witness but declined to answer questions, citing his right against self-incrimination.

He was indicted on misdemeanor charges in a separate Flint water investigation. The Michigan Supreme Court said the indictment was invalid, though state prosecutors are trying to reinstate the charges.

The jury instead watched a video of Snyder's 2020 interview with lawyers.

"I wish this never would have happened," he said of the water mess, acknowledging mistakes by government.

Chiefs' Mahomes to buck NFL trend, play preseason opener

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. (AP) — Patrick Mahomes will start the Kansas City Chiefs' pre-season opener in Chicago on Saturday, bucking a trend across the NFL of coaches sitting their starting quarterbacks for the first of their three exhibition games.

Chiefs coach Andy Reid said Thursday he would stick to his usual routine of having each of the four quarterbacks in camp play for a quarter of the pre-season opener. And while he acknowledged the number of snaps could change based on the way the game is going, Reid thinks it's important for everybody — stars and backups alike — to get onto the field.

"I think it's good to get the juices going, get yourself out there, even if it's a limited amount of plays," Reid said after the Chiefs wrapped up Thursday's practice at Missouri Western State University.

"I'm not saying it's wrong what others are doing," Reid said. "That's just where I'm at."

The Raiders sat Derek Carr and the Jaguars played without Trevor Lawrence in last week's Hall of Fame Game, though that's typical given the game occurs a week earlier than the rest of the pre-season openers. But plenty of teams are choosing to sit their starting quarterbacks this week, too, rather than risk an injury by subjecting them to unnecessary hits.

HENDERSON, Nev. (AP) — Jarrett Stidham knows who's the starting quarterback in Las Vegas.

Now, happy to be in Las Vegas, Stidham joins a coach who molded his offensive game since the Patriots drafted him from Auburn in the 2019 draft, when Josh McDaniels was still the offensive coordinator in New England.

Broncos sport NFL's richest, most diverse ownership group

ENGLEWOOD, Colo. (AP) — The Denver Broncos now sport the wealthiest owner in the NFL and the league's most diverse ownership group.

Four of the six members of the Walton-Penner ownership group, which was welcomed into the NFL this week, are either women or minorities.

Walmart heir Rob Walton, the oldest child of Walmart co-founder Sam Walton, bought the Broncos along with his daughter, Carrie Walton Penner, and her husband, for \$4.65 billion, a global record for a professional sports franchise.

Walton said Wednesday that his son-in-law, Greg Penner, will serve as CEO of the team. Penner said he'll soon hire a team president. Those roles had been held by Joe Ellis, who is staying on this year as an advisor.

Penner said he'll be the point person "but this is an incredible group. We're going to draw on all of them."

The ownership group includes limited partners Mellody Hobson, Condoleezza Rice and Lewis Hamilton. Hobson is CEO of Starbucks, Rice is

a former U.S. Secretary of State and Hamilton is the winningest Formula One driver in history.

Walton thanked Ellis for his 27 years of service and paid tribute to the late Pat Bowlen. He purchased the team in 1984 for \$78 million and died in 2019, a month shy of his induction into the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

"Pat Bowlen built a great legacy and a record of winning and championships," Walton said. "We plan to do everything we can to build on the championship tradition of this great organization. ... Simply put, it's an honor to steward this historic franchise. Our No. 1 priority is putting a winning team on the field

to win Super Bowls." Before Walton's group purchased the Broncos, the NFL's wealthiest owner was Carolina's David Tepper, whom Forbes estimates has a total net worth of \$16.7 billion. Walton's estimated net worth is \$60 billion.

"We wanted to add people that brought different perspectives and experiences and certainly we have that here," Penner said. "Lewis, being the G.O.A.T. (greatest of all time) Formula One driver, Dr. Rice with all of her experience in politics and academics and world affairs, Mellody, as a you know, an incredible businesswoman and her track record there."

Tagovailoa on Miami tampering with Brady: 'I'm still here'

TAMPA, Fla. (AP) — Tua Tagovailoa would rather chat with Tom Brady than answer questions about him taking his job.

Tagovailoa spent time talking with Brady while the Miami Dolphins and Tampa Bay Buccaneers held a joint practice Wednesday. He had a simple reply when asked about Miami being penalized for tampering with Brady.

"I'm still here. To me, that's all noise at this point," Tagovailoa said.

Last week, the NFL suspended Dolphins owner Stephen Ross through Oct. 17, fined him \$1.5 million and docked the team a first-round pick in the 2023 draft and a third-round selection in the 2024 draft

for talking to Brady while he was under contract with the Patriots in 2019 and Buccaneers in 2021.

The league's investigation determined the Dolphins had impermissible communications with both Brady and his agent, Don Yee, no later than early December 2021 and after the season, while he was under contract to the Buccaneers.

Those discussions focused on Brady becoming a limited partner in the Dolphins and possibly serving as a football executive, although at times they also included the possibility he would play for the Dolphins. The league says Ross and Dolphins vice chairman/limited partner Bruce Beal participated in the discussions.

Brady, who turned 45 last week, briefly retired after

last season. He hasn't spoken to reporters since the league punished the Dolphins but the seven-time Super Bowl champion spoke to Tagovailoa on the field.

"We were talking on the side for a good bit," Tagovailoa said. "He was just asking how the offseason was. We were talking a little about golf at the same time. But for the most part, 23 years playing, that's a long time. That's a lot of knowledge, so I was asking him some things and he gave me some good insight on. I'm going to keep that between me and Tom. Then if you guys want to ask Tom, you can go ask him."

Tagovailoa said Brady's "composure in the pocket" impressed him the most.

"Nothing really rattles him. When you have a guy

The Patriots planned to sit Mac Jones for their preseason opener against the Giants on Thursday night, when the Ravens were expected to have Lamar Jackson wearing a headset rather than a helmet for their game against the Titans.

Others sitting out include the Cowboys' Dak Prescott, Bills starter Josh Allen and the Buccaneers' Tom Brady, who is beginning an 11-day absence to deal with "personal things." Aaron Rodgers also is unlikely to play for the Packers given that the four-time and reigning league MVP has not played in a preseason game for Green Bay since 2018.

"I like to get in there and get hit like, on time," said Mahomes, who has played the preseason opener every season but 2020, when there wasn't any because of the pandemic. "Once you get hit

one time, you see what it is. Then you're good to go."

Mahomes threw only two passes in last year's preseason opener against San Francisco before giving way to backup Chad Henne and the rest of the Kansas City quarterbacks. Mahomes had more extensive time in the second and third games.

When there was a four-game preseason schedule, he usually played the first three before sitting out the finale.

"It'll be good this time to get in there with the new group of receivers we have, all the new running backs, and show how we do it in the game," Mahomes said. "We're doing it here in practice but we want to show how we do it in the game."

Reid said his quarterbacks will be accompanied by their respective line on the depth chart, meaning Mahomes will play with the starting offense before Henne takes over with the backups. Shane Buechele and Dustin Crum will finish

things out.

"It's definitely about getting into rhythm. It's getting into the game, seeing how the clock is running — everything in the game speeds up," Mahomes explained. "So the guys need to think, execute, show off their talent. It's going to be important to be in the game and see how all these guys do."

As much as Mahomes wants to see how new wide receivers JuJu Smith-Schuster, Marquez Valdes-Scantling and second-round pick Skyy Moore fare on Saturday, most of the attention will be on the revamped defense.

First-round pick Trent McDuffie is expected to start at cornerback along with Justin Reid, who arrived from Houston in free agency. The Chiefs also expect to give plenty of work to another first-round pick, defensive end George Karlaftis, along with rookie defensive backs Joshua Williams, Jaylen Watson and Bryan Cook.

After appearing in a total of eight games, backing up Tom Brady and Cam Newton in his first two seasons, Stidham missed last year after back surgery kept him from competing with Mac Jones.

Then, one morning in May while working out, Patriots coach Bill Belichick told him they were shipping him "to Vegas to Josh and them."

Stidham, who turned 26 on Monday, now finds himself in competition with Nick Mullens and Chase Garbers for the backup role behind Carr but what has proved to be beneficial is knowing how McDaniels expects his offense to be run.

"I've tried to be as helpful as possible because I know when I was in Chase's shoes my rookie year, Brian Hoyer, Tom Brady, these guys really helped me in the offense and just learn how to be a pro," Stidham said. "That's what I've tried to help with Chase; and then obviously with Nick (Mullens) and Derek (Carr), those guys being vets, just trying to help them as much as I can with little things. And that goes along with anybody really, running backs, tight ends, receivers, O-line, I just try to help out as much as I can where I can."

That said, his familiarity with McDaniels' offense doesn't automatically give him an upper hand in the hunt for the backup spot, as there are certain intangibles that come with installing a system into a

new team.

"All these guys come in here and they had a practice in the morning, they have a heavy installation in the evening, they have a walk-through in the evening and the installations (aren't) the same as the ones he's had previously in New England," Raiders offensive coordinator Mick Lombardi said.

"It's something that he has to learn that evening and study that night to really get. Now, obviously, the operation stuff gives him some advantage, but how does he take advantage of that? Knowing that it is taking it to the next step of doing the actual things we talked about as a quarterback."

Such as communication with an offensive line that has plenty of question marks a month before the

start of the regular season.

Or little things that are not only assignment-based, but also in understanding the bigger picture with the new personnel he's working with and understanding his role with a new set of receivers in the event he has to replace Carr.

Stidham's football IQ and eagerness to learn aren't being overlooked.

"Great kid, smart, works hard at the game," McDaniels said. "Understands what he's trying to do, ran the offense pretty efficiently the other night. Took care of the ball, made some plays with his legs. I see him as a young player who's continuing to develop and improve. We have not reached his peak yet. We have a lot of players on our team I'd say that about, but certainly, Jarrett is one of them."

"We're big believers in bringing together different perspectives and experiences and backgrounds and that we think will make us more successful."

All but Hamilton, who is still in racing season, gathered at team headquarters a day after NFL owners unanimously approved the sale Tuesday in Minnesota. Hobson called it "such an honor and a privilege to be an owner of this remarkable organization. ... The moment is humbling and it's historical, and yet, I feel at home."

Hobson said when she was first approached about joining the ownership group, she encouraged Walton to also bring aboard her friend Ham-

ilton.

"Lewis is my chosen little brother," she said. "As soon as this opportunity came up, I said, 'You have to have Lewis.' I met Lewis in his rookie season as an F1 driver. We bonded over time. As many of you know, he was knighted by Queen Elizabeth and I call him, 'Sir Little Brother.'"

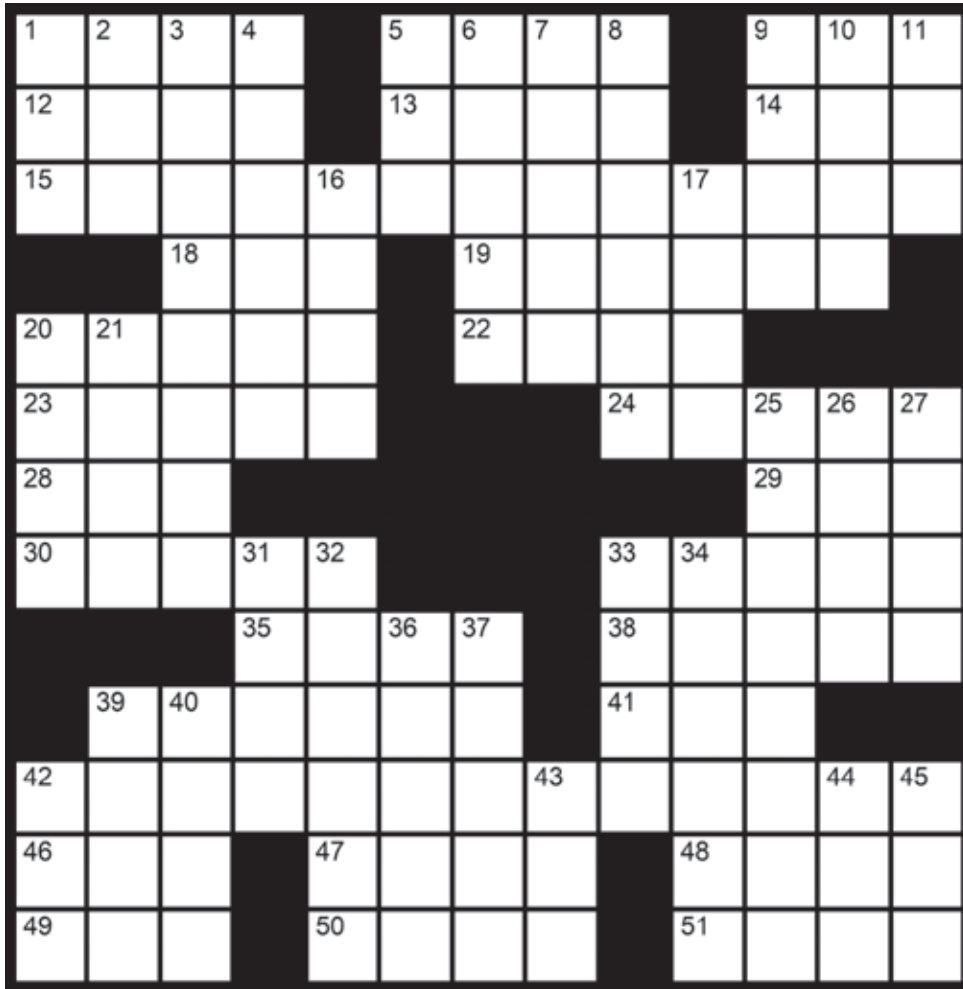
