Safety concerns bring changes to Horace Mann school zone

Bump-outs, islands, crosswalks intended to protect pedestrians

Last year, the principal and school resource officer at Horace Mann Elementary came to Sedalia Public Works Director Brenda Ardrey looking for solutions to the dangerous traffic on West 16th Street. Even with the increased congestion in front of the school, people were still speeding through the school zone despite the LED flashing signs.

"We had asked if we could put in one-way streets on Park and Stewart just for our block," Horace Mann Principal Sara Pannier said Thursday. "My crosswalk volunteers, teachers and staff members have been nearly hit two to three times."

Public Works went to work to find the cause of the problem.

"We went out and watched the traffic flows and the traffic patterns," Ardrey said. "We did discover that there is increased traffic on 16th Street, as you might expect with Sedalia growing. Of more concern to us were quite a few distracted drivers we noticed going through the school zone using a cell phone or an iPad while they're driving and in the school zone. You put that with a possible speed problem, it becomes very hazardous for pedestrians there along in front of the school and we do have some small businesses, including Papa Jake's."

Ayden Bartley with Papa Jake's Donuts has been in

his family's business for years and is a daily witness to the traffic problems near Horace Mann Elementary.

"It's pretty hectic," Bartley said. "Just a lot of traffic going through here. On 16th, traffic is always going back and forth, then you know there's just not enough parking to properly let people drop off and pick up here, so the only place for them to go is on the sides of the road and the sides of a busy road at that."

Bartley sees his regular customers have to scurry across 16th Street, especially during drop-off times when all his spaces are filled.

"You particularly see it in the morning," Bartley said. "Earlier this spring, we had one of our regular customers, a little kid a couple of blocks down who was on his way to school, and a car came ripping through here. He was on his bicycle; people just don't slow down. You would think it would be obvious it's a school zone with kids running around everywhere."

After the Public Works traffic study, the City put a plan together to direct drivers safely past the school.

"We got a traffic safety engineer involved and he made a recommendation that we consider putting some bump outs on the corners," Ardrey said. "That allows the pedestrians to better see traffic coming towards and going away from them, and it gives them a better feel for the speed that those vehicles are traveling. We were also hoping to increase the parking availability. The bump

outs themselves, the refuge islands that you see going in the center, that's all about the pedestrians."

Bartley is still waiting to see if the bump-outs, islands, crosswalks and fully ADA-compliant ramps will help or hurt his business.

"It's definitely going to limit access," Bartley said. "Whenever they complete this one and the one across the street, that's going force anyone that wants to come park right in front of our business out into the middle of the road where the traffic stream is. It's just going to slow everything down, bog everyone up, just kind of congest things that much more. They didn't consider the fact that we have trucks that come and deliver to us."

Smithton School District starts 2022-23 school year 17 new teachers, three new admins join district

On Aug. 24, the Smithton R-VI School District started the first day of school with 17 new teachers and three new administrators across the campus.

Superintendent David Bray said the reason for all the new staff is the previous staff members moved closer to their families or left to start their own families.

Bray said that even though there was a large amount of new staff, the first week went well.

"We started on a Wednesday, which is always good," Bray said. "It seems like we can always get students back in and used to routines and review expectations."

Bray added that the first week of school gives families and transportation, along with other programs, time to get things worked out during the few days.

During this week's first

full week of school, the sports teams started competing, which made it feel like school officially started.

To help the 17 new teachers who have joined the Smithton district, new support services were added.

"We have an instructional coach to support them this year, which we have not had in the past before," Bray said. Bray called the 2022-23 school year a year of new, especially for their school district, and said it's very exciting.

As superintendent, Bray said he looks forward to watching all the new teachers and administrators grow throughout the year.

"It's always exciting to see someone who comes in, this is from administration down, it's always exciting to watch them grow and develop through a school year," Bray said. "It's also exciting to see the support from those who have been here, our veteran teachers or even if they have been here

for a few years, have become the experts.

Bray added that he also enjoys seeing the support those people give to the new teachers and administrators.

"No question, that's the most exciting thing about this school year," Bray said. "Watching that teamwork where our folks that have been here are working to support our new teachers and watching those new teachers grow throughout the school year."

Bray added that the leaving and hiring of so many teachers are just normal right now across the board for all school districts.

"There have been more openings across the state in teaching than ever before," Bray said.

The Smithton school district's enrollment is steady this year, but Bray didn't have the exact number because they're still enrolling students.

Twitter readies edit feature for premium users

Permanently misspelled tweets might soon be a thing of the past.

Twitter said Thursday it will roll out an editing feature to subscribers of its premium Twitter Blue service later this month.

In an update on its plans to introduce an edit button, the social media company said it has been testing the feature internally, which it said is one of the most requested features to date.

The edit function will give users 30 minutes to make changes to their 280-character messages such as fixing typos or adding hashtags after first

publishing a tweet.

To make it clear that a tweet has been modified, they'll be labeled and appear with an icon and timestamp. Users can look up past versions of the tweet by tapping the label.

Twitter said it's testing the edit feature with a small group of users so it can identify and resolve potential issues.

"This includes how people might misuse the feature," the company said in a blog post. "You can never be too careful."

The time limit and version history play an important role, Twitter said. "They help protect the integrity of the conversation and create a

publicly accessible record of what was said."

Twitter hinted that the edit feature would eventually be rolled out to all users. Testing helps the company understand how it impacts the way people use Twitter "as well as plan for and anticipate what might happen if we bring it to everyone," spokeswoman Stephanie Cortez said.

Many Twitter users — among them, Kim Kardashian, Ice T, Katy Perry and McDonald's corporate account — have long pleaded for an edit button.

The company said in April that it has been working on the feature since last year, a day after

Tesla CEO Elon Musk polled his followers on whether they wanted an edit button. About three-quarters of the 4.4 million respondents said yes.

Later that month, Musk offered to buy Twitter for \$44 billion with the promise that his ownership would bring big changes to the service. He has since attempted to back out of the deal citing concerns about fake accounts and whistleblower allegations of poor cybersecurity, setting the stage for a bruising legal battle over whether he has to go through with the purchase.

The premium service costs \$4.99 per month.

CHILHOWEE — Residents of Chilhowee will be celebrating a diamond jubilee this weekend as the town marks 75 years of the Chilhowee Fair. The Chilhowee Fair is going “Back to the Past” and will be hosted in downtown Chilhowee from Thursday, Sept. 1 to Saturday, Sept. 3. A wide variety of food, music, contests and activities will take place during the three-day event. Exhibit entries will be accepted from 6 to 8 p.m. Thursday; some contests also allow entries from 7 to 10 a.m. Friday. Several contests will be available to enter, such as fine arts, floriculture, food, home economics, farm crops, and 4-H projects. Exhibits will close at 10 a.m. Friday for judging and then will be open for viewing. At 7 p.m. Friday, local youth will compete for Wee Queen, Junior Miss and High School Queen. Afternoon games will be hosted from 2 to 4 p.m. Friday and Saturday. On both days, the schedule of games includes flour dip, relay race, tug of war, terrapin race, hula hoop contest, egg throwing contest, water balloon throwing contest, and bicycle and tricycle races. Some activities have age requirements. On Saturday, registration for judged activities will be from 1:30 to 2 p.m. with the events hosted among

the other afternoon games. Judged activities include storybook character, best decorated bicycle and tricycle, and hobo contest. There will also be carnival rides throughout the weekend.

Missouri Humanities Council awards grant to UCM for Historic Missouri

WARRENSBURG — The Missouri Humanities Council has awarded a \$10,000 grant to the University of Central Missouri in support of Historic Missouri.



Historic Missouri is a website and a free mobile app that provides users access to information about the important places, people and stories that are unique to Missouri.

Developed by the faculty and students in the History Program at the University of Central Missouri, the mobile application provides interpretive and curated narrative tours about Missouri's history.

Each point on the map includes historical information about that site and features historic images from Missouri's archival institutions, such as the State Historical Society of Missouri and the Missouri State Archives.

Project Director Jon Taylor, UCM history professor, said the grant supports UCM Master of Arts in History students to research, write and upload content to Historic Missouri that will be used to create at least 10 walking/driving tours for several Missouri communities.

Students plan to finish the tours by May 2023, when the tours will be featured on historicmissouri.org and also available for android and iPhone users via the Historic Missouri app. For more information

Working on the potter's wheel

I have always wanted to try my hands at throwing a clay pot on a pottery wheel. It looks like such a wonderfully messy process, and it is. A chunk of the earth, water, hands, a spinning wheel. Out of that messy process comes a vessel that is beautiful and useful, ready to be filled.

In Jeremiah (18:1-4), the prophet tells us of his vision of God as a potter working a lump of clay. Verse 4 says, "The vessel he was making of clay was spoiled in the potter's hand, and he reworked it into another vessel, as seemed good to him." We can also read about God as the potter in Isaiah 64:8 "... we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand."

Working clay on a wheel must be such a rich experience for the

senses. The clay smells like the earth from which it was taken and has the color of the same. It feels heavy and malleable, and when water is added, it becomes slippery. The potter spins the wheel and uses their hands to help the lump of clay, a chunk of the earth, take shape. We are very much like the clay that Jeremiah talks about. Like that clay, we are just perfect for God's purpose.

The potter works with clay, an imperfect lump of stuff. There may be stones and other debris to remove. The forming is tricky. The potter forms us and, if our vessel collapses, the potter reworks us. We are constantly being formed and reformed by God.

We are like the clay that Jeremiah talks about, in and of itself, just perfect for God's purpose. Sometimes the clay may have pebbles or other debris that need to be picked out. We might call those sin, or fear, or

addiction, or misunderstanding. Whatever we call the pebbles, they are never the clay. They are things that rob the clay of its perfection.

So, can we, imperfect as we are, possibly help the potter in the work of forming us into something more perfect? We can and we do, over and over again! When we gather together for worship, we are helping the potter to perfect us. We add our help to the potter's work when we go to the scriptures for study and when we go to God in prayer. We assist the potter when we serve others as God's hands and feet in the world.

Whenever we open our minds and our hearts to the work of the Holy Spirit, we are picking out the pebbles and casting away the debris. God created the clay and God, as the potter, constantly works to create and recreate each one of us as a better vessel, ready to be filled.

Reading, math scores fell sharply during pandemic, data show

WASHINGTON (AP) — Math and reading scores for America's 9-year-olds fell dramatically during the first two years of the pandemic, according to a new federal study — offering an early glimpse of the sheer magnitude of the learning setbacks dealt to the nation's children.

Reading scores saw their largest decrease in 30 years, while math scores had their first decrease in the history of the testing regimen behind the study, according to the National Center for Education Statistics, a branch of the U.S. Education Department.

The dramatic setbacks, which erased two decades of progress in American test scores, reflect years of upheaval for the country's education system. Schools shut down for months at a time amid COVID-19 outbreaks. Many children spent a year or more learning from home. Virus outbreaks among staff and students continued the disruption even after kids returned to the classroom.

The declines hit all regions of the country and affected students of most races. But they were most dramatic for the country's most vulnerable kids. Students of color saw some of the steepest decreases, widening the racial achievement gap.

Much of the nation's standardized testing didn't happen during the early days of the pandemic, so the findings released Thursday gave an early look at the impact of pandemic learning disruptions. Broader data is expected to be released later this year as part of the National Assessment of Educational Progress,

also known as the Nation's Report Card.

"These are some of the largest declines we have observed in a single assessment cycle in 50 years of the NAEP program," said Daniel McGrath, the acting associate commissioner of NCES. "Students in 2022 are performing at a level last seen two decades ago."

In math, the average score for 9-year-old students fell 7 percentage points between 2020 and 2022, according to the study. The average reading score fell 5 points.

The pandemic's upheaval especially hurt students of color. Math scores dropped by 5 percentage points for white students, compared with 13 points for Black students and 8 points for Hispanic students. The divide between Black and white students widened by 8 percentage points during the pandemic.

Decreases were more uniform in reading: Scores dropped 6 points for white, Black and Hispanic students.

For Asian American students, Native American students and students of two or more races, there was little change in reading or math between 2020 and 2022, the study found.

The setbacks, especially among underprivileged kids, raised alarms in the education world. Denise Forte, interim CEO of the Education Trust think tank, called it "deeply disturbing."

"Due to inequitable and unjust school systems, students who are the most underserved continue to struggle academically both before and during the pandemic," Forte said. "Decision-makers at all levels have not done nearly enough to address the

long-standing resource inequities that prohibit Black, Latino and students from low-income backgrounds from reaching their full academic potential."

A national association of superintendents said the findings are disappointing but not surprising.

Dan Domenech, executive director of AASA, said there's encouraging evidence that schools are now investing in summer learning, mental health counselors and reading specialist. But experts have questioned whether schools are taking actions that are sweeping enough to address the magnitude of academic losses.

Geographically, all regions saw decreases in math, but declines were slightly worse in the Northeast and Midwest compared with the West and South. Outcomes were similar for reading, except that the West had no measurable difference compared with 2020.

Although it marks a sharp drop since 2020, the average reading score was 7 points higher than it was in 1971, and the average math score was 15 points higher than in 1978, the study found.

Overall, the results paint a "sobering picture" of schooling during the pandemic, said Peggy Carr, commissioner of the NCES.

Federal officials say this is the first nationally representative study to compare student achievement before the pandemic and in 2022, when most students had returned to in-person learning. Testing was completed in early 2020, soon before the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic, and in early 2022.

House committee reaches deal to get Trump financial records

WASHINGTON (AP) — A House committee seeking financial records from former President Donald Trump has reached an agreement that ends litigation on the matter and requires an accounting firm to turn over some of the material, the panel's leader announced Thursday.

The long-running case began in April 2019, when the House Committee on Oversight and Reform first subpoenaed a wealth of records from Trump's then-accounting firm, Mazars USA. The committee cited testimony from Trump's former attorney, Michael Cohen, that it said raised questions about the president's representation of his financial affairs when it came to seeking loans and paying taxes.

Under the agreement, Trump has agreed to end his legal challenges to the subpoena and Mazars USA has agreed to produce responsive documents to the committee as expeditiously as possible, said Rep. Carolyn Maloney, D-N.Y., who heads the committee.

"After numerous court victories, I am pleased that my committee has now reached an agreement to obtain key financial documents that former President Trump fought for years to hide from

Congress," Maloney said.

Trump is facing investigations on several fronts, including the storage of top-secret government information discovered at Trump's Mar-a-Lago home and whether the former president's team criminally obstructed the inquiry. In Georgia, prosecutors are investigating whether he and allies illegally tried to interfere in the 2020 presidential election. Meanwhile, congressional committees are following through on investigations that began when he was president.

The settlement over Mazars follows a July decision by a federal appeals court in Washington that narrowed what records Congress is entitled to obtain. The court said the committee should be given records pertinent to financial ties between foreign countries and Trump or any of his businesses for 2017-18.

The appeals court also ordered Mazars to turn over documents between November 2016 and 2018 relating to the Trump company that held the lease granted by the federal government for the former Trump International Hotel, located between the White House and the Capitol.

In the decision, the court said Trump's financial records would "advance the Committee's

consideration of ethics reform legislation across all three of its investigative tracks," including on presidential ethics and conflicts of interest, presidential financial disclosures, and presidential adherence to Constitutional safeguards against foreign interference and undue influence.

The House investigation dates February 2019, when Trump's former personal attorney, Cohen, testified to the committee that Trump had a history of misrepresenting the value of assets to gain favorable loan terms and tax benefits.

Cohen served time in federal prison after pleading guilty in 2018 to tax crimes, lying to Congress and campaign finance violations, some of which involved his role in orchestrating payments to two women to keep them from talking about alleged affairs with Trump.

But his testimony prompted the committee to seek key financial documents from Mazars, and in April 2019, the committee issued a subpoena to Mazars seeking four targeted categories of documents.

The following month, Trump sued to prevent Mazars from complying with the subpoena. The case has been winding its way through the court system since.

While Papa Jake's may lose a street parking space for the bump-out, Public Works has planned for that as well.

"We'll be adding a small parking lot there diagonal from school and directly across from Papa Jake's to help alleviate some of the line of sight issues by providing parking alternatives in that lot," Ardrey said.

She noted driving west on 16th Street, approaching the school, the road

looks narrower than normal. That channeling of traffic is intended to get drivers to slow down.

"The area looks like it's dramatically reduced in size," Ardrey said, "but as you get closer, you see that you have a full lane width there without any trouble.

It's all about getting that driver focused on the need to get through this area at a reduced speed when there are children present."

Crossing guard Ernest Lancaster hopes the hard work the city has put in, and big, yellow curbs, will get people's attention.

"People go speeding

around here and I don't want my kids to get hit," Lancaster said. "I just started last week. Hang up the phone!"

Principal Pannier has noticed some improvement since the giant yellow curbs and islands have been added.

"From my observation so far, they are slowing down," Pannier said, "because they think it narrows the road just enough, it gets their attention. So in that regard, I do believe it has helped slow down the traffic flow."

"So, we try to be a liaison and a resource for churches involved in it (and) we want to get more people involved."

Guier said they try to recruit other churches and give them supplies if they don't have the "information or link to get the supplies." For those who need boxes, labels, or information brochures, the Summers and Guier will ensure they have what they need.

Keith added they are also encouraging community groups and schools to become part of OCC.

"Private schools are starting up," he noted. "Some of them are expressing interest in getting involved."

Sherry and Guier said those wishing to help don't have to be churches; they can be families.

"It's not just church; it can be anybody in the

community," Guier said. "If they want to build a shoebox online or fill it themselves, they can do that at home and then take it to the drop-off location."

The trio said the way the program works is volunteers assemble and pack the shoeboxes with gifts, such as school supplies, toys, handcrafted items, and one "wow" gift. A "wow" gift can be a doll, stuffed animal, or a race car. Those packing the boxes can also include a note and photo of themselves. The packages are for children ages 2 to 14 and are packed for girls and boys. Items placed in the boxes are either collected or made by volunteers.

After the boxes are packed, they are collected or dropped off; from there, they're processed, shipped, and distributed worldwide. Once they reach their destination, the boxes are gifted to children through outreach events. The final goal is to teach them about Christ.

September is the month for Pettis County OCC to begin filling boxes. The local drop-off for the filled boxes is Nov. 14-21 at New Hope Baptist Church, 664 E. 16th St.

"What is attractive, I think, about the ministry, these (boxes) go to hard-to-reach areas," Keith said. "We're talking about boxes going in on dog sleds, donkeys, canoes, camels.

"The main thing that attracts most of the ministry, not just the boxes, which brings temporary happiness," he continued. "But the Gospel message which is Jesus Christ, which goes with it — that's our main focus."

Keith said many boxes go to children who have never received a gift. Samaritan's Purse posts videos on its website of the children receiving their packages, and Keith added it's incredible to see their reactions.

Sherry said those who feel led to join OCC could go to the volunteer link online and volunteer

for different positions within the organization.

"I think there's a position for just about anybody," Guier noted. "If they feel led to do something ... whatever they feel their talents is or gift, then they can do that."

Keith added that what drew them to the ministry was the "accountability and effectiveness" of the program.

"So many times, people give money, and they wonder what happened," he noted. "Was it wasted? Did it do any good? With OCC, every year, they're just so open. It's making a difference in lives."

Keith and Sherry Summer, and Sheila Guier said they are available for speaking engagements.

White House: How about a COVID-19 boost with that flu shot?

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Biden administration hopes to make getting a COVID-19 booster as routine as going in for the yearly flu shot.

That's at the heart of its campaign to sell the newly authorized shot to an American public that has widely rejected COVID-19 boosters since they first became available last fall.

Shots of the updated boosters, specifically designed by Pfizer and Moderna to respond to the omicron strain, could start within days. Advisers to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention were meeting Thursday to decide who should get the modified doses and when the shots will be eligible. The U.S. government has purchased 170 million shots and is emphasizing that everyone will have free access to the booster.

White House COVID-19 coordinator Dr. Ashish Jha said this latest round of shots will offer protection during the busy cold and flu season, with the hope of transitioning people to get the vaccine yearly. Typically, at least half of U.S. adults get a flu shot.

"We expect them to provide more durable protection over time," Jha said in an interview Wednesday with The Associated Press. "The goal very much is to get to a point where people get their COVID shot on a regular basis, the way they do their flu shot."

Community health workers in North Carolina, home to the country's lowest COVID-19 booster rate, like the strategy, especially because of confusion among some people about vaccine schedules.

"I believe in keeping things simple," said Marty Stamey, an outreach coordinator for the Mountain Area Health Education Center in western North Carolina. "I've heard a lot of people say, 'I think I'll just wait and try to do it like the flu shots.'"

The White House plan also relies in part of on local health departments, providers and community groups to reach out and encourage people to get the updated booster. Pharmacies, health providers and state or local health departments are preparing to send text messages to millions of people that will encourage them to get a booster this fall, White House officials said.

Jha said he recommends most Americans get the booster by the end of October.

Still, this latest vaccination campaign faces several challenges.

A majority of Americans got their first and second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine when it was released last year but they've been more reluctant to get a booster jab, with less than half getting their first booster since it became available late last

year. Congress also has not moved forward on President Joe Biden's \$22.5 billion request earlier this year for the COVID-19 response. Republicans criticized the request, pointing to the \$1.9 trillion already spent on responding to the pandemic. Running short on funds, the government announced it would stop shipping COVID-19 tests to people's homes after Friday.

And COVID-19 funding is drying up for many of the community groups that received millions of federal tax dollars to hire workers who spent months reaching deep into neighborhoods with door knocks, mobile vaccine clinics and posters encouraging people to inoculate against COVID-19.

White House officials say those local leaders deserve a lot of credit for stamping out misinformation about the COVID-19 vaccine and convincing many around the country that the shot will protect them.

"Those are the really critical messengers," Jha said.

That on-the-ground work has been crucial to getting people vaccinated in the rural, Spanish- and Haitian-speaking communities that the Migrant Clinicians Network has reached throughout Texas, California and Maryland with its \$8.5 million federal grant.

"Simply having the vaccines available is one thing, but getting the shots in the arms is another," said Amy Lieberman, a chief program officer for the nonprofit group.

Some of those local health organizations, too, are now stretched as they work to get low vaccination rates among children under 12 up. Only a third of 5- to 11-year-olds received both doses of the COVID-19 vaccine since becoming eligible late last year. Meanwhile, just 7% of children under 5 have gotten a first dose since it was made available this summer.

Dr. Niharika Khanna at the University of Maryland School of Medicine has just started making progress on convincing new mothers that the vaccine is safe and effective for their babies.

Her program, which has hired more than 269 health workers and administered more than 12,000 vaccinations and boosters across Delaware, Maryland, Virginia and West Virginia, isn't quite ready to transition back to pushing COVID-19 boosters.

"All of these people, all of these relationships we've carefully cultivated are at risk for falling apart," Khanna said. "Today if you were to say to me switch to booster, I'd say no. I need another two to three weeks to really get these people going."

'Tragic outcomes': Mentally ill face fatal risk with police

SALEM, Ore. (AP) — One summer night, Misty Castillo stepped out of her house in Salem, Oregon, called 911 and asked for the police, saying her son was mentally ill, was assaulting her and her husband and had a knife.

"He's drunk and he's high and he's mentally ill," Castillo told the emergency dispatcher, emphasizing again her son's mental condition. Less than five minutes later, a police officer burst into the house and shot Arcadio Castillo III dead as he stood, his mother said later, "frozen like a deer in headlights."

"He didn't try to calm him down. He just came in and immediately shot my son," Castillo said.

Time and time again across the U.S., people experiencing mental health crises are being killed by police, but the exact number remains unknown because of a yawning governmental information gap.

A law passed by Congress in 2016 requires the Department of Justice to collect and publish data on how often federal, state and local officers use force, how many times that force ends up being fatal and how often the deceased had a mental illness. But the law doesn't require police departments to tell the DOJ how many people their officers killed. The FBI, for the first quarter of this year, estimated that only 40% of all law enforcement agencies submitted use-of-force numbers.

Arcadio's parents had sought mental health treatment for their 23-year-old son and even tried to have him committed. But the system, such as it is, failed them.

Across the country, in

West Virginia, another system failure, another death.

Matt Jones was apparently suffering from a severe manic episode while standing on a highway with a handgun. Police were everywhere, sirens wailing. The scene on July 6 in the community of Bradley was captured by a bystander on video. One officer took a shot and then others opened fire, killing Jones in a hail of bullets.

The 36-year-old had been unable to get his medication refilled and was experiencing delusions and hallucinations, his fiancée, Dreamer Marquis, said.

"He desperately wanted help," Marquis said. "He knew that he needed the medication in order to live a normal life because he knew that he would have manic episodes that would get him in trouble."

Advocates for people with mental illness say it's clear they face greater risk of a police encounter resulting in their death.

Hannah Wesolowski, chief advocacy officer of the National Alliance on Mental Illness, said the deaths of Castillo and Jones "highlight a larger systemic problem that we have in helping people who are struggling with their mental health or are in a mental health crisis."

Many communities lack a mental health crisis infrastructure, with nearly 130 million people in the United States living in an area with a shortage of mental health providers, she said.

People with untreated mental illness are 16 times more likely to be killed during a police encounter than other people approached by law enforcement, the Treatment Advocacy Center said in a 2015 report.

In Portland, Oregon, 72% of the 85 people who were shot to death by po-

lice from 1975 to 2020 were affected by mental illness, drugs or alcohol, or some combination thereof, according to Jason Renaud of the Mental Health Association of Portland. The group does not have the numbers for those affected by mental illness alone, but sometimes they're intertwined. Long-term methamphetamine use, for instance, can cause psychosis.

Lt. Nathan Sheppard, a Portland Police Bureau spokesman, said he couldn't confirm those numbers. All Portland police officers receive crisis intervention training, he said, but more must be done to address what he described as a "public health emergency ... in which services and treatment are not readily available or easily accessible for those in need of mental health treatment."

Misty Castillo is suing a Salem police officer and the city for the failure to use crisis intervention tactics and training before the officer resorted to deadly force by shooting Arcadio, on July 9, 2021. A grand jury found the shooting was justified. The district attorney's office said Arcadio rushed towards the officer with a knife in a stabbing position, but his mother denied that.

A case worker at a psychiatric crisis center couldn't diagnose Arcadio because of his drug and alcohol use, Castillo said. Arcadio's parents tried to have him committed to a psychiatric institution, "but everywhere we turned we were told he wasn't sick enough to be committed," Castillo said. "And one week later he was killed."

A video of the West Virginia killing hit social media before Jones' loved ones were informed about his death.

Nicole Jones, his sister-in-law, was scrolling

through Facebook when she clicked on a video that showed a man with red shoulder-length hair walking on a highway, pursued by at least eight police with guns drawn. The man held his arms above his head, a pistol in one hand. He pointed the gun at his own head briefly.

Jones' heart dropped as she recognized the man's walk and the way he flipped his hair over his shoulder— and realized it was her husband Mark's brother.

Mark Jones said Matt, who had been a star baseball player and wrestler, struggled with mental health since childhood. Matt built a landscaping and tree removal company but was also getting in trouble — often DUIs or driving without a license or violating probation, his family said.

While incarcerated, Matt was diagnosed with bipolar disorder and placed on medication. But weeks before his death, he was running low on pills and broke down crying, his fiancée said.

He didn't have a driver's license. His social security card and birth certificate were elsewhere. That made it difficult to make medical appointments, Marquis said.

Mark Jones was at work landscaping when he saw the video of his brother being shot.

"I was trying to understand, 'What was he thinking?'" he said. "What I keep coming back to is that he was lost and he really wanted help — not just one time, but his whole life."

Ford recalls SUVs; heating and cooling fans can catch fire

DETROIT (AP) — Ford is recalling nearly 200,000 large SUVs in the U.S. because the heating and cooling fan motors can fail and catch fire.

The recall covers Ford Expeditions and Lincoln Navigators from the 2015 through 2017 model years.

The Dearborn, Michigan, company says in government documents that it has reports of 25 fires caused by the motors, which are behind the glove

box. Thirteen fires were limited to the blower motor area, while 12 involved extensive damage to the SUVs. Three fires damaged structures and one damaged another vehicle.

One person reported injuries to their hand and fingers, and all fire reports indicated that the vehicles were running at the time of the incident, Ford said in documents posted Thursday by the National Highway Traffic Safety

Administration.

The company says it's not telling people to park the SUVs outdoors. It says some customers have reported inoperative fans, burning smells or smoke coming from the vents while the vehicle is on.

Dealers will replace the front blower motor assembly at no cost to owners, who will be notified starting Sept. 12.

It's the second recent recall for the Expedition and

Navigator due to problems that can cause fires.

In July, Ford expanded a May recall to 66,000 of the SUVs from the 2021 model year. The company told owners to park them outdoors due to a series of engine fires that could happen while the ignitions are off. Ford traced the cause to printed circuit boards that are susceptible to an electrical short.

Russia launches war games with China amid tensions with US

MOSCOW (AP) — Russia on Thursday launched weeklong war games involving forces from China and other nations in a show of growing defense cooperation between Moscow and Beijing, as they both face tensions with the United States.

The maneuvers are also intended to demonstrate that Moscow has sufficient military might for massive drills even as its troops are engaged in military action in Ukraine.

The Russian Defense Ministry said that the Vostok 2022 (East 2022) exercise will be held until Sept. 7 at seven firing ranges in Russia's Far East and the Sea of Japan and involve more than 50,000 troops and over 5,000

weapons units, including 140 aircraft and 60 warships.

Russian General Staff chief, Gen. Valery Gerasimov, will personally oversee the drills involving troops from several ex-Soviet nations, China, India, Laos, Mongolia, Nicaragua and Syria.

The Defense Ministry noted that as part of the maneuvers, the Russian and Chinese navies in the Sea of Japan will "practice joint action to protect sea communications, areas of marine economic activity and support for ground troops in littoral areas."

Beijing sent more than 2,000 troops along with more than 300 military vehicles, 21 combat aircraft and three warships to take part in the drills, Chinese news reports said.

China's Global Times newspaper noted that the maneuvers marked the

first time that China has sent forces from three branches of its military to take part in a single Russian drill, in what it described as a show of the breadth and depth of China-Russia military cooperation and mutual trust.

The drills showcase increasing defense ties between Moscow and Beijing, which have grown stronger since Russian President Vladimir Putin sent his troops into Ukraine on Feb. 24. China has pointedly refused to criticize Russia's actions, blaming the U.S. and NATO for provoking Moscow, and has blasted the punishing sanctions imposed on Moscow.

Russia, in turn, has strongly backed China amid the tensions with the U.S. that followed a recent visit to Taiwan by U.S. House Speaker Nancy

Pelosi.

Putin has drawn parallels between U.S. support for Ukraine and Pelosi's trip, describing them both as part of alleged efforts by Washington to foment global instability.

Alexander Gabuyev, a political analyst who closely follows Russia-China ties, noted that "it's very important for Beijing to show to the U.S. that it has levers to pressure America and its global interests."

"The joint maneuvers with Moscow, including the naval drills, are intended to signal that if the pressure on Beijing continues it will have no other choice but to strengthen the military partnership with Russia," Gabuyev said. "It will have a direct impact on the interests of the U.S. and its allies, including Japan."

He noted that the Kremlin, for its part, wants

to show that the country's military is powerful enough to flex its muscle elsewhere despite the campaign in Ukraine.

"The Russian leadership demonstrates that everything goes according to plan and the country and its military have resources to conduct the maneuvers along with the special military operation," Gabuyev said.

The exercise continues a series of joint war games by Russia and China in recent years, including naval drills and patrols by long-range bombers over the Sea of Japan and the East China Sea. Last year, Russian troops for the first time deployed to Chinese territory for joint maneuvers.

China's participation in the drills "aims to deepen pragmatic and friendly cooperation between the militaries of the partici-

pating countries, enhance the level of strategic cooperation among all participating parties, and enhance the ability to jointly respond to various security threats," Chinese Defense Ministry spokesperson Col. Tan Kefei said last week.

Putin and Chinese President Xi Jinping have developed strong personal ties to bolster a "strategic partnership" between the former Communist rivals as they both are locked in rivalry with the U.S.

Even though Moscow and Beijing in the past rejected the possibility of forging a military alliance, Putin has said that such a prospect can't be ruled out. He also has noted that Russia has been sharing highly sensitive military technologies with China that helped significantly bolster its defense capability.

US advisers endorse updated COVID shots for fall boosters

U.S. health advisers on Thursday endorsed new COVID-19 boosters that target today's most common omicron strains, saying if enough people roll up their sleeves, the updated shots could blunt a winter surge.

The tweaked shots made by Pfizer and rival Moderna promise Americans a chance at their most up-to-date protection at yet another critical period in the pandemic. They're combination or "bivalent" shots, half the original vaccine and half protection against the BA.4 and BA.5 omicron versions now causing nearly all COVID-19 infections.

Advisers to the Cen-

ters for Disease Control and Prevention struggled with who should get the new booster and when -- because only a similarly tweaked vaccine, not the exact recipe, has been studied in people so far.

But ultimately the panel deemed it the best option considering the U.S. still is experiencing tens of thousands of COVID-19 cases and about 500 deaths every day -- even before an expected new winter wave.

"I think they're going to be an effective tool for disease prevention this fall and into the winter," said CDC adviser Dr. Matthew Daley of Kaiser Permanente Colorado.

Comparing the tweak that has been studied in people and the one the U.S. actually will use, "it is the same scaffolding, part

of the same roof, we're just putting in some dormers and windows," said Dr. Sarah Long of Drexel University.

The CDC is expected to adopt that recommendation soon, the last step before shots can begin. Millions of doses are expected to reach vaccination sites nationwide by Labor Day, CDC officials said.

The original COVID-19 vaccines still offer strong protection against severe illness and death, especially among younger and healthier people who've gotten at least one booster.

But those vaccines were designed to target the virus strain that circulated in early 2020. Effectiveness drops as new mutants emerge and the longer it's been since

someone's last shot. Since April, hospitalization rates in people over age 65 have jumped, the CDC said.

The new updated shots are only for use as a booster, not for someone's first-ever vaccinations. The Food and Drug Administration cleared Pfizer's bivalent option for people 12 and older while Moderna's is for adults only.

A big unknown: Exactly how much benefit people will get from one of those extra shots.

The CDC said more than 1,400 people have been included in studies of a prior tweak to the vaccine recipe -- targeting an earlier omicron strain named BA.1. That omicron-targeting combo shot proved safe and able to rev up virus-fighting

antibodies -- and European regulators on Thursday recommended using that type of booster.

In the U.S., the Food and Drug Administration wanted fall boosters to target the currently circulating omicron strains -- and rather than waiting until possibly November for more human studies to be finished, the agency accepted mouse testing that showed the newer tweak sparked a similarly good immune response.

That's how flu vaccines are updated every year, the CDC noted.

Still, several CDC advisers said that to get the maximum benefit, people will need to wait longer between their last vaccination and getting the new booster than the two months that the FDA set as the minimum. Wait-

ing at least three months would be better, from the last shot or if someone had recently recovered from COVID-19, they said.

Before this new COVID-19 booster update, people 50 and older already were urged to get a second booster of the original vaccine -- and those who did saw some extra protection especially the longer it had been since their last shot, said CDC's Dr. Ruth Link-Gelles.

The new combination booster "should provide at least similar or better protection against omicron since it'll be a better match" to today's virus strains, she told the panel.

The last "survivor" indicates that the others have been discovered previously, so although the "news" story isn't brand new, the "local resident" might well feel relief that the "respected leader's" "family" members have all been found. The LOST "survivor" implies that the single individual is the only one who was found.

Missouri judge moves Greitens custody case to Texas

COLUMBIA, Mo. (AP) — A child custody case between former Missouri Gov. Eric Greitens and his ex-wife has been moved to Texas.

Sheena Greitens' lawyer confirmed to the Kansas City Star Wednesday that the judge decided the case should continue in Texas, where Sheena Greitens is a public affairs professor at the University of Texas.

Boone County Associate Circuit Judge Leslie Schneider made her decision closed to the public. Texas court records show she decided to keep her ruling secret to protect the former couple's two young boys from public scrutiny because of the parents' notoriety.

The case drew heightened attention amid Eric Greitens' failed bid to become the Republican nominee for retiring U.S. Sen. Roy Blunt's seat. Sheena Greitens said in a sworn affidavit that he was physically abusive, which he strongly denied.

Mazars earlier this year said it had cut ties with Trump and warned that financial statements the firm had prepared for Trump "should no longer be relied upon" by anyone doing business with him.

Another House committee, the House Ways and Means Committee, has been seeking Trump's tax returns and waging its own litigation. In that case, a three-judge appellate court panel agreed last month with a lower court's decision in favor of Congress and that the Treasury Department should provide the tax returns to the committee. The Justice Depart-

ment, under the Trump administration, had defended a decision by then-Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin to withhold the tax returns from Congress. Mnuchin argued that he could withhold the documents because he concluded they were being sought by Democrats for partisan reasons. A lawsuit ensued.

After Biden took office, the committee renewed the request, seeking Trump's tax returns and additional information from 2015-2020. The White House took the position that the request was a valid one and that the Treasury Department had no choice but to comply. Trump then attempted to halt the handover in court.

UN inspectors arrive at Ukraine nuclear plant amid fighting

ZAPORIZHZHIA, Ukraine (AP) — A U.N. inspection team entered Ukraine's Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant Thursday on a mission to safeguard it against catastrophe, reaching the site amid fighting between Russian and Ukrainian forces that prompted the shutdown of one reactor and underscored the urgency of the task.

The 14-member delegation from the International Atomic Energy Agency arrived in a convoy of SUVs and vans after months of negotiations to enable the experts to pass through the front lines and get inside Europe's biggest nuclear plant.

"The IAEA is now there at the plant and it's not moving. It's going to stay there. We're going to have a continued presence there at the plant with some of my experts," IAEA director Rafael Grossi, the mission leader, declared after the group got its first look at conditions inside.

But he added: "I will continue to be worried about the plant until we have a situation which is more stable."

As the experts made their way through the war zone toward the complex, Russia and Ukraine accused each other of shelling the area and trying to derail the visit. The fighting delayed the team's progress.

"There were moments when fire was obvious — heavy machine guns, artillery, mortars at two or three times were really very concerning, I would say, for all of us," Grossi said.

Just before the IAEA team arrived, Energoatom, Ukraine's state nuclear power company, said Russian mortar shelling had led to the shutdown of one of its reactors by its emergency protection system and had

damaged a backup power supply line used for in-house needs.

One of the plant's reactors that wasn't operating was switched to diesel generators, Energoatom said.

Once inside the plant, Grossi said, his experts were able to tour the entire site, including control rooms, emergency systems and diesel generators. He said he met with the plant's staff and residents of the nearby village, Energodar, who asked him for help from the agency.

He reported that the team had collected important information in its initial inspection and will remain there to continue its assessment.

"It is obvious that the plant and the physical integrity of the plant has been violated several times by chance, deliberately — we don't have the elements to assess that," Grossi said.

"And this is why we are trying to put in place certain mechanisms and the presence, as I said, of our people there."

The Zaporizhzhia plant has been occupied by Russian forces but run by Ukrainian engineers since the early days of the 6-month-old war. Ukraine alleges Russia is using it as a shield to launch attacks, while Moscow accuses Ukraine of recklessly firing on the area.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy had tough words for the IAEA delegation. While applauding its arrival at the plant, he said independent journalists were kept from covering the visit, allowing the Russians to present a one-sided, "futile tour."

And he said that while Grossi agreed to support Ukrainian demands for the demilitarization of the plant — including the withdrawal

of Russian forces from it — the IAEA has yet to issue such a call publicly.

Fighting in early March caused a brief fire at its training complex, and in recent days, the plant was briefly knocked offline because of damage, heightening fears of a radiation leak or a reactor meltdown. Officials have begun distributing anti-radiation iodine tablets to nearby residents.

Experts have also expressed concern that the Ukrainian staff is overworked and stressed out from the occupation of the plant by Russian forces — conditions they say could lead to dangerous errors.

Grossi said after his initial tour that the Ukrainian employees are "in a difficult situation, but they have an incredible degree of professionalism. And I see them calm and moving on."

Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov said Moscow

expects "impartiality" from the team.

"We are taking all the necessary measures to ensure that the plant is secure, that it functions safely and that the mission accomplishes all of its plans there," he said.

Ahead of the visit, Russia's Defense Ministry reported that Ukrainian forces unleashed an artillery barrage on the area and sent a group of up to 60 scouts to try to seize the plant on the Dnieper River. It said that the Ukrainian troops arrived in seven speedboats but that Russian forces "took steps to destroy the enemy," using warplanes.

Some of the Ukrainian shells landed 400 meters (yards) from the plant's No. 1 reactor, Russian authorities said.

The Russian-installed administration in Enerhodar reported that at least three residents were killed early Thursday by Ukrainian

shelling.

Ukrainian officials, meanwhile, accused Russian forces of shelling Enerhodar and a corridor that the IAEA team was set to go through.

Neither side's version of events could immediately be independently verified.

The fighting came as Ukraine endeavored to start the new school year in the middle of a war. Just over half of the country's schools are reopening to in-person classes despite the risks.

In other developments, authorities with the Russian-backed separatist government in the eastern region of Donetsk said 13 emergency responders were killed by Ukrainian shelling in Rubtsi, a village in neighboring Kharkiv province. Much of the fighting in recent weeks and months has centered on the area.

Gatopoulos reported from Kyiv, Ukraine.

Trump documents probe: Judge appears open to special master

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla. (AP) — A federal judge Thursday appeared to give a boost to former President Donald Trump's hopes for appointing an outside legal expert to review government records seized by the FBI, questioning the Justice Department's arguments that Trump couldn't make the request and that it would needlessly delay its investigation.

"Ultimately, what is the harm" in such an appoint-

ment, U.S. District Judge Aileen Cannon asked department lawyers. But she did not rule on the request, saying she would do so later.

Lawyers for Trump say the appointment of a special master is necessary to ensure an independent inspection of the documents seized by the FBI during the Aug. 8 search of Mar-a-Lago.

This kind of review, they say, would allow for "highly personal information" such as diaries or journals to be separated from the investigation and returned to Trump, along with any other documents that may

be protected by claims of attorney-client privilege or executive privilege.

Chris Kise, a Trump lawyer and former Florida solicitor general, told Cannon that appointing a neutral party would restore public faith in the investigation.

"This is an unprecedented situation. We need to lower the temperature," Kise said. "We need to take a deep breath."

The Justice Department has said an appointment is unwarranted because investigators have completed their review of potentially privileged records and identified "a limited set of mate-

rials that potentially contain attorney-client privileged information." The government also says Trump lacks legal grounds to demand the return of presidential documents because they do not belong to him since he no longer occupies the White House.

"He is no longer president, said Jay Bratt, the head of the Justice Department's counterintelligence section. He is unlawfully in possession of them."

The department has also expressed concerns that the appointment could delay the investigation, in part because a special master

probably would need to obtain a security clearance to review the records and special authorization from intelligence agencies.

But Cannon, who said she would issue a written ruling at some point, pressed the government on that point, asking, "Ultimately what is the harm?"

Cannon had said on Saturday, before the latest arguments in the matter, that her "preliminary intent" was to appoint a special master. It was not clear whether she might make a final determination Thursday or how her view might be affected by the fact that the Justice

Department says it has already reviewed potentially privileged documents.

It was also not clear who might serve as that outside expert. In some past high-profile cases, the role has been filled by a former federal judge.

Cannon was nominated by Trump in 2020 and confirmed by the Senate 56-21 later that year. She is a former assistant U.S. attorney in Florida, handling mainly criminal appeals.

More kids are repeating a grade. Is it good for them?

HARRISBURG, Pa. (AP) — As Braylon Price remembers it, he struggled with pretty much everything the first full school year of the pandemic. With minimal guidance and frequent disruptions, he had trouble staying on top of assignments and finishing homework on time.

It was so rocky his parents asked for him to repeat sixth grade — a decision they credit with getting him on a better track.

"At first I didn't really want to do it," said Braylon, now 13. "But then later in the year I thought

it would probably be better for me if I did."

The number of students held back for a year of school has surged around the country. Traditionally, experts have said repeating a grade can hurt kids' social lives and academic futures. But many parents, empowered by new pandemic-era laws, have asked for do-overs to help their children recover from the tumult of remote learning, quarantines and school staff shortages.

Twenty-two of the 26 states that provided data for the recent academic year, as well as Washington, D.C., saw an increase in the number of students who were held back, according to an Associated Press analysis. Three states — South Carolina, West Virginia and Delaware —

saw retention more than double.

Pennsylvania, where the Price family lives, passed a pandemic-era law allowing parents to elect to have a redo for their kids. The following year, the number of retained students in the state jumped by about 20,000, to over 45,000 students.

Braylon's mother has no regrets about taking advantage of the new law. "Best decision we could have made for him," said Kristi Price, who lives in Bellefonte, in central Pennsylvania.

While the family's two daughters managed to keep up with school despite limited supervision, Braylon struggled. He went back to in-person school for the first full academic year of

the pandemic but it was "wishy-washy," his mother said. Students were quarantined on and off, and teachers tried to keep up with students learning at home, online and in hybrid models. That winter, Braylon suffered a spinal cord injury from wrestling that forced him to go back to remote learning.

On his repeat of sixth grade, Braylon had an individualized education program that helped him build more focus. Having more one-on-one attention from teachers helped too. Socially, he said the transition was easy, since most of his friends had been in lower grades or attended different schools already.

Research in the education world has been critical of making students

repeat grades.

The risk is students who've been retained have a two-fold increased risk of dropping out, said Arthur Reynolds, a professor at the University of Minnesota's Human Capital Research Collaborative, citing studies of students in Chicago and Baltimore.

"Kids see it as punishment," Reynolds said. "It reduces their academic motivation, and it doesn't

increase their instructional advancement."

But backers of retention say none of the research was conducted in a pandemic, when many children wrestled with Zoom lessons and some stopped logging in entirely.

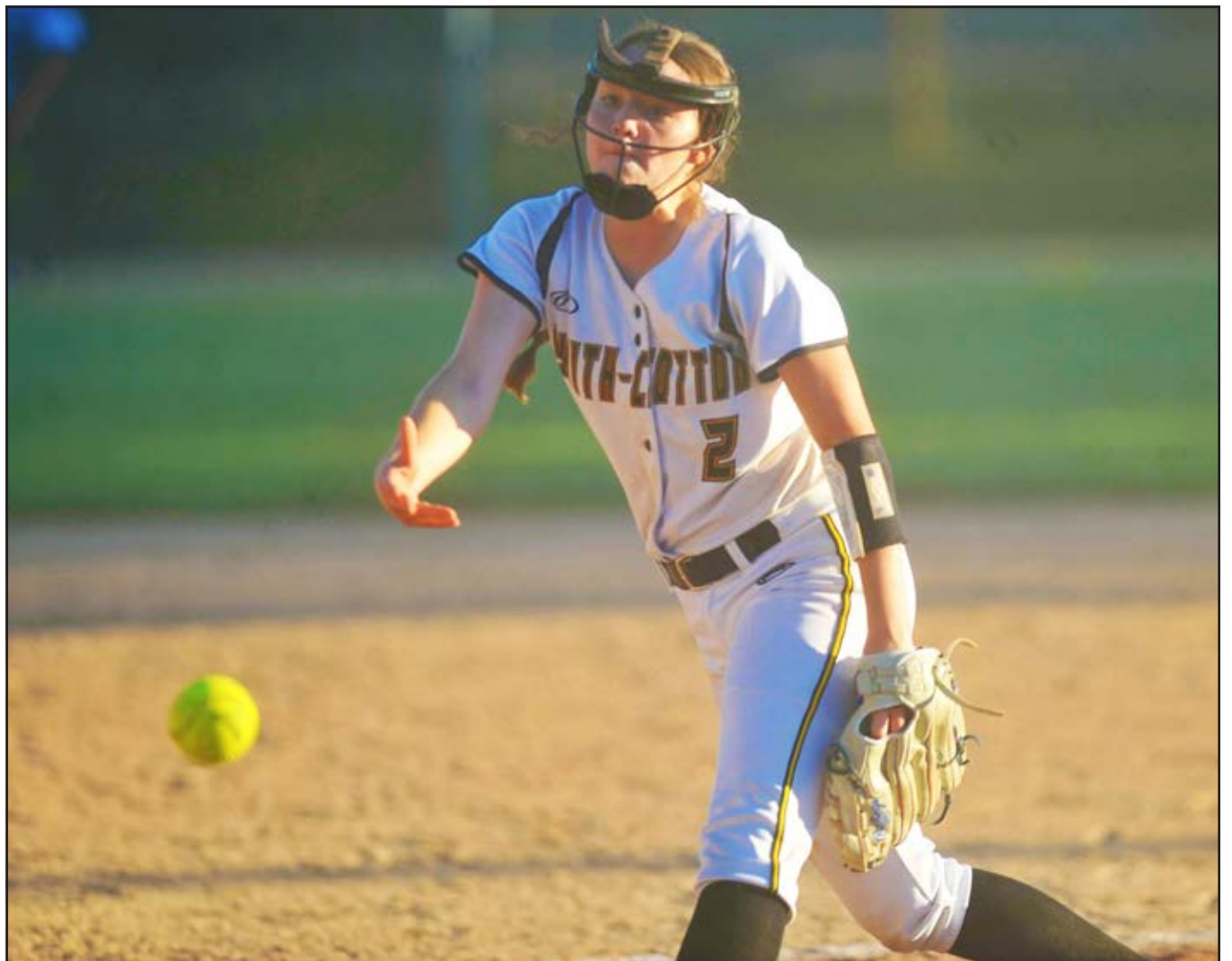
That didn't stop Smith-Cotton from tacking on runs in the sixth, the team's biggest

Russell Wilson gets five-year, \$245M extension from Broncos

ENGLEWOOD, Colo. (AP) — Denver quarterback Russell Wilson signed a five-year, \$245 million extension Thursday that includes \$165 million in guarantees, the biggest contract in Broncos history and one of the largest ever in the NFL.

winner, Russell is a dynamic leader whose positive impact is felt throughout our entire team and community," co-owner and CEO Greg Penner said in a statement, adding, "Our organization is fully committed to winning and competing for Super Bowls with Russell as a Bronco for many years to come."

Wilson's new deal comes three weeks after the league

approved the record \$4.65 billion sale of the team to the Walton-Penner ownership group. Led by Walmart heir Rob Walton, it's the wealthiest ownership group in the NFL.

General manager George Paton thanked Penner "and our entire ownership group for the support and resources to get this long-term extension done."

Low on water, prep football adapts in Mississippi's capital

Marcus Gibson never realized how much water a high school football program used until it was gone.

Even so, he considers his team one of the lucky ones as a water crisis roils Mississippi's largest city.

The football coach at Murrah High School — right in the middle of Jackson, Mississippi, not far from the state capitol — says that his fieldhouse has about 40 to 50 cases of bottled water stacked along the walls thanks to players' parents, administration and other benefactors. That should be plenty for his team to drink over the next few days at practice.

"Hydration isn't much of a problem," he said "It's everything else."

Many Jackson residents have been without running water in their homes and businesses this week because of breakdowns in the city's main water treatment plant. Torrential rains caused the Pearl River to flood, exacerbating problems with pumps.

Jackson schools moved to online classes and canceled some of this weekend's high school football games because of uncertainty about water. Some restaurants closed, while others are bringing in tankers of clean water from the suburbs. People are waiting in long lines to receive bottled water for drinking or non-potable water for flushing toilets.

Even before the water pressure dropped perilously low, Jackson's water system was fragile and officials had warned for years that widespread loss of service

was possible.

Now it's happened — right in the middle of the hottest part of football season. While there are certainly more important things to worry about during a crisis, football is a staple of the state's cultural identity. Coaches and players are trying to find ways to press forward, even in less than optimal conditions.

"We're kind of used to it," said Murrah receiver Christian Jackson before Wednesday's practice. "After two years of COVID-19, we just make it work. You bring your own water to practice if you can and make the most of opportunities, because some of our practices have been canceled."

Gibson said keeping everything clean is the biggest challenge. He said assistant coaches are working out plans to wash practice and game uniforms at laundromats outside the city or at any other place with enough water pressure.

Callaway High School coach Dameon Jones said he just takes his team's clothes home and washes them himself since he lives a few miles outside of the city.

"We're taking it one day at a time," Jones said. "What I tell my kids — adversity is going to come. It's how you're going to deal with it."

Murrah and Callaway are among four of the biggest city schools preparing to play in a "Graduation Classic," which was originally expected to be at Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium. That's been canceled due to the lack of water, though there's hope the games can be moved

elsewhere. Thousands of fans were expected.

Three high school football games remained on schedule for Thursday and Friday nights as of Wednesday.

"We will certainly have plenty of hand sanitizer and different things," said Sherwin Johnson, executive director of public engagement for Jackson Public Schools. "Although our restrooms don't have water, we are reserving and will have portable restrooms at each of our stadiums, enough to accommodate the crowds that we anticipate."

Johnson added that no other sports were affected by the water shortage.

The inconveniences weren't limited to high school sports. Jackson State football coach Deion Sanders said Tuesday that the water crisis left his players without air conditioning or ice at their practice facility. In a video that one of his sons posted to social media, Sanders said he wanted to move players into a hotel so they could shower.

"We're going to find somewhere to practice, find somewhere that can accommodate every darn thing that we need and desire to be that we desire to be, and that's dominate," Sanders said. "The devil is a lie. He ain't going to get us today, baby."

The make-do attitude is common these days around Jackson. Gibson and Jones — the high school coaches — said they're still optimistic their games will be played.

"We're just waiting to hear where the game is going to be," Jones said. "Give us a time, a field and we'll be ready."

Legalized sports betting begins in Kansas with 'soft launch'

TOPEKA, Kan. (AP) — Legalized sports betting arrived in Kansas on Thursday, with wagers being taken at state-owned casinos and via mobile apps.

The "soft launch" of sports betting in Kansas comes after Democratic Gov. Laura Kelly signed a bill in May that the Republican-controlled Legislature passed with bipartisan support.

The launch meets a goal set by state officials to have the operations running by Sept. 1, in time for the first NFL games. An official launch of the operations is scheduled for Sept. 8.

Bettors must be in Kansas to place their wagers.

Under the law, each state-owned casino may offer in-person sportsbooks and mobile sports betting on up to three

platforms or applications.

As of Thursday, in-person betting is available at Hollywood Casino in Kansas City, Kansas, and Kansas Star Casino in Mulvane.

Hollywood Casino will partner with Barstool Sports for mobile betting and Kansas Star will partner with FanDuel.

Boot Hill Casino and Resort in Dodge City will offer mobile sports betting through DraftKings, and Kansas Crossing Casino in Pittsburg will offer mobile sports betting through BetMGM, Caesars, and PointsBet.

In-person betting at the two casinos will be announced in the near future, lottery officials said.

Tribal casinos in Kansas are working with state officials on contracts to allow sports betting.

NASCAR drivers feeling the hits more in Next Gen car

CHARLOTTE, N.C.

(AP) — The jolts are more jarring, the impacts feel harder and the pain hangs on longer for NASCAR drivers in the first season of the Next Gen car.

Stories of sore backs, headaches and damaged ribs that don't heal as quickly as they did in the past are more common heading into the opener of the NASCAR Cup Series playoffs on Sunday at Darlington Raceway.

Just ask Denny Hamlin, part of a massive wreck late at Daytona a week ago. He pulled out of the Xfinity event Saturday at Darlington due to continuing soreness in his neck, ribs and back.

"It feels like I got beat up in a bar and someone was kicking me in the ribs while I was on the ground," Hamlin said of the wreck Thursday. "The whole right side, it just felt smashed."

The issue of driver safety has taken center stage since Kurt Busch's qualifying crash at Pocono. He suffered a concussion and missed the final six regular-season races.

Busch's condition led him to surrender his playoff spot, and his 23XI co-owner Hamlin is unsure when he will return. Hamlin said Busch had "plateaued" in his

recovery.

"He got to about 80% (recovered) and stayed there," Hamlin said. "I think the rest is going to take a little bit of time."

The Next Gen car was rolled out this season to provide a durable, competitive car that can hold down costs and bring more excitement to the track by looking like something consumers could buy at a dealership. It has certainly brought parity with 16 winners this year, including first-timers Chase Briscoe, Austin Cindric, Ross Chastain and Daniel Suarez.

Still, the buzz among the haulers and in team meetings is the average hits and accompanying pain don't feel so average anymore.

"It seems like a recurring topic," said Chase Elliott, the 2020 Cup Series champion and top playoff seed. "And I don't necessarily think that something everybody is just making up, right?"

More evidence came in Hamlin's radio exchange with his team moments after the accident. He is heard moaning, telling them he "hurts" preceded by an expletive.

"Certainly, from my standpoint body-wise, it took a much harder hit than what I've had in the past in any other wreck," Hamlin said.

NASCAR's ongoing crash analysis agrees with drivers: The hits are harder than in the past.

"We've heard similar things about their experiences in the car that it crashes harder or the crashes are worst," said Dr. John Patalak, managing director of safety engineering.

"The really short answer is yes, the drivers are experiencing more severe crashes than in the past," he continued. "But there's more to it than that."

Patalak said analysis shows some drivers at high speeds are hitting the wall at steeper angles. While cars in the past would hit at angles of about 14 to 16 degrees, some Next Gen crashes are registering in the high teens or low 20s.

"When you look at it on paper, you think, 'Well, what's the big deal, 14's really close to 19?'" he said. "But it's a massive difference with the amount of energy that's going into the wall, not parallel to it."

Two-time series champ Kyle Busch is skeptical. "The wrecks don't look as bad because the drivers are carrying the brunt of it and the car isn't," the Joe Gibbs racer said.

There's more work ahead on safety concerns, but Elliott believes NASCAR is paying

attention.

"You never want to take a step backward," Elliott said. "It's been great conversations (with NASCAR) and I think it will end up making a difference."

The car, Patalak said, was never designed as a final draft. There already have been modifications in the safety foam surrounding the driver's head. More analytics could lead to additional changes.

"There are certain solutions that can't be implemented immediately," he said. "There are other solutions that can."

That likely means increased costs for financially conscious race teams, according to 2017 NASCAR champion Joey Logano.

"Here's the bottom line, safety is expensive," he said. "I hate saying that, but it's true."

Logano, too, has felt the hits more this season than others. He and others have said the car is too rigid. But it's not all bad. "In some ways, it's safer than the old car," he said.

Logano is confident the car won't cave in on the cockpit on a significant accident or rollover crash. "It's the everyday hits that are more severe than they used to be," he said. "It depends on how you want to look at it."

Hours later, United signed Slovakia goalkeeper Martin Dubravka on a season-long loan from Newcastle as a backup to David De Gea.

The future of Cristiano Ronaldo has been a hot topic since the end of last season — he has pushed to leave because United isn't in the Champions League — but manager Erik ten Hag reiterated Wednesday that he is counting on the Portugal forward this season. Ronaldo was a second-half substitute for United in its 1-0 win over Leicester in the Premier League on Thursday.

City decided to bolster its defensive options, signing Switzerland international Manuel Akanji from Borussia Dortmund for \$17.5 million to get a fifth center back in its squad.

Forest made its 19th signing of the window by bringing in defender Willy Boly from Wolverhampton and was reportedly in talks with two or three other players. The promoted team has already spent more than \$150 million this summer.

Senegal midfielder Idrissa Gueye sealed a return to Everton from Paris Saint-Germain, which sent left back Layvin Kurzawa to Fulham on loan for the season. Fulham also signed former Chelsea and Arsenal winger Willian on a free

transfer after he recently left Brazilian club Corinthians.

Aston Villa signed Belgium midfielder Leander Dendoncker from Wolverhampton, and Arsenal sent Ainsley Maitland-Niles on loan to Southampton.

Leicester chose the final day of the window to make its first outfield signing of the summer, Wout Faes from French club Reims. Faes filled the vacancy left by Wesley Fofana, who joined Chelsea on Wednesday for 75 million pounds (\$87 million).

That was one of the most eye-catching moves of the summer as the Premier League reverted to pre-pandemic levels of spending — and then some — on the back of its huge global broad-

casting deals worth about 10 billion pounds (\$11.8 billion) over three seasons.

The rest of Europe just cannot compete, with clubs in the top leagues in Spain, Italy, Germany and France on course to spend less combined than England alone.

Chelsea could yet take its spending on players to around \$300 million, like it did two summers ago when the likes of Kai Havertz and Timo Werner joined for huge fees.

The Premier League's record for spending in a single season — covering both summer and winter transfer windows — stands at 1.86 billion pounds (\$2.18 billion) in 2017-18. That figure should be comfortably surpassed in this transfer window alone.

Mitchell can take over a game, and he'll give Cavs coach J.B. Bickerstaff a late-game option.

The Cavs are also giving up unprotected first-round picks in 2025, 2027 and 2029 and swapping picks in 2026 and 2028, said the person.

A three-time All-Star in five seasons with Utah, the 25-year-old Mitchell is one of the league's elite back-court players and his acquisition could push the Cavs, who won 44 games last season — a 22-game improvement — with a young nucleus, among the top teams in the loaded Eastern

Conference.

Mitchell, who averaged 25.9 points per game last season, will pair in Cleveland with All-Star point guard Darius Garland. He'll also play with All-Star center Jarett Allen and forward Evan Mobley, who had a strong rookie season averaging 15.0 points, 8.3 rebounds and 1.7 blocks.

Mitchell signed a five-year, \$163 million contract in 2020 and is under contract through the 2026 season.

Cleveland also has Garland and Allen locked up to long-term deals.

The 23-year-old Sexton missed last season with a knee injury and was a restricted free agent. He's a proven scorer, but became expendable for Cleveland due to Garland's devel-

opment and the club's talented frontline.

Sexton will sign a four-year, \$72 million contract as part of a sign-and-trade agreement with Utah, his agent Rich Paul confirmed for AP.

This is the second major trade during this offseason for Utah, which started its rebuild in July by trading All-Star center Rudy Gobert to Minnesota.

Markkanen averaged 14.8 points and 5.7 rebounds in his first season with the Cavs, who made the play-in round last season before losing to Brooklyn and Atlanta.

Agbaji was drafted by Cleveland with the No. 14 overall pick this year after helping Kansas win a national championship.

The extension pays Wilson an average of \$49 million a year beginning in 2024 and keeps him under contract in Denver through the 2028 season for \$296 million.

He had two years and \$51 million left on his deal when the Broncos acquired him from Seattle for five draft picks and three players in a franchise-changing trade six months ago.

Paton said in a statement that "in just a few short months with the Broncos, Russell has already had a dramatic effect on this organization both on and off the field. His leadership, work-ethic and championship mentality have helped elevate our team in partnership with Coach

(Nathaniel) Hackett, his teammates and the staff."

Although much of the money is in the form of a bonus, Wilson's new deal averages \$49 million per year, just shy of Aaron Rodgers' \$50 million average on the four-year, \$200 million deal the Packers QB signed to stay in Green Bay this year.

In terms of guaranteed money, it's the third-most lucrative contract in NFL history, behind Deshaun Watson's fully-guaranteed \$230 million, five-year deal over and Kyler Murray's new five-year, \$230.5 million contract that includes \$189.5 million guaranteed.

Penner said last month that Paton's trade for Wilson in the spring made the Broncos an even more attractive asset.

"It's critical to have a great quarterback in this league and coming in this

organization with Russell in place is a tremendous benefit for us," Penner said.

"On our first diligence trip in May here, one of the first people we ran into the hallway when Rob, Carrie (Walton Penner), and I were here was Russell," Penner added. "Right away, we got a sense of how positive he is as a leader. He is just such a dynamic individual. I can't wait to see him on the field."

Wilson will make his Denver debut on Sept. 12 when the Broncos open the season at Seattle, where Wilson played for a decade, leading the Seahawks to two Super Bowl appearances and one championship.

Wilson's 113 victories, including one in Super Bowl 48 over the Broncos, are the most for a quarterback in his first 10 NFL seasons.

Barcelona loans US defender Dest to AC Milan

MILAN (AP) — Sergiño Dest is set to become the first American to play for AC Milan in Serie A after the Italian champion signed the defender on loan from Barcelona on Thursday, shortly before the transfer window shut.

Milan also has the right to buy the U.S. international at the end of the season-long loan deal, with the fee reportedly fixed at 20 million euros (\$19.9 million).

The move comes a day after AC Milan's ownership transferred from one American entity to another, as RedBird Capital Partners completed a deal to purchase a controlling interest in the seven-time European champion for 1.2 billion euros (\$1.2 billion) from Elliott Management. The deal includes a minority stake in Milan for the New York Yankees.

The 21-year-old Dest, who only flew into Milan on the morning of transfer deadline day, could face a tough debut as the Rossoneri's next match is Saturday's derby against city rival Inter Milan.

The only previous American player Milan has signed was Oguchi Onyewu, in 2009. The former U.S. defender had an eighteen-month spell at Milan but only made one Champions League appearance before being sidelined for almost a year with injury and then leaving the club, shortly after a training ground spat with teammate Zlatan Ibrahimović.

Dest has a Surinamese-American father and Dutch mother and chose to play for the United States instead of the Netherlands, where he was born and raised. He has scored two goals in 17 matches for the national team.

Dest started his career at Ajax before moving to

Barcelona two years ago for a fee of 21 million euros (then \$24.7 million), going on to make 72 appearances and netting three goals.

Dest never fully met expectations at Barcelona and couldn't establish himself as a regular starter. He had plenty of minutes in his first season, under coach Ronald Koeman, but then his playing time gradually decreased. He had chances under coach Xavi Hernández during the Europa League last season but again couldn't take advantage of them. He had not made any appearances this season other than in friendlies.

Dest's signing continues Milan's policy of sticking with the blend of youth and experience that helped to end its lengthy wait for the Serie A title. Most of the players it has signed this summer have been 21 or under.

AP source: Titans OLB Harold Landry tears ACL in practice

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Tennessee outside linebacker Harold Landry III tore an ACL in practice, leaving the two-time defending AFC South champion Titans without their reigning sack leader for the season, a person with direct knowledge of the injury told The Associated Press on Thursday.

ESPN reported Landry tore an ACL during practice Wednesday, which was closed to reporters after the first 20 minutes. The person confirmed the report to the AP on condition of anonymity because the Titans are not commenting on the injury.

Later on Wednesday, the Titans canceled Thursday's scheduled practice for meetings and conditioning with no media availability. The team is off through Sunday.

Landry was coming off the best year of his career with 12 sacks to earn his first Pro Bowl nod. That earned the 41st pick overall out of Boston College in the 2018 draft a five-year extension worth up to \$87.5 million with \$52.5

million guaranteed.

He helped the Titans tie for ninth last season with 43 sacks led by Landry. Tennessee was the only NFL team with at least three different players with at least eight sacks each. Landry had started every game for three straight seasons.

The defending two-time AFC South champs open the season Sept. 11 by hosting the New York Giants.

The Titans used an NFL-record 91 players during the 2021 season, most ever for a non-strike season, with 26 placed on injured reserve. The number of players allowed to return from injured reserve is limited to eight this season.

The Titans did announce some roster moves, signing veteran wide receiver Josh Gordon to the practice squad along with tight end Kevin Rader. The 6-foot-3, 225-pound Gordon has 4,284 yards receiving and 21 touchdowns over seven seasons with Cleveland, New England, Seattle and most recently Kansas City.

Gordon played in 12 games for the Chiefs last season with five catches for 32 yards and a touchdown.

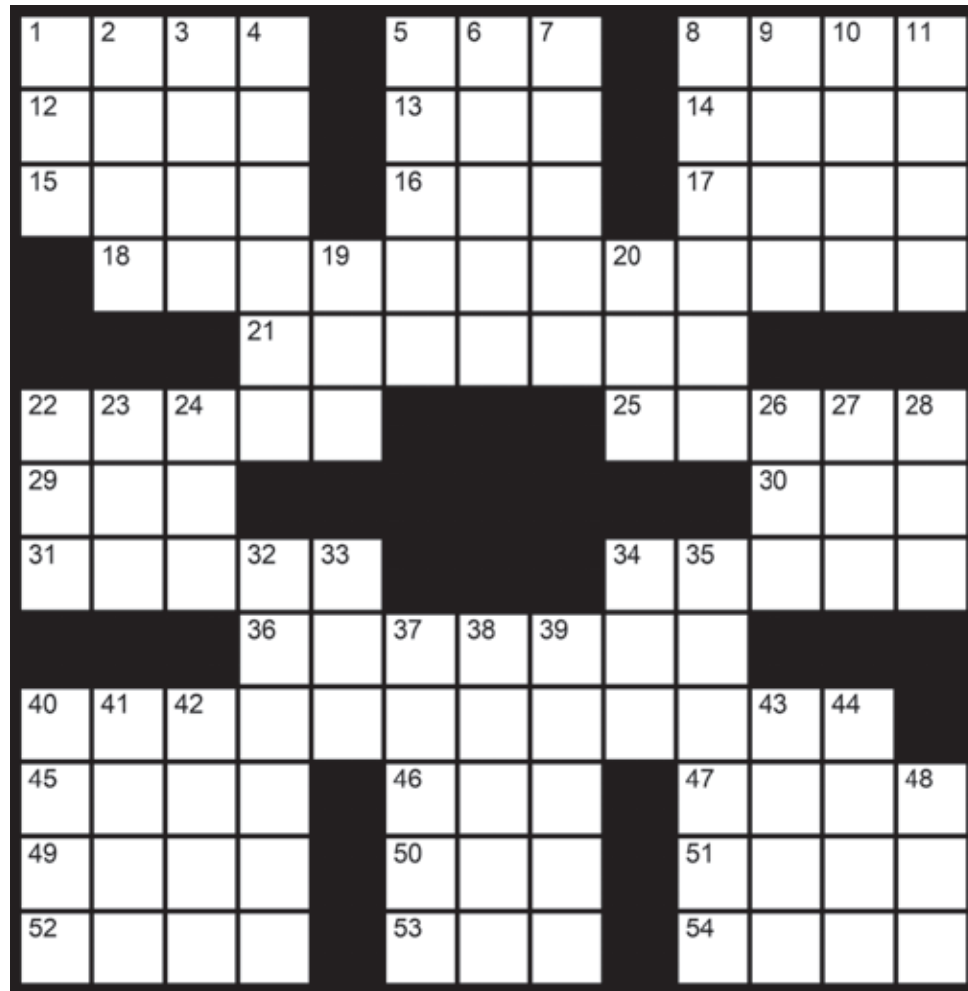

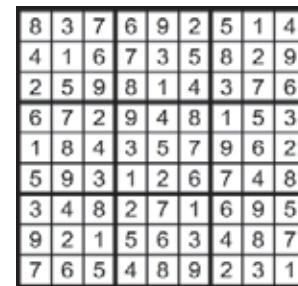
