Cedar Drive expansion makes room for increased truck traffic

Cedar Drive just north of the Sedalia city limits is getting a makeover and had to be closed to through traffic as construction is underway.

"What we're doing is widening the roadway here," said Luke Rosendale, Construction Inspector for Anderson Engineering. "There's going to be a couple other phases of the project that this leads into."

Heavy equipment is moving a lot of dirt, preparing for the widening process.

"In order to keep progress in the project rolling, we had to move a water line over here, just north of Reine Road," Rosendale said. "And then we have some drainage as well that we're installing along the project and

that'll be continuing throughout the project as we work our way north."

A few scattered homes along Cedar Lane have to make their way between barricades to proceed down the road to their homes. Others, like Albert Reine, on Reine Road have dealt with temporary water shut-offs and the inconvenience of driving the long way around Cedar Drive.

"We haven't gotten a whole lot of negative feedback from the locals in this area as far as closing it down," Rosendale said. "Most people knew this project was going to hit this area, so I think it's gone pretty well as far as that goes."

Reine was in his yard as workers worked with a broken pipe. He didn't seem too bothered by the construction.

La Monte begins year focused on students

On Aug. 23, the La Monte R-IV School District started the first day of classes for more than 290 K-12 students.

Superintendent Justin Thomas said the first couple of weeks of school for La Monte have gone well.

"Students are back in class and they seem to be positive and working hard," Thomas said. "We're excited to get back to school."

The biggest change for the 2022-23 school year is a new high school principal, Todd Misenhelter. Thomas said Misenhelter is working on meeting staff and students and building relationships.

La Monte school will

be using the same return to learning plan in terms of COVID-19 but has updated it to meet the current guidelines from the health department.

"We're really trying to focus on students and their well-being and creating a positive learning environment," Thomas said. "Really working on academic achievement, we're going to put a lot of emphasis on student mental health."

Included in the focus on mental health, the district will be gathering resources for students and connecting them with the people, resources and organizations that can help.

"Just across the board, we've seen, especially since the 2019-20 school year, where students were out of school for several weeks," Thomas said. "We've seen an uptick, not just in La Monte but across the board in education, of more students who need those resources."

Put down the phone, reach for art

Heimsoth creates word-worthy show

A new exhibit at the Hayden Liberty Center has several goals: to make the viewer forget about their cell phone, to create a discussion, and to interact.

Sedalia artist and educator Josh Heimsoth has a well-rounded show that will draw the viewer into the creative spaces of his mind. The show opened Thursday evening with an artist reception; it will remain until Oct. 29. Heimsoth has large industrial sculptures and fine art ceramics, two-dimensional paintings, and digital collages.

He noted his large interactive and industrial pieces sometimes take four months to create.

"There's a lot of plan-

ning," he added. "When you do components to make super big stuff, there's a lot of planning."

All the pieces must fit to-

gether correctly, and Heimsoth often builds templates. He also works to bolt steel onto clay — sometimes adding LED lights or glass. His installation, "All knowing armadillo of omniscience," leans toward Zen spirituality with a spin. For example, a fortune-telling armadillo will communicate with the viewer if they type their question onto a computer keyboard.

"Everything I make, everything you see in the show, the first step of my process is, do I want it in my living room?" he explained. "If I don't, I don't make it — if I do, I go, 'yeah!'"

"All of this (art) is stuff at the end of its touring life cycle, will end up in my house," he continued. "Or in my backyard or in the corner of the shop."

Heimsoth noted there are two "veins" to his sculptural work.

"I've got an industrial esthetic, where there's a lot of bolts and steel and phalanges," he said. "And (then) there is more of the ornate kind of religious-inspired work."

"And all of that stems from how I was brought up," he added. "I grew up a kid on a farm, working with lots of machinery. Going to church every Sunday and going to church on Wednesdays ... So, the two major things growing up were industrial farm machinery and religious iconography."

He was "exposed" to different religious faiths when he went to college and some of his work reflects this also.

WARRENSBURG — Bradley Callihan has joined West-Central Independent Living Solutions as the director of disability support services.

"Right now, I'm actually learning a lot of different areas," Callihan said.

Callihan is in charge of the independent living program and benefit administration, as well as the case managers for clients.

"We have a great team

that helps out," Callihan said.

Callihan said his interest in working with people with disabilities began from personal experience taking care of his father, who was considered medically fragile.

"I actually got to see where having somebody who actually tries to help people or at least guide people in the right way, it was a great environment to get to be," Callihan said. "That first step with my father was years ago, but I guess it opened up a different environment for me. That way, I could actually provide help that a person might not get."

Callihan previously served in the U. S. Navy.

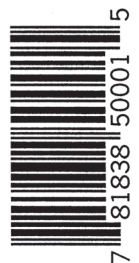
"I actually was honorably, medically discharged," Callihan said. "I had to have surgery and while that happened, I actually went

from a learning unit to actually being staff. ... That's when I actually got to gain my first actual leadership position."

Callihan said it was around the same time he started providing assistance to his father.

"I actually (have experience) first-hand of giving assistance to a person who did need a lot of help, not just physically but mentally as well," Callihan said. "That was actually where I got to meet a pretty severe situation where a person needed assistance. ... At that point, I also decided I wanted to extend my education."

Armed suspect fatally shot in Arizona ID'd as a Missouri man

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. (AP) — The Northern AZ Officer Involved Shooting Team is investigating the fatal shooting of a man who allegedly robbed a gas station store in Flagstaff and threatened people with a weapon.

Flagstaff police on Thursday identified the man as 51-year-old Donald Wayne Henry of Missouri. A hometown for Henry wasn't immediately available.

Police said officers responded to a call about a man breaking a gas station window Wednesday, entering the business and taking items from the store.

Coconino County Sheriff's officials received a call about a man threatening to stab people with a knife in the same area as the gas station.

Police said an arriving officer confronted the man in the middle of an intersection.

The suspect was armed with a screwdriver and allegedly advanced toward the officer in a threatening manner.

Police said the man fled as sheriff's deputies arrived and refused multiple commands to stop and drop the screwdriver before running across a road.

Authorities then surrounded the man, who reportedly charged toward a deputy before being fatally shot and later identified.

St. Louis police shoot and kill Sudanese man after standoff

ST. LOUIS (AP) — St. Louis police shot and killed a 61-year-old Sudanese refugee after he reportedly lunged at an officer after a long standoff, authorities said.

The confrontation on Wednesday began when officers were serving felony warrants for assault, resisting arrest and a weapons charge, Lt. John Green said.

After the man barricaded himself in an apartment, police used tasers, tear gas, robots and other nonlethal means to end the standoff, Green said, but they were unsuccessful.

Officers also tried to negotiate with him in English and Arabic, his native language, Green said.

When a SWAT team eventually entered the apartment, officers fired at least seven shots when the man charged an officer with a knife, Green said. No one else was in the apartment.

Friends said the man and his children immigrated to the U.S. about five years ago, the St. Louis Post-Dispatch reported.

Veii Kauaria, who works with Organization for Black Struggle and speaks Arabic, said he was disappointed officers wouldn't let him negotiate with the man.

"It just didn't have to happen like this," said Kauaria. "He was afraid. All he saw was this SWAT team with big guns, thinking they were going to kill him and they did."

Missouri man accused of beating 6-year-old to death with bat

ST. JOSEPH, Mo. (AP) — A northwest Missouri man has been accused of beating his 6-year-old daughter to death with a baseball bat.

Dustin L. Beechner, 37, has been charged with child abuse resulting in death. During a court hearing Wednesday, a judge ordered that he be held without bail.

Police were called to a St. Joseph home early Friday and found a child, Jozlyn Marie Beechner, dead with blunt force trauma to the head, the St. Joseph News-Gazette reported.

The child was struck several times in the head with an aluminum baseball bat, according to a probable cause statement.

Beechner led police to the roof of the house, where they found a child's body covered in a white sheet, according to the documents. He identified the girl as his daughter.

Associate Circuit Judge Keith Marquart noted during Wednesday's hearing that Beechner has two felony domestic assault convictions and was on probation on one of those past cases. The judge said Beechner is on suicide watch at the jail.

Dustin Beechner does not yet have an attorney, the newspaper reported.

The judge set a bond review hearing for Sept. 14, one day before what would have been the victim's seventh birthday.

Pablo Rafael Perez Riviera, 31, of Branson, sustained minor injuries at 3:30 p.m. Wednesday in a Henry County accident.

According to a Missouri State Highway Patrol report, Riviera was driving a 2017 Nissan south on Route 7 when he veered into the right-hand lane and was struck by a 2008 Lexus driven south by Guy E. Wright, 58, of Overland Park, Kansas.

Both drivers were wearing seat belts. Riviera was transported to Golden Valley Memorial Hospital in Clinton by Golden Valley ambulance.

Iowa woman injured in Moniteau accident

Lorrie A. Kinser, 58, of Chariton, Iowa, sustained moderate injuries at 7:50 p.m. Tuesday in a Moniteau County accident.

According to a Missouri State Highway Patrol report, Kinser was driving north on Highway 179 in a 2002 Ford F-150 when she failed to negotiate a left curve, traveled off the right side of the roadway, overcorrected, returned and traveled off the left side of the roadway, and struck several trees.

She was wearing a seat belt and was transported to University Hospital in Columbia by Mid-Mo Ambulance District.

Unions under pressure because rail strike may cost \$2B a day

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — Major freight railroads, in a bid to apply pressure on unions and Congress, say a strike that could come after a key deadline passes next week would cost the economy more than \$2 billion a day and disrupt deliveries of all kinds of goods and passenger traffic nationwide.

The Association of American Railroads trade group issued a report estimating the dire consequences of a strike Thursday, one day after U.S. Labor Secretary Marty Walsh took part in talks to try and help hammer out an agreement. A strike or lockout won't be allowed until next Friday at the soonest under the federal that governs railroad negotiations.

Five of the 12 unions involved that together represent some 115,000 workers have announced tentative agreements covering over 21,000 workers based on a set of recommendations that a special panel appointed by President Joe Biden made last month, but several key unions are holding out in the hope that the railroads will agree to go beyond those recommendations and address some of their concerns about working conditions.

The Presidential Emergency Board recommended a five-year deal, retroactive to 2020, that includes 24% raises and \$5,000 in bonuses. But it wants unions to take their concerns about attendance policies, paid leave and expenses to arbitration or to negotiate separately with the railroads. Unions say their

workloads have become unbearable after railroads eliminated nearly one-third of their workforces over the past six years.

The railroad trade group said a strike would idle some 7,000 freight trains a day run by CSX, Union Pacific, BNSF, Norfolk Southern, Kansas City Southern and other railroads and disrupt passenger operations nationwide because Amtrak and half of all commuter rail systems rely at least partly on tracks owned by the freight railroads.

The AAR also said it would be impossible for trucks to pick up the slack if railroads shut down because roughly 467,000 additional trucks a day would be needed to handle all the freight railroads deliver and there is already a shortage of trucks and drivers.

AAR CEO Ian Jefferies said the unions should accept the recommendations of the Presidential Emergency Board because they would deliver the biggest raises in nearly 50 years and they represent a compromise.

"Should negotiations fail and result in a work stoppage, Congress must act to implement the PEB recommendations," Jefferies said.

A Labor Department spokesman confirmed that Walsh took part in the talks Wednesday. If this contract dispute does fall to Congress to resolve, lawmakers might be forced to make some difficult decisions in an election year.

A coalition of 31 large agricultural groups sent a letter to Congress Thursday urging lawmakers to be prepared to intervene and block a strike if the two sides can't reach an

agreement before next Friday's deadline. They say they are dealing with delayed deliveries because railroads are shorthanded.

"Most freight railroads currently lack extra capacity to make up for down time," the agricultural groups said in their letter. "Thus, a sizable portion of freight backlogged due to a stoppage may never be made up leading to less production from rail-dependent businesses to the detriment of producers and consumers."

Railroad analyst Anthony Hatch said the unions are trying to take advantage of the current environment with Democrats in control of the White House and Congress and a tight job market, but ultimately he doesn't think a strike will happen.

"It makes sense for them to hold on until the last minute and try to get the best deal that they can. For the railroads, it makes perfect sense for them to say a disruption would be cataclysmic," Hatch said.

Even if a strike were to happen, Hatch predicted it would "last not weeks, not days, not hours but minutes" because Congress would intervene.

The heads of the two biggest rail unions — the Sheet Metal, Air, Rail and Transportation Workers — Transportation Division union that represents conductors and the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and Trainmen union that represents engineers — said in a joint statement last week that Congress should remain on the sidelines because that would put more pressure on the railroads and help them reach an agreement workers will approve.

Queen Elizabeth II, UK's longest-serving monarch, dies at 96

LONDON (AP) — Queen Elizabeth II, Britain's longest-reigning monarch and a symbol of stability across much of a turbulent century, died Thursday after 70 years on the throne. She was 96.

Buckingham Palace said she died at Balmoral Castle, her summer residence in Scotland, where members of the royal family had rushed to her side after her health took a turn for the worse.

A link to the almost-vanished generation that fought World War II, she was the only monarch most Britons have ever known.

Her 73-year-old son Prince Charles automatically became king and will be known as King Charles III, his office announced. Charles' second wife, Camilla, will be known as the Queen Consort.

The BBC played the national anthem, "God Save the Queen," over a portrait of her in full regalia as her death was announced, and the flag over Buckingham Palace was lowered to half-staff as the second Elizabethan age came to a close.

In a statement, Charles called the death of his mother "a moment of the greatest sadness for me and all members of my family," adding: "I know her loss will be deeply felt throughout the country, the Realms and the Commonwealth, and by countless people around the world."

British Prime Minister Liz Truss, appointed by the queen just 48 hours earlier, pronounced the country "devastated" and called Elizabeth "the rock on which modern Britain was built."

In Canada, where the

British monarch is the country's head of state, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau saluted her "wisdom, compassion and warmth." In India, Prime Minister Narendra Modi tweeted: "She provided inspiring leadership to her nation and people. She personified dignity and decency in public life. Pained by her demise."

President Joe Biden called her a "stateswoman of unmatched dignity and constancy who deepened the bedrock alliance between the United Kingdom and the United States."

The queen enjoyed robust health into her 90s, although she used a cane after the death of Philip, her husband of 73 years, in 2021. In October of that year, she was hospitalized for a night for tests, and

thereafter her public appearances grew scarcer.

In 1947, almost five years before she ascended the throne, the 21-year-old Elizabeth promised the people of Britain and the Commonwealth that "my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service."

It was a promise she kept across more than seven decades.

Elizabeth reigned over a country that rebuilt from war and lost its empire; joined the European Union and then left it; transformed from industrial powerhouse to uncertain 21st century society. She endured through 15 prime ministers, from Winston Churchill to Truss, becoming a fixed point and a reassuring presence even for those who ignored or loathed the

monarchy.

Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Windsor was born in London on April 21, 1926, the first child of the Duke and Duchess of York. She was not born to be queen — her father's elder brother, Prince Edward, was destined to take the crown, to be followed by any children he had.

But in 1936, when she was 10, Edward VIII abdicated to marry twice-divorced American Wallis Simpson, and Elizabeth's father became King George VI.

Princess Margaret recalled asking her sister whether this meant that Elizabeth would one day be queen. "Yes, I suppose it does," Margaret quoted Elizabeth as saying. "She didn't mention it again."

Elizabeth was barely in her teens when Britain went to war with Germany in 1939. Elizabeth and Margaret lived mostly at Windsor Castle, spending many nights in an underground shelter as bombs fell. Eager to do something for the war effort, the heir to the throne joined the Auxiliary Territorial Service in 1945, learning to drive and service heavy vehicles.

On the night the war ended in Europe, May 8, 1945, she and Margaret mingled, unrecognized, with celebrating crowds in London. She later called it "one of the most memorable nights of my life."

At Westminster Abbey in 1947 she married Royal Navy officer Philip Mountbatten, a prince of Greece and Denmark whom she had first met in 1939 when she was 13 and he 18.

Their first child, Prince Charles, was born on Nov. 14, 1948. He was followed by Princess Anne in 1950, Prince Andrew in 1960, and Prince Edward in 1964. Besides those children, she is survived by eight grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren.

In February 1952, George VI died after years of ill health at age 56. Elizabeth, visiting Kenya, was told that she was now queen.

"In a way I didn't have an apprenticeship," Elizabeth reflected in a BBC documentary in 1992. "My father died much too young, and so it was all a very sudden kind of taking on, and making the best job you can."

Her coronation came more than a year later at Westminster Abbey, a spectacle viewed by millions through the still-new medium of television.

Prime Minister Winston Churchill's first reaction was that the new queen was "only a child," but he was won over within days and became an ardent admirer.

Churchill was the first of 15 prime ministers in her reign. The monarch held weekly meetings with them, and they generally found her well-informed, inquisitive and up to date.

Her views in those private meetings became a subject of intense speculation and fertile ground for dramatists like Peter Morgan, author of the play "The Audience" and hit TV series "The Crown." Those semi-fictionalized accounts were the product of an era of declining deference and rising celebrity, when the royal family's troubles became public property.

There were plenty of troubles. In Elizabeth's first years on the throne, Princess Margaret provoked a national controversy through her romance with a divorced man.

In what the queen called the "annus horribilis" of 1992, Princess Anne was divorced, Prince Charles and Princess Diana separated, and so did Prince Andrew and his wife, Sarah. That was also the year Windsor Castle was seriously damaged by fire.

The public split of Charles and Diana was

followed by the shock of her death in a Paris car crash in 1997. For once, the queen appeared out of step amid unprecedented public mourning, failing to make a public show of grief that was seen by many as unfeeling. After several days, she made a televised address to the nation.

The dent in her popularity was brief. She was by now a sort of national grandmother, with a stern gaze and a kind smile.

She was arguably the most famous person in the world. But her inner life and opinions remained mostly an enigma. The public saw only glimpses of her personality -- her joy watching horse races at Royal Ascot, or her pleasure in the companionship of her beloved Welsh corgi dogs.

In 2015, she overtook her great-great-grandmother Queen Victoria's reign of 63 years, seven months and two days to become the longest serving monarch in British history, and she kept working into her 10th decade. The loss of Philip at age 99 in 2021 was a heavy blow.

And the family troubles kept coming. Her son, Prince Andrew, was entangled in the sordid tale of sex offender Jeffrey Epstein, an American businessman who had been a friend. The queen's grandson Prince Harry walked away from Britain and royal duties after marrying American actress Meghan Markle in 2018.

As the queen entered her mid-90s, she had what the palace called "mobility issues" and she appeared infrequently in public this year as she marked her Platinum Jubilee. In May, she asked Charles to stand in for her at the State Opening of Parliament, one of the monarch's key constitutional duties.

But she remained firmly in control of the monarchy. On Sept. 6, she presided at a ceremony at Balmoral Castle to accept the resignation of Boris Johnson as prime minister and appoint Truss as his successor.

She remained at the center of public life to the end. As Britons endured loss, isolation and uncertainty during the coronavirus pandemic, she made a rare video address in 2020 that urged people to stick together.

She summoned the spirit of World War II, that vital time in her life, and the nation's, and echoed Vera Lynn's wartime anthem, "We'll Meet Again."

"We should take comfort that while we may have more still to endure, better days will return. We will be with our friends again. We will be with our families again. We will meet again," she said.

What to know about U.K. accession rules after queen's death

The British monarchy's rules state that "a new sovereign succeeds to the throne as soon as his or her predecessor dies."

That means Queen Elizabeth II's eldest son, Prince Charles, became king immediately upon her death.

However, it may be months or even longer before Charles' formal coronation. In Elizabeth's case, her coronation came on June 2, 1953 — 16 months after her accession on Feb. 6, 1952, when her father, King George VI, died.

A look at the formalities that take place after Charles accedes to the throne:

- Within 24 hours of a monarch's death, a new sovereign is proclaimed formally as soon as possible at St. James's Palace in London by the "Accession Council." This is made up of officials from the Privy Council, which includes senior Cabinet ministers, judges and leaders of the Church of England, who are summoned to the palace for the meeting.
- Parliament is then recalled for

lawmakers to take their oaths of allegiance to the new monarch.

- The new monarch will swear an oath before the Privy Council in St. James's Palace to maintain the Church of Scotland, according to the Act of Union of 1707.

- The proclamation of the new sovereign is then publicly read out at St. James's Palace, as well as in Edinburgh, Cardiff and Belfast — the capital cities of the four nations that make up the United Kingdom.

- Charles must declare to Parliament on the first day of its session following the accession, or at the coronation, whichever is first, that he is a faithful Protestant. The oath is mandated by the Accession Declaration Act of 1910.

- He must also take a coronation oath as prescribed by the Coronation Oath Act of 1689, the Act of Settlement of 1701 and the Accession Declaration Act.

- He must be in communion with the Church of England, a flexible rule which allowed King George I and King George II to reign even though they were Lutherans.

United makes 'conditional' order for electric air taxis

DALLAS (AP) — United Airlines thinks that in a few years, plenty of big-city customers will pay \$100 or more for a one-way ride to the airport in a four-seat, electric-powered air taxi.

The Chicago-based airline said Thursday that it invested \$15 million in a startup manufacturer, and signed a "conditional" agreement

to buy 200 of the tiny aircraft with options for 200 more.

United said it expects to receive the first taxis — which will take off and land vertically, like helicopters — from Eve Air Mobility as soon as 2026.

It's hard to judge United's commitment to the deal, since it wouldn't provide terms for the order. A spokesman said the conditions are standard when buying an

aircraft that hasn't been certified by regulators, and they cover "a number of United's business objectives."

The stake in Eve amounts to less than 5% of United's second-quarter profit.

But the deal fits United's pattern of announcing interest in startups that are trying to build and win regulatory approval for air taxis, like Archer, and supersonic planes, like Boom.

Mike Leskinen, president of United's venture-funding arm, said the eVTOLs — electric vertical takeoff and landing aircraft — will be ideally suited for traffic-clogged cities where United flies, including New York, Chicago and San Francisco. He said air taxis will be faster than driving to the airport and produce fewer emissions, and trips will cost \$100 to \$150 each way.

"It will take time for consumers to adopt this. People are going to have some hesitancy at first," Leskinen said. "It will feel a lot similar to a helicopter ride, it might be scary for some, but this is going to change the way we work and live."

The Eve aircraft is envisioned to have a range of 40 to 60 miles (65 to 100 kilometers). Future designs might be slightly bigger than the currently planned four-seater, but

they would not replace any planes that United flies from one airport to another, so they won't reduce carbon emissions produced by the airline's regular fleet.

Eve Holding Inc. is a publicly traded company formed this year by a combination of a special purpose acquisition company called Zanite and a unit of Brazilian aircraft manufacturer Embraer. It is based in Melbourne, Florida.

“No matter where you’re at in the world, religion is responsible for some of the most beautiful stuff there is,” he noted.

He calls his two-dimensional work “couch art.”

“This, honestly, is my have fun, decompress (art),” he said.

He added the paintings are stress-free. There’s no drilling, bolting, or lining up pieces. Instead, Heimsoth enjoys taking everyday landscapes and adding sci-fi elements to the art.

His ceramic pieces are combined with steel, and four of them are copper plated.

“So, the patina you see on them, it’s not some special effect,” he noted. “It’s legit — coat it, throw it outside, and let mother nature do her thing. And it’s prettier than anything I could have put on it, to begin with.”

While the first gallery houses his industrial steel and sci-fi pieces, the second gallery has botanical-themed art created with bonsai trees and digital collages that engage the viewer.

“In the last year or two, I’ve been getting into bonsai trees and bonsai planters,” he noted. “I understand when you’re doing bonsai trees, the

focus is on the tree.

“The planters are always super plain, super mundane,” he continued. “But I’m an artist and like ostentatious stuff and flashy things.”

So, he decided to make creative and over-the-top containers for bonsai trees.

“Why don’t the planters reflect the ornate majesty of the tree?” he noted. “Why not put them in pots deserving of them? So, a lot of these (art pieces) are my personal interpretation on bonsai planters. Just sort of fancy pots to put a fancy tree in.”

He noted that the show’s goal is to cause people to interact, think, and discuss art and make them forget about their cell phones. His digital collages are incredibly engaging.

“If I’m not making (art) engaging enough to make you forget about that phone for five minutes, then I need to quit,” he explained of his digital work. “So that’s why these have animations and backlit screens. It’s that same kind of mental cue as a cell phone.”

The Josh Heimsoth exhibit is open from 1 to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday at the Hayden Liberty Center, 111 W. Fifth St. For more information about his work, contact Heimsoth on Instagram.

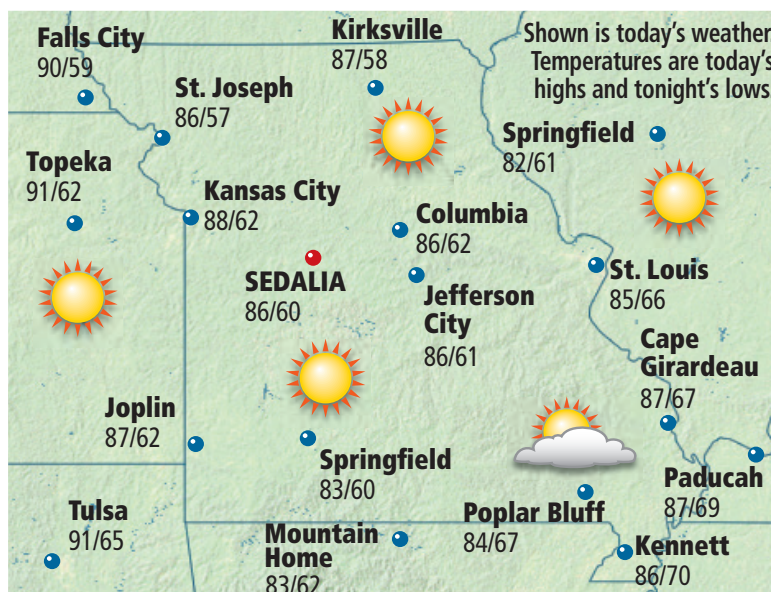

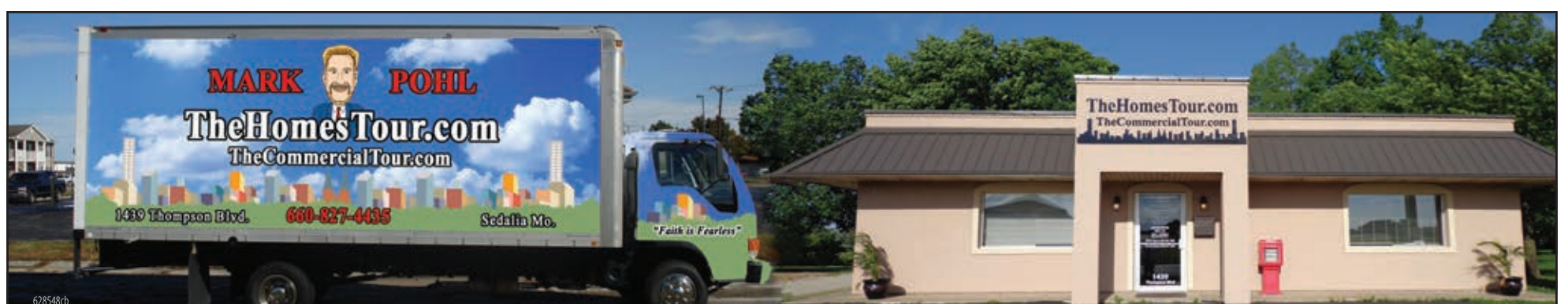

UCM restructures Red and Black scholarship program

WARRENSBURG — The University of Central Missouri has announced the restructuring of the Red and Black Scholarship program.

UCM states the restructuring is to extend the program's reach and improve its financial impact on more incoming freshmen for the 2023-24 academic year.

While national test scores are still greatly valued in this restructuring, changes also benefit students who have achieved excellent grade point averages in high school but may opt out of submitting scores on national tests.

Offering more scholarship dollars overall for entering freshmen, changes in the program range from adding a \$3,000 scholarship level for those with a 3.95 GPA and no ACT to a full tuition and general fees offer for those with a GPA above 3.90 and an ACT above 32.

"This new scholarship program is designed to give more money to more students and align with the university's mission to provide access to higher education," said Chris Lang, assistant vice pro-

vost for admissions and analytics at UCM. "These new scholarships help ensure that UCM remains affordable, even for those who want to take advantage of our test-optional admission. More scholarship money can allow students to potentially take on less debt and finance their education and also minimize the debt it takes to graduate with a bachelor's degree."

The Red and Black Scholarship program is an automatic award that is given to qualified incoming freshmen with amounts that were traditionally determined by a student's ACT score and GPA.

Now that admission to the university is test optional, the revisions to the Red and Black Scholarship program reflect this change, which demonstrates the cumulative GPA as a strong indicator of the student's potential to succeed.

Students with a high GPA will be eligible for a larger Red and Black Scholarship than in the past.

"In previous years, students who were test optional, regardless of their GPA, would receive

a \$1,000 scholarship from us," Lang said. "Under this new scholarship platform, students, if they have a low ACT or no ACT at all, can receive more scholarship dollars depending on their GPA."

Lang said under the new program, anyone who has at least a 2.75 GPA will receive a minimum \$1,000 scholarship, regardless of whether or not they have an ACT score. The higher their GPA, the larger the Red and Black Scholarship they will receive.

A student, for example, who earns a 3.95 GPA, without an ACT score, will receive up to \$3,000 to apply toward their first year of tuition and academic fees. This is renewable for up to eight consecutive semesters. If a student has a minimum GPA of 3.95 and an ACT score of 27, they will be eligible for \$4,500. If the student has an ACT between 32-36 and a 3.90 GPA or higher they will qualify for full tuition and general fees.

Lang said the university uses the ACT Superscore in calculating the amount of a Red and Black Scholarship. This score is determined

through a process of averaging a student's four best subject scores from all of their ACT test attempts.

"If students take the ACT test once, that score will be used to determine the score. But if they take it multiple times, through the Superscore they may see a bump in their overall ACT score," Lang said.

The Red and Black Scholarship is the largest scholarship program funded by the university to support incoming freshmen.

Awards are not competitive but instead are based on the student's individual success and can be combined with other scholarships.

The university has a separate program for assisting transfer students, as well as Second Generation Grants, UCM Dual Credit Scholarships and Non-Resident Scholar Awards.

UCM also expects to announce a new needs-based scholarship later this year.

"Well, they're moving a lot of dirt and getting ready to build another road," Reine said. "They want a four-lane road, that's what they really want, but they're only going to build a two-lane to start with, they tell me, because they don't have enough money to do the four-lane right now."

Reine is a dairy farmer who sold much of his property to Nucor Steel, a neighbor that is seeking another entrance to its property.

"Well, you got Nucor back there, and I still got over 200 acres to sell to them, providing they'll name the road Reine Dairy Parkway," Reine said.

Reine originally sold over 300 acres to Nucor to build its plant on. He has 300 acres left and wants to sell Nucor 200 acres more for a drive and back entrance off Cedar Drive.

Cedar Drive is getting widened to accommodate heavy truck traffic to the new entrance.

"They've already got the land bought for a four-lane road," Reine said, "so they could expand that when they get around to doing it. There will be a lot of truck traffic on it because Nucor says they want to use it for a truck entrance on the backside of their place and set up another opening there for a gateway, scales, and everything so trucks can come in and keep the traffic off 65 Highway."

Construction on Cedar Drive is proceeding well as the dry weather has been holding.

"This is our second week as far as working off the NTP, Notice to Proceed," Rosendale said. "So far, it's been immaculate. If it gets too wet, we're going to have to put things on hold because compaction is based on the moisture content of the soil that we're using, so we've been pretty lucky with the weather so far."

PASTOR'S PULPIT

You may think the title of this article is an irrelevant question. The decision of whether or not we should attend the church of our choice is one that every believer needs to make. It is a choice, at least for most people.

When I was growing up, there was no debate in our family. We were in church every time the doors were open; in fact, sometimes my parents opened the doors. While growing up, I resented the fact I "had to go to church," but believe me when I say I'm so very thankful for the spiritual heritage my parents gave me. I would have never believed then that my three brothers and I would spend our lives in the ministry. My sister, who is now with the Lord, ministered through her many years of playing the piano in church and also being married to an ordained minister.

What about you? What is your reason for going to worship? We really don't "go to church" because, in reality, "we are the church." We gather together at church,

at least some of us do. Why should we? What difference does it make whether we do or don't gather regularly?

On any given Sunday in most communities, less than 30% of the population can be found in worship. That means more than two-thirds of the general population are missing out on the opportunity to receive a word from the Lord through their pastor. This particular message may have been just what they needed to hear. Out of those who do choose to come to worship, less than half of those who attend are in the fellowship every Sunday. The average faithful member in the church of today attends 2.1 times per month. There are so many things that just seem to take priority over participating in worship — weekend trips to the lake or the big city, ball games, excursions to see the grandparents and so much more. Everything seems to take priority over church.

What's the big deal? Why is it important to be an active part of the gathered church on any given Sunday? I'd like to share with

you what I believe are some of the best reasons to be a part of your local assembly of believers.

You need to be around like-minded people who can encourage you in your faith. You might be an encouragement to someone else. The message your pastor prepared may be just the word that God wants you to receive this week. Someone among the gathered saints may be looking to you as the model for how they should live the Christian life. Perhaps this is the weakest of all reasons, but have you ever thought that your pastor is actually encouraged by your presence?

God has set forth this principle in His word. Hebrews 10:23-27 says it like this:

"Let us hold unwaveringly to the hope we profess, for He who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another — and all the more as you see the day

approaching." So, therefore, we should gather more faithfully both for ourselves and for others. There's an energy that is hard to describe when we have a good crowd. I can tell you after all of my years in ministry that it is an encouragement to the pastor when you are there.

Those are not the best reasons for you to be faithful. The best reason for you to be a part of the gathered assembly is to bring praise and honor and glory to Christ. Your presence could be a witness to someone who is struggling with their faith. Your example of faithfulness might warm the heart of an aging saint or challenge someone else to follow Christ. If you have invited someone to join you and you aren't there, what kind of example would that be?

Two things will keep you coming back to worship week after week: relationships and responsibilities. Find somewhere you can contribute your gifts and talents. Make a covenant with a small group of believers and be accountable to be there unless providentially hindered. You will be better and so will your church.

Hearing to determine if Missouri boarding school will close

A Missouri boarding school already under scrutiny amid physical and sexual abuse allegations may soon be shut down, following a judge's ruling.

Cedar County Circuit Judge David Munton signed an order Wednesday night to close Agape

Boarding School in Stockton after the Missouri attorney general's office and the state Department of Social Services filed petitions citing evidence that someone on the state registry for child abuse and neglect was actively working there.

But early Thursday, Munton stated in a court

document that before closing the school he wanted the sheriff to confirm that the employee is still working at Agape. Officials have not said whether that's the case, and a hearing originally scheduled for Thursday to decide Agape's fate was postponed until Monday.

"Agape's employment of a staff member who is listed on the state's Child Abuse/Neglect Central Registry presents an immediate health and safety concern for the children residing at Agape," the petition from Attorney General Eric Schmitt's office stated. "This new development is sadly consistent with the dark pattern of behavior at Agape previously exposed by the Attorney General's Office and DSS."

Agape's lawyer, John Schultz, said the school remains open. A spokesman for Schmitt declined further comment.

Munton's order, if carried out, would require the removal of all 63 boys at Agape, and require assessments of their health, safety and well-being.

Allegations of physical and sexual abuse at Agape and nearby Christian boarding school Circle of Hope Girls' Ranch prompted a

state law last year requiring stricter oversight of such facilities. Among other things, the new law allows state or local authorities to petition the court for closure of a facility if there is believed to be an immediate health or safety threat to the children.

Last year, Agape's longtime doctor, David Smock, was charged with child sex crimes and five employees were charged with low-level abuse counts. Schmitt's office contended that 22 workers should have been charged, and with more serious crimes. But in Missouri, only the local prosecutor can file charges, and Cedar County Prosecuting Attorney Ty Gaither has said no additional employees would be charged.

Meanwhile, the husband-and-wife founders of Circle of Hope, Boyd and Stephanie Householder, face a combined 99 charges that include child abuse and neglect, sex crimes and other counts. The school was ordered shut down in 2020 amid the investigation.

Several lawsuits filed on behalf of former students also have named Agape and Circle of Hope.

The district wants to focus on being a place that provides those resources. There is a new student-led coalition in La Monte called the BC2M Club that will meet monthly to talk about mental health.

"They will meet and come up with strategies and solutions for how to tackle mental health and well-being in students," Thomas said.

La Monte will also double down on professional development for teachers

and maximizing classroom time while focusing on student achievement and improvement.

As superintendent, Thomas added that he is looking forward to making an impact on students and focusing on student success in the 2022-23 school year.

"Also that we are meeting the needs of our community," Thomas said. "That we are focused on the things our community values and one of those things the community values is student achievement and student well-being."

Ukraine, neighbors, to get big new aid, Blinken says in Kyiv

KYIV, Ukraine (AP) — Underscoring determined U.S. support, Secretary of State Antony Blinken paid an unannounced visit to Kyiv on Thursday and the Biden administration ramped up military aid by more than \$2.8 billion to Ukraine and other European countries threatened by Russia.

The new assistance came as the U.S. sought to boost momentum in Ukraine's counteroffensive against Russia — and amid fears that public support is waning as the war drags on. President Joe Biden, Blinken and Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin all participated in meetings aimed at showing U.S. resolve to stand behind Ukraine.

In Kyiv, Blinken said the administration would provide \$2.2 billion in long-term military financing to Ukraine and 18 of its neighbors "potentially at risk of future Russian aggression." That's on top of a \$675 million package of heavy weaponry, ammunition and armored vehicles for Ukraine alone, announced by Austin and Gen. Mark Milley, chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, earlier in the day.

"I thought it was particularly meaningful (to visit) at this time as Ukraine is starting this counteroffensive in the south, also in the east," Blinken told reporters in Kyiv before boarding a train for Poland after meeting Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and his top aides.

"It's early days, but we're seeing real effectiveness on the ground, and we're proud of the fact that our support, the support of so many other countries, is helping to enable what the Ukrainians are doing and working to liberate territory seized by Russia in this aggression," Blinken said.

He told Zelenskyy when they met, "We know this is a pivotal moment, more than six months into Russia's war of aggression against Ukraine, as your counteroffensive is now underway and proving effective."

Zelenskyy replied, "We are grateful for the signal, for

this enormous support that you're providing on a day-to-day basis."

The new funding and military weapons are designed to provide enduring training and support for what Gen. Milley called a "very deliberate" counteroffensive that Ukrainian troops have launched.

Meeting virtually, Biden and the leaders of major U.S. allies all emphasized their countries' strong support "for Ukraine as it defends itself from Russian aggression," according to a White House readout.

"Russia's weaponization of energy" and what to do about it — a major concern for this winter in Europe — was also discussed, said press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre. Those on the call included the leaders of Germany, Italy, the United Kingdom, Poland, Romania, NATO, Canada and Japan and representatives from France and the European Union.

Austin and Milley announced the package of heavy weaponry, ammunition and armored vehicles for Ukraine alone at a conference in Ramstein, Germany.

"We are seeing real and measurable gains from Ukraine in the use of these systems," said Milley. He said Russia is suffering significant equipment and troop losses. But, he added, "The war is not over. Russia is a big country. They have very serious ambitions with respect to Ukraine. So sustainment of Ukraine to continue their fight for their survival will be necessary."

The \$2.2 billion in so-called Foreign Military Financing has already been appropriated by Congress, but lawmakers, some of whom have expressed concerns about the massive amounts of money going to Ukraine, must still approve the actual allotments. Just two weeks ago, the administration had announced a \$3 billion package of support for Ukraine.

About \$1 billion of the total will go to Ukraine and the rest will be divided among Albania, Bosnia, Bulgaria, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Georgia, Greece, Kosovo, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Slovakia

and Slovenia, the State Department said.

It will help those countries "deter and defend against emergent threats to their sovereignty and territorial integrity" by enhancing their military integration with NATO and counteracting "Russian influence and aggression," the department said.

Asked about continued congressional support for the massive aid packages, Austin said the administration will provide its rationale to lawmakers, and "I fully expect that it will continue to receive broad bipartisan support because our leaders recognize how important this is."

Foreign Military Financing allows recipients to purchase U.S.-made equipment, often depending on their specific needs.

The package for Ukraine includes howitzers, artillery munitions, Humvees, armored ambulances, anti-tank systems and more to assist the country with its shorter-term needs as it presses its counteroffensive.

"The capabilities we are delivering are carefully calibrated to make the most difference on the battlefield," Blinken said.

He will visit NATO headquarters in Brussels on Friday to further emphasize coordinated support. And Austin announced the U.S.

will convene a meeting of international senior leaders to discuss how their defense industrial bases can best equip Ukraine's forces into the future.

"The war is at another key moment," Austin said. "Now we're seeing the demonstrable success of our common efforts on the battlefield," he said at a meeting of the Ukraine Defense Contact Group, which was attended by NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg and Ukraine's defense minister as well as officials from allied countries.

Germany and the Netherlands will provide training in de-mining to Ukrainian soldiers as well as de-mining equipment, the countries' defense ministers said on the sidelines of the meeting with Austin. The training will be carried out in Germany. The two countries previously joined forces to send howitzers.

Thursday's contributions bring total U.S. aid to Ukraine to \$15.2 billion since Biden took office.

Fighting between Ukraine and Russia has intensified in recent days, with Ukrainian forces mounting a counteroffensive to retake Russian-held areas.

Ukrainian forces in the northeastern Kharkiv region have retaken portions of Russian-held territory as efforts in the south have

drained some of Moscow's resources in the area, according to a report from the Washington-based think tank Institute for the Study of War.

Meanwhile, shelling continued near Ukraine's Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant, Europe's largest, with the warring sides again trading blame amid dire warnings from the U.N. atomic watchdog, which has urged the creation of a safe zone to prevent a catastrophe.

Separately, on Wednesday, the U.S. accused Moscow of interrogating, detaining and forcibly deporting hundreds of thousands of Ukrainians to Russia. Russian officials rejected the claim as "fantasy."

Before leaving Ukraine, Blinken visited the devastated city of Irpin outside Kyiv where he toured damage caused by Russian forces during their 25-day occupation. He was told there that Ukrainian investigators have 30,000 open cases related to war crimes.

"There has to be accountability for those who committed atrocities" he said.

Before meeting Zelenskyy and Ukrainian Foreign Minister Dmytro Kuleba, Blinken made a short stop at the U.S. Embassy and then the National Specialized Children's Hospital Ohmatdyt, where he saw boys and girls injured during Russian

bombardments, including Maryna, a 6-year-old from the city of Kherson who lost a leg after a rocket struck her house.

In the hospital lobby, Blinken also met Patron, a Jack Russell terrier that has helped Ukraine's military find more than 200 mines laid by Russian forces. Blinken knelt down, petted the dog and presented him with treats, saying he was "world famous."

In one ward, Blinken brought a basket of stuffed animals, which the children quickly dangled in front of Patron to get his attention.

Blinken told parents that "the spirit of your children sends a very strong message around the world."

Retailers pull lobster from menus after 'red list' warning

PORTLAND, Maine (AP) — Some retailers are taking lobster off the menu after an assessment from an influential conservation group that the seafood poses too much of a risk to rare whales and should be avoided.

Whales can suffer injuries and fatalities when they become entangled in the gear that connects to lobster traps on the ocean floor. Seafood Watch, which rates the sustainability of different seafoods, said this week it has added the American and Canadian lobster fisheries to its "red list" of species to avoid.

The organization, based at Monterey Bay Aquarium in California, said in a report that the fishing industry is a danger to North Atlantic right whales because "current management measures do not go far enough to mitigate entanglement risks and promote recovery of the species."

Thousands of businesses use Seafood Watch's recommendations to inform seafood buying decisions, and many have pledged to avoid

any items that appear on the red list. A spokesperson for Blue Apron, the New York meal kit retailer, said the company stopped offering a seasonal lobster box prior to the report, and all of the seafood it is currently using follows Seafood Watch's guidelines. HelloFresh, the Germany-based meal kit company that is the largest such company operating in the U.S., also pledged shortly after the announcement to stop selling lobster.

"HelloFresh is committed to responsible sourcing and follows guidelines from the Monterey Bay Aquarium Seafood Watch program," said Saskia Leisewitz, a spokesperson for HelloFresh.

Seafood Watch assigns ratings of "best choice," "good alternative" and "avoid" to more than 2,000 seafood items based on how sustainably they are managed. The organization's recommendations have been influential in the past, such as when it red-listed the Louisiana shrimp fishery, prompting efforts to better protect sea turtles. The fishery was later removed from the red list.

The lobster fishing indus-

try has come under scrutiny from Seafood Watch because of the threat of entanglement in fishing gear. The North Atlantic right whales number less than 340 and entanglement is one of the two biggest threats they face, along with collisions with ships, scientists with the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and other groups have said. The population of the giant animals, which were decimated during the commercial whaling era generations ago, has fallen in recent years.

Members of the lobster fishing industry, which is also coping with increased federal fishing restrictions to protect the whales, pushed back against the Seafood Watch rating. The lobster industry in Maine, where most of the U.S.'s lobster comes to land, has not had a documented interaction with a right whale in almost two decades, said Patrice McCarron, executive director of the Maine Lobstermen's Association.

"Lobster is one of the most sustainable fisheries in the world due to the effective stewardship practices handed down through

generations of lobstermen. These include strict protections for both the lobster resource and right whales," McCarron said.

American and Canadian lobster fishermen target the same species, the American lobster, which is popular as live seafood and in processed products such as lobster rolls and lobster ravioli. The vast majority of the world's American lobster comes to the shore in New England and eastern Canada, and the crustaceans are both a key piece of the economy and a cultural marker in both places.

The U.S. lobster fishery is also one of the most lucrative in the country and was worth more than \$900 million at the docks in 2021, when fishermen caught more than 130 million

pounds (59 million kilograms) of the crustaceans.

Seafood Watch partners with numerous major seafood buyers on its recommendations. Some of the buyers, such as Compass Group and Cheesecake Factory, did not respond to requests for comment from The Associated Press. A spokesperson for one, Mars Petcare, said the company doesn't have lobster in its supply chain.

Environmental groups said Seafood Watch's decision places a spotlight on the fishery and the need to do more to protect whales.

Pujols chasing home run history as Cardinals chase playoffs

INDEPENDENCE, Mo. (AP) — Rodolfo Castro doesn't remember how old he was when he first met Albert Pujols, or even the exact circumstances, whether it was at a major league game or during one of the big slugger's charitable trips back to the Dominican Republic.

Castro remembers how he felt, though. It was that childlike sense of wonder that comes when you meet your hero.

"I know I was a young kid," recalled Castro, now the 23-year-old infielder for the Pittsburgh Pirates. "And I was very timid in approaching him because I knew his stature and knew what he represented."

It was just last year, after Castro signed with the Pirates and climbed every laborious rung on the minor league ladder, that he learned there was nothing to fear. The Pirates were playing the Dodgers and Castro had drawn a fifth-inning walk.

"Pujols was playing first base," he said, "and we just had a brief conver-

sation, and he gave me a really warm welcome into the big leagues and just congratulated me. And then that same series, the next day during BP, I was able to run into him and I approached him and just told him what a pleasure it was to meet him and what a great honor it was to be able to play on the same field as him. He was very warm with me and encouraged me to just continue balling out."

Walk through any big league clubhouse and you're bound to come across someone with a similar Pujols story — a shared laugh during batting practice, a chance meeting in the offseason, an opportunity to work with him in the community. They are shared freely as the erstwhile star tries to hit the five more homers he needs for 700 in his career.

More often than not, though, the stories have to do with the way Pujols inspired an entire generation of baseball players, and particularly Latino kids, who saw him rise from humble roots in the Dominican Republic to dominate the game.

at one end of the pool, sometimes signaling if the swimmer needs to be more urgent.

"We work really hard on tracking their pacing [for the event]," Ryan said. "Someone has to be on the sidelines making sure he's making time on his 50 [yards]. There's a lot of communication [and] it's about balancing and knowing your body."

Added Seltzer, "You

want a nice steady pace, a little stronger than you'd normally do. Then the last 100, all-out."

He cut over 14 seconds off his seed time and was one of eight events where the Tigers achieved PRs Wednesday.

Two were achieved in the 100-yard freestyle, where Clay Pilliard won in 50.88 seconds. Trailing just behind was teammate Findlay Hume, who

finished in 52.97, shaving multiple seconds off his previous best.

"For them to cut time, it's tough when they're already going so hard to break those PRs," Ryan said. "And that's what we kind of focus on, being a small team. Even if we don't win every single race, my goal for them and their goal is to at least beat their PR."

Clemson coach Dabo Swinney gets raise, extended through 2031

COLUMBIA, S.C. (AP) — Clemson coach Dabo Swinney has a reworked contract that will pay him \$115 million over 10 seasons through 2031.

Swinney's enhanced contract follows mega-deals given to Alabama's Nick Saban, Georgia's Kirby Smart and Ohio State's Ryan Day earlier this season. Swinney's average yearly salary of \$11.5 million sits only behind Saban's \$11.7 million average compensation.

The university's board of trustees compensation committee approved the deal Thursday.

Swinney will make \$10.5 million this season, a raise of \$2 million scheduled under his old agreement signed in 2019. He'll earn \$12.5 million in the contract's final year, 2031.

Each year, Swinney will get \$305,000 in base salary. His supplemental income this season will be \$6.695 million plus

\$3.5 million in licensing money.

Swinney's total compensation will go up \$250,000 for the next four years. He will remain at \$11.5 million in 2026 and 2027, then continuing increasing by \$250,000 the final four years of the agreement.

"I remain eternally grateful and honored for the opportunity to continue coach and developing young people of excellence," said Swinney, who is in his 14th full season with the Tigers. "This agreement is representative of what

has been collectively built here."

The 52-year-old has won seven Atlantic Coast Conference titles, made the College Football Playoff six times and won national crowns after the 2016 and 2018 seasons.

The Tigers, fifth in the latest poll, open the home season Saturday against FCS opponent Furman.

Athletic director Graham Neff said it was "critical that Clemson invest in our football program and ensure our head coach is at Clemson for a long, long time."

Ginobili and his Eurostep reach Basketball Hall of Fame

The first clue that, no, Manu Ginobili did not invent the Eurostep should come from the move's name. Ginobili isn't from Europe. He's from South America. And it's not called the South Ameristep.

Perhaps it should be. The long, lateral move — step one way to get a defender leaning, then cut the other way into open space — was Ginobili's signature, something he mastered, something that he brought into the mainstream.

In turn, it brought him to the Basketball Hall of Fame.

The four-time NBA champion with the San Antonio Spurs is one of the headliners for Saturday night's enshrinement ceremony in Springfield, Massachusetts. Ginobili spent all 16 of his NBA seasons in San Antonio, partnering with Tim Duncan and Tony Parker to form a Big Three that was, and surely will remain, one of the best

trios the league has ever seen.

"It's something you never expect," Ginobili said of entering the Hall. "You start playing ball because you love it, because it's fun, because you're there with your friends. ... And now, when I thought there were not going to be more surprises after my career was done, you get a recognition like this which makes you think, go back a little bit in time, and relieve your story, and it's incredible."

Ginobili isn't the first international NBA player to make the Hall. He is, however, the first to be selected by the North American committee, which means he got into the Hall solely on the merits of his NBA career and not what he did playing internationally.

He's quick to point out that he won't be the last name on that list. Parker, Dirk Nowitzki and Pau Gasol will be getting their calls before long.

Chelsea hires Graham Potter as manager, replacing Tuchel

Chelsea's new American owners took a gamble with the first managerial appointment of their tenure, hiring Graham Potter from Premier League rival Brighton on Thursday despite his lack of experience coaching at soccer's highest level.

The 47-year-old Potter agreed to a five-year deal as the replacement for Thomas Tuchel, who was fired on Wednesday after an apparent breakdown in his relationship with Chelsea's recently installed ownership team fronted by Los Angeles Dodgers part-owner Todd Boehly.

While Tuchel won the Champions League with Chelsea last year and previously ran a locker room of soccer superstars — such as Kylian Mbappé and Neymar — at Paris Saint-Germain, Potter has a more obscure coaching past and has won only one trophy, the Swedish Cup in 2017.

That came during a

seven-year stint at remote Swedish club Ostersund (2011-18), which he led from the country's fourth tier to the first division and then into the Europa League for the first time.

Since then, he has coached Swansea for one season in English soccer's second division, guiding the team to the FA Cup quarterfinals, before taking over at Brighton in 2019. Brighton is currently in fourth place in the Premier League, having finished last season in ninth — the highest in the club's history.

Chelsea said Potter would bring "progressive football and innovative coaching" to the club, while Boehly said the new coach "fits our vision."

"Not only is he extremely talented on the pitch," Boehly said of Potter, "he has skills and capabilities that extend beyond the pitch which will make Chelsea a more successful club."

Potter, who played mostly for lower-league English teams in an un-

distinguished career from 1992-2005 before retiring at the age of 30 and going into higher education, is widely admired as one of the country's best tacticians and has a brave, entertaining style of play that has won plaudits if not trophies. Manchester City manager Pep Guardiola has said he is a "big fan" of Potter because of the way his "players move with freedom and ... have the courage to play everywhere."

And Boehly, the face of Chelsea's ownership, has been convinced that Potter is the man to instill a long-term soccer ethos and identity throughout the club at the start of the new era.

The demands Potter will face at Chelsea will contrast sharply with those at his previous clubs, however, unlikely giving him as much time to cultivate a team as he has had so far in his career.

"He'll be expected to win every week, to challenge for trophies," said former Chelsea player

and assistant coach Jody Morris. "It's totally different to being in a club where you are expected to be midtable and can go a couple of months without winning a game. You go a couple of games without winning at Chelsea and it'll be totally different."

Potter's time in

Sweden offers an interesting insight into why he is lauded as a good manager and a thinker of the game.

Under Potter, Ostersund, which prides itself on developing its players as people before sportsmen, started what it called a "Culture Academy" where squad mem-

bers and coaches were faced with challenges to their mental process and decision-making under pressure.

After achieving promotion one year, Potter and his players put on a modern-dance production in the city's theater, set to music from Swan Lake.

Bazelak composure helping him settle in as Hoosiers new QB

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP) — Connor Bazelak stood at the microphone last weekend, every bit as composed following his first win as Indiana's new quarterback as he was during the decisive final drive.

It's the reason Hoosiers coach Tom Allen brought the former Missouri quarterback to Bloomington.

And his spectacular Friday night finish convinced others that Bazelak can win games, too. Now, just one game into a new chapter in his career, many Indiana fans and teammates expect bigger and better results from the former Ohio prep star.

"Honestly, that was the first time I've seen Connor talk for real," said Cam Camper, who had two catches on the final series and finished with a school-record 156 yards receiving in a Hoosiers debut. "It was good to see him keeping us positive after certain plays, telling us it was good and we would get another one. The game kind of brought out Connor being a leader."

Bazelak certainly came to Indiana with solid credentials.

He was 7 of 9 for 80 yards in his first career start, which ended with a torn anterior cruciate ligament in 2019. He returned the next season and was chosen the SEC's co-freshman of the year after topping the 300-yard mark three times, beating LSU and going 5-3 as the starter. Then last year, Bazelak threw 16 TD passes, 11 interceptions and didn't play in Missouri's bowl game, prompting him to search for a new school.

What he found at Indiana was that his quiet demeanor coupled with Allen's excitable personality was a perfect match.

"The things that showed up on Friday night, to me, those things were probably big factors (in the decision)," Allen said. "The poise that he shows in that moment when you have to just kind of have ice in your veins and just go make plays. Even though it was a tough decision, that was the decision and, obviously, he came up big for us and I wasn't surprised."

At least Bazelak succeeded in Week 1 — something that didn't happen last year when the Hoosiers were routed at Iowa. A spate of injuries ensued and the season quickly unraveled.

A repeat seems unlikely now. Indiana (1-0) hosts Idaho (0-1), a Football Championship Subdivision foe, on Saturday and Western Kentucky (1-0) the following week before visiting Cincinnati (0-1). The Hoosiers resume conference play Oct. 1 at Nebraska.

Bazelak, meanwhile, now has three more weeks to fine-tune his timing with his new team and he's already off to a good start.

He went 28 of 52 for 330 yards and one touchdown with one interception, becoming the first Hoosiers quarterback to top the 300-yard mark in his starting debut since Antwaan Randle-El in 1998.

Plus, he led the masterful 12-play, 75-yard drive in the final 2 1/2 minutes against an improving Illinois defense. The result: Indiana snapped an eight-game losing streak, a nine-game skid in conference play, and now is already within one win of matching last year's total.

Bazelak never doubted the Hoosiers could score in the waning moments of the opener.

"We knew we were going to get one more chance, that the defense was going to

come through and we kind of got after it. We had confidence we were going to get it done," he said. "We knew we had the game, we just had to go take it, and I guess we had to do it in style."

What's next?

Indiana can start building some sorely needed momentum. They've started two of the past three seasons with back-to-back wins and received bowl bids both times. The hope is Bazelak continues to excel in a system that he and his new teammates are still learning.

Running back Shaun Shivers, who scored the winning touchdown, played in his first game since transferring from Auburn. Camper spent the previous two seasons in junior college. And former Florida State receiver D.J. Matthews Jr. returned from a torn ACL by catching seven passes for 109 yards, including a 52-yard TD.

"I'm just really trying to keep everyone calm," Bazelak said. "That's our offense. The whole game we're in 2-minute (offense), so we didn't have to do anything special. We knew we had only two timeouts, but when you get in a rhythm in this offense things start to roll."

Molina homers twice in Cards' loss to Nats

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Yadier Molina homered twice on a day he paired with St. Louis Cardinals pitcher Adam Wainwright to tie the major league record of 324 starts by a battery in an 11-6 loss to the Washington Nationals on Thursday.

Alex Call had four hits and five RBIs for Washington, including a three-run homer off James Naile in the ninth.

"Guys are stingy with throwing balls down the middle here, there's no doubt about that, but they still throw them," Call said. "They still throw pitches that you can hit, so just being able to adjust and being ready for it no matter what, that's the key."

Wainwright and Molina matched the mark set by Detroit's Mickey Lolich and Bill Freehan from 1963-75.

"It's been a good run," Wainwright said. "He's an incredible teammate, friend, and partner in crime. We've been together for a long time. So, you know, we got to finish strong."

Molina hit a two-run homer into the third deck in left field in the third and a solo shot just over the wall in the fourth. It was the ninth career

multi-homer game for Molina and his first since April 17, 2021, at Philadelphia.

"We're in a good position, we're having fun," Molina said.

Wainwright allowed four runs and nine hits in five innings. It was the second-straight subpar start for Wainwright, who said his mechanics are off.

"The timing of the upper and lower half are just totally off," Wainwright said. "So throwing a lot of middle pitches, throwing a lot of pitches a foot outside you can't swing at, falling behind way too many accounts."

Cardinals manager Oliver Marmol has confidence that Wainwright will make the necessary adjustments quickly.

"I just sat down with our pitching guys and walked through it," Marmol said. "We'll address it in his next pen and go from there, but we're in a good spot."

The 41-year-old Wainwright and 40-year-old Molina got a standing ovation from the crowd of 40,437 as they made their way in from the bullpen moments before first pitch, and another after the top of the first inning. Wainwright and Molina are on track to break the record at home against Milwaukee

on Sept. 14.

"Just to do it with him and we're going to do it here at Busch, it's going to be special for us," Molina said.

The pair have totaled 13 All-Star Game appearances, and the Cardinals have reached the postseason in 11 of the 17 seasons the two have been on the roster.

César Hernández drove in three runs and Luis García broke a 4-4 tie with sixth-inning infield single off Jordan Hicks, who had relieved Andre Pallante (6-5). The Nationals had 18 hits and earned a four-game split.

Nationals starter Josiah Gray gave up four runs in 3 1/3 innings. Mason Thompson (1-0), Andrés Machado, Kyle Finnegan, Jake McGee and Carl Edwards Jr. combined for 5 2/3 innings in relief.

"It was awesome," Nationals manager Dave Martinez said. "We struggled the first couple of innings, Josiah just couldn't find the plate, but the boys hung in there. We scored some runs. I can't say enough of how they play. I always say these guys will always play hard for 27 outs. Today's the perfect example."

St. Louis lost for just the fourth time in their last 24 home games.

"It was very special, mostly because it was unexpected," Castro said of their moment in August 2021. "I had so many mixed emotions. I was so nervous, getting to meet him, but it was special. It was something I'll never forget."

For all his success, and the millions of dollars he's made, the story of Albert Pujols remains downright Dickensian.

He was raised mostly by his grandmother and a large collection of aunts and uncles in Santo Domingo, the capital on the southern coast of the Dominican Republic. And when he speaks of his humble roots, Pujols often recalls using a makeshift glove fashioned out of a milk crate and whatever fruit was available to practice the game he grew to love.

Pujols immigrated with his family to New York in 1996, then moved to the Kansas City suburb of Independence, where his high school coach at Fort Osage, Dave Fry, once called him "a gift from the baseball gods."

Nothing he's done over the next two decades could persuade anyone otherwise.

Pujols played briefly for Maple Woods Community College before he was drafted by St. Louis — much to the everlasting chagrin of Royals fans. They still lament the fact that an 11-time All-Star, who grew up in the shadow of Kauffman Stadium, would win two World Series and play the majority of his career for the cross-state Cardinals.

Along the way, Pujols showed Latino players from the most modest of backgrounds that they could be something.

"Pujols is someone that not only I but my entire country, we admire a lot. We respect him deeply," said 23-year-old Pirates shortstop Oneil Cruz, who grew up down the coast from Santo Domingo in the small city of Nizao. "Something that I've admired most out of Pujols is that the goals he sets, he achieves them. As a young ballplayer, that speaks measures to me, because it shows me that I'm able to do this."

To the surprise of many, Pujols is still doing it.

After three National League MVPs, six Silver Sluggers and two Gold Gloves, it seemed as if time was finally catching up to the 42-year-old Pujols. The decade he spent playing for the Los Angeles Angels was a largely underwhelming coda to the 12 superlative

years he spent in St. Louis, and many believed the stint he played with the Dodgers that culminated in a trip to the NL Championship Series last year was a fitting way to head off into retirement.

Pujols had other ideas, though. He wanted to return to St. Louis, where he remained beloved by fans, and reunite with longtime pitcher Adam Wainwright and catcher Yadier Molina for one last run.

And here they are: first place in the NL Central as they march through the final month of the regular season.

Pujols has played a big part in it, too. He was hitting .266 with 16 homers and 43 RBIs entering Thursday's game against Washington, leaving him five homers shy of joining Barry Bonds, Hank Aaron and Babe Ruth in the 700 club.

"I'm happy he's healthy and doing what he knows he can do," Molina said, while on TVs around the Cardinals clubhouse, a panel on MLB Network debated the topic: "Is Albert Pujols the best baseball player of this century?"

"It would be special for every guy here in the clubhouse," Molina said of the 700 milestone. "I hope he can do it."

Regardless of whether he does, Pujols insists this will be his final season. Yet rather than doing a victory lap around the league, and getting feted everywhere he plays, Pujols has taken a businesslike approach to every night at the park.

Still, there are moments when the magnitude of it all has caught up to him. One came last week, when Pujols was called upon to pinch hit against the longtime-rival Chicago Cubs, and he stepped out of the dugout to a Busch Stadium roar.

"I've been energized by these fans for 12 years in my career, including the playoffs, but on Friday, I felt something different," Pujols admitted a couple of days later. "I don't know what it was, but I felt it. I shared it with my family, and I shared it with my kids who were here, and I was like, 'Wow, this was different.'"

It was a moment that felt different for a lot of people in the ballpark that night.

Then again, Pujols has always been a different player.

"There are times when you take a step back from being locked into the game and you get to be a fan for a minute, and experience it the way everybody else does, and that was one of them," Cardinals manager Oliver Marmol said. "You take a moment and take it all in because what he's doing is absolutely incredible."

The contract includes a different tier for any buyout if Swinney were leave to coach his alma mater, Alabama — \$9 million to join the Crimson Tide this year, but just \$6 million for any other college head coaching job. Those figures are reduced, but

remain different, as the contract continues.

Swinney wouldn't owe anything if he left to become an NFL head coach.

Clemson would have to pay Swinney \$64 million if it dismissed him without cause, a figure that decreases throughout the length of the deal.

There are several contract performance bonuses, including

\$350,000 for a national title and \$200,000 for an ACC championship. Swinney would get \$100,000 if his team's Academic Progress Rate reaches 975 out of 1,000, according to the NCAA's scale that tracks academic performance.

Swinney was elevated to interim head coach in 2008 at midseason when Tommy Bowden was let go. Then the

receivers' coach, Swinney went 4-2 down the stretch to earn the full-time job.

The Tigers reached their first ACC championship game in 2009, then won the title two years later. In 2015, Clemson began a run of six straight league crowns and six consecutive CFP berths.

The Tigers have had 11 straight seasons of 10 wins or more.

"I'm proud of being part of that generation that changed the way the game was played, the game was perceived, the international players were recognized," Ginobili said. "It was fun to be part of that."

The Spurs drafted Ginobili in 1999, when he was playing in Italy, and it took more than three years for him just to come to the NBA. It's not like San Antonio had made a huge investment: Ginobili was the next-to-last pick in his draft class, 57th out of 58. And most of the players taken in the bottom 15 picks of that draft never played a single game in the NBA.

But in 2002, he showed up. With his Eurostep.

"I didn't know what the hell it was," Spurs coach Gregg Popovich said. "But it didn't look right."

Turns out, it was legal and lethal. The true measure of whether a move has captured the attention of NBA players comes by seeing if others have copied it and tried to put it into their own repertoires. And that's been happening for two decades

now.

Nobody knows for sure how the move truly originated, and Ginobili insists that he didn't create it, either. The commonly held belief is that Lithuanian great Sarunas Marciulionis — a Hall of Famer himself, class of 2014 — brought it to the NBA.

But there isn't much argument that Ginobili is the one who made it popular. Thing is, he can't teach it very well, despite being asked countless times to do so over the years.

"I couldn't exactly explain it," Ginobili said. "Some basics of it, yes, but it was super natural, it was super instinctive."

It's not the move that got Ginobili into the Hall, though. It was the winning.

When Ginobili played, the Spurs won. It's that simple. They were 762-295 when Ginobili appeared during the regular season. That winning percentage of 72.1% is just a smidge better than the 71.9% posted by Duncan, who went into the Hall in 2020 and, fittingly, will present Ginobili this weekend.

Ginobili is one of two players (Bill Bradley being the other) to have won championships in the NBA, the Euroleague and the Olympics. He got four rings with

the Spurs, the Euroleague title with Italian club Kinder Bologna in 2001, then led his native Argentina to Olympic gold at Athens in 2004. Ginobili had 29 points in the semi-final win over the U.S., outplaying everybody else who was on the court that day, Duncan included. The Americans haven't settled for anything less than gold at any of the four Olympics that have been played since.

"It's not just about individual accomplishments," Ginobili said. "I never won a scoring championship, an MVP, even first-team. I'm here because of my surroundings, of the players I play with, of the coaches I've been coached with, and the organizations. I know I've been very lucky to have played with such teammates ... so definitely, I don't take it as an individual achievement. It's just that I've been in the right place, in the right time."

Case in point: San Antonio.

Ginobili didn't know what, or even where, San Antonio was when he first went there. He never left — it's still home for Ginobili and his family. He works for the Spurs now, drives his three kids to and from school, takes them to Argentina for time

with family every summer, and then it's back to San Antonio.

"I didn't know how I was going to pair up with Tony and Tim, play with David Robinson, being coached by Pop, so yeah, full of uncertainties," Ginobili said. "And I wanted to do good, I wanted to help, I wanted to grow, but I wasn't the No. 1, first pick, right? I was 57, so I knew that the odds of me staying for long here were not with me because it doesn't usually happen. So, it turned out to be an incredible story and enjoyed 16 wonderful years."

There's another place that Ginobili hasn't been: Springfield, Massachusetts.

He was with Duncan for his enshrinement two years ago, but because of the pandemic, that ceremony took place at a casino in Uncasville, Connecticut. Ginobili didn't get to Springfield on that trip.

He's there now. Forever.

"We knew we had a wild, competitive, young man who was in love with basketball and was quite athletic and just fierce," Popovich said. "Just seemed to have no fear and do whatever it might be that he needed to do to win. He was a force of nature."

Wainwright, Molina tie MLB record for batterymates

Molina are scheduled to break the record against the Milwaukee Brewers on Sept. 14.

The duo made their first start together on April 6, 2007, at Houston. Wainwright notched his first of 212 wins as a starter with Molina as his catcher, which is a major league record for batterymates.

Molina, 40, will retire at the end of the season, but Wainwright, 41, has not publicly announced a decision on his plans for 2023.

Molina debuted in 2004. Wainwright broke

into the majors in 2005, but was used mostly as a reliever his first two seasons.

Notably, Wainwright struck out Carlos Beltrán to clinch the 2006 NLCS and Brandon Inge to clinch the 2006 World Series, both with Molina behind the plate.

Wainwright and Molina have 13 total All-Star Game appearances between them. The Cardinals have reached the postseason in 11 of the 17 seasons that the two have been on the roster.

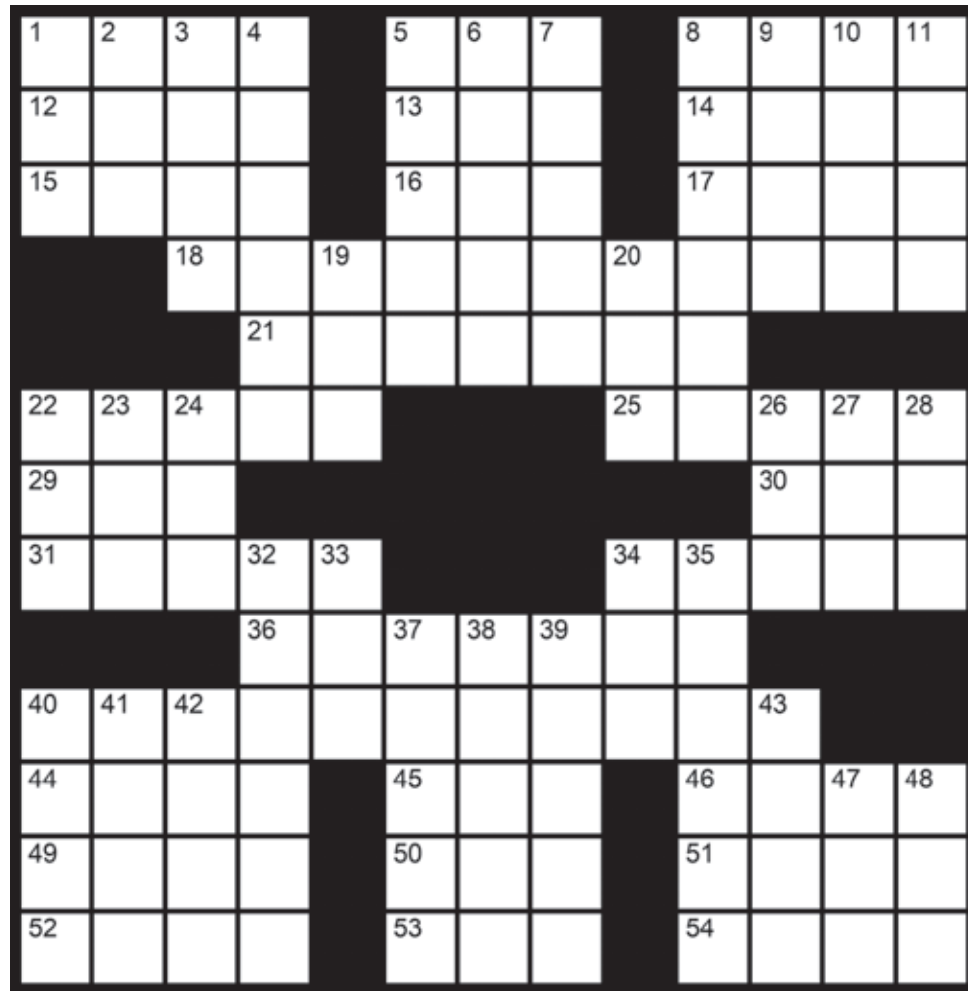
