Historic McVey School to host open house

Doors open for Homecoming weekend

McVey School No. 31, fondly known in Pettis County as the Little Red Schoolhouse, is sporting a new coat of red paint and is cleaned and dusted just in time for Homecoming weekend and a unique open house on Sunday.

Over the last year, the

one-room school was refurbished by the Rea and Broyles families. The inside of the school was also cleaned and dusted, and on Wednesday, Sherry Broyles was busy hanging handmade curtains on its bare windows. Constructed in 1886, the school closed its doors for the last time in 1956. The Pettis County Historical Society main-

tains the school, which is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Broyles noted they finished refurbishing the building recently. Her daughter and son-in-law, Sarah and Brad Rea, hired a friend to paint the highest portions of the building. And proving teamwork is invaluable, Mike's Tree Service, of Sedalia, stopped

and allowed the painter to use its bucket lift.

"The guy just parked the truck, took his bucket, and put him (the painter) right over, and he was able to paint it in half the time," Broyles explained, laughing. "I just thought it's that kind of teamwork I love. It was almost like the cavalry had arrived."

Business owners express concerns over Mercy Rest Stop

Local business owners are planning on expressing their concerns with the proposed Mercy Rest Stop at the Sedalia Planning and Zoning Commission meeting next Wednesday evening.

The Mercy Rest Stop was announced in January 2021. When the project began, the plans were to "provide the homeless and nearly homeless with the 'necessities of life' such as 24/7 sanitary restroom facilities, a 24/7 water source, showers, laundry, cooling and warming stations, and a place for resources and communication, plus a place to meet agency caseworkers to obtain assistance."

It was originally planned for 314 W. Benton St. next to the Open Door Kitchen, but after residents in that area expressed concerns about the location and the 24/7 restroom access, City of Sedalia representatives began working with the Mercy Rest Stop Coalition to find a new location.

Coalition members have repeatedly said the facility will not be a homeless shelter, but many in the community remain concerned it will cause problems for neighboring homes and

businesses.

Worried the facility would draw even more homeless people downtown, the business owners began talking to each other.

"We started getting concerned learning that it was possibly an overnight shelter sometimes or just something that would bring more homeless into the community," Michelle Quattlebaum, owner of The Venue, said Wednesday. "Honestly, it's just been like word on the street, there's a lot of back and forth. A lot of people didn't really know all the details, so we started reaching out to each other. 'Have you heard about this? Have you heard about that?'"

Last month, the City of Sedalia notified the Mercy Rest Stop Coalition that it intended to donate the property at 669 E. Third St. for the proposed project. But until planning and zoning issues are clarified by ordinance, building permits cannot be issued. That didn't stop local business owners from worrying.

The Venue hosts weddings and receptions, which often run late into the evening, and Quattlebaum has had issues in the past with panhandlers and vandals.

Casino Night started in 2019, with all the funds going to serve the club's programs and the services the club provides.

"It's going to help us get any of the supplies

that we need," White said. "We also have our Whatever It Takes. People can donate money that evening, which will go to our Whatever It Takes that supports scholarships for kids."

That scholarship is for kids whose families can't afford to send them to the Boys & Girls Club; it will cover their tuition for the club.

Knob Noster State Park to host History Halloweenfest

WARRENSBURG — Goblins and ghouls of all ages will be taking a hike through history as Knob Noster State Park celebrates the 76th anniversary of its founding.

The annual History Halloweenfest celebration will be from 2 to 8 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 15 at Camp Bobwhite, located off Highway DD. It is free and open to all ages.

"We get between 600 and 1,000 visitors each year for this event," Park Superintendent Daniel Brigman said.

Activities include Halloween games, a self-guided spooky hike, Oddities in Nature, crafts, face painting, an obstacle course for kids, Lions Club food, and a Knob Noster Revitalization vendor.

"This year (the History Hike) will basically be a self-guided hike," Brigman said. "You can go back to some older buildings and take a look. Just get an idea of the camp and the history behind the park's founding."

Brigman said visitors can come and go as they please, but several activities do have time restrictions.

The self-guided history and spooky scavenger hunt will be from 2 to 6 p.m. The Lakeside Nature Center animal program will be from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m.

Hayrides will take place about every 45 minutes from 2 to 7 p.m. Each ride will be limited to approximately 25 people.

The Frosty Morn Trio will perform traditional acoustic music from 2:30 to 4:30 p.m. at the Bobwhite Amphitheater. From 7 to 8 p.m., storyteller Jim "Two Crows" Wallen will be at the Bobwhite Amphitheater.

Boy Scout Troop 509 will be selling popcorn.

Brigman said he doesn't have a favorite part and enjoys all aspects of the event.

"We've been doing it since 2014 and it's been fun every single year," Brigman said. "I think the most popular part of it is the hayride or the tram ride that we do and that's because people don't normally get back to parts of the park that we visit ... and they're getting a kind of a backstory about the park."

Though construction was delayed by World War II, the Missouri State Park Board was given control of the area by the National Park Service in 1946 and the name Knob Noster State Park was officially adopted in 1947.

The park is home to miles of walking and equestrian trails, as well as camping, kayaking and fishing.

PASTOR’S PULPIT

Taking time to stop and listen

There is an old adage that states, “God gave us two ears — to listen more and to talk less.” Most of us claim to hear others when they speak, yet are often afflicted with a disease called “selective hearing.” This accusation may just buck you up when you are accused by someone of not listening. I have heard many times out of the mouths of others, including myself, the following words: “Well, I am listening to you now!” I would hope that is true. But the question is, do you really take the time and really listen when others are speaking?

Listening is easy for us who can hear well. Those with hearing disabilities are limited in hearing, yet for the great majority of us, that is not a problem. We can hear alright — the noisy kid in the restaurant, the obnoxious teen racing his car down a quiet street, or someone in our house playing a television or stereo way too loud. Yep, I imagine we can hear well when things like that are going on around us.

That is not what I am talking about. Everyday noises aside, what I am talking about specifically is human interaction — someone, be it a loved one, a spouse, a customer, or a colleague, is communicating something vitally important — at least they consider those words and ideas as important. Are we, at that moment, really listening? Or are we treating them like all the background noise that we ultimately filter out?

Among other things, I am a trained counselor. My training requires me to learn the steps to appropriate listening like 1) face the one who is talking with you; 2) make mental notes of their message; 3) reassure the one speaking that you are listening by the cues of nodding or saying “yes;” and 4) summarize back what the person just said.

There is something missing from this list, however, that all of us need to consider. I have often sat with people who share with me their day. Sometimes I hear complaints like, “others do not listen to me!” Most of the time, the complaint was all about minutia. But every once in a while, the complaint was about a rushed and

hurried person who in haste was trying to get through their day — and the person I am talking with really wanted them to listen. Really listen. They wanted some of the other’s time and attention — and did not get it — the last element and all-important part of listening effectively.

There is someone who wants to speak to all of us. One who is attempting to get our undivided attention. One who has given His all, in sacrifice for the ability to have a moment of our time. Many reading this have never availed themselves of the opportunity to speak with Him and do not know of His love and grace. Jesus came that we could have life, and that there would always be someone who would listen to us no matter what the circumstances. He always stops to listen to our concerns, our needs, our wants, and our fears. He is always a prayer away.

Take the time today, stop, and then listen to others. You may be surprised at what you hear. And while you are at it, take some time to ask the Lord to speak with you. You may be surprised to hear what He has to say as well.

Jan. 6 committee schedules next public hearing for Oct. 13

WASHINGTON (AP) — The House committee investigating the Jan. 6 attack on the U.S. Capitol has scheduled its next hearing for Oct. 13, pushing the investigation back into the limelight less than three weeks before the midterm election that will determine control of Congress.

It will be the panel's first public session since the summer, when lawmakers worked through a series of tightly scripted hearings that attracted millions of viewers and touched on nearly every aspect of the Capitol insurrection.

The committee had planned to hold the hearing in late September, but postponed as Hurricane Ian made landfall in Florida.

The panel — comprised of seven Democrats and two Republicans — has not yet provided an agenda, but Rep. Adam Schiff, D-Calif., said recently that the hearing would "tell the story about a key element of Donald Trump's plot to overturn the election."

Democratic Rep. Bennie Thompson, the committee's chairman, told reporters last week that the hearing would touch on recent revelations about Save America PAC, Trump's chief fundraising vehicle. It is facing legal scrutiny after the Justice Department issued a round of grand jury subpoenas that sought information about the political action committee's fundraising practices.

The hearing is also expected to include never-before-seen interview footage of witnesses the committee has deposed since late July. That could include Virginia "Ginni" Thomas, the wife of Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas, who was interviewed last week behind closed doors. The committee probed Thomas about her role in trying to help Trump overturn his election defeat, including her correspondence with White House chief of staff Mark Meadows and lawmakers in Arizona and Wisconsin in the weeks after the 2020 presidential election.

Throughout its initial eight hearings, the committee has sought to show the American public in expansive detail how Trump ignored many of his closest advisers to pursue false claims of election fraud after he lost the election to Democrat Joe Biden, then failed to act when his rhetoric spurred a mob assault on the Capitol.

Some of the more than 1,000 witnesses interviewed by the panel — a number of them Trump's closest allies — recounted in videotaped testimony how the former president sat idly when hundreds of his supporters violently attacked the Capitol as Congress certified Biden's victory on Jan. 6, 2021.

The committee is aiming to wrap up its work by the end of the year and issue a final report and legislative recommendations, but their investigative work is not yet complete as lawmakers

explore several unanswered questions.

Panel members still want to get to the bottom of missing Secret Service texts from Jan. 5-6, 2021, which could shed further light on Trump's actions during the insurrection, particularly after earlier testimony about his confrontation with security as he tried to join supporters at the Capitol. Thompson said earlier this month that the committee has recently obtained "thousands" of documents from the Secret Service.

Congressional investigators have also been interviewing several of Trump's former Cabinet members, some of whom had discussed invoking the Constitution's 25th Amendment to remove Trump from office in the aftermath of the insurrection.

Another decision for the committee is how aggressively to pursue testimony from Trump and former Vice President Mike Pence. Some members have downplayed the value of taking that step and time is running short to request their testimony.

The panel will have to wrap up the loose ends by the end of the year when the select committee status expires.

If Republicans take the majority in November's elections, they are expected to dissolve the committee in January. The panel plans to issue a final report by the end of December that will include legislative reforms it says would help prevent future attempts to subvert democracy.

Amid end to COVID help, homelessness surging in many cities

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — In California's capital, massive tent encampments have risen along the American River and highway overpasses have become havens for homeless people, whose numbers have jumped a staggering nearly 70% over two years.

Among the 9,300 without a home is Eric Santos, who lost his job at a brewery and was evicted from his apartment in July. Now he carries a list of places where free meals are available and a bucket to mix soap and water to wash his hands, and to sit on.

"The bucket is part of my life now," the 42-year-old said, calling it his version of Wilson, the volleyball that becomes Tom Hanks' companion in the film "Castaway."

Cities big and small around the country are facing a similar experience to Sacramento.

Fueled by a long-running housing shortage, rising rent prices and the economic hangover from the pandemic, the overall number of homeless in a federal government report to be released in coming months is expected to be higher than the 580,000 unhoused before the coronavirus outbreak, the National Alliance to End Homelessness said.

The Associated Press tallied results from city-by-city Point in Time surveys conducted earlier this year and found the number of people without homes is up overall compared with 2020

in areas reporting results so far.

Some of the biggest increases are in West Coast cities such as Sacramento and Portland, Oregon, where growing homelessness has become a humanitarian crisis and political football. Numbers are also up in South Dakota, Prince George's County, Maryland, and Asheville, North Carolina.

Research has shown places seeing spikes in homelessness often lack affordable housing. Making matters worse, pandemic government relief programs — including anti-eviction measures, emergency rental assistance and a child tax credit that kept people housed who may have been on the streets otherwise — are ending.

In Sacramento, where rents are soaring and officials disagree on how best to deal with the problem, homelessness has jumped 68% from 2020 to 2022 — the most among larger cities reporting results so far.

The surge has been driven in part by the city's legacy of being more affordable than other California cities, which has attracted new residents, overwhelming the housing market.

A Zillow analysis found the average rent in July was \$2,300 — a 28% increase since July 2019, before the pandemic began. Sacramento's median income was about \$70,000 in 2020, according to the U.S. Census Bureau.

Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg has made reducing homelessness a priority since he took office in 2017. But so far, it hasn't been enough.

"People are becoming homeless much faster than we are getting them off the street," Steinberg told the AP.

Steinberg has advocated for adopting a legal right to shelter and a legal obligation for people to accept it when offered. The approach has drawn some criticism from advocates who say it's just a means of taking the problem out of the public eye, without providing meaningful help for those who need it.

County officials voted in August to ban camping along Sacramento's American River Parkway, with a misdemeanor charge for people who don't comply. City voters will decide in

November on a ballot measure requiring the city to open hundreds more shelter beds. But it would only take effect if the county agrees to pony up money for mental health and substance abuse treatment.

Still, the rise in homelessness is not uniform across the country.

In Boston, the number of people sleeping on the streets and in shelters has dropped 25% over two years as advocates focused on finding permanent housing for those on the streets the longest.

In some cities, "housing first" policies intended to move the homeless into permanent homes have paid off. And while the pandemic

brought economic chaos, an eviction moratorium, boosted unemployment payments and family tax credits prevented some people from becoming homeless at all.

Along with Boston, numbers have fallen sharply in Houston, Philadelphia and Washington, D.C. Even in California, homeless counts are down in San Francisco, and growth has slowed significantly in Los Angeles.

In Boston, Steven Hamilton moved into a new apartment in September after decades staying on a friend or relative's couch or in a homeless shelter.

With the help of a program run by the Boston Medical Center, he was able

to get a subsidized apartment in a public housing development. His portion of monthly rent is \$281 — or about 30% of his Social Security payments.

"I'm grateful," he said.

"I am not looking to move nowhere else. I am going to stay here until eternity. I lost a lot of stuff. I'm not going through that again."

Hamilton's studio apartment is the result of a Boston strategy whereby the city and area nonprofits use extensive outreach to get people who've been on the streets for over a year into apartments and then provide services such as drug treatment and life-skills training like budgeting with the help of case managers.

New survey suggests little progress against U.S. teen vaping

NEW YORK (AP) — The latest government study on teen vaping suggests there's been little progress in keeping e-cigarettes out of the hands of kids.

The data seems to show more high school students vaping, with 14% saying they had done so recently, according to survey results released Thursday. In last year's survey, about 11% said they had vaped recently.

But experts cautioned that a change in the survey makes it difficult to compare the two: This year, a much higher percentage of participants took the survey in schools, and vaping tends to be reported more in schools than in homes.

"It continues to be diffi-

cult to assess (vaping) trends since the pandemic," said Alyssa Harlow, a University of Southern California researcher who studies youth e-cigarette use.

Educators say vaping is still a big problem.

Anecdotal, the 2021-2022 school year was worse than it was before the pandemic, said Mike Rinaldi, principal of Westhill High School in Stamford, Connecticut. That school year was the first when most kids returned from remote learning following COVID-19 lockdowns, noted Rinaldi, who speculated that many kids may have taken up vaping as they dealt with mental health issues or stress related to the pandemic.

Kids vaping in school bathrooms and stairwells remains "a constant battle," said Matt Forker, principal of the nearby Stamford High

School.

Centers for Disease Control and Prevention researchers authored the new study, which is based on a Jan. 18 to May 31 online survey of about 28,000 U.S. middle and high school students.

The study asked about use of e-cigarettes and other vaping devices in the previous 30 days. In addition to the 14% of high school students who said they vaped recently, about 3% of middle schoolers said they had done so.

Of those who vaped, about 28% said they did it every day.

Nearly 85% of the youth who vaped used flavored products. Favored brands included Puff Bar and Vuse, followed by Hyde and Smok.

Despite its persistence, vaping appears to be less popular than it was: In 2019, 28% of high schoolers said they had recently vaped.

In the last three years, federal and state laws and regulations have raised the purchase age for tobacco and vaping products, and banned nearly all teen-preferred flavors from small, cartridge-based e-cigarettes.

Some kids also may have been scared away by a 2019 outbreak of vaping-related illnesses and deaths — most of them tied to a filler in black market vaping liquids that contained THC, the chemical that makes marijuana users feel high.

Leaders of one advocacy group said they worry the battle to diminish youth vaping is not going well.

The numbers "may not reflect the much larger reality of youth e-cigarette use that we hear about on a daily basis from parents, teachers, pediatricians, and

prevention specialists who are experiencing this urgent and ongoing adolescent public-health crisis," the group, Parents Against Vaping E-Cigarettes, said in a statement.

The FDA has struggled to regulate the sprawling vaping landscape, which includes both established companies and smaller startups. The agency has been pilloried by Congress and health advocates for missing multiple deadlines to issue decisions on millions of vaping products submitted by companies hoping to stay on the market for adults.

The FDA tried to ban the leading e-cigarette maker Juul's products earlier this summer, citing questions about its potential health risks. But it's been forced to put that effort on hold following a court challenge.

In this year's survey, about one-fifth of teens who vape reported recently using Juul, though it was no longer a favorite brand. That's a big shift from 2019, when more than half of teens reported Juul as their usual brand.

Instead, many young people have migrated to e-cigarettes delivering laboratory-made nicotine, a loophole in FDA's oversight that Congress closed this year. Despite gaining new authority over those products, the FDA missed a mid-July deadline to issue decisions on millions of products, including disposable Puff Bar e-cigarettes.

Like some other companies, Puff Bar reformulated its fruit and candy-flavored vapes last year to use laboratory-made nicotine in a bid to skirt FDA oversight.

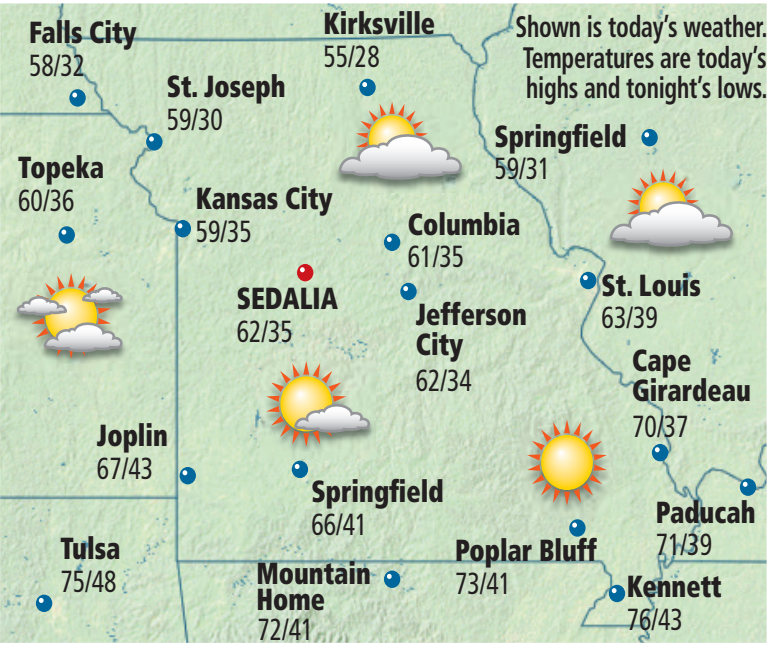

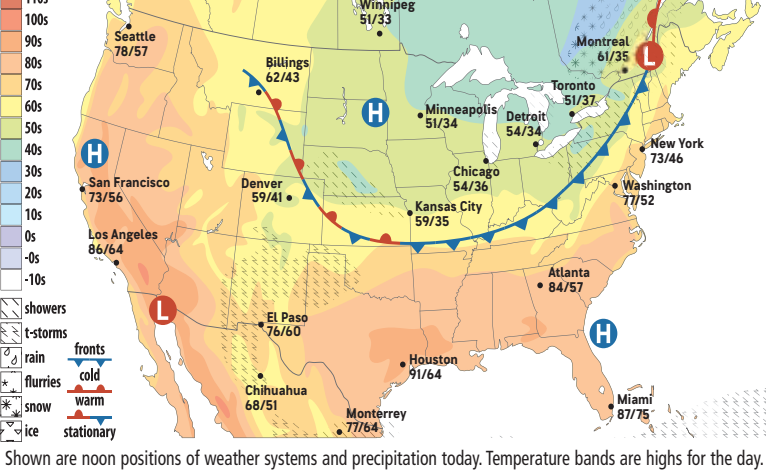

To fill teacher jobs, community colleges offer new degrees

In her second-grade classroom outside Seattle, Fatima Nuñez Ardon often tells her students stories about everyday people realizing their dreams. One day, for example, she talked about Salvadoran American NASA astronaut Francisco Rubio and his journey to the International Space Station.

Another day, she told them her own life story — how she, an El Salvadoran immigrant who arrived in the U.S. in middle school speaking very little English, came to be a teacher.

Nuñez Ardon took an unusual path to the classroom: She earned her teaching degree through evening classes at a community college, while living at home and raising her four children.

Community college-based teaching programs like this are rare, but growing. They can dramatically cut the cost and raise the convenience of earning a teaching degree, while making a job in education accessible to a wider diversity of people.

In Washington state, nine community colleges offer education degrees for teaching grade school and up. All of the programs started within the last decade.

Around the country,

education programs remain far more common at four-year institutions. Six other states — Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Nevada and New Mexico — have community colleges that offer degrees related to K-12 education, according to Community College Baccalaureate Association data.

The expansion comes at a good time: Teacher shortages have worsened in the past decade, and fewer undergraduates are going into teacher training programs. The number of people completing a teacher-education program declined by almost a third between the 2008-09 and 2018-19 academic years, according to a report in March from the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education.

More community colleges around the country are starting to offer teacher education, said CCBA President Angela Kersensbrock. In all, 51 community college-based teaching programs have launched across the country since the early 2000s.

And they're attracting students like Nuñez Ardon, who became certified to run a K-8 classroom in June, at the age of 36. It's likely she wouldn't have pursued a classroom career otherwise.

Teacher shortages predate the pandemic.

For years, the number of people graduating from teacher education programs has fallen short of demand. In 2018, 57,000 fewer students nationwide earned education degrees than in 2011.

To fill gaps in staffing, schools in Washington state have had to turn to underqualified employees. The number of waivers granted for staff who had not completed certification requirements rose to 8,080 in the 2019-2020 school year, from less than 2,800 a decade prior, according to a 2021 report from the state's Professional Educator Standards Board.

The state in recent years has encouraged "Grow Your Own" programs, or alternative pathways to classroom certification. Some are run by schools, others by colleges. They're seen as a way to buffer the teacher shortage and to grow a workforce more representative of the student body. Statewide, 50% of Washington students are people of color, while 87% of classroom teachers are white.

At Yakima Valley College, like other Washington community colleges, teacher candidates are assigned a residency at a partner school for the second half of the two-year program.

Students must first have an associate degree before

starting the program. Classes are primarily in the evenings. While juggling their work and school load, teacher candidates are also taking a series of tests required by the state to get certified.

"By the time they finish their residency, they have fulfilled all of their requirements not only of the program but also of the state," said Elizabeth Paulino, who runs Yakima Valley College's teacher education program.

There has been pushback against community college degree programs in education in Washington and nationally, as universities with teacher education programs grapple with declines in enrollment, said Debra Bragg, the founder and former director of the University of Washington's Community College Research Initiatives.

Community colleges argue that they're a good place for teacher training because they're open-access — there is no selective admissions process — and that they "are attracting students that the universities probably are not attracting and probably won't attract," she said.

Nuñez Ardon said this was the case for her.

For one thing, she was place-bound by her growing family, and the nearby University of Washington doesn't offer a bachelor's degree in teacher educa-

tion. Cost was another factor. The program Nuñez Ardon attended at Highline College costs roughly \$7,100 a year — far less than nearby universities — and allowed her to live at home and accommodated her work schedule.

Many education programs at Washington community colleges grew in response to demand from local schools.

Connie Smejkal, Centralia College's dean of teacher education, said area superintendents were calling frequently to say they were struggling to hire and retain teachers.

"Their need was extraordinary," she said.

In 2016, Centralia and Grays Harbor community colleges launched a teacher education program in collaboration, anticipating that neither would have enough students to run a full program on their own. Each planned to have an initial cohort of 12 teacher candidates. But student interest was high: There were more than 80 applicants to Centralia alone for the first cohort.

"We realized how thirsty the community was to become teachers," Smejkal said. The next year, Centralia and Grays Harbor formed their own separate programs, and between the two schools, 175 people have completed degrees.

Smejkal said everyone from last year's cohort who was interested in classroom teaching had signed a contract with a school before graduating.

Peter Finch, superintendent of West Valley School District in Yakima, said he's experienced no shortage of general education teachers since the launch of Yakima Valley College's program.

He also said the teachers hired from the local program have so far been predominantly Latinx, and half had been bilingual Spanish-English speakers, better matching the district's student demographic and support needs.

Meanwhile, Nuñez Ardon spends her days at Madrona Elementary School in SeaTac as a teacher and role model to young students she sees herself in — and in whom she hopes to inspire the same curiosity and passion to learn.

White said that in 2021, the club raised around \$20,000 at the event but hopes to raise even more this year.

"Unfortunately, I've actually had to have the police involved a few times after the events or weddings," Quattlebaum said. "We had a couple of women that were out there loading their vehicle and had multiple men standing around them asking for money. That's a very uncomfortable situation to be in. I had to go out there and ask them to leave and to please stop coming. I understand that they were looking for help, but they can't come up to women by themselves in dark parking lots."

Other times, vandals spray-painted the side of The Venue and other buildings along with dumpsters.

Informal research into homeless shelters and accompanying crime has Quattlebaum alarmed about the Mercy Rest Stop.

"We have a train station here, so I feel like that would help to bring more people in," Quattlebaum said. "I've done a lot of research about surrounding towns and their homeless shelters. They deal a lot with women sexually soliciting themselves outside, drug trafficking going on, and then running out of space for all the people that are trying to find shelter, then they end up just spreading out throughout the town to try to find shelter for the night."

Sedalia Police Chief Matt Wirt told the Democrat the people bothering guests at The Venue were residents of a nearby apartment that broke into cars and hassled people. They have since moved and those problems have ended.

"If there's someone or something that is suspicious, if there is someone on property they're not supposed to be, never hesitate to call the police so we can go check it out," Wirt said. "The community, our eyes and ears, we need

their help. Call us if there's a problem, if there's someone creating a disturbance or trespassing. Please call us so we can go take care of the problem. That helps us know where the issues lie."

Debra Andresen said homeless people frequently loiter about the Katy Depot, a State-run facility that must allow public access.

"Here at the depot, we've had several incidents that has happened throughout the years. So for one example, is a gentleman went back into the museum and he was shooting up with heroin. The police came and they arrested him," Andresen recalled. "We've had individuals come that steal, are maybe on drugs because they're talking to themselves and acting very erratically, and then of course when they come in, it makes you feel very uncomfortable as an employee not knowing how they're going to act. We even have homeless sleeping on the benches at night here at the depot."

Andresen said she thinks the Mercy Rest Stop, which is now proposed to be across the street from the Katy Depot, may compound the homeless problem.

"My concern is if we bring in the Mercy Rest Stop (that is open) from 8 to 5, you're still going to have those individuals that are going to be out in the community and wander. Where are they going to be?" Andresen asked. "I've reached out to Warrensburg and was talking to them because I wanted to get a little bit of statistics and facts about what they're experiencing. They've had (shelters) for five years and within those five years, they have seen their homeless population increase. They have been getting homeless from surrounding communities, even from Kansas City."

Downtown business owners like Mark Quattlebaum, Michelle's husband, don't want to seem unwelcoming to anyone, even homeless people, but say

giving can be complicated.

"I don't want to be misunderstood," Mark said. "I'm all for helping people, have no problem helping people, I have no problem donating money towards organizations that will help people. We have done so in the past and will do so in the future. But there are plenty of businesses already set up in this city, CASA, Katy Trail, Compass, Burrell, plenty of business and job centers. There are plenty of avenues for people to get help. I just don't want to enable the bad characters."

He sees an influx of homeless people walk past his business every day and wonders if anything can stem the tide.

"It's a big concern for me just as far as safety downtown," Mark said. "The proposed location I have reservations with because it is within a mile of three different schools, Sacred Heart, Washington Elementary and Sedalia Junior High. What we see walking by our business every day, the type of people that are coming off the trains. I've seen an influx of new faces arriving in Sedalia, the backpacks, the shopping carts, staying the night in Maple Leaf Park and sleeping on benches."

Michelle hopes other concerned business owners will join her at 5:30 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 12 at City Hall for the Planning and Zoning meeting, which is open for public comment.

"I would like more business owners and residents of downtown to show up and speak their concerns and feel comfortable speaking," Quattlebaum said. "I feel like this is a hard situation, no one wants to sound like they don't want to help. But if you bring the reality of what's going to happen, I think if more people would just speak up. Would you feel comfortable with a homeless shelter being put into your backyard?"

US to begin screening travelers coming from Uganda for Ebola

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States will begin screening travelers coming from Uganda for Ebola as an additional precaution aimed at trying to prevent an outbreak in the African country from spreading, the Biden administration said Thursday.

There have been no Ebola cases from the outbreak reported outside Uganda, and the risk in the U.S. is considered low. U.S. officials described the screening move as an additional precaution.

The screenings will begin rolling out immediately. Travelers who have been in Uganda at any point during the past 21 days, which is the incubation period for the virus, will be redirected to one of five U.S. airports for Ebola

screening: Kennedy International Airport in New York, Washington Dulles International Airport, Newark Liberty International Airport in New Jersey, Chicago's O'Hare International Airport and Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport.

The screening applies to any passenger who was in Uganda, including U.S. citizens. It involves a temperature and symptom check conducted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The CDC will also collect contact information that will be shared with local health departments at the travelers' destination.

The administration says about 145 people per day enter the U.S. from Uganda, with most already arriving at the five large airline hubs. Anyone scheduled to fly into a different airport will be rebooked

by their airline, the administration said.

Also Thursday, the CDC sent a health alert to doctors, urging them to get a travel history from patients who have Ebola-like symptoms.

The Ebola virus disease is mainly spread through contact with blood and other bodily fluids of an infected person who is sick or died. Symptoms include fever, vomiting, diarrhea, muscle pain and sometimes bleeding. There are Ebola vaccines, but not for the Sudan strain causing the current outbreak.

This marks the sixth Ebola outbreak in Uganda, but this one has escalated quickly. As of Thursday, there have been 44 confirmed cases and 10 confirmed deaths since the first case was diagnosed Sept. 19.

EXPLAINER: Tax cut trend reaches two-thirds of states

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. (AP) — States brimming with cash are cutting taxes at a rapid pace.

With the enactment Wednesday of an income tax cut in Missouri, about two-thirds of U.S. states have adopted some sort of tax relief in 2022.

For taxpayers, the trend means billions of dollars back in their pockets. Some already have received rebate checks. Others, like those in Missouri, will realize their tax savings over several years.

One-time rebates — typically totaling several hundred dollars per taxpayer — have been more common in Democratic-led states, though some Republican-led states also have provided refunds.

Many Republican-led states have instead opted for permanent income tax rate reductions, sometimes phased in. In such cases, workers might notice a gradual reduction in the amount of taxes withheld from their paychecks — and potentially get a refund when they file their annual income tax returns.

Here's a look at the tax-cutting trend across the U.S.

BUDGET SURPLUSES

Economic shutdowns at the onset of the coronavirus pandemic triggered sharp revenue declines for many states in 2020. But those losses turned out to be short-lived. As the economy recovered, state tax revenues came roaring back. At the same time, the federal government provided billions of dollars

of pandemic relief funds to taxpayers, which helped boost consumer spending. The federal government also provided billions of dollars of aid directly to states, further bolstering their finances.

The 2022 fiscal year, which ended June 30 for most states, marked the second straight year of large growth in tax collections. Many states reported their largest-ever surpluses, according to the National Association of State Budget Officers. That allowed states to enact tax cuts and rebates, even while increasing spending on government programs and services.

TAX RELIEF TRENDS

At least 33 states have approved some form of tax relief this year.

Income tax rate cuts have passed in 14 states. All have Republican-controlled legislatures except New York, where Democrats

who hold power accelerated a previously approved tax rate reduction. At least 15 states have approved one-time rebates from their surpluses, including 10 led by Democratic governors and legislatures, four by Republicans and one — Virginia — with split partisan control.

In addition to general income tax cuts and rebates, some states have approved targeted tax breaks for families or retirees. Others have cut sales taxes on food or suspended gas taxes to help offset the effects of inflation.

Georgia Gov. Brian Kemp signed an order Monday extending the state's gas tax suspension another month, until after the Nov. 8 election. Kemp estimates the state already has forgone about \$800 million in gas tax revenue, which benefits roads. He plans to backfill that by using some of the state's

\$6.6 billion surplus.

MISSOURI TAX CUT

While signing the income-tax-cut legislation Wednesday, Missouri Gov. Mike Parson said the estimated \$760 million reduction, when fully phased in, will be "the largest tax cut in the state's history."

Under previous law, Missouri's top individual income tax rate already was scheduled to fall from 5.3% to 5.2% in January, with the potential to gradually drop to 4.8% if revenue-growth triggers were met in future years. The new law will cut the tax rate to 4.95% in January and exempt the first \$1,000 of income from taxation. The tax rate could drop to 4.8% as soon as 2024, if state tax revenue grows by at least \$175 million over the high mark of the previous three years.

Missouri's new law also authorizes three additional annual tax cuts that could eventually reduce the tax

rate to 4.5%. Each reduction would occur only if state revenue grows by an inflation-adjusted \$200 million over the high mark of the previous three years while also exceeding an inflation-adjusted baseline.

Parson said the cuts amount to a 5% reduction in people's taxes. The nonprofit Missouri Budget Project estimates that a household earning \$30,000 annually would save \$17 next year, and \$29 once the law is fully phased in. For a household earning \$152,000 annually, first-year savings would be \$348 and eventual savings would reach \$759.

Parson also signed a law Wednesday authorizing \$40 million of annual agricultural tax breaks benefitting meat processing facilities, urban farmers and biofuel retailers, among others.

TAX CUT HESITANCY

Some states have bucked the tax-cutting trend. Politically divided government has made agreement difficult among Republicans and Democrats in such states as Minnesota and Wisconsin. But tax relief also has failed in some entirely Republican-led states.

A Republican effort to call a special session of the Montana Legislature to provide tax rebates failed to draw enough support in September.

Oklahoma Gov. Kevin Stitt, a Republican, called the GOP-led state Legislature into a special session in June — and again in September — to consider a sales tax cut for groceries and a reduction in the individual income tax rate. But lawmakers adjourned without passing anything.

West Virginia Gov. Jim Justice, a Republican, also called lawmakers to special session this summer to consider an income tax cut. But the Republican-led Legislature has not passed it. GOP Senate leaders instead have proposed to cut personal property taxes. In November, voters will decide on a constitutional amendment that would allow lawmakers to eliminate property taxes on business equipment and inventory. Justice has spoken against the proposal, saying it could harm schools and counties that rely on property taxes.

BALLOT PROPOSALS

Despite recent tax rebates, voters in some states will be considering ballot measures this November to increase taxes for certain purposes.

California provided rebates between \$200 and \$1,050 this year to individuals earning less than \$250,000 annually and households earning less than \$500,000. A proposition going before voters would impose an additional 1.75% tax on personal income over \$2 million, with the proceeds to fund electric vehicle initiatives and wildfire prevention.

Soaring tax collections in Massachusetts have triggered a decades-old law that will return more than \$2.9 billion to taxpayers, with refund checks expected to begin in November. That same month, voters will consider a proposed tax increase on incomes over \$1 million to benefit education, public transportation and roads.

Colorado accelerated the payment of a constitutionally mandated rebate of \$750 per individual and \$1,500 for couples this year. The checks arrived before a fall election in which voters will weigh a pair of ballot measures — one cutting the income tax rate from 4.55% to 4.4%, the other increasing taxes on income over \$300,000 to benefit school meal programs.

17. FEAR not feat. FEAR is apt. The clue word "great" is redundant with feat, which is defined as an example of greatness: either courage, skill or strength.

1. PRESS not dress. The client's "use of" of the PRESS is a straightforward answer. Grammatically speaking, a dress is worn, not used.

2. HAZY not lazy. The clue uses the future tense (i.e., "I doubt she'll make much progress"), which links up well with someone who is relatively new at the job who could be HAZY regarding new information or details. A lazy worker could have spent lots of time at the job but managed to hide or compensate for their idleness.

3. MONEY not Monet. The MONEY "could be worthless" if it's fake, but even a copy of a Monet "could" still have some value, especially if the frame is an expensive one.

4. SOUR not dour. Although a gloomy (e.g., dour) "teen" could be somewhat concerning, a big "worry" for a "teacher" might well be a SOUR student, since his bad temper could trigger arguments or fights, which are disruptive to a classroom.

5. SLED not shed. "To have a good long look at a photo of" a SLED would be "wise." But one "photo of" an "expensive" shed probably wouldn't be enough information to make a

wise decision since both the interior and exterior of it are factors to consider.

7. COLT not coat. COLT is best. The fact that the word "breeder" is stressed in the clue makes COLT a natural answer. Any horse owner would likely take pride in being complimented on his mare's attractive coat.

8. SEAT not seam. A carpenter's "workmanship" might prove to be shoddy if the SEAT he built ends up breaking (i.e., "gives way") easily.

9. MESS not less. She may have "made" a MESS of a project or a duty assigned to her, but her realization that "she had made" less needs clarification since she is making a comparison and it's unclear what less is in reference to; for example, less pay than a colleague or less salary than a month ago.

11. HOLD not hole. "Working in" the HOLD of a fishing vessel can certainly be confining, but "working in" a hole needs further explanation regarding its size. Large open-pit mines, for example, can have a lot of space.

12. PRINTED not pointed. The "politician" would have grounds for legal action when the "false" news was PRINTED. If it was just word of mouth and not PRINTED, even if pointedly accusatory, the "politician" might not be able to make a legal case out of it.

14. LINE not wine. LINE is best. There's no indication what kind of store the owner has or what kind of product he sells. There are many types of stores that don't sell wine.

At least 66 US clinics have halted abortions, institute says

At least 66 clinics in 15 states have stopped providing abortions since the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, according to an analysis released Thursday.

The number of clinics providing abortions in the 15 states dropped from 79 before the June 24 decision to 13 as of Oct. 2, according to the Guttmacher Institute, a research group that supports abortion rights.

All 13 of the remaining clinics are in Georgia. The other states have no providers offering abortions, though some of their clinics are offering care other than abortions.

Nationally, there were more than 800 abortion clinics in 2020, the institute said.

The new report does not include data on hospitals and physician offices that provided abortion and stopped them after the court ruling, but Guttmacher researcher Rachel Jones noted that clinics provide most U.S. abortions, including procedures and dispensing abortion medication. Recent Guttmacher data show just over half of U.S. abortions are done with medication.

States without abortion providers are concentrated in the South.

Dr. Jeanne Corwin, who provides abortions in Indiana and Ohio, said clinic closures harm "women's physical health, mental health and financial health."

In several states, access is under threat because bans were put on hold only temporarily by court injunctions. These include Indiana, Ohio and South Carolina, the analysis found.

"It is precarious from a medical standpoint and certainly from a business standpoint," said Dr. Katie McHugh, an OB-GYN who provides abortions in Indiana. "It's difficult to keep the doors open and the lights on when you don't know if you're going to be a felon tomorrow."

Biden and DeSantis join together in Ian recovery effort

FORT MYERS, Florida (AP) — President Joe Biden surveyed the devastation of hurricane-ravaged Florida on Wednesday, promising to marshal the power of the federal government to help rebuild as he comforted local residents alongside Republican Gov. Ron DeSantis, a potential 2024 foe.

Biden praised DeSantis' handling of the storm recovery as both men — who have battled over pandemic protocols and migration as the governor mulls a presidential bid — put aside politics for a few days. The state is struggling to recover from the wreckage of Hurricane Ian, which tore through southwestern Florida last week and left dozens dead.

"Today we have one job and only one job, and that's to make sure the people in Florida get everything they need to fully, thoroughly recover," Biden said in a community that bore the brunt of Ian's assault. He warned that the rebuilding effort will take months or years.

"It's going to take a hell of a long time, hopefully without any snags in the way," he said as DeSantis stood behind him, hands folded as he squinted into the glaring sunlight. "Later, after the television cameras have moved on, we're still going to be here with you."

The days after Ian's landfall in Florida have prompted a temporary détente between Biden and DeSantis, who had spoken on the phone at least three times to coordinate recovery efforts. They spent part of Wednesday meeting with area residents and, for Biden, absorbing the full scope of

Ian's devastation.

After Biden and first lady Jill Biden arrived earlier at Fisherman's Wharf — where homes and businesses lay in ruins amid debris and muck — DeSantis offered his hand to the president for a shake. Next to them as they spoke was a boat that the storm had lifted into a cafe.

The solidarity, however fleeting, continued Wednesday afternoon when DeSantis formally welcomed Biden to his state and praised the collaboration with officials on the ground and the federal government in Washington.

"We are cutting through the red tape and that's from local government, state government, all the way up to the president. We appreciate the team effort," DeSantis said.

Biden said DeSantis had done a "good job" when asked by reporters to assess the governor's handling of the recovery efforts.

"We have very different political philosophies ... but we worked hand in glove," Biden said. "On things related to dealing with this crisis, we've been completely lockstep. There's been no difference."

The breadth of the devastation that Biden witnessed was immense. The presidential motorcade drove by wind-shorn trees, some uprooted, others with branches pulled backwards by the storm. Fields off the highway were still flooded, forming stagnant lagoons.

Signs for stores and restaurants were blown out; ruined mattresses were piled in neighborhood streets, a building was tipped to the side like a chess piece. An armada of workers and repair trucks struggled with

recovery.

Hurricane Ian has resulted in at least 98 people confirmed dead, including 89 in Florida, and many people still wait for power to be restored. Ian's 150 mph winds and punishing storm surge last week took out power for 2.6 million in Florida. Many people still are unable to get food and water, although DeSantis said power has been restored to more than 97% of the state.

With the midterm elections just a month away, the crisis was bringing together political rivals in common cause at least for a time.

Biden and DeSantis have had a multitude of differences in recent years over how to fight COVID-19, immigration policy and more. In recent weeks, they tussled over the governor's decision to put migrants on planes or buses to Democratic strongholds, a practice that Biden has called "reckless."

Along with DeSantis, Sen.

Rick Scott has also been one of Biden's most prominent Republican critics. He, Republican Sen. Marco Rubio and other state and local officials joined the president and governor. Rubio, like DeSantis, is up for reelection in November.

Jeff Rioux, a general contractor in Fort Myers and a registered Republican, said as he mopped up floors and tore out soaked drywall from his flooded house that he welcomed Biden's visit.

"The world does need to see what happened here. It's going get some help down here," Rioux said of the national attention. "At some point you've got to put politics aside. People are hurting down here. It's not right or left, it's America at the end of the day."

Biden resorted to profanity at one point, but only in an apparently jocular comment picked up by a microphone and causing much comment on social media.

As Fort Myers Beach Mayor Ray Murphy thanked Biden for coming, the president said at one point in the brief conversation, "No one f— with a Biden," and appeared to offer the mayor some advice.

"That's exactly right, that's exactly right," Murphy said, laughing. "All right, good to see you."

Before the storm hit, the president had intended to visit the Florida cities of Orlando and Fort Lauderdale to stress his efforts to strengthen Social Security and Medicaid. Biden has accused Scott of wanting to end both programs by proposing that federal laws should expire every five years, although the Florida senator has said he wants to preserve the programs.

The hurricane changed the purpose and tone of Biden's first trip to Florida this year, which was in an area devastated by winds and surging water. Boats,

including huge yachts, were capsized and hurled inland.

FEMA Administrator Deanne Criswell told reporters on Air Force One that the cost of rebuilding will be significant. "It will certainly be in the billions and perhaps one of the more costly disasters that we've seen in many years."

The White House message of bipartisan unity in a time of crisis marked a difference from Biden's predecessor, Donald Trump, who at times threatened to withhold aid from the states of Democrats who criticized him, including Govs. Gavin Newsom of California and Andrew Cuomo of New York.

Biden: IBM investment to help in tech competition with China

POUGHKEEPSIE, N.Y. (AP) — President Joe Biden said Thursday that a \$20 billion investment by IBM in New York's Hudson River Valley would help give the United States a technological edge against China, hailing the expansion during an appearance with two House Democrats in competitive races in next month's critical elections.

The president cited IBM's commitment as part of a larger manufacturing boom, spurred by this summer's passage of a \$280 billion measure intended to boost the semiconductor industry and scientific research. That legislation was needed for national and economic security, Biden said in Poughkeepsie, adding that "the Chinese Communist Party actively lobbied against" it.

"The United States has to lead the world of producing these advanced chips — this law is going to make sure that it will," Biden said.

Democratic candidates have largely avoided election-year appearances with Biden, whose approval ratings remain under water. Bucking that trend in New York were Reps. Sean Patrick Maloney and Pat Ryan.

The lawmakers, along with Democratic Gov. Kathy Hochul, greeted Biden upon his arrival at Stewart Air National Guard Base.

"When I heard @POTUS was looking to see the benefits of the CHIPS & Science Act first-hand, I told him that the Hudson Valley was the perfect place," Maloney wrote Wednesday on Twitter. "I'm thrilled to host him in Poughkeepsie this week to celebrate the major wins and good-paying jobs we are delivering here in NY."

The CHIPS and Science Act, which Biden signed in August, was a rare bill for which the president was able to win bipartisan support.

IBM's \$20 billion investment over the next decade is intended to bolster research and development and manufacturing of semiconductors, mainframe technology, artificial intelligence and quantum computing.

"As we tackle large-scale technological challenges in climate, energy, transportation and more, we must continue to invest in innovation and discovery — because advanced technologies are key to solving these problems and driving economic prosperity, including better jobs, for millions of Americans," said Arvind Krishna, IBM's chairman and CEO.

IBM's commitment comes on the heels of chipmaker Micron announcing this week an investment of up to \$100 billion over the next 20-plus years to build a plant in upstate New York that could create 9,000 factory jobs. In his remarks, Biden also celebrated Intel's plant

groundbreaking in Ohio and an investment by WolfSpeed for chip production in North Carolina.

Maloney, chairman of the powerful Democratic congressional campaign fundraising arm, is running against Republican state Assemblyman Mike Lawler in the 17th Congressional District. Ryan faces state Assemblyman Colin Schmitt in the 18th District.

The boundaries of most New York districts, including Maloney's and Ryan's, have been affected by redistricting.

Ryan in August won a close special election to serve out the term of Democrat Antonio Delgado, who vacated his 19th District seat after he was appointed lieutenant governor by Hochul. Ryan is running for a full term in the 18th District, where he lives.

Maloney, who had represented that district since 2013, decided to run in the 17th District. His Hudson Valley home fell inside the new boundaries after redistricting.

Hochul, who took office last year after Democrat Andrew Cuomo resigned amid sexual harassment allegations, is looking to win a full term. Her opponent is Republican Rep. Lee Zeldin.

Royals fire manager Mike Matheny after 65-97 end to season

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Manager Mike Matheny and pitching coach Cal Eldred were fired by the Kansas City Royals on Wednesday night, shortly after the struggling franchise finished the season 65-97 with a listless 9-2 loss to the Cleveland Guardians.

The Royals had exercised their option on Matheny's contract for 2023 during spring training, when the club hoped it was turning the corner from also-ran to contender. But plagued by poor pitching, struggles from young position players and a lackluster group of veterans, the Royals were largely out of playoff contention by the middle of summer.

The disappointing on-field product led owner John Sherman last month to fire longtime front office executive Dayton Moore, the architect of back-to-back American League champions and the 2015 World Series title team. He was replaced by one of his longtime understudies, J.J. Picollo,

who made the decision to fire Matheny hours after the season ended. "Managing the Royals has been a true privilege," Matheny said in a statement. "I'm thankful to so many, primarily Dayton Moore, and the coaches and players I've worked with. I would like to thank Mr. John Sherman and the ownership group for the opportunity to manage their team, and everyone involved in this great organization. "I came to the Royals knowing it was an organization of excellence and care, and was shown that care every single day.

Royals fans should be excited about this group of players, and I look forward to watching them continue to grow." Matheny spent parts of seven seasons managing the St. Louis Cardinals, finishing each with a winning record and winning the National League pennant in 2013. Phillies, Cardinals meet in playoffs; first time since 2011

ST. LOUIS (AP) — More than a decade ago, the talented triumvirate of Albert Pujols, Yadier Molina and Adam Wainwright helped power the St. Louis Cardinals past the Philadelphia Phillies in the divisional round of the playoffs, and ultimately to a World Series title.

A lot has happened since, and not a lot of it good around Philadelphia, where the Phillies have had more losing seasons than winning ones and secured a wild-card spot earlier this week for their first return to the postseason.

The two clubs will meet again, 11 years after their last thrilling playoff showdown, set to play a best-of-three National League wild-card series at Busch Stadium. And wouldn't you know it? Pujols, Molina and Wainwright are still around, and each could have a starring role when the series begins Friday afternoon. "I've thought about it a lot, right? It literally

became like a fork in the road — one went right, one went left," John Mozeliak, the Cardinals' president of baseball operations, said Thursday in recalling the decisive Game 5 of the 2011 series. St. Louis won 1-0 behind Chris Carpenter's three-hit gem against Hall of Famer Roy Halladay. "It was such an epic game, probably one of the greatest games any of us got to watch," Mozeliak said. "For us it became more of a springboard, and in the Phillies' case, it became a turning point for their franchise, too."

The Cardinals continued to challenge for championships over the next decade, losing three times in the NL Championship Series and once in the World Series. The team they're taking into this postseason might be the best one yet: Nolan Arenado and Paul Goldschmidt will be getting plenty of MVP votes. The starting rotation, buoyed by the trade-deadline arrival of Game 1 starter Jose Quintana, has been solid. And the bullpen has been among the best in baseball. See MEET | 14A

Raiders aim to dispel more Mahomes magic in MNF trip to KC

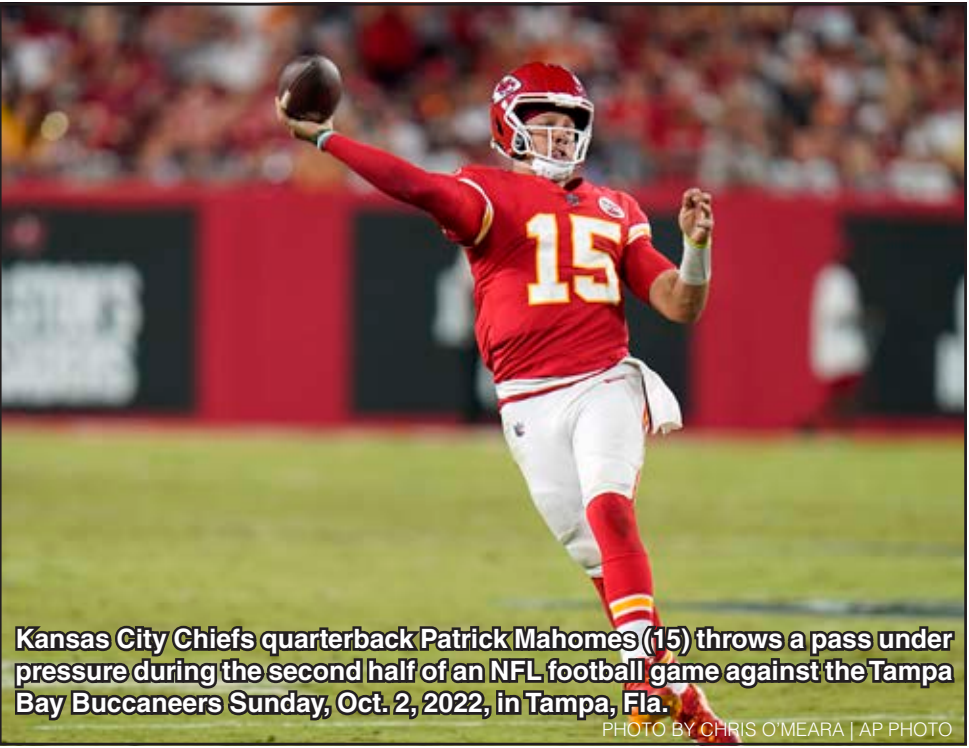

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — There was a play last Sunday night at Tampa Bay when Chiefs quarterback Patrick Mahomes did a pirouette away from a defender, then flicked a pass to Clyde Edwards-Helaire standing in the back of the end zone for a touchdown.

It was the kind of play that perhaps only Mahomes can make, and he made it look easy. The way Raiders coach Josh McDaniels sees it, those kinds of did-you-see-that plays are going to happen, probably again when the AFC West rivals

face each other Monday night. Mahomes is due for at least one a game. The trick is to make sure that one incredible play doesn't set the tone for the rest of the night. "When you play a great player in any sport," McDaniels said, "they're going to produce some moments like that during the course of the game. I think the biggest thing is you just have to try to be consistent and disciplined in your approach, if you can keep playing and have the right idea and make it as hard as you can on him. "I think everybody tries to do that," McDaniels added. "Some may have

more success than others. But you're not going to stop this guy from doing some really good things for their team. That's just the nature of the sport." It's what makes facing the Chiefs (3-1) such a daunting challenge. And unless you're facing them, it's also what makes them so much fun to watch. "It may be surprising to some," Edwards-Helaire said of those highlight-reel plays, "but it's just one of those things that, not necessarily we work on, but it's scramble rules. It's football, man. LeBron in Vegas? He makes an expansion pitch to Adam Silver

LAS VEGAS (AP) — LeBron James came to Las Vegas for a preseason game. And a pitch.

James, who has spoken in the past about wanting to eventually own an NBA franchise — with Las Vegas on his mind — has sent another crystal-clear message to Commissioner Adam Silver, reminding him of his plans.

"I know Adam is in Abu Dhabi right now, I believe. But he probably sees every single interview and transcript that comes through from NBA players," James said after the Lakers' match-up with the Phoenix Suns on Wednesday night. "So, I want the team here, Adam. Thank you."

James smiled after finishing that thought, knowing full well that Silver would soon hear every word.

Silver is indeed in Abu Dhabi, for preseason games this week between the Milwaukee Bucks and Atlanta Hawks. The league certainly was aware of James' remarks; a story about what he said was posted Thursday morning to the NBA website.

Silver has spoken of expansion plans many times in recent years, but there has also been a clear belief that the NBA won't move forward on adding teams until the next collective bargaining agreement and television deals are complete.

That said, Silver has called Las Vegas "a great sports market."

"As I said before, at some point, this league invariably will expand, but it's not at this moment that we are discussing it," Silver said earlier this year. "But one of the factors in expanding is the potential dilution of talent."

James said in June on his show "The Shop: Uninterrupted" that he wants to own a team and wants it to be in Las Vegas, which has long been mentioned as a possible expansion site. The city has become a basketball epicenter of sorts in recent years, playing host to the NBA Summer League — featuring all 30 teams, and often with James sitting courtside for some Lakers games — along with many major USA Basketball events. It's also the home of the newly crowned WNBA champion Las Vegas Aces

and was the site of the 2007 NBA All-Star Game.

Lakers coach Darvin Ham said he thinks "it's only a matter of time" before Las Vegas gets a team, calling it "a no-brainer."

"It has rapidly become an NBA market," Ham said.

"When you look at Summer League and that whole layout, the way it's done now, I remember a day when you barely knew the NBA was in the city during Summer League. And now, it's like a huge extravaganza. It's a whole rollout, a whole

layout of excitement."

Fans in Las Vegas gave James loud ovations Wednesday night, and he responded by scoring 23 points in 18 minutes. He appeared in only the first half, making 8 of his 11 shots. He looked right at home.

And if Las Vegas becomes a business home one day, James clearly wouldn't mind.

"It's the best fan base in the world and I would love to bring a team here at some point," James said. "That would be amazing."

College football at 49? North Dakota lineman has right stuff

WAHPETON, N.D. (AP) — When North Dakota State College of Science suffered a heartbreaking loss in early September — foiled at the goal line as time expired in a jolt to their national championship ambitions — it was a backup defensive lineman who stepped forward with a pep talk to lift the locker room.

Forget it, 49-year-old Ray Ruschel said, according to his junior college teammates. Focus on the rest of the season and things will work out.

"There were just kind of emotions everywhere. Everybody did not handle it," wide receiver Marselio Mendez said after the loss to rival Minnesota State Community Technical College. "Ray came up and said, you know, it's not really failing, right? He said we just have to put the emotion to the side and we still got the rest of the season and playoffs to show who we are."

When it comes to inspiration, the Wildcats could do worse than look to Ruschel's own story, and the path that brought him to a small, vocational-minded school in the wide shadow cast by nearby NCAA power North Dakota State.

After nearly two decades in the Army and National Guard, Ruschel was working as a night-shift mechanic at a North Dakota sugar beet factory when he decided to enroll at the College of Science. The school offers two-year programs in manufacturing, skilled trades, health care, and the liberal arts.

That sounded good to Ruschel, who hoped to move up at the factory and

decided to study business management. Then he learned the school had a football team among its six sports — and that, despite his age, he was eligible.

"Something just clicked in my head, like why not play?" recalled Ruschel, whose last game action came when he was a high school senior in Pennsylvania, more than 30 years ago.

When Ruschel asked head coach Eric Issendorf — one year younger — for a tryout, Issendorf said sure, even though he worried that Ruschel might get hurt.

Instead, Ruschel has held his own and earned the respect of the other players. He now plays about a dozen snaps a game.

"Guys that he's playing against are bigger, faster, stronger than him," Issendorf said. "But he's been able to manage it. His personality he's just a really likable guy with an ambition not to leave any stone unturned. As long as he's here on this earth."

Wahpeton, a mostly industrial town of about 7,800, is home to the Minn-Dak Farmers Cooperative, one of the largest sugar beet producers in North Dakota and Minnesota. That's where Ruschel works an overnight shift, then fits in a couple of hours at the gym after he gets off at 8 a.m. each day.

After a few hours of schoolwork online at his apartment near campus, Ruschel grabs some rest before afternoon practice, which runs until about 7 p.m. Then it's back to his apartment, where Ruschel showers and eats before lying down for whatever rest he can get before it all begins again with his overnight shift.

How does he pull off such a grueling schedule?

"That's a good question," said Ruschel, a single father of two grown children. "It's because I choose to prioritize certain things and other things have to be sacrificed. They just have to be sacrificed right now."

The college campus is home to about 3,000 students, anchored by its historic Old Main that dates to its founding in 1903. A recruiting brochure boasts of a 97% employment rate for graduates.

When it comes to football, it's no North Dakota State — a perennial national champion in the NCAA's second tier, with a \$25 million budget, a dome that seats 19,000 and numerous alumni in the NFL.

But it's not bad, with facilities among the best in junior college football, including a 4,100-seat stadium, four practice fields and a locker room with 90 modern stalls.

The Wildcats went 9-1 last season, second-best in school history, and finished at No. 4 in the Division III junior college rankings. After a 37-6 win over Vermillion Community College — a six-hour bus ride to far northeastern Minnesota — and a homecoming win last weekend they are 4-1 in a season they hope can end with a national championship.

Players say Ruschel fits in with his teammates despite the obvious musical and cultural differences that come with such a big age gap. On that bus ride to Minnesota, for example, Ruschel spent the hours scrolling through Facebook, listening to music on his head phones and "staring out the window mostly." No

Instagram or TikTok for him.

"The players will come up to me and ask me what I'm listening to," Ruschel said, chuckling. "I tell them country music and that will be the end of that."

Ruschel, who made sergeant while in the Army and said he aims to stay active in the National Guard until he's 60, has served in Afghanistan and Jordan, though he declined to talk about the tours.

Linebacker Manny Garcia said Ruschel's Army experience and his willingness to take on players less than half his age give him credibility with his teammates.

"You know, we hear Ray's stories about the military and listen to those and make sure we try to translate those to the football field, for sure," Garcia said.

Five games into the season, the 6-foot, 225-pound Ruschel, a workout buff, said he feels no pain on the field.

"All in all I'm no more sore than the rest of these kids," he said. "I've just got to keep stretching."

Word of a 49-year-old college football player has attracted national media attention and Ruschel has at times apologized for taking the spotlight away from others, Issendorf said. Before Ruschel arrived, the program's claim to fame was Errol Mann, who kicked for the NFL's Oakland Raiders and was part of their Super Bowl-winning 1976 team.

"I told Ray, you know, we're embracing it," Issendorf said. "Our institution loves it. Our administration loves the attention. It's great marketing. But it's also a really good story."

MLB crowds jump from '21, still below pre-pandemic levels

PHOENIX (AP) — Even with the homer heroics of sluggers like Aaron Judge and Albert Pujols, Major League Baseball wasn't able to coax fans to ballparks at pre-pandemic levels this season, though attendance did jump substantially from the COVID-19 affected campaign in 2021.

The 30 MLB teams drew nearly 64.6 million fans for the regular season that ended Wednesday, which is up from the 45.3 million who attended games in 2021, according to baseball-reference.com. This year's num-

bers are still down from the 68.5 million who attended games in 2019, which was the last season that wasn't affected by the pandemic.

The 111-win Los Angeles Dodgers led baseball with 3.86 million fans flocking to Dodger Stadium for an average of 47,672 per contest. The Oakland Athletics — who lost 102 games, play in an aging stadium and are the constant subject of relocation rumors — finished last, drawing just 787,902 fans for an average of less than 10,000 per game.

The St. Louis Cardinals finished second, drawing 3.32 million fans. They were followed by the Yankees

(3.14 million), defending World Series champion Braves (3.13 million) and Padres (2.99 million).

The Toronto Blue Jays saw the biggest jump in attendance, rising from 805,901 fans to about 2.65 million. They were followed by the Cardinals, Yankees, Mariners, Dodgers, and Mets, which all drew more than a million fans more than in 2021.

The Rangers and Reds were the only teams to draw fewer fans than in 2021.

Only the Rangers started the 2021 season at full capacity and all 30 teams weren't at 100% until July. No fans were allowed to attend regu-

lar season games in 2020.

MLB attendance had been declining slowly for years — even before the pandemic — after hitting its high mark of 79.4 million in 2007. This year's 64.6 million fans is the fewest in a non-COVID-19 season since the sport expanded to 30 teams in 1998.

The lost attendance has been balanced in some ways by higher viewership on the sport's MLB.TV streaming service. Viewers watched 11.5 billion minutes of content in 2022, which was a record high and up nearly 10% from 2021.

Put in charge of a rebuild in the works, Matheny went 26-34 during a COVID-19-shortened first season, then appeared to show progress last season, when the Royals ushered forward a slew of young prospects and finished 74-88.

The expectation was another step forward this season, but the Royals instead spent September fighting off 100 losses. Matheny finished 165-219 during his time with the Royals, though the number that perhaps is more important to the future of the club is 29 — the number of players that made their Major League debut during his tenure.

“We are grateful to Mike for leading us through some unusual times these last three seasons,” Picollo said in a statement. “He met those challenges head on and helped us move forward in a positive manner. We thank him for his leadership and know his influence will have a positive impact moving forward.”

Matheny became the fifth big league manager to be fired this year.

Philadelphia’s Joe Girardi was replaced on June 3 by Rob Thomson, who engineered a miraculous turnaround to get the Phillies into the playoffs. The Angels replaced Joe Maddon with Phil Nevin four days

later, Toronto’s Charlie Montoyo was succeeded by John Schneider on July 13 and the Rangers’ Chris Woodward by Tony Beasley on Aug. 15.

Chicago White Sox manager Tony La Russa left the team on Aug. 30 for medical tests and said Monday he will not return for 2023.

In addition, Miami’s Don Mattingly said late last month that he will not return next season.

While he was well-liked in the Kansas City clubhouse, it seemed unlikely Matheny would be granted another season when Moore was fired last month. Sherman indicated at the time the change in the leadership of the baseball operations department was only the start of what was expected to be widespread shifts throughout the organization.

The Royals have struggled for years to develop pitching — they had the fourth-worst ERA and the worst WHIP by far of any staff in the majors this season. And the continued struggles by their latest wave of young arms was a big reason for letting go of Eldred, the pitching coach since 2018.

“The bottom line here is it’s time for change,” Sherman said last month. “There is a gap right now between where we are and where we expected to be. ... I felt like in 2021 we did make progress, and in 2022, that’s not how I feel. There have been some bright spots — I love seeing the young players — but in 2022, we are not where we expected to be.”

Molina will be back behind the plate, Wainwright is available out of the bullpen and Pujols, after soaring past the 700-mark for career home runs and topping Babe Ruth in career RBIs, will attempt to continue his torrid second half.

“We’ve had a lot of different contributors throughout the year,” first-year manager Oliver Marmol said. “What our corner guys have done in Nolan and Goldy is unbelievable. They answer the bell every day, and without them we’re not here. You can go down the list. But what Albert has done has been remarkable.”

The Phillies are pretty remarkable, too.

They were going nowhere when team president Dave Dombrowski fired manager Joe Girardi in June, replacing him with Rob Thomson. They were 23-29 and 5 1/2 games out of the playoffs, despite a payroll pushing \$237 million.

But with Bryce Harp-

er, Kyle Schwarber and JT Realmuto leading the offense, and a rotation featuring Aaron Nola and Game 1 starter Zack Wheeler shutting down hitters, Thomson led one of the biggest turnarounds in baseball. Only the Dodgers and Braves have better records in the NL since the soft-spoken Canadian took over.

“I feel a sense of pride for these players,” Thomson said. “We’re glad to be here but we’ve got more to go.”

HARPER’S HOPE

Harper has largely lived up to his \$330 million contract in Philadelphia, winning his second MVP last season and putting together another strong year despite a series of injuries — a small tear in his elbow ligament that turned the right fielder into a designated hitter, and a broken thumb that cost him most of the summer.

The one thing Harper hasn’t done is win a postseason series, losing all four in the divisional round when with the Washington Nationals.

“I’m so excited to be back here with an organization that I absolutely love,” said Harper, who

hit .286 with 18 homers and 65 RBIs this season. “This is the plan, right? This is the goal, to do this. But this is Step 1, as well.”

IN THE WHEELHOUSE

Wheeler (12-7, 2.92 ERA) got the nod in Game 1 in part because of his two outings against the Cardinals this season. He tossed seven innings in each, allowing a combined nine hits while striking out 10 and walking two. The Phillies won both.

“You just try to stay within yourself. Be yourself,” Wheeler said. “Attack hitters, work ahead and get outs.”

Q’S AND ANSWERS

Quintana was 3-5 with a 3.50 ERA with Pittsburgh when the Cardinals called at the trade deadline, hoping the veteran pitcher could solidify their starting rotation.

In St. Louis, he’s gone 3-2 with a 2.01 ERA in 12 starts, including three innings of one-hit ball in a final tune-up Monday in Pittsburgh.

“As soon as I got traded and starting pitching for the Cardinals,” Quintana said, “I could feel the energy. It was so

exciting.”

CLOSING TIME

Both teams could have question marks when it comes to holding the lead in the ninth.

The Phillies’ Seranthony Dominguez and David Robertson have scuffled of late, meaning former rotation stalwart Zach Eflin could be called upon to close out games. He’s allowed one earned run over seven appearances out of the bullpen.

Ryan Helsley will get the call for the Cardinals, assuming the middle finger he jammed Tuesday against the Pirates doesn’t cause him problems. Helsley threw during Thursday’s workout and Marmol was optimistic about his availability.

UP NEXT

Nola (11-13, 3.25) will start Game 2 for Philadelphia on Saturday with Ranger Suarez (10-7, 3.65) getting the nod Sunday if the series goes to a decisive third game. The Cardinals will send Miles Mikolas (12-13, 3.29) out in Game 2, but Marmol was coy with his plans for a potential decider, saying: “When we get to Game 3, I’ll announce it then.”

Or, to describe it more succinctly: “That’s Patrick, man,” Edwards-Hellaire said.

The Raiders (1-3), who are coming off a much-needed win over Denver, have some playmakers of their own on offense, and it will be up to Derek Carr and

the rest of them to keep up with Kansas City’s second-ranked scoring offense.

Josh Jacobs is coming off arguably the best game of his career, catching five passes while running for 144 yards and two touchdowns. Davante Adams caught nine passes for 109 yards. And fellow wide receiver Hunter Renfrow, who has been out with a concussion since Week 2, was back at practice this week and could play Monday night at Kansas City.

“Any division game, you’ve got to pay a little bit more attention,” Adams said. “We obviously know those are going to be huge games, and especially against a really good team like this. You can’t take anybody lightly, but you’ve definitely got to get up to play a team like this, especially going into their place where the Raiders haven’t done a great job in the past.”

BUTT-KICKER RETURNS

The Chiefs are hopeful that Harrison Butker, otherwise known as @buttkicker7 on Twitter, will return for the first time since spraining his plant ankle in the opener against Arizona. Mat-

thew Wright was perfect as his replacement last week in Tampa Bay, but the Chiefs clearly prefer to have their accurate, strong-legged kicker on the field.

RUN TO THE CARR

Carr ran for a career-high five first downs last week for the Raiders. Two came on short-yardage sneaks and three more on scrambles as he ran for 40 yards, his most productive day on the ground since 2017. And if defenses continue double-teaming Adams, Renfrow and Darren Waller, Carr intends to keep running.

“I take it upon my shoulders and find a lane and go,” he said. “It’s definitely something I’m conscious about.”

RED ZONE WOES

The red-zone issues that have plagued the Raiders in recent years still haven’t been solved, despite a new coaching staff and an upgraded roster. The Raiders have converted 44% of their red-zone drives into touchdowns, tied for fourth worst in the NFL, and they are fourth worst on defense, too, allowing TDs on 76.9% of red-zone drives.

“It comes down to being locked in and know-

ing your assignment and being disciplined enough to go execute,” Adams said.

PRIME TIME

The Chiefs are playing in prime time for the third time — one Thursday, one Sunday and now Monday — in their first five games. But don’t think for a moment they don’t like the spotlight. Kansas City has won its last five Monday night games while Mahomes is 6-1 as a starter in such high-profile contests.

STINGY DEFENSE

Mahomes and the Chiefs’ offense earned most of the plaudits for their 41-31 win over the Buccaneers, but all the defense did last week was allow a franchise-low 3 yards rushing on six carries to Leonard Fournette and Co.

“The thing that makes me most excited is the influx of young guys we’ve got, and those guys have an opportunity to grow and get better,” Chiefs coach Andy Reis said. “If you keep working and do it day-in and day-out, and work, you have a chance to be something special. But you have to stay in that frame of mind.”

World ranking rejects last-minute LIV Golf bid for points

The Official World Golf Ranking won't be awarding points to LIV Golf events this year, denying the MENA Tour's request to immediately add the Saudi-funded series to its schedule.

The OWGR said in a statement Thursday the MENA Tour did not give it sufficient notice and there would not be time to finish the review ahead of

the LIV Golf Invitational in Bangkok that starts Friday or the event in Saudi Arabia next week.

In a move that indicates how quickly LIV Golf wants world ranking points for its 48-man fields, it created an alliance with the little-known MENA Tour, which hasn't run a tournament of its own since March 2020 because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The MENA Tour stands for Middle East and North

Africa and is a developmental tour that has been getting the bare minimum of world ranking points since 2016. It has 54-hole events with a 36-hole cut, offering a \$75,000 purse. LIV Golf events have a \$20 million purse for 54-hole events with no cut.

The MENA Tour now is aligned with the Asian Development Tour, a step below the Asian Tour. LIV Golf already has invested \$300 million in the Asian Tour, creating an "Interna-

tional Series" that began this year.

The OWGR said it now is reviewing "significant changes" to the MENA Tour's membership structure and schedule.

The MENA Tour not only submitted LIV Golf's next two tournaments as part of its schedule, it said all LIV Golf players — such as Phil Mickelson, Dustin Johnson and Brooks Koepka — have joined the MENA Tour.

The OWGR said it

would wait until the review is complete before deciding whether to award points to the MENA Tour's new "Limited Field Tournaments." It said the MENA defined that as "any MENA Tour-approved event" of fewer than 80 players.

Meanwhile, the OWGR said regular MENA Tour events will still get points. That won't be the case for LIV Golf this year. After the events in Bangkok and Saudi Arabia, the last tour-

namment is only for teams.

Bryson DeChambeau and Harold Varner III are among those that appear certain to fall out of the top 50 by the end of the year, meaning they likely would have no path to play in the Masters and would have to go through qualifying for two other majors.

None of the majors has yet to say whether LIV Golf has caused them to change their criteria for next year.

MLB velocity, shifts set records; average lowest since 1968

NEW YORK (AP) — Higher velocity and increased shifts led to the major league batting average dropping to .243, its lowest since 1968.

Defensive shifts and 100 mph pitches set records this season, contributing to the worrisome offensive decline Major League Baseball is trying to address.

When the average dropped this low more than a half-century ago, MLB lowered the pitcher's mound. Next year's rules changes announced last month include the

first restriction on shifts, a decision made over the objection of the players' association.

"We've engaged in a process to develop rules that will bring back the best form of baseball," Commissioner Rob Manfred said at the time.

The major league average was .269 in 2006 but fell to .254 in 2016 and .245 during the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, then dropped by one point in each of the following years. The only seasons with lower averages than this year were the record low of .237 in 1968 along with 1967 and the deal-ball era seasons of 1884,

1888 and 1908.

Defensive shifts on balls in play totaled 66,961 this season, Sports Info Solutions said Monday, up from 59,063 last year and 2,349 in 2011. The major league-best Dodgers led this year with 2,912 shifts and NL Central champion Cleveland had the fewest at 1,600.

Batting average for left-handed hitters was .236 this year, down from .254 in 2016, when lefties were one point below the big league average.

Luis Arraez's .316 average for Minnesota was the lowest by an American League batting champion since Boston's Carl Yas-

trzemski hit .301 in 1968.

Velocity has a lot of do with the fall. There were 3,356 pitches of 100 mph or more, 0.05% of the major league total of 703,918, according to MLB Statcast. That was up from 1,829 in 2021 and 1,056 in 2019.

Minnesota's Jhoan Duran had the most 100 mph pitches with 392, followed by Cincinnati's Hunter Greene (337), St. Louis' Jordan Hicks (274) and Ryan Helsley (237) and Seattle's Andrés Muñoz (209).

Duran averaged 100.8 mph with his fastball, Muñoz 100.2 and Hicks 100.1.

"Every time that bullpen

door swings open, it's velocity," Atlanta manager Brian Snitker said. "The guys, they weren't like that. The closers weren't throwing like they are now. But it's kind of the way they are growing up and now they are trained — and amazing to me, the number of them, too. It's like they just keep coming."

The average four-seam fastball velocity was 93.9 mph, up from 93.7 mph in 2021 and 93.1 mph in 2015, when Statcast first began measuring.

"The way the game is now, everybody's throwing that hard. It's not fun to face, but it's just how

the game is," Seattle's Ty France said. "To be able to step in the box on this stage, it was pretty cool."

Home runs dropped to 5,215 from 5,944 last year and a record 6,776 in 2019.

The gap between strikeouts and hits narrowed to 1,135 from a record 2,661 last year. Strikeouts topped hits for the first time in 2019. After increasing annually from 2005 through 2019, when there were a record 42,823 whiffs, strikeouts dropped to 42,145 in 2021 and 40,812 this year.

Warriors' Draymond Green apologizes for fight with teammate

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Golden State Warriors star Draymond Green apologized to the team a day after fighting with teammate Jordan Poole during practice, general manager Bob Myers said.

Poole practiced Thursday while Green didn't, and Myers said any potential discipline would be handled

internally. Warriors coach Steve Kerr said Green will be away from the team again Friday and expects him to return Saturday.

Myers said he doesn't anticipate Green missing any games for Wednesday's altercation.

"Everybody's fine," Myers said, saying the team is lucky nobody got hurt. "Look, it's the NBA, professional sports, these things

happen. Nobody likes it. We don't condone it, but it happened.

"Draymond apologized to the team this morning, Jordan was there in the room, I was there in room with the team, the coaches, the players and we heard that."

The Athletic first reported the scuffle, saying Green struck Poole. Myers said "space is good" regarding

Green not practicing and going home after he addressed the team.

The fiery Green, a four-time NBA champion and four-time All-Star, has long been considered the emotional leader of the Warriors. He's been willing to get into it with his teammates when he feels appropriate. There is a "tough love" element to every team, Myers said, noting "Dray-

mond is absolutely a leader on this team."

"It's unfortunate, I'm not going to deny it," Myers said. "It'll take some time to move through, but we'll move through it and move forward and I'm confident that we will. We've got a good team, we've got good leadership, we've got some guys that have been here a long time."

"This isn't our first thing

that's happened, first sense of adversity, we've been through some of this before. Don't like going through it, but it's part of the NBA and it's part of sports."

Poole's representatives are in discussions with Myers about a contract extension ahead of the Oct. 17 deadline, one day before the defending NBA champions open the season at home against the Lakers.

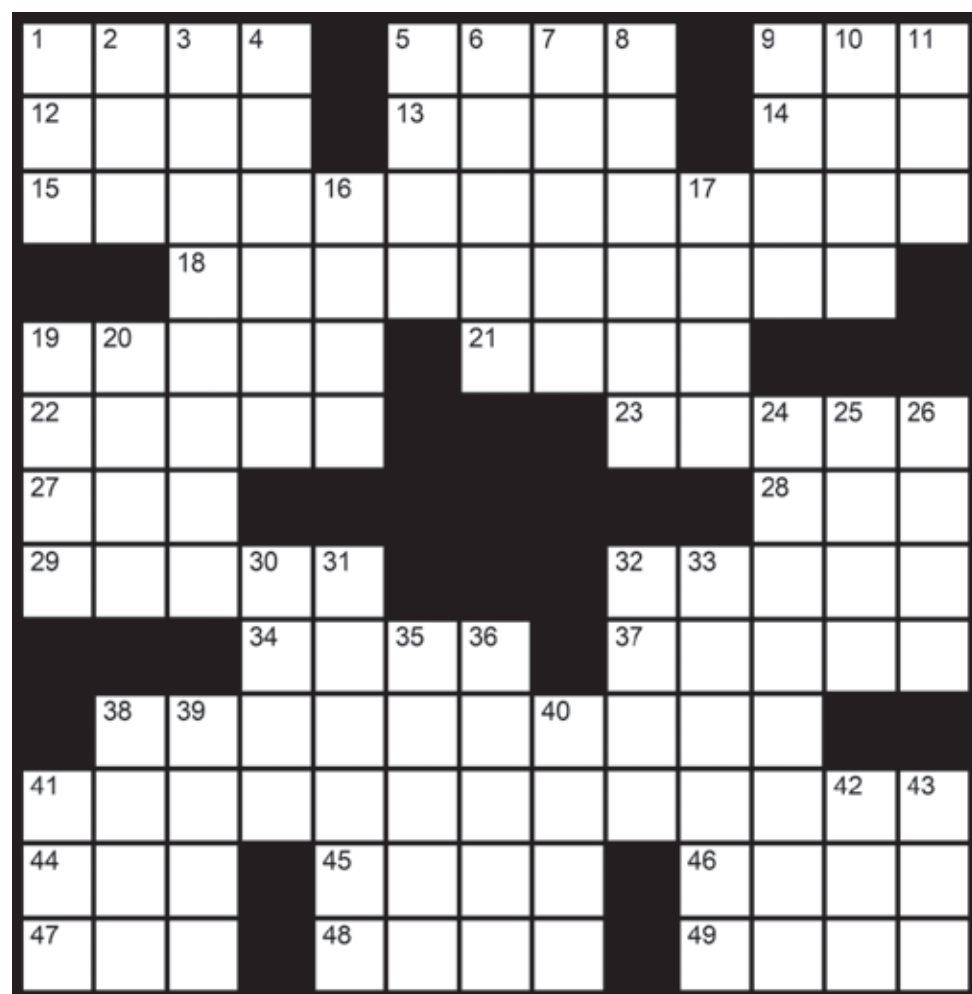


