Festival Latino to party in downtown Sedalia Saturday

Parade, food, folklorico dancing

This Saturday a new tradition begins with the first ever Festival Latino in downtown Sedalia. A parade at noon will be followed by a day of free events, entertainment, regional food, dancing, and celebration.

The event is organized by the committee of Heresia Hispania of Sedalia who took the idea from local businesses as a way of reaching out to the Latino community.

"It is the first year that this committee is hosting the Latino Festival in downtown Sedalia," organizer El Blue Ramirez said. "The way all this started it was Sunny Broyles with Pruitt Insurance said, 'Blue, you would be great to try and bring our Latinos to downtown Sedalia, we don't see a lot of Latinos.'"

The two started talking and Ramirez offered Broyles a reason Latinos did little business downtown.

"I'm like, well, we don't have a whole lot of bilingual people that can provide service," Ramirez said. "So, they don't feel that they can communicate down here."

Pruitt Insurance has bilingual employees, and Ramirez was put in touch with Downtown Specialist/Planner Joleigh Cornine with the City of Sedalia.

"She was very happy to work with us see what we could do to bring people downtown," Ramirez said. "And that's when we asked could we hold something for our Latinos to come together and join celebration for all the countries, not just Mexico or just El Salvador."

The Festival Latino hopes to find common ground for celebration of all the various cultures of Latin America.

"We're going to have information about our culture to share with the community," Ramirez said. "It's the start of Hispanic

heritage month and that's from September 15th through October 15, we'll have plenty of food out there from different places, different recipes, and we'll have traditional folklorico dancing."

There will also be plenty of people hoping to bridge any language barriers and help make everyone feel welcome.

"We have information to share with the community and then resources that our Latinos need to know that are in the community," Ramirez said. "The goal is to be able to share resources. For example, Central Bank has been a huge part of what we have done with the Latinos, they have language speaking people at every branch."

Ramirez is a huge advocate for continuing education and will have information about attending State Fair Community College available that the college now prints in Spanish.

He also teaches at the college and says the bilingual pamphlets SFCC now prints are a great way of reaching out to potential Latino students.

"That has also been huge for us to be able to share that information with the community," Ramirez said. "Information for our Latinos, and then information for our community all about our Hispanic heritage is a win-win for everyone."

"We're going to have a great full day of activities," Sedalia Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Debra Andresen said. "At noon we will have the Latino parade we have so far exceeded 27 entries for that, of course this is the first year, so hopefully next year we'll have a lot more."

A beauty contest, a talent show, dessert, and hot sauce contests and loads of activities for kids will keep the fiesta rolling into the evening.

"After the parade is over with all the other festivities downtown will start at 1 (p.m.). We'll have a car show, there's an opening ceremony where mayor Dawson we'll be there giving a few remarks as well."

Telling the story of life

Becky King opens show at City Hall

"Faith, Family and Friends," an exhibit by Sedalia artist Becky King, opened this week at the Municipal Building.

King, a Sedalia Visual Art Association member, will have a reception from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Friday. Her over 20 acrylic paintings take on many subjects but center around family.

On Wednesday, as King and SVAA President Linda Hoover hung her show, she said painting is an escape for her — a grounding force that gives her peace.

Hoover noted King is "a force of nature."

"She's a ball of energy," she added. "She's become such a helpful part of SVAA; she is so full of passion and life."

"I think from having her husband in the military, it makes her conscious of things not all of us are conscious of," she continued. "And she touches on subjects that others don't — war, peace, life and death, birth. So, they run the gamut of life; they tell the story of life and of her life."

King, with a laugh, describes her work as "laborious."

"It's the only thing that I have that I feel that is for me," she explained. "I tend to do for everybody else all the time."

She added that for the last four years, she's tended to family members who have cancer, including her late father and mother, Randall and Alma Blankenship, her veteran husband Daryl King, and a grandson. Creating art comforts her.

"This is my escape," she said of painting. "I literally hide from everybody and try not to answer the phone."

During the times when she wasn't able to paint, she created work in colored pencil and also

did some wood burning. Those pieces are also included in the show.

"I didn't want to make a mess that I'd have to clean up," she noted. "I have a studio, but with everybody being sick, I moved my art back into the office so I could be there for them."

King said some of her work is influenced by her husband being an Army Ranger veteran. Her father was also in the U.S. Marine Corps.

"All of my aunts and uncles served," she noted with a smile. "But I couldn't because I was too short, and they wouldn't let me."

An award-winning artist, one of her pieces, "Uncle Joe's Spaghetti," made it into the Missouri State Fair Top 50 in 2019. The painting, set in 1961, shows Uncle Joe dipping up spaghetti while her husband, a tiny infant, is held by his mother.

Her piece, "The Crossing," features a horse running through water.

It received first place in 2021 at Boonville Heritage Days.

"That was one of the most fun pieces I've ever done," she noted.

She also painted a couple of self-portraits, one that shows the fear of the show "The Walking Dead" and then one created during COVID-19.

King is also known for her face painting at special events. She will be at Bothwell State Park on Oct. 6.

"I raise money for St.

Jude's (Hospital)," she said. "I do that for donations. I paint for free, but they can donate to St. Jude's if they want."

Most of King's work is for sale; she can be contacted at 660-631-4416. The Municipal Building, 200 S. Osage Ave., is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Reza brings concert-style magic show to Warrensburg

WARRENSBURG — Reza, an illusionist, is bringing his world-class tour to Warrensburg next month.

Reza gained interest in magic in elementary school. He said he dreamed to be an entertainer one day.

"Every year, my parents bring me on vacation to Branson, Missouri, where I watched the magic shows," Reza said. "And so that kind of cultivated my interest over the years as a vacation destination. So now full circle, we have a residency that we get to put on throughout the

season and then we tour nationally internationally between those residency dates."

The show will contain illusions that include passing through the spinning blades of a real jet engine, a record-breaking recreation of Houdini's most famous stunt, and the appearance of a real helicopter, live on stage. The show is designed to be interactive with the audience as well.

"I really enjoy the interactive moments with the audience," Reza said. "We do well over 300 shows a year, and the part that is always different every single show is that is always exciting to me is how that audience is going to respond and react so the moments that we bring

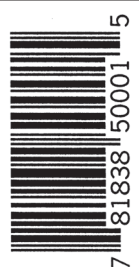
people up on stage from the audience."

American explorer thought he would die during 11-days in Turkish cave

ISTANBUL — An American researcher who spent 11 days stuck in a Turkish cave after falling ill said Thursday that he thought he would die there before a complex international rescue operation got him out.

Mark Dickey, 40, appeared relaxed as he spoke to reporters at a hospital in Mersin, southern Turkey, where he is recovering from his ordeal.

Asked if he ever gave up hope while trapped 1,000 meters (more than 3,000 feet) underground, Dickey replied, "No. But there's a difference between accurately recognizing your current risk against giving up.

"You don't let things become hopeless, but you recognize the fact that 'I'm going to die.'"

Dickey fell ill on Sept. 2 with stomach bleeding while mapping the Morca cave in southern Turkey's Taurus Mountains. He vomited blood and had lost large amounts of it and other fluids by the time rescuers brought him to the surface on Tuesday.

What caused his condi-

tion, which rendered him too frail to climb out of the cave on his own, remained unclear.

Dressed in a blue T-shirt and with an IV line plug attached to his hand, the experienced caver from Croton-on-Hudson, New York, thanked the Turkish government for acting "quickly, decisively" to get the medical supplies needed to sustain him down into the cave.

He also praised the international effort to save him. Teams from Turkey and several European countries mounted a challenging operation that involved pulling him up the cave's steep vertical sections and navigating through mud and cold water in the horizontal ones.

Rescuers had to widen some of the cave's narrow passages, install ropes to pull him up shafts on a stretcher and set up temporary camps along the way before the operation could begin. Medical personnel treated and monitored Dickey as teams comprised of a doctor and three to four other rescuers took turns staying by his side at all times.

"This honestly was an amazing rescue," Dickey,

who also is an experienced underground rescuer, said. "This was an amazing example of international collaboration, of what we can do together as a country, as a world."

Commenting on the "insane" public focus on his rescue, he added: "I really am blessed to be alive. It's been a tough time. While I was trapped underground — I was trapped for 11 days — I learned that I had a nation watching, hoping, praying that I would survive: Turkey."

In a later interview with ABC's "Good Morning America" show, Dickey recalled the moment he cleared the cave's entrance. "I was happy to get to the surface and see those stars and smell the fresh air. That was a good moment," he said.

He also paid tribute to fiancée Jessica Van Ord, who accompanied him on the expedition and left to obtain medical products that could be administered in the cave. "She made the climb out, she made the climb back in with the medical supplies," Dickey told the broadcaster. "The second she came into that cave camp at a thousand meters with four bags

worth of fluid, that was a game changer.

"She saved my life, period," he continued. "She is one hell of a woman, one hell of a caver, one hell of a rescuer, one hell of a paramedic. She's awesome."

Dickey will continue his recovery at Mersin City Hospital. Laughing and joking during his brief media conference on Thursday, he said he would "definitely" continue to explore caves.

"There's risk in all life and in this case, the medical emergency that occurred was completely unpredicted and unknown, and it was a one-off," he said, adding that he "would love to" return to Morca cave, Turkey's third deepest, to complete his task.

Around 190 people from Bulgaria, Croatia, Hungary, Italy, Poland and Turkey took part in the rescue, including doctors, paramedics and experienced cavers.

The Italian National Alpine and Speleological Corps said the rescue operation took more than 100 rescuers from around 10 counties a total of 60 hours and that Dickey was in the cave for roughly 500 hours.

Lemur on the loose! Police chase critter that escaped in Missouri

SPRINGFIELD, Mo. — Bounding through a darkened city park, a lemur managed to stay one step ahead of police officers armed only with a large towel.

Bodycam video shows the two officers' attempts to nab the speedy little primate, which made a dash for freedom Tuesday in Springfield, Missouri.

"We see the tail," one officer says with a chuckle as he tries to get closer.

Not giving up easily, the lemur raises its distinctive

black-and-white banded tail and dashes away. It sprints and weaves through a parking lot, down a sidewalk, across grass and around trees.

Eventually the officer tosses the towel like a net, but the lemur slips out and darts away.

"Dang it!" the officer exclaims, as a few civilians help try to corral the critter.

Finally, another officer is able to grab the lemur and hold it still as his partner gently gets it "snug-

gled up" in the towel, the Springfield Police Department said in a Facebook post.

The animal's owners had reported it missing, the department said, and were later reunited with it. But they won't be able to keep it — city ordinance bans having wild animals as pets.

Instead, police say the lemur has been connected with a local wildlife rescue agency where it will be "well cared for and loved."

New rules for WWII-era duck boats aim to improve safety after drownings

AP—Five years after 17 people died when a duck boat sank on a Missouri lake, the U.S. Coast Guard has issued new rules for the amphibious World War II vessels retrofitted for tourist excursions.

But the new rules have limited impact: Only 16 applicable vessels are still in use.

The interim rules posted Monday require removal of window coverings and canopies, or installation of a canopy that doesn't keep passengers from escaping if the boat floods or sinks.

The Missouri vessel, and an Arkansas duck boat that sank in 1999, killing 13 people, had overhead roofs or canopies that the National Transportation Safety Board warned could greatly increase the risk of passengers becoming trapped and drowning.

The new rules also include requirements for passengers to wear personal flotation devices, requirements for alarms and pumps, and they strengthen inspection regulations.

The rules apply only to repurposed World War II-era Army vessels now used for land-and-water tours — not newer vehicles built specifically for tourist trips. The 16 older vessels in use are operated by three companies, the rules document states. The Coast Guard didn't say where those

boats are, but 10 are part of one Arkansas fleet.

Duck boats have been involved in more than 40 fatal accidents since 1999. Among their critics is Jim Hall, a former NTSB chairman. He said the new set of rules is a good step, but long overdue.

"The significance of it, unfortunately, is lost in the years it has taken for it to be produced," Hall said.

Branson Ride the Ducks was a popular attraction in the Missouri tourism town. Though the weather was calm when the vehicle began its trip on July 19, 2018, forecasters had warned of an impending storm.

Video and audio from the boat, recovered by divers, showed that the lake was calm when the vessel entered the water. But a massive storm blew in, and within minutes, the boat sank. The 17 victims included nine members of one Indiana family.

The wind speed at the time of the accident was more than 70 mph (113 kph), just short of hurricane force, an NTSB investigation determined.

The vessel's captain and two business managers were charged with several felony counts, including manslaughter. Those cases have not gone to trial.

Fallout from the accident reverberated. Insurance costs rose sharply for operators. Duck boat rides ceased in Pittsburgh, Seattle and other places.

Branson Ride the

Ducks never reopened after the accident, and there are no plans to resume, said Suzanne Smagala-Potts, spokesperson for Ripley Entertainment, which operated the attraction. The company has settled 31 lawsuits.

A new duck boat attraction opened in Branson in 2022, but with vessels "custom-built for tourism, that have a great safety record," according to a statement from the operator, Branson Duck Tours.

Ten of the 16 remaining World War II-era vessels in operation are part of National Park Duck Tours in Hot Springs, Arkansas, which takes about 100,000 visitors each year on a tour of the historic downtown and a water ride around islands in Lake Hamilton. Operator Stacy Roberts said that in 31 years on the water, his vessels have never had an accident.

Roberts estimated it will cost about \$10,000 per vessel to make modifications required by the new rules.

"I don't have any problem meeting the new regulations," Roberts said. "But my vessels are safe as they are."

Roberts said safety of his fleet was scrutinized and upgraded after a competitor's duck boat sank in 1999, killing 13 people. The NTSB blamed inadequate maintenance and determined that the vessel built by the Army in 1944 wasn't designed for passenger service.

A Warm Place for the Least of These

Matthew 25:35-40 is that familiar passage in which Jesus tells his followers that when he was hungry, thirsty, naked, sick, a stranger, or imprisoned, they provided for him. Puzzled by this statement, they asked him when it was that they did all this. The answer was then and remains now that just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me. (Matt. 25:40)

Jesus also told them you always have the poor with you (Matt. 26:11) and so we have. The poor, our neighbors who struggle to meet the most basic needs of life are, indeed with us and some of our neighbors do not have homes. Some sleep outside or in cars. Some bounce from couch to couch, relying on favors from friends or family. Some of our neighbors have a place to live, but their home may be in poor condition and difficult to heat. When winter comes, some of our neighbors need a place to rest where it is warm.

A more than five years ago, a hand-

ful of people, most representing local congregations gathered to plan for the needs of those who lack a warm place to sleep, and the Warming Shelter was born. The 2023-2024 Warming Shelter will once again be located at St. Patrick's Chapel on the corner of 4th and Washington streets in Sedalia. The shelter will be open from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. on the coldest nights. The shelter already has plenty of cots and blankets, coffee and snacks, gloves, and socks. The shelter does not need things. The shelter needs help.

What the shelter really needs is YOU. The Warming Shelter depends on volunteer teams that stand ready to be present, to assist our neighbors and keep watch while they rest. The project currently has seven or eight teams, and more teams are needed. It takes six to 10 dedicated volunteers to make up a team. Teams work overnight, usually in two six-hour shifts or three four-hour shifts. Each shift includes at least two people, one man and one woman. The volunteers welcome guests, help them find cots and bedding, offer a snack or drink. In the morning, volunteers help the guests to put away the cots and clean up.

The shelter will be open under the

following conditions – on wet nights (rain or snow) when the air temperature is predicted to be 30 degrees; or lower, and on dry nights when the wind chill temperature is predicted to be 15 degrees or below. The National Weather Service forecast is used.

Some may wonder why the Warming Shelter is not open more than this. The answer is based on staffing. There are simply not enough teams working with the Warming Shelter for it to operate in less extreme weather. With more teams in place the Warming Shelter could be open on even more nights.

Warming Shelter teams are not limited to congregations. Philanthropic organizations, professional groups, clubs, or businesses may assemble a team. Flooding death toll soars to 11,300 in Libya's coastal city of Derna

DERNA, Libya — The death toll in Libya's coastal city of Derna has soared to 11,300 as search efforts continue following a massive flood fed by the breaching of two dams in heavy rains, the Libyan Red Crescent said Thursday. Marie el-Drese, the aid group's secretary-general, told The Associated Press by phone that a further 10,100 people are reported missing in the Mediterranean city. Health authorities previously put the death toll in Derna at 5,500. The storm also killed about 170 people elsewhere in the country.

The flooding swept away entire families in Derna on Sunday night and exposed vulnerabilities in the oil-rich country that has been mired in conflict since a 2011 uprising that toppled long-ruling dictator Moammar Gadhafi.

Here's a look at the latest developments.

WHAT HAPPENED IN LIBYA?

Daniel, an unusually strong Mediterranean storm, caused deadly flooding in communities across eastern Libya, but the worst-hit was Derna. As the storm pounded the coast Sunday night, residents said they heard loud explosions when two dams outside the

city collapsed. Floodwaters gushed down Wadi Derna, a valley that cuts through the city, crashing through buildings and washing people out to sea.

A U.N. official said Thursday that most casualties could have been avoided.

"If there would have been a normal operating meteorological service, they could have issued the warnings," World Meteorological Organization head Petteri Taalas told reporters in Geneva. "The emergency management authorities would have been able to carry out the evacuation."

The WMO said earlier this week that the National Meteorological Center issued warnings 72 hours before the flooding, notifying all governmental authorities by email and through media.

Officials in eastern Libya warned the public about the coming storm, and on Saturday, they ordered residents to evacuate coastal areas, fearing a surge from the sea. But there was no warning about the dams collapsing.

HOW DOES CONFLICT IN LIBYA AFFECT THE DISASTER?

The startling devastation reflected the storm's intensity, but also Libya's vulnerability. Oil-rich Libya has been divided between rival govern-

ments for most of the past decade — one in the east, the other in the capital, Tripoli — and one result has been the widespread neglect of infrastructure.

The two dams that collapsed outside Derna were built in the 1970s. A report by a state-run audit agency in 2021 said the dams had not been maintained despite the allocation of more than 2 million euros for that purpose in 2012 and 2013.

Libya's Tripoli-based prime minister, Abdul-Hamid Dbeibah, acknowledged the maintenance issues during a Cabinet meeting Thursday and called on the Public Prosecutor to open an urgent investigation into the dams' collapse.

The disaster brought a rare moment of unity, as government agencies across the country rushed to help the affected areas.

While the Tobruk-based government of eastern Libya is leading relief efforts, the Tripoli-based western government allocated the equivalent of \$412 million for reconstruction in Derna and other eastern towns, and an armed group in Tripoli sent a convoy with humanitarian aid.

WHAT'S HAPPENING TODAY?

Derna has begun burying its dead, mostly

in mass graves, said eastern Libya's health minister, Othman Abdaljaleel earlier Thursday.

More than 3,000 bodies were buried by Thursday morning, the minister said, while another 2,000 were still being processed. He said most of the dead were buried in mass graves outside Derna, while others were transferred to nearby towns and cities.

Abduljaleel said rescue teams were still searching wrecked buildings in the city center, and divers were combing the sea off Derna.

Untold numbers could be buried under drifts of mud and debris, including overturned cars and chunks of concrete, that rise up to four meters (13 feet) high. Rescuers have struggled to bring in heavy equipment as the floods washed out or blocked roads leading to the area.

Libya's eastern based parliament, The House of Representatives, on Thursday approved an emergency budget of 10 billion Libyan dinars — roughly \$2 billion — to address the flooding and help those affected.

HOW MANY PEOPLE HAVE BEEN KILLED?

As of Thursday, the Libyan Red Crescent said that 11,300 people have been killed, and a further 10,100 are reported missing.

However, local officials suggested that the death toll could be much higher than announced.

In comments to the Saudi-owned Al Arabia television station on Thursday, Derna Mayor Abdel-Moneim al-Ghaithi said the tally could climb to 20,000 given the number of neighborhoods that were washed out.

The storm also killed around 170 people in other parts of eastern Libya, including the towns of Bayda, Susa, Um Razaz and Marj, the health minister said.

The dead in eastern Libya included at least 84 Egyptians, whose remains were transferred to their home country on Wednesday. More than 70 came from one village in the southern province of Beni Suef. Libyan media also said dozens of Sudanese migrants were killed in the disaster.

IS HELP REACHING SURVIVORS?

The floods have displaced at least 30,000 people in Derna, according to the U.N.'s International Organization for Migration, and several thousand others were forced to leave their homes in other eastern towns, it said.

The floods destroyed or destroyed many access roads to Derna, hampering the arrival of international rescue teams and humanitarian assistance. Local author-

ities were able to clear some routes, and humanitarian convoys have been able to enter the city over the past couple of days.

The U.N. humanitarian office issued an emergency appeal for \$71.4 million to respond to urgent needs of 250,000 Libyans most affected. The office, known as OCHA, estimated that approximately 884,000 people in five provinces live in areas directly affected by the rain and flooding.

The International Committee of the Red Cross said Thursday that it has provided 6,000 body bags to local authorities, as well as medical, food and other supplies distributed to hard-hit communities.

International aid started to arrive earlier this week in Benghazi, 250 kilometers (150 miles) west of Derna. Several countries have sent aid and rescue teams, including neighboring Egypt, Algeria and Tunisia. Italy dispatched a naval vessel on Thursday carrying humanitarian aid and two navy helicopters to be used for search and rescue operations.

President Joe Biden said the United States would send money to relief organizations and coordinate with Libyan authorities and the United Nations to provide additional support.

Israel's Netanyahu to meet Elon Musk as X faces antisemitism controversy

JERUSALEM — Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu will meet billionaire businessman Elon Musk during a trip to the United States next week, the Israeli leader's office said Thursday.

Netanyahu's office said their meeting, which is scheduled for Monday, will include discussions about artificial intelligence. It comes at a time when Musk is facing accusations of tolerating antisemitic messages on his social media platform X, formerly known as Twitter.

The Anti-Defamation League, a prominent Jewish civil-rights organization, has accused Musk of allowing antisemitism and hate speech to spread on X. Its director, Jonathan Greenblatt,

said Musk had "amplified" the messages of neo-Nazis and white supremacists who want to ban the league by engaging with them recently on X.

In a Sept. 4 post, Musk claimed that the league was "trying to kill this platform by falsely accusing it & me of being anti-Semitic." In other posts, he said the league was responsible for a 60% drop in revenue at X and said his company would have "no choice" but to file a defamation lawsuit against the group.

"Oh the irony!" he wrote. As of Thursday, he has not followed through on this threat.

X, however, did file a lawsuit against another group that has studied the proliferation of hate speech on the platform.

In August, it sued the nonprofit Center for Countering Digital Hate, accusing it of violating X's terms of service by improperly collecting a vast amount of data for its analysis. The lawsuit claims the group's research highlighting an increase in hate speech on the former Twitter since Musk took over cost the company millions of dollars of advertising revenue.

But analysts who track Twitter have argued that Musk's chaotic changes to the platform — including jettisoning its well-known brand name — have led to a decline in interest from advertisers.

Greenblatt says his group is "willing to work" with X and last week met with the company's chief executive, Linda Yaccarino. Both Musk

and Yaccarino have recently posted messages saying they oppose antisemitism.

Netanyahu's office said his first U.S. stop — in San Francisco — will include meetings with other tech leaders to discuss artificial intelligence. It did not identify the executives.

From there, he heads to New York, where he is scheduled to address the United Nations General Assembly and meet with President Joe Biden and other world leaders, his office said. They include German Chancellor Olaf Scholz, Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, as well as South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol and U.N. Secretary-General António Guterres.

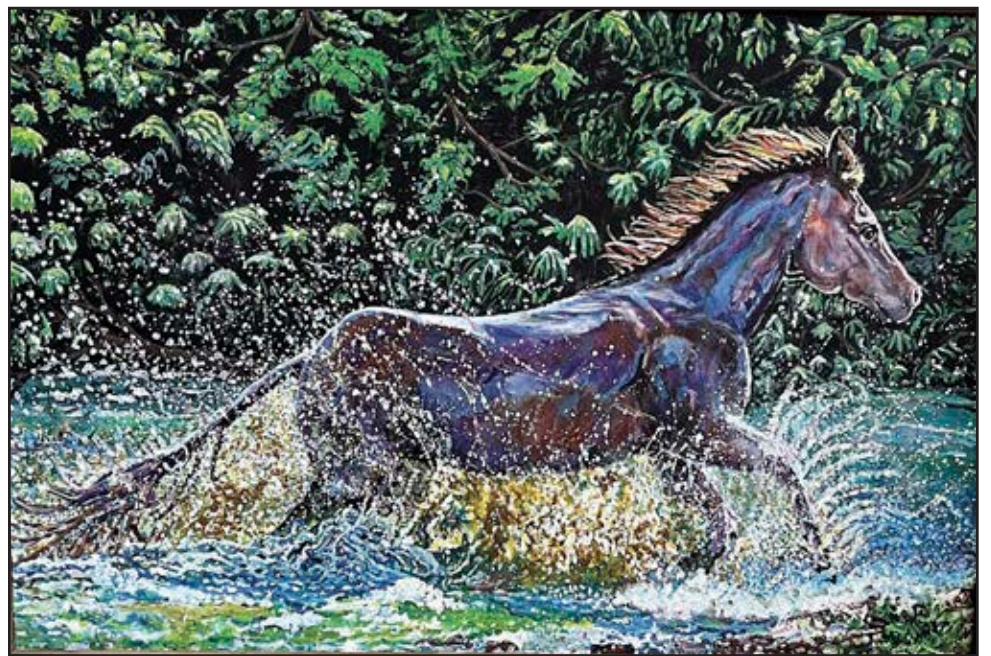

"It's not as much of a nervous energy, it's just excitement," Reza said. "It's always the best part of my day, being on stage. It doesn't matter if it's a crowd of 1,000 people or last month we had 14,000 people at one single show and the nerves are never there. It's always just the excitement of feeding off of a live crowd and the energy of that crowd."

To set his shows apart from traditional shows, Reza developed his own style. He said attending his show is "like a rock concert meets a magic show."

"To break the barrier to a successful career, I had to figure out a way to make it unique," Reza said. "So I started designing my own illusions to create magic that had never been seen before and also create a style that was unique as well. So all of that has been a brand that we've developed over the years, to stand out from those apart from other ma-

gicians in the industry."

Reza said he hopes his shows will give everyone a chance to escape from everyday life and experience the joy and wonder of magic.

"I feel like it's just a unique experience to see something impossible," Reza said. "We have so much going on in our everyday lives that could be stressful and cause negative feelings. So to come together like this, it's just two hours that you don't have to worry about anything."

"And no matter what age you are, you can feel like a kid again. And so that's a unique experience I think, to bring people and bring joy and happiness and excitement and all those things like to look out in the audience and see all those things taking place."

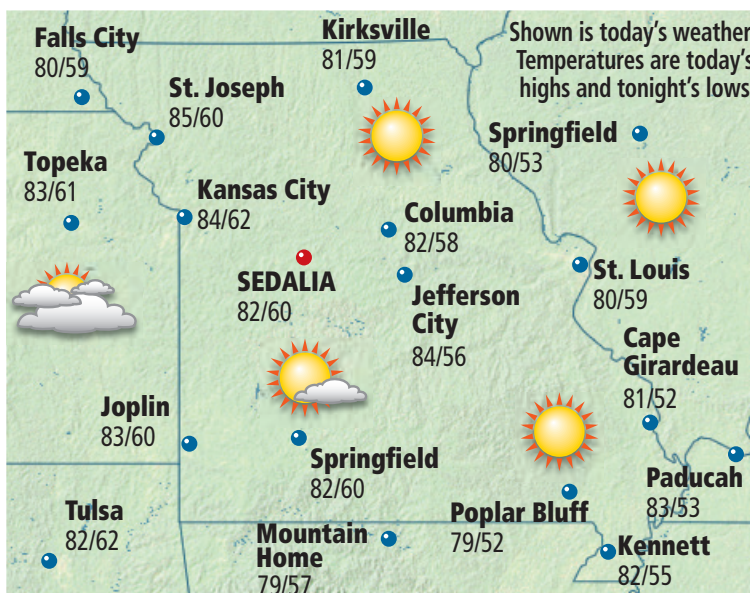

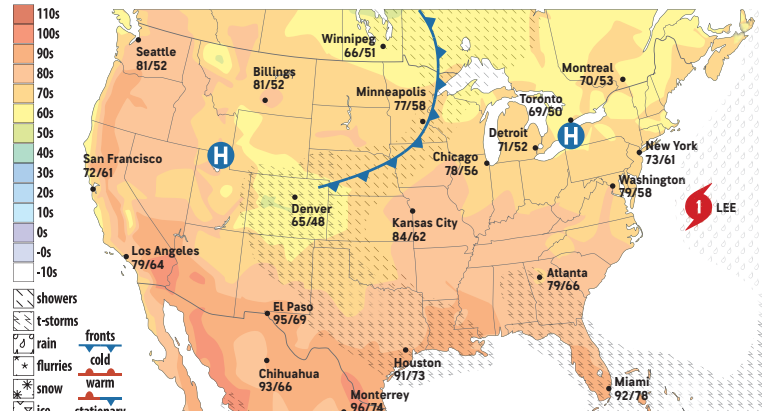

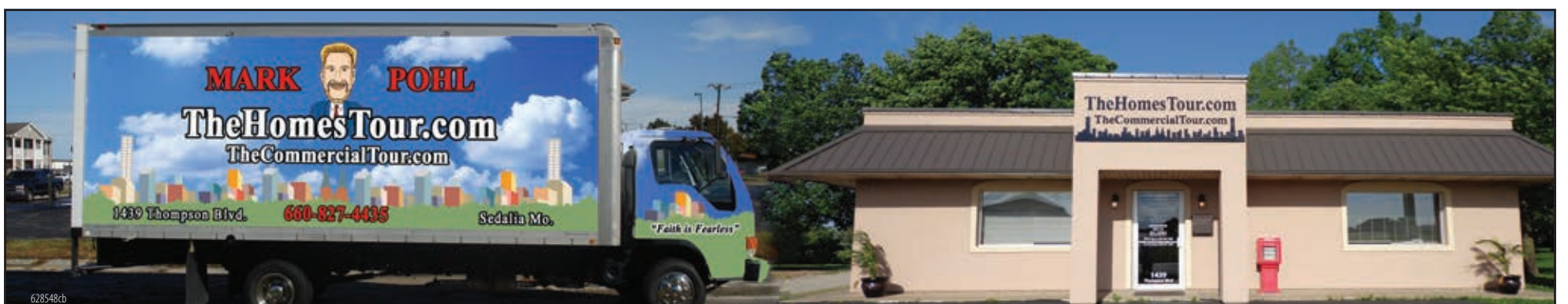

Largest US newspaper chain draws ire for hiring Taylor Swift and Beyoncé reporters

LOS ANGELES — This week the United States' biggest newspaper chain posted to its site two unusual job listings: a Taylor Swift reporter and a Beyoncé reporter.

Gannett, which owns more than 200 daily papers, will employ these new hires through USA Today and The Tennessean, the company's Nashville-based newspaper. The chain is looking for "modern storytellers" adept in print, audio and visual journalism, said Michael Anastasi, The Tennessean's editor and Gannett's vice president for local news.

"Seeing both the facts and the fury, the Taylor Swift reporter will identify why the pop star's influence only expands, what her fanbase stands for in pop culture, and the effect she has across the music and business worlds," the company said in its job description.

Similarly, the company wants a journalist who can capture Beyoncé's effect on society and the industries in which she operates.

Anastasi said the Tennessean already has a three-person music team and "I put our sophisticated coverage up against anybody." Gannett is always looking for opportunities to make itself essential for paying customers, he said.

Critics of the new roles cited layoffs at Gannett, where the workforce has shrunk 47% in the last three years because of layoffs and attrition, according to the NewsGuild. At some newspapers, the union said the headcount has fallen by as much as 90%. Last year alone, Gannett cut about 6% of its roughly 3,440-person U.S. media division.

Some journalists said that while hiring these massively popular artist-specific roles reflect their influence in pop culture, they do fail to invest in local journalism at a company known for its local dailies.

"At a time when so much serious news and local reporting is being cut, it's a decision to raise some questions about," Rick Edmonds, an expert at the journalism think tank Poynter Institute, said

of the new positions.

Said Anastasi: "We're not hiring a Taylor Swift reporter at the expense of other reporters."

Some journalists criticized the job listings for presenting superfan behavior as a full-time journalism job. Music writer Jeremy Gordon said on social media that it "doesn't feel great to see 'full-time stan' go out as an actual journalism job." ("Stan" is slang for superfan.)

If the hire acts more like a fan than a journalist, the decision could backfire on Gannett. But if the job is done well, and the reporters can penetrate tightly controlled operations to glean insights, they can establish themselves as national authorities on important cultural figures.

Representatives for Swift and Beyoncé did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

Omiseke Tinsley, academic and author of "Beyoncé in Formation: Remixing Black Feminism," says this type of role makes space for more positive stories about Black women.

But also, she adds, the

existence of both jobs directly reflects Beyoncé and Swift's economic power. "If there wasn't that component to it, there wouldn't be a Beyoncé reporter," Tinsley said.

It is not uncommon for journalists to develop a beat on a specific figure, particularly in politics — as evidenced by Amy Chozick, whom the New York Times hired in 2013 to cover Hillary Clinton exclusively. But most entertainment journalists are responsible for reporting on a wide range of talent — even if they are subject matter experts on a specific artist.

That was the case for Los Angeles Times reporter Suzy Exposito, who called herself an "unofficial" beat reporter on popular reggaetonero Bad Bunny because she spent a disproportionate amount of time in a previous job covering him compared to other priorities.

"His near-weekly output became really overwhelming, and it took away focus from a lot of other artists who were also making compelling work," Exposito said. "He's so prolific that I think I literally ran

out of new words to describe him at some point. He could use his own reporter, too."

She said a major challenge for entertainment journalists is the sheer volume of releases from pop artists. "The business of music is a numbers game," Exposito said. "Hit records become deluxe editions become sold-out world tours, and it can be dizzying for a general music journalist to keep up."

So, are artist-specific jobs the future of music journalism?

"It is a bit odd, but Taylor Swift Inc., I guess you would call it, is a big economic driver right now," said Eric Grode, director of the Goldring Arts Journalism and Communications program at Syracuse University. "Taylor Swift is doing a lot of newsworthy things beyond just selling concert tickets."

If a reporter takes the job seriously and provides more than breathless concert coverage, their established expertise could be valuable for a news organization, Grode said. Still, there are very few musicians who have such a wide cultural reach.

The likelihood of fans to click on stories about Swift or Beyoncé makes it an obvious motivating factor in designing the new jobs, Exposito said.

"Digital media is now competing with fan accounts on social media — not when it comes to accuracy, but when it comes to being the first source to report on pop stars' developments," she said.

Top artists prioritize the attention and work of expert reporters, leading to what critic Soraya Roberts has called a "culture of sameness" — yet another barrier to local arts coverage.

Tinsley believes that posts on social media criticizing the focus of these new roles may reflect a culture of sexism.

"Adding to the pantheon of what figures and representatives matter has the potential to do something important," she said. "I believe some of the dismissals (of these roles) have to do with what we value and don't value as a society — and I think there's an implicit misogyny in it."

After days of heavy rain and flooding in New England, Hurricane Lee is up next

PORTLAND, Maine — Days of wild weather that produced torrential rain, flooding, sinkholes and a tornado in New England could be a prelude to something more dangerous lurking offshore — Hurricane Lee.

As the Category 1 system swirled southwest of Bermuda, Maine Gov. Janet Mills declared a state of emergency on Thursday, and the state was under its first hurricane watch in 15 years. The water-logged region prepared for 20-foot (6-meter) waves and wind gusts up to 70 mph (112 kph), along with more rain.

A dangerous storm surge was projected for Friday evening for Massachusetts' Cape Cod Bay and Nantucket Island, while the brunt of the storm was to arrive early Saturday.

Although Lee did not contribute to the recent flooding, it threatened to exacerbate conditions in a region that is already much too wet.

The Coast Guard and emergency management agencies warned New England residents to be prepared, and utility companies brought in reinforcements to deal with power outages. At Boothbay Harbor Marina in Maine, the community came together to remove boats from the water to keep them out of harm's way.

"It's a batten-down-the-hatches kind of day," owner Kim Gillies said Thursday.

Similar scenes played out at Kennebunkport Marina, where crews planned to take 100 boats out of the water, said Cathy Norton, marina manager.

Commercial lobster fisherman Steve Train said fishermen have been sinking gear in deeper water

to protect against storm damage. Fishing boats were also headed to the safety of harbors.

In Canada, where the remnants of Hurricane Fiona a year ago washed houses into the ocean, knocked out power to most of two provinces and swept a 72-year-old woman into the sea, residents of western Nova Scotia and southern New Brunswick were warned to prepare for power outages and flooding this weekend.

New Brunswick Minister of Public Safety Kris Austin urged residents to assemble a 72-hour safety kit that included batteries, water, food, medication and a radio.

In her emergency declaration on Thursday, the governor urged people to take the storm seriously and to make preparations. Mills, a Democrat, also asked President Joe Biden to issue a preemptive presidential disaster declaration to give the state access to federal resources.

Earlier in the week, the region saw 10 inches (25 centimeters) of rain over six hours. Tornado warnings were posted Wednesday for communities in Massachusetts and Rhode Island, and more heavy rain opened up sinkholes and brought devastating flooding to several areas.

The National Weather Service in Boston confirmed Thursday that damage to trees and power lines in Rhode Island and Connecticut the day before was consistent with a tornado. In Lincoln, Rhode Island, photos taken after the storm showed that at least one roof was damaged, and the press box at the high school stadium tipped into the bleachers.

At midday Thursday, Lee was spinning 245 miles (395 kilometers) southwest of Bermuda, with maximum

sustained winds of 90 mph, according to the National Hurricane Center. It was traveling north on a path that could lead to landfall in Nova Scotia, possibly as a tropical storm, forecasters said.

The system threatened to bring a mixed bag of threats. Ocean waves as tall as 20 feet could lash the coast, damaging structures and causing erosion; powerful wind gusts could knock down trees weakened by a wet summer; and rain could cause flash flooding in a region where the soil is already saturated, said Louise

Fode, a National Weather Service meteorologist in Maine.

The state's eastern coast — known as the Down East region — and the coast of Nova Scotia was expected to bear the brunt of the storm, though the track could shift before the system arrives, Fode said.

One thing working in the region's favor: The storm surge will not be accompanied by an astronomical high tide, helping to lower the risk, she said.

New England has experienced its share of flooding this summer, including a

storm that dumped up to two months of rain in two days in Vermont in July, resulting in two deaths. Scientists are finding that storms around the world are forming in a warmer atmosphere, making extreme rainfall more frequent.

Massachusetts Gov. Maura Healey issued a state of emergency late Tuesday following "catastrophic flash flooding and property damage" in two counties and other communities. The torrential downpour in a six-hour period was a "200-year event," said Matthew Belk, a meteorologist

with the National Weather Service in Boston.

The state is monitoring the conditions of dams, the governor said, and she urged residents to stay off the roads when ordered.

The rain created several sinkholes in Leominster, Massachusetts, including one at a car dealership where several vehicles were swallowed up. In Providence, Rhode Island, downpours flooded a parking lot and parts of a shopping mall. Firefighters used inflatable boats to rescue more than two dozen people stranded in cars.

WARRENSBURG — Mules football wide receiver Arkell Smith went into the 2023 season ready for takeoff.

The flight has gone to plan so far. Through two games, the sixth-year senior leads the MIAA in receiving yardage while sitting No. 4 in NCAA Division II.

“He’s endured a lot of things here at the University of Central Missouri,” Central Missouri head coach Josh Lamberson said. “A coaching change, some lean years. COVID. He stuck it out through and through ... Really, he is just focussed on the give. Now he’s getting, which is a gratifying thing for us.”

Smith has 300 receiving yards and four touchdowns to his name off 20 receptions.

He had nine catches for 152 yards and three touchdowns against Central Oklahoma on Sept. 9, earning him MIAA Offensive Athlete of the Week recognition for week two.

His scores against the Bronchos included receptions of 12, 21 and 27 yards. The last two touchdowns arrived in the second half.

Smith credits the success to first-year offensive coordinator/wide receivers coach Justin Bane.

“With our scheme, we just wanted to wear them down,” Smith said. “Quick offense and over the top. In the second half I think they just kind of folded and it opened it up for us.”

Smith sits as one of 11 different Mules to have caught a pass this season.

Redshirt sophomore Jack Pospisil, redshirt junior Demarcus Gregory and redshirt sophomore Michael Fitzgerald each have more than 100 yards of receiving with redshirt senior Zion Perry and sophomore Price Morgan right outside the range.

The core has assisted the Mules to the top of the MIAA and No. 2 in Division II in total offense with 554.5 yards per game, including 446 yards per game in the air.

Whatever uncertainty fans might have had that striker Alan Pulido would remain with Sporting Kansas City beyond 2023 were put to rest Thursday afternoon.

Kansas State made quick work of Missouri a year ago, when the old conference foes renewed their rivalry in Manhattan, Kansas.

Well, it would have been quick if not for the driving rainstorm and hour-long lightning delay.

All it did was make the dreary day even worse for Tigers coach Eli Drinkwitz, whose team was soundly beaten by the Wildcats in their first matchup since Missouri bolted the Big 12 for the SEC. Brady Cook struggled through the air,

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — Doug Pederson has known Andy Reid for nearly 30 years.

He played for Reid in Green Bay (1996-98) and then Philadelphia (1999). He spent seven years coaching under Reid in Philadelphia (2009-12) and then Kansas City (2013-15).

They share offensive philosophies, coaching principles and core beliefs.

They’ll share the field for the third time in 10 months when Pederson and the Jacksonville Jaguars (1-0) host Reid and the Kansas City Chiefs (0-1) on Sunday. And Pederson is still looking for a breakthrough victory against his mentor and close friend.

“I got a ton of respect for Coach Reid and his career and what he’s done,” Pederson said Wednesday. “I’ve played for him.

I worked for him and obviously you’d love to eventually win a football game against him.”

Pederson is 0-3 in head-to-head matchups against Reid, with all three of those played at Arrowhead Stadium in Kansas City.

The Chiefs beat Pederson and Philadelphia 27-20 in Week 2 of the 2017 season; the Eagles rebounded and ultimately won the Super Bowl. The Chiefs swept the Jaguars last season, winning 27-17 in Week 10 and 27-20 in the divisional round of the AFC playoffs.

Pederson still laments the most recent one. His defense gave up a 98-yard drive with Patrick Mahomes (sprained ankle) sidelined in the second quarter. His offense had two chances to tie the game in the third and couldn’t move the ball past midfield, and then turned the ball over twice in the fourth.

Red Sox fire executive Bloom amidst stumble toward another last-place finish

BOSTON — The Boston Red Sox fired Chief Baseball Officer Chaim Bloom on Thursday as the team stumbled toward a third last-place finish in four seasons.
 The team made the announcement before the start of a doubleheader against the New York Yankees, who took the first two games of the series to drop Boston into a tie for last.
 "The decision was not made lightly or easily," President & CEO Sam Kennedy read from a prepared statement before his press conference. "We all know where we are in the standings. It's a painful reality that fans feel as deeply as we do. Our fans deserve a winning, competitive team that consistently plays postseason baseball."
 Bloom was hired from the Tampa Bay Rays to help revive the farm system and bring financial stability to a team that was one of baseball's biggest spenders. One of his first moves was to trade 2018 AL MVP Mookie Betts, a year before he was eligible for free agency, on a mandate from ownership to get the payroll in order.
 But the return for


Betts was unspectacular — outfielder Alex Verdugo and some prospects that have not panned out — and other moves have failed to yield results at the major league level. Bloom also watched shortstop Xander Bogaerts, whom the organization developed into a four-time All-Star, depart as a free agent.
 "I think we've always been consistent, trying to build, build that farm system, but win at the major league level has always been a priority," Kennedy said. "Obviously, the past two seasons we haven't been there and the change was made."
 Entering Thursday's doubleheader, the Red Sox were 267-262 in Bloom's tenure, with a trip to the AL Championship Series in 2021.
 "It's hard to say it's not related to results because that's what this is all about," Kennedy said. "We're aiming for World Series championships. That's it. That's the aim, that's the goal. We're here to win World Series championships. While we're here, we're not going to waste this opportunity. That's what the Boston Red Sox are all about."
 Kennedy said Bloom was informed of the decision by

owner John Henry, Chairman Tom Werner and himself Thursday morning.
 The team said general manager Brian O'Halloran "has been offered a new senior leadership position within the baseball operations department."
 O'Halloran will run the department in the interim, along with assistant general managers Eddie Romero, Raquel Ferreira and Michael Gropman.
 After going 86 years without a World Series championship, the Red Sox have won four since 2004, the most for anyone this century.
 But they've done it with three different baseball bosses — Theo Epstein (2004, '07), Ben Cherington ('13) and Dave Dombrowski ('18) — and five different managers over that span as the team rode a roller coaster that has also seen it finish last in the AL East five times since 2012.
 "We expected a team that would be in this thing, a post-season contender and unfortunately we all know we feel short of that," Kennedy said. "We are in the results business. Results, ultimately, always matter."
 Epstein is not a candidate to return, Kennedy said.

Man U's Ten Hag hit by slew of problems in troubled start to season

MANCHESTER, England — Manchester United has been beset with problems on and off the field, and the Premier League season is only four games old.

After already losing twice, results and performances have been disappointing; particularly when manager Erik ten Hag was expected to mount more of a challenge to defending champion Manchester City in his second year in charge.

Off the field, it has been even more turbulent.

Amid a backlash from fans, United eventually decided to part ways with Mason Greenwood, six months after a criminal investigation of attempted rape was closed by prosecutors.

The club then had to contend with allegations of domestic abuse made against Brazil winger Antony, who has been given a leave of absence to address the claims.

Meanwhile, United said on Thursday that Jadon Sancho would train away from the first team over a disciplinary issue.

Sancho used social media to air his grievances by saying he had been made a "scapegoat" after being cut from United's squad for its last game before the international break, a 3-1 loss to Arsenal.

All of that comes at the same time as uncertainty continues to surround the ownership of the club, 10 months after it was put on the market.

Regarding the on-field matters, Ten Hag is also dealing with a spate of injuries to key players including Mason Mount, Luke Shaw and Raphael Varane.

In that sense, a two-week pause for international soccer might have been a welcome relief to the Dutch coach. The visit of Brighton to Old Trafford on Saturday, however, represents the potential of another setback for a United team that has looked vulnerable so far this season.

After all, Brighton beat United home and away last season and inflicted a first defeat on Ten Hag in his opening game as manager.

The south coast club seems serene in comparison to the troubles at United, but has had to handle its own upheaval over the past year after losing star players, its manager and a key executive. Still, the club has continued to over-perform, qualifying for this season's Europa League and unearthing more talent in highly-rated striker Evan Ferguson.

Brighton has become a benchmark of how to run a soccer club well, with an outstanding recruitment set up and savvy, imaginative managerial hires.

In the last transfer window it brought in about \$204 million in sales, with midfielders Moises Caicedo and Alexis Mac Allister the big departures. Last season, it made sales worth about \$148 million, with Marc Cucurella, Yves Bissouma and Leandro Trossard making moves to Premier League rivals.

Manager Graham Potter was lured away by Chelsea, as well as recruitment chief Paul Winstanley. Yet Brighton secured its highest top flight position, finishing sixth under Potter's replacement, Roberto De Zerbi, advanced to the semifinals of the FA Cup and qualified for Europe.

"We are always prepared for a head coach suddenly leaving for whatever reason," Brighton owner Tony Bloom said this week. "But until you bring one in and see how they settle, you really don't know how they are going to work out. We were extremely fortunate that we got someone of such high quality as Roberto to come in."

Brighton's preparation for upheaval appears to be the secret to its success, six years after it was promoted to the top flight. There is an expectation that the league's biggest clubs will try to lure its best talent, as was the case when Chelsea signed Caicedo and Mac Allister joined Liverpool.

"It was not unexpected that Alexis and Moises

have left the club in the summer," Bloom said. "But we've been prepared for a number of months."

"I prefer to be in the situation where lots of clubs and lots of the media are talking about our players, which means we're doing something right as a club and obviously those players are performing really well on the pitch."

Ferguson, who scored a hat trick in Brighton's 3-1 win against Newcastle before the international break, has already been linked with a move to United.

It's a measure of Brighton's growing ambition that it has signed highly-rated Barcelona forward Ansu Fati on a season-long loan.

United is still trying to recover from a series of mistakes made in the transfer market since Alex Ferguson retired as manager in 2013. It has been 10 years since the storied club won its last league title, but there is encouragement Ten Hag is moving it in the right direction after finishing third last year, qualifying for the Champions League and winning the League Cup.

The former Ajax coach's impressive first year in charge gave rise to hope he could mount a credible title challenge this season.

That could yet materialize, but it has been far from the start he would have wanted.

Ravens' Jackson healthy this time for road game with Bengals

BALTIMORE — When the Baltimore Ravens' season came down to two big games at Cincinnati eight months ago, Lamar Jackson was absent with a knee injury.

"Very tough," the star quarterback said this week. "One, I was injured. Two, I wasn't able to travel with my guys and support them. Just being out of the game, that's not something I want to do ever again."

Jackson is back and healthy, and the Ravens are hoping for a different result in this week's visit to Cincinnati. Last season, Baltimore still had a chance to host a first-round playoff game before dropping its finale 27-16 to the Bengals. In the postseason, the same teams played at the same site — and with Jackson again out,

the Ravens lost 24-17.

Cincinnati is the two-time defending champion of the AFC North, and Jackson's late-season injuries have played a role in that. The Bengals also drubbed Baltimore 41-21 on the day after Christmas in 2021, with Josh Johnson playing quarterback for the Ravens.

Baltimore was more competitive with Cincinnati defensively last season. The Ravens beat the Bengals 19-17 in October, and the playoff game was close even with Jackson watching from afar.

The key play in that game was Tyler Huntley's fumble on a quarterback sneak at the goal line, which Cincinnati's Sam Hubbard returned 98 yards for a tiebreaking touchdown.

"I feel like it was my fault a little bit, because I had to go use the restroom,"

Jackson said. "Get up, and by the time I'm walking to the bathroom, I'm hearing cheers. I'm like, 'What happened? What happened?' I look, and (No.) 94 running the other way. I almost hit my screen."

Jackson is 6-1 in seven starts against Cincinnati. Since he entered the NFL, Baltimore is 0-4 against the Bengals with any other starting quarterback, including the postseason.

"We lost a couple times, but I feel like we played strong games," running back Gus Edwards said. "We were in those games until the very end, and with Lamar back, we have our leader back."

Both Jackson and Bengals quarterback Joe Burrow received big new contracts recently, but neither was all that good in Week 1. Jackson turned the ball over twice in a 25-9 win over Houston,

and Burrow threw for only 82 yards in a 24-3 loss to Cleveland.

It's not as though this is a must-win for Cincinnati, which also started 0-2 last season, but taking a two-game lead over the Bengals would be big for the Ravens. Baltimore plays three divisional road games in the first five weeks, starting with this one.

Although Jackson is fine, the Ravens are already feeling the weight of injuries. They lost running back J.K. Dobbins to a torn Achilles tendon last weekend. Safety Marcus Williams (pectoral), cornerback Marlon Humphrey (foot), center Tyler Linderbaum (ankle) and tackle Ronnie Stanley (knee) have not practiced this week.

Tight end Mark Andrews (quadriceps) missed the first game and has been limited in practice this week.

Analysis: Acuña vs. Betts showdown for NL MVP highlights MLB's award races

Ronald Acuña Jr. has the kind of numbers that make the young Atlanta Braves star a no-doubter for the National League MVP award.

Then again, so does Dodgers standout Mookie Betts and his teammate, Freddie Freeman.

It's getting close to the postseason for Major League Baseball, which also means it's close to award season. Some of the races are tighter than others, and it appears the NL MVP race is a particularly epic chase.

Acuña has been the favorite for months. He's the catalyst for a robust Braves offense that leads the big leagues by scoring nearly six runs per game. The 25-year-old outfielder even created his very own club this season, becoming the one and only player in MLB history with at least 30 homers and 60 stolen bases.

Who could beat that?

Well, Betts is certainly trying. The 2018 AL MVP has somehow put himself into the discussion with a stellar second half that has propelled the Dodgers to the top of the NL West. He's batting .311 with 37 doubles, 39 homers, 103 RBIs and 11 stolen bases — all while moving between right field, second base and even shortstop.

If advanced metrics are your thing, Betts has a 7.9 Wins Above Replacement while Acuña

is at 7.3, according to FanGraphs.

Then there's Freeman, the 2020 NL MVP, who is batting .339 with 55 doubles, 26 homers, 93 RBIs and 18 stolen bases.

NL MVP

The favorite: Acuña Jr.
In the mix: Betts, Freeman, Matt Olson (Braves).

The race: It still feels like Acuña is a sizable favorite thanks to a combination of speed and power that's never been seen in the big leagues. Betts and Freeman are also poised to receive plenty of love from voters. And let's take a minute to appreciate Olson, a 51-homer first baseman who has been a force all season.

AL MVP

The favorite: Shohei Ohtani, Los Angeles Angels.

In the mix: Corey Seager (Rangers), Marcus Semien (Rangers), Kyle Tucker (Astros).

The race: Ohtani's likely got this one wrapped up. His two-way prowess was derailed by a torn elbow ligament in August, but for five months, he treated baseball fans to one of the most impressive performances in MLB history. Seager and Semien have been fantastic for a Rangers team that is vastly improved but backsliding in September. Tucker has emerged as an under-the-radar star for the defending World Series champ.

NL CY YOUNG

The favorite: Blake

In the mix: Zac Gallen (Diamondbacks), Justin Steele (Cubs), Spencer Strider (Braves).

The race: This one is still up for grabs in the season's final weeks. Snell probably has the best overall numbers, but he'll be hurt by the fact that the Padres have underachieved this season. Gallen recently pitched a shutout against the Cubs, helping his case, but he was knocked around by the Mets on Wednesday. Speaking of the Cubs, Steele has come out of nowhere to be the ace for the surprising playoff contenders. Strider's ERA has crept upward

over the past month, but it's hard to ignore those 250 strikeouts.

AL CY YOUNG

The favorite: Gerrit Cole, New York Yankees.

In the mix: Luis Castillo (Mariners), Sonny Gray (Twins).

The race: The Yankees have been a huge disappointment this season, but it's not Cole's fault. The veteran right-hander has a 13-4 record, 2.79 ERA and 204 strikeouts. Castillo has been a key cog for the Mariners, who have made an unlikely charge up the standings since they were sellers at the trade deadline.

Steer, McClain and Elly De La Cruz are among several young Reds who have made an immediate impact in the big leagues. At 30 years old, Senga isn't a classic rookie, but has been among the bright spots

Jets' Wilson stepping in for Rodgers with renewed confidence, swagger

FLORHAM PARK, N.J. — Zach Wilson was in the middle of the locker room Thursday talking about taking over for the injured Aaron Rodgers when a teammate shouted and made the New York Jets quarterback grin.

“Zach, we love you, bro!”

It was a light moment, but one that was telling.

Wilson struggled mightily during his first two NFL seasons and his confidence took a massive hit, and so did his popularity in the locker room. He was benched twice last season and his playing future — particularly with the Jets — was uncertain when New York acquired Rodgers in April. The No. 2 overall pick in the 2021 draft was no longer the face of the franchise.

But Wilson insisted he would soak up as much football knowledge as he could from the sideline and learn from Rodgers, the four-time NFL MVP and one-time Super Bowl winner. He found himself back in the huddle after just four snaps with Rodgers out for the season with a torn left Achilles tendon suffered in the Jets' season-opening overtime win over Buffalo.

Suddenly, the spotlight is back on Zach.

“One step at a time, one play at a time,” Wilson said. “And I think it's trusting the guys around

me.”

Wilson had some shaky moments Monday night when he came in for Rodgers, finishing 14 of 21 for 140 yards and a touchdown with an interception. But he was able to make plays under pressure, too, and the short passes to get out of trouble — something that was such an issue last season — were also there.

All that, from the Jets' perspective, is progress.

“I'll tell you, my respect for him is off the charts,” said offensive coordinator Nathaniel Hackett, in his first season with the Jets. “For a guy to not have any practice to come in there and execute the way that he did, it's so great to see.”

Defensive coordinator Jeff Ulbrich knew Wilson would be OK when he looked across the locker room at halftime against the Bills.

“There was a really cool moment,” Ulbrich said, “where I saw the skill guys wrap their arms around Zach and uplift him.”

There's almost a sense that after all the hits Wilson has taken, both on and off the field, the Jets are doing everything they can to make sure he knows they're behind him.

“I think when he came in, he had a nice swagger about him,” center Connor McGovern said. “I think he lost it a little bit over the course. And it's back. It's back and better than ever. The way he's

carrying himself around the locker room, around the building is awesome.”

Wilson feels it in himself, too.

“A lot of confidence, man,” he said. “I truly believe in myself, and I think that's the first step to being in the NFL. You've got to believe in yourself first and the rest can take care of itself.”

Wilson said he's having more fun than ever. And having Rodgers around “absolutely” made him better in the five months they've been teammates.

“I feel like I've been trying to copy every little thing he's doing, from his footwork to the coaching tips he's given us,” Wilson said.

But both Hackett and coach Robert Saleh have made it clear they don't need Wilson to be Rodgers. They need Wilson to be a better version of Wilson — the one they've seen all spring and summer — starting Sunday against the Cowboys' strong defense in Dallas.

Many Jets fans remain skeptical Wilson has made significant enough progress to step in for a team that had Super Bowl hopes with Rodgers.

“For me, it's I know what I'm capable of,” Wilson said, adding he doesn't listen to the outside noise. “And I feel like I've got the belief from the guys in this

locker room.”

There could, however, potentially be some déjà vu for his teammates if he struggles a bit in games.

“That's the past. This is the future,” Hackett said. “This is a guy that's been training his butt off and learning a new system and growing within it. I think everybody can say that they've seen him grow and that's all we can do every game.”

“There's going to be ups and downs with all quarterbacks and with all players, especially young players. There's always going to be questions. For me as a coach, I just want to keep teaching him. I just want him to feel more and more

comfortable and keep growing.”

While Saleh said the Jets are looking into bringing in another quarterback to back up Wilson along with Tim Boyle, the coach insisted it won't be someone to compete for the starting job.

The Jets want Wilson to play free, knowing the team is his — again — and he doesn't need to look over his shoulder.

“It's good to know he's got a lot of trust in me,” Wilson said. “As a quarterback, when you're stepping in and when you feel the belief of the guys around you, it makes you want to go out there and do everything you can for them.”

Most had him linked to Cruz Azul, or Chivas, who Pulido arrived from in 2019 for a club-record \$8 million fee. With his age, coupled with injuries that have lessened his impact for Sporting, there may have been truth to a June tweet from Fox Sports Mexico reporter Fernando Cevallos that the club was asking \$2 million this summer; most clubs lose negotiating leverage as a player's contract reaches expiration, leaving them able to negotiate and depart without recouping funds.

But Pulido, though he may have never needed to instill greater faith in Vermes, has nonetheless proven himself to Sporting faithful and doubters across Major League Soccer this season. He's currently tied for second in the league's Golden

Boot race with 13 goals (one behind Nashville SC's Hany Mukhtar, last year's MLS MVP).

"One of the reasons why he was brought in here was to score goals and his strike rate is phenomenal," Vermes said. "The fact that he's now healthy and fit and strong and I would say he's still probably only 90%. He's still probably not 100%. I think, unfortunately, we probably won't see him 100% until next season. But the fact that he is one goal shy of the Golden Boot with the fact that probably the first 10 games of the season he was probably 40-50% of himself says a lot about his quality. We're very excited that he's here."

Vermes spoke in Thursday's presser about how in Pulido's first several days of preseason training after arriving at the club, he proved even better than imagined. For fans, that glimpse wasn't as extensive. After being

named a finalist for MLS Newcomer of the Year in his first season, Pulido suffered an injury in early 2021 that shortened that campaign and forced him to miss all of 2022, during which SKC fell to the basement of the standings.

"Because of the injuries that he sustained with the national team for the majority of the time, I think that we were unable to see his best other than when he first started until he got injured at the end of the season that first year. And that was at an incredibly high quality and high level. The difficulty in the re-signing was where was he going to be coming out of all this?"

"I think the great thing is that between, I would say him and his agent and us the club, we had great communication from day one when we were talking about this. And this goes all the way back to August (2022) before where we

already started talking about this and how could we get there. We maintained very open communication. This is a great relationship in that he knows how much that we would like him to be here. I know how much he enjoys it here. The fact that we were able to come to an agreement that we all feel good about is great because at the end it comes down to us both wanting the same thing and that is we both want to be successful. We want to win and there's no doubt that he has those qualities."

In total, Pulido has compiled 29 goals and 11 assists in 61 matches (all competitions) for SKC. He ranks first in club history in goals per match (0.48) among players with at least 20 regular season appearances, a rate that has climbed with his 12 goals in as many league matches since June. Overall, Sporting's record is 28-16-12 (.607

win percentage) when Pulido has played, compared to 28-28-13 (.434) in his absence.

Vermes spoke about the difficulty of finding a No. 9 while praising Pulido's flexibility to be able to play multiple positions and operate as a versatile forward, comparing him to former D.C. United star Jaime Moreno and even Argentine striker Sergio Aguero.

"[Alan] figures out what the game needs at that time and he does it. There's not many players that do that anymore especially," Vermes said.

Pulido opened up about the perils of rehabilitation from his injury and how the training and coaching staff have played parts in both his comeback and willingness to stay in Kansas City, despite its relative cold weather that he joked about. "This city is very calm," he said. "When I came here, I bought a house because I liked it. I enjoy it here.

The life in the USA is very different to Mexico. I like it. Only the weather is a little bit cold, but it's okay now. I like the city.

"I like also the team. The club is fantastic. The facility here is amazing. And also the people support me a lot — the players, all the staff — which for me is very important. The people that work here in the kitchen are always with a smile and this is amazing. In general, I like to stay here in this city and I like to stay here in this club because I enjoy all the time when I come to training here and also because I know in this team now we can win a championship and I am working toward that."

Sporting sits two points and three positions outside the MLS Cup Playoffs despite Pulido's contributions this season. SKC travels to face Minnesota United on Saturday night.

Giants' Isaiah Simmons focused on play while heading back to Arizona after trade

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. — Isaiah Simmons isn't heading back to Arizona looking to get even with the Cardinals after they drafted him eighth overall in 2020 and then moved on before the start of this season.

The 25-year-old Simmons still has good friends and former teammates in Arizona and he feels the Cardinals treated him well in his four seasons with them. They were the team that first allowed him to live his dream of playing in the NFL.

While he made a lot of tackles for Arizona, more than 200 over the past two seasons, the former Clemson star never found a position. He played linebacker, safety and slot cornerback. They wanted him to be a linebacker and he saw himself as a hybrid player.

Since being traded to New York on Aug. 24, Simmons has impressed defensive coordinator Wink Martindale with his speed. He was on the field for 15 plays on defense as well as special teams in the 40-0 loss to the Dallas Cowboys on Sunday

night.

"He's fitting in. He's fitting in," Martindale said Thursday, noting Simmons will get more action Sunday. "He's just going to keep getting better and better."

The Giants have listed Simmons as a linebacker and safety. He considers himself a playmaker, no matter where he lines up. He also insists he knows the playbook and understands his role.

"I'm not an emotionless person so I'm sure there will be some emotions flowing through me, but nothing that's going to affect me and make me do anything crazy," Simmons said.

"I'm not a person to go out there and be like, 'rah, rah, rah,' so I'm not going to go out there doing that or try to make an extra play because then that's when you end up hurting yourself in the long run."

This won't be Simmons' first trip back to Arizona since the trade, one that cost the Giants a seventh-round draft pick in 2024. He went back on Labor Day weekend to pack some things in his house and bring his two dogs to New Jersey.

Simmons, who had

four sacks last season, may stop by the house again after the game. The Giants are staying in Arizona on Monday and Tuesday to prepare for a Thursday night game in California against the San Francisco 49ers in Week 3.

He laughed when asked if he would have dinner with any of his former teammates before Sunday's game. There is a better chance he might see them Monday or Tuesday.

Simmons said he appreciates what the Giants have done for him. He was brought in late after missing most of the training camp and he said the coaches and players made him feel welcome.

"I just feel like, this is a place where I was kind of meant to be," Simmons said. "I just feel like I knew I was going to fit in, but I didn't necessarily know I was going to fit in this well. You know, I fit in well with all the guys. I think I fit in really well in the system."

Simmons is carrying over some of his past to the Giants. He is wearing No. 19. The No. 1 was from his days at Clemson. The No. 9 was his number with the Cardinals.

"There were some missed opportunities by us," Pederson recalled. "Those were critical and those were big and all of that. But I felt like, too, we just missed the opportunities that were there. Whether that's the outcome of the game or not, who knows?"

"Maybe fortunately for us it's a learning experience and something that our young football team can take away from moments like that. When you're playing good teams like this and defending world championship teams, you can't make those mistakes and expect to win."

Reid has noticed similarities between Kansas City and Jacksonville,

especially on the offensive side of the ball.

It's no surprise, either, given how much Pederson studied and learned while playing and coaching under Reid.

"Everywhere you go, you take a piece of it and put it in there," Reid said. "I think he's probably put his own flair on things. I'm sure there are things he does that he took from here, but we were together a long time."

The Chiefs are 3½-point favorites, according to FanDuel Sportsbook. Jacksonville went 5-0 as home underdogs last season, the best single-season mark by any team in the Super Bowl era.

"It'll be a good test for early in the season to see where we're at," Jaguars receiver Christian Kirk said. "It's big for us, Week 2, to really

Kansas State has carried its momentum from a Big 12 championship into this season, waylaying Southeast Missouri and Troy — a 12-win team a year ago — in two home games.

Will Howard has been accurate through the air, DJ Gidden and Treshaun Ward have been a potent one-two punch on the ground, and the Kansas State defense has allowed one touchdown in eight quarters.

Asked what must change Saturday, Drinkwitz was succinct.

"We're going to have to do a better job than we did last year defending the run. We put our defense in a lot of bad situations in last year's game," he said. "We have to limit the explosive plays in the run game. And then I think their quarterback is very good. He has a natural feel for where to place the ball. He's incredibly accurate."

The Tigers, meanwhile, followed up an easy opening win over South Dakota with a 23-19 win over Middle Tennessee State, which wasn't secured until the Blue Raiders turned the ball over on downs with 3:44 left in the game.

"It's going to be fun. It's going to be a loud, packed

environment," Howard said. "It's kind of an us-against-the-world mentality when you go in there. You have 70-plus players and some staff and you have a whole stadium rooting against you."

"We love that," Howard said. "We love being on the road."

INJURY UPDATE

Wildcats offensive tackle Christian Duffie practiced early in the week but Klieman was not sure whether he would play. Duffie had started 35 straight games before missing the first two because of an undisclosed injury that occurred over the summer.

Missouri linebacker Chad Bailey has also been working his way back from an undisclosed procedure that Drinkwitz said would take about three weeks of recovery. That puts Bailey a bit ahead of schedule if he suits up Saturday.

GETTING OFFENSIVE

Drinkwitz relinquished offensive play-calling midway through last year, then he hired Kirby Moore to direct the offense. There have been some bumps early in the season but Drinkwitz remains confident in the Tigers' ability to move the ball.

Keagan Johnson made his Kansas State debut against Troy, catching three passes for 25 yards. The Iowa transfer missed the opener to an injury, and Klieman said he expected Johnson to be closer to full-go against the Tigers.

CHANGES UP FRONT

Marcellus Johnson is expected to start for Missouri in the latest attempt to improve the offensive line. Cook was sacked once by South Dakota and four more times by Middle Tennessee State, which piled up seven tackles-for-loss in their game.

GETTING DISRUPTIVE

Many wondered whether Kansas State would get into the backfield without Felix Anudike-Uzomah, a first-round draft pick of the Kansas City Chiefs. It hasn't been a problem. Wildcats linebacker Austin Moore ranks fourth nationally with five tackles for loss, and defensive end Khalid Duke is tied for fifth nationally with three sacks through the first two games.

"I think as we go against better O-lines and better offensive schemes," Duke said, "I think we'll see how we do."

"I think that's the major advantage of force multiplier, if you will, for an offense," Lamberson said. "If you can do that and they don't know exactly where the ball is going to go on every play, it's going to make you hard to defend."

Redshirt junior quarterback Zach Zebrowski has orchestrated the on-field portion of the success, serving as UCM's starter since the second quarter of a Aug. 30 win against Missouri Western.

He leads Division II in passing yards, collecting 790 yards. He is No. 2 in total individual offense with 410 yards per game.

"He's making good decisions," Lamberson said. "We have some pretty fun toys and weapons that we can spread the ball around and throw to. But, Zach continues to make very

snappy, quick and smart decisions to distribute the ball to the guy it is supposed to go to based on what coverage he is seeing."

Zebrowski stepped into the starter role following the week one injury of Cedric Case.

A captain for the Mules, Case was on the sideline during the Sept. 9 win against Central Oklahoma.

Zebrowski remains as the listed QB1 on this week's depth chart.

"Zach is a very quick processor, and one of the things we need in this offense is that," Lamberson said. "He has a quick release, he's got mechanical things that are really good. Overall, I'm just impressed with what he's doing and how he's doing it."

Central Missouri collected votes in this week's American Football Coaches Association Division II poll, collecting 13 points.

Ahead of a home game against No. 3 Pittsburg State on Saturday, Sept. 16, Smith says the Mules have a chip

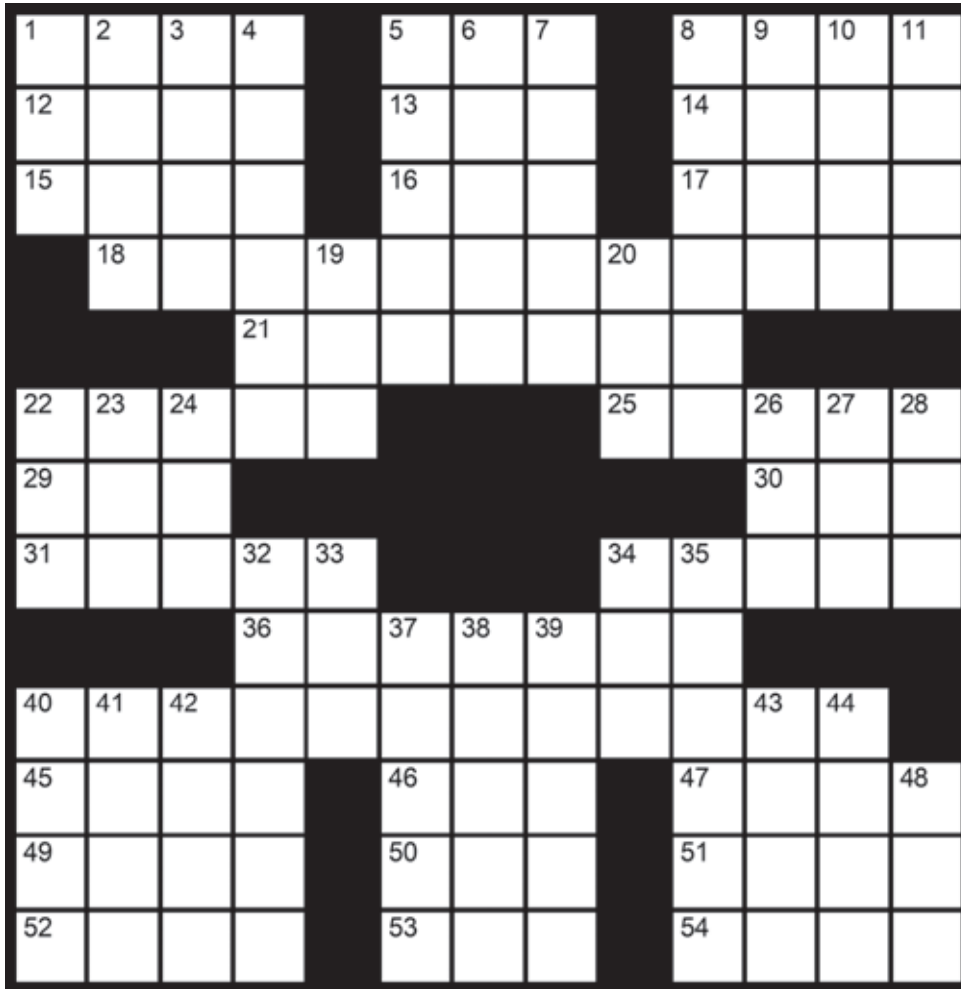
