Middle School's Christmas adoption program makes a difference

Adopting a child for Christmas through Sedalia School District 200 makes a difference not only in a child's life but also for those individuals and businesses who buy gifts for them during the holiday season.

Pettis County Real Estate, owned by Myron and Kelly McNeal, adopted five Sedalia Middle School children this season. On Tuesday, Dec. 19, McNeal said they chose the middle school because her daughter Kasey Miller is a math and science teacher there. This is the first year for the business to adopt someone for Christmas through the school system.

On Thursday, Dec. 21, Principal Jeremy Fry said 65 fifth-grade students were adopted this year.

"We have so many students that we typically adopt, and we reach out by word of mouth to let people know we have these needs in our building," he explained. "What we do is we typically interview the student and talk to them to figure out what their needs and wants are.

"We try to balance both because we have a lot of students that have

a lot of needs more than wants," he continued. "To me, that's the blessing of all of it, really — it amazes me."

He added he doesn't think people realize some of the adopted students have so many needs over wants.

McNeal said when she and her staff received the lists, they purchased everything on the lists and added to them.

"It was about the saddest thing the girls and I ever read," she noted. "I have a daughter, and her Christmas list, growing up, entailed whatever the coolest new toy or electronics was."

The Christmas lists her staff received asked for shampoo, conditioner, body wash, and deodorant.

"When it came to toys, they asked for one or two things," she noted. "One asked for a soccer ball, and one asked for earrings. They asked for a few minor things."

"They asked for mainly necessities," she continued. "So, it was very sad, but we kind of went a little over and got extra stuff."

Fry echoed McNeal's feelings. He said he saw lists where students wanted to give gifts to others like siblings or parents.

Sacred Heart NHS prepares hundreds of Christmas Eve dinners

While many of their classmates were asleep, enjoying the first day of winter break, members of Sacred Heart High School's National Honor Society were up early on a mission to provide healthy holiday meals.

Faculty advisor Brianna Libby had the NHS students show up at 7 a.m. Thursday, Dec. 21 to begin cooking hundreds of Christmas Eve dinners for delivery Saturday, Dec. 23.

"Right now, they are making meals for the Christmas Eve dinner, which is going to be held on Dec. 23," Libby said. "Since Christmas Eve

is on a Sunday this year, to keep Sunday the Sabbath for Catholics, they are delivering about 750 meals. Our goal was 1,000, so we're still hoping to call a few more places, like fire stations, police stations, maybe a little bit outside of Sedalia."

The students who aren't cooking are busy planning routes for Saturday's drivers to follow. Some deliveries go to Knob Noster and even as far as Warrensburg.

"The kids out here are now putting together addresses for our delivery drivers," Libby explained. "I think right now 28 routes and I think we'll probably have about 40 routes going out by Saturday."

Heart's dinner is traditional, and the food is prepared with loving care.

"The meal is going to be honey-baked ham," Libby said. "It's going to be mashed

potatoes and gravy, Hawaiian rolls, and pie. All the students are bringing three pies each to hopefully feed 1,000 people."

Deadline approaching for Missouri to opt in to federal summer food program

Missouri education and social services officials have not yet made a decision on whether to participate in a federal food assistance program next summer, weighing their ability to execute it after years of administrative challenges and delays.

Participating in the program, called Summer EBT, would provide approximately \$51.5 million in food benefits to 429,000 Missouri children next summer. States have until

Jan. 1 to notify the federal government of their intent to participate, and must submit a plan by Feb. 15.

The state is evaluating federal guidelines and "assessing Missouri's ability to implement the [Summer EBT] program in 2024," said Mallory McGowin, spokesperson for the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the agency that administers the benefits.

At least 20 other states have already notified the government of their intent to opt into Summer EBT.

The program provides \$40 in food benefits for each month the child is on summer break, loaded onto a card that can be used like a debit card to purchase groceries. Students who are eligible for free or reduced lunch during the school year are eligible for Summer EBT.

"We know how important this program is for kids and families," said Crystal FitzSimons, director of School and Out-of-School Time Programs at the D.C.-based Food Research & Action Center.

"And we know what a huge impact it would make on reducing summer hunger, and easing the pressure on families' household food budget. So we are really hopeful that Missouri and other states come onto the program."

In a letter to Gov. Mike Parson sent Wednesday afternoon, a coalition of Missouri advocacy groups including Empower Missouri urged the governor to direct the education and social services agencies to operate the program.

Ready, set, travel: Holiday rush to airports and highways is underway

It's beginning to look a lot like a hectic holiday travel season, but it might go relatively smoothly if the weather cooperates.

Travel over Christmas and New Year's tends to spread out over many days, so the peaks in the U.S. are likely to be lower than they were during the Thanksgiving holiday. That is making airlines and federal officials optimistic.

But the debacle at Southwest Airlines over Christmas last year should guard against overconfidence. Just this week, the Transportation Department announced a settlement in which Southwest will pay \$140 million for that meltdown, which stranded more than 2 million travelers.

So far this year, airlines have canceled 1.2% of U.S. flights, down nearly half from 2.1% over the same period last year. Cancellations were well below 1% during Thanksgiving, according to FlightAware.

"I don't want to jinx us, but so far 2023 has seen the lowest cancellation rate in the last five years," Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg said Tuesday. He added, however, that winter weather "will certainly be a challenge in the next few weeks."

Canceled flights surged last year, as airlines were caught short-staffed when travel rebounded from the pandemic more quickly than expected. Since then, U.S. airlines have hired thousands of pilots, flight attendants and other workers, and the cancellation rate has come down.

After struggling with cancellations and other disruptions last year, European travel has also been smoother this year and more people are expected travel over Christmas and New Year's, said Mike Arnot, spokesman for Cirium, an aviation analytics company. Still, about 3% of flights within Europe have been canceled in so far in December, and nearly 30% have been delayed, accord-

ing to Cirium.

Cirium projected that the number of seats flown within Europe will rise 10% between Dec. 22 and Jan. 2 compared to the similar period in 2023.

High winds from a storm named Pia disrupted travel Thursday in the Netherlands, Denmark and northern areas of the U.K.

More than a quarter of flights arriving and departing Amsterdam Airport Schiphol were canceled Thursday, and hundreds of flights were delayed, according to Flightaware. Copenhagen Airport in Denmark warned that weather conditions posed a "risk of delays and cancellations," especially on Thursday night.

In the U.K., train service was suspended or slowed, and ferries stopped running to islands off Scotland's west coast. British Airways grounded two dozen flights, British broadcaster Sky News reported. A spokesperson for the airline did not provide further details but apologized to customers

for having to "make some adjustments" to its schedule.

Adding to difficulties, workers at the undersea tunnel between Britain and France held a surprise strike on Thursday, disrupting train trips for thousands of travelers getting away ahead of Christmas.

Eurostar, which operates passenger train services from London to continental Europe, said it "had to cancel most services scheduled to run" on Thursday. Eurotunnel Le Shuttle, which runs vehicle-carrying trains on the same link underneath the English Channel, tweeted that service has been suspended.

Globally, air travel has still not fully recovered from the COVID-19 pandemic. About 8.6 billion people are projected to travel through the world's airports in 2023, according to Airports Council International, a Montreal-based trade group for airports. That's about 94% of the passenger volume in 2019, before the pandemic hit.

What Child is this...who laid to rest on Mary's lap is sleeping, whom angels greet with anthems sweet while shepherds watch are keeping?

Christmas offers an assortment of great carols, songs, and hymns. It is the season seasoned by music. Written as a poem and then set to music years later, *What Child is This* poses a critical question for every person: **who is He?**

We all answer this question in one way or another. Is he a moral guide, a great teacher or prophet, a liar, delusional about his sense of identity, or is he who he says he is: **the Lord of All, God in flesh?** Not considering the question at all is rejecting him by default.

What Child is This demands an answer. Jesus offered only two options. Either he is the true Lord God, or he is not. He never gave us any other options. Some may want to say no to his divine nature yet affirm him as a nice guy, a good teacher, or a moral example. Again, Jesus never gave us any of those options. Either he is God in flesh, or he is not. That is the question *What Child is This* presents to us all.

Jesus did not expect **blind faith** from his followers. He gave them (and us!) EVIDENCE. He miraculously healed people (Matthew 9, 12, John 9), cured diseases instantly (Luke 14, 17), drove out demons (Mt. 12, 17), ruled nature (Mt. 8, 21, Lk. 5), and restored the dead to life (Jn. 11, Mt. 9). These miracles demonstrated his divine power and identity, and were never meant to be normal, routine occurrences. The men and women who knew him the best, knew him personally as did his own brother James, testified to his identity as God in flesh.

In addition, Jesus gave direct statements as to his identity. He called himself "the Son of Man," which was Daniel's Old Testament term for *God among us*. Jesus forgave sins, an ability reserved for God alone (Mark 2, Lk. 7). He demonstrated authority over Old Testament Scripture (Mt. 5:21-48). In John 8, Jesus said, "Before Abraham, I am," using the personal name of God from Exodus 3, **Yahweh**, which means ***I am who was and is and will be***. Then, in John 10:30 Jesus asserted, "I and the Father are ONE."

What Child is This was written in 1865 by William C. Dix during and following a life-threatening illness, depression, and near-death experience. In the midst of such pain and suffering, he knew who this Child was – God himself! In Isaiah 9, the prophet foresaw the coming Messiah, the Suffering Servant. *What Child is this?* Isaiah proclaimed long ago that he would be:

- **Wonderful Counselor:** the One who offers unmatched calm and comfort in the midst of sorrow.
- **Mighty God:** the Creator and Sustainer of all, powerful over all...even death.
- **Everlasting Father:** the Child is Yahweh, God, come to walk among His creation out of His great love for us.
- **Prince of Peace:** the One who offers and delivers a sense of peace that transcends all earthly forms of peace. His peace promises that for those who sincerely call him Lord, rest in the truth that all will be made well and right in God's time.


The angel Gabriel said to call Jesus *Emmanuel*, a title, which means "God with us." Not just a prophet, nice guy, leader, teacher, or moral example, but *Emmanuel: **GOD** with us.*

This Christmas, give yourself a **great gift:** seek and find Jesus. Examine the evidence, ask questions, seek answers, and know the truth. *What Child is this? **This, this is Christ the King whom shepherds guard and angels sing!***

He truly is **The Reason for the Season.**

Department of Ag approves permit for Santa's reindeer

Director of Agriculture Chris Chinn and Missouri State Veterinarian Dr. Steve Strubberg have approved livestock movement papers for nine special reindeer.

Mr. Santa Claus from The North Pole applied for the permit this week, providing proof of the healthy herd through a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection signed by licensed veterinarian Dr. Hermy Elf.

Team leader Rudolph underwent additional testing to prove he's the most famous reindeer of all.

"We love to see Santa recognize so many on his nice list throughout Missouri this year," Chinn said. "Santa's elves have been working hard to provide toys for all children. We're excited that our team gets to ensure all of Santa's reindeer are ready for flight and

gifts get delivered across the Show-Me State this Christmas."

The permit approves Santa, his sleigh and nine reindeer for flight starting the night before Christmas, with a few exceptions for early deliveries.

"Our veterinary staff works to allow timely movement of healthy animals across Missouri and the U.S.," Strubberg said. "Our team also recommends the reindeer consume healthy rations of Missouri grass hay. We encourage Missourians to make hay available for Santa's reindeer, in addition to milk and cookies for Santa."

Reindeer approved for flight include Dasher, Dancer, Prancer, Vixen, Comet, Cupid, Donner, Blitzen and Rudolph.

PASTOR'S PULPIT

What does the Nutcracker have to do with Christmas?

Our church normally participates in the Sedalia Christmas parade and we like to be creative and work with the theme each year. But when I heard that this year's theme was the Nutcracker, I drew a blank.

I had never seen a production of the ballet or read the story. The only thing I could come up with was, "We are nuts about Jesus." But I didn't think that would fly. So, I started doing some research to see what the story "The Nutcracker" has to do with Christmas.

Apparently, nutcrackers didn't start out as classic Christmas décor; in fact, they weren't even associated with the holiday until after the ballet debuted in 1892 in St. Petersburg. The ballet is set on Christmas Eve and

the hero is a nutcracker come to life. After the ballet premiered, the story and products quickly became associated with Christmas time. The popularity of the ballet "The Nutcracker" skyrockets during the Christmas season because of its pageantry, dancing, and timeless classical music.

But have you ever wondered what the story is really all about? If so, you're not alone. Matt Rawle, in his book, "The Gift of the Nutcracker," helps us see many parallels to our Christian faith in what happens to the characters. Clara, the main character, is at the "in-between" age and is always waiting: waiting to grow older, waiting for someone, waiting to understand the world. She is loved dearly by her peculiar godfather, who gives her a special gift — the Nutcracker. After the Nutcracker later comes

to life, he battles the evil Mouse King only to die in battle. However, the loving godfather resurrects the Nutcracker. The Nutcracker then takes Clara to his kingdom to the acclaim of many who have awaited his return. Does that sound familiar? It's a picture of Christ's death, resurrection, and return for us.

The final section of the book deals with the Nutcracker, whom Rawle calls "the greatest gift." "Missouri's Department of Social Services or Department of Elementary and Secondary Education must act soon to meet this deadline," the letter said. "...It is vital that Missouri leverage this opportunity to keep summer hunger at bay in 2024 and beyond."

Missouri officials are weighing considerations including: "technology solutions and the timeline in which a system would be in production and complete," along with the level of staffing assigned to EBT implementation and administrative funding, McGowin said.

The Summer EBT program was approved and made permanent by Congress last year. A similar, temporary program called Pandemic EBT provided various benefits during the pandemic, including over the summers.

The temporary pandemic-era food programs were beset with administrative issues in Missouri that made dispersing benefits difficult — particularly because it required a new data collection portal to collect and share eligible students' information with two agencies in the state.

The benefits designed to cover food costs during the summer of 2022 did not start going out until June 2023, and Missouri declined to participate in the summer 2023 program because of those issues — foregoing at least \$40 million in aid.

The state is still troubleshooting benefits from summer 2022, McGowin said — primarily cases in which the department did not have the students' correct address. Around 348,000 school children received the summer 2022 benefits, which is more than 100,000 short of the number predicted to have been eligible — a discrepancy McGowin has previously

attributed to instances such as students graduating or moving and no longer qualifying.

Summer 2022 Pandemic EBT also included children under age 6, which the permanent program will not. Those benefits were dispersed in September 2023, McGowin said.

In July, McGowin pledged that going forward, the state would "focus on implementing the system changes necessary to facilitate participation in Summer EBT programs in future years," but said to participate, the state's "data collection systems need to be addressed well in advance."

FitzSimons said some states are "in a better place coming out of pandemic EBT."

"Others I think didn't really set up the long-term systems to build off of," she said. "And Missouri did not participate in 2023. So I think they do need to do some work, probably, in setting up more permanent

systems."

She added that putting in the effort now to create the system for this summer would ensure there is "less food insecurity over the summer in Missouri, that kids are able to return to school in the fall well nourished and ready to learn," she said — and create a framework for years to come.

States are also facing the broader challenges of implementing a program with new guidance from the federal government and securing the funding to do so.

The federal government will pay for the benefits but split the administrative cost 50/50 with the state. There is no budget request in the education department's current fiscal year 2025 budget request for Summer EBT.

McGowin said a request would be added during the legislative appropriations process if a decision to implement the program is made.

Deal on US border policy is closer than it seems

WASHINGTON — Amid grueling negotiations, the contours of a bipartisan border security and immigration deal are beginning to take shape, emerging even as Congress leaves town having failed to publicly unveil any details of the package that's central to unlocking stalled aid for Ukraine.

Talks between the White House and key senators have not veered widely from three main areas of discussion: toughening asylum protocols for migrants arriving at the U.S.-Mexico border; bolstering border enforcement with more personnel and high-tech systems; and deterring migrants from making the journey in the first place.

As the Senate broke for the holidays, due back Jan. 8, Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer and Senate Republican Leader Mitch McConnell in a rare joint statement indicated negotiations are progressing. They also met Wednesday to discuss how to advance the border policy alongside President Joe Biden's \$110 billion package of wartime aid for Ukraine, Israel and other national security priorities.

"We all know there's a problem at the border,"

Schumer said before sending senators home. "Our goal is, as soon as we get back, to get something done."

McConnell said the negotiations "continue to make headway."

And as aid for his country hangs in balance, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said at his own press conference in Kyiv he was confident "the U.S. will not let us down."

Here's a look at what's being discussed as key Senate negotiators and the White House plan to dig in during the weeks ahead:

TOUGHER ASYLUM CLAIMS

Senate negotiators have focused on asylum, by which the U.S. offers protection for people facing persecution in their home countries. The senators say they are trying to ensure that migrants who have a credible claim to asylum can safely apply, but that officials can also quickly turn away those who don't qualify.

Critics often say that too many people who pass their initial asylum interview end up ultimately failing in their efforts to win asylum. But because the immigration courts are so backlogged by the time the final determination happens, many have been in the country for years, making it more difficult and expensive to deport them.

The senators and the Biden administration have considered toughening the so-called credible fear standard that's used in the initial interviews to determine if migrants seeking asylum would likely have a winnable case before an immigration judge.

Advocates for immigrants argue that the credible fear standard is deliberately low in recognition of the fact that migrants being interviewed have usually fled desperate conditions, don't have legal representation and are still shaken by their journeys.

BORDER SECURITY

It was the Republicans who demanded negotiations over the border, refusing to provide aid for Ukraine as it battles Russia's invasion, unless Biden also agreed to changes to cut immigration.

While Biden had initially proposed \$14 billion to bolster border security in the national security package, Republicans said money was not enough. They want to enshrine policy changes at the border into law, some echoing Donald Trump, the party's frontrunner for the presidential nomination, who takes a hard line against immigration.

Still, billions of dollars of funding will almost certainly be part of any deal.

Border Patrol officers are overwhelmed processing migrants who turn them-

selves in seeking asylum. Biden had proposed \$3.1 billion for additional border agents as well more asylum officers, immigration judge teams and processing personnel. Supporters say the money for the asylum system is crucial to addressing the backlog in immigration courts and essentially getting the process moving faster.

Biden has also suggested \$1.2 billion for Customs and Border Protection officers and inspection systems to stop the flow of deadly fentanyl.

While the president also proposed funds to help communities in the U.S. that are taking in the record numbers of new arrivals, Republicans have resisted sending money to the cities, largely Democratic, that are helping house and provide care for the migrants.

REDUCING BORDER BUILD-UP

Over and over, senators have emerged from hours of closed-door talks with an exasperated conclusion: Immigration policy is complicated.

"Millions of decisions," said Sen. James Lankford, a Republican of Oklahoma. "Underneath every big idea is 100 smaller decisions that all have to be made, and every one is complicated."

Sen. Chris Murphy, Democrat of Connecticut, said: "It's interconnected. So if you

press in one side and it pops out the other, it takes time to get this right."

One of the toughest issues to resolve has been how to dissuade migrants from even embarking on their journeys to the U.S. in the first place, particularly from countries experiencing unrest, economic calamity or widespread gang violence.

Senators have discussed ways to encourage people to apply for asylum before they arrive at the border — either in their home country, or if that's not plausible, a country they travel through on their way to the U.S.

The Biden administration had launched a new system earlier this year that encourages people seeking asylum to schedule an appointment, via a smartphone app, to seek entry at the border.

In talks, the White House has also insisted on keeping in place its ability to allow 30,000 people a month from Venezuela, Nicaragua, Cuba and Haiti entry into the U.S. if they have a financial sponsor and fly into the country.

The idea is to create a more orderly, efficient asylum system that reduces chaos at the border.

But record numbers of migrants are still arriving. Illegal crossings topped 10,000 some days in December.

ENFORCEMENT

Negotiators have run into trouble in the talks when

it comes to enforcement measures. One potential compromise would set a threshold for the number of border crossings, and once the number is reached, stricter enforcement measures would take effect.

Under that system, if the crossings get too high authorities would shut down the border for asylum claims, enable fast-track removals of migrants who have already entered unlawfully, and detain some migrants while they are screened for valid asylum claims.

Funding in the package could also go to bolstering immigration enforcement, including detention facilities, according to one person familiar with the private negotiations who spoke on the condition of anonymity.

Advocates for immigrants worry that some of the restrictions under discussion could just push the build-up of migrants south of the U.S.-Mexico border.

"We're turning Mexico into a staging area for migrants moving north," said Dylan Corbett, who heads the Hope Border Institute, in a call with reporters. "Mexico doesn't have the infrastructure to be able to deal with this."

"That's the part that shakes you as a human being," he noted. "To think you have these kids that truly need us so much that they were willing to give up their wants ... to focus on the needs."

He added that students have asked for bedding, clothes, bikes for transportation to school, and a new winter coat.

"You just don't realize how blessed we are when you hear these students and their needs, just to survive or to live," Fry said.

McNeal said brightening Christmas for a child makes her and the staff happy.

"Those girls all came together, and we all went out and went shopping," she added. "And we had a whole day at the office last Wednesday, where we spent the day wrapping all the presents for them."

She noted they went "a little over the top" buying gifts, but they wanted to ensure the children had a great Christmas.

"That's a tough age," McNeal said. "I vaguely remember being at the middle school, and one thing that sticks out is that my mom worked at Kmart. So, I got new Kmart shoes — I was so proud of them, but a kid made fun of me."

She added that Sadie Reeser, who works for her, was a substitute teacher for the school district years ago

and remembered delivering gifts to families.

"She said some of the parents cried because they really appreciated it," she added. "It's a nice thought, and I hope (the gifts) helped them a little bit."

McNeal said they already have plans to adopt students again next Christmas.

Fry added what he loves about the district is the community support.

"It's a blessing," he noted. "That's the best part about this job ... I'm a giver. So, being able to reach out to the community and then having the community pour support back into us and our students, my cup is always full."

St. Louis-area urgent care chain to pay \$9.1M over false claims allegations

ST. LOUIS — One of the largest urgent care chains in Missouri will pay \$9.1 million to settle allegations that the company submitted false claims for medical services, including COVID-19 testing.

The U.S. Attorney's office in St. Louis on Thursday announced the settlement with Total Access Urgent Care, which operates more than two dozen clinics in the St. Louis area.

"This settlement will fully repay three federal health care programs for TAUC's overbilling for COVID tests and office visits," U.S. Attorney Saylor A. Fleming said in a news release.

Federal prosecutors said Total Access Urgent Care submitted false insurance claims for COVID-19 testing between April 2021 and December 2021, using improper billing codes that resulted in the company getting reimbursements at a rate that was too high.

From 2017 to 2021,

TAUC was accused of falsely claiming that doctors participated in some office visits that were actually overseen by non-physician practitioners. The reimbursement rate is higher for visits involving physicians.

Total Access Urgent Care said in a statement that it "cooperated fully" with the investigation, the St. Louis Post-Dispatch reported. The company said it has improved a compliance program.







Flip through the Smith-Cotton girls basketball box scores as of late and you'll find a double-digit scorer one might not have predicted this time last season.

Good guess, but it's not Anastasia Bellamy, the team's leading scorer.

Sophomore Dominique Bell has helped light it up for the Lady Tigers recently on their four-game winning streak. In addition to her 19 points in the team's victory over Eldon at State Fair Community College last Saturday night, she's filled it up in those other contests enough to be averaging 13.5 points over that stretch of wins.

With much of it coming inside the perimeter, it's a nice compliment to the existing unit of upperclassmen guards in the starting

lineup.

And there's more to her than the scoring.

"She is a freak of an athlete," Lady Tigers head coach Ron Rhodes said. "There's nobody that can touch her [in that regard]. I'll throw her in there [for that] on her ability, her quickness. Her basketball skills are getting much better from last year."

Another great sign for Rhodes, who shouldn't be working with a bare cupboard in Year 2.

Penske threeppeat a potential theme for NASCAR in 2024; Hamlin, Elliott mend from offseason surgeries

Roger Penske achieved something this season the pioneering motorports magnate had never done in his long, accomplished career with back-to-back NASCAR championships.

Ryan Blaney gave Penske consecutive series titles at Phoenix last month after teammate Joey Logano's title-winning run in 2022.

"You win one, and you start all over again," Penske said. "They don't give you an extra lap ahead of everybody after you win one. Last year, Joey did a great job, and by the way when you

think about it, last year at Phoenix, if you watched it, Ryan was a good wing man. He had a fast car at Phoenix, so we knew that he had the speed."

That showed throughout this past season as Blaney won three times, including twice in the playoffs and was fastest when it counted most with eight top 10 finishes in the final 12 races.

Blaney was gushing after his championship after starring in a pair of Penske firsts: Winning the Coca-Cola 600 to combine with Josef Newgarden's Indianapolis 500 win on Memorial Day weekend and then earning that NASCAR crown.

Soccer's Super League revived by court ruling against FIFA and UEFA

European soccer was rocked by a court ruling that revived the rebel Super League on Thursday, though it wasn't clear whether any clubs were joining Real Madrid and Barcelona in the breakaway project.

The European Union's top court said UEFA and FIFA acted unlawfully to block Super League. The ruling was praised by Madrid which, along with Barcelona, is leading the fight to form a rival competition to the Champions League.

"A Europe of freedoms

has triumphed, and also football and its fans have triumphed," Madrid president Florentino Pérez said.

The original project in April 2021 sparked vehement protests by fans across Europe, chiefly in England, that helped to scuttle Super League within 48 hours, and no new clubs immediately came forward on Thursday to support Perez's vision.

Indeed, many big clubs — including Manchester United, Manchester City, Chelsea and Paris Saint-Germain — and supporters' groups repeated their staunch opposition to Super League,

whatever its shape.

"The world of football moved on from the Super League years ago and progressive reforms will continue," said the European Club Association which represents Europe's top football clubs. "All the recognized stakeholders of European and world football — spanning confederations, federations, clubs, leagues, players and fans — stand more united than ever against the attempts by a few individuals pursuing personal agendas to undermine the very foundations and basic principles of European football."

Injuries bring changes on Patriots' O-line going into game at Broncos

FOXBOROUGH, Mass. — David Andrews is a team captain, a starter at center, and someone with ties to the Patriots' most recent Super Bowl titles.

Given the state of New England's offensive line, which in many ways resembles a season where the wear and tear continues to take its toll on a franchise that has no choice but to play out the string, Andrews still sees reasons to be positive heading into the Week 16 matchup at Denver. The last thing the nine-year veteran wants to hear is that the Patriots have nothing at stake.

"We've only got three more guaranteed opportunities with this football team. It's a huge opportunity for not only yourself but the organization ... everyone involved,"

Andrews said on Wednesday. "Sometimes when you get in these positions, people will say you have nothing to lose. We have everything to lose because we're playing this game. You never know when it's going to get taken from you or when it's going to end."

A few individuals have an opportunity to make an impact alongside Andrews after the Patriots placed offensive lineman Cole Strange on injured reserve earlier in the week. The second-year pro was carted off the field with a knee injury that he suffered during the second quarter of Sunday's home loss to Kansas City.

"Tough kid. I know he's going to do everything he can to come back. If anyone can do it, he can," Andrews said about the rehab path that awaits Strange.

Healthy offensive linemen are at a premium for

the Patriots as they head down the stretch of the season. Offensive lineman Conor McDermott did not practice Wednesday. He sustained a head injury that forced him out against the Chiefs.

New England could welcome back offensive lineman Trent Brown to the practice field after he missed the Kansas City game. With Strange sidelined, New England will likely turn to rookie Antonio Mafi for the rest of the season at left guard. An opportunity is also open for second-year lineman Vederian Lowe to see his workload increase beginning with Sunday's matchup against the Broncos. Lowe finished this past week's game at left tackle after McDermott was ruled out.

"As a team, you want to fight and compete and get as many wins as you can. There are guys who are going to get different opportunities coming up

here with Cole and Conor dealing with some stuff.

"It's a great opportunity to learn when you get thrown into the fire when you have to read and react and do different things," Andrews said before throwing it back to a time in Patriots history when an injury allowed for the launch of the career of one of the greatest winners in NFL history.

"Think about Tom Brady. What if Drew Bledsoe had never gotten hurt? You never know when you're going to get an opportunity. You have to be ready to take advantage of it," Andrews said. "The more snaps you play, the more the game slows down a bit and you're not going a million miles an hour. As a rookie, there's a lot piled on you throughout the year. As the years go on, you figure it out. Whether you're a veteran or a rookie, you're trying to improve each week."

Yankees have already given Yamamoto a No. 18 jersey. Boone hopes he keeps it

NEW YORK — Yoshinobu Yamamoto already has New York Yankees pinstripes with No. 18, the numeral prized by many Japanese pitchers.

"I gave him that jersey. It's his if he wants

to keep it," Yankees manager Aaron Boone said Thursday.

Some Japanese pitchers covet No. 18 because the Central League's Tokyo Yomiuri Giants assigned it to their ace in the 1960s. Daisuke Matsuzaka wore it with Boston, and Hiroki Kuroda was the last Yankees pitcher with the number from 2012-14. Kenta Maeda included having the number in his Los Angeles Dodgers contract, and eight-time All-Star Tomoyuki Sugano wears it on the Yomiuri Giants.

A 25-year-old right-hander pursued by top teams on the free agent market, Yamamoto has until Jan. 4 to sign with a Major League Baseball team based on when he was posted by the Orix Buffaloes. Boone and Yankees officials met with Yamamoto in Los Angeles and again in Manhattan, and the New York Mets, Los Angeles Dodgers and San Francisco are among the other teams in pursuit.

"All the teams are now putting their best foot forward and negotiating. That's above my pay grade. So we'll see where it lands," Boone

said. "Special dude. Really some presence to him. Comfortable in his skin. Confident, but a humility to him. So it's just been nice to get to know him."

New York's presentation include a video from former Yankees star Hideki Matsui, the 2009 World Series MVP.

"I think he wants to be great," Boone said. "There's some similarities there between him and Gerrit (Cole) in how dedicated and disciplined and all-in they are on pitching and baseball and their body how to be successful."

Boone spoke just north of Yankee Stadium before assisting for the second straight year in food and toy distribution with the New York Police Department's 44th Precinct and the Food Bank For New York City.

A few hours after Boone's appearance, outfielder Alex Verdugo spoke on a Zoom to discuss the Dec. 5 trade that sent him from Boston to New York. Verdugo lined a tie-breaking, opposite-field RBI double against Yamamoto for Mexico in the semifinals of this

year's World Baseball Classic.

"He was very fast to the plate, so it was hard to get your timing as a hitter," Verdugo said.

New York also acquired All-Star outfielder Juan Soto from San Diego, joining a batting order that has Aaron Judge and three players coming off subpar seasons and injuries: Giancarlo Stanton, Anthony Rizzo and DJ LeMahieu.

"It's Juan Soto. I can count on one hand the amount of hitters, including Aaron Judge, that belong in that conversation," Boone said. "Hopefully we couple it with reasonable health around him and some guys returning to form, then it's got a chance to be a special lineup."

Boone sounded pleased with rookie center fielder Jasson Dominguez's recovery from Tommy John surgery on Sept. 20.

"I'm optimistic it'll be sooner rather than later," Boone said of Dominguez's return. "I think when you get to spring training, he's going to look a lot like a regular player."

AP source: Florida State to discuss future of athletics, affiliation with ACC at board meeting

Florida State will hold a Board of Trustees meeting on Friday and a person with knowledge of the situation told The Associated Press the future of the athletic department and its affiliation with the Atlantic Coast Conference will be discussed.

The board is expected to consider a possible exit strategy that could involve legal action against the ACC and contracts that bind the conference's members for 12 more years, according to the person, who spoke Thursday on condition of anonymity because the school had not yet published an agenda for the meeting.

Florida State leaders have made it known they are unhappy with the school's current situation in the ACC, where revenue distribution lags way behind the payouts to schools in the Southeastern and Big Ten conferences. That gap is likely to

grow substantially in the near future as new media rights deals kick in for the SEC and Big Ten while the ACC is locked into a deal with ESPN that still has more than a decade left.

"We are not satisfied with our current situation," Florida State President Rick McCullough said during an August board meeting.

Earlier this month, Florida State won the ACC football title game but became the first Power Five conference champion to finish with an undefeated record and still be left out of the College Football Playoff.

The snub of the Seminoles (13-0) for a playoff spot that went to SEC champion Alabama reignited frustrations at Florida State with what many of their supporters view as conference that holds back their athletic program — and most notably the football team.

Any ACC school that wants to leave the conference would have to chal-

lenge the grant of rights to be able to get out before joining another league. The grant of rights, which runs through 2036, gives the ACC control over media rights for its member schools — including the broadcast of games in all sports.

In addition, any school that wants to leave the ACC would have to pay an exit fee of three times the league's operating budget, or roughly \$120 million.

The length of the ACC's agreement and potential financial penalties have protected the conference from being poached by other leagues the way the Big 12 and Pac-12 have been in the most recent round of realignment.

But it has also caused consternation in the conference as its members see a future where SEC and Big Ten schools are receiving upwards of \$75 million annually from their conferences and ACC schools are struggling to stay within \$30 million of their competitors.

"It'd be tough to run any other kind of company like this," FSU board chairman Peter Collins said in August.

Florida State is not the only ACC member concerned about the growing revenue gap, but it has been by far the most vocal.

The ACC has tried to address some of those concerns through a proposed new revenue distribution model that will reward schools for postseason success. The ACC also decided to expand, adding Stanford, California and SMU next year. All three schools agreed to join the conference at a reduced rate, with the extra money ESPN will pay for new members being directed into the bonus pool.

Florida State, along with Clemson and North Carolina, voted against expansion, but it was not enough to block the move approved by the other 12 members, including Notre Dame.

Blues among NHL teams to remain on Bally Sports after agreement

The NHL and Diamond Sports Group, the largest owner of regional sports networks, have reached an agreement that will keep local broadcasts for 11 teams on Bally Sports through the end of this season.

The agreement, which was contained in a court filing made Wednesday, is subject to court approval. Diamond Sports has been in Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings in the Southern District of Texas since it filed for protection in March. The company said in a financial filing last year that it had debt of \$8.67 billion.

While there will be a reduction in rights payments for some teams, the local rights for those 11 franchises will revert back to the NHL at the end of this season.

The agreement provides stability for fans, networks and teams after Major League Baseball had to take over the broadcasts of San Diego

Padres and Arizona Diamondbacks games last season after agreements could not be reached.

The NHL teams that are currently on Bally are: Anaheim, Carolina, Columbus, Dallas, Detroit, Florida, Los Angeles, Minnesota, Nashville, St. Louis and Tampa Bay. Diamond also reached the same type of agreement with the NBA for the 15 teams under

contract to the RSNs last month.

Diamond is also in discussions with Major League Baseball on reworked agreements for the 2024 season with as many as 11 teams, with the next court hearing scheduled for Jan. 10.

If successful, Diamond would have agreements with all of its professional sports teams end after the current or upcoming

seasons, giving leagues and franchises a little more time to figure out a new path due to the possible implosion of regional sports networks.

Diamond is in discussions with Amazon about becoming a strategic partner, which could help it stave off liquidation. The Amazon-Diamond negotiations were first reported by The Wall Street Journal.



The case was heard last year at the European Court of Justice after Super League failed to launch more than two years ago. UEFA President Aleksander Ceferin called the club leaders then “snakes” and “liars.”

The company formed by 12 clubs — now led by only Real Madrid and Barcelona after Juventus withdrew this year — started legal action and the court was asked to rule on points of EU law by a Madrid tribunal.

Madrid-based A22 Sports Management, which promotes the Super League, immediately announced new proposed competitions for men and women, saying young fans are “turning away” from soccer.

“I hope they start their fantastic competition as soon as possible with two clubs,” Ceferin reacted sarcastically.

In a presentation streamed on YouTube, A22 CEO Bernd Reichart said there would be no permanent members of the new competition and they would remain committed to their domestic leagues.

The rebel clubs had accused UEFA of breaching European law by allegedly abusing its market dominance of soccer competitions, and they were

backed by the court.

“The FIFA and UEFA rules making any new interclub football project subject to their prior approval, such as the Super League, and prohibiting clubs and players from playing in those competitions, are unlawful,” the court said. “There is no framework for the FIFA and UEFA rules ensuring that they are transparent, objective, non-discriminatory and proportionate.”

The court acknowledged FIFA and UEFA were abusing a dominant position and their rules on approval, control and sanctions “must be held to be unjustified restrictions on the freedom to provide services.”

Madrid’s Perez welcomed the court ruling: “It has been fully recognized that the clubs have the right to propose and promote European competitions that modernize our sport and attract fans from all over the world.”

But while clearing the way for Super League, the court also said it “does not mean that a competition such as the Super League project must necessarily be approved.”

Ceferin said he was confident the amendments to rules on approval, control and sanctions adopted by UEFA last year were fully in line with the judgment.

“The judgment is actually positive as it embraces the key features of the European

football pyramid, open competitions, sporting merit and solidarity,” he said.

Two years after the original idea collapsed, Super League promoters presented in February a new proposal for a multi-division competition involving up to 80 European soccer teams and operating outside of UEFA’s authority. The latest plans announced on Thursday would involve 64 men’s teams and 32 women’s clubs.

English clubs are still unlikely to join a revived plan. The Premier League’s international appeal and financial power has grown in the past two years, and a U.K. government bill announced last month by King Charles proposed powers to block English teams from trying to join a breakaway league.

The Premier League Owners’ Charter states clubs “will not engage in the creation of new competition formats outside of the Premier League’s rules.”

The Spanish league said “the Super League is a selfish and elitist model. Anything that is not fully open, with direct access only through the domestic leagues, season by season, is a closed format.”

The court also noted that rules giving FIFA and UEFA exclusive control over the commercial exploitation of the media rights related to their competitions are “such as to be harmful to European football

clubs, all companies operating in media markets and, ultimately, consumers and television viewers, by preventing them from enjoying new and potentially innovative or interesting competitions.”

Reichart of A22 said they will offer to fans “free viewing of all Super League matches,” and sent a message to clubs that “revenues and solidarity spending will be guaranteed” in Super League.

Football Supporters Europe said on Thursday there was “no place in European football for a breakaway super league.”

“Our clubs, our competitions, & our local communities need protection,” it said in a post on X, formerly Twitter. “Whatever comes next, the super league remains an ill-conceived project that endangers the future of European football.”

The Court of Justice’s ruling was the most anticipated sports decision since the so-called Bosman Ruling in 1995. That case upended soccer’s transfer system and drove up players’ pay.

When Super League was unveiled — a largely closed competition as an alternative to the UEFA-run Champions League — widespread condemnation hit the rebel clubs from England, Spain and Italy.

UEFA’s defense was that it protected the place of sports in European society by running

competitions in a pyramid structure open to all, and funded the grassroots of the game. This season, the Champions League included Royal Antwerp, which won its first Belgian title for 66 years, and Union Berlin, which rose into the German top division only in 2019.

The proposed 20-team Super League with locked-in places for up to 15 founders would have effectively replaced the Champions League and weakened the sporting and commercial appeal of domestic leagues.

The lack of relegation was fundamentally at odds with European soccer which, unlike elite U.S. sports leagues, has the risk and reward of moving up or down divisions based on performance.

“UEFA remains resolute in its commitment to uphold the European football pyramid, ensuring that it continues to serve the broader interests of society,” UEFA said. “We trust that the solidarity-based European football pyramid that the fans and all stakeholders have declared as their irreplaceable model will be safeguarded against the threat of breakaways by European and national laws.”

Part of the benefit of teams playing in the W-K Holiday Shootout is exposing students to the opportunities of education beyond high school, of course.

But from a purely athletic standpoint, there’s not only that unique opportunity of getting to play on a collegiate court, but using it as a warm-up for other games later down the line where teams will be play in bigger gyms. The Kaysinger Conference Tournament is one example, but the same goes for those programs with aspirations of potentially going beyond districts.

Crowds will always play a part, but considering the many small schools that partake in the Shootout, adjusting to a bigger gym and that background is what really can affect play.

“It’s nice to play here before the Kaysinger Tournament, especially for the girls who never have before,” Smithton girls basketball head coach Haley Kahrs said. “Playing here is hard. It’s a totally different ball game.”

“The backdrop. The crowd — sometimes it’s dead silent in here. It’s a big area.”

There’s also the size of the court, and with it, the perimeter markings that vary from the high-school 3-point line. “You have to use the spacing to your advantage,” Kahrs said. “A lot of times, they’re wanting to shoot the 3 from the last one, and I’ll say, ‘Know where you’re at, let’s not launch it from out there’ [laughs].”

It didn’t stop there from being some strong outside

shooting performances from some teams throughout the action. Sacred Heart boys basketball drained 10 triples in the Santa Fe win. Climax Springs’ boys hit on eight 3s. Stover’s girls connected seven times from distance. Some of those programs have made deep runs and have exposure on college courts previously, potentially proving how it can make a difference.

PACKING IT IN

The holiday tournaments can prove great for exposure, but sometimes it means going from a one-off tournament game to a conference matchup within hours, or in some cases, off to another tournament.

Northwest boys basketball head coach Rick Mills talked about having to choose between planning in practice for a pivotal Kaysinger matchup with Green Ridge instead of the Mustangs’ W-K Shootout opposition.

The congestion for Northwest went beyond that, though. After playing Smithton on Dec. 12, and games against Prairie Home with Bunceton (Dec. 14) and Green Ridge (Dec. 15), the Mustangs turned right back around to face Smithton again on Dec. 16. Smithton itself played six games in nine days throughout that same span.

While it can wear teams down, there’s two sides of the coin. It mimics a postseason format by putting teams out on the floor multiple times over four or five days, but bumping up a tourney like the Otterville Classic a bit earlier also allows for a little more time off during the holidays. After all, there’s just a little more than a month until the Kaysinger Tournament and the season hits full gear.

The Raiders are tied with the Pittsburgh Steelers for ninth in the NFL in scoring defense, allowing an even 20 points per game. That’s quite a jump from the 24.6-point average Las Vegas allowed last season, which put its defense 26th.

Since Pierce took over as the interim coach six games ago, the Raiders have allowed a 15.5-point average. That includes giving up 31 points to Monday’s opponent, the Kansas City Chiefs, and holding the Miami Dolphins 11.5 points below their league-leading scoring average.

The Raiders allowed 21 points in their most recent game, Dec. 14 against the Los Angeles Chargers, but that is deceiving. Las Vegas held the Chargers to seven points through three quarters before LA scored twice in the fourth against reserves.

“I feel like for (Graham), I think it was definitely a point to make things simple, so we can play as fast as possible,” defensive end Malcolm Koonce said.

Rookie defensive end Tyree Wilson embodies the defense’s improvement. The No. 7 overall draft pick was considered a disappointment for most of the season as he worked his way back from a foot injury he sustained at Texas Tech last season and that cost him much of the offseason work for the Raiders.

Wilson has shown flashes recently of what the Raiders expected when they chose him. He had a sack, tackle for a loss and quarterback hit two weeks ago against the Minnesota Vikings and recovered a fumble against the Chargers.

“Part of confidence starts with getting reps,” Graham said. “We talk about it all the time, self-confidence over self-esteem. Self-esteem a lot of time is the talk. Self-confidence comes from the preparation

you put in, the work you put in. He’s constantly getting better at practice.”

Maxx Crosby remains the focal point and is tied for fifth in the league with 13 1/2 sacks. But Crosby, unlike last season, isn’t having to do it virtually all himself this season.

He had no sacks and a tackle for a loss against the Chargers, but others stepped up. Koonce had two sacks, Jerry Tilley had a sack, 6-foot-3 and 327-pound tackle John Jenkins returned a fumble 44 yards for a touchdown and Jack Jones jumped a route for an acrobatic interception and easy TD.

“What you’re seeing is everybody contributing to a defense,” Pierce said. “Patrick is sitting upstairs, and you don’t really have to do too much. The players are playing at a speed and a physicality that less is more. Allow them to use their God-given physical attributes and let them put that on display, and then you put them in position to make plays. It’s a group that

believes in one another. They have fun with one another.”

INJURY UPDATES

Pierce said he was optimistic running back Josh Jacobs (quadriceps) and left tackle Kolton Miller (shoulder) would play at Kansas City.

“This is a game you want to play in now,” Pierce said. “You don’t watch it on television. You want to be there.”

Miller has missed four of the past five games, costing Las Vegas its top offensive lineman. Jacobs sat out only the game against the Chargers, but Pierce said it was a close call on whether or not to play him.

ROSTER MOVE

Defensive tackle Nesta Jade Silvera, drafted in the seventh round out of Arizona State, was waived Wednesday. He’s the first draft pick from this year’s class to be released.

Silvera had a strong training camp, but it didn’t translate into the season. He played in two games and made two tackles.

A healthy Elliott should make Hendrick Motorsports as strong as ever. Past champion Kyle Larson and William Byron combined for 10 victories and finished second and third in the series standings.

TUNING IN

NASCAR fans will have several new streaming ways to watch after the sport’s seven-year media rights deal that includes Amazon, TNT and Max. The new arrangement is worth \$7.7 billion when a previously announced \$1.1 billion contract with CW is figured in, according to the Sports Business Journal. NASCAR has not detailed the contract’s value.

BIGGEST SURPRISE

Roush Fenway Keselowski Racing’s revival under ex-series champion Brad Keselowski, an owner who helped Jack Roush’s once-great

program return to prominence this season. The program got drivers Chris Buescher and Keselowski into the playoffs with Buescher winning three races and advancing to the final eight.

BIGGEST DISAPPOINTMENT

Kevin Harvick rode through his final NASCAR season without a victory, despite tributes and remembrances at almost every stop on the circuit. The Stewart-Haas driver came close, winding up second behind William Byron at Darlington in May. Harvick ends his career with 60 wins and a record 14 straight playoff appearances, along with a 2014 series championship.

TOP ROOKIE

Ty Gibbs, Joe Gibbs’ grandson, was the 2022 Xfinity Series champion and backed that up by winning rookie of the year in his first full Cup Series season driving his granddad’s No. 54 car. The 21-year-old Gibbs had nine top-10 finishes this

past season with his best showing a fourth at the Royal course in Charlotte last October.

RETIREMENT AGE?

Martin Truex Jr., the 2017 NASCAR champion, thought about stepping out of the cockpit of the No. 19 Joe Gibbs Racing car at age 43 before signing a one-year extension. Several times during the year, Truex sounded like a racer ready to join contemporaries Jeff Gordon, Dale Earnhardt Jr. and now Harvick outside the NASCAR garage.

ONE TO WATCH

Noah Gragson is getting a second chance after a “like” of a social media post about murdered George Floyd nearly cost him his NASCAR career. The talented 25-year-old spent the past five months working on personal growth and maturity following his dismissal from Legacy Motor Club. He has been signed by Stewart-Haas Racing to drive the No. 10 formerly run by Aric Almirola.

WHAT'S NEW ON NETFLIX

"Berlin" - Season 1

Going back to the very beginning, the new "Money Heist" spinoff, "Berlin," premieres Friday, Dec. 29, on Netflix. Long before he finds out about his terminal diagnosis and takes the Royal Mint of Spain hostage, Berlin (Pedro Alonso, "Padre Casares") was living in his golden age. The series follows Berlin through this exciting and prosperous period of his life, as he prepares for one of his most extreme heists yet — disappearing \$44 million worth of jewels. 



