Local GOP caucus slated for Saturday morning on fairgrounds

On Saturday, March 2, the Missouri GOP will host its local caucus at the Missouri Electric Cooperative building on the Missouri State Fairgrounds.

The Missouri GOP is conducting a series of caucuses and conventions to elect delegates for the Republican National Convention on July 16-18 in Milwaukee and determine their nominee for President of the United States. Currently, the eligible candidates for nomination are former President Donald Trump, Nikki Haley, and David Stuckenberg.

Chairman Carla Young with the Missouri Republican Party said she hopes everyone eligible to help choose the Republican candidates comes to the Missouri State Fairgrounds Saturday morning.

"We will begin at 10 a.m.," Young told the Democrat this week, "but we're going to open the doors at 8:30 at the MEC building on the State Fairgrounds across from the Grandstand."

The caucus replaces the normal Presidential Preference Primary and is how the Missouri Republican Party sends delegates and alternates to

the Republican National Convention.

"You need to bring a form of ID," Young said, "just like you would to register to vote. And you are required to, by the call to caucus, sign a 'Pledge the Platform' form to vote at the caucus."

Once checked in, those at the caucus will proceed quickly through Saturday's event.

"You'll get a sticker, and we'll know you have secured both those items," Young said. "You'll come in to vote for your preference for president."

Strict caucus rules will not allow voting for those arriving after 10 a.m.

"The main thing is we will start around 10," Young warned. "If you're in line at 10, even if it's outside the door, that's fine, but at 10 we're going to have two lines and I will station somebody at the end of the line - if you're there at 10:01 and that person's there, you will not come in to vote."

The Presidential Preference Primary in Missouri was removed two years ago when the Election Integrity Act was passed and signed by Gov. Mike Parson. Young preferred the primary process but will host the caucus instead.

United Way moves forward with several events

United Way of Pettis County has several events planned for the next few months, including bringing back its annual luncheon meeting slated for April.

On Thursday, Feb. 29, Executive Director Rachelle Simon was excited to talk about the nonprofit's funded partners and the events, which include a Set the Table Skillet, Cook-off and Discussion on March 13, the annual Luncheon on April 3, and the Day of Action on June 22.

She noted that United Way has 17 funded partners this year, up from 2023. All the programs with the funded partners support ed-

ucation, health, and financial stability.

"Every year, any nonprofit that serves folks in Pettis County can apply," Simon said. "We have 17 funded partners, but Community Café is a grant recipient."

The grant supplied to Community Café is for paper goods for carryout dinners to those who can't eat in.

Bothwell to host CPR/AED class

Bothwell Regional Health Center will offer Community CPR/AED and First Aid courses on Saturday, March 16 in the Bothwell Education Center at 600 E. 14th St.

The CPR/AED class is from 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The course teaches participants how to provide CPR to an adult, child or infant and how to use an automated external defibrillator (AED) for adults and children. An AED is a small, lightweight device that allows individuals and first responders to treat sudden cardiac arrest by delivering a shock to the victim's chest, ideally restarting their heart.

People may also sign up for a First Aid course for adults and children from 12:30 to 3:30 p.m. Typical participants in these classes include corporate and retail employees, security, law enforcement, health and fitness staff, parents and grandparents. Special classes can be arranged for large groups.

According to the American Heart Association, more than

350,000 people experience out-of-hospital cardiac arrests in the United States and more than 100,000 occur outside the home. CPR, especially if performed immediately and correctly and used with an AED, can double or triple a cardiac arrest victim's chance of survival.

The fee for each class is \$45 or \$60 for both classes, and payment is due by March 6. For more information or to register, contact Bothwell Education Center at classes@brhc.org or call 660-827-9516.

Shelter Insurance offering local scholarship

This spring, the Shelter Insurance Foundation will award a \$1,500 scholarship to a graduate of Green Ridge High School. Shelter Agent Troy Curtis sponsors and partially funds this scholarship.

House passes tax cut aimed at offsetting surge in vehicle values

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. — Missouri residents could see a roughly \$138 million tax break under legislation passed Thursday by the House in an attempt to offset a recent surge in local tax collections caused by higher vehicle values.

The legislation changing the way Missouri's personal property tax collections are calculated comes as lawmakers in numerous states this year are considering ways to reduce property taxes charged on homes, real

estate and other property.

Home values have risen at a faster-than-normal pace in recent years. Vehicle values typically decline as cars and trucks get older, but used vehicle values also rose during the coronavirus pandemic because of supply shortages. That resulted in higher tax bills for many people in states that allow property taxes on vehicles.

Republican state Rep. Mike McGirl said his Missouri legislation, which now goes to the Senate, would return to taxpayers about a quarter

of the "windfall" that local governments received from the surge in vehicle values. Legislative analysts said that could amount to about \$138 million, effective in 2026.

The bill "will ultimately mean less tax revenue for our schools (and) for public safety," said Democratic Rep. Peter Merideth, who opposed the measure.

The Tax Foundation, a nonprofit group that researches taxes, has said property taxes are likely to be the biggest tax issue in many state legislatures this year.

Several states already have enacted property tax cuts. West Virginia last year passed a credit for personal property taxes that residents pay annually on vehicles, at an estimated cost of \$157 million to the state.

Colorado lawmakers meeting in a November special session approved legislation increasing residential deductions for property tax purposes and decreasing the property tax assessment rate. In Texas, voters in November approved a plan cutting property taxes by \$18 billion.

One Tech Tip: Here’s how to dry out your smartphone

LONDON — You were walking next to a swimming pool when you slipped and dropped your phone into the water. Or it slipped out of your hand when you were next to a filled bathtub or toilet.

However your smartphone got wet, you now need to dry it. But what do you do? There’s lots of advice on the internet, some of it conflicting. Apple inserted itself into the debate recently when it put out an advisory that included a warning against using rice.

Here are some things to keep in mind next time your phone has an unintended encounter with a liquid.

What you should do

Dry off the exterior with a towel or clean cloth, even your shirt-sleeve — anything that’s absorbent. Take out the SIM card and holder. If possible, remove the back housing and battery to wipe them dry. Also, if possible, turn the phone off.

iPhones can’t be disassembled so Apple recommends tapping it gently against your hand with the connector ports facing down so liquid can flow out.

Samsung, which is the biggest maker of Android phones, recommends using a cotton bud to get moisture out of the ear-phone jack and charging port. In contrast, Apple says cotton buds shouldn’t be inserted into iPhone openings.

If it’s not water but another liquid — a drink, seawater or chlorinated pool water — Samsung advises soaking the phone in clean water for a few minutes then rinsing it to get rid of any impurities or salinity that could speed up corrosion of the circuitry inside.

Both companies say it’s best to leave the phone out in a well ventilated area (perhaps with a fan) to dry it out. Google says leave the device to dry at room temperature.

What you shouldn’t do

Don’t use a hair dryer or compressed air on your phone. Don’t put it in a freezer — this might stop your device from short-circuiting but the problem will be back once you try to thaw it. And while this might seem obvious, don’t put your device in a tumble dryer or on top of a radiator.

Don’t power it up or try to charge it with a cable — although wireless charging is OK if your phone has it and you really need to turn it on in an emergency.

So what about using rice to dry your device? You may have heard that putting a phone in a bowl of rice will help draw out moisture. It’s been a tip that’s been out there for years.

Apple, however, says that’s a no-no. The company warned against it in an advisory published in early January. It drew little attention at the time, but then people noticed the line that said: “Don’t put your iPhone in a bag of rice. Doing so could allow small particles of rice to damage your iPhone.”

Is there anything I can use besides rice?

The best option is silica gel, a drying agent that can absorb lots of moisture. Silica gel beads are typically found in packets that are included with products like beef jerky, seaweed sheets or sneakers to keep them dry. You can also buy them in bulk online. This works best if you put them in an airtight box with your phone.

When do I know it’s dry?

It’s hard to tell but it’s best to wait as long as possible — at least a few days. Samsung advises bringing your device into a service center for inspection even after it’s been air-dried.

Aren’t phones waterproof nowadays?

Most phones nowadays are designed to be water-resistant, which means they can resist water entering critical areas for a certain amount of time. But beware, this isn’t the same as being waterproof.

Apple says the iPhone 7 and newer models are splash and water resistant. iPhone XS devices and up have the IP68 rating, which means they can be submerged for as long as 30 minutes and, depending on the model, as deep as 6 meters (20 feet). These models also pop up a warning if there’s liquid detected in key ports, and warn against charging. Samsung says most of its Galaxy Android phones feature the same rating, though the maximum depth is about 5 meters (16 feet).

Google’s newer Pixel phones carry the same water resistance ratings, but Google warns that they aren’t waterproof and the water resistance will diminish over time because of “normal wear and tear, device repair, disassembly or damage.”

What to expect in Missouri’s GOP caucuses

WASHINGTON — The Missouri Republican Party will hold presidential caucuses on Saturday, March 2, offering voters their only chance to weigh in on who should represent the party on the November presidential ballot. The contest is one of the last chances for candidates to shape the race for the GOP nomination before Super Tuesday, when 15 states will hold Republican contests on March 5, the most of any day on the primary calendar.

Former President Donald Trump looks to extend his string of primary and caucus victories this year, while Nikki Haley, his former U.N. ambassador, seeks her first win of the campaign. Trump prevailed twice under the state’s old presidential primary system, first in 2016, when he barely edged Texas Sen. Ted Cruz, and again in 2020, when he won 97% of the vote as the incumbent.

The caucuses will also start the process of awarding 51 of Missouri’s 54 Republican delegates to the Republican National Convention this summer.

The caucuses were organized after GOP Gov. Mike Parson signed a 2022 law that, among other things, canceled the planned March 12 presidential primary. Lawmakers have failed to reinstate the primary, despite calls to do so by both the state Republican and Democratic party leaders. Democrats will hold a party-run primary on March 23.

A look at what to expect on election night: CAUCUS DAY

The caucuses are scheduled to convene at 10 a.m. In Pettis County, the local caucus will be hosted in the Missouri Electric Cooperative building on the Missouri State Fairgrounds in Sedalia.

WHAT’S ON THE BALLOT

It is the only contest being decided that day, aside from administrative posts such as caucus chair and secretary. There is no “ballot” in the traditional sense, as caucus-goers form groups to express their preferences, but the candidates eligible for nomination at the caucuses are Trump, Haley and Florida businessman David Stuckenberg. Texas businessman and pastor Ryan Binkley ended his campaign on Tuesday,

and the state party’s practice has been to remove former candidates from the caucus mix.

WHO MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE CAUCUSES

Caucus-goers must be registered to vote in Missouri and sign a pledge declaring their “allegiance to the Missouri Republican Party.” The caucus rules state: “Only strong and faithful Republican voters residing and registered to vote in the district involved shall be allowed to participate in any caucus or Convention.”

For years, Missouri voters did not register by party, but the same 2022 election law that canceled the presidential primary also gave voters the option to “affiliate” with a party through their local county clerk’s office. While the state party does not require caucus-goers to have officially affiliated with the Republican Party through this new process, it has advised county party chairs and caucus staff that voters who chose to affiliate with the Democratic Party may be barred from participating on Saturday.

DELEGATE ALLOCATION RULES

Missouri has 54 Republican delegates. Fifty-one of them are awarded to candidates through a monthslong process that begins Saturday. Eleven delegates will be awarded to candidates at the statewide level, while five delegates will be awarded from each of Missouri’s eight congressional districts. That’s a combined total of 51 delegates at stake in what’s known as a “caucus-convention” system. The remaining three delegates are the state party chairman and Missouri’s Republican national committeeman and committeewoman, who may support any candidate they wish regardless of caucus results.

Caucus-goers will express their preferences for president, and those results ultimately are used to determine the number of delegates awarded to candidates both at the statewide and congressional district level. At both the statewide and district levels, all delegates at stake are awarded to the candidate who receives majority support. If no candidate receives a majority, delegates are allocated

proportionally among candidates who received at least 15% of support, with some minor exceptions.

The individuals who will serve as national convention delegates will be selected at congressional district conventions on April 6 and the state convention on May 4.

DECISION NOTES

Missouri’s GOP caucuses vaguely resemble the format Iowa Democrats used for decades before scrapping it for this year in favor of a vote-by-mail primary.

Unlike state-run primaries, participants must attend in person during a limited time frame and participate in a party meeting, rather than being able to just cast a ballot and leave. Voting is not done by secret ballot. Caucus-goers instead move around the room and form groups in support of their preferred presidential candidate.

Any candidate group that comprises less than 15% of the total attendance of that caucus in the first round of voting must disband, and its members have the option of joining another candidate group. The number of people in the newly formed candidate groups is then used to determine how many representatives each campaign will send to district-level conventions in April as well as to the state convention in May. Delegates to those spring conventions will formally allocate national convention delegates to the presidential candidates.

If a candidate has the support of more than 50% of the total attendance in a caucus site, the candidate wins all the district and state convention delegates at stake in that caucus. If a candidate wins the caucus with less than 50%, proportionality rules are applied, depending on the number of delegates at stake.

The Associated Press will report a statewide winner based on the preferences of caucus participants. The vote results will not reflect the raw votes of all caucus-goers. Instead, the vote will be expressed in terms of how many of the 924 state delegates each candidate has won, as well as the number of district delegates each candidate has won across eight congressional

districts.

The AP does not make projections and will declare a winner only when it’s determined there is no scenario that would allow the trailing candidates to close the gap. If a race has not been called, the AP will continue to cover any newsworthy developments, such as candidate concessions or declarations of victory. In doing so, the AP will make clear that it has not yet declared a winner and explain why.

WHAT DO TURNOUT AND ADVANCE VOTE LOOK LIKE

The last time Missouri Republicans held caucuses to allocate delegates in a contested presidential campaign was in 2012, but the format was different and there was no binding presidential preference result to provide a meaningful turnout comparison for this year.

Early and absentee voting is not permitted at the caucuses. Caucus-goers must participate in-person at the caucus site.

As of November 2022, there were about 4.3 million voters registered in Missouri.

HOW LONG WILL VOTE-COUNTING TAKE?

The caucuses convene without a hard stop time. Chairs of individual caucus sites must report their results to the state party no later than 5 p.m. The state party has not provided a more detailed vote-counting timeline beyond those broad parameters.

Given the number of items on the agenda, the length of time allotted to forming and reforming preference groups and the possibility of delays as caucus staff and participants adjust to an unfamiliar system, it may take even the most efficiently run caucus at least one to two hours to conduct all of its business. In Iowa, caucuses in some precincts have lasted up to three hours.

The AP will begin reporting results as soon as they are available.

ARE WE THERE YET?

As of Saturday, there will be 135 days until the Republican National Convention in Milwaukee and 248 days until the November general election.

Miles apart, Biden and Trump tour U.S.-Mexico border

BROWNSVILLE, Texas — Three hundred miles apart, President Joe Biden and likely Republican challenger Donald Trump walked the U.S.-Mexico border in Texas Thursday, dueling trips underscoring how important immigration has become for the 2024 election and how much each man wants to use it to his advantage.

Each chose an optimal location to make his points, their schedules remarkably similar. They each got a briefing on operations and issues, walked along the border and gave remarks that overlapped. But that's where the comparisons ended.

Biden, who sought to spotlight how Republicans tanked a bipartisan border security deal on Trump's orders, went to the Rio Grande Valley city of Brownsville. For nine years, this was the busiest corridor for illegal crossings, but they have dropped sharply in recent months.

The president walked a quiet stretch of the border along the Rio Grande, and received a lengthy operations briefing from Homeland Security agents who talked to him blunt-

ly about what more they needed.

"I want the American people to know what we're trying to get done," he said to officials there. "We can't afford not to do this."

Trump, meanwhile, continued his dialed-up attacks on migrants arriving to the border, deriding them as "terrorists" and criminals after harnessing rhetoric once used by Adolf Hitler to argue migrants are poisoning the blood of America.

"This is a Joe Biden invasion," Trump said.

Trump was in Eagle Pass, roughly 325 miles northwest of Brownsville, in the corridor that's currently seeing the largest number of crossings. He went to a local park that has become a Republican symbol of defiance against the federal immigration enforcement practices it mocks.

Gov. Greg Abbott and Texas National Guard soldiers gave him a tour, showing off razor wire they put up on Abbott's orders and in defiance of a U.S. Supreme Court order.

"This is like a war," Trump said.

The number of people who are illegally crossing the U.S. border has been rising for years for complicated reasons that include climate change, war and unrest in other nations,

the economy, and cartels that see migration as a cash cow.

The administration's approach has been to pair crackdowns at the border with increasing legal pathways for migrants designed to steer people into arriving by plane with sponsors, not illegally on foot to the border.

Arrests for illegal crossings fell by half in January, but there were record highs in December. The numbers of migrants flowing across the U.S.-Mexico border have far outpaced the capacity of an immigration system that has not been substantially updated in decades. Trump and Republicans claim Biden is refusing to act, but absent law change from Congress, any major policies are likely to be challenged or held up in court.

Among those voters, worries about the nation's broken immigration system are rising on both sides of the political divide, which could be especially problematic for Biden.

According to an AP-NORC poll in January, the share of voters concerned about immigration rose to 35% from 27% last year. Fifty-five percent of Republicans say the government needs to focus on immigration in 2024, while 22% of Democrats

listed immigration as a priority. That's up from 45% and 14%, respectively, from December 2022.

Trump landed to cheers from a crowd gathered at the small airport who held signs that read: "Trump 2024." Some yelled, "Way to go, Trump." He chatted with supporters for a few minutes before getting into his waiting SUV.

From Air Force One, Homeland Security Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas dismissed claims the president's visit was political, and noted how badly his department that manages the U.S.-Mexico border needed extra funding that would have been contained in the collapsed bill.

"This visit is focused on the work that we do, not the rhetoric of others," he said. "This is focused on operational needs, operational challenges and the significant impact that legislation would have in enhancing our border security."

In a symbol of the political divide, the Republican-controlled House voted to impeach Mayorkas over the Biden administration's handling of the U.S.-Mexico border. Democrats say the charges amount to a policy dispute, not the "high crimes and misdemeanors" laid out as a bar for impeachment in the Constitution.

Since the president was last at the border a year ago, the debate over immigration in Washington has shifted further to the right. Democrats have become increasingly eager to embrace border restrictions now that migrants are sleeping in police stations and airplane hangars in major cities.

During bipartisan talks on an immigration deal that would have toughened access for migrants, Biden himself said he'd be willing to "shut down the border" right now, should the deal pass.

The talks looked promising for a while. But Trump, who didn't want to give Biden a political win on one of his signature campaign issues, persuaded Republicans to kill the deal. House Speaker Mike Johnson, R-La., declared it dead on arrival.

Biden vowed to make sure everyone knew why.

"Every day, between now and November, the American people are gonna know that the only reason the border is not secure is Donald Trump and his MAGA Republican friends," Biden said this month, referring to the former president's Make America Great Again slogan.

Trump was also to be interviewed by Fox News' Sean Hannity from Shelby

Park, an expanse along the Rio Grande owned by the city of Eagle Pass.

Trump has laid out updated immigration proposals that would mark a dramatic escalation of the approach he used in office and that drew alarms from civil rights activists and numerous court challenges.

Some of those include reviving and expanding his controversial travel ban, imposing "ideological screening" for migrants, terminating all work permits and cutting off funding for shelter and transportation for people who are in the country illegally. Trump also is likely to bring up the killing of a 22-year-old nursing student in Georgia. The suspect is a Venezuelan migrant.

"Biden is preposterously trying to blame me and Congressional Republicans for the national security and public safety disaster he has created," Trump wrote in an op-ed in the British newspaper The Daily Mail. "He created this catastrophe."

Airlines could face more fines for mishandling wheelchairs under proposal

The Biden administration is proposing to make it easier for the government to fine airlines for damaging or misplacing wheelchairs by making it an automatic violation of a federal law on accessible air travel.

The U.S. Transportation Department also called Thursday for airlines to provide annual training for employees who handle wheelchairs or lift passengers with disabilities.

Damage to wheelchairs and scooters during air travel is a big problem. The Transportation Department said 11,527 of the devices were mishandled by airlines last year, up slightly from 2022.

The administration announced the proposed rule during a White House event that included advocates for people with disabilities.

There will be a 60-day period for public comment on the proposed rule. It's not clear, however, when or if the proposal will ever become final. Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg declined to provide a timetable when he briefed reporters.

Under the proposal, it would be easier for the Transportation Department

to fine airlines up to roughly \$125,000 if they damage a wheelchair or delay its return to the passenger at the end of a flight.

The proposal would give passengers the right to use their preferred vendor to repair or replace a damaged wheelchair — airlines are already required to cover the cost.

Buttigieg called the proposal the biggest expansion of rights for passengers who use a wheelchair since 2008. He said airlines need stronger financial incentives to treat disabled passengers with dignity.

The large number of damaged wheelchairs "reflects a culture where this is just treated as part of doing business," he said. "There is going to be this risk that if something happens to your chair, and that's too bad."

Airlines for America, a trade group for the largest U.S. carriers, said airlines are working with the government and disability groups to reduce barriers to flying, said its member airlines have increased employee training, set up passenger-accessibility advisory groups and supported development of accessibility improvements since signing a commitment in October 2022.

"U.S. airlines are com-

mitted to offering a high level of customer service and providing a positive and safe flight experience for passengers with disabilities," said Hannah Walden, a spokeswoman for the group.

The airline group didn't comment on the administration's specific proposals.

The Muscular Dystrophy Association, one of several disability-rights groups pushing for better treatment of disabled passengers, praised the proposal. Paul Melmeyer, the group's vice president of public policy, highlighted provisions on training for airline workers, higher standards for on-board wheelchairs that passengers use to get to the lavatory, and placing the passenger's personal wheelchair as close as possible to the aircraft door when they exit.

Melmeyer also endorsed the prospect of big fines for mishandling wheelchairs.

"We work with the airlines. They are not trying to damage wheelchairs, but we do need them to be more motivated to damage or mishandle fewer wheelchairs used by our community," he said. "If higher fines or more frequent use of fines by the Department of Transportation will accomplish that goal, then we're going to be supportive of that."

Norovirus illnesses are up in some places. Here's what to know

Cases of norovirus, a nasty stomach bug that spreads easily, are climbing in the Northeastern U.S., the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported Thursday.

Nationwide, about 12% of most recent norovirus tests sent to the CDC were positive, but the proportion was about 16% in the Northeast, the agency said. That compares with nearly 10% of norovirus tests in the Midwest and South and nearly 13% in the West.

Characterized by the sudden onset of vomiting, diarrhea and general feelings of misery, norovirus outbreaks are notorious on cruise ships, nursing homes, jails, schools and other places where people are in close contact.

Here's what you need to know about this wily germ:

WHAT IS NOROVIRUS?

Norovirus infections are caused by a group of viruses that spread remarkably easily. It can take as few as 10 viral particles — "a minuscule amount" — to make someone sick, said Dr. William Schaffner, a infectious disease expert

at Vanderbilt University Medical Center.

HOW DOES NOROVIRUS SPREAD?

Norovirus can spread from person to person, in food or water or on contaminated surfaces. Because it's so contagious, one handshake or a the touch of a contaminated door knob or handrail can be enough to cause illness, experts said.

HOW LONG DOES A NOROVIRUS ILLNESS LAST?

Illness caused by norovirus typically starts suddenly, in what Schaffner called "a strikingly dramatic way." A person can go from slightly unwell to miserable within hours.

It usually lasts two to three days. Most people recover fully.

WHO IS AT RISK?

There is no medication to treat norovirus. Dehydration from vomiting and diarrhea is a chief worry, so those most at risk include young children, older people and those with weakened immune systems.

It's important to replace fluids by sipping water, soda or other drinks — except coffee, tea and alcohol

— during illness, Schaffner said. Anyone experiencing symptoms of dehydration should seek medical help, he added.

HOW CAN I AVOID BEING INFECTED WITH NOROVIRUS?

The best defense against norovirus infection, especially during the peak winter season, is rigorous and frequent handwashing. Use ordinary soap and warm water and scrub hands vigorously for 20 seconds before meals.

Cleaning surfaces is important, too. Use household disinfectants and scrub well, Schaffner said.

IS THIS SEASON WORSE THAN PAST YEARS?

The nationwide trajectory of norovirus doesn't seem very different this year than in past years, but there are still a few weeks left in the winter, experts noted.

The unpleasant truth is that a norovirus surge is to be expected at this time of year, said Dr. Daniel Griffin, an infectious disease expert at Columbia University Medical Center.

"We often call it 'winter vomiting disease,'" he said.

The ladder was helpful when Mitchell locked herself out one time, and Menefee always let them borrow his truck, even letting them keep spare keys after they moved to come use it anytime.

When called about Lion Dave's celebration, the Mitchells had to attend and support their great friend.

"We're very excited about it," Mitchell said. "We got a call from Jeff Wimann, I guess last month, and he told us about the celebration, so Max said, 'of course we're going to be here,' so we are."

Menefee graduated from Smith-Cotton High School in 1954, attended the University of Missouri, worked for McDonald Aircraft in St. Louis, joined the National Guard, operated a local Hallmark store from 1963 to 1978, and sold insurance for 30 years.

"Dave joined this club on March 1, 1974, and this Friday is the 50th anniversary of that event," Lions President Evan Fluty said. "He became our president for the 1978-79 year and was one of the initial selections for our Lions Club EB Smith award."

Fluty noted when Menefee joined the Lions Club, Nixon was president, gas was 39 cents a gallon and it was only men meeting at the Hotel Bothwell each week, suit and tie mandatory. These days, Lions are 40% women.

Dr. Derrick Menefee wrote in a letter, which

was read by Fluty, that as Dave and Vera's son, he had the perfect childhood.

"He rescued them from a life that could have been a lot different going through the foster care system," Dr. Menefee's letter stated. "He was adopted and never ever felt adopted, and he feels like any other kid raised by loving parents other than he was quite spoiled. He said my dad is the nicest man I'll ever know."

Menefee told the Democrat he has enjoyed his time with the Sedalia Lions club.

"It's been fun, it really has," Menefee said. "It's a good group. Get involved, it's simple enough. Everybody can take the first step - you do the first step and it's easier after that."

Menefee used to sell brooms door to door for the Lions Club, but always remembered he was really selling Lion service projects.

"Whether it's self-satisfaction, whatever, you have to feel it, but you have to want to do it, too," Menefee said. "It's easy to talk it, but it's hard to do it sometimes."

After a lifetime of shaking hands and greeting neighbors, Menefee offered a suggestion for those dealing with shyness.

"They live with it, and they can overcome it," Menefee noted. "I think we all kind of sometimes hide inside our shell. It's easier than coming out and getting involved, but I think once you get involved, you enjoy it."

Young testified for the need to return to the PPP in Jefferson City last year and the motion passed the House but expired in the Senate. Young hopes the former process will be returned.

"We no longer have a Presidential Preference Primary; it has been turned to kind of a mirrored form of the Iowa caucus," Young explained. "So, instead of having weeks to go vote in the Presidential Preference Primary, we call it the PPP,

this is a one-shot deal only."

From local caucuses to state caucuses to Milwaukee's national convention, those who show up Saturday will help decide the GOP's course for the next four years.

"We've always had a caucus where we elect our county delegates to go onto the Congressional and State, which is where we elect the delegates to the RNC at those two levels," Young said. "The Congressional one is April 6, a month later is the State one."

Missouri will have 54 delegates to go to the Republican National Conven-

tion, who are bound in the first round of voting to the winning delegates from the caucus.

"You have to come in," Young said, "and it's not a ballot process. You come in and sit down and we go through the whole thing, including electing the delegates to represent the county in the next two levels, and we go over the platform to make suggestions."

Young wants to make sure Saturday's process runs as smoothly as possible while making sure the public gets to help choose the nation's leaders.

"I never want to take

away the vote and I don't think anybody should," Young emphasized. "I want them to come in and exercise their right to vote."

You must be a registered Missouri voter in the county in which you wish to join a caucus. All counties will begin their caucuses at 10 a.m. March 2.

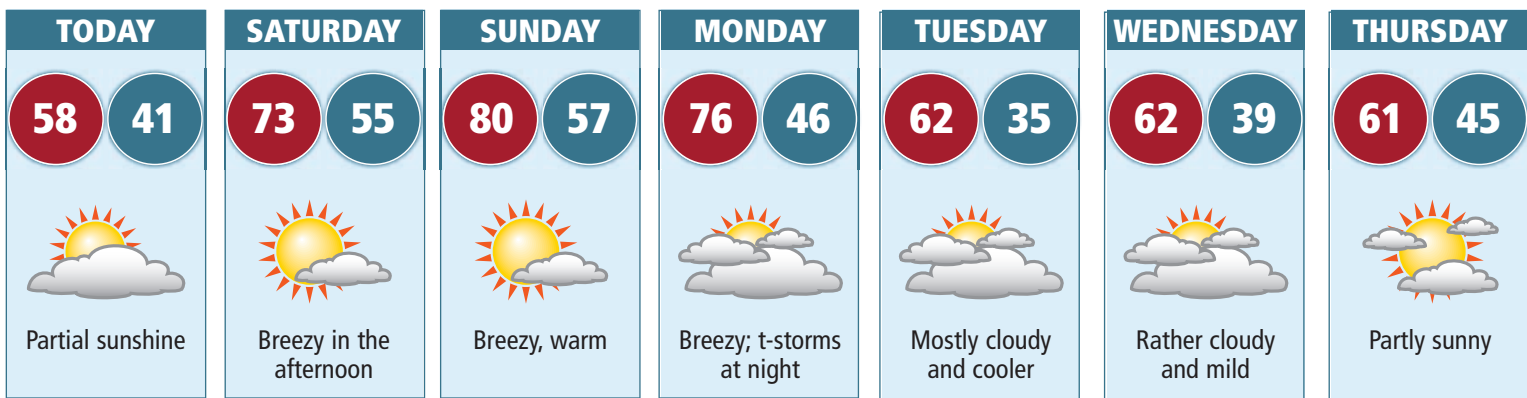

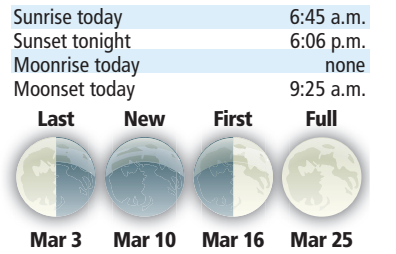

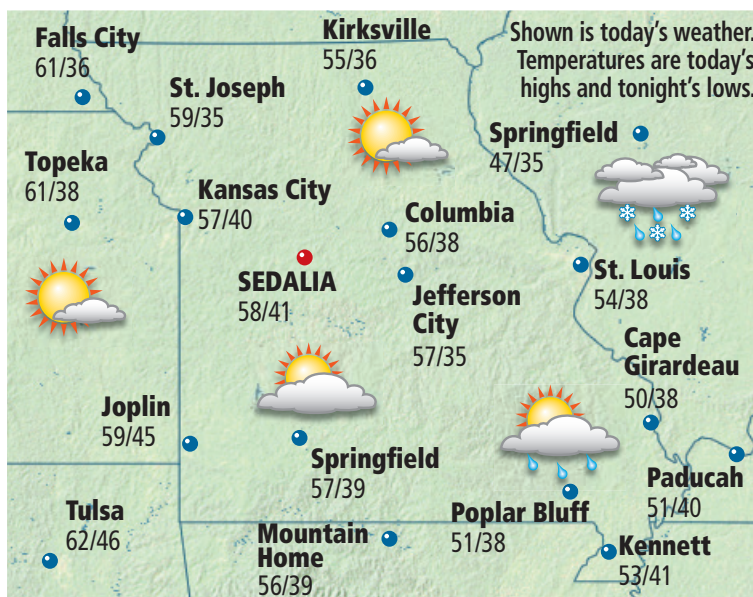

Three years ago, The State Fair Community College women's basketball team had just one win.

Now, the team is in the midst of their best season since the 2015-16 season as the Roadrunners have reached the 20-win milestone and have their eyes set on reaching the national tournament.

Third-year head coach Nicole Collier was hired after the one-win 2020-21 season and led the team to a 9-16 record in her first season and a 13-16 record last season.

The last time the Roadrunners made it to the national tournament, they were eliminated in the first round by Western Nebraska Community College.

The team's depth this season has also helped them win games.

The Roadrunners boast a large roster of 16 players, 13 of which are freshmen.

Collier said this has helped the team become more balanced.

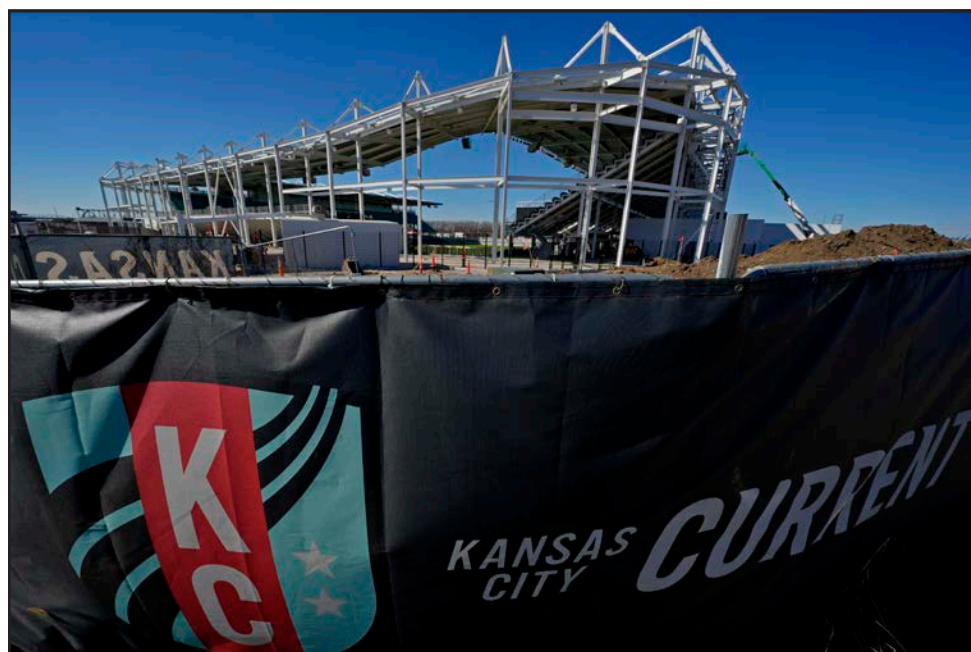
"We're pretty consistent. There's not one player that averages 20 points and then everyone else is below them. It's pretty even scoring and balance," Collier said. Kansas City Current home to first NWSL stadium

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — One by one the women walked onto the field for the first time, shortly before they departed for a warm-weather camp in Florida, and gazed at the stands towering above them on three sides and the scoreboard looming over them on the fourth.

For the first time, they felt as if they were home.

That's because for the

first time in the history of the National Women's Soccer League — and just maybe, professional soccer worldwide — the Kansas City Current had a home every bit as good as men's teams just for themselves. Built at a cost of nearly \$120 million on the banks of the Missouri River, with the downtown skyline just to the south, CPKC Stadium represents one of the few facilities in the world that has been constructed expressly for the use of

female athletes.

"I'm very happy for Kansas City," Brazilian star and KC Current forward Debinha would say, "but also for women's soccer."

The 11,000-seat stadium, almost entirely privately financed, will be christened March 16, when the Current play the Portland Thorns in a game televised by ABC, providing a national showcase for just how far the club and the sport have come.

Chiefs owner gets 'F-' grade from NFLPA

Chiefs owner Clark Hunt admitted Wednesday the Super Bowl champions are overdue for renovations to their practice facilities after the NFL Players Association's annual report card graded Kansas City the second-worst team in the league overall.

Hunt had just unveiled plans for an \$800 million renovation to Arrowhead Stadium that would include plenty of amenities for fans — but little for players — when he was asked about the report card. The NFLPA has produced it the past two years based on surveys of players in an attempt to improve overall working conditions around the league.

The report card gave the Chiefs, who will go for a third straight Super Bowl title and fourth in six years next season, failing grades for their nutritionist/dietician, locker room and training staff. Hunt was given an F-minus as the owner of the franchise, and "a rating of 4.9/10 from Chiefs

players when considering his willingness to invest in the facilities."

"I have not had a chance to see the report," Hunt told a small group of reporters after the stadium presentation in Kansas City. "I mentioned the practice facility is something we're going to continue to think about. It's coming up on 20 years. We've certainly in a lot of ways outgrown it and we recognize we need to expand it and modernize it."

Hunt pointed out that the Chiefs recently renovated the locker rooms at Arrowhead Stadium, but those in the nearby training complex remain untouched. Most of the rest of the facility likewise has gone unchanged over the years.

Kansas City also received a D for its training room and team travel, a D-plus for treatment of families and C-minus for food and cafeteria. Its weighted score put it 31st ahead of only the Commanders, who received failing grades for team travel and training staff and an F-minus grade for its locker room and training room..

"The one bright spot for the team is head coach Andy Reid, who was the highest-rated head coach in the NFL," the survey said of the Chiefs. "Other than that, the players are frustrated by their workplace offerings, especially after the team's sustained success in recent years. The responses identify major issues in two areas: quality of care and out-of-date facilities."

NFLPA president JC Tretter said more than 77% of active players responded to the survey.

At the top of the rankings were the Miami Dolphins, who had no grade lower than an A-minus in any category and received the highest weighted score of any team. The Minnesota Vikings had no grade lower than a B and had the second-best score.

"The (Dolphins') state-of-the-art facilities continue to impress," the report said, "but more importantly, are complemented by the number of quality trainers, strength coaches and other support staff who help make the workplace experience one of the best across the league."

Phillies to scrap \$1 hot dog nights

PHILADELPHIA — For more than a quarter-century, Phillies fans considered dollar hot dog night among the best ballpark promotions — but the team has now decided it was the worst.

Those dog days of April — when the Philly weather is cold and the wieners are a steal — are going, going, gone.

The Phillies officially ended the popular promotion Thursday and replaced dollar dogs on select dates with a 2-for-1 deal at two April games at Citizens Bank Park.

A statement from the team said the change was made "based on the organization's ongoing commitment to provide a positive experience for all fans in attendance."

What wasn't positive about dollar dog nights?

Armed with projectile frankfurters, some unruly Phillies fans began chucking their favorite Hatfield meat during a game last year, and the dogs soared like cans of corn throughout the stands and onto the field. The demand for the discount dogs also led to clogged lanes — if not arteries — on the concourse, and the cramped

spaces led to security and safety concerns.

Who needs snowballs? An April 11 game last season turned into a Philly food fight when fans — largely good-naturedly — tossed their ballpark franks in several sections, leading to multiple ejections.

"It wasn't just the throwing," said John Weber, senior vice president, Phillies ticket operations and projects. "It's the concourse, the crowds of everybody being at the same X amount of stands. But obviously, you know, the throwing was a little bit of a tipping point."

Duke's Filipowski returns after court-storming injury

DURHAM, N.C. — Kyle Filipowski was in the starting lineup four days after sustaining a knee injury when fans stormed the court and finished with nine points, 10 rebounds and six assists as No. 10 Duke beat Louisville 84-59 on Wednesday night.

Filipowski, a preseason Associated Press All-American, was hurt following Saturday's loss at Wake Forest when he collided with a fan. Team managers and coaching staff members helped guide the sophomore stand-out away from the swarming fans and off the court.

"It wasn't anything too bad," Filipowski said of making the quick recovery. "Coming off a real hard loss, we had to make ourselves known again."

Jeremy Roach scored 19 points, Mark Mitchell added 17 and Jared McCain had 14 as the Blue Devils (22-6, 13-4 Atlantic Coast Conference) won for the sixth time in seven games. Duke is one game behind conference-leading North Carolina with three regular-season games remaining for both teams.

The Blue Devils had the right mindset following the aftermath of chaotic weekend game, coach Jon Scheyer said.

"Not to make excuses," Scheyer said. "Get back to work."

Tre White scored 15 points for Louisville (8-20, 3-13), which lost its fourth straight. Brandon Hunt-

ley-Hatfield and Ty-Laur Johnson each added 11 points. The Cardinals have lost 20 games for the second consecutive season.

"You have to walk in here with a toughness, with a fight," said Louisville coach Kenny Payne, who was disappointed with Duke's 43-24 rebounding advantage. "You can't beat this team if you're not going to rebound."

Roach connected on the first two of Duke's three 3-pointers in a 54-second span of the first half, giving the Blue Devils a 26-13 lead.

Duke led 36-23 at half-time. Louisville was slowed by 29% shooting from the field.

The Blue Devils committed 10 of their 14 turnovers in the first half, but they

routinely had high-percentage shots and finished with 23 assists, the team's most in ACC action this season.

TIP-INS

Filipowski has never missed a game in his two college seasons, playing in 64 contests. ... Duke played without freshman guard Caleb Foster, who was wearing a boot on his right foot. He had played in all 27 previous games, making 15 starts and averaging 7.7 points per game. Foster will be out for "some time," Scheyer said. "We have to adjust without Caleb. My heart breaks for him that he couldn't play."

BIG PICTURE

Louisville: The Cardinals have hit the brakes offensively after opening February with their best stretches of

offense this season. Making just 3 of 17 attempts from 3-point range wasn't going to be a winning recipe, and the Cardinals will likely be hard-pressed to make it out of the ACC basement.

Duke: The Blue Devils didn't seem distracted by the much-debated court-storming issue that was part of the college basketball conversation in recent days after the incident last weekend.

After three consecutive road games, Duke wasn't threatened in what became a run-away victory. The Blue Devils have won seven ACC games by 14 or more points.

Ronaldo suspended after alleged offensive gesture

Cristiano Ronaldo has been suspended for one match for making an alleged offensive gesture during a Saudi Arabia league game while playing for Al Nassr in the Saudi Pro League.

After Al-Nassr defeated Riyadh rival Al-Shabab 3-2 on Sunday, video footage appeared to show Ronaldo cupping his ear and repeatedly thrusting his hand forward near his pelvis, in a gesture that seemed to be aimed at Al-Shabab fans.

Background chants of "Messi," referencing Ronaldo's longstanding soccer rival Lionel Messi, could be heard.

The Disciplinary and Ethics Committee of the Saudi Arabia Football Federation (SAFF) committee announced the ban on social media early Thursday morning local time.

Al-Nassr's next league game is at home to Al-Hazm on Thursday.

The former Real Madrid and Manchester United star will also have to pay a fine of 20,000 Saudi Riyals (\$5,333) to Al-Shabab, to cover the costs of the club filing the complaint, and half of that amount to the federation.

The committee said that the decision was not open to appeal.

While the incident was not captured by television cameras, the actions of Ronaldo, who scored a first-half penalty in the game, were widely criticized in Saudi Arabia by former players and commentators.

According to reports in the Saudi Arabia media, the 39-year-old told the committee that the gesture was one of victory and common in Europe.

It is not the first time that the Portuguese forward has been at the center of contro-

versy since joining Al-Nassr. Last April, upon leaving the field after a game against Al-Hilal, Ronaldo appeared to grab his genitals as fans chanted Messi's name. On that occasion, Al-Nassr said that the forward had sustained a groin injury in the match.

Ronaldo, who moved to the Riyadh-based club in December 2022, has a league-leading 22 goals. His scored the opener against Al Shabab, a first-half penalty.

Al Nassr is also in the quarterfinals of the Asian Champions League, a tournament it has never won.

LeBron James takes over in Lakers' comeback win

LOS ANGELES — LeBron James scored 19 of his 34 points during a brilliant fourth quarter, leading the Los Angeles Lakers back from a 21-point deficit for a dramatic 116-112 victory over the Los Angeles Clippers on Wednesday night.

Kawhi Leonard missed a 12-footer with five seconds to play, and James threw a long pass to Cam Reddish for a dunk that punctuated a stunning victory for the Lakers in the rivals' final regular-season game as co-tenants of their downtown arena.

The 39-year-old James was the center of it all, hitting five of his season-high seven 3-pointers while outscoring the Clippers by himself in the fourth quarter (19-16). He either scored or assisted on 11 of the Lakers' 13 baskets in the final period.

"It's just a feeling when you feel like everything you put up is going in," James said. "I just kept it consistent. I wasn't taking ill-advised shots. I stayed in the course of the offense. My teammates did a great job of continuing to find me, and I just tried to dictate the tempo, dictate

the game. ... It's just a zone. Can't really describe it. Wish you could stay in it forever."

Leonard scored 26 points and James Harden had 23 points and nine assists for the Clippers, who lost back-to-back games for the first time since Dec. 23 after committing seven turnovers and allowing 39 points in that calamitous fourth quarter. The Clippers played without All-Star Paul George, who missed his second straight game with a sore left knee, and starting center Ivica Zubac, who was ill.

"It's one game," Clippers coach Tyronn Lue said. "Played well for three quarters. Didn't finish the game. I never let one loss or a bad loss take away from what we've been doing and what we've built. It's a tough loss because we were up 21 points, but this is a good team, and when you don't take care of the basketball and you don't do what you're supposed to do, you lose."

The Clippers led 98-77 in the opening minute of the fourth quarter, but James led a 29-8 run in just 7:34. Anthony Davis' free throws tied it at 106- with four minutes to

play, and James found Rui Hachimura for a go-ahead 3-pointer moments later.

D'Angelo Russell's 3-pointer put the Lakers up 114-108 with 1:12 to play before Harden and Leonard scored on drives to the hoop while James missed a pair of shots for the Lakers. But Leonard's last shot was off target, and James found Reddish for the capper to the delight of the thousands of Lakers fans in attendance at a "road" game.

"How can you be surprised with some of the things he does?" Russell asked about James. "A lot of guys locked in defensively and gave us what we needed, but he's a huge reason we won this game, just from him being him. As a group, we fought."

The Lakers won three of four over the Clippers this season, winning the season series for the first time since 2011-12.

Davis had 20 points and 12 rebounds for the Lakers, while Russell had 18 and Hachimura added 17.

The Clippers and Lakers moved into the building long known as Staples Center — along with the NHL's Los Angeles Kings — when it opened in

1999. The NBA franchises shared their home for the next 25 years, usually facing each other four times annually in a rivalry known as the Hallway Series because their locker rooms are about 100 feet apart in the same corridor.

The era ends this fall when the Clippers move into Intuit Dome, owner Steve Ballmer's lavish new arena in Inglewood. Ballmer decided the Clippers needed their own home to complete their move out of the shadows of the Lakers' 17 NBA championships and the accompanying banners on the walls of the shared arena, and the billionaire quickly got it done.

The balance of power in Los Angeles still tilts completely in the Lakers' direction, but the Clippers have made progress: They've finished with a better record than the Lakers in 10 of the last 11 seasons, failing only in 2020 when the Lakers won their 17th title.

The teams could always meet in a playoff series this spring, but that's never happened.

Reddish returned from a 14-game absence due to a sprained right ankle.

Chad Ramey takes lead at Cognizant Classic with 64

PALM BEACH GARDENS, Fla. — Chad Ramey's first two trips to PGA National as a professional were largely forgettable. He might have a chance to change that this week.

Ramey shot a bogey-free round of 7-under 64 on Thursday in the opening round of the Cognizant Classic in the Palm Beaches, grabbing a one-stroke lead after the morning wave over Cameron Young, Ryan Moore, Chesson Hadley, Austin Eckroat and Andrew Novak. The event is the first on the PGA Tour's Florida Swing this year.

Ramey's past appearances in the event — then known as the Honda

Classic — were quick and unremarkable. He missed the cut at PGA National by 10 shots in 2022, missed it by just one stroke last year and failed to shoot a round in the 60s either time. But conditions were perfect when he teed off early Thursday; a course known to often have whipping winds had barely a breeze for much of his round.

"I got a good break this morning with there not being any wind," Ramey said. "I fully expect the rest of the week the wind to blow. I've never been here and it not blow. But to take advantage of the calm conditions is definitely a plus."

Added Rory McIlroy, the world's No. 2-ranked player who shot a 4-under 67 in the morning wave: "You're not going to get this course much easier."

Ramey made a 27-foot birdie putt on the opening hole, starting a stretch where he had five birdies in his opening seven holes — including on the 479-yard, par-4 sixth, one of PGA National's toughest holes. From there, he mostly just stayed out of trouble; only two of his 11 par putts were from outside of 4 feet.

"Hit it well, putted well, chipped in once," said Ramey, whose last first-round lead came last year at The Players Championship. "Very solid through the whole bag."

Hadley was also bogey-free, with six birdies on his card as he finished one shot back of Ramey. Moore holed out from 113 yards for eagle at the par-4 13th, highlighting his 65. Eckroat had five consecutive birdies in one stretch;

he and Moore both had nine birdies and three bogeys on the day.

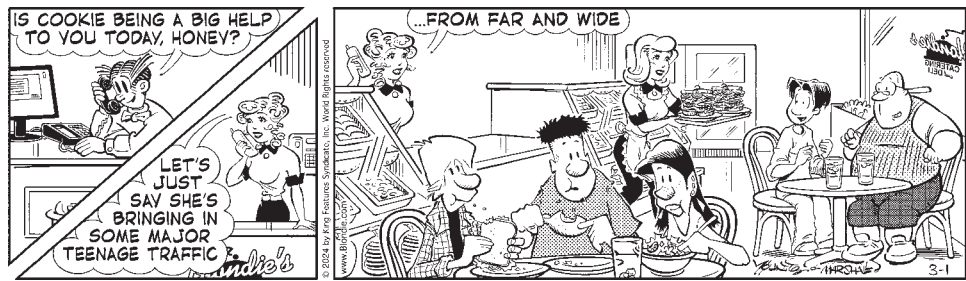
Hadley said the combination of minimal wind and receptive greens left him thinking "let's go."

"I was able to take advantage of the conditions today and shoot 6 under. It probably will continue to go a little bit lower, but it'll show its teeth. It always does," Hadley said. "Typically if you're just hanging around on Sunday, you can put together something, and it can be a special weekend."

Billy Horschel, C.T. Pan, Sam Ryder, Bud Cauley and Chandler Phillips were in a group at 5-under 66. McIlroy, defending champion Chris Kirk and FedExCup points leader Matthieu Pavon were among those who finished with 67s.

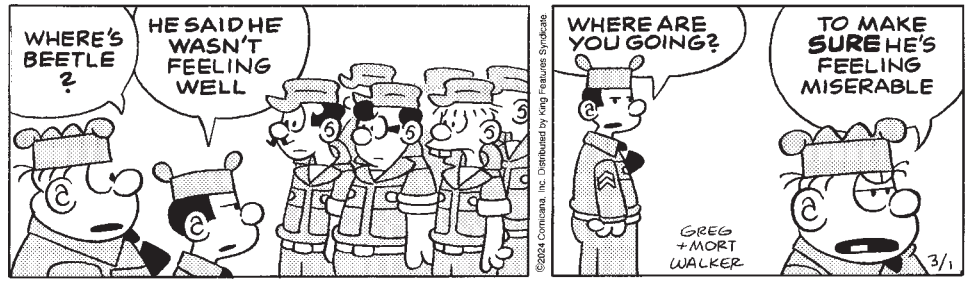

Start with the game itself, which a century ago in England imposed a ban on women playing pro matches in stadiums used by men. The sport had gone on hiatus during World War I with so many men fighting abroad, and games involving women grew so popular in their stead that 50,000 or more would turn out to watch at places such as Goodison Park.

The sport's governing body, the Football Association, felt threatened by the success and decided the game was "quite unsuitable for females," and for more than five decades effectively banned women from playing in any FA-affiliated grounds.

The ban eventually was lifted, but it took decades more for the women's game to begin gaining traction around the world. And in the U.S., numerous leagues formed and folded over the years before the NWSL finally found its lasting foothold.

Still, most of the 14 teams in the league rent stadiums, or if they are owned by a Major League Soccer club, play in venues built for the men. The predecessor to the Current, known as FC Kansas City before it folded in 2017, played at various times at a high school football stadium, a college soccer stadium and the training field of MLS club Sporting KC.

When the club reformed as the Current in 2021, it began playing in a minor league ballpark before moving a few blocks over to Children's Mercy Park, one of the jewels of MLS but a stadium that nevertheless belonged wholly to someone else.

But the vision of the Current's ownership group, led by Chris and Angie Long and including investors such as Chiefs quarterback Patrick Mahomes and his wife, Brittany, was to build facilities of their own. They began with an \$18 million, purpose-built practice facility, then turned their attention to the stadium, where they could control standards, scheduling and, most importantly, revenue.

"It raises the bar," Chris Long said told The Associated Press. "People are going to want to be there. They are going to want to be in Kansas City. And I think that's going to cause a ripple-effect globally, putting forward elite facilities for women athletes."

With women's sports on the rise, the timing hardly could be better. The most recent season of the WNBA, whose basketball teams generally rent out facilities, is coming off its highest television viewership in more than two decades. The first season of the Professional Women's Hockey League is underway. And viewership of college sports, highlighted by Iowa basketball star Caitlin Clark's pursuit of scoring history, also has

been on the rise.

Nor could the timing be better in Kansas City, where a golden age of sports is underway.

The Royals, who won the World Series in 2015, are planning to build a new downtown stadium by 2028 as part of a \$2 billion-plus public-private partnership. The Chiefs are coming off back-to-back Super Bowl titles, will try to become the first team in NFL history to three-peat this coming season, and are aiming for an \$800 million renovation of their own at Arrowhead Stadium.

Sporting KC remains a popular draw, as do several minor league teams in the area, while the NCAA wrestling championships and Big 12 basketball tournaments will soon take place at the nearby T-Mobile Center.

"From the beginning," Angie Long explained, "we wanted to be a tier-one sports team in our city. We have asked to be treated like the Chiefs and the Royals and Sporting KC, and our expectation of ourselves is that's what we can mean to our city."

Angie Long remembers being asked to attend an FC Kansas City game a decade ago, long before her ownership of its successor.

"I was like, 'Where's the game?' It was at the high school," she recalled. "The whole premise of that's what women's sports is, we want to break that mold. If you treat women's sports with this level of growth and investment, what can it be?"

Season tickets have been sold out for months, and the demand for single-game seats is strong enough that some fans already are wondering when the stadium will expand. It was designed so that seats can be added in the future.

Yet the construction of CPKC Stadium — naming rights were sold to the Canadian Pacific Kansas City railway — has not been without detractors. Some are concerned about property values and traffic congestion, others a lack of parking; the club recently said spots would cost \$50 per match, and many fans took to social media to express their outrage.

The club hopes many take advantage of ride-share options and public transportation to alleviate the parking concerns.

In the meantime, the countdown is on for the opening of one of the few stadiums in the world built for a women's team in any sport, and for showcasing what that could mean for professional teams elsewhere going forward.

"It definitely brings energy," former U.S. national team-turned-Current coach Vlatko Andonovski said. "When we trained in the stadium before going to Florida, the training was energetic and enthusiastic and intense, and we talked about: Can you imagine doing all of this with 11,000 people in the stands? It's exciting, and I hope we can use it to our advantage."

To be frank, the Phillies don't necessarily need the deal these days to pack in crowds. The Phillies started the promotion 27 years ago when they still played at cavernous Veterans Stadium to try and boost ticket sales on an otherwise dreary game night.

But the Phillies stuck with the food-frenzy deal through the decades, even as they rose again to become one of the best teams in the National League. The Phillies topped 3 million fans last season — and scheduled three dollar dog nights for two April and one May weeknight game when attendance is generally down compared to weekend games.

"The idea originally was much more family-oriented, four, five, six people and having a discounted concession item," Weber said. "As it's morphed over time, it's gone more to a

younger demographic, which is great as well, especially in the April, May timeframe."

The Phillies BOGO nights this season are April 2 against the Reds and April 16 against the Rockies.

Aramark did not provide sales totals for 2023.

The company said ahead of the 2022 World Series when the Phillies played the Houston Astros that 1 of every 3 fans eats a hot dog at Citizens Bank Park and an average 6,951 hot dogs were sold per game — enough to line Ashburn Alley five times.

The Phillies kept a running dollar dog sold tally on the scoreboard for each game they were marked down.

The Phillies first caught blowback in 2022 when they tried to scale back from three dollar dog nights to two.

The unpopular move failed to cut the mustard with fans — even in the highest branches of state government. Pennsylvania

Sen. Bob Casey responded to a writer for the Crossing Broad website who complained about the decision with a post on social media that read, "I agree, more Dollar Dog Nights. @Phillies Let's do this."

Casey was a hot dog here when one more dog night was added to the schedule.

He took a high road on Thursday, posting on social media, "Double (hot dog emoji) sounds like a great way to fuel up for #RedOctober."

Phillies fans still grilled the decision on social media.

By mid-afternoon, one apparel shop already had a T-shirt made lamenting the decision with the inscription "RIP dollar dog night. Pork Flew. Heads Rolled."

"Our goal is to always give a great fan experience," Weber said. "If you were there at the game, it was not a great experience."

If cheap meats are still your thing at the old ball-

game, head across the state to Pittsburgh, where the Pirates will hold at least six \$1 hot dog nights. Just a long relay throw south down I-95, the Class-A Wilmington Blue Rocks offer \$2 dog Wednesdays.

The Texas Rangers sell dollar dogs at every Wednesday home game and the Minnesota Twins put extra buns in the oven for their \$1 dog deal on each Tuesday home game. The Kansas City Royals are among the teams that still offer low-cost hot dogs.

Just not in Philly anymore, where some bad apples spoiled the Phillies' appetite for a good-dog deal.

"Hopefully our fans will still come out and view two hot dogs for five dollars as a value and support the team in those two April dates that we have," Weber said.

Hey, there is still a chance in Philly to always snag a free hot dog — just catch one out of the Phanatic's famed hot dog launcher.

Rounding out the top five in weighted score were the Green Bay Packers, Philadelphia Eagles and Jacksonville Jaguars.

At the bottom of the ranking were the Washing-

ton Commanders. When their players were asked what issues were most important to fix, the report said, "most players couldn't come up with just one."

"Instead, the common answer was the entire facility," the report said. "The players understand that the new club ownership didn't create these current prob-

lems, and they are hopeful that the new team ownership is willing to do what it takes to fix them."

This was the first year that the survey included grades for head coaches, owners and dietician/nutritionist.

More than half of head coaches received an A-minus or better, including

A-plus grades for Reid, the Lions' Matt Campbell and the Vikings' Kevin O'Connell. The lowest grade was a D for the Raiders' Josh McDaniels, who has since been fired.

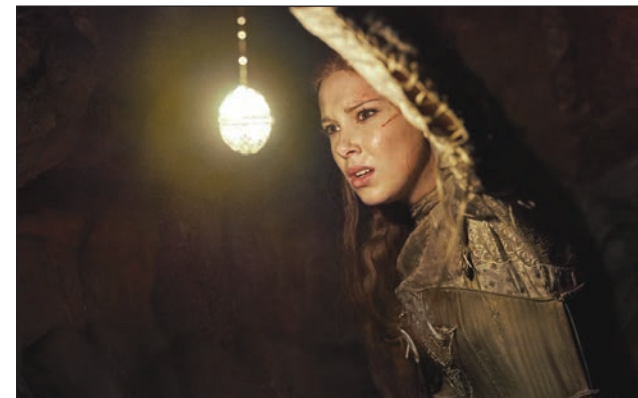

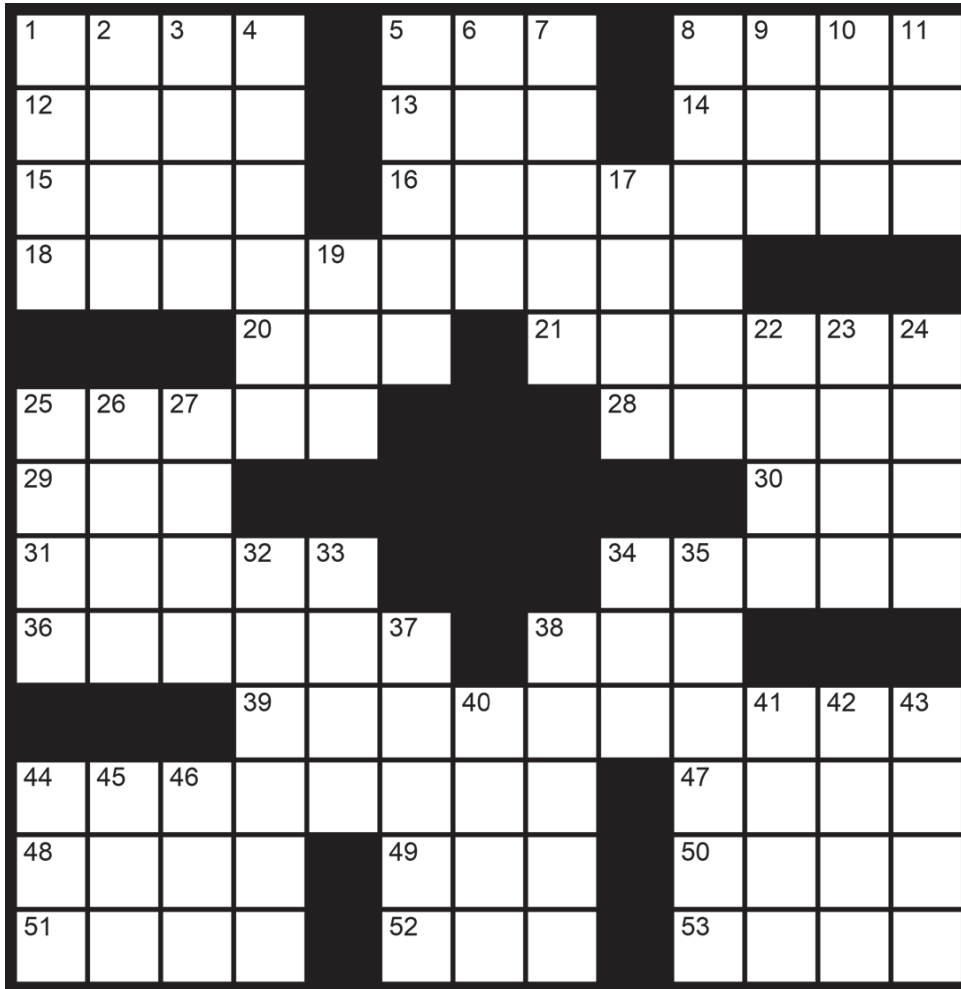

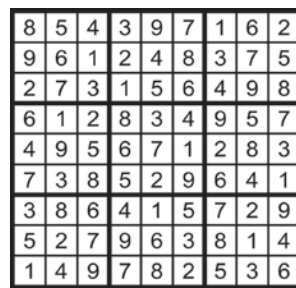
