City letter on Pettis County debt causes some confusion, concern

Unsigned letters on City of Sedalia letterhead that are causing some confusion and concern.

The letter alleges county owes the City off Sedalia \$548,000 based on a half-cent sales tax approved by voters and extended every five years since. Said tax is meant for improving and maintaining streets, sewer, water and stormwater projects in municipalities in Pettis County.

The letter goes on to allege the county withheld the money to force the Sedalia to not enforce fire and safety regulations for county owned buildings.

The Tuesday Sep. 4, Sedalia City Council meeting went without mention of the letter until a presentation on projects by the Road and Bridge Department by supervisor Justin Bray for Fiscal Year 2025.

According to Bray, public works completed seven projects this season.

“Totals were budgeted at \$979,000,” Bray told the council. “Total spent just in materials \$469,845, so the remain-

ing budget \$509,150.”

Bray noted the projects have been completed on time and under budget. However, his summary made note of the \$365,400 not received from the 1/2 cent sales tax owed by Pettis County.

With many crumbling roadways needing milling, overlays and chip seal, the council voted to complete remaining roadwork.

“We’re at \$470,000 roughly,” city administrator Kelvin Shaw said. “You’ll remember last year we did not get the allocation from the county of the county-wide sales tax, so that comes out of the reserves. So, you take that out you have a remaining budget of \$143,755.”

Shaw said the city has asked the county to allocate the funds, but not knowing their answer, the council voted to pay for the roadwork and hope for the county to chip in.

Second Ward council Tom Oldham told the Democrat on Thursday, Sept. 5, that he was the only councilman who voted to not send the letter at the Aug. 19 City Council meeting.

Raines finishes latest mural for Sedalia Spay and Neuter Clinic

Artist Kelsey Raines is known for her murals adorning buildings and business windows across Sedalia.

Last weekend, Raines finished her largest mural to date near the Sedalia Spay and Neuter Clinic, 214 W. Main St.

“I had done a mural inside the Spay and Neuter Clinic for Dr. [Olivia] Bloom,” Raines said. “She approached me about this huge wall, and I said, ‘Let’s do it.’ This is the biggest mural I’ve ever had, we measured and it’s like 23 feet by 100 feet.”

Sedalia Spay and Neuter Clinic owner Dr. Olivia Bloom, DVM, noted the project included support from the community.

“The Sedalia Animal Society and the City of Sedalia helped fund the artist,” Bloom said. “Dugan’s Paint donated all the paint, and the Sedalia Spay and Neuter Clinic paid for the lift to get the mural painted.”

The stucco wall looks smooth from afar, but up close is very textured and its bumpy surface adds to the difficulty of the painting.

“The wall has been a challenge,” Raines said. “It’s been a lot of spraying paint versus brushwork. We were using sprayers and then spray paint, so that makes it go on a little faster.”

The massive size makes

the finished mural impressive, though Raines had to use different methods to get the image correctly transferred from her original rendering.

“I have a drawing” Raines said. “I had to grid the wall to make sure that I had my size correct, then I projected the images of the dog and the cat to make sure that they were in proportion.”

Wednesday search warrant, traffic stop busts two for meth and fentanyl trafficking

The Pettis County Sheriff’s Office reported that around 1 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 4, a search warrant was executed by Pettis County Sheriff’s Office deputies and the Mid-Missouri Drug Task Force at 33062 Highway E regarding a continuous drug investigation.

Charles Spellmeyer, 55, of Green Ridge was detained and a search was conducted at the residence. Methamphetamine and fentanyl were located during the search in addition to forged license plates.

Spellmeyer was transported to the Pettis County Jail, where he was placed on a 24 hour hold on three counts of forgery, second-degree drug trafficking and possession of a controlled substance.

Charges have been sub-

mitted to the Pettis County prosecutor.

Also on Wednesday, at 3:59 p.m. a detective with the Mid-Missouri Drug Task Force conducted a traffic stop on eastbound U.S. Route 50 at Missouri Highway 127 in La Monte.

The driver and sole occupant was identified as Danny Love, 50, of Rocky Mount. Various factors were noted that were consistent with those of subjects involved in criminal activity. A search of the vehicle ensued after a positive K9 alert.

Approximately 57 grams of both methamphetamine and fentanyl were located inside a speaker box.

Love was arrested and placed on a 24 hour hold at the Pettis County Jail pending charges of two counts of second-degree drug trafficking.

Gas prices fall across the state this week

Prices below \$3 in Sedalia

According to information supplied by GasBuddy on Thursday, Sept. 5, the average gasoline price in Missouri has fallen 4.7 cents per gallon in the last week, averaging \$3.01 a gallon.

This is represented by GasBuddy’s survey of 3,940 stations in Missouri.

This week, Missouri’s prices are 20.4 cents per gallon lower than a month ago and 51.4 cents per gallon lower than a year ago.

The national average price of diesel has declined 3.5 cents in the last week and stands at \$3.66 per gallon.

According to GasBuddy price reports, the cheapest station in Missouri was



On Tuesday, Sept. 3, most Sedalia gas stations, such as the eastside Woods Express station, were selling gas at \$3.02 per gallon. However, Shell Jiffy Stop was selling gas at \$2.98 and Murphy USA at \$2.95.

\$2.48 a gallon on Monday, Sept. 2 (Labor Day), while the most expensive was \$3.79 a gallon, a difference of \$1.31.

On Thursday, all

stations in Sedalia were selling gas below \$3. The lowest price was \$2.93 per gallon at the Phillips 66 at 216 W. Broadway Blvd.

We are not created to be friendly with death

From the August 30 edition of the Sedalia Democrat: “At approximately 1 a.m. Friday, Aug. 30, Pettis County Sheriffs Office deputies were dispatched to the area near Anderson School Road and Shire Lane for a single vehicle accident called in by a passerby.

“Right at about 1 we had a call of a vehicle accident at Anderson School Road,” Sheriff Brad Anders told the Democrat. “While the deputies were en route there came another call about a potential burglary.

“A white male, whose name is being withheld pending notification of kin, tried invading a home on Anderson School Road, failed, then apparently ran to the back door of a home on Shire Road and busted into the residence. Pettis Deputies arrived minutes after the initial call to find a broken door and a dead man.”

The intruder had been shot dead by the homeowner.

On Sheriff Brad Anders’ social media announcement about the incident, there appeared to be one predominant community sentiment: FAF.

If you don’t know what it means, you’ll have to look it up, because I’m not going to print it here.

It’s a more vulgar way of saying, “stupid games win stupid prizes,” or “you get what you deserve.”

Many commenters congratulated, even celebrated the homeowner for killing the home invader. As days passed, a heated conversation began about the motives, morals and the mental health of the dead intruder. Most of that information is gossip, so I won’t pass it along.

I want to talk about FAFO.

I am a strong advocate for my constitutional right to bear arms and defend myself and my family with deadly force. I grew up fifteen miles away from the nearest police station and live about that far from law enforcement now, so I know how important it is to be able to protect myself when help might not be close at hand.

As a woman, I believe that firearm ownership coupled with good judgment and training can be a great equalizer, enabling my sex to defend ourselves against violent men who are naturally bigger and stronger than we. I believe if I were put in the same situation as the Sedalia homeowner was last week, I too would shoot to protect myself and my children. I pass no judgment on him, and very little on the dead man either, given what I have read about his circumstances.

But I cannot agree that a flippant, celebra-

tory attitude — FAFO — is an appropriate response to a tragedy that ends with one man dead and another compelled to kill him out of fear for his life.

We were not created to be friendly with death. It is against our human nature. We were made to hate death, to make war against it, and to take life only when it is absolutely necessary.

Killing another human being is the gravest act one can commit. Even when justified, the act of homicide does violence to the doer too.

It changes him, clinging to his soul for the rest of his life and whispering in unexpected moments: “What have you done? Your brother’s blood cries out to me from the ground!” It’s a whisper that many, soldiers and police especially, can never stop hearing.

In the Clint Eastwood film “Unforgiven,” the drunken young bounty hunter Schofield Kid brags to Eastwood’s character, repentant criminal Will Munny, about killing a vicious cowboy named Quick Mike: “I shot that *** three times! ... he went for his pistol and I blazed away. First shot, I got him right in the chest. Say, Will?

“Yeah.”

“That was the first one.”

“First one what?”

“First one I ever killed.”

The young man begins to cry, his pride mixing with shock and remorse for killing a man, even one who deserves it.

“It don’t seem real,” the kid sobs. “How he ain’t gonna never breathe again, ever. How he’s dead.”

“It’s a hell of a thing, killin’ a man,” replies Munny. “You take away all he’s got, and all he’s ever gonna have.”

“Yeah,” the kid replies. “Well I guess he had it coming”

“We all have it coming, Kid,” relies Munny.

There are only two types of people who delight in the death of another human being: psychopaths and the immature. I will not speculate who is who, but will only leave you with this: “God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living ... He fashioned all things that they might have being.” Wisdom 1:13-14

No room for government in the doctor’s office

Today, I respond to Doug Kneibert’s column regarding Amendment 3, which would enshrine the ability for a doctor to prescribe the best treatment for a patient, even if that treatment is anything that is otherwise called “abortion.” Mr. Kneibert seems to think things are always black and white. I, on the other hand, don’t see life, or “abortion,” that way.

I see a young woman, the niece of an out-of-town friend, whom I have known since she was a baby, who wanted a child, but who suffered, in the first three months – the first trimester – a miscarriage, as many women do.

Her doctor prescribed a drug designed to help her miscarriage be complete. With the drug, she experienced difficult nausea, cramps, pain – but the result was that her body expelled the dead fetus that would have caused an infection, possibly so severe that she would not be able to carry another child to term, if she were able to become pregnant in the first place. Fortunately for her and her family, she now has, a few years later, a baby who makes my sweet friend

and her husband’s family complete.

I see a friend whose pregnancy was not “normal” – an ectopic pregnancy. This means that her egg was fertilized in her fallopian tube. The tube would explode at some point, and most likely, she would have died. Of course, an ectopic pregnancy cannot be handled other than by a medical procedure that is technically an abortion.

I see my friend who was asleep in her apartment when an intruder broke in, held her at knifepoint, and raped her. She escaped by running, naked, to a neighbor’s apartment, and banging on the door until the neighbor heard her and let her in so that she could call the police.

She stayed at my house

for weeks, sleeping with the light on because she couldn’t handle being in the dark. As far as I know, she was not pregnant from that horrible episode, but had she received a positive pregnancy test, she would have been able to terminate the pregnancy, because Roe v. Wade guaranteed that she could.

I see a 14-year-old girl, raped by her father, who, now in the State of Missouri, would have had to carry a pregnancy to term and give birth to her half-sister. Under Roe v. Wade, she would have been able to terminate that pregnancy.

I see many women, who miscarry early, and who must have a D&C to scrape the uterus, ensuring that an infection or sepsis will not occur. Technically, a D&C is an abortion and could be banned in Missouri.

These are not fiction. These are real stories. And I have more. But right now, in our state, none of these women would be able to terminate a pregnancy – one that could have led to total infertility, one that could have killed the woman, one that would have caused her

to carry and deliver her rapist’s child, one that would have caused her to deliver her half-sibling.

These are scenarios we don’t want to see. But they happen. And to try to interfere with the physician-patient relationship and control these women’s medical decisions, and their lives, is wrong.

I don’t have a problem with anyone’s not liking abortion. I don’t know anyone who likes abortion. But I do know that not all pregnancies are Cinderella stories. A doctor should be able to advise a patient without interference from the government. The doctor’s office isn’t big enough for a woman in distress and the government.

I respectfully disagree with Doug Kneibert’s stance on allowing the government to determine what a woman – any woman – needs when she is pregnant. Women’s well-being is determined by their doctors and them in a physician-patient relationship. The government should butt out. And the voters should make sure that happens by voting in favor of Amendment 3.

Judge calls Ashcroft's characterization of abortion amendment 'unfair' and 'misleading'

Missouri Secretary of State Jay Ashcroft has been ordered to remove his characterization of an abortion rights amendment from his government website after a judge deemed it was unfair and violated state statute.

A Cole County judge on Thursday ruled that Ashcroft's "fair ballot language" summary of the reproductive rights amendment, also known as Amendment 3, was "unfair, inaccurate, insufficient and misleading."

"Intentionally of not, the secretary's language sows voter confusion about the effects of the measure," Circuit Judge Cotton Walker wrote in a Thursday afternoon decision.

The day Ashcroft certified the abortion-rights amendment for the Nov. 5 ballot, a "fair ballot language" summary for Amendment 3 was also published on his office's government website. That summary will also appear at every polling place around the state next to sample ballots. By state law this summary must be "true and impartial."

Ashcroft is vocal in his opposition to abortion. Amendment 3, if passed by a statewide majority vote, would establish the constitutional right to an abortion up to the point of fetal viability. Since the overturning of the U.S. Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe v. Wade in June 2022,

nearly all abortions became illegal in Missouri, with limited exceptions for the life and health of the mother.

It would also enshrine other reproductive rights in the constitution, including in-vitro fertilization and birth control, both of which remain legal in Missouri.

Ashcroft's summary of the amendment read: "A 'yes' vote will enshrine the right to abortion at any time of pregnancy in the Missouri Constitution. Additionally, it will prohibit any regulation of abortion, including regulations designed to protect women undergoing abortions and prohibit any civil or criminal recourse against anyone who performs an abortion and hurts or kills the pregnant women."

Abortion-rights activists in a lawsuit filed two weeks ago called Ashcroft's summary of the amendment harmful and confusing to voters.

Walker agreed, ruling that Ashcroft's assertion that the amendment would allow the right to an abortion at any point in pregnancy "gives voters the wrong idea of what the amendment will accomplish."

The secretary of state's office said in a statement that it is reviewing the judge's decision.

"Secretary Ashcroft will always stand for life and for the people of Missouri to know the truth," Jo-Donn Chaney, a spokesperson for Ashcroft, said Thursday afternoon.

Walker's decision came a day after a bench trial in

which both sides argued over what the amendment would mean for Missourians if approved by voters.

The brief trial was focused on language around provider immunity.

The amendment reads, in part, that no person "assisting a person in exercising their right to reproductive freedom with that person's consent be penalized, prosecuted, or otherwise subjected to adverse action for doing so."

Andrew Crane, a lawyer representing Ashcroft on behalf of the attorney general's office, argued Wednesday that the amendment would lead to "effectively neutering the government's ability to enforce any effective regulations" on abortion.

Such a claim was "politically-charged" and unfounded, since it fails to take into account other language in the amendment protecting patients, said Tori Schafer, an attorney with the ACLU of Missouri, which is representing the plaintiff.

Walker wrote that Ashcroft's argument runs "contrary to the language of the amendment and will give voters the mistaken impression that the amendment will allow physicians to perform abortions negligently or criminally."

The judge said Ashcroft's argument of provider immunity "ignores, with respect to health care providers, that the protection from prosecution (1) hinges on the patient's consent and (2) is coextensive with the right to reproductive freedom and

its regulation."

Walker on Thursday provided new "fair ballot language" to be posted on the secretary of state's website and at polling places. It reads:

"A 'yes' vote establishes a constitutional right to make decisions about reproductive health care, including abortion and contraceptives, with any governmental interference of that right presumed invalid; removes Missouri's ban on abortion; allows regulation of reproductive health care to improve of maintain the health of the patient; requires the government not to discriminate, in government programs, funding, and other activities, against persons providing or obtaining reproductive health care; and allows abortion to be restricted or banned after fetal viability except to protect the life or health of the woman."

The Amendment 3 lawsuit was filed by retired physician Dr. Anna Fitz-James, who initially filed the abortion rights initiative petition in spring 2023 on behalf of Missourians for Constitutional Freedom, the campaign behind the amendment.

"Missourians deserve the chance to vote on Amendment 3 based on facts," Rachel Sweet, campaign manager for Missourians for Constitutional Freedom, said in a statement following the decision. "And today's decision brings us one step closer to making that a reality."

Raines began work on the mural during the heat of the summer Aug. 5. She worked in the evenings when the building itself provided some shade.

“We weren’t able to work every day,” Raines said. “We had a few breaks. During the fair, the temperature was a little better so we could work a little longer but then we there were a few days we got rained out.”

Raines works teaching eighth through 12th grade art in Smithton, and was eager to finish before the holiday window painting season began.

“I do a lot of window painting,” Raines said. “That’s where it started originally. During COVID I was like looking for something to do, and I saw window painting. Someone else was doing it in another town and I was like, “Oh, I want to do that.”

Raines has painted murals at Ozark Coffee, the State Fair, Omni Tan, North Ohio at the train tracks and others.

Raines said she is even amazed by the body of work she has created.

“It makes me proud, and I know what it takes,” Raines said. “The hard work that has gone into that; the design and the planning.”

Her latest mural near the Sedalia Spay and Neuter Clinic is a tribute to Dr. Cheryl Albin, who worked at the Sedalia Spay and Neuter Clinic for many years.

“They’re going to put a bench in her honor and make this where it’s a usable space for people to walk their dogs,” Raines

said. “The phoenix in the center, that’s kind of their rebirth symbol.”

Bloom addd the new mural creates a new point of interest for the area.

“It’s partially to spread a little bit of love and joy,” Bloom said. “The other part is to honor Dr. Albin. We’re kind of like the dog and cat corner of the town with the grooming salon and the spay and neuter clinic, so it’s appropriate to have animals on the wall. And it’s a nice piece for people sitting at the train station to look at.”

Raines work has become a family affair. Her mom, Carla Brock, even moved to the area to help her daughter paint.

“She tells me what to do and it,” Brock said. “I’m a good filler-inner and keep her company, anyway. We talk and its quality time between me and her.”

Raines’ brother, Kyle Ragsdale lives in Los Angeles and contributes design work as well.

“He’s a graphic designer and helped me do the mockup,” Raines said. “So, we just did it all through the Internet, emailing each other and facetiming.”

After the huge mural, Raines is gearing-up for the busy holiday window-painting season.

“Last year I did 48 businesses for Christmas in Sedalia and the surrounding area,” Raines said. “I’ll do fall windows starting the beginning of September, then probably starting the beginning of November it’ll be winter and Christmas.”

The national average price of gasoline has fallen 4.6 cents per gallon in the last week, averaging \$3.28 a gallon on Thursday, Sept. 3. The national average is down 17.7 cents per gallon from a month ago and 50 cents per gallon lower than a year ago, according to GasBuddy data compiled from more than 11 million weekly price reports covering over 150,000 gas stations across the country.

Neighboring areas and their current gas

When you’re asking the county to help you giving this money, then you send a letter out like this? That is no way to get a deal done. I believe I could sit down with the commissioners and in 90 minutes have this deal solved with good negotiation and relationship building.”

Presiding commissioner Bill Taylor told the Democrat on Wednesday, Sept 4, that he was already fielding calls from his constituents about the city’s letter and every one had

supported the county’s side of the dispute.

“It’s just sad that the city spent some \$100,000 bucks suing the county and another \$15,000 to send these letters out,” Taylor said. “They won’t come and sit down with us. City Council, we can work some of this out, I think, if we can sit down and talk to each other. I just don’t understand the whole thought process of what’s going on down there. They act like we’re withholding their money, and it’s a

county tax. There was a ruling by judge, and it was a county tax. We have obligated \$200,000 to the Washington Street bridge. Once they do some work on that bridge, we’ll give them that money.”

Taylor said the county is obligated \$340,000 for street improvements, but the city won’t indicate where the funds would be spent, making the deal a non-starter for Pettis County.

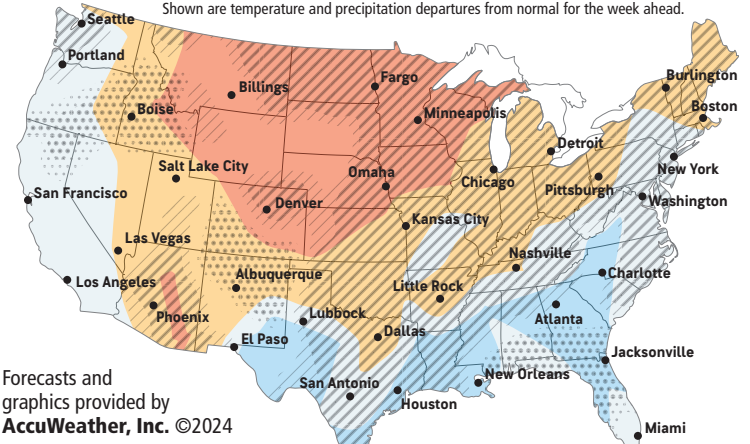

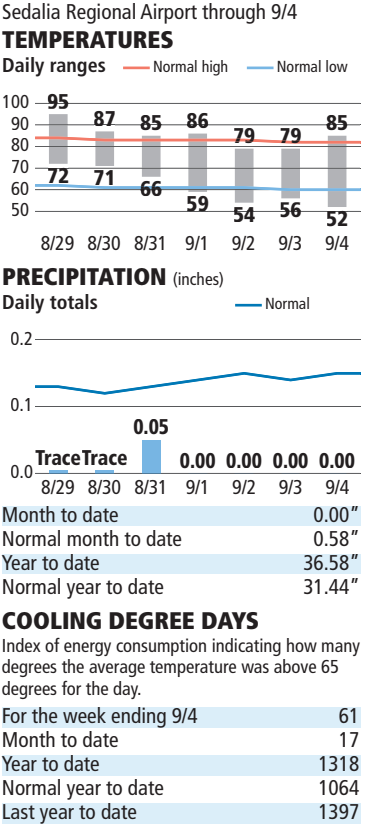

highlight play in center field when she made a diving catch to record an out in the third inning.

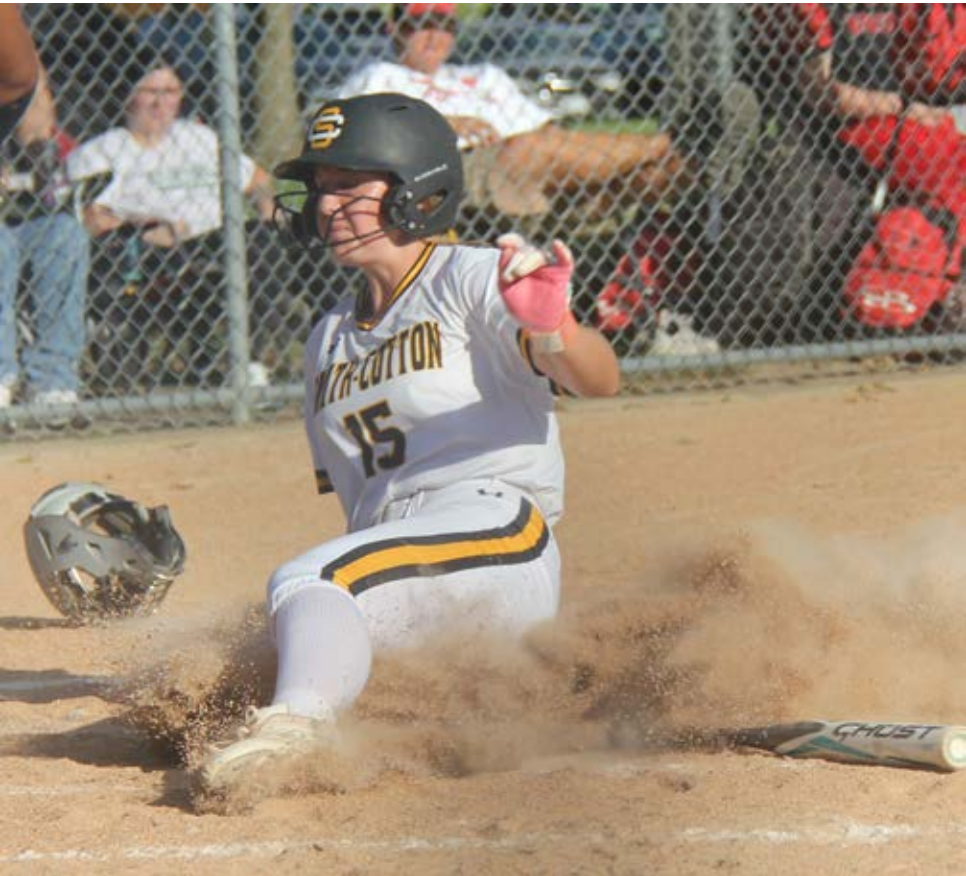

WINE FROM THE VINE

Missouri Wine – Show Me

This month’s article is a continuation of last months. Space limitations did not allow me to complete the article. Hopefully you had a chance to stop by the Missouri Wine Tent at the State Fair.

It was a great opportunity to taste a wide selection of Missouri Wines. The closest winery to Sedalia is Wildlife Ridge in Bahner, Missouri, about 10 miles southeast of Sedalia on state Route V and M intersection. It is open Wednesday through Sunday.

We discussed the history of Missouri wines last month. This month a few facts from the Missouri Wine Board: there is a \$3.2 billion economic impact, with 125 wineries, 875,700 wine-related tourists, 1,700 bearing acres of grapes, of 3-4 tons per acre, 424 grape growers, \$1 billion in wages, \$144 million in state taxes with 1.16 million gallons sold.

All grapes can produce dry to sweet wine, depending on the length of time left on the grape vine, how long the skins stay in contact with the juice, temperature at harvest (ice wine is an example), and fermentation process. Some descriptors we use are dry meaning very low sugars, tannins which vary from none to very high (the higher the tannins the more you get a dry mouth, but the better with beef and spicy dishes). Fruity can mean you taste the grapes and tannins are usually low with varying levels of sugar. Effervescent like Moscato or champaign varying from sweet to dry, and of course sweet which may be the result of adding sugar or by adjusting some of the above methods for obtaining sweet wines.

Now let’s look at the grapes. Remember juice can be mixed which we call a cuvee.

Grape name: what you see, what you smell, what you taste, what it feels like, and what it pairs with

Catawba: Strawberry juice, it has a sweet yet floral and woody taste, and is light and refreshing. Serve it with spicy cheeses, pork chops, cold cuts and light desserts.

Chamboucin: A classic red, violets, tastes like cherries and light oak, dark cherry meets earthiness, and soft tannins resemble a Pinot Noir. Serve it with meats, hamburgers, red sauce pasta.

Concord: Has a deep, dark plum, concord grape jam taste, its soft yet round, and also produced without alcohol and jams and jelly. Serve it with BBQ.

Norton: Is a dark ink color, and tastes like dark berries with light spices, dark fruit and spicy red fruits, its big and bold, with high tannins. Serve it with red meats, wild game, and BBQ.

Chardonel: Is lemony yellow, and comes from inside of the barrel or lemon, oak and citrus.. It’s full and dry. Pair it with almonds, creamy white cheese, and mushrooms.

Seyvel Blanc: Is golden white, light green to straw, and tastes like fresh herbs, clean crisp pear with a hint of spice. It’s medium bodied and dry. Pair it with grilled meat and vegetables.

Traminette: Looks like light green grass, its floral, citrus with a hint of spice. Pair it with chicken, cream gravy and sauces, curry and heavy seafood.

Vidal Blanc: Is straw colored, and tastes like a fresh summer garden, with flavors of apple and citrus fruits like lemon and grapefruit. It’s clean and full and pairs with seafood, poultry and fresh herbs.

Vignoles: Tastes like sunshine, with fresh cut tropical fruit, and an assortment of citrus and tropical fruits, light and soft> It is frequently done in a sweet or semi-sweet manner. Look for the blue bottles. It pairs with fresh fruit and spicy dishes.

Many thanks for the descriptors from the Missouri Wine and Grape Board.

Recipe for the month: Cream Biscuit “Shortcakes”

- 2 cups of all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoons kosher salt
- 3 tablespoons granulated sugar, divided
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 3 cups heavy cream

Heat oven to 425. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper or a silicone baking mat. In a medium bowl stir together flour, salt, 1.5 tablespoons sugar, baking powder. Drizzle in 1.5 cups of heavy cream and stir with a fork until mixture forms a shaggy dough. Press dough a few times with your hands until it comes together, Transfer to prepared baking sheet.

Former SFCC student writes memoir about living in Cameroon

Nonfiction author DeAnna Anderson, a former State Fair Community College student and previous Leeton resident, has written a memoir about living in the African country of Cameroon for six years.

Anderson’s information noted that the book recounts the adventures and misadventures, including harrowing encounters and humorous cross-cultural lessons she and her family experienced while living in Yaoundé, Cameroon.

On Wednesday, Sept. 4, Anderson spoke to the Democrat by phone from her home in Pleasant Hill. She said her book, “Scars & Souvenirs: A Memoir of an American Family Living Outside of the United States,” was released on Amazon on July 22. Anderson wrote a blog for 15 years, and the book is a compilation of some of those entries.

In the summer of 1994, while in high school, Anderson attended SFCC as a Summer Science Institute student. The program was for high schoolers preparing to enter their senior year. After graduation, she returned to SFCC for two semesters before transferring to the University of Central Missouri at Warrensburg, where she obtained a degree in tourism management.

Anderson, her husband David Anderson, and young sons Joshua and Jonah eventually moved to Cameroon on a mission-oriented trip with Wycliffe Bible Translators and lived there for several years.

While there, they did not translate, although David Anderson was their IT manager, and DeAnna Anderson wore many hats.

“I did a lot of different things,” DeAnna Anderson said. “I was involved with children’s education and I was also the orientation person for any new arrivals. I was giving them crash courses in the first four days

in hopes that they would not get sick or hurt. I was also a fill-in nurse for about two months.”

Anderson said she relied on the summer science classes she took at SFCC checks and administer Malaria prevention meds.

She added her book about living there starts off with a grave injury to her youngest son Jonah, who was seven at the time.

“It starts off with a bang, on purpose, because I wanted to really hook a reader from the very first paragraph,” DeAnna Anderson said. “Our youngest son had a horrible accident there — that’s what it starts off with.

Jonah almost completely severed his left ring finger and crushed his left middle finger. When this happened, the family found the Cameroon healthcare system was extremely insufficient compared to Western medicine.

Doctors at government hospitals in Cameroon often didn’t have degrees and were only called doctors because they had patients. Due to the healthcare system, Jonah was brought back to the States and seen at Children’s Mercy Hospital in Kansas City. A bone infection led to the amputation of his left hand.

Although this experience was harrowing for the family, they also have many good memories while living there. One was of the Anderson’s house help, Sophie, and another was watching their boys play with the local neighborhood children and getting a field trip together for youngsters to visit a real airplane.

“For us, she became like family,” DeAnna Anderson said of Sophie. “That was always a highlight of my day when she would show up. It was always customary to ask someone how they slept — you’d say, ‘Did you sleep well?’ And that person would respond.”

Sophie also taught

DeAnna Anderson the local language and shared life experiences with the family. One poignant moment was when Sophie brought some cocoa pods to Anderson, who loved cooking and baking, and asked her to make chocolate.

“That was a tall order,” DeAnna Anderson said. “But I researched it, and we started to look at the material together — It was about a week-long process ... and we created something chocolatesque. It was very gritty and not tasty.

“But we tried it,” she continued. “It was just one of those fun memories that her and I had together. I loved watching our boys go out and play with the children in our neighborhood ... We were the only non-Cameroonians in the neighborhood. So, our children would go out and play like all children do, and that was fun to watch.”

Anderson also noticed the neighbor children loved it when the planes would take off near the neighborhood. They would yell, “The plane, the plane.”

DeAnna Anderson said this memory was important to her because, as a child, she lived near Whiteman Air Force Base and often heard the planes take off, including the B-2 Spirit.

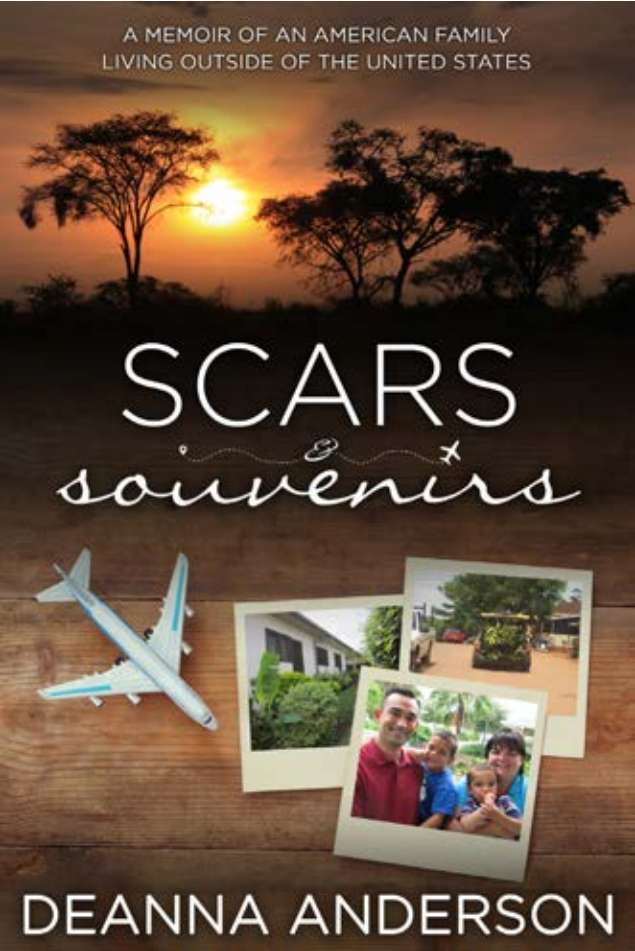
These memories prompted her to seek out a way to take them on a field trip. The airport was also where the plane for their organization had its hangar.

Through Wycliffe Bible Translators, Anderson organized a field trip for the children.

The children got to visit with a pilot and touch and see a small Cessna. Afterward, when planes would take off over the neighborhood, the children would shout, “The pilot, the pilot.”

DeAnna Anderson said that after the field trip, they realized a human was at the controls.

MEXICAN FOOD: MORE THAN CHIPS AND SALSA

The United States is a land of eclectic dining, but Mexican food is among the most popular cuisines. According to Pew Research, Mexican restaurants make up about 1 in 10 restaurants in America. While they're very common in California and Texas, about 85% of all U.S. counties have at least one Mexican eatery.

Pew also reports Mexican-Americans are the largest Hispanic group in the U.S., which could account for the popularity of Mexican cuisine. While it's typical for casual Mexican restaurants to offer chips and salsa to every table, the ethnic, vibrant cuisine is much deeper than a complimentary appetizer.

What Defines Mexican Food?

Ask, "What is Mexican food?" and you may be met with varied answers. There are common, almost stereotypical Mexican foods, like tamales and pico de gallo, but Mexican cuisine encompasses a wide variety of flavors and ingredients.

According to Moon, the roots of Mexican cuisine could be as old as the 15th century and primarily featured ingredients like squash, corn, beans, and chile peppers. When the Spanish settled the area, they introduced new ingredients and cooking methods, including onions, cheese, and rice. What we consider Mexican food today slowly emerged from the fusion of those two cultures.

Tex-Mex is a specific variant of "authentic" Mexican food and evolved as Texas residents discovered unique and flavorful dishes served south of the border and adopted them into their cuisine. They used items commonly found in local grocery stores, giving way to dishes like nachos, fajitas, and flour tortillas.

The Evolution of Mexican Food

Mexican food changes with the region. Southern Foodways points out dishes like "hot tamales" or "Delta tamales" became popular in the Mississippi Delta region in the early years of the 20th century. Theories on how such an iconic

Mexican food reached the isolated Delta vary. Some food historians even say they've been in the Delta since the mound-building Native Americans lived there.

Others believe soldiers brought the recipe with them after the Mexican-American War. Perhaps they arrived when Mexican laborers worked the cotton harvest alongside the resident African Americans. The recipe has changed a little in the intervening years, but hot tamales are still popular in the area, and "tamale stands" can be found from Vicksburg to Tupelo.

New Mexico's version of Mexican food features dishes like green chile sauce made from patented Hatch chiles bred in New Mexico State University in the '60s and '70s. Arizona has Sonoran-style Mexican, focusing on beef and producing dishes like the chimichanga. Nevada combines styles, as found in the Reno eatery, Bertha Miranda's, and its recipes from Chihuahua in northern Mexico. California Mexican is more health-conscious, with avocados, fish tacos,

and more vegetables in the mix. Ultimately, the styles reflect the local culture and readily available ingredients.

Fast Food Fuels Mexican Cuisine Popularity

According to historians at Ohio State University, the popularity of Mexican food in the United States spurred the first Taco Bell restaurant in 1962 in San Bernadino, California. Owner Glen Bell took influences from California-Mexican dishes to create his version of Mexican fast food, which eventually blossomed into more than 8,000 Taco Bell restaurants worldwide.

Taco Bell's food caters to white customers' tastes otherwise unaccustomed to spicy traditional Mexican dishes. It also offers familiar ingredients like ground beef, lettuce, and cheese, packaged in the then-exotic crispy taco shell. American diners were already familiar with rice and pinto beans, but Taco Bell offered refried beans, prepared differently with a similar taste.

After Taco Bell succeeded, more chains fol-

lowed. El Chico opened its first restaurant in 1940 and expanded to 16 restaurants. The now-defunct Chi-Chi's started in Minnesota in 1975, opening the same year as the Tex-Mex chain Chili's. Authentic, traditional Mexican cuisine tends to be reserved for smaller family-owned restaurants, which tend to find their home in cities, where cultures are more likely to stand out than blend.

The National Restaurant Association reports there were more than 749,000 restaurants in the U.S. in 2023. Based on Pew Research's report claiming that 1 in 10 American restaurants is a Mexican eatery, that adds up to an estimated 74,900 Mexican restaurants nationwide. However, that figure likely doesn't include Mexican food trucks and small Mexican grocery stores offering takeout.

Making Mexican at Home

As the popularity of Mexican food increases, homeowners replicate their favorite foods in their kitchens. Book retailers offer a range of Mexican-themed cook-


books, including works by celebrity chefs Rick Bayless and Pati Jinich, who specialize in Mexican cuisine.

Many towns either have Mexican grocery stores or grocery stores with an aisles dedicated to Latin foods and ingredients. Home cooks can now access more esoteric ingredients like nopal cactus, achiote seasoning, or masa harina. Stores also offer different dried chiles such as ancho, guajillo, Anaheim peppers, serrano, and more.

When asked about their favorite dish, Tiffany McCauley with Slappy Toad shares, "My favorite thing to order in a Mexican restaurant is queso for an appetizer and then enchiladas for my main meal. But my favorite Mexican dish to make at home is taco salad served with corn chips."

In many ways, that's the essence of Mexican cuisine: cook what you like with the authentic ingredients you may have on hand.

“We came in and did a lot of painting, did some moving of some walls and just remodeled a little bit,” Ramirez said. “The kitchen was ready to go, so that really helped us out a lot.”

There are simpler ways than canning to preserve your garden harvest

If you’ve had some gardening luck this summer, you’ve ended up with more homegrown food at the end of the season than you can eat before it spoils. So think about preserving your harvest and carefully consider safety. Many folks successfully cook fruits, vegetables and sauces and then can or process them for shelf-stable storage.

AP garden writer Jessica Damiano says her hat’s off to them. Canning requires specialized equipment and specific recipes to avoid food-borne illnesses. Damiano plays it safer and easier by freezing and drying herbs and produce rather than canning. She cooks her tomatoes and preserves them in the freezer. Herbs are also easy to freeze so you can use them all winter long.

If you’re lucky, you’ll find yourself with more homegrown food at the end of the season than you can consume before it spoils. Rather than waste your hard-earned bounty, it’s time to think about

preserving your harvest — and carefully consider safety.

Many folks successfully cook fruits, vegetables and sauces and “can” or process them for shelf-stable storage, and my hat’s off to them. I play it safe (and easy) by freezing and drying herbs and produce rather than canning, which, if not done properly with specialized equipment and specific recipes, can result in food-borne illnesses.

One year, after an excruciatingly hot September day spent outdoors washing, cutting, cooking, straining and processing jars of tomato sauce with my family, they nearly kicked me out. Sure, it was all fun and games for the first hour or two, but as the day progressed, I nearly had a mutiny on my hands. To make matters worse, I used a very deep pot over too-high heat and burned the whole batch. I envy those who have mastered the process.

Easy ways to preserve tomatoes

These days, I boil whole tomatoes for just a minute or two, remove them from the pot with a

slotted spoon and allow them to cool for a few minutes before removing their skins with my fingers. After cutting them into wedges, I pulse them in a food processor, then cook them on the stovetop for 30 minutes and salt to taste. When the sauce has cooled, I pour it into airtight, zipper-top freezer bags, Mason jars or plastic containers, allowing an inch of headspace for expansion.

If I have plans to use the sauce for pasta, I’ll add fresh basil and garlic cloves to the container so that it’s ready to go when I am. If I’m uncertain of the sauce’s fate, I’ll freeze it plain and season it as needed.

Another way I keep tomatoes is by freezing them whole, and it couldn’t be easier: I rinse each fruit, pat it dry and place as many as will fit into a gallon-size, zipper-top freezer bag. Freezing them whole not only preserves their flavor and texture but also makes it convenient to use them in soups, stews or other recipes. When I want to add tomatoes to a dish, I grab one from the bag, peel off its skin, which

removes easily, then drop the tomato in the pot and break it up with a spoon as it defrosts.

Herbs are even easier

Although they can be dried, my preferred method for preserving chives and flat-leaved herbs, like basil, parsley and cilantro, is to freeze them, either as whole leaves or chopped in oil infusions (directions below).

For the best flavor, harvest herbs in the morning, after the sun has risen but before the dew has dried. This is the time of day when their essential oils are most concentrated.

To freeze leaves for individual use, remove them from stems, rinse and pat dry, then spread on clean towels in a single layer until all the residual rinsing moisture has evaporated. Toss occasionally to ensure even drying. This may take a couple of days. Next, place leaves in a single layer on a cookie sheet and freeze overnight. Place frozen leaves in a zipper-top plastic bag and return to the freezer for future use. This method allows you to remove individual leaves as needed; skipping the evaporation step would

result in a frozen block that would be difficult to break.

Other ways to preserve herbs

To make oil infusions, remove leaves from stems, then rinse and pat dry with a clean towel or paper towel. Cut leaves into quarter-inch pieces using herb snippers (or clean, sharp scissors). Fill the compartments of a 1- or 2-ounce silicone freezer tray, such as the ones made by Souper Cubes, halfway with herb clippings, and fill the remainder of each compartment with the oil of your choice. Freeze overnight, then carefully pop individual cubes from the tray and store them in a zipper-top bag in the freezer.

Herbs can also be dried to keep them at room temperature. This is my preferred method for those with small, textured or needled leaves, such as thyme, sage, oregano and rosemary.

Rinse, remove from stems and set out in a single layer on clean towels to dry. Because the goal here is to dehydrate the leaves rather than allow only excess moisture to evaporate

from around and between them, the process will take considerably longer. Toss leaves daily. When they become crunchy, add them to clean jars or other sealable containers and store them as you would dry herbs from the store.

No-work pickles

And if you want to get really easy, try my no-effort refrigerator pickles. Most refrigerator pickles, which are shortcuts in their own right, require boiling a brine made from vinegar, spices, sugar and salt, and pouring it over sliced cucumbers in a jar, then refrigerating.

I skip all that and simply add my own sliced cucumbers to the brine that’s already in an empty jar of pickles. They’re delicious after 24 hours in the fridge and even better after 48 hours. You can get two batches out of that pickle juice. Why let it go to waste?

You may need to purchase a special permit if you collect, handle, breed, or process wild animals. For example, wildlife managers, researchers, taxidermists, dog trainers, collectors, and hobbyists need special permits. All special permits must be purchased at MDC headquarters in Jefferson City.

MDC HAS REGULATION CHANGES FOR FALL DEER, TURKEY SEASONS

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reminds hunters of regulation changes for the upcoming fall deer and turkey hunting seasons.

TURKEY CHANGES

Turkey permits will no longer be included with an archery permit.

A new fall turkey-hunting permit has been created. Both fall firearms turkey hunters and fall archery turkey hunters must purchase this permit to be able to take turkeys during fall.

The fall turkey season is now divided into archery and firearms portions, and the harvest limit has been reduced from four to two birds of either sex (both portions combined).

CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE UPDATES

Audrain, Boone, Cole, Dent, Douglas, Howard, Lewis, Maries, Monroe, Newton, Osage, Phelps, Randolph, Saline, Scotland, Shannon, Shelby and Webster counties have been added to the chronic-wasting-disease (CWD) Management Zone.

As with all counties in the CWD Management Zone, grain, salt products, minerals, and other consumable products used to attract deer are prohibited year-round. Hunters must also follow carcass transportation regu-

lations. All counties in the CWD Management Zone are open during the CWD portion of firearms deer season.

During Nov. 16–17, hunters who harvest a deer in designated CWD Management Zone counties must take the deer (or its head) on the day of harvest to a mandatory CWD sampling station.

OTHER UPDATES

The antler-point restriction has been removed from Audrain, Boone, Cole, Howard, Lewis, Maries, Monroe, Osage, Phelps, Randolph, Saline, Scotland, and Shelby counties.

Deer hunters may now fill four firearms antlerless permits in Dent, Douglas, Maries, Newton, and Phelps counties.

Hunters may now use archery antlerless permits in Dunklin, Mississippi, New Madrid, and Pemiscot counties.

New managed deer hunts have been added, and others have been removed or modified.

Deer hunting regulations have changed for some conservation areas.

Hunters may now use aerial drones to track wounded deer and turkeys.

Prices for deer and turkey hunting permits have increased.



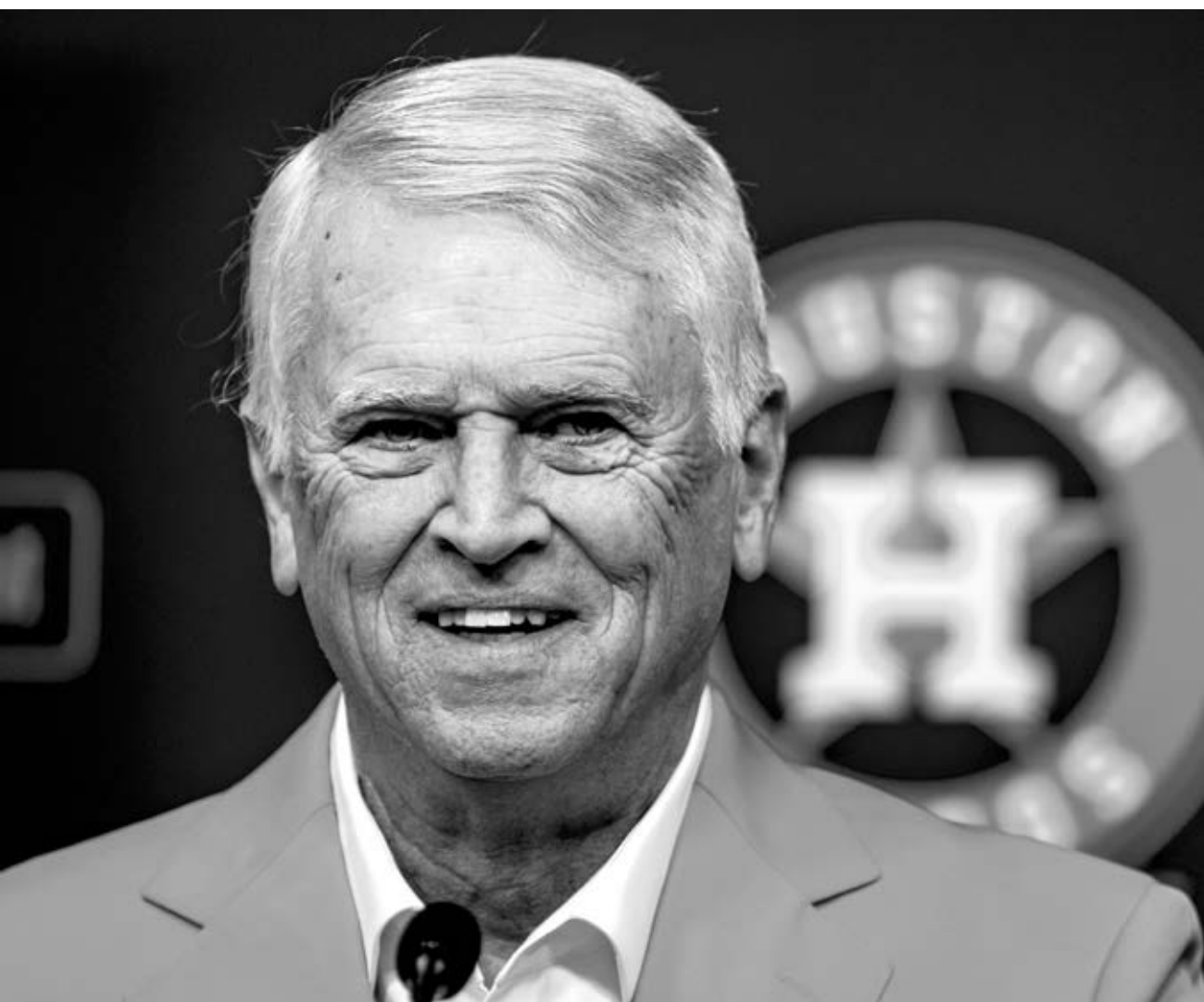

Hundreds of 'Game of Thrones' props are up for auction

After watching eight seasons of the epic saga "Game of Thrones," fans can now enter what may be a competition on par with the battle for the Iron Throne: an auction of prized memorabilia from the HBO series.

Fans can now bid on a slew of costumes, props, set pieces and memorabilia from the hit show that ended in 2019. More than 2,000 items — including a melted version of the coveted Iron Throne — distributed across 900 lots will be on the auction block in October through Heritage Auctions.

The starting bids range from \$500 to \$20,000 for items as iconic as Jaime Lannister's full suit of armor and sword to props as granular as prosthetic teeth used for the White Walkers.

Other notable items include Daenerys Targaryen's memorable cloaks, coats and leather ensembles (some that feature dragon chokers and accents) worn by Emilia Clarke, Jon Snow's notorious Longclaw sword wielded by Kit Harington, and the Hand of the Queen Pin donned by Peter Dinklage as Tyrion Lannister. Even items that didn't boast much screen time, like the bell wielded during Cersei Lannister's walk of shame or blood-stained garb from the infamous Red Wedding, are expected to draw fans' attention during bidding.

Jay Roewe, HBO's

senior vice president of global incentives and production planning, said the auction — a chance for fans to "grab a piece of history" — speaks to the staying power the series has had five years after its finale.

"Game of Thrones" was a zeitgeist moment in our culture. It was a zeitgeist moment in high-end television. It was a zeitgeist moment in terms of HBO," he said in an interview with The Associated Press. "This is something we all grew up with. It's impacted every single one of our lives. It's impacted the culture, and 'Game of Thrones' has meant something to every single person."

Although the series started in 2011 and several items in the auction date back to then, they have not been "collecting dust," Roewe said. HBO had been carefully preserving thousands of props, costumes and set pieces since the series began for use on potential spinoffs or sequels. With "House of The Dragon" having recently completed its second season and other projects firmly in development — while others have been discarded — Roewe said the studio now knows what they'll need to hold on to and what they can part ways with.

"These items have been curated and taken care of since we finished filming. They are the quality that they were when we finished filming, and we've had people working on them for years to keep

them in shape," he said. "We don't need them anymore. It's time to finally open it up to the world."

Beyond the preservation and quality of the items, the sheer scale of the auction required months of collaboration with HBO and countless hours of research and planning to organize, said Joe Maddalena, the executive vice president of Heritage Auctions.

Maddalena wanted to ensure fans and collectors didn't feel like there were any "glaring holes" in the collection by including a wide variety of characters' costumes and props, displayed in a 750-page catalog. There are even multiples of crucial items like Arya Stark's rapier Needle, of which there were several versions throughout the series' run.

The intricate nature and craftsmanship of the costumes and props are part of what make the show so memorable, Maddalena, a fan himself, said. Emmy-winning costume designer Michele Clapton has been praised since the series' start for the detailed and intentional designs that fueled storylines. The catalog features interviews with Clapton, showrunners David Benioff and D.B. Weiss and several of the cast members commenting on the episode-specific usage and significance of hundreds of the items. Maddalena called this kind of access and information "uncharted territory" in the auction world.

The plot to attack Taylor Swift’s Vienna shows was intended to kill thousands

BERLIN — The suspects in the foiled plot to attack Taylor Swift concerts in Vienna earlier this month sought to kill “tens of thousands” of fans before the CIA discovered intelligence that disrupted the planning and led to arrests, the agency’s deputy director said.

The CIA notified Austrian authorities of the scheme, which allegedly included links to the Islamic State group. The intelligence and subsequent arrests ultimately led to the cancellation of three sold-out Eras Tour shows, devastating fans who had traveled across the globe to see Swift in concert.

CIA Deputy Director David Cohen addressed the failed plot during the annual Intelligence and National Security Summit, held this week in Maryland.

“They were plotting to kill a huge number — tens of thousands of people at this concert, including I am sure many Americans — and were quite advanced in this,” Cohen said Wednesday. “The Austrians were able to make those arrests because the agency and our partners in the intelligence community provided them information about what this ISIS-connected group was planning to do.”

Austrian officials said the main suspect, a 19-year-old Austrian man, was inspired by the Islamic State group. He allegedly planned to attack outside the stadium, where upwards of 30,000 fans were expected to gather, with knives or homemade explosives. Another 65,000 fans were likely to be inside the venue. Investigators discovered chemical substances and technical devices during a raid of the suspect’s home.

Austria’s interior minister, Gerhard Karner, previously

said help from other intelligence agencies was needed because Austrian investigators, unlike some foreign services, can’t legally monitor text messages.

The 19-year-old’s lawyer has said the allegations were “overacting at its best,” and contended Austrian authorities were “presenting this exaggeratedly” in order to get new surveillance powers.

Swift broke her silence about the cancellations last week after her London shows had concluded.

“Having our Vienna shows cancelled was devastating,” she wrote in a statement posted to Instagram. “The reason for the cancellations filled me with a new sense of fear, and a tremendous amount of guilt because so many people had planned on coming to those

shows.”

She thanked authorities — “thanks to them, we were grieving concerts and not lives,” she wrote — and said she waited to speak until the European leg of her Eras Tour concluded to prioritize safety.

“Let me be very clear: I am not going to speak about something publicly if I think doing so might provoke those who would want to harm the fans who come to my shows,” she wrote.

Swift’s publicist did not immediately return a request for comment Thursday.

Concert organizer Barracuda Music said it canceled the three-night Vienna run that would have begun Aug. 8 because the arrests made in connection to the conspiracy were too close to showtime.

The main suspect and a

17-year-old were taken into custody on Aug. 6, the day before the cancellations were announced. A third suspect, 18, was arrested Aug. 8. Their names have not been released in line with Austrian privacy rules.

The shows in London, the next stop after Vienna, came on the heels of a stabbing at a Swift-themed dance class that left three little girls dead in the U.K. In a statement issued after the Southport attack, Swift said she was “just completely in shock” and “at a complete loss for how to ever convey my sympathies to these families.” News outlets reported that Swift met with some of the survivors backstage in London.

The Vienna plot also drew comparisons to a 2017 attack by a suicide bomber at an Ari-

ana Grande concert in Manchester, England, that killed 22 people. The bomb detonated at the end of Grande’s concert as thousands of young fans were leaving, becoming the deadliest extremist attack in the United Kingdom in recent years.

Cohen on Wednesday praised the CIA’s work in preventing the planned violence, saying that other counterterrorism “successes” in foiling plots typically go unheralded.

“I can tell you within my agency, and I’m sure in others, there were people who thought that was a really good day for Langley,” he said, referring to the CIA headquarters. “And not just the Swifties in my workforce.”

The record-smashing tour is on hiatus until the fall.

Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson discusses new memoir, ‘Lovely One’

NEW YORK — In one of her first public appearances on behalf of her newly published memoir, “Lovely One,” Supreme Court Justice Ketanji Brown Jackson didn’t make a lot of news, but she did make a little history: She can add her name to James Brown, Stevie Wonder and Smokey Robinson among others as someone who has sung at the Apollo Theater.

Reminiscing Tuesday night with interviewer Gayle King about her love for musical theater, Jackson ably crooned a few lines from “The Wiz” — “When I think of home, I think of a place/Where there’s love overflowing” — and threw in a favorite chant from “Schoolhouse Rock” — “I’m just a bill, yes I’m only a bill. And I’m sitting here on Capitol Hill.”

The capacity audience at the famed Harlem performance center cheered and sang along.

King had promised — and kept her promise — to focus on Jackson’s personal story and not on the law. Jackson discussed her childhood in Miami, the origins of her name (It means “lovely one,” the book’s title), her undergraduate years at Harvard University, her interracial marriage to Dr. Patrick Jackson — who was in the audience Tuesday night — and her rise through the court system, culminating in 2022 when she became the first Black woman on the Supreme Court. “A roaring ocean” in her ears is how she

remembered the call from President Joe Biden, asking her if she would agree to fill the vacancy left by retiring Justice Stephen Breyer, for whom she had once clerked.

Jackson explained Tuesday that she had been interested since she was a girl, when she and her father, Johnny Brown, would sit together at the dining room table, she with coloring books and he with law books he was studying at the time. Her ambition grew in middle school after she learned about Constance Baker Motley, the first Black woman to serve on the federal judiciary.

“I remember this kinship with this fantastic woman,” Jackson told King. “I thought, ‘Why stop at law? I could be a federal judge.’”

Jackson’s book, 405 pages, combines family history, legal history and personal history as she narrates her own improbable journey — a Black woman rising to the highest court in a country where segregation was legal well into the 20th century. “Lovely One” often reads as a kind of lesson, or roadmap, what Jackson calls in the preface “a testament for young women, people of color, and strivers everywhere, especially those who nourished outsized ambitions and believe with stubborn faith in the possibility of achieving them.”

She endured aggressive questions from Republican senators during her confirmation hearings and she currently serves on one of the most conservative and divisive courts in U.S. history, casting dis-

senting votes on such landmark rulings as the granting of partial legal immunity for former presidents. But Jackson avoided naming names — beyond noting that Sen. Ted Cruz, the Texas Republican, attended law school with her — or pointing fingers in her book, and resisted Tuesday night when King pressed her to cite even one justice she had clashed with.

“I’m not going to answer that question,” she said, laughing.

When King asked if justices socialized, Jackson responded, “There are opportunities to have lunch.”

Jackson spoke of remaining calm during the confirmation hearings, thanks to her resolve, her preparation and to political realities. The White House worked with her at length in advance, helping her anticipate questions that might otherwise have upset her. One aide had advised she had a choice: “You can get angry or you can be a Supreme Court justice.” Jackson also welcomed another suggestion: Meet with the senators before the hearings.

“They were all lovely. Person to person they were courteous, they were respectful,” she said Tuesday night. “It was ... super helpful in the hearings, because we had had conversations. So I said, ‘Oh, I see. You’re not really talking to me’ — right in my head, as I’m listening to them — because we had talked. ‘You must be talking to your constituents or to someone else.’”

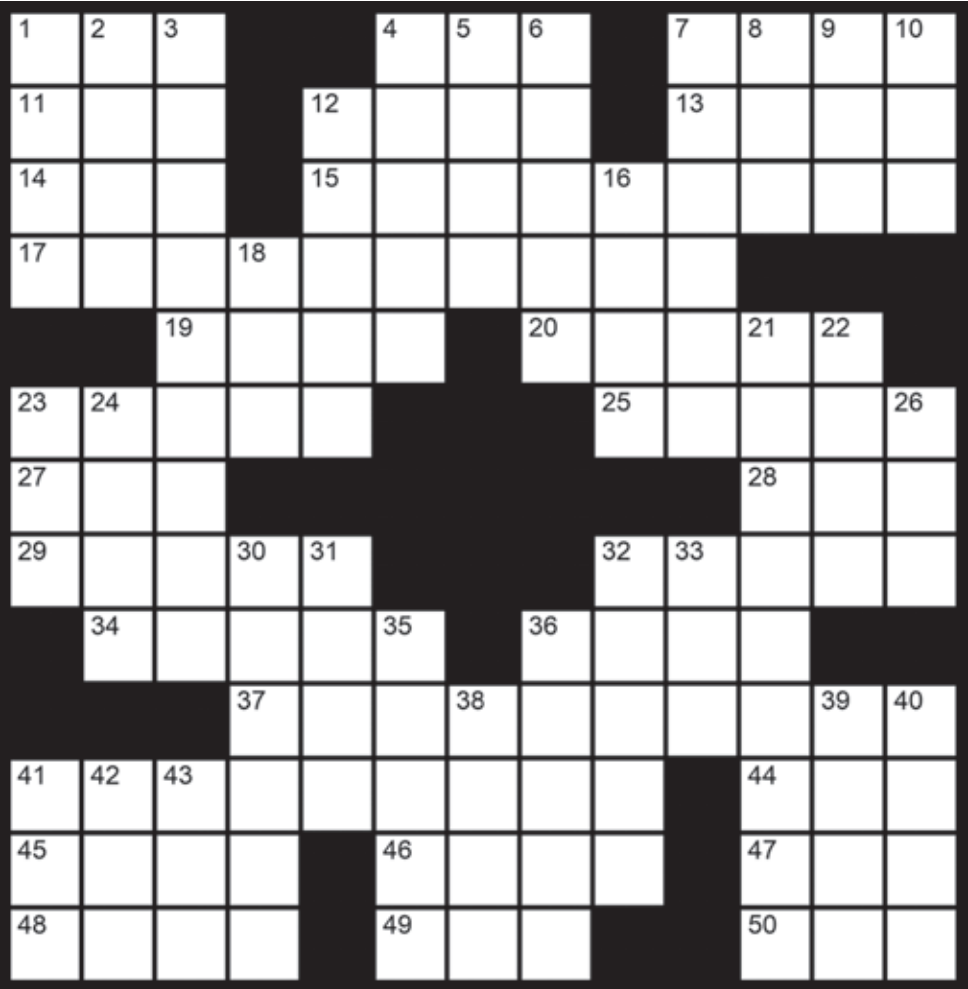

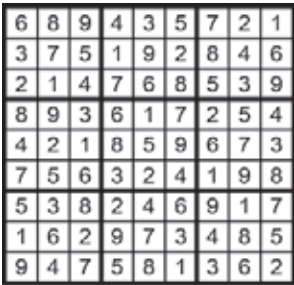
