SFCC Occupational Therapy program gifts switch-adapted toys to Loftus Early Childhood Center

Loftus Early Childhood students had the chance to try out switch-adapted toys designed and gifted by the State Fair Community College Occupational Therapy Program on Wednesday, Nov. 20.

SFCC students, faculty, family members and Loftus children attended an event that unveiled the new toys.

Katelyn Milberg, a certified occupational therapy assistant and an OTA instructor at State Fair Community College, spearheaded the program to demonstrate the power of inclusive play.

“What we’re doing today is a switch-adapted toy event with our State Fair Community College OTA program,”

Milberg said. “They’ve completed evaluations with these kiddos and followed them all semester long. We’ve created switch-adapted toys specific to the kid’s needs, likes, interests and abilities.”

Children were gifted toys that Katelyn Milberg and her husband Derek Milberg modified to be operated with an easy-to-use wired-in switch.

A simple touch of the custom switch engages the toy and helps foster development in children with diverse needs.

“They’re all bought, and my husband and I soldered them, switch adapted them and made them universally acceptable so anybody can play with them no matter the ability,” Katelyn Milberg said.

Light Up Liberty displays to be switched on Friday evening

Crews with Sedalia Parks and Recreation were busy early Thursday, Nov. 20, putting finishing touches on displays for Light Up Liberty.

Supervisor Steve Moon and his crew were hanging lights from the shelter on Liberty Park pond while other workers ran for more extension cords.

The display opens on Friday, Nov. 22.

“This is like my fourth year doing it,” Moon said. “It has grown quite a bit, probably 10 or 12 new displays just this year.”

Moon has been working on the holiday light show since Nov. 1 and he said nice until Thursday’s cold snap made this year’s lighting of the park easy on his crew.

“They would come and go, but there was three of us constantly,” Moon said. “The rest of the crew brought everything out to us to help every now and then because they had other things to take care of.”

Newly installed in-ground electrical connections for the displays made the wiring easier and safer.

“In years past it was fairly hard, last year was the first year that we’ve got the new pedestals, which made it a lot easier,” Moon said. “But yeah, years past we had the stuff

in the ground, and we had to bring it out and get it all plugged in. It was kind of yeah nasty.”

Anyone who has decorated a Christmas tree knows it can be labor intensive and the drive-through light display is

just one of many complex features at Light Up Liberty.

“Everything is pretty much time-consuming,” Moon said. “Probably the hardest thing is to get everything plugged into where we don’t have a

whole bunch of extension cords laid out everywhere.”

For the remainder of the year, cars will proceed in a long line through the park, enjoying the seasonal light show.

Sedalia to consider naloxone vending machines to fight rising opioid deaths

Pettis County Health Center staff proposed a program intended to reduce opioid deaths during the Monday, Nov. 18 Sedalia City Council meeting.

Pettis County Health Center mental health coordinator Dawn Williams stood before the council to request a portion of the money due to Sedalia after a landmark opioid settlement.

The primary portion of the proposal suggests outdoor, temperature controlled harm reduction vending machines containing

naloxone be placed Sedalia City Hall, the Pettis County Community Health Center and a to-be determined location.

“As dedicated community leaders, we have witnessed the devastating impact of the opioid epidemic firsthand,” Williams said. “The rising overdose rates in our community are more than statistics; they represent families being torn apart, lives lost and a community in pain.”

Williams urged community leaders to work together to eliminate needless deaths due to the fentanyl epidemic.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of West Central Missouri has named Patrick Stewart as its new Chief Executive Officer.

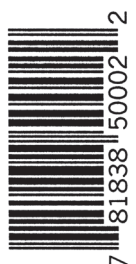
Stewart, who has been interim director since July, will become full-time in December.

"They just hit the switch, tap a button and it functions as it should."

Katelyn Milberg's OTA students gathered information on the types of toys the Loftus children might react to before purchasing and rewiring individual toys.

"We collaboratively chose toys and then broke them apart, soldered them and then made a switch for them," Katelyn Milberg said.

Derek Milberg played an elf Wednesday and saw the hard work he put in pay off in the children's smiles as they learned to control their new toys.

"It was incredible, it was absolutely incredible," Derek Milberg said. "I was very anxious to see how

they would react, and this is absolutely amazing. It's great to see all the people that came together to do this, and I hope we can keep doing this over the next several years."

Derek Milberg credits Katelyn Milberg with the simplicity of the switch-adapted toys.

"She's started this project and told me that she was going to buy some toys that we needed to switch-adapt them for these kids," Derek Milberg said. "I volunteered to help her with that. She helped deconstruct the toys to where all the circuit boards are, the wires, and see what would be needed to get some new switch-adapted connections. She made the 3-D printed switch-adapted buttons, and I assisted with stripping all the wires and

connecting them to the right parts of the circuit boards."

A special appearance by Santa and Mrs. Clause, SFCC OTA instructor Rebecca Thornberry and her husband Heath Thornberry, added to the festivities as they posed with Loftus students and admired their newly interactive gifts.

"I would like for this project to be a continuation that we can expand and build on in the future and make play possible for kids of all abilities," Katelyn Milberg said.

Tyson vs. Paul was a great moment in American sport

My husband and I were two of the 108 million people who tuned in for the Mike Tyson vs. Jake Paul boxing match on Nov. 15.

Like the rest of America, we waited through the long undercard, winced at the vicious Katie Taylor vs. Amanda Serrano matchup, and cussed a little at the glitchy Netflix broadcast. When the time finally came for the headliners to touch gloves, I did not really know what to expect.

Tyson is a sporting figure that looms large in my childhood memories: Iron Mike, the baddest man on the planet, the mad dog who bit off Evander Holyfield's ear. Fierce and unpredictable. Who in their right mind would want to challenge him?

But, on the other hand, as my ten-year-old daughter quipped: "I get believing in yourself ... but he's also 60." (Tyson is actually 58.) Eventually biology catches up to us all, and it's usually a little quicker than we'd care to admit.

Tyson is an ancient in regard to the sporting world, and while Jake Paul is a ridiculous blowhard, he's a blowhard who has the KO power to back up his claims. Our kids had heard the hype about the match through the elementary school grapevine, and they asked to be allowed to watch. I said no. It was past their bedtime, and I feared it would be so personal and so violent that it would affect them mentally.

Boy, was I wrong.

The match went all eight rounds. There was no swift knockout, no ear biting, no graphic violence. In fact, the fight was so mild that it made some viewers angry. The social media chatter the next day was full of jokes and put-downs. The word "boring" was thrown around. Many people claimed the match was rigged. But I do not think it was boring or rigged. I think the naysayers were looking for raw power and excitement, and so they missed the subtle splendor unfolding right under their very noses. I think this was a great moment in American sport.

As soon as the two men got in the ring together, it was clear that Jake Paul was in better shape. Tyson is no slouch, but he looked like an older man. Paul looked like a young man in his physical prime, and he is. But I looked a little further, into the eyes of each fighter. What I saw in Paul's eyes was awe. And fear. This swaggering egotist, who had trash-talked Tyson, baited him at the weigh-in, even peacocked into the arena with a ridiculous entourage, was afraid of the slightly stooped

60-year-old in the other corner. What an archetype! We all know a young man who runs his mouth incessantly to disguise his lack of self-confidence, and we all love to hate him.

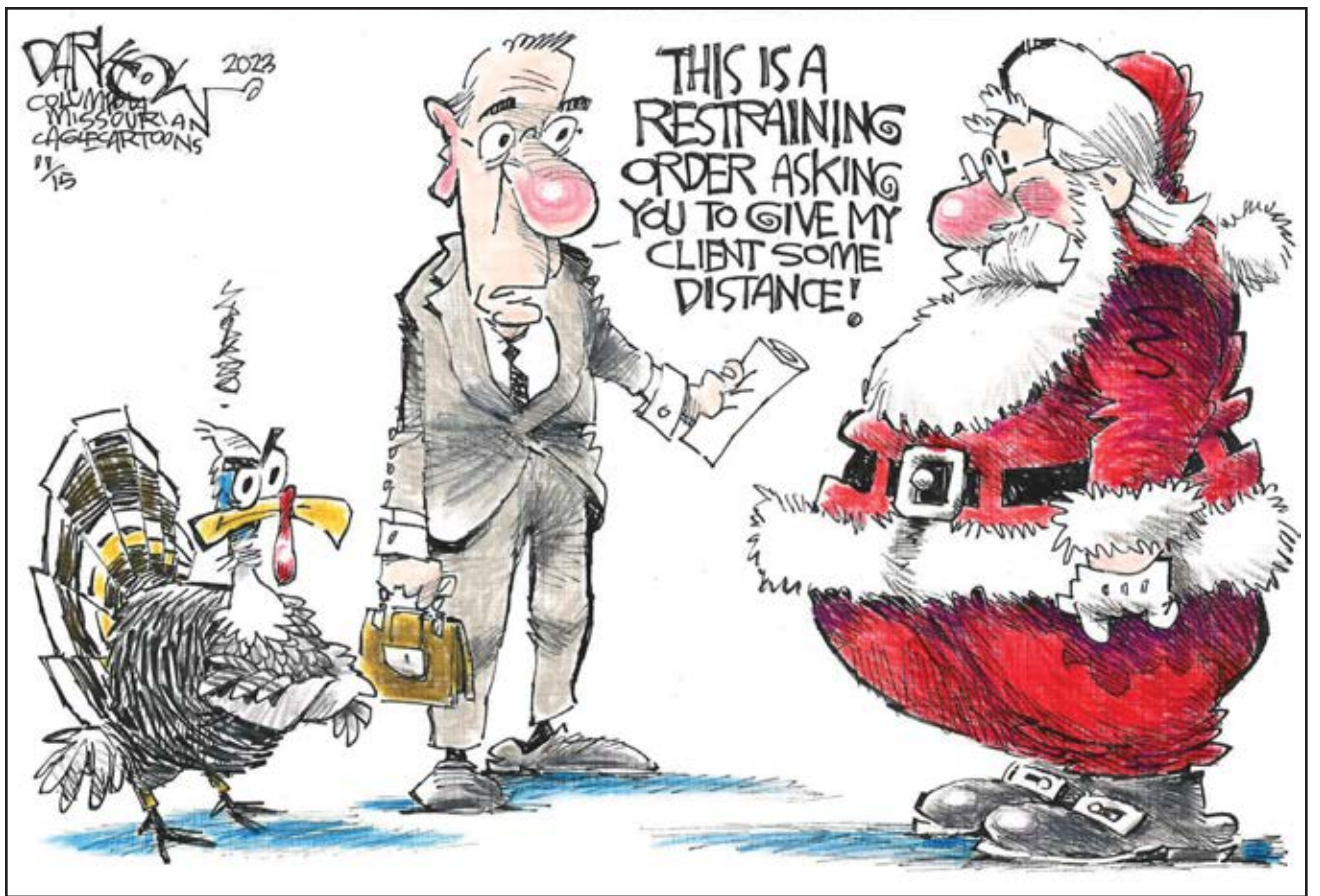
Tyson, by contrast, had no fear and no pretense. He entered the arena without fanfare. His eyes showed nothing. He had the look of another archetype, the world-weary man who has done this all before, so many times that he has finally mastered his passions. And it seems he had. His vicious alter ego had been tamed, and while that's bad for an entertaining boxing match, that's good for a man. Instead of biting Paul's ear, he bit his glove over and over again. It seemed like a coping mechanism.

Mike Tyson never even had a chance to win. His legs began to wobble shortly after the bell rang. He landed only 18 of 97 punches. If Paul had not been filled with wonder and awe, he might have knocked the legend clean out in the first round. But he did not, and many viewers were upset about it. Later, Paul admitted to the press, "I wanted to give the fans a show but I did not want to hurt someone that didn't need to be hurt."

We did not see a fantastic fight. But for those with eyes to see, it was an unparalleled story of personal growth. In one corner, a pompous young man learned both healthy fear and respect for his elders. He made an unpopular but truly manly decision to be merciful rather than crush his opponent. In the other corner, a grizzled old man showed the world and himself that he'd got one last fight in him. He demonstrated that age does not preclude strength, that anger can be subordinated to self-control, and that a man can change his very nature with hard work and hard-won experience.

None of it was glitzy. None of it was exciting. None of it made for particularly good television. But it was a master class in what it means to be a man. Flashy fights are a dime a dozen. You're never going to see as great a life lesson as Tyson vs. Paul again.

Through other eyes

If you have not read "James," I recommend that you do.

"James" is a re-telling of "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" through the eyes of Jim, the slave who escapes with, and saves the life of, Huck Finn, one of Mark Twain's most interesting characters.

I assume all of us of a certain age remember reading "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" in ninth grade, but I recently heard that Twain's epic about a young boy who attempts to escape civilization by sailing down the Mississippi River on a raft accompanied by a runaway slave is no longer required reading by high school students.

I find solace in that they probably would not read it anyway. I make this assumption based on my teaching students from ages 18 through 50, most of whom tell me that they do not read books.

Back to "James" and its origins. I hadn't read "Huckleberry Finn" in decades, so I chose it as my 2017 book club selection. It was interesting to read it through adult eyes.

I think that as a kid, I was in love with the romance of floating down the Mississippi on a raft, regardless of the dan-

gers of the current and the huge steamboats that could destroy a raft in a second.

Way back then, I also laughed at "the stories in the story" about the Duke and the King. I was too young to know that Mark Twain was making unmerciful fun of the ability of swindlers to rookie-do (my mother used that word, so it must be a word) unsuspecting – and non-discerning – humans. It wasn't until I took a Mark Twain class in college that I understood Twain was pointing out the susceptibility of people to the P.T. Barnums of the world – you remember? "There's a sucker born every minute."

As an adult, though, I was taken aback by its dark humor and misanthropy. Despite those things, "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" stands as an unambiguous statement regarding slavery and race in

general, education and lack thereof, wealth and stature and lack thereof, and human nature during the period just before the Civil War.

Though the book is set in Missouri, half slave and half free, I imagine these themes held true in most of the rural and southern United States during the 1850s.

The book has withstood the test of time, reminding us of America's history 150 years ago. Attempts to ban the book because it contains the "N" word have generally failed. Although that epithet is disgusting, it's a part of our past, and to forget it or try to hide it would be wrong. "Huckleberry Finn" reminds us of a particularly dark time in our history, but one we must remember so as not to repeat those mistakes.

Now, along comes "James," telling the story in a new light, but emphasizing "Huckleberry Finn" themes. We see everything that happened in "Huckleberry Finn," but through the eyes of Jim, the slave on the run, who felt a particular responsibility for Huck's safety.

We see that Jim is not only aware of, but also scorns, the antics of the smarmy Duke and King, as well as the silly

people who swallow their slippery tales. In "James," Jim is more savvy than Huck and the people they meet on their journey down the river.

During their time on the water, Jim and Huck are separated several times, by fate, weather, and missteps. In "Huckleberry Finn," we see what happens to Huck during those separations; in "James," we see what happens to Jim during those same times. Jim's solo adventures are no less dangerous than Huck's, but in a totally different way. Should Huck be caught, he would be sent home. Should Jim be caught, he would be lynched. The disparity is overwhelming.

The ending of the book is startling, as Jim's character, beaten to submission, disregarded as property, and broken by the sale of his family, becomes clear – and unexpected.

"James" is well worth the read and is thought-provoking.

What would it be like if we tried to see others' lives through their eyes? Through their experiences?

Maybe we would be nicer to each other. We should try it sometime.

A time for thanks: Farmers and ranchers keep the plates full

When you look at the calendar, it is clear the "holiday sprint" is about to begin. There are groceries to buy, events to plan for Thanksgiving, and children everywhere are drawing up their Christmas lists. Squeeze in the upcoming Missouri Farm Bureau Annual Meeting from December 8-10 at the Lake of the Ozarks, and it seems like the pages are getting ripped off the daily calendar at an extraordinary rate.

As we approach the five-week holiday dash that starts with a day of thanks and gratitude, it is important to share our appreciation for the thousands of Missouri farmers and ranchers who continue to show up. In this time of uncer-

tainty, it brings a level of peace and comfort to know that farmers and ranchers continue to lace up their boots every morning and put in long hours to provide the plentiful food supply that our nation and world rely on.

That hard work was once again reflected in the American Farm Bureau Federation's 39th annual Thanksgiving dinner survey, released earlier this week. While this is merely a snapshot of the cost of a Thanksgiving dinner for 10, the overarching results point back to the general state of the economy through times of highs and lows. This year, the survey results that were collected by Farm Bureau members nationwide showed a decline in prices for the second straight year from a

2022 all-time high. The total price of a classic holiday feast for 10 dropped to \$58.08, or about \$5.80 per person.

Despite fewer turkeys being available due to the overall flock's battle with Avian influenza, the average American will see about a six percent drop in their main course price this November. Also down are items such as frozen peas (8.1 percent), a gallon of milk (14.3 percent), sweet potatoes (26.2 percent), and fresh vegetables such as carrots and celery (6.4 percent). Processed foods such as cubed stuffing mix and dinner rolls saw modest upticks.

While the grocery store bill might not be as high for a get-together this holiday season, farm families and all Ameri-

cans are still being impacted greatly by higher prices. Even though inflation growth has slowed down, consumer prices are not coming down. The cost of food has gone up 28% since 2019. As we approach the end of 2024, we are all too aware that inflation continues to impact family budgets.

This Thanksgiving, I'm thankful for the thousands of Missouri farmers and ranchers who put in long hours to provide the plentiful food supply that our nation and world rely on. In a world that rarely stops to notice, let's take a breath to think of all the hands that helped keep our plates full.

“And not duplicate services,” Stewart said. “But just enhance the overall Club experience and expand our reach. We do have a good net cast into multiple communities, but we want to serve more kids and serve them more often.”

Currently, the BGCWCM serves 12 club sites in Sedalia, Cole Camp, Dres-

den, Fayette, Green Ridge, La Monte, Leeton and Smithton.

“We want to make sure we walk before we run, of course,” Stewart said. “Other communities have reached out and are asking for clubs in their communities. But we want to be strategic about it. We’ve got to have a plan behind it, and make sure it’s sustainable for all parties.”

Stewart said he and his family are excited to be part of the Sedalia and area community.

“Because wherever we’ve been, we’ve always been vested not only in our immediate family but also in our sphere of influence, which is our community,” Stewart said. “Already, the community is showing to be very welcoming, and we’re very appreciative of that.”

"It's just all day long, even during the day even they come through here," Moon said. "I understand that at night there's bumper to bumper traffic, especially for the first week or so."

Moon and his crews were finished early Thursday and ready for Light Up Liberty to begin Friday.

"Everything is up ready to go, we're just doing little odds and ends like putting a few lights around the fishing dock here," Moon said. "But as far as that goes everything's ready to go, we need to plug it in and check them and then after that it's set."

Parks and Recreation Director Amy Epple told the Democrat the Liberty Park event has been very successful due to faithful employees like Savannah Lynde and Moon, who is

retiring after this year. "Light Up Liberty is growing every year," Epple said. "We're expanding, we really want to make it go all the way down to the Heckert and you make your own way down Liberty Park Boulevard. We had a 10-year master plan for it, we're getting there halfway there and we're happy with where we're at and happy with what's going to be coming down the road."

Storage is a large concern as the displays are big and there are more displays each year. The cost is supported by area sponsors.

"We're excited and couldn't have done it without the sponsors," Epple said. "Every year we have more sponsors step up and then we have our repeat sponsors as well."

For parks crews the lighting of Liberty Park is a labor of love.

"It's a lot of work," Epple said. "The guys are out there putting them

in one place and then you're changing them, then you're going in and making sure the bulbs are working in the mornings and at night they're out there checking them. But they really love it, they love hearing all the positive feedback."

Those wanting to sponsor a display are encouraged to reach out early as the process of getting a display built and ready is lengthy.

"They just reach out to the Parks Department," Epple said. "We always kick it off in July with 'Christmas in July' activities and start looking for sponsors then, because really, we've got to have everything ordered and ready to go by Labor Day."

A new feature this year will be a huge electronic Christmas Tree that will blink in time with music.

"You'll pull into it, you can put on a radio station and music's played to the lights so it's a light show," Epple said. "So that's our

big, brand-new display for this year."

Thursday, crews were still working on the tree which may have more features added as time will allow.

"We'll have the majority of it up this year," Epple said. "Not all of it, we'll be adding even more next year but because of the stadium construction it kind of put a little dent in what we could do in front of the stadium this year."

Light Up Liberty is scheduled for a switch-throwing ceremony Friday, Nov. 22 at 5 p.m.

Liberty Park mascot Libby the Squirrel is slated to throw the switch that will Light Up Liberty.

"It's free for anyone to drive through and enjoy through the whole holiday season," Epple said.

Light Up Liberty is scheduled to operate 5:30 p.m. to midnight.

According to Williams, Missouri recorded 1,948 total deaths caused by opioid overdose last year. Pettis County recorded six

Williams added the numbers are like higher because opioid deaths are often underreported by coroner's.

In Missouri last year, there were 1,404 deaths related to fentanyl.

"As you can see, fentanyl is one of the key contributing causes to overdose," Williams said. "Naloxone is a medicine

that rapidly reverses an opioid overdose. It is an opioid antagonist which attaches to the opioid receptors and reverses and blocks the effects of other opioids. Naloxone can quickly restore normal breathing to a person that their breathing has slowed or stopped due to an overdose."

First responders carry doses of naloxone, which is a prepackaged nasal spray that sometimes goes by the generic brands of Narcan or Kloxxado, to spray up the noses of overdose victims and have been credited with saving many lives.

"Within seconds it can restore their breathing," Williams told the Democrat Tuesday. "Of course you would want them to be checked out by medical personnel depending on the amount of opioid that they have in their system."

Revived overdose victims can easy slip back into unconsciousness as the naloxone wears off and the opioids again take over.

"That's why each box comes with two doses," Williams said. "Because the Narcan does not stay in the system as long as some opioids do."

Free doses of naloxone are currently publicly available with no questions asked at the Pettis County Health Center, 911 East 16th St.

"It's less than five minutes for them to come in, ask for it, we give it to them make sure they know how to use it," Williams said. "They're aware of the resources that we provide with it, and we send them on out the door."

Kits are also available at Recovery Lighthouse, 1809 West 10th St, and Compass Health, 1700 West Main St.

For Williams, 24/7

access to naloxone means more lives can be saved.

"There's been proven statistics that it's caused individuals to change their habits, their behaviors by having that near death experience and being brought back to life," Williams said. "That was the wake-up call they needed to change their life for the better."

The vending machines would be paid for by the opioid settlement money.

"It ranges anywhere from about \$25,000 up to the one that I showed last night at the City Council was \$60,000," Williams said. "The one that we

have recommended going with it'll cost about \$37,000 for all three, so a little over \$10,000 apiece."

The Health Center's proposal also suggests a business outreach campaign that includes educational materials and travel costs for one year of outreach totaling \$12,283. In total, the proposed funding request is \$50,000.

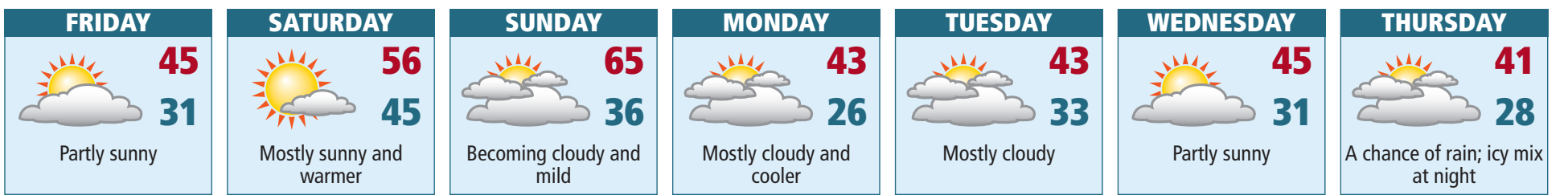
The City Council promised to revisit the budget and see if it can be revised to purchase the vending machines.

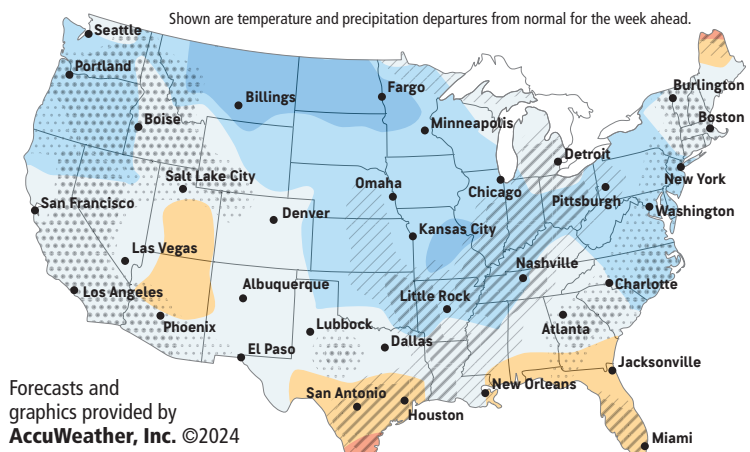

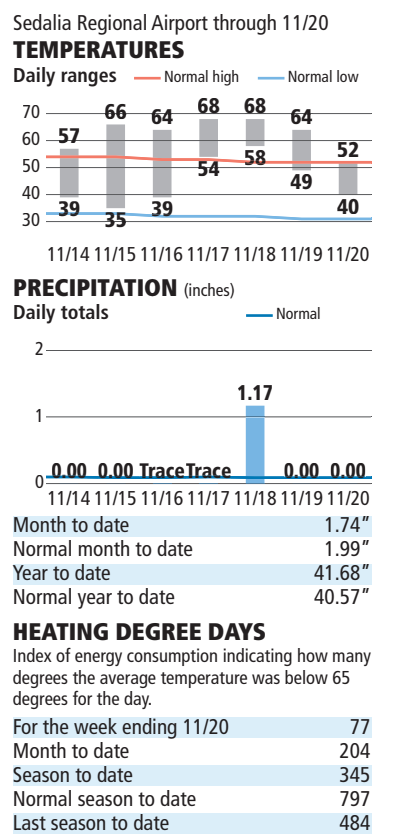

MARSHALL — A familiar name has officially returned to the Smith-Cotton boys basketball team's sideline.

Brennan Scanlon opened his second stint as the Tigers' head coach Tuesday, Nov. 19, as the team competed in the Marshall Jamboree at Marshall High School.

was to play as much as I can in high school, and then once I got to see that there's college and it's actually doable for me, that was my goal. It's amazing. To know that I've been dreaming about this since I started playing basketball — it's just amazing."

Bailey said Drury head coach Kaci Bailey has been in touch with her since her sophomore season and they've developed a solid relationship over the years.

"She was actually the first person who ever offered me," Charlee Bailey said. "We kind of already had a relationship built. That trust and friendship was already there."

Once she stepped on campus, though, Bailey was sold.

Central Missouri football to play in Heritage Bowl

Central Missouri football is heading to the Lone Star State.

The Mules have accepted an invitation to play the University of Texas Permian Basin in the Heritage Bowl at noon Saturday, Dec. 7, at Community Bank & Trust Stadium in Corsicana, Texas.

This will be Central Missouri's (8-3) second-consecutive postseason appearance, a feat last accomplished in 2016 and 2017. UCM last appeared in a bowl game in 2017.

"Anytime you get to play meaningful games in November and December, it is really important for your program," Central Missouri head coach Josh Lamberson said during the Bowl's announcement. "It indicates you are having some level of success. The opportunity to play in a bowl game, to continue your season and have one last game for your seniors, your upperclassmen. I think what probably gets lost most is the extra practices for your underclassmen, the guys that didn't get to play a whole lot of snaps during the season."

Lamberson added the bowl environment also provides flexibility to give younger players who have yet to exhaust playing time guidelines that are in place to qualify for redshirt status.

"Those guys that get to play in three games might get to play in this bowl game and have the opportunity to get some game and real life experience," Lamberson said. "It's a big thing. It's something we're really looking forward to and we're blessed for the opportunity."

This is UCM's first appearance in the Heritage Bowl, which began as the Corsicana Bowl in 2017. The bowl game is the longest existing in Division II.

This will be the fourth year a MIAA program has appeared in the contest. Central Oklahoma won in 2017 while Emporia State won in 2018 and 2023.

This is UT Permian-Basin's second showing in the bowl. It lost to Okla-

homa Baptist in 2021. The Falcons concluded the 2024 season with a 7-4 record.

UT Permian-Basin head coach Kris McCullough won the bowl game as the head coach of East Central in 2022. He took the head coach job at UTPB two weeks later.

"We made some good memories back in 2022," McCullough said during the Bowl's announcement. "I look forward with this family to come back and make some memories and hopefully come out and hold that big star they do for the winners."

Central Missouri heads into the bowl holding the top passing offense in NCAA Division II, averaging 402.5 yards per game. It also leads DII in first downs with 322 and is second in total offense, averaging 534.1 yards per game.

Redshirt senior quarterback Zach Zebrowski leads DII in completions per game (32), passing yards per game (405.6), passing yards (4,462), passing touchdowns (38) and total offense (447.5).

The Mules have six receivers with at least 200 receiving yards, highlighted by senior Zach Patterson's 1,013, redshirt junior Jack Pospisil's 697, redshirt freshman Hogan Wasson's 550, and redshirt senior Derrick Rose's 411.

On defense, the Mules have four athletes with two or more takeaways, led by redshirt junior Drew Kaufman's two interceptions and one fumble recovery. Redshirt senior Noah Blair, redshirt senior Charles Gadie, and

redshirt senior LaDarian Paulk each also had two interceptions. Redshirt junior Isaac Montgomery had one interception and one fumble recovery.

"The Mules are an exciting football team to watch, we have the returning Harlon Hill award winner in Zach Zebrowski," Lamberson said. "We have a bunch of high-flying receivers, some big o-lineman, some fast tailbacks, a very aggressive defense that likes to force turnovers and be aggressive towards the issue."

UTPB led the Lone-Star Conference in scoring offense with 34.5 points per game, passing offense with 254 yards per game, first downs with 261 and red zone touchdowns with 31.

UTPB limited its opponents to 17 points per game.

"It all starts with defense," McCullough said. "Those teams that get into the postseason year in and year out, they're built on championship caliber defenses. We're fast, we're physical, we're strong. We're three down, we're four down. We're a little bit of everything. Both in the front end and the back in. We got some great players that fly to the football and make things happen. On offense, we try to be as explosive as possible. We want to be balanced, 50/50 run-pass. But, at the end of the day it's football. You got to get it to your playmakers and let them work."

Tipton eyes first district title since 2012 in rematch with Harrisburg

The table is set for Tipton football to claim its first district championship since 2012.

The top-seeded Cardinals (10-1) host No. 3 Harrisburg (7-4) in the Class 1 District 2 title game at 7 p.m. Friday, Nov. 22.

Tipton head coach William Duke said the Cardinals are hungry to get another win after they didn't play up to their standards in their 42-6 semifinal win against Salisbury last week.

"Each and every week is an opportunity for the team to get better," Duke said. "After Salisbury last week, we were ecstatic that we won the game and got another seven days with the team, but we also knew there were some things we didn't do too well. We spent a good part of the early week highlighting those, not in a bad way, but in a way that shows them, hey, look at these things you were doing. Are you still doing those same things at the same level of intensity? ... It's something the players can see and they've taken ownership of, and say, 'Coach, we can do that better.'"

The championship game will be a rematch of a Sept. 27 matchup that the Cardinals won 38-32. This was the only contest Tipton won by six or fewer points all season.

"We know they're a good football team," Duke said. "Their coaches are very confident in their scheme. Their players are very confident in their scheme. I'm sure they've wanted this rematch since the game finished."

The Bulldogs' defense has been key in their run to the championship game, as they held No. 6 Fayette to just six points in the quarterfinals and held No. 2 Westran to just 10 points in the semifinals.

Junior Rylee Robinson leads Harrisburg's defense with 105 tackles and four sacks on the season. Junior Jonathan Darwent also has over 100 tackles on the season, while junior Victor Shouse has 95.

On the season, Harrisburg is allowing 23.5 points per game.

Duke said the Cardinals will try to keep the offense simple Friday.

"You're not going to try to reinvent yourself just because it's another game," Duke said. "We've talked about being brilliant with the basics. Sometimes those drills may be boring or mundane, but it's through those repetitions and focused repetitions that you truly get better."

Tipton's rushing game helped them beat Harrisburg last time, as senior Lucas Cashman and sophomore Paxton Pyle combined for 281 yards, while Cashman had two touchdowns. However, junior quarterback Dane Schlotzhauer threw three touchdowns in the game.

Cashman helped the team beat Salisbury with four rushing touchdowns last week.

Cashman leads Tipton's offense with 1,195 rushing yards on 161 carries for 19 touchdowns, while Pyle has 947 yards on 129 carries and 10 touchdowns.

As a unit, the Cardinals are averaging 7.81 yards per rushing attempt and 41.2 points per game on offense.

On the other side of the ball

for each team, Tipton is only allowing 11 points per game, while the Bulldogs are putting up 29.3 points per game.

Cashman leads the Cardinals defense with 86 total tackles, while Pyle has 78. Junior Sam Duke has 68.

William Duke said the players just need to do their 1/11 for the entire defense to slow down the Bulldogs' offense.

"You have to do your job and not try to do someone else's job," William Duke said. "You have to be able to sacrifice the statistic for what we call making the play. How many times do defensive linemen take on a block and it makes the running back have to bounce outside where a linebacker or safety or a corner comes in and makes a tackle? They got the stat, you know, the other person got the stat, but you made the play, right? You do your job, you make plays. You may not

get the highlight on the TV or your name in the paper or anything like that, but it's because you did your job that we got to play."

Harrisburg's offense is led by senior quarterback Trace Combs, who has 1,468 passing yards and 15 touchdowns this season. He also has 869 rushing yards.

Junior Caleb Sager leads the ground game with 1,277 yards on 197 carries.

Senior Bryce Ott is the Bulldogs' big-play threat out wide, as he has 736 yards on 29 catches this year for an average of 25.4 yards per reception.

"They have a lot of elite level skill players," William Duke said. "A lot of their kids could play at any class around."

The winner of this game advances to the Class 1 state semifinals next week, where they will see either North Platte or Penney.

Marionville plays Adrian, while Crystal City faces St. Vincent on the other side of the bracket.

William Duke said winning the district championship and advancing to the Final Four would be a massive accomplishment for Tipton football.

"The Tipton sports program, as a whole, is doing great right now," William Duke said. "Girls basketball has been playing at an elite level for several years now. Baseball has won districts now and reached the Final Four. Men's basketball has won a district title. You have wrestlers and golfers going to state. There's just so much going right for Tipton. So, we just want to do our best so that we can represent the school the way we believe it should be represented."

"I absolutely loved the campus," Bailey said. "I actually talked to a possible professor that I would have if I went to school there and absolutely loved her. Then, just meeting some of the girls, watching practice, everything about it. I loved it all. Then, to add to it, my brother, Jackson Bailey, he goes to Mission University to play basketball in Springfield. So, that kind of works out for our parents and keeps the family a little closer together."

Bailey plans to study pre-occupational therapy with an emphasis on psychology.

On the court, Drury was 25-7 last season in Kaci Bailey's first year as head coach and made an appearance in the NCAA DII Tournament. The Lady Panthers are 2-1 to start this season.

Drury has never won a national championship in women's basketball.

Kaci Bailey said Charlee Bailey is the exact type of player you want to add when trying to build a winning program.

"She's a multi-sport athlete who's literally won at everything she does," Kaci Bailey said. "I think she's very driven. I think she's an ultra competitor, and I think she just makes everyone around her better."

Tipton head coach Jason Culpepper said he knows Charlee Bailey will make an impact right away at Drury because of the effect she has on a team's culture.

"She really takes that 1% better to heart and she just tries to get 1% better each time she's

on the floor," Culpepper said. "So, Drury is getting someone that's going to work really hard and be a great teammate. She's a great person to bring in and be around your team, and lead by example."

Culpepper said Bailey is just an all-around great basketball player and athlete as well.

"I think what makes Charlee so special, as far as being a basketball player goes, is she's probably the only person I've ever coached that is maybe faster laterally than she is running a straight line," Culpepper said. "Whenever she is moving laterally, playing defense, she's extremely fast, and she's also a physical defender. Then, also, you know, she's a knockdown shooter. For her career, she's shooting over 40% and made over 100 threes multiple times. I think this year she'll probably have a good chance to be among the finalists of the McDonlad's All-American nominees."

In her first three years with the Lady Cardinals, Bailey has averaged 13.5 points per game on 45% shooting and has made 255 3-pointers. She also averages 3.4 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 2.2 steals per game.

Last season, Bailey averaged 16.8 points per game on 46% shooting, and 4.2 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 3.2 steals per game.

With her college decision behind her, Bailey said she is now locked in on her senior season.

"I definitely wanted to make my decision before basketball season started, that way I'm not really thinking about

things in the future and really focusing on the present," Bailey said. "With our first two weeks of basketball practice over, I am very excited about this upcoming season."

Tipton went 28-4 last season and finished third in Class 2. The Lady Cardinals have reached the Final Four in four of the past five years, highlighted by a state championship in 2023.

Bailey enters as the only senior on the Lady Cardinals' roster, but is joined by two All-State juniors in Madison Carvajal and Ava Schlotzhauer.

Carvajal joins the Lady Cardinals after playing her first two years for Class 1 Meadville, while Schlotzhauer returns after averaging 18.9 points and 11.8 rebounds last season.

Junior Clara Williams also returns after having a successful sophomore season, as does junior Anna Crane, who was the team's sixth man last year.

Sophomore Larrah Petree will also be a name to keep an eye on this season.

Culpepper said the team competed in about 36 games over the summer and did extremely well.

"The games we lost at Pitt State, we played 16 games there, and we lost two games there, and that was the only two games we lost all summer," Culpepper said. "That was to Class 4 Farmington out of Arkansas, who has won I think like seven of the last 10 state championships in their state. They start three DI girls and two DII girls. They beat us, but they didn't

beat us by much. We had a lead in the second half of that game. So, it's like they [Tipton] understand that we're at a different level than what we've been before. There's not a team out there we're going to play and not have a chance to beat."

Tipton will have its hands full this season with teams such as Helias Catholic, Hickman and Rock Bridge on their schedule.

The Lady Cardinals will also get their first

action in the new Central State 8 Conference, which includes Fayette, a district champion last season, as well as South Callaway and Eugene, who have each won three district championships in the last seven years.

Bailey said the key to this season will be to take things one game at a time.

"We have to take it step by step," Bailey said. "Set a small goal to a bigger goal to the biggest one, which

is to get to the Final Four and then the state championship... If we keep those small goals, we will continue to get better, and then once we get there, we can focus on that state championship and hopefully bring the championship home."

The Lady Cardinals tip off their season Saturday, Nov. 23, at the Bluefish Shootout in Rolla.

“She’s our glue,” Rhodes said of Cavanagh. “As she goes, the Tigers go.”

Dominique Bell also returns for her junior season after having success as a sophomore last year.

A big addition to the Lady Tigers this season will be junior Brekyn Scanlon, who played her first two years at Oak Park High School.

As a sophomore last season for the Lady Ookies, Scanlon averaged 6.96 points per game on 37% shooting as well as 2.26 assists per game.

Among the freshmen on the team are Bella Blackaby, Camdyn Jones, Mia Cavanagh and Khloe Myers, all of which received playing time in Tuesday’s jamboree.

With many new faces, Bell said it’ll be important to put the work in at practice so the team can gel as one.

“I feel like we need to play more together,” Bell said. “Everything is going to be different this year and we

need to practice how we play.”

As a whole, the Lady Tigers want to at least reach the .500 mark, a milestone they surpassed last year after going 14-13.

Last season was the first time since 2012 the Lady Tigers finished with a winning record.

Once upon a century

The year 1924 found America on the cusp of change. Telecommunications and transportation were exploding with new applications for everyday life. Automatic telephone exchanges came on the scene, automobiles were just coming into their own, and, in France, a helicopter with 16 blades set a record for staying in the air over eight minutes.

However, such wonders of technology had not yet reached farm families eking out an existence a few miles east of Sedalia between the little towns of Florence and Otterville. With no electricity, they burned wood to cook and to heat their homes. With no indoor plumbing, they relied on well water for drinking, bathing, and washing clothes. The little wooden building out behind the house, equipped with last year's Sears and Roebuck catalog, took care of other needs. This is the world my mother was born into one hundred years ago today.

It is hard to even imagine all the changes the past century has brought about. The events I have read about in history books, Mom has actually witnessed firsthand. She grew up through the presidencies of Calvin Coolidge, Herbert Hoover, and Franklin Delano Roosevelt. In 1929, when the stock market crashed to begin the Great Depression, Mom was getting ready for her fifth birthday. When the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor in 1941, she was a senior at Otterville High School.

Mom, or "Susana" as her family called her, was the youngest of seven sisters, all born at home. By the time Mom came along, her three oldest sisters had already left to marry or to "work out," which meant cooking and cleaning house for others. My grandmother made the girls' dresses from flour sacks, so Mom inherited lots of hand-me-downs.

Being the youngest came with its advantages, though. When the older sisters invited her to spend the night at their homes, she reveled in meals of store-bought bread, margarine, and sliced bologna. One sister even had a

toaster. When the babies started coming, Mom became an aunt at only six years old.

Despite the Depression Mom's family lived on home-grown garden vegetables, wild berries, and eggs, meat, and milk from the animals they raised. Excess food was cold-packed or pressure canned for winter use. They used homemade lye soap, a washboard, and a large metal tub to wash their clothes. They never owned a car, so the occasional trips to town for supplies called for a horse and buggy.

Winter walks to Stony Point school a mile or two away could be brutal. The trek to the one-room schoolhouse, where one teacher taught all eight grades, required black rubber galoshes with large metal buckles. Besides heavy coats and scarves, the girls wore long johns (the underwear kind) and long stockings secured with elastic garters. I love to hear Mom talk about these "olden days" as we browse through a box of old photos where everyone resembles a character from "The Waltons."

My favorite stories are the ones she tells about high school days when she was dating my dad. She talks about going for a hamburger and Coke at Garst's Drive-in (brand new then, later Eddie's, and now gone) at Broadway and Ohio in Sedalia. Then, there was the time the study hall teacher caught Mom shooting paper wads, and asked Dad if he wanted to take her punishment for her. (To make a paper wad, Mom says, you roll a small bit of paper around in your mouth to make a ball and then shoot it at someone with a rubber band.) Anyway, in true hero fashion, Dad bent over the teacher's desk and sacrificed his backside to two licks with the dreaded razor strap. This act of chivalry must have impressed Mom, because just a few years later, they were married.

The yellow brick road leads to the Heckart Performing Arts Center stage this weekend as the Smith-Cotton Theatre Department presents "The Wizard of Oz."

Two months of rehearsal—and a deep dive into special effects—will culminate in an exciting way.

"This is definitely the most time I've spent on a production as a director," Smith-Cotton High School Theatre teacher Elizabeth Carter said. "Between building all the set pieces—we have a giant Oz face, like a puppet, that talks (and) a few other interesting building challenges—the biggest change this year is that we're flying."

ZFX Flying Effects, a theater company based out of Louisville, Kentucky, rendered the Heckart so characters like Dorothy, Glinda the Good Witch, the notorious flying monkeys and Oz himself could soar above their audience. "A fly track made it so that we can safely harness and fly actors," Carter said. "...Each actor, and myself, and some of our stage crew members, committed a whole weekend to be here and train with a person out of Louisville."

Professionalism within the cast, even its youngest members, has continuously impressed Carter. For the amount of children involved in the production, rehearsals ran smoothly. 16 elementary schoolers comprise the munchkins, their parts mastered within five to six rehearsals.

Even canine actors stepped up to their roles, including Teddy, a Yorkshire Terrier owned by "Oz" piano accompanist Susan Preisendorf. "This is the first time we're using a real dog," said Carter.

With six years to her name in Smith-Cotton theater, Carter expressed profound thankfulness for the cast and crew bringing this logistically intense musical to life.

Serviceberry is a sadly underused native tree that helps wildlife and is worth planting

Winters were brutal throughout most of New England in Colonial America. It snowed a lot, often into spring, and there were no radiators (or antibiotics). Many settlers didn't survive the season, but because the ground was frozen solid, the colonists couldn't bury their dead in real time. Funerals had to wait until the spring thaw.

Plants, however, don't follow calendars. They grow, bloom, fruit and go dormant on their own schedules, dictated by the weather. The settlers knew this, so they watched one specific tree — Amelanchier — for cues: When its white flowers were in bloom, it meant the soil was soft enough to dig graves.

Preachers then went from settlement to settlement to perform funeral services, earning the harbinger tree its common name: serviceberry. Or so the story goes.

(True or not, it's the more interesting of the two bits of lore about the tree, which is also sometimes called shadbush or shadblow because its blooms coincide with the shad fish's migratory season.)

Because it's one of the earliest spring bloomers, the serviceberry is an important food source for bees, butterflies and other pollinators. Later, its berries sustain dozens of bird species and mammals, including humans, who can make them into jams, jellies and even serviceberry wine.

There are more than 20 species of the North American native tree, which is sadly underused if you ask

me. Here are four favorites.

Allegheny serviceberry (Amelanchier laevis)

An early-blooming, 15-to-25-foot-tall woody shrub or multi-stemmed tree native to Eastern North America. Its delicate white flowers bloom in April before leaves appear, and small, edible red berries, which mature to purple, appear in June. In fall, the tree's foliage turns a brilliant orange-red, and its gray bark provides lovely winter interest, giving it true four-season appeal. Plant it in part sun or shade in moist, well-draining soil. It does not tolerate salt or drought well. Hardy in zones 4-8.

Amelanchier canadensis (Canadian or Eastern serviceberry)

This tree has similar attributes, minus the gray bark, and grows to 15-to-20-

feet tall. The Eastern North American native is often found in swampy areas, but can tolerate somewhat sunnier and drier sites than the Allegheny species. Hardy in zones 4-7.

Amelanchier arborea (downy serviceberry)

Reaches heights of 15-25 feet, and is notable for its large berries and sun tolerance, although it will also thrive in shade. Its native range spans from Eastern North America west to Quebec and Nebraska. Hardy in zones 4-9.

Amelanchier utahensis (Utah or Western serviceberry)

Among the most drought-tolerant of the bunch. Native from Montana south to Texas and west to the Pacific Coast, it reaches 6-15 feet tall and displays yellow fall foliage. Hardy in

zones 5-8.

Growing tips

Multi-stemmed, shrubby varieties can be trained to grow as trees by pruning away all but one (preferably straight) central trunk when the plants are young. All varieties tend to sucker (send-

ing up small shoots), some more than others; leave them be to grow a shrubby screen or cut them at ground level as needed (once or twice annually) to maintain a tidier appearance.



Turkey triumph: Master the perfect Thanksgiving bird

Don't be intimidated by the prospect of cooking a big Thanksgiving turkey. It's not that difficult, even for novice cooks, says a University of Missouri Extension nutrition specialist.

First, make sure you have enough bird, says Tammy Roberts. If you're hosting a large group, get at least 1 pound of whole turkey per person, especially if you want leftovers. If you don't want leftovers or are cooking a turkey breast, buy ¾ pound of turkey per person.

If you buy a frozen turkey, make sure to allow enough time for it to thaw out. To deter microbial growth, thaw in the refrigerator or in cold water, not on the kitchen counter. Allow one day of thawing in the refrigerator for every 5 pounds of turkey. To thaw in cold water, completely submerge the wrapped turkey in cold water and change the water every 30 minutes so the outer layer of turkey won't get to warm. This method requires about 30 minutes of thawing for every pound of turkey.

Be sure to clean and san-

itize the sink after removing the turkey. But don't rinse turkey and other meats before cooking. That only spreads those germs around the sink, which can cross-contaminate other foods. Any bacteria that might be rinsed off the surface of the turkey would be easily killed by cooking in the oven.

"We don't recommend stuffing the turkey," Roberts says. It's safer to cook the stuffing outside the turkey in a casserole dish. That's because it takes stuffing a long time to reach a safe internal temperature when cooked inside the cavity of the bird. Roberts says more people get sick whenever the turkey is stuffed with stuffing.

Once it's ready for the oven, put the turkey breast side up on a rack in a shallow pan. Using a rack lets the drippings fall below the turkey and will help to evenly distribute the heat around the bird, Roberts says.

Then grab a meat thermometer. "Place the meat thermometer in the thickest part of the breast or the thickest part of the thigh," she says.

Make sure the thermometer is not touching bone. The temperature of the bone will go up faster than the meat.

Set the oven for 325 degrees. An 8- to 12-pound unstuffed turkey will take about 2 3/4 to 3 hours to cook. To prevent over-browning, you might want to put aluminum foil over the turkey for the first half of the cooking time. "Roast the turkey until the thermometer reaches a minimum of 165 degrees," she says.

Some turkeys in supermarkets are labeled "basted" or "self-basting." That means the meat has been injected with something to make it flavorful and moist, Roberts says, adding that you might instead want to do that yourself with butter, oil, broth or spices.

But there's no need to baste while the turkey is cooking. The image of Mom lovingly spooning the juices over the roasting turkey is a perfect Norman Rockwell picture, but it doesn't really add to the flavor.

Truffle & Sorrel offers holiday plan

Restaurants and other establishments are gearing up with new and innovative menu items and activities for the holiday season.

On Monday, Nov. 18, Chef Chris Paszkiewicz, owner of the newly opened Truffle & Sorrel Seafood and Chophouse, 322 S. Ohio Ave., shared his holiday plans and noted the new restaurant now has artwork on the walls.

The two large black-and-white photos depict the inside of the vintage Trust Building, which is the location of Truffle & Sorrel.

The Dude is an 11-ounce burger topped with smoked pork belly, fried green tomatoes, fried onions, lettuce, tomato, pickles, fried mozzarella sticks, and

smokey barbecue sauce. It’s not for the faint of heart and is excellent for sharing.

Paszkiewicz is also planning to offer more economical lunch specials Tuesday through Thursday. The menu may include pulled pork macaroni, spaghetti, and lasagna. He added that the offerings will be “fast and economical.”

The Saturday brunch menu includes shrimp and grits and options such as a Monte Cristo sandwich, chicken and waffles, and a Seafood Frittata.

Paszkiewicz added that brunch has bottomless Mimosas and Bloody Marys. The main menu includes fried chicken, grilled lamb chops, fillets and ribs, a crab boil, and an assortment of southern seafood options such as lobster rolls and risotto.

Paszkiewicz will kick the holidays off Saturday, Nov. 23. Truffle & Sorrel is participating in the Sedalia Holiday Boutique Crawl. It will be open for brunch.

“I’m actually going to have an eggnog special that day with the brunch,” Paszkiewicz said.

On Thursday Nov. 28, Thanksgiving evening, during the Hotel Bothwell Lighting Ceremony, the restaurant will host a “Fire Pit and Fireworks” event.

“The bar and the restaurant will be open,” Paszkiewicz said. “But there won’t be food — we’ll have some sort of snack option, but the kitchen won’t be open.”

will introduce his small business kick-off.

“Brody Buster will be playing that night; he’s out of Lawrence, Kansas,” Paszkiewicz said. “And we’re going to have Black Friday gift card incentives — that goes on to Christmas.”

On Saturday, Dec. 7, the night of the Sedalia Area Chamber of Commerce Christmas Parade, Paszkiewicz plans to host a hot chocolate bar beginning at 5 p.m. inside the restaurant’s ice cream shop, Ice Cream @ Truffle & Sorrel.

The restaurant will be closed the week of Christmas but has plans for New Year’s.

How windbreaks boost livestock health and energy efficiency

Winter cold and wind are soon going to be upon us. Wind chill values are a usual part of any winter weather forecast. Wind chill also impacts livestock, so developing some type of wind protection is beneficial to the performance and well-being of the animals we care for.

Research has shown that below 30 degrees Fahrenheit, energy requirements of beef cattle increase about 13% for every 10-degree drop in windchill. Providing wind protection is therefore beneficial in reducing the amount of extra feed or supplement needed to overcome the impact of windchill.

Windbreaks or wind protection comes in a variety of forms. If natural windbreaks are unavailable, man-made structures can be constructed. There are a few guidelines to follow, however, in order to make these structures more effective.

Solid windbreaks are not recommended. Wind

protection is lessened downwind of the structure compared to windbreaks that provide some porosity. Also, drifting snow due to down drafting is an additional problem close to the structure and can reduce the benefit of the windbreak.

Recommendations for cattle windbreaks suggest a minimum height of 10 feet with 25 to 33 percent porosity. This allows some air movement close to the structure and reduces the amount of snow deposited close to the downwind side of the windbreak. Leeward wind and drift protection is provided eight to 10 times the height of the structure with this amount of porosity. For example, a 10-foot-tall structure with 25% porosity would provide wind and drift protection approximately 80 to 100 feet downwind of the windbreak.

If constructing a structure with 6-inch-wide lumber, a spacing of 1.5 to 2 inches between boards will provide the recommended amount of porosity. Also be sure to leave some space at

the bottom of the windbreak for a bit of air flow and to allow the area to dry out. Four to six inches are recommended. If necessary, some straw or hay could be placed at the bottom of the windbreak during extreme weather events. Provide about 25 square feet of protection per cow or 1 foot of length per cow. A width to height ratio of 10:1 is also recommended, so the length of a 10-foot-tall structure should be 100 feet for maximum wind protection.

Windbreaks should be oriented perpendicular to wind direction, but V-shaped or L-shaped structures can also be effective. Windspeed will increase around the edges of windbreaks, so keep edges away from waterers, feed bunks, and resting areas. Also pay attention to windbreak placement due to the potential for drifting snow.

Wind protection is beneficial to livestock but be sure if constructing windbreaks that you also consider drifting snow so a solution to one problem

doesn’t cause another one. Farm site planning, building placement, and potential for vegetative windbreaks are other considerations to keep in mind.

There are a variety of resources available for planning both constructed windbreaks as well as planting, placement, and species selection for vegetative windbreaks. Many different materials can be used for this purpose but keeping in mind a few general guidelines will make wind protection for farmsteads and livestock more effective.



NEW YORK — It's not the holiday season until the house is full of festive music, from classics to covers and reimaginings across genres, for all to enjoy.

In honor of the most wonderful time of the year, here are some of the best new holiday releases for the 2024 season.

Vince Gill and Amy Grant, “When I Think of Christmas”

When it comes to country music Christmas classics, Vince Gill and Amy Grant immediately come to mind. The couple is no stranger to the world of holiday music, and their latest collection, “When I Think of Christmas,” channels the spirit of their popular “Christmas at the Ryman” residency in Nashville, with two new recordings: a duet of “Til the Season Comes Round Again” and Grant's take on the title track.

The Carpenters, “Christmas Once More”

Don't fix what ain't broke is an expression for a reason: Sometimes the best holiday album listening experience is enjoying the classics, but newly remixed and remastered. Enter the 16-track “Christmas Once More” from the Carpenters. Fall in love with “Sleigh Ride” and “(There's No Place Like) Home For The Holidays” all over again.

Jennifer Hudson, “The Gift of Love”

Jennifer Hudson has done a ton in her career — including winning an Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony, making her the rare performer to EGOT, as the expression goes — but a holiday album? That's new territory. “The Gift of Love” is her first, full of big-hearted classics like “O Holy Night,” “Winter Wonderland,” “Auld Lang Syne” and “Carol of the Bells,” which features the a cappella-meets-Zulu music South African group The Joy. The album also contains some inventive originals. In that category: “Almost Christmas”

with Common. If there is only one album to grab this holiday season, you'd be wise to make it this one. **Little Big Town, “The Christmas Record”**

Another big name in contemporary music has released their first holiday album. Little Big Town's “The Christmas Record,” produced by the legendary Dave Cobb, is a country music spectacular. Like Hudson's, this one is a collection of familiar tunes along with originals — like the opener “Glow,” and the cheery vocal harmony of its chorus: “That shine, that shimmer deep inside of you / Find that magic, let the light in you show / Let it go / Let it glow.”

Toby Keith, “Christmas to Christmas”

In February, country superstar Toby Keith, a hit crafter of pro-American anthems who riled up critics and was loved by millions of fans, died at 62. In the time since, he's been eulogized and celebrated, and that continues with a newly remastered reissue of his 1995 holiday classic, “Christmas to Christmas.”

Clay Aiken, “Christmas Bells Are Ringing”

Clay Aiken — you read that name correctly, the onetime “American Idol” runner-up and politician — has returned with his first studio album in over a decade, “Christmas Bells Are Ringing.” His voice sounds as sweet and theatrical as ever — a natural partner to holiday classics.

Jimmy Fallon, “Holiday Seasoning”

At the intersection of Christmas and comedy albums comes Jimmy Fallon's “Holiday Seasoning.” The “Tonight Show” host gets into the spirit of the season with jokes — and some A-list guests — included. Check out “Almost Too Early for Christmas” with Dolly Parton, “Hallmark Movie” with Cara Delevingne, and “New Year's Eve Polka (5-4-3-2-1)” featuring the Roots and Weird Al. It's exactly what it sounds like.

The Philly Specials, “A Philly Special

Christmas Party”

For a third year in a row, the Philly Specials — former Philadelphia Eagle Jason Kelce and current Eagles Lane Johnson and Jordan Mailata — have released a holiday album for charity. “A Philly Special Christmas Party” benefits a few organizations, including the Children's Crisis Treatment Center and Children's Hospital of Philadelphia. If getting NFL stars to sing sounds funny, well, that's kind of the point. The fun and absurdity are this album's superpowers: On the Americana “Maybe This Christmas,” Kelce (brother to Travis Kelce) and Stevie Nicks duet, singing, “And maybe forgiveness will ask us to call / Someone we love / Someone we've lost for reasons we can't quite recall / Maybe this Christmas.” It's moving.

Ella Fitzgerald and Louis Armstrong, “Ella & Louis Wish You a Swinging Holiday”

Let's be honest here. Around Christmas, everyone wants to hear Ella Fitzgerald and Louis Armstrong. Why not hear them together? “Ella & Louis Wish You a Swinging Holiday” is a new boxset, two jazz classics meeting in perfect harmony: “Ella Wishes You a Swinging Christmas” and “Louis Wishes You A Cool Yule.”

Ben Folds, “Sleigher”

Ben Folds might not be an obvious pick for holiday music — “Sleigher” is his first Christmas album, after all — but it's a match made in heaven. His indie piano pop has charmed horn-rimmed glasses wearers for many years; his delicate compositions hit like falling snow. There are seven originals here and three covers.

The Temptations, “Give Love at Christmas”

The holidays, like every day, are a time for listening to Motown Records' vocal groups. This year, tuck into a new reissue of the Temptations' 1980 album, “Give Love at Christmas.” It's for fans of five-part harmonies and soulful renditions of classics.

Campbell's shareholders approve the company's new, souplless name

NEW YORK — Campbell's is ditching the soup — at least in name. And the change has now received shareholders' greenlight.

Campbell Soup Co. announced its intention to change its name just over two months ago, saying it wanted to instead be known as the (slightly shorter) Campbell's Co. Shareholders overwhelmingly approved the change on Tuesday.

In a statement, CEO Mark Clouse maintained that this “subtle yet important change” will retain the company's iconic name

“while reflecting the full breadth of our portfolio.”

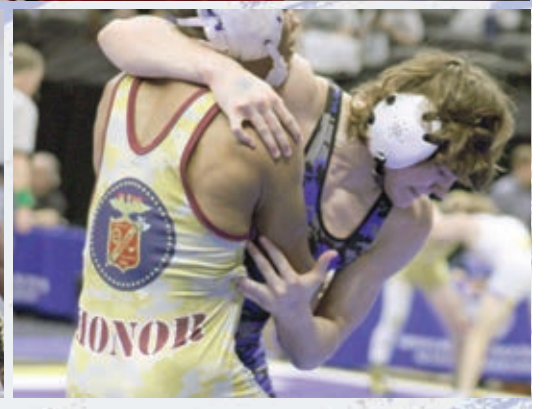
New Jersey-based Campbell's hasn't been exclusive to the soup business for some time. The company also owns brands like Prego sauce and Goldfish crackers — and completed a \$2.7 billion acquisition of Sovos Brands, the maker of Rao's pasta sauces, earlier this year.

Still, the 155-year-old food seller is most famous for its namesake canned soups, adorned with red and white labels. Its new name won't change that, the company says — noting the Campbell's soup brand or packaging will not be affected.

“We love soup and always will,” Clouse stated Tuesday. “The iconic red and white Campbell's soup labels that consumers love will be on shelves forever.”

The new name will officially be effective following an amendment filing to the company's certificate of incorporation.

Campbell's is far from the first to attempt such a makeover. From Dunkin' to KFC, a handful of other food companies have also rebranded themselves over the years — often shedding the mention of specific item they were known for with shorter corporate title, or even an updated logo, in hopes of emphasizing other business.
