# Pettis County first in nation to use new GPS snowremoval tech this weekend

Pettis County is the first county in the nation to implement a system that keeps track of snow removal in real-time allowing crews maximum efficiency.

With the season's first major snowfall of the season expected this weekend, county crews were busy Thursday readying plows with the new tech to hit the streets.

"Pettis county is prepared for the expected winter weather," Eastern commissioner Israel Baeza told the Democrat. "We have our crews getting everything ready and preparing for what we anticipate is to come. We're implementing new things; part of that includes adding plows to a lot of our pickups so they can get into the smaller areas as well as some of the subdivisions."

Pettis County road crews have also added to their fleet, and though they have always worked longer hours during snow events, they are adding a second shift to ensure to 24-hour coverage.

"Lastly, we're launching a plowing technology which will incorporate GPS in all our vehicles which we will be the first in nation to utilize it," Baeza said. "This technology will allow us to keep our drivers safe, see where they are, any needs they may have, but it will also be used as a tool to keep the public informed about what roads have been touched and what are the conditions of those roads."

Beaza said Pettis county will be a proving-ground for the new snow clearing system and which should save money by managing routes more efficiently.

"Obviously, this is some new technology we're excited to be using it," Baeza said. "This will essentially be GPS tracking on our vehicles, it will be it will be giving live updates of the clearing they are doing on the road.

# Missouri's hands-free law now in effect

On Jan. 1, 2025, Missouri became the 49th state to implement hands-free driving laws.

The Siddens Benning Hands-free law aims to combat distracted driving by prohibiting the use of handheld electronic devices while operating a motor vehicle.

"The law was passed and put into law on Aug. 28 of 2023," Missouri State Highway Patrol Cpl. Justin Ewing said. "However they built in a 16-month grace period to try to let drivers

change their behaviors, let us as the law enforcement agencies of the state educate the public on what the law was, what it says, what's required of drivers."

The grace period expired Jan. 1, 2025, and under the new law drivers are prohibited from holding or manually operating a cell phone or other electronic device while driving, sending, reading or writing text messages, recording videos, browsing social media or engaging in any other activity that takes attention away from the road.


# Stan Miesner

Denny is survived by his sister, Donna Humble (age 89) of Osage Beach, MO; his wife, Donna Holman, of the home; his son, Grant Holman and daughter-inlaw, Stacy Holman, who reside on the family farm as well. Dennis is also survived by two daughters, Juanita Hargis and Sherri Jones of KC, MO; a stepson, Harry Donnellan, of Sedalia; a stepson, Randy Meekins, of Surprise, AZ; a stepdaughter, Denise Bryan, of Columbia, MO; and recently an honorary adopted daughter, Patty Gerke, of Boonville, MO who has been an angel amongst us the past several months.

In addition to this immediate family Denny is survived by a huge family who loves him dearly including nine grandchildren: Ricky, Allison, Chastity, Hunter, Ethan, Brandi, Anthony, Nicholas, and Linsey; ten great-grandchildren; and two great-grandchil-

Denny was the fourth generation to live and work on the Holman Family Farm which was founded in 1890 and is still active and growing today. His son, Grant, is the fifth generation to carry on this legacy which was Denny's life's work. Denny added land to the farm during his lifetime which today totals over 900 acres.

Denny attended a one-room schoolhouse on Woodland Road until the fifth grade, at which time he moved to Smithton School to finish his education. He graduated high school in 1957. Denny then joined the Marines in 1958 in lieu of the draft. He served in Okinawa, Japan between the Korean and Vietnam Wars and was a proud lifelong Marine. Semper Fi were words that meant something to him, and he always felt a kinship with others who had served their country in all branches of the military. After coming home from the corps, Denny toured the nation with his friend Larry Gunner (deceased) of North Dakota. They traveled from one end of the nation to the other before coming back to their respective homes to pick up again with the work to be done on their respective family farms.

in 1993 and began his very eventful thirty plus years of "retirement"

For the last ten years Denny has been working back at the farm doing what he's always loved in the place that he is most proud of. In 2016 Grant and Denny had a logger out to harvest the logs on the Holman Farm for the first time since its inception. Denny spent the next five years cutting up the tops that he and the family turned into more than 300 cords of split firewood, and getting grass sowed on the more than two miles of wooded trails and food plots on the north end of the property. With this accomplished, Denny and Grant, with the help of Stacy and the kids, started a small outfitting business which has seen visitors arrive from five states including Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Wisconsin, Michigan, and UP Michigan. Denny's most recent and most crowning achievement was purchasing the last of, and finishing, the bottom to the south to complete the dream he and his father started over seventy years ago. In 2022 Denny and Grant and family finished sowing grass and picking

Creek. Denny will be fondly remembered for his determination to care for future generations, his work ethic and constant belief that anything worth doing is worth doing your very best, his ability to love unconditionally, and his love for the legacy of the family farm that lives on into the sixth and seventh generations. It's just winter, people Arctic Blast! Polar Vortex! Snowmageddon!

I hate to sound like a crotchety old lady, but back in my day, this was called winter. If the weather man got real excited, he might say words like snow or freeze or even blizzard. But there was none of this "polar vortex" business. Polar Vortex was the name of the new portable cooler you bought for your light beer. Arctic Blast was a package of particularly minty chewing gum.

I kid, but only a little. Some of our dramatic terms for winter weather have existed for a while. "Arctic blast" and "polar vortex" have official definitions that you can look up with the National Weather Service! But until the early 2000s, these terms were mostly jargon that meteorologists used when speaking with each other. They didn't make it into the news forecast with any regularity. And they certainly weren't accompanied by 24-7 "extreme weathermen" with social media pages TYPING IN ALL CAPS THAT THE ARCTIC BLAST IS ON ITS WAY. WARNING! THIS IS A HUGE THREAT.

Like most people who yell on the internet, these guys are just doing it for your attention. They thrive (and are paid!) on the amount of clicks and views they receive, so they have every reason to trumpet doom and gloom. Especially since the science of weather is traditionally a little drier than your average news content. "If it bleeds, it leads," has been a principle of yellow journalism for more than 100 years. Weather can't bleed, so to shock you and keep you reading, unscrupulous weather outlets must hook you with headlines promising floods, tornados, and traffic-stopping snowstorms. This strategy works, to an extent. People love drama, have an inborn need to be prepared for catastrophe, and are primed to believe someone in a position of authority. So as soon as the meteorologist says "Arctic blast" 25,000 people cancel all their weekend plans and run out to buy toilet paper. It ends up snowing two inches, everyone's mad things are canceled, and the only real winner is Charmin. Little by little, the news outlet's credibility suffers because of the whole "boy who cried wolf" cautionary tale, but that's matter for a differ-

that we've been told to prepare for, as one online meteorologist called it, the "JANUARY SNOW-POCALYPSE?

Winter. We can expect winter, the season proper to January that includes cold and sometimes snow accumulation. Beyond that, we don't really know. We're getting the feeling it could be a "strong winter storm," in the words of the much more demure National Weather Service. But as my favorite local weatherman Clint Perriguey put it on Wednesday on his Facebook page, "All about your weather," "It's silly right now to talk snow totals or ice potential." And he's totally right. Even by Friday when this column is printed, we still won't know for sure how much snow or ice we will receive over the weekend. Any weatherman worth his road salt will admit it. In fact, the drier, more levelheaded, and loath to make a solid prediction a meteorologist is, the more I trust him. Weather forecasting is not an exact science, and that's okay. We don't need it to be as immutable as the laws of physics. We just need it to be reliable enough that we can plan a weekend.

Stop freaking out about the weather. Stop sharing dramatic posts on social media. Don't buy up all the milk and toilet paper unless you really need it. This is winter. It is normal. It's what's supposed to happen this time of year, and it will not harm you if you have an ounce of preparedness and any common sense at all. So make sure you have your blankets, flashlights and groceries, gas up your car, and then get a grip. Say a little prayer for the people who really will have to suffer in snowy conditions, like farmers and first responders and homeless people. Go build a snowman. Make some tea. Don't drive anywhere you don't really have to go. Take a breath. It's winter, not Snowmageddon. You can do this.



Although they had not planned to go to Bourbon Street on New Year's Eve, plans sometimes change, and so until we heard from one of Emily and James's group, we were on tenterhooks.

As it turned out, one of their group did want to take in the French Quarter, but Emily was starting a headache, and James experienced some pain in his back - and so they didn't go. I have never been so happy to hear that my daughter was having a migraine. It seemed as if the blackeyed peas from January 1, 2024, had the desired effect. I was grateful, and Max was happy that he had learned to follow my instructions regarding eating them.

But others started this new year with tragedy and sadness in the midst of revelry and happiness.

I suppose that's always the truth. Each day consists of different things for different people. The tragedy that occurred in New Orleans crystallizes the truth that we are all connected by more than we realize, even when they occur at different times on the same day. We all know joy. We all know sadness. We all shed tears. We have all seen and shown kindness and sympathy. We all experience heartbreak and loss.

This knowledge should give us patience with each other, even as we have different outlooks on life and life's events. I suppose I am as guilty as anyone when I am impatient with those who don't see things as I do. What I can do, however, is to remind myself that truly, patience is a virtue, and try to be more patient in the coming year.

I think about the people who are suffering unimaginable loss today in New Orleans, and I cannot, with any serious intent, utter the phrase "Happy New Year." Instead, I'll say this. I hope 2025 is a year of patience and kindness for us all.

# Jimmy Carter exemplified the role of president as diplomat

The news of Jimmy Carter's passing takes me back to 1976, a year that marked my own passage to adulthood. As the bicentennial year dawned, I took first notice of Carter upon his victory in the Iowa Caucuses. I followed his campaign through my high school graduation and into the summer, when I shuttled in my first car between my summer job at Walt Disney World near Orlando, Florida and New Smyrna Beach. I studied Carter's campaign in my first college course on American politics that fall and proudly cast my first vote for Carter in November.

My enthusiasm for Carter was driven by many things - his comparative youth, his progressive brand of politics and his promise of honesty and integrity after the scandals of the Nixon years.

My interest in Carter endured. Enrolled in a Ph.D. program in political science a few years later, I proposed to write my dissertation on Carter's foreign policy. Although my adviser initially gave thumbs down, he relented after I persisted in making my case that this was a worthy topic.

A one-term president who left office with low approval ratings, Carter's presidential performance is often dismissed as a failure. The widespread admiration Carter gained over the years was associated with his post-presidency, which he devoted to fighting tropical disease, monitoring elections, promoting human rights and extolling the power of dialogue as a path to peace.

Yet as I argued in my book "Reversing Course," Carter compiled an extraordinarily successful diplomatic record that was unjustly obscured by events, especially the Iranian revolution and the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan, over which Carter had little control.

With America's global reputation in tatters following the Vietnam War and Watergate, Carter recognized the urgency of restoring a moral foundation for American foreign policy through the championing of human rights. He understood that a sense of moral purpose was not only essential to American leadership abroad but also necessary to gaining domestic support for an expansive U.S. role in the world.

Carter's human rights policies also had significant practical consequences. Vocal U.S. support for human rights gave added legitimacy and weight to the growing human rights advocacy of non-governmental organizations and international organizations. Authoritarian governments came to realize that systemic human rights violations brought real costs. Argu-

ably, the global diffusion

of human rights norms contributed to the later fall of the Soviet-controlled communist bloc and to the spread of democracy in many countries around the world.

Even more impressively, Carter's presidency illustrated the power of diplomacy. Carter employed diplomacy as a tool for both resolving insipient conflicts before they spun out of control and, where escalation had already taken place, finding a path toward peace and reconciliation.

This approach paid major dividends. The SALT II arms control agreement with the Soviet Union capped a dangerous and costly nuclear arms race (while never ratified by the Senate, both countries abided by the terms of the accord). The Panama Canal Treaties removed potential threats to the Canal's security, while eliminating a constant irritant in U.S. relations with Latin America. Diplomatic recognition of China set the stage for China's growing integration with the existing global political and economic

The Camp David Accords removed Egypt and Jordan as military threats to Israel's security while the transition to majority Black-rule in Zimbabwe, brokered by the United States and Great Britain, brought an end to the bloody civil war there. The successful conclusion of the Tokyo Round trade

negotiations sustained progress toward a more open global economy. It is difficult to think of another president who used diplomacy to better effect in serving major American interests.

Carter's record was not unblemished. As domestic political opponents unfairly painted Carter's emphases on human rights and diplomacy as evidence of weakness, Carter increasingly and unwisely sought opportunities to prove his toughness, with little effect.

A foreign policy that prioritizes diplomacy and broadly-shared values cannot solve all problems. Nevertheless, at a moment in which the American Century faces unprecedented challenges at home and abroad, we as a nation would do well to seek lessons from Carter's presidential and post-presidential records.

I was fortunate to finally meet and shake hands with Jimmy Carter a number of years ago when he and Rosalynn Carter spoke at Drake University. As Carter has for so long served as both a political inspiration and a scholarly subject for me down through these many years, I will miss his presence in our national life.

Drivers can still use hands-free features such as voice commands or Bluetooth to make calls or send texts, operator-mounted devices if they're not physically held, use electronic devices when parked or stopped in a safe location such as a traffic light or stop

Penalties for violations could lead to fines and points on your driving record. Repeat offenders could face license suspen-

driving should be our full time job," Ewing said. "When we're distracted by anything, whether it's passengers, the radio, food or drink and especially what we see very prevalent in our society; these electronic devices or cell phones whatever word distracted we're putting ourselves and other people at risk and we've seen unfortunately people lose their lives in the state it was very 106 people in 2023 were killed by a distracted driver."

According to Missouri Department of Transportation, distracted driving contributed to over 2,200 crashes as well as 106 deaths in 2023.

"Two of these families are Randall Sidden's and Michael Benning's," Ewing said. "Their families who lost loved ones due to distracted driving and together with the state legislators and they were instrumental in getting this law passed."

Siddens was helping with roadside cleanup in Columbia, MO after a triathlon when a speeding driver distracted on her phone ran a red light, struck and killed

"Benning was on Interstate 49 in Cass County and had lost some stuff out of a trailer that he was hauling to the lake." Ewing said.

"He was trying to retrieve that from the roadway and a driver that was on her phone did not see him in the middle of the road and struck and killed him as well. These two families lost loved ones, that could have potentially been prevented had these drivers not been distracted on their phones."

You can prepare for the new law by investing in hands-free mounts and Bluetooth enabled car audio systems.

Learn your phone's voice-activated features and avoid the habit of checking it constantly.

"It is a secondary violation in Missouri currently," Ewing said. "You can't be pulled over solely for using your phone, but what law enforcement officers are going to be looking for are those violations that are committed by distracted drivers."

You could be stopped for primary violations that may seem insignificant such as not using a turn signal or traveling a little bit over the speed limit.

"A lane violation, following too close, things we see people doing while they're distracted that are leading to crashes," Ewing said. "In the meantime we're also going to be looking to see if they're using their phones

as well, and if we see that phone usage while these other primary violations are being committed now, we're going to be enforcing this law."

Troopers hope drivers will heed the warnings to put down their phones while driving and only check them while parked.

"We just want people to focus solely on driving while they're behind the wheel," Ewing said. "Use your do not disturb features you need to, because no text message, no phone call is worth someone getting seriously injured or killed."



Our goal is to be able to take this data and inform the public about what roads and have and haven't been touched, the condition, but also on the back end it will allow us to collect data internally to see how many trips we took to get salt, for example."

"So, we won't have missed streets if they made a wrong turn," Baeza said. "The technology will walk them step by step of what

roles they need to take to ensure that we're being as efficient as possible and that will also allow us to have communication with them if we ever need to send them a message."

Drivers whose routes are almost finished can be summoned to assist other plows once their done.

"If somebody is 70%

done with the route and maybe somebody else is 30% done with their route we'll be able to analyze what's going on there," Baeza said. "Do we maybe need to add a vehicle to that route? Do we need to maybe add or change the equipment that we're using? It allows us to better analyze this data always with the intention of improving our services to our county residents."

The first major snow event of the season is expected this weekend around the region.

According to the National Weather Service, the watch goes into effect at 6 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 4 and runs until 3 a.m. Monday, Jan. 6.



here were many sports moments in and around Sedalia that were cause for celebration in 2024.

Among the highlights were six Final Four finishes and 12 district championships earned by area teams. Countless student-athletes earned myriad individual accolades as well.

Here is a look back at some of the best moments from this past year:

# **Cole Camp boys** golf comes back to win state

After the first round of the state tournament Monday, May 13, Cole Camp boys golf sat down for dinner feeling lost.

"Everybody was down. It was not a celebration," head coach Jared Espey said.

The Bluebirds had just shot a season-worst 349 and found themselves in fifth place with an uphill battle for the Class 2 state title coming in Round 2 on Tuesday, May 14.

But as the team started eating, they began to relax until something clicked in them.

"We didn't really talk about golf. We kind of just reminisced because, you know, this is their third year in a row for state. They won it two years ago, got fourth last year, and it kind of just went back to like, 'Hey, this is it, guys," Espey said. "I think they realized they had nothing to lose."

Everything changed Tuesday.

One-by-one, scores were

being entered as they came in, and when the Bluebirds finished their round, they found themselves in first place.

Cole Camp beat out Willow Springs by three strokes. Emotions ran high once

the team found out they had completed the comeback.

"There were tears by some of the boys," Espey said. "A lot of big hugs. I'm a big hug guy. There was just a lot of celebration."

In Round 2, the Bluebirds shaved 21 strokes off their first round score to shoot a 328 and claim the state title with a two-day total of 677. Sacred Heart baseball finishes as runnerup at state

This Sacred Heart baseball season was one for the history books.

The Gremlins earned the most wins in a season in school history, claimed a district title for the second

year in a row and made it to the state tournament's Final Four for the first time since 2006.

All of that success this year was capped off with a second-place finish at the Class 1 state tournament Tuesday, May 28. The Gremlins lost to Oran 11-1 in the championship game to go home with silver medals.

"If you would've told us a month ago that we would take second, we would've taken it," senior Connor Rice said. "It's not exactly how we wanted to finish tonight, but we knew we wanted to finish here and just getting here is a really great accomplishment."

Head coach Nick Brashear said he couldn't be happier with the season and how the team competed throughout the year.

"We worked so hard to get to this point and have

a chance to win the state championship, and finishing second in the state is still a huge accomplishment," Brashear said. "I don't think the boys realize the magnitude of this. They're the second team in school history to make it to the championship game. So, win or loss doesn't really change the fact that we had a great season." Tipton girls basketball

The Lady Cardinals defeated Norwood 62-35 Thursday, March 7, to take home the Missouri State High School Activities Association third-place trophy and bronze medals.

Even though the team wanted the first-place trophy, head coach Jason Culpepper said ending the season with a dominant win was important to him and

the team. "Third place means a lot because it was the best we could do today," Culpepper said. "We were a good enough team to win state. Unfortunately, we didn't get it done to get first, but I'm super proud of this group and wouldn't trade it for anything in the world."

Seniors Courtney Edwards and Madalyn Hagerman wrap up their high school careers with 109 wins and a state championship to their names.

Edwards said she couldn't be more grateful for her time as a Lady Cardinal.

"I just love basketball. I love my teammates. Everybody makes it so much fun in Tipton and it's just really emotional," Edwards said. "You really put your blood, sweat and tears into Tipton basketball."

# Five Chiefs selected to Pro Bowl, Mahomes not one of them

Nine Baltimore Ravens, including two-time NFL MVP Lamar Jackson and Derrick Henry, were selected for the Pro Bowl Games.

The Detroit Lions are next with seven players and the Minnesota Vikings and Philadelphia Eagles each have six players on the NFC roster.

Patrick Mahomes wasn't selected to the AFC roster for the first time since becoming Kansas City's starting quarterback in his second season. Mahomes, a three-time Super Bowl MVP and six-time Pro Bowl pick, wasn't among five Chiefs chosen. Teammate Travis Kelce made it for the 10th time.

Washington's Jayden Daniels is just the fourth rookie quarterback since 1970 selected to the initial Pro Bowl roster. Raiders tight end Brock Bowers and Rams outside linebacker Jared Verse are the other rookies among 24 players chosen for the first time.

Detroit's Jared Goff is the NFC's starting quarterback and Minnesota's Sam Darnold also made the team. The AFC's starting quarterback is Buffalo's Josh Allen. Jackson and Cincinnati's Joe Burrow are the backups.

Philadelphia's Saquon Barkley, who became the ninth player to rush for 2,000 yards, is the NFC's starting running back.

San Francisco's Kyle Juszczyk was selected to his ninth Pro Bowl, the most ever by a fullback. Indianapolis' Quenton Nelson is the third offensive lineman since 1970 to be selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first seven career seasons.

Cincinnati's Ja'Marr Chase is the fourth wide receiver to be selected in each of his first four seasons. Dallas' Micah Parsons is the first defensive player chosen in each of his first four seasons since Aaron Donald went to 10 straight.

Wide receiver Zay Flowers, safety Kyle Hamilton, cornerback Marlon Humphrey, center Tyler Linderbaum, defensive tackle Nnamdi Madubuike, fullback Patrick Ricard and inside linebacker Roquan Smith are the other Ravens.

Safety Brian Branch, running back Jahmyr Gibbs, center Frank Ragnow, right tackle Penei Sewell, wide receiver Amon-Ra St. Brown and punter Jack Fox join Goff from the Lions.

Wide receiver Justin Jefferson, outside linebackers Andrew Van Ginkel and Jonathan Greenard, cornerback Byron Murphy and long snapper Andrew DePaola are the other Vikings.

Right tackle Lane Johnson, center Cam Jurgens and left guard Landon Dickerson, defensive tackle Jalen Carter and inside linebacker Zack Baun are going from Philadelphia.

The Dolphins, Jets, Titans and Saints are the only teams not represented.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Blake Craig kicked two field goals in the fourth quarter, his second a 56-yarder with 4:36 left as No. 23 Missouri rallied to beat Iowa 27-24 on Monday in the Music City Bowl.

Missouri trailed 24-14 when the Tigers started the comeback, scoring the final 13 points for the win. Brady Cook threw for 287 yards and two touchdowns. Joshua Manning also ran for a TD to key the comeback. Marquis Johnson added 122 yards receiving and a TD catch.

Missouri (10-3) posted the program's eighth 10-win season. Coach Eli Drinkwitz said the win total is only a piece, with the Tigers starting and finishing the season ranked a great accomplishment for his seniors.

"It's something that they should take a lot of pride in back-to-back seasons," Drinkwitz said. "Finishing ranked is an unbelievable accomplishment for our program and really, really proud of them."

Cook, who also ran for 54 more yards, said there was never a decision for himself or fellow senior defensive end Johnny Walker not to play one last game for Missouri.

"We knew we were going to and getting that 10th win and leaving our legacy and going out with a win, going out winning a championship — no matter what the championship is, we won a championship today," Cook said. "And

The Hawkeyes jumped out to a 14-7 lead with Terrell Washington Jr. catching a 6-yard pass from Sullivan and Kaden Wetjen's 100-yard kickoff return. Kamari Moulton's 1-yard run gave Iowa a 21-14 halftime lead. Drew Stevens added a 38-yard field goal in the third.

Then Missouri started the comeback. After Manning's TD late in the third quarter. Toriano Pride Jr. picked off a pass by Sullivan. The Tigers tied it up with a 51-yard field goal by Craig with 10:10 left before he kicked the game-winner.


While they would've liked to have had third place, senior Madison Finkenbine said the team was happy to just bring home a trophy.

# **Opal the kitten comes** home through good deed

ome individuals see a need and spring to action, and right before Christmas, when a small kitten became confused and trapped 40 feet up in a tree, one Sedalia man knew he had to help.

Opal, the kitten's story, became the talk on Facebook on Friday, Dec. 20, when residents in her neighborhood began posting about her plight. Her owner, Gabby Wassam, let her out and then found the young cat had climbed a tree. Carol Jo Sipe Minton posted on Facebook that she heard a kitten crying all night but couldn't find it.

Many discovered the five-month-old kitten had climbed a tree and was perched on a tiny limb, afraid to move.

Worried posters noted that the Sedalia Fire Department couldn't help due to the tree's position, and Evergy was also unable to help. That's when Thomas Gardner, 21, stepped in and decided it was worth the climb to save Opal. It wasn't his first time saving an animal in distress.

# A rescue plan

Gardner is a traveling salesman for Webster Enterprises with his girlfriend Paris Wilson. The couple has an eightmonth-old son, Greyson. They talked with the Democrat on Friday, Dec. 27, about the rescue. Gardner found out about the kitten from his father, William Gardner, who'd seen the posts on Facebook.

"We'd just come over to their house, actually ..." Gardner said. "He showed me a post and said, 'You know there's a cat stuck in a tree, and it's been there for two days."

Gardner added that his girlfriend encouraged him to help because she loves cats and

thought the kitten might be homeless and needed a home.

"Pretty much, after he showed me the picture, right after that, we decided to go look for it," Gardner said.

Due to the Facebook posts, the couple only knew the vicinity but not the exact location. They began their search and soon located the tree, where they heard the kitten crying.

Garaner said ne used to watch videos of professional cat rescuers, who would wear a backpack to place the cat or kitten in once they reached it. He decided to do the same. But those rescuers wore a safety harness — Gardner didn't.

"We tried to find a rope before we left," Wilson said. "But we couldn't find any."

With a laugh, Gardner added he'd free-climbed a "million trees and never fallen." So, he would "knock on wood" and

attempt it again.

"That poor cat's cry was so sad," Wilson said. **Bringing Opal home** 

Gardner added that the kitten was perched on a tiny branch split into a "V." Once he reached Opal, he grabbed her by the scruff of the neck and gently placed her into the backpack.

He noted that the tree rescue was "super high," and he was a little scared. Wilson, on the other hand, was terrified for him.

"I was freaking out because he had the bag in one hand and the cat in the other," Wilson said. "And was holding the tree with his legs, 40 feet up there. And at first, people were cheering him on. "And that was making him go faster, and I was just scared."

Once on the ground, Gardner said he pulled Opal from the bag. She meowed a few times and went back into the arms of her owner, Wassam.

Wassam, a stay-athome mom, was thrilled to have Opal back especially for Christmas and her children.

"We actually had a friend on our roof at midnight for two hours the night before with 30 feet of PVC pipe and a bucket on the end with tuna in it as we stood up there trying to lure her into the bucket," Wassam said. "One of many things we tried and

failed to succeed in. Our friend also tried climbing the tree and couldn't. So, Thomas really stepped up the game."

Wassam said when she

saw Gardner walk into the yard, she was afraid he would fall from the "But the way he just

leaped immediately up on the fence, I was like, oh wow, maybe he's actually going to make it up there," Wassam said. She added she never

thought a stranger would come to Opal's rescue.

"Absolutely not," Wassam said. "Especially someone who doesn't know me. We called all kinds of professionals to help, and no one would come. And then a kid/a random guy showed up."

With a bright smile, Wassam added that Opal would remain an indoor cat; she wasn't allowed outside anymore.

# Gardner, a hero at heart

Due to his heroic rescue, Chris Rippey, who owns the Missouri Arborist Co., asked Gardner if he'd like a job. Gardner also received a couple of gift cards in the mail for his rescue.

Opal's rescue isn't Gardner's first time to save an animal. He rescued a dog and cat from a fire at his grandmother's trailer at the Boonville Trailer Park in Sedalia.

After large drops during the pandemic, life expectancy in the United States should recover to 2019 levels this year nationally and in 26 states — but not as fast as it should compared with similar countries, according to a new study.

Bad habits such as junk food, smoking and illicit drug use are preventing longer lifespans even as technology brings major progress in diseases such as cancer and heart disease, according to a new study by the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation at the University of Washing-

By 2050, U.S. life expectancy is projected to increase from 79.1 years to 80.4 years for babies born in that year, a modest improvement that would drop the United States behind nearly all other high-income countries, according to the study.

Poverty and inadequate health insurance are slowing progress in some states. Wealthier, more urban and better-educated states are doing better and are more likely to adopt policies that save lives, from curbing gun access to offering income supports for young mothers. Nine of the 10 states (all but North Dakota) with the longest life expectancies for babies born this year are dominated by Democrats, and all 10 have expanded Medicaid under the Affordable Care Act. All 10 states with the shortest life expectancies are controlled by Republicans (though Kentucky has a Democratic governor), and they include five of the 10 states that have not expanded Medicaid.

A Stateline analysis of data from the study shows how some states have risen, and some have tumbled, in terms of life expectancy.

In 1990, for example, New York and West Virginia were nearly tied at Nos. 39 and 41 among states' life expectancy rankings. But the two have since taken sharply different paths — New York rose to No. 3 in 2024 and is projected to have the longest life expectancy of any state by 2050, passing Hawaii and Massachusetts.

West Virginia outranks only Mississippi in 2024 and is projected to be last among states in 2050.

New York has bene-

fited from good health care availability in New York City hospitals as well as state policies such as strict gun laws that have curbed suicides, and harm reduction policies to curb overdose deaths with supervised use sites and other controversial programs, said Brett Harris, president of the New York State Public Health Association and an associate professor in the University of Albany's Department of Health Policy.

Harris said she's not surprised that New York state, despite its ascent in life expectancy among states, would still drop from No. 33 to No. 41 by 2050 if ranked as a nation,

according to the analysis. "I think part of that is how individualistic we are in this country, the idea of always trying to get ahead, versus more of a community-based environment in other countries," Harris said. "Their social policies tend to be better for health outcomes. If you live in more of a family environment versus an individualistic environment, that

builds in more support." West Virginia's sparse population and rural poverty make it harder to get health care. It's also hard to get past community and political skepticism about health measures, said Brian Huggins, health officer for Monongalia County, West Virginia. Huggins has worked with other county health officials to advocate for stricter anti-smoking laws and to maintain school vaccination mandates in the face of opposition.

"It hurts to see West Virginia ranked at the bottom. We're a proud state," said Huggins, adding that life expectancy there also is hampered by lack of economic opportunity that drives young, healthy residents to move away. A plethora of concerns include a lack of sidewalks that make healthy walking more hazardous, and a dietary culture that does not include vegetables; both promote obesity.

Huggins also has seen conditions abroad. While stationed in Germany for the U.S. Army, he saw generous health provisions for Germans, such as two-week retreats with massages and sauna baths for those feeling stressed or burned out at work.

"Their goal in Germa-

ny is they want you back at work. Prevention and keeping a healthy workforce are their priority because that contributes to the economy," said Huggins. "On the other hand, they have built a tax system to support this. You pay like an 18% tax on everything you buy there — that would not be something Americans would necessarily accept." Germany's valued-added tax, now 19%, applies to most goods and services.

Life expectancy dropped two years in a row during the COVID-19 pandemic, including a national drop of more than 1.8 years between 2019 and 2020, from 79.1 to 77.3 years. Recovery will not be complete until this year, according to the projections, with slow progress predicted until 2050 — when the national life expectancy will be about 80.4 years.

Some of the states that recovered fastest from the pandemic were North Dakota, Rhode Island and Massachusetts, where life expectancy gained about a year between 2019 and 2024. Twenty-four states still haven't regained their

2019 life expectancy. The District of Columbia, which is not a state, had a lower life expectancy than all 50 states in 1990, but this year it ranks 23. Ali Mokdad, an author of the study and the chief strategy officer for population health at the University of Washington, said D.C.'s improvement is at least partly due to an influx of more affluent and well-educated people since 1990.

Most states that were in the top 10 in 1990 have fallen out: Colorado (from No. 7 to 11), Iowa (from No. 4 to 17), Kansas (from No. 8 to 36), Nebraska (from No. 9 to 19), South Dakota (from No. 10 to 21) and Utah (falling from No. 2 to 12).

Those new to the top 10 in 2024 compared with 1990 are: Massachusetts (from No. 13 to 2), New York (as mentioned from No. 39 to 3), California (from No. 24 to 4), New Jersey (from No. 26 to 6), Rhode Island (from No. 19 to 8), and Washington state (from No. 14 to 10).

Urban concentrations of people are important to long life because of the availability of top-flight care, said Mokdad.

"I'm very close to the hospital [in Seattle] and I have health insurance. But is that true for everyone in Washington state? You might live two or three hours from Seattle, so even for people of my income and education level it's not the same," Mokdad said.

Quality care and insurance also are important, Mokdad said, to ensure that problems such as obesity and high blood pressure are noted and controlled.

"You see obesity in many areas, especially the Southern states, has increased tremendously and while smoking has dropped in rich areas, it has stuck around in other communities. This is explaining many of these [state differences] — what we call preventable risk factors," Mokdad said.

"There's an increase in life expectancy but a lot of people are still left behind," Mokdad said.

Even in urban areas, racial minority groups and women can find themselves in impoverished circumstances that can cut short both their lives and their children's lives. One report in the same Lancet issue this month focused on a program in majority-Black Flint, Michigan, where doctors prescribe money for women from late pregnancy through the

first year of a child's life. The program, launched this year, is the first nationally to mimic some in 140 other nations that offer cash subsidies for child health, according to the article. The success of similar, temporary child tax credits early in the pandemic has prompted other states to adopt or expand their own tax credits for young mothers.

"We increasingly know that what happens in early childhood can impact life expectancy," said Dr. Mona Hanna, a Flint pediatrician who founded the program, called Rx Kids. It relies on state help, in the form of permission to use federal funds, as well as private donations.

Michigan included \$20 million in its state budget for next year to expand the program to other cities as well as to mostly white, rural counties in the state's Upper Peninsula. The program grants \$1,500 to expectant mothers plus \$500 a month for the first year of the baby's life.







# Progress continues on Bothwell Lodge roof

The northern section of Bothwell Lodge State Historic Site will remain closed as the last of its asbestos shingles are removed and polymer-based shingles take their place. Product malformation, unfavorable weather conditions, and precipitous areas of the building have extended the job beyond its forecasted one-month completion date.

"The asbestos removal went pretty quick-it's not completely done yet, but the shingle install wound up taking a little longer than we were expecting because some of the shingles themselves seem to have defects," said Jim Griggs, Bothwell Lodge State Historic Site superintendent. "When they were molded at the factory, they wound up having some warpage, so (Missouri Builders Services) have had

to sort out the bad shingles." Additionally, 10 feet of lumber and underlayment above the breezeway were found unfit for continued use and promptly remediated.

Along with these discoveries, maintaining historical accuracy with contemporary shingles has proven a challenge. "The roofer himself had to get a little bit creative," Griggs explained. "...The exposed ends (of the shingles) want to raise up, so he had to really watch what he was doing, so slow and meticulous is what it turned

To date, the majority of the east wing and breezeway are complete. The northernmost area of the lodge-which will prove most difficult due to its positioning on a steep cliff-has yet to be abated.

"That part of it is going to require an extravagant lift system to come in," said Griggs. "It's going to be

quite the spectacle to reach around the building to get the rest of the shingles off... they're just so hard to get to in places."

While contractors accounted for structural complexities, weather-as anyone in construction can attest-can't be helped. "The rain has knocked us out a lot on this," Griggs said. "Any time it rains or gets super wet it throws a wrench in (the workday)." With snow predicted this Sunday, and more likely as winter wears on, a new roof by February is the new estimation.

"I'd say we'll be doing our normal (tours) by March," Griggs said. "No plan survives its first implementation. We're taking our time. We want to turn out a good product."

# 5 things we know and still don't know about COVID

Five years ago, a cluster of people in Wuhan, China, fell sick with a virus never before seen in the world.

The germ didn't have a name, nor did the illness it would cause. It wound up setting off a pandemic that exposed deep inequities in the global health system and reshaped public opinion about how to control deadly emerging viruses.

The virus is still with us, though humanity has built up immunity through vaccinations and infections. It's less deadly than it was in the pandemic's early days and it no longer tops the list of leading causes of death. But the virus is evolving, meaning scientists must track it closely.

Where did the SARS-CoV-2 virus come from?

We don't know. Scientists think the most likely scenario is that it circulated in bats, like many coronaviruses. They think it then infected another species, probably racoon dogs, civet cats or bamboo rats, which in turn infected humans handling or butchering those animals at a market in Wuhan, where the first human cases appeared in late November

That's a known pathway for disease transmission and likely triggered the first epidemic of a similar virus, known as SARS. But this theory has not been proven for the virus that causes COVID-19. Wuhan is home to several research labs involved in collecting and studying coronaviruses, fueling debate over whether the virus instead may have leaked from one.

It's a difficult scientific puzzle to crack in the best of circumstances. The effort has been made even more challenging by political sniping around the virus' origins and by what international researchers say are moves by China to withhold evidence that could help.

The true origin of the pandemic may not be known for many years — if

How many people died from COVID-19?

Probably more than 20 million. The World Health Organization has said member countries reported more than 7 million deaths from COVID-19 but the true

death toll is estimated to be at least three times higher.

In the U.S., an average of about 900 people a week have died of COVID-19 over the past year, according to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The coronavirus continues to affect older adults the most. Last winter in the U.S., people age 75 and older accounted for about half the nation's COVID-19 hospitalizations and in-hospital deaths, according to the CDC.

"We cannot talk about COVID in the past, since it's still with us," WHO director Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said.

What vaccines were made available?

Scientists and vaccine-makers broke speed records developing COVID-19 vaccines that have saved tens of millions of lives worldwide – and were the critical step to getting life back to

Less than a year after China identified the virus, health authorities in the U.S. and Britain cleared vaccines made by Pfizer and Moderna. Years of earlier research - including Nobel-winning discoveries that were key to making the new technology work — gave a head start for so-called mRNA vaccines.

Today, there's also a more traditional vaccine made by Novavax, and some countries have tried additional options. Rollout to poorer countries was slow but the WHO estimates more than 13 billion doses of COVID-19 vaccines have been administered globally since 2021.

The vaccines aren't perfect. They do a good job of preventing severe disease, hospitalization and death, and have proven very safe, with only rare serious side effects. But protection against milder infection begins to wane after a few months.

Like flu vaccines, COVID-19 shots must be updated regularly to match the ever-evolving virus — contributing to

public frustration at the need for repeated vaccinations. Efforts to develop next-generation vaccines are underway, such as nasal vaccines that researchers hope might do a better job of blocking infection.

Which variant is dominating now?

Genetic changes called mutations happen as viruses make copies of themselves. And this virus has proven to be no different.

Scientists named these variants after Greek letters: alpha, beta, gamma, delta and omicron. Delta, which became dominant in the U.S. in June 2021, raised a lot of concerns because it was twice as likely to lead to hospitalization as the first version of the virus.

Then in late November 2021, a new variant came on the scene: omicron.

"It spread very rapidly," dominating within weeks, said Dr. Wesley Long, a pathologist at Houston Methodist in Texas. "It drove a huge spike in cases compared to anything we had

seen previously." But on average, the WHO said, it caused less severe disease than delta. Scientists believe that may be partly because immunity had been building due to vaccination and infections.

"Ever since then, we just sort of keep seeing these different subvariants of omicron accumulating more different mutations," Long said. "Right now, everything seems to locked on this omicron branch of the tree."

The omicron relative now dominant in the U.S. is called XEC, which accounted for 45% of variants circulating nationally in the twoweek period ending Dec. 21, the CDC said. Existing COVID-19 medications and the latest vaccine booster should be effective against it, Long said, since "it's really sort of a remixing of variants already circulating."

What do we know about long COVID?

Millions of people remain in limbo with a sometimes disabling, often invisible, leg-

acy of the pandemic called long COVID.

It can take several weeks to bounce back after a bout of COVID-19, but some people develop more persistent problems. The symptoms that last at least three months, sometimes for years, include fatigue, cognitive trouble known as "brain

fog," pain and cardiovascular problems, among others.

Doctors don't know why only some people get long COVID. It can happen even after a mild case and at any age, although rates have declined since the pandemic's early years. Studies show vaccination can lower the risk.

It also isn't clear what causes long COVID, which complicates the search for treatments. One important clue: Increasingly researchers are discovering that remnants of the coronavirus can persist in some patients' bodies long after their initial infection, although that can't explain all cases.

# Airman holds authority to sign up to \$5 million contracts

# *Martinez is the first to hold* honor at Whiteman AFB

WHITEMAN AIR FORCE BASE — Senior Airman Francisco Martinez, 509th Contracting Squadron contracting officer, is the first Airman from Whiteman Air Force Base to hold a unique distinction.

Martinez is the first junior enlisted Airman to have the authority to sign contracts of up to \$5

"When you first come in, you begin as a contracting administrator," said Martinez, "As you gain experience, you take the contracting officer test and see if you are ready to take that next step and receive a warrant to be able to sign contracts yourself."

When Martinez first assumed the role of a contracting officer, he was an airman first

class, making him the first person of that rank from Whiteman AFB to achieve this title. His initial warrant was valued at \$250,000, but as he gained experience and responsibility, his warrant value steadily increased, until reaching the \$5 million approval he has now.

"It takes a lot of discipline," Martinez explained. "You're constantly learning and asking questions, as everything is changing constantly,"

Martinez's responsibilities include overseeing contracts for a wide range of essential Air Force projects, such as procuring cold weather gear, maintaining critical system needs for the B-2 Spirit, and securing contracts for advanced training tools like flight and driving simulators.

Projects can span several months, requiring

him to balance competing priorities and manage significant financial stakes.

"He definitely is one of our top performers," said Tech. Sgt. James Bohnenstingel, 509th Contracting Squadron flight chief. "He's really good at being able to articulate all the weird things about our

In recognition of his leadership and expertise, Martinez has also become a trainer for new contracting Airmen joining the squadron, helping to pass on the knowledge and skills necessary for success in the field.

Martinez's achievement is not just a personal milestone, but a reflection of the Air Force's commitment to developing young leaders. His achievements underscore the opportunities for junior enlisted personnel to take on significant responsibilities and contribute to the overall mission in new and impactful ways.

# What's on the table in 2025? Some predicted trends in food

As we tip into the New Year, we food writers are often tasked with putting on paper our predictions for what will be trending. Truly, this used to be a simpler task!

Now, with food becoming more and more global, culinary innovations developing at the speed of light, social media weighing in, chefs feeling more empowered to break traditional rules or to dig deep into their cultural roots — it's kind of hard to know where to begin. But begin I will, with the caveat that this list is far from comprehensive, and I'm not allowed to hog the whole lifestyle section.

### **Asian flavors** and chains

It seems a little silly to say Asian cuisine is on the rise, since the category is enormous and has been around for millennia. But the growing number of Asian (Southeast Asian in particular) markets, restaurants, ingredients and prepared foods is dramatic, and is influencing all kinds of cooking.

H Mart, a South Korean chain of Asian markets now has 96 stores worldwide, most in the U.S., while other chains like 99 Ranch (Chinese) and Patel Brothers (Indian) are expanding.

Gochujang, sambal, yuzu, calamansi, matcha and kimchi (to name but a few) appear more and more on packaging and menus. There's sushi, barbecue, ramen, bulgogi. And Asian dumplings are proliferating in the frozen food aisles.

# The global palate

Diners are looking for a blend of authenticity and convenience, says Leana Salama of the Specialty Foods Association, a not-for-profit trade association representing more than 3,600 businesses worldwide.

After COVID, she says, when people began traveling again, they came home from trips wanting to recreate the traditional flavors they had tasted.

That has led to a lot of

unique spinoffs of more authentic snacks from all over. Besides Asia, other leading areas of culinary influence are South and Central America, says Whitney Herrera of Whole Foods' functional snacks division.

# Heat is hot

Our love of chiles continues. In 2025, it will be "less about how much heat you can stand, and more about exploring the flavor nuances," Salamah says.

She's seeing various hiles used in every thing from chocolate to

Herrera agrees: "Heat is bigger than ever, with more of an emphasis on complex notes of sweet and spicy." Chile flavors are permeating snack items such as nuts and trail mix.

Chile crunches or crisps are still gaining fans. Chile oils are infused with crunchy bits, usually fried garlic or shallots, sometimes with added ingredients.

Salsa macha is the Mexican version of chili crunch, with nuts, seeds

and spices added to the hot chili oil.

# **Functional Foods**

The "food is medicine" philosophy has evolved, Salamah says. People are thinking more about what foods will enhance their mood or their health, and less about what to avoid.

Non-alcoholic beverages continue to emphasize different flavors, adaptogens and "functional" ingredients.

Salamah calls functional-mushroom beverages a way to "elevate your drinking experience in a healthier way," appealing to folks avoiding alcohol. Functional mushrooms also are showing up in snacks, in teas and in your coffee. Salty snacks

Seaweed is "on fire," says Herrera, becoming more prevalent in snacks and other food categories. It's pitched as having health benefits and sustainability. With its strong umami flavor, it can be a stand-alone snack, or used as an ingredient, a flavoring for nuts, in stir-fry kits, rice dishes and more.

Another aquatic plant that is moving from the supplement aisle to the food aisles, in beverages in particular, is sea moss, Herrera says.

### Crunchy is the texture of the moment

See chile crunches and crisps above. And salty, crunchy snacks are a burgeoning category, says Herrera.

Pistachio seems to be the nut of the moment. In the last month alone, I've seen pistachio panettones, pasta, lattes, spreads and croissants in New York City. The pistachio-filled Knafeh chocolate bar from Dubai has been a global sensation.

# Added protein

"The 'proteinization' of foods is here to stay," says Salamah. "Makers are finding new and innovative ways to pack more protein into foods."

She mentions a Tik Tok-spurred craze in 2024 promoting cottage cheese to build protein into flatbreads, dips and cookie dough.

# Food waste and sustainability

More and more, consumers want to know how their groceries were grown, raised, harvested and produced, say retailers and restaurant

Attention to packaging and efforts to reduce food waste are growing. Companies are becoming more transparent about sourcing and manufacturing in response to customer demand.

# Micro trends

So, if this were the Oscars the music would be soaring, and I'd still have more people to thank. There are many more trends, and micro trends, to explore. Sandwiches getting bigger and more creative. Foods made in pearl form (algae caviar, balsamic vinegar). Lavender in food and drink. Freeze-dried foods. Mood foods. Dumplings in all guises. Unusual melons. AI entering your grocery shopping experience. Cookbook clubs. Sourdough (again!). High-low food pairings.

# Small businesses brace themselves for potentially disruptive TikTok ban

A looming TikTok ban could affect the millions of small businesses that use the short-video social media app to help them grow their busi-

Desiree Hill, owner of Crown's Corner Mechanic in Conyers, Georgia, started her business solo as a mobile mechanic. Sharing videos of her work on TikTok helped spread the word and she became so popular she was able to open a 9,000 square foot brick and mortar shop with five

employees 18 months ago.

"Every day I get at least two to three customers that have seen me on TikTok, watched my videos and wanted to become a customer," she

Though TikTok has been around only since 2016, small business owners use the platform in a variety of ways, from growing a customer base to advertising and marketing, as well as selling goods directly from the site.

According to TikTok's own estimates, small businesses on TikTok

would lose more than \$1 billion in revenue in a single month if the ban goes into effect.

The Justice Department ordered the app's China-based parent company, ByteDance, to sell TikTok or face a U.S. ban by Jan. 19, citing security concerns. The Supreme Court will take up the matter in January. President-elect Donald Trump, who takes office Jan. 20, has asked the Supreme Court for a delay.

If a ban does occur, small businesses will have to migrate to other platforms to find their customers. Instagram

Reels, SnapChat and YouTube Shorts are alternatives. The good news is brands likely already have a presence there. But it may be harder to reach teens that have made TikTok their preferred social media app.

Another alternative is to build a strong database of customers that opt in to providing contact emails or phone numbers. That lets owners reach out directly to customers with promotions and other marketing messages.

But Crown Corner Mechanic's Hill said she

is worried that other sites may not have the reach that TikTok does. She has a presence on YouTube, Instagram and Facebook, but it's not the same, she said.

"I am worried because there is no preparation for this," she said. "It holds such a significant place in regards to my customer base and how I reach customers that if I lose TikTok, I will lose a large part of my business or I will lose my ability to grow anymore."

Crystal Lister is the owner of Mommy and Me: The Listers, in Cypress, Texas, which

offers interactive workshops about STEM education. She's working on pivoting to YouTube for videos and Instagram Reels for teasers to direct people to YouTube, but said TikTok is easier.

"It is going to be a challenge if TikTok is banned because we're losing kind of all the functionality you want — the ability for a video creation, the ability to spread the word via social media," she said. "So we'll have to use many other platforms to supplement what TikTok did in one."

# Movies in 2024: Lessons from a turbulent year at the box office

ovie ticket sales took a bit of a hit in 2024. The annual domestic box office is expected to end up at around \$8.75 billion, down more than 3% from 2023, according to estimates from Comscore.

It's not as dire as it was in the pandemic years, but it's also not even close to the pre-pandemic norm when the annual box office regularly surpassed \$11 billion.

This is the year the business felt the effects of the Holly-wood strikes of 2023, the labor standoff that delayed productions and releases and led to a depleted calendar for exhibitors and moviegoers. And yet it's not as bad as it could have been, or at least as bad as analysts projected at the start of the year.

"This has been a really incredible comeback story for the industry," said Paul Dergarabedian, the senior media analyst for Comscore. "Just a couple of months ago it was a question of whether we would even hit \$8 billion for the year."

Hollywood continues to learn lessons about what moviegoers really want, what works and what doesn't. Here are the biggest takeaways from 2024.

# The strike fallout was real

The Hollywood strikes might have ended in 2023, putting productions back into full swing and sending stars out on the promotional circuit again — but the ripple effect of the work stoppages

and contract standoffs showed their real effects on the 2024 release calendar.

The first two quarters were hit hardest, with tentpoles pushed later in the year ("Deadpool & Wolverine," for one) or even into 2025 (like "Mission: Impossible 8"). With no Marvel movie kicking off the summer moviegoing season, the box office was down a devastating 27.5% from 2023 right before "Inside Out 2" opened in June.

"It's an unpredictable business but it thrives on stability," Dergarabedian said. "When the release calendar is thrown off, the momentum stops."

# The PG rating (and animation) ruled

Sequels and franchises dominated the top 10 movies of the year, as has often been the case in the past 15 years. But this year, films carrying a PG rating did especially well, starting with the biggest movie of 2024: "Inside Out 2," which also became the biggest animated movie of all time, not accounting for inflation.

Family films with a PG rating — including "Despicable Me 4," "Moana 2," "Wicked," "Kung Fu Panda 4," "Sonic the Hedgehog 3," "Mufasa" and "The Wild Robot" — grossed over \$2.9 billion this year, accounting for around 33% of the annual box office, according to Comscore. Movies rated PG-13, by contrast, made up about 30% of ticket sales.

The Disney impact

After a quieter 2023 and several years without a film at the very top of the charts, the Walt Disney Co. came back roaring in 2024 with three of the top five movies of the year: "Inside Out 2," "Deadpool &

Wolverine" and "Moana 2." In mid-December, it crossed the \$2 billion domestic mark, the second time any studio has done so since 2019 (that was also Disney, in 2022). Its 20th Century division also played an important part with "Alien: Romulus" and "Kingdom of the Planet of the Apes."

"It's a different industry when Disney commits to theatrical releases," said Daniel Loria, an executive at the movie data and analytics trade The Boxoffice Company.

# Looking at 'flops' a different way

Every year has high-profile flops and disappointments, and this was no exception. Sony had a rough go with its "Spider-Man" adjacent titles like "Madame Web" and "Kraven the Hunter" (but this also seems to be the fate lately for anyone not named "Deadpool"). Universal had higher hopes for "The Fall Guy," as did Warner Bros. for "Furiosa: A Mad Max Saga" and "Joker: Folie à Deux."

Then there were the filmmaker-driven (and financed) passion projects that failed to take off like Kevin Costner's "Horizon: An American Saga — Chapter 1" and Francis Ford Coppola's "Megalopolis."

"It's a reductive way of thinking about those passion projects," Loria said. "Those movies didn't come out with huge expectations, meaning theaters didn't clear out the house and give them three auditoriums per site in hopes for money to come in."

This was, however, part of the problem with "Joker 2," which was expected to be more in line with the first which made over \$1 billion.

But even that has a caveat, Loria thinks.

"It wasn't just that 'Joker' didn't perform, it's that there was nothing coming in behind it to make up that momentum," Loria said. "That's more the fault of a release schedule where one movie is supposed to carry a month. That model doesn't work anymore."

# Audiences crave options and a diverse lineup

What does work, Loria said, is a diverse lineup, with the Thanksgiving and Christmas successes being the perfect example. At Thanksgiving, there was "Wicked," "Gladiator II" and "Moana 2." Christmas had "Mufasa," "Sonic 3," and a lot of adult offerings too, including "Nosferatu," "A Complete Unknown" and "Babygirl."

Horror is often the safest bet for theatrical, but this year had even veterans pleasantly surprised by just how enthusiastic that audience can be, with hits like "Longlegs," "Nosferatu," "Terrifier 3" and "Smile 2" getting people out of the house.

The Blake Lively drama "It Ends With Us," which had its share of ongoing off-screen drama as well, also became an event. Audiences turned out for smart thrillers, like "Conclave" as well as unexpected originals including "Anora," "The Substance" and "The Brutalist."

# Nostalgia and the allure of a re-release

Re-releases of movies in theaters that are also widely available in the home thrived this year. Some of the biggest successes included Christopher Nolan's "Interstellar," "Coraline" and "The Phantom Menace." "It just shows our industry once again that audiences truly understand the difference between a communal, big screen theatrical experience that they crave even on films that they've had the opportunities to see in the home," Nolan said in December. "That theatrical experience that we all know and love is so powerful and so exciting. It's a very clear demonstration of it."

# Viral marketing moments

As silly as it sounds, this is the year the novelty popcorn bucket became a star. It started with the accidentally suggestive "Dune: Part 2" creation, which "Deadpool & Wolverine" latched onto in a less accidental way. More recently, the "Nosferatu" coffin buckets have been fetching high resale prices.

For Loria, it's all part of a trend that theaters have been noticing since reopening during the pandemic: Moviegoers aren't back in pre-pandemic numbers, but those who did come back were spending more on concessions and premium tickets (like IMAX and other large format screens) than ever before.

# 2025 looks bright

Everyone is optimistic for the film business in 2025, and the offerings for moviegoers — which include at least 110 films projected to open on over 2,000 screens — according to the National Association of Theatre Owners. And the momentum is there.

"There's been a huge amount of box office generated in the last six weeks of the year," Dergarabedian said. "This is the best opening act 2025 could have."

# For some, 'Winter Arc,' is replacing New Year's resolutions

New York — A new year is the time to set new goals. Yet studies have shown that most people don't tend to uphold their New Year's resolutions much past the first month.

In an attempt to reframe the thinking around new year goal-setting, a new wellness trend has popped up online. It's called the 'Winter Arc.'

Here's what to know.

# What is the Winter Arc?

The goal-setting challenge was created online by fitness and wellness influencers, so there isn't a one-size-fits-all approach or standard definition. There are over 400,000 posts on Instagram with the caption #winterarc, and almost 600,000 on TikTok.

For many of those trying the trend, the Winter Arc involves utilizing the cold, dark earlier months of winter to turn inward and get a jump start on their goals, with the intent of having them in place by the time Jan. 1 rolls around.

It's also meant to encourage participants to be extremely disciplined and rigid with their goals since it's a shorter period to get them done rather than an entire year, or indefinitely.

Laura Galebe, an influencer and the self-proclaimed "CEO of Glow-up Series," posts videos to her social media accounts talking about her Winter Arc experience. She used the time to commit to "walking every day, journaling, and sticking to (her) skincare and wellness routines."

"I found it very transformative

both mentally and physically," Galebe says. "The consistent movement helped me stay energized and the structure made the season feel a lot less heavy."

# How can you participate?

Although some say the Winter Arc challenge can begin in October, it's never too late to start. According to Alex Rothstein, an exercise psychologist with the New York Institute of Technology, the best way to dive in is to carve out time each day to work on your goals.

"If you make sure to actively plan and schedule each commitment," Rothstein says, "you will have an easier time adhering to the program."

He also recommends setting reasonable, realistic goals that are achievable from day to day. "Recognize that if unforeseen circumstances cause you to miss a day or miss a specific goal in a day, it does not mean you failed the entire process," he says. "You should be willing to pick up where you started the next day."

Galebe recommends finding ways to make fitness "cozy and convenient" in the cold winter months.

"If the thought of heading to the gym in freezing weather is demotivating, consider at-home workouts or joining a heated indoor Pilates or yoga studio," she says. "Another tip is to reframe movement as self-care. Winter is tough on your body and mind so I treat my walks or workouts as part of keeping my overall mental and physical health in check."

To recap:

Set realistic, attainable goals.Plan out your routine and find

the time in your schedule in ad-

—Be okay with missing a day,giving yourself the space to pick up

where you left off.

—Find cozy and convenient ways to stay active in the colder months.

What's the point?

Elliot Berkman, a professor of psychology at the University of Oregon, says that goal progress, rather than simply goal attainment, is psychologically beneficial. He says it can provide "positive emotion, a sense of purpose and meaning as

well as agency and autonomy."

When it comes to goal-setting in a short, specific period of time, like the Winter Arc, he says those parameters can be helpful. "Putting a time bound on a goal can improve the chances the goal is achieved. It's easier to maintain motivation if you know that you get to stop at some point as opposed to feeling like you need to keep up the hard work indefinitely, which can be demotivating."

Some on social media have made comparisons between short-term fitness challenges and crash diets, with the idea being that once the challenge stops, one could return to unhealthy habits. But experts say that's not necessarily true.

"If the challenge is used to help establish new and healthier habits for long term health and wellness, than the challenges are exceptionally useful to help guide and motivate to create these changes," Rothstein says. He recommends making a plan toward the end of the challenge to continue keeping up with your goals in an attainable and realistic way.


