
During the show, Buble' said, "Dude, if that's how you sound when you're a little nervous, then dude,

"It was a good year, it was a busy year," Woolery said. "It seems like every year is busy and we've been a little shorthanded, but we're used to that, nobody wants to go into law enforcement anymore. These folks do a lot of calls and do quality work."

Are you loud or just a bad sport?

I have been to a lot of school sporting events. More than your average Midwesterner, even. My mother was a high school teacher, so I've been attending youth athletic games since I was old enough to be dolled up in a tiny school spirit outfit.

I have a large, close family with upwards of twenty first cousins whose games I've watched over the span of four decades. I played basketball, softball and soccer during my own school years, and I attended many other games as part of the pep band. When I graduated high school, I joined Marching Mizzou, and I didn't miss a home football game for four years.

I have seen a lot of poor sportsmanship in that time.

Parents and spectators who get thrown out of gymnasiums. Hecklers — some funny, some dumb. Players who mouth off to referees. Refs who mouth off to players. Flagrant fouls, near fistfights, and about as many drunken, belligerent Big 12 fans as you'd ever care to meet. (Oklahoma had the worst fans, K-State was always reliably classy.)

But one thing I never encountered until this year was someone who vocally tried to make excuses for their own insufferable behavior. My family and I attended a local game, and I began to get rather uneasy when the individual behind us started in with angry shouting at everything under the sun before the first quarter had even ended.

At one point I looked back in annoyance, and Yelly McYellerson's spouse met my eye: "If you're going to sit here, just know that [Name] is going to be loud," the

person said.

I stifled a snort.

I know what loud is. Loud is eight uncles, nine aunts and twenty-something cousins all fighting to be heard in a holiday din. It's 70,000 fans and a 200-piece marching band at Faurot Field. It's me – I inherited a big, booming voice that carries well, causing my parents to refer to me as Foghorn for much of my childhood. This loudness has gotten me in trouble over the years, and I've had to work hard to modulate my tone so that I'm not totally annoying to the people around me. Because I also know what obnoxious is. I've shouted and heckled with the worst of them. But as I've grown and matured, I've come to understand that what's witty and excusable for a pep club or college crowd is embarrassing and shameful for adults attending a youth game. There's a difference between being loud and being a loser. Here are some dividing lines:

tioned above, what's acceptable in a crowd of thousands could be totally inappropriate for a small gymnasium where your voice carries easily.

1. Setting: As I men-

For example, when I attended Mizzou games, the student crowd could roar, "KILL HIM! BREAK HIS LEGS!" on the punt return and be totally drowned out. If you tried to pull that at a peewee football game, you'd be beaten up by the player's parents, and you'd deserve it.

- 2. Age of athletes: The outfielders at a professional baseball game get paid the big bucks to ignore insults and hecklers. The student athletes at your local baseball game aren't even done developing, emotionally or morally. There is never an excuse for shouting something personal or critical at a minor in a sports setting. If it's at your own child, that's even more shameful.
- 3. Timing: High spirits are understandable at a close game or during a pivotal play. But if the game is a blowout (or hasn't started) it's time to tone it down. If you're still shouting your head off when the stakes are low, you're making a pest of yourself and teaching your peers not to take you seriously, even when you have a good point.
- 4. Content: Nobody ever got in trouble for yelling, "Defense!" or "YEAH!" But personal insults, angry criticisms, and pointed curse words are all lemon behavior, especially at a game where children can hear you.
- 5. Nuance: What if the referee is wrong? They often are. Some of the worst game behavior I've ever seen came from high school athletic officials. But arguing a call is a delicate art, and you're not going to help your team's chances by insulting the ref. If he's really that blind, you can't help him, and if he's really that unfair, your two cents is just going to add to the punishment your team is receiving. Ref criticism is like hot pepper – use it tastefully and sparingly or it gets disgusting

All these bullet points can be summed up in one final flourish. Is your behavior helping your favorite athlete? When you go to her game, is it all about her and her teammates? Or is it all about you and what you want to say? Is your team proud to have you as their representative? Or do they secretly cringe every time you turn up? Being a public sports fan comes with a certain set of responsibilities. Be loud, be proud, but don't be a loser.

that the Thayer district spends less per student than someplace like Ladue in St. Louis. And Thayer kids don't have the advantages of larger schools, such as foreign language classes, and, when I was there, advanced math.

The state also uses federal funds to make sure that all students have equal access to public education. This means that kids who have developmental delays or learning disabilities have IEPs (Individual Education Plans), which help them navigate better through school. Without federal funding, these students probably won't get the extra help they need. And vouchers? They may help some, but vouchers will take money away from public education, and private schools don't have to take all students, leaving those with learning problems to the underfunded public schools.

But by all means, take the federal government out of it.

I could have written about many more head-shaking moments in the past week, but I have to stop now. I'm hoping I won't have to use the randomizer anymore. But I'm not holding my breath.

Different isn't the same as wrong

When our three college kids are home for a visit and we go out to eat, we follow a protocol. We usually ask for a big booth and slide into it in a particular order - with our two left-handed kids sitting together. Over the years, we've learned that when a lefty sits to the right of a righty, elbows collide. So, we've learned to arrange ourselves to give everyone room to move, no matter which hand holds the fork.

I love lefties, partly because I'm the mother of two of them and because the history of left-handedness is so interesting. Only about 10 percent of the human population is left-handed, which means there are more than 700 million left-handed people in a world of more than seven billion. Even dogs and cats have a "paw preference," and one study shows that more than 30 percent of dogs and cats are lefties, too.

Scientists have been studying left-handedness for a long time now, but they still don't completely understand it. They do know that genetics play a role. But I can tell you from experience that two right-handed parents like Tom and me can have one right-handed kid and two left-handed ones.

Fascinated by the mys-

tery of it, I once asked my parents and Tom's parents if any of their parents were left-handed. That's when I learned that Tom's dad (who I thought was right-handed) was born left-handed and had been "retrained" to use his right hand when he started school.

These days, forcing a kid to use his non-dominant hand seems like an absurd and even cruel thing to do. Forcing a change never even crossed my mind when I realized that two of my toddlers were reaching for Cheerios with the left hand versus the right. It just didn't matter.

But for centuries, trying to force change toward conformity was regularly done because people made up crazy ideas about what it meant to be left-handed. They feared differences that didn't matter, and that fear even crept into languages. The

word "sinister" originates from Latin and translates to the word "left." In the Middle Ages, sometimes left-handed people were actually burned at the stake because they were assumed to be the offspring of witches or devils.

Throughout history, people continued to be so unnerved by a simple difference in hand dominance that teachers were told to "correct" left-handed kids into right-handed ones. In some Asian cultures, the right hand is called "the good hand," and the left is called the "bad" one. Can you imagine what it must have felt like to be a little kid who adults called "wrong" or treated as unacceptable for simply moving in ways that felt natural since birth?

Over and over, scientific studies, common sense, and real-life experience have shown that being left-handed and being right-handed are both natural. Different but natural. Left-handed people aren't trying to hurt anyone or destroy society by grabbing a cup of coffee with the left instead of the right.

Thankfully, in the 1960s and 70s, Americans finally put an end to the foolishness of trying to force kids to be right-handed. It's a shame it took that

long, but it finally happened. We learned that different doesn't equal destructive or demonic. We created left-handed scissors and expanded our minds to accept that right-handed and left-handed people are all just people. Our world is packed with differences and diversity - in plants, animals, people, abilities, landscapes, colors, climates, languages, accents, and cultures yet we all survive on one planet.

Sometimes I wonder if this is one of those lessons human beings will have to keep learning in all areas of life – that different doesn't always mean wrong. That difference can deliver its own blessings and strengths. Two hundred years from now, what biases and conflicts will seem ludicrous to future generations?

I hope they'll look back at the political fights of our current age and wonder why people wasted so much energy and spewed so much hate over a simple difference between left and right.

"We requested and were granted \$50,000 last July to do some work on our two houses here in town," Graff said. "So far we've billed the city \$8,357.89."

Sedalia holds a portion of opioid settlement money and is paying for repair work done at Embassy properties.

"We have pending work still, \$26,872," Graff said. "A lot of that got held up because of weather."

Underlying foundation problems found during the creation of a basement entry at The Embassy have delayed progress on finishing a fence, completing a new classroom, a basement remodel and reworking the roof.

"So, we're asking City Council to grant us an

additional \$100,000," Graff said. "Through the opioid settlement to complete the work that we've described."

Boggess suggested the council take some time to consider The Embassy request.

During the Finance / Administration portion of the meeting, a presentation on FY2026 budget highlights was given by Interim City Administrator Matt Wirt, who showed changes made to the budget a Feb. 24 work session.

"Drones as First Responders, we had left that out in the recommendation and we had talked about possibly reducing it," Wirt said. "We did the best we could at coming up with a number for that, so that is a question there."

Allocations for the program in the budget proposal have been reduced from \$75,000 to \$29,500.

Changes to the committal shelter at Oak Lawn Cemetery also needed to be reflected in the new budget, though the final design is still in question.

Long-term disability insurance for city employees will be purchased Budgeted cost is \$50,000.

A new goose-neck trailer for hauling equipment by street crews was voted into the budget to keep damage from occur-

The FY2025 budget should be finalized by March 17.

The council was asked to approve a construction manager for the city's east side project.

"The next step in that construction process is the construction of the fire station, the fire training center, the aqua center, the bowling alley is to approve the construction manager." Second Ward Councilperson Tom Oldham said. "When we sent out our RFQ (request for quotes) the most qualified to come back was Nobles Construction, tonight we need to approve that agreement for the Construction Manager at Risk."

Under Community Development, the outdoor clock at recently closed Bichsel Jewelry will return to its original home at 217 S. Ohio Avenue.

The measure was presented by City Planner Joleigh Cornine, and approved by the council as a restrictive donation.

"This clock has witnessed generations of Sedalians grow up since 1882," Cornine said. "Thank you to Mr. Robert Walters and Mr. Mark Callis for working together to see the Bichsel clock returned to downtown Sedalia."

Fourth Ward Councilperson Steve Bloess addressed the demolition of a home on North Stewart Avenue and the conversations it created.

"I'm proud of councilwoman [Rhiannon] Foster, I thought it was a good article in the paper." Bloess said. "Mr. Kopp [Community Development Director Bryan Kopp] did a good job, too. We've got a responsibility to explain what's going on and I think they did a good job."

That feeling wasn't universal, and during the Good and Welfare portion of the meeting, Debbie Covington made her feelings known.

Covington was one of eight people to speak during the portion of the meeting.

"You kick an elderly couple out of their home on 325 North Stewart for them to live on the street or in their car, that does not sound safe," Covington said. "You allowed the same house to remain vacant for nine months while squatters ran in and out, tore the house up, left windows and doors open for it to dilapidate rapidly, that is not public safety.

"Rhiannon Foster and Bryan Kopp, you used your position of power to influence Chris Howell with the Sedalia Democrat to publish an article full of lies and misinformation. An entirely different type of abuse of the public health."

Mayor Andrew Dawson and Second Ward Councilman Chris Marshall were not present.

Emergency Management hosts Subby's Weather Talk at Junior High

Pettis County Emergency Management hosted a severe weather seminar and radar technology class Tuesday, March 4, at Smith-Cotton Junior High School.

Featured speaker Jim Sublette with Subby's Weather Talk explained the dynamics of storm formation and the various radar systems used in their detection.

A gathering of around 20 people interested in weather forecasting watched Subby's presentation on the websites and apps he likes to predict tornados, hail, snow and

torrential rain. "We're kicking off Severe Weather Awareness Week," Pettis County Emergency Management Director Trisha Rooda said. "I thought it would be neat to have a training on how to look at a radar, a better understanding of what we're looking at on

our apps on our phone." Sublette walked the audience through the atmospheric conditions needed to create a storm, the use of modern radar technology, how each system works and the most useful software and mobile apps.

"I ran across Subby's page last year and then I found out that he started working part-time for Henry County's Emergency Management program," Rooda said. "I said, 'hey, would you mind coming to Pettis County sometime in March next year? So, I've had it planned. I like his page because it catches some of the storms in southern Pettis County because he's focused on like Clinton, in Henry County. I just think it benefits us too on some of the storms."

Sublette told the Democrat he has been a weather tracker for years.

'Weather has been my passion ever since I was seven years old and my mother still keeps my weather journal back from 1973," Sublette said.

Besides being a talented forecaster, Sublette puts on a number of weather and radar presentations at schools each year.

"Typically, every spring go around, last year I had 13 schools that I went around to in West Central Missouri," Sublette said. "I have a total of 19 this spring extending from Osage Trails and Independence and all the way down to Springfield Public School System."

Sublette keeps his audiences engaged with visual demonstrations and common-sense explanations about weather behavior.

"What I try to do with the kids is keep it interactive," Sublette said. "I bring in a bunch of different elements of the weather; we do everything from an egg in a bottle to a twister in a bottle."

Sublette said many children discover an interest in meteorology after just one of his presentations.

"We do all these experiments and to see their eyes light up when they see something happen that they've never seen before," Sublette said. "Matter of fact, I had a couple teachers reach out to me and they thought, 'Well, now I've got a classroom with 12 kids, and they all want to be meteorologists. If I can get kids interested in the weather and the science and get them into something other than Pokémon, I feel like I have succeeded."







Lincoln boys prevail against St. Paul Lutheran in Class 2 sectional

LINCOLN — Before its Class 2 sectional game against St. Paul Lutheran, Lincoln boys basketball set a goal of what it wanted the final score to be.

The Cardinals achieved that mark almost exactly, defeating the Saints 47-46 on Monday, March 3, at Lincoln High School.

"We had said before the game that we wanted to win 46-45," Lincoln head coach Tyler Burke said. "All year long, we've held our opponents to 10-12 points below their average. They average 55 points. So, we thought, 'OK, if we can hold them to 45, [we just got to] figure out how to score 46.' The kids were pretty impressed when we got back to the locker room and we won 47-46. That was our goal and we got it done."

Lincoln struggled to get its offensive motor started for much of the game, but junior Ben Eckhoff provided a spark by making a basket and drawing a foul at the 5:39 mark of the fourth quarter.

The play was the start of a 16-3 run the Cardinals used to turn a 34-28 deficit into a 44-37 lead.

"It kind of felt like that turned the game back in our direction," Burke said of Eckhoff's and-one. "We had that bucket there to cut it to three or four and then turned around and hit a three to cut it to one. So, we gained a lot of confidence."

Following Eckhoff's basket and missed free throw, junior Dawson Parrott hit a 3-pointer, junior Braydn Benham scored a layup and junior Riley Sanders sank a pair of free throws to put Lincoln up 37-34 with 3:18 remaining.

St. Paul freshman Samuel Moenkhoff made a 3-pointer to tie the game back up at 37 with

2:55 to play.

After that, Benham sank a triple, Parrott made a layup and Sanders scored a basket to give the Cardinals (22-4) a seven-point lead with 1:02 left.

"We've been in a lot of close games this year and we've won most of them," Burke said. "So, we felt pretty confident that if we could just get it down to the end and not have a six, eight-point deficit, we felt like we could win."

The Saints (21-6) made a push in the final minute through a 9-2 run that tied the game at 46 with about 20 seconds to play.

Parrott was fouled on the Cardinals' next possession, which sent him to the free-throw line where he went 1-for-2 to put Lincoln up 47-46 with 13.4 seconds left.

Lincoln forced and earned a jump ball on St. Paul's next possession, making the Saints foul in order to extend the game.

However, the Cardinals missed a pair of free throws with three seconds left.

After a timeout, St. Paul inbounded the ball from under its own basket, but Parrott picked off the pass to end the game.

Moustakas to retire with Royals

SURPRISE, Ariz. — Mike Moustakas is going to retire with Kansas City after spending 13 years in the majors and winning the World Series with the Royals in 2015.

The Royals announced Moustakas' retirement on Monday. The 36-year-old infielder will sign a oneday contract with his first big league team on May 31, and he will be honored before Kansas City's home game against Detroit that day.

Moustakas hit .247 with 215 homers and 683 RBIs in 1,427 games, also playing for Milwaukee, Cincinnati, Colorado and the Los Angeles Angels. The three-time All-Star appeared in his last major league game with the Angels on Sept. 30, 2023.

Moustakas was the No. 2 overall pick in the 2007 amateur draft. He broke into the majors with Kansas City in 2011.

He became a key performer for the Royals during a memorable stretch for the franchise. He hit .284 with 22 homers and 82 RBIs in 147 games in 2015, helping the team win the AL Central. Then he drove in eight runs in the postseason as the Royals won the World Series for the first time since 1985.

Moustakas bashed a career-high 38 homers for Kansas City in 2017. He set a career best with 95 RBIs while playing for the Royals and Brewers in 2018.

Central Missouri's Tilley tabbed MIAA Freshman of the Year

entral Missouri men's basketball guard Kyran Tilley was named as the MIAA Freshman of the Year, highlighting a pair of two Mules to receive All-MIAA

Tilley is the first UCM athlete to receive the honor. The Mules last had an athlete earn a headlining honor when Ja'Cor Nelson was named as the MIAA Defensive Player of the year in 2021-22.

Tilley, who appeared in 27 games including 23 starts in the regular season, was one of two Mules to average double-figure scoring with 10.4 points per game.

Tilley led UCM with 66 assists, an average of 2.4 per game, while sitting second in line with 37 steals. He had a team-best 86.3% success rate at the freethrow.

Tilley surpassed 20 points in a game twice in the regular season, posting 21 on 3-of-8 shooting and a 14-of-15 success rate at the free-throw line in a 70-67 loss to Fort Hays State on Dec. 15 and 20 points on 7-of-12 shooting in a 78-56 win against Missouri Southern on Feb. 27.

Tilley had a season-best eight assists in a 80-70 win over Newman on Jan. 16. He tallied four steals twice, arriving in the win over Newman and a 57-52 loss to Nebraska-Kearney Jan. 30.

Tilley was not named to an All-MIAA team.

Senior DeAirius Barker received All-MIAA Honorable Mention status.

Barker led UCM with 12 points per game and 2.4 rebounds per game. He also had a team-best 60 3-pointers made, 337 points scored and 67 freethrows made.

He crossed double-digit scoring in 18 games, including 35 points in a 72-58 win over

Illinois-Springfield on Nov. 26. Barker appeared in all 28 contests, making 27 starts and aver-

aging 30.3 minutes per game.

Central Missouri finished the regular season with a 14-14, 9-10 MIAA record.

MIAA regular season champion Washburn took three of the five highlight league honors.

Jacob Hanna won the MIAA Defensive of the Year and the first-ever MIAA Newcomer of the Year while Brett Ballard was named as the MIAA Coach of

Pittsburg State's Jordan Frison was named as the MIAA Player of the Year.

Chiefs trade Thuney to Bears

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — The Kansas City Chiefs are trading two-time All-Pro guard Joe Thuney to the Chicago Bears for a fourth-round pick in the 2026 draft, a person familiar with the deal told The Associated Press on

The person spoke on condition of anonymity because the trade had not been finalized.

Wednesday.

The 32-year-old Thuney would have carried a salary cap number of nearly \$27 million next season, unless the Chiefs could have worked out a contract extension. That extension is now expected to come from the Bears, who have been working to retool their offensive line to better protect young quarterback Caleb Williams next season.

On Tuesday, the Bears agreed to send a 2025

sixth-round pick to the Los Angeles Rams for Jonah Jackson, a former Pro Bowl offensive guard. Jackson was drafted by the Detroit Lions, where he had played for new Chicago coach Ben Johnson.

Williams was sacked an NFL-high 68 times last season. The Texans' C.J. Stroud was next with 63 sacks.

Kansas City would have liked to keep the dependable Thuney, who has started all 146 games in his nine NFL seasons. He is a four-time Super Bowl champion, winning two with the Patriots and two with the Chiefs, and has proven to be the consummate team player, even sliding out to left tackle late last season as Kansas City struggled to protect Patrick Mahomes' blind

The trade to Chicago ultimately came down to finances.

By trading Thuney,

the Chiefs freed up \$16 million in much-needed salary cap space to address other needs. They are still in search of a solution at left tackle — a season-long problem that doomed them in their Super Bowl loss to Philadelphia along with help at wide receiver, along the defensive line and in the defensive backfield.

The Chiefs placed the franchise tag on Pro Bowl offensive guard Trey Smith on Tuesday, which equates to a one-year deal worth about \$23.4 million for next season — unless the sides work out a longterm deal. That effectively makes Smith the highest-paid guard in the NFL next season. And when his salary is combined with the four-year, \$72 million deal that center Creed Humphrey signed last fall, the Chiefs have tied up a huge chunk of their cap space in their offensive

Meanwhile, the Chiefs have several options to replace Thuney already on the roster.

Mike Caliendo finished the season at his spot once Thuney moved to tackle, though he struggled mightily against the Eagles in the Super Bowl. They also drafted interior lineman Hunter Nourzad in the fifth round of last year's draft.

The most intriguing possibility, though, may be Kingsley Suamataia, whom the Chiefs drafted in the second round last April in the hopes that he could play left tackle. Suamataia struggled at that position early in the year and was summarily benched, but the Chiefs began to try him at guard during practice and he seemed to flourish at the new spot down the stretch.

The Chiefs are expected to take another swing at addressing the left tackle position in the April draft.

Chargers release Bosa after nine seasons

The Los Angeles Chargers released Joey Bosa on Wednesday night, ending the linebacker's nine-season tenure with the franchise.

The move, which came less than a week before the start of the new league year, was expected due to Bosa's large salary cap number and injury history. Bosa had a cap number of \$36.47 million for the 2025 season, but the Chargers will save \$25.36 million in cap space.

Bosa was the third overall pick by the Chargers in the 2016 NFL draft and was the last player on the roster from when the team played in San Diego. He signed a five-year extension worth \$135 million in 2020 that made him the league's highest-paid defensive player at the time.


Bosa played in 14 games with nine starts this past season after agreeing to restructure his contract. But his five sacks were his fewest in the six seasons during which he has played at least 12 games as he battled hip and back injuries.

After seeing action in 16 games in 2021, Bosa saw the field for only 14 games combined in the 2022 and '23 season. He missed most of 2022 because of a groin injury, but returned late in the year. He was sidelined the final seven games in 2023 with a foot injury.

Bosa's 72 sacks are tied for 10th most in the NFL since he entered the league and are second in franchise history.

With Bosa's release, the Bolts will put a bigger emphasis on trying to re-sign linebacker Khalil Mack, who is an unrestricted free agent for the first time in his 11-year career.

Tuli Tuipulotu, who led the Chargers with 8 1/2 sacks this past season, is expected to move into a starting spot with Bosa's departure.



he magic of The Little Mermaid" will be presented in a musical by Smithton R-VI School students on Friday, March 7, and Saturday, March 8.



Trade tariffs squeeze US Farmers amid global retaliation

U.S. farmers are bracing for economic uncertainty as newly imposed trade tariffs spark retaliatory measures from key agricultural trading partners.

The Trump administration recently announced a 25% tariff on imports from Canada and Mexico, along with a 10% tariff on certain goods from China. In response, these nations have enacted countermeasures targeting American agricultural exports, leaving farmers vulnerable to shifting global markets.

The agricultural sector, heavily reliant on exports, is feeling the immediate effects of these tariffs. Soybean, corn and wheat producers are particularly at risk as China, one of the largest importers of U.S. crops, has imposed tariffs on American-grown grains.

Drought is costing

Missouri agriculture

With China historically purchasing billions of dollars' worth of soybeans from U.S. farmers, any disruption in trade flows could have long-term financial consequences for the industry.

The impact of these trade policies extends beyond row crops. The dairy and meat industries are also caught in the crossfire, with Canada and Mexico implementing duties on American cheese, beef, and pork products.

These tariffs threaten to slow U.S. agricultural exports, increasing supply domestically and potentially lowering prices for farmers already operating on tight margins.

Market analysts warn that these tariffs could lead to a decline in farm incomes as producers struggle to find alternative markets. While some countries, such as Brazil and Argentina, may step in to

fill the supply gap left by American exports, U.S. farmers could face long-term consequences if buyers establish new, more stable supply chains elsewhere.

"Exactly how strong our economy is over time has a lot to do with U.S. consumers' comfort with continuing to go out to restaurants and continuing to buy washers and dryers and just that general activity. And a lot of what we're talking about here is probably going to slow some of that," said Glynn Tonsor, an agricultural economist at Kansas State University.

Agricultural leaders across the country are urging policymakers to negotiate trade deals that protect farming interests.

While President Donald Trump told farmers in his State of the Union Address on Tuesday, March 4 to "have fun" selling their products domestically,

many farmers who rely on international sales argue that tariffs disrupt a delicate balance, making it difficult to plan for future planting and production cycles. With global commodity prices fluctuating, uncertainty in the trade landscape adds another layer of financial strain.

Federal officials have indicated that relief programs may be expanded to offset potential losses for farmers affected by the tariffs.

However, past assistance programs during previous trade disputes have received mixed reviews from the farming community, with many arguing that financial aid does not fully compensate for lost market access and long-term damage to trade relationships.

In the meantime, farmers continue to monitor developments, hoping for a resolution that will stabilize international trade.

surface. Missouri has been hit hard by drought during the past three consecutive years, he says. In 2024, the state recorded its 11th-driest August-to-October period ever, based on data going back to 1895. That followed 2023, when the state had its 7th-driest May-November on record, and 2022, when Missouri had its 15th-driest June-Sep-

By the end of October 2024, most of southwestern Missouri was in drought condition D3, indicating extreme drought, according to the U.S. Drought Monitor. Stone, Barry,

tember on record.

Hickory and Lawrence counties in southwestern Missouri's forage and cattle stronghold all had rainfall deficits of 6 inches or more from August to October.

By the end of November, the waterspouts had turned back on, and most of the state received an abundance of rainfall. St. Louis had 9.68 inches of rainfall, giving the city its second-wettest November on record. Kansas City, Springfield and Columbia also had above-normal precipitation. Several longstanding one- and two-day November rainfall records were broken on Nov. 4 and Nov. 5, with Mountain Grove in Wright County getting 12.50 inches of rain during the two-day period.

In addition to rainfall shortages, producers of row crops, forages and livestock saw higher temperatures in 2024, with the preliminary annual temperature 3.5 degrees above normal. The year was Missouri's second-warmest in 130 years of records, says Leasor.

Looking to 2025,

Persistent drought costs Missouri ag industry Leasor says La Nina may or may not bring relief. While January and February were colder and snowier for many, most of the state is slightly below average for wintertime precipitation, and springtime moisture will be critical. Typically, La Nina can bring wetter conditions mainly to eastern Missouri, but most of Missouri's current drought areas are to the west. This is also a weak La Nina that is not expected to last long, so there is uncertainty over how much impact La Nina will have on spring

> Leasor notes that the U.S. Drought Monitoring Network has improved communications about drought. The network includes more than 400 scientists from across the U.S. who provide input on local conditions. Through their observations, the network works to understand the science of drought and improve awareness and decision-making about drought, he says.





Saints here and now

Exhibit 1: "I not only locked up many of the saints in prison...but when they were put to death I cast my vote against them" (Acts 26:10).

Exhibit 2; "To ail those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints" (Romans 1:7).

Exhibit 3: "...the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God" (Romans 8:27b).

Exhibit 4: "To the church ... in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints..." (ICorinthians 1.2)

Exhibit 5: "When one of you has a grievance against another, does he dare go to law...instead of the saints?" (I Cor. 6:1)

Exhibit 6: "As in all churches of the saints,..." (I Cor. 14:33b).

Exhibit 7: "All the saints greet you" (II Cor. 13:13).

Exhibit 8: "...to the saints who are in Ephesus..." (Ephesians 1:1b).

Exhibit 9: "...to all the saints in Christ Jesus who are at Philippi...." (Philippians 1:1b).

Exhibit 10: "Greet every saint in Christ Jesus... All the saints greet you, especially those of Caesar's household" (Philippians 4:21-22).

Exhibit 11: "To the saints and faithful brothers in Christ at Colossae...." (Colossians 1:2)

Exhibit 12: "...because the hearts of the saints have been refreshed through you" (Philemon 7b).

In Ephesians 4:11-12, Paul says that Christ gave to the church apostles, prophets, evangelists, and pastor-teachers so that they will "equip the saints for the work of the ministry."

Over the years, the word "saint" has been sinned against, and its popular, modem usage has become mega-morphed. Those who give top priority to the Christian scriptures can help restore the word to its original meaning and usage.

To extricate ourselves from the grip of the word's current usage, we would do well to think through I Corinthians 6:9-11. Please read it aloud. In this passage, the bad news about the Corinthian Christians' pre-conversion lifestyle is contrasted with their redeemed Christian experience, with Paul saying to them, "And such were some of you. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God."

What does that tell us? That saints

are regular folks with an unsavory background, who have been salvaged by the Savior, declared forgiven due to His payment on the cross for their sins, and set apart, made saints, made holy, for His exclusive use and honor.

Researching to write this article triggered a eureka moment for me because I discovered that the word "saints" occurs 11 times in Paul's two letters to the Corinthian church, which is more than in any other New Testament epistle. I couldn't get over the fact that Paul was repeating "saints" to readers with such poor resumes!

Question 1: So, who are saints, according to God's word?

Answer 1: All kingdom of God rejects (see I Cor. 6:9-11) who have admitted their utter, helpless spiritual disqucilifications, and have trusted the One who demonstrated His love on the despicable cross.

Q. 2: Why does it say in the Bible, "The Gospel According to Saint Luke"? if the word "saint" is not used as an honorific?

A. 2: Titles of books, and even subheadings, in the Bible are added by editors or pubhshers, and are not part of the inspired word of God. Bible publishers who believe that certain persons deserve that honor-prefix use it. Publishers that do not hold to that view refrain from using "saint" in any book title in the Bible.

Q. 3: If we want to give special honor and recognition to either a Bible person, like Jeremiah or Peter, or later church VIPs, like Augustine or Martin Luther, how do we show it?

A. 3: Some of these persons are so highly esteemed that adding the common Bible word (saint), used to describe regular Christ followers, in front of their names will not add any more status to them.

I use Prophet Jeremiah and Apostle Peter in my speaking and writing. For non-Bible persons I find some other way to distinguish them, like Theologian Augustine, or Reformer Martin Luther.

Using "saints" to describe Christ followers won't cheapen the word; it will only heighten Christians' awareness of their high calling. It should not be a word to identify only an elite minority.

We Christians should gratefully and unashamedly acknowledge our spiritual set-apartedness in our internal communication. Letters I receive from some ministries start out with "Dear Saints." A needed reminder.

A weak Pope Francis thanks people for their prayers 'from the bottom of my heart' in audio message

ROME — A weak and breathless Pope Francis thanked people for their prayers for his recovery in a remarkable audio message broadcast Thursday, the first public sign of life from the 88-year-old pope since he was hospitalized three weeks ago with double pneumonia.

Francis' feeble voice, discernible through his labored breaths and in his native Spanish, was recorded Thursday and broadcast to the faithful in St. Peter's Square who had gathered for the nightly recitation of the

rosary prayer.

"I thank you from
the bottom of my heart
for your prayers for my
health from the square,
I accompany you from
here," he said, his soft
voice piercing the hushed
square. "May God bless

you and the Virgin protect you. Thank you."

The cardinal presiding over the prayer, Cardinal Ángel Fernández Artime, had told the crowd at the start of the service that he had "beautiful news, a beautiful gift" to share. The clearly surprised crowd broke into applause and then applauded again after Francis' final "Gracias." Fernández Artime, for his part, bowed his head as he listened.

For anyone used to hearing Francis' voice, which is often so soft it sounds like a whisper, the audio was an emotional punch to the gut that hammered home just how sick he is.

The 88-year-old pope has chronic lung disease and had part of one lung removed as a young man.

The Vatican has given twice-daily updates on Francis' medical condition, but has distributed no photos or video of him since the morning of Feb. 14, when he held a handful of audiences at the Vatican before being admitted to Rome's Gemelli hospital for what was then just a bad case of bronchitis.

The infection progressed into a complex respiratory tract infection and double pneumonia that has sidelined Francis for the longest period of his 12-year papacy and raised questions about the future of his papacy.

Doctors on Thursday reported that Francis was in stable condition, with no new respiratory crises or fever. He continued his respiratory and other physical therapy Thursday, worked, rested and prayed from the 10th floor papal suite at Rome's Gemelli hospital.

Given the continued stability of Francis' condition, doctors said they didn't expect to provide a new medical update until Saturday. His prognosis remains guarded, meaning he is not out of danger.

The pope has been sleeping with a non-invasive mechanical mask to guarantee that his lungs expand properly overnight and help his recovery. He has been transitioning to receiving high-flow oxygen with a nasal tube during the day. His routine now includes physical therapy, along with treatment for double pneumonia and respiratory therapy, Vatican officials said.

The 88-year-old pope has been stable for three full days after suffering a pair of respiratory crises Monday.

The pope was sup-

posed to attend a spiritual retreat this weekend with the rest of the Holy See hierarchy. On Tuesday, the Vatican said the retreat would go ahead

without Francis but in "spiritual communion" with him. The theme, selected before Francis got sick, was "Hope in eternal life."

Ban on use of food stamps for candy, soda debated by Missouri lawmakers

Low-income Missourians who receive food assistance would be prohibited from buying soda and candy with their benefits under a bill debated Tuesday.

The bill, sponsored by state Rep. Jamie Gragg, a Republican from Ozark, would restrict food purchases under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, previously called food stamps, if approved by the federal government.

The bill would "get us back to where the original program was meant to go," Gragg argued in Tuesday afternoon during a hearing of the House Committee on Government Efficiency. "The program's been bastardized."

The purpose of the SNAP program is to help low-income families supplement their grocery budgets to afford nutritious food. As of last month, over 320,000 households in Missouri received SNAP benefits, loaded onto electronic benefits transfer cards used to purchase groceries. The average value of benefits per household was \$396.

Proponents argue that taxpayer dollars, through the SNAP program,

Opponents called the proposal government overreach — limiting low income families' freedom to choose their food — and overly broad, potentially banning SNAP access for things like granola bars and electrolyte drinks.

State Rep. Jim Murphy, a Republican from St. Louis, asked whether "any pre-process food could be deemed unhealthy" and added to the list of banned purchases.

"Do we want to be the nanny state that says, 'you can eat this and you can't eat that?" Murphy said. "Where does that end?"

Rep. Darin Chappell, a Republican from Rogersville, said the list of unhealthy foods could keep growing.

"My concern is we can add to this list ad infinitum," Chappell said. "The United Nations tells us that red meat is a carcinogen...at what point do we stop micromanaging this list?"

Similar bills have been proposed in other states, including Arizona, West Virginia, Idaho and Kansas.

Robert F. Kennedy, Jr., health and human services secretary, has said he supports restricting SNAP for junk food, and the agriculture secretary, Brooke Rollins, has signaled interest.

The conservative national think tank Foundation for Government Accountability has helped push for the change.

"Food stamps have fueled the junk food epidemic, with soda ranking as the number one commodity bought with food stamps," Gragg told the committee — a direct quote from a report published by the Foun-

dation for Government Accountability earlier this year.

James Harris, a lobbyist for the Foundation for Government Accountability, called the bill common sense.

"If this were to pass and it helps one child have a little more milk or something of actual nutrition in their home, that's great," Harris testified. "... This just would allow Missouri to hopefully help some children have access to more nutritional food, besides maybe what they get at school."

Those testifying in opposition included the progressive anti-poverty nonprofit Empower Missouri, along with industry groups such as the Missouri Chamber of Commerce and Industry, the Missouri Grocers Association and the Missouri Beverage Association.

Nationally, beverage groups have been lobbying to keep sodas in the

program, the Wall Street Journal reported late last year.

A 2016 report from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, which oversees SNAP, found that the households that rely on the program have similar spending patterns to non-SNAP households. For both SNAP and non-SNAP households, the report stated, "more money was spent on soft drinks than any other item." SNAP households spent 5% of their grocery budget on soft drinks, and non-SNAP households spent 4%. The percent spent on candy, 2%, was the same between both groups.

The bill defines candy as a food product "containing sugar, honey, or other natural or artificial sweeteners in combination with chocolate, fruit, nuts, or other ingredients or flavorings in the forms of bars, drops, or pieces."

It defines a soft drink as "nonalcoholic beverages that contain natural or artificial sweeteners" but does not contain milk or milk substitutes or beverages that are more than 50% fruit or vegetable juice by volume.

The definition would prevent the purchase of Powerade with SNAP funds, but allow sugary bottled coffee drinks with milk, said Katie Gamble, a lobbyist for Missouri Beverage Association.

State Rep. Dean Van Schoiack, a Republican from Savannah, said it seems that granola bars would fall under the candy definition, "and I always thought they were supposed to be healthy."

Christine Woody, director of food policy for Empower Missouri, said individuals could cross the border into neighboring states and spend their SNAP dollars on banned items there.

She added that a better strategy would be to encourage the purchase of healthy food, by "really investing in some of the programs that are successful." Woody pointed to two programs that offer incentives to purchase fruits and vegetables, the Double Up Food Bucks program and the Seniors Farmers Market Nutrition Program.

Those opposed said any changes should be federally decided, rather than having each state determine what is healthy or not.

Missouri would submit a waiver to the federal government requesting this change, if the bill is passed, but there's no guarantee it'd be approved. States' previous attempts to limit SNAP purchases in this way have been rejected by the federal government, including because of being complex to implement, having vague standards of what is defined as healthy, and failing to show they would reduce obesity.

No action was taken on the bill Tuesday.

Red Cross reminds residents to test smoke alarms this weekend

"Working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in a home fire in half as you only have about two minutes to safely get out," said JoAnn Woody, Executive Director, American Red Cross of Greater Kansas City and Northwest Missouri. "Every second counts when there's

a home fire and the sooner an alarm alerts you to a fire, the sooner you can get to a safer place. When daylight saving time ends this weekend, test your smoke alarms to help prevent a tragedy in your home."

Just in the month of January alone, local Red Cross volunteers responded to help more than 920 people, in Missouri, affected by nearly 260 home fires, which account for most of the about 65,000 disasters that the Red Cross responds to annually across the



Gerke added that they made some of the costumes for the show and purchased some. She noted she's thankful to the Liberty Center

An unmistakable mark left by Fleming was her advocacy for women in scientific fields, as well as equitable pay.

"In her time, the rate of Harvard women's pay was about 60 percent that of the men in the same job," Bahner said. "Today it's, in general, about 85.3 percent. Mina would still find this unacceptable!"

At \$1,500 per year, Fleming made good money "for a woman," Bahner said. "...Mina had left school at the age of 14 in order to work as a teaching assistant because her family's economic state made it necessary. If she had stayed in teaching, she would have made \$700 per year; as Pickering's maid, much less than that."

Despite the separation of time, Bahner admits to feeling a kindredship to her character.

"I'd love to just hang out with her," Bahner said. "We share many interests and opinions. Reading her journal, getting a feel for her personality-I think she and I would have made good friends."

Dynisha Hawkins, who plays renowned suffragette and astronomer Annie Jump Cannon, marveled at her bravery.

"I believe that Annie got in trouble for being a suffragette. I believe that she spoke her mind, but just like with the play (version of) Annie, that the confidence she had in herself being in an old man's world didn't necessarily bother her," Hawkins said. "She wanted the same rights as them, but instead of letting it get her down, she used it as her power."

Cannon's inherent confidence was likely instilled by her forward-thinking mother, who encouraged her daughter's love of math and science.

"Not only was their connection with the stars, math and science part of their bond; I believe it was her mother's dream for herself that she could not achieve," Hawkins said. "So she made sure her daughter achieved it. Annie and her mother shared that passion."

In addition to her work in astronomy, Cannon was known for her keen eye for photography.

"She was a well known photographer," Hakins said. "She had a book of her published works. Annie actually took time off of school and just traveled and took photographs until her mother passed away."

Pursuing a non-traditional life for the time period almost seemed her destiny, Hawkins explained.

"I think a degree would have always been in her future," Hawkins said. "I don't know if it had been for her mother if the science degree would have come first, (but) the passion for the stars was always there. I think that if her mother hadn't pushed her there would have been more of a chance for her to discover things about herself, and with her brain, who knows what she could have discovered."

For her own curiosity, Hawkins wonders if Cannon did, indeed, desire more.

When asked if he could ask her character anything, she replied, "You did so much with your life. I've always wondered why you did not want to have a family? What turned you against that notion? I truly believe that during that time a woman's mind frame was that maybe she could have it all. Why didn't you

want to have it all?"

Trinady Klemme, who plays Henrietta's fictionalized sister in "Silent Sky," brings a traditional woman's role to life through Margaret Leavitt. While Margaret may not be a true historical figure, Klemme feels she represents women content with homemaking.

"I don't think (she) envied the independent lifestyle (Henrietta) created," Klemme said. "I think she was...very pleased by her family, music, and church being the center of her life"

Still, Klemme speculates how a real-life sister of Henrietta's may have felt about Williamina, a fellow mother who became close to her

"I think part of her envied Henrietta's relationship with Williamina as well as what she perceived as a lack of responsibility since she didn't have kids (and) family to care for," Klemme said.

And while a woman like Margaret may have been happy in her circumstances, carving out a small space of her own would likely be in order by today's standards, Klemme said.

"I think Margaret would pursue a more serious career in music," Klemme said. "I do think that she would still hold her morals of the importance of family and the church but I think she would be more outgoing and creative in her life. I would love to get to know the story of how she became so confident in her faith and if she ever struggles."

"Silent Sky" premiers Friday, March 7 at 7:30 with another evening show Saturday, March 8 at 7:30. A matinee will be performed Sunday, March 9 at 2:00. Tickets are \$17 for adults, \$15 for seniors, and \$12 for students.


