WCHS Coach Frasier looking to seniors to lead

As the 2022 high school football season begins, Warrior head coach Mark Frasier is looking forward to continuing to build the White County program with players who have a long history together.

"Many of these seniors have played since they were very young," Frasier said about his team that will take the field under the Friday Night Lights. "They are bonded and have a love for the game and hold each other accountable."

Frasier is looking for his seniors to lead the Warriors toward the team goal of being competitive every game and keeping the team in a position to be successful each and every time they take the field. In addition to the team's seniors, Fraiser has marked a couple of underclassmen that he is putting the pressure on to step up and be team leaders as the program moves forward. "Owen Adams is a junior that plays

with great intensity. Tripp Pinion's ability and willingness to learn is an asset," Frasier listed two of the players he is expecting to step up this season, and then identified an area that he and his staff has been focusing on during the pre-season. "We lost many key offensive linemen and some guys in secondary, and we have been working on filling those spots."

Frasier said that he hopes to see the Warriors grow on and off the field this year, increasing their skills as well as becoming stronger teammates as the season progresses and said that the future of White County Football is looking bright.

"Our program has grown tremendously over the last four years," he said, adding that having players come to the high school with experience is making the program that much stronger and positioning the team for better performances. "Both our middle school and high school programs are at max capacity for the equipment that we have."



WCMS coach balances high expectations and hard work

Warrior head coach Aaron Brown said that despite his squad being pegged as the front runners in the conference, his goal for the White County Middle School football team is the same this season as any other season.

"I expect to give the players a positive experience playing a very tough sport while also helping them to become better young men for the community and school system," Brown explained.

The expectations for a successful 2022 season for the WCMS Warriors comes because the team has several key players returning for their eighth-grade season.

"We have five returning starters off of last year's team," Brown said. "They are led by Tucker Pinion at Quarterback, Running backs Cole Sims and Jojo Dowell, as well as Lineman Chris Graver and Allen Brown. Overall, we have about 26 eighth graders."

Brown said that the team has added a couple of newcomers in Carter Seal and Eli Smith, and that while the pair has never played football before, their

athleticism and competitiveness on the basketball court is going to carryover onto the gridiron and that he feels they will be big additions to the team.

"Eli Smith has especially been impressive during the summer," Brown said. "Other eighth graders we are leaning on as contributors this year are Kevin Tollison, Jacob Knowles, and newcomer Jieseyn Suggs. All of which have hit the weight room especially hard this past winter and look to provide our explosive backfield with an imposing line to match."

Brown listed Jack Carpenter, Jack Walker, Eli Sparkman, Landon Kerr, Brian Anderson, Hudson Dodd, Brylee Kelso, Maddox Pratt, and Andrew Joliff as the other eighth graders that he is looking at to contribute significantly during the season.

Brown said that despite the high expectations for the team, he has warned them that nothing is determined until they take the field.

"I have told the players from day one that expectations and potential have never won anything. Do we have the potential to be the best team in the

conference? Perhaps, but no one is just going to let them have it," he said. "We took the mindset from day one during winter workouts that we will outwork everyone on the schedule, and I have repeatedly explained to them that they will get everyone's best shot. They know the second they become complacent, someone will happily humble them."

While Brown has been sure to keep his players grounded and not let them be complacent, he indicated that he has taken the same approach in preparing for the upcoming season, making sure he and his staff are taking the responsibility of having the team game-ready serious.

"Although we do return a very talented group of players, we do have a lot of key positions that have never played in a meaningful game or have not played at all," he said, recognizing the areas that needed the most focus was an important task for himself and his staff. "Due to this, we have taken the players on more 7 on 7 tournaments and lineman challenges in order to give them as much experience around football as

we can. Additionally, we prioritized the weightroom during the winter months in an effort to not only get stronger but give those kids some needed confidence."

Brown credits the Warrior Football program at all levels for being instrumental in developing not only the players he will be putting on the field this year, but those he has had in the past and those he will have in the future, claiming that working as a cohesive program at all levels is going to benefit White County athletes for years to come.

"I work with both the high school and youth programs extensively with the common goal of turning our program into one of the area's top," he said. "As of right now, I think the program from top to bottom (Youth to High School) is in one of the best places it has been in some time. Participation is at an all-time high, our facilities are as good as they have ever been, we have quality coaches at every level instructing kids, and the community support is top tier. There has never been a better time to be involved in White County Football."

Headlined by two juniors and four sophomores, the White County Cross Country Team will be young this season, but that hasn't kept Warriors coach Gregg Seagraves from setting some high goals for his young team.

"We don't have any seniors returning this season, but we are excited about our newcomers," Seagraves said, and then mentioned that the goal for the season was a lofty but attainable. "We want our kids to be better each week

and then peak at the state qualifier."
