WCHS coaches anticipate competitive season for Warriors

The White County High School Warriors will be led by head coach Eric Mitchell for the twentieth consecutive season.

Mitchell will once again be assisted by Montuka Murray and Tyler Hillis who have been by his side for more than half of his tenure at the helm of the Warriors basketball program.

"Montuka Murray, who has been with me for 15 years, is a high IQ guy that understands player psychology and is great at getting players to focus and overcome mental obstacles," Mitchell said. "Tyler Hillis, who has been with me for 11 years, coaches the freshman and junior varsity teams and helps run practices."

Mitchell said that the Warrior coaching staff expects the team to be competitive within their district, which he says is one of the toughest in the state. While he admits that the Warriors will be a young team with a lot of new players, the Warriors staff has set the bar high for them and anticipates them

rising to meet those expectations.

"We lost 90 percent of our production from the past two seasons and last year's state tournament team by graduating six seniors. Almost all of our offense is gone. So, we are working hard to overcome that by being a very good defensive team," said Mitchell.

Mitchell said that the shift to defense being the team's strength rather than trying to out-shoot teams will be key to the Warriors success this year. "We return the district defensive player of the year and have a lot of guys that are willing to scrap and get after it on that end of the floor."

Another challenge the Warriors will face is one they deal with every year: that most of the players are multi-sport athletes and have been involved in football for much of the summer and the fall semester. Not knowing how individual playing skills and shooting abilities have changed is something that the coaching staff will now have to analyze quickly.

"We didn't see a lot of them until the last week or so," Mitchell said about his players.

"Early in the summer, we stressed the need to get better at shooting and that will continue to be an area of focus moving forward."

Mitchell said that he will be relying heavily on junior Tripp Pinion to lead this team on the court and to raise the level of play of his teammates around him.

"Tripp Pinion, right now as a two-year starter and point guard, is the leader of this team. He has earned that position through his on-court play," said Mitchell.

Mitchell described Pinion as a high IQ player, saying that game intelligence is invaluable at the point guard position.

"He is a positive teammate that leads by example. He'll dive on the floor and take charges which sets the example to the rest of the team that if the captain will do the little things, every else had better do them too."

Mitchell said that the road back to the state tournament will be a rough and bumpy ride for the Warriors, but that it isn't an unreachable goal. The Warriors have been picked middle of the pack in both the pre-season coaches and media polls, and the Warriors head coach said that he feels that

is accurate for where his team is at the start of this season.

"This is a very deep league, and with so many young new guys we will have to work hard to get anywhere near the top of this league," Mitchell said. "Last year we went to the state but lost to Upperman in three straight games. They will be very good again this year. Also, Stone Memorial has become quite a big rival for us going back for a decade now. They have one of the best players in the state in Cade Capps. Those games will be a battle."

Mitchell said that along with the work his staff and players put into the Warrior basketball program, he truly appreciates all of the community support that is given to the White County teams.

"The crowd that came out for the state tournament game last season was huge," he said. "This is a wonderful place to coach basketball."

WCHS Warriorette schedule packed with tough battles

The White County High School Warriorettes were picked to finish third this year in both the pre-season coaches' poll and the media poll, but head coach Michael Dodgen says the goal is the same as every year: win a district championship, region championship, and earn a berth at the state tournament.

"This team has some experience coming back that will be very vital to them meeting these expectations, but we also have some youth in areas that we will need to develop throughout the upcoming season," Dodgen said. "Our league is so balanced top to bottom that the teams in our league will be battles when district play starts in January. Winning our home games is a major plus in district play and sneaking road wins will only help our cause."

Dodgen went on to describe the Warriorettes schedule as good as any around and said that every night in January and February will be a battle with as tough as their district is.

"Upperman, Livingston, Stone Memorial, Cumberland County and Dekalb County are five of the toughest teams in the state top to bottom year in and year out, and this year is no exception," Dodgen said. "For girls basketball, we compete in the toughest district and region in the state of Tennessee no matter what classification."

The Warriorette coach said that the Frank's Shootout, hosted in White County on December 19-21, has one of the best fields on the girls' side of the tournament that they have put together in years.

"There will be high-level basketball being played each night of the tournament," he said.

The Warriorettes will have a strong presence at post with seniors Celeste Reed and Pyper Price, who are also co-captains this season, along with Ava Jones. The combination of those three Warriorettes brings a lot of size and depth to the post game for White County.

"These young ladies have been a big part of our team now for the past three years," Dodgen said about seniors Reed and Price who he lists as the team leaders. "We expect

them to continue to lead our players and locker room daily."

The Warriorettes, under Dodgen's guidance for the ninth straight season, are coming back to play after losing five seniors from last year's squad. Not an easy task for any team, especially one that is always expected to be competitive in district play.

"We lost five seniors off last year's team, Nia Powers who scored over 1500 points, KK McDonald who is now playing at Johnson University, Karley Gentry who is now playing at Bryan College, Lexi Golden and KB Frazier," said Dodgen.

Dodgen talked about the biggest challenge the Warriorettes will face this season being one of experience.

"These young ladies were all four-year members of the Warriorette program, and replacing their experience on and off the floor will be a major obstacle for this team."

However, the Warriorette coach said that the challenge of making up for not having as much experience on the courts this season as last is one that his team has set out to overcome.

"This team has done a great job of get-

ting better on shooting the basketball and working on their overall game," Dodgen said. "With our youth and inexperience, this summer we won some games that we should not have probably won and lost a couple games that we should have won, but overall, they got better game by game and competed at very high levels."

Dodgen won't be leading the Warriorettes alone. He will be aided by assistants coaches Shanee Wallace and Dave Walla. Wallace, who has been on the Warriorette coaching staff for some time now and is a former Warriorette herself, will work with the post players and is someone that Dodgen describes as putting a lot of time and work into the program while doing a fantastic job of with involvement throughout the community. Walla, who is joining the Warriorettes for the first time this season, is a former high school coach (both Texas and North Carolina) will bring a lot of experience to White County.
