White County High School Warriors' basketball preview

The White County High School Warriors are heading into the upcoming basketball season with a senior-heavy roster prompting head coach Eric Mitchell, now in his 20th year at the helm, to be optimistic about the team's potential and ability to compete fiercely in a challenging district.

"We should be able to compete in this district, which is very tough," Mitchell said, adding there were a lot of expectations for the senior-loaded team. "And, hopefully we will play well in the region."

The coaching staff plays a crucial role in the Warriors' strategy. Montuka Murray, who has been with Mitchell for over 15 years, excels in the mental aspects of the game, helping players get their mentality in the right place. Meanwhile, Tyler Hillis, with over a decade of experience, focuses

on practice and defensive strategies.

"Montuka is great at the mental side of the game, relating to players, and understanding how to get their mentality in the right place," Mitchell said.

The Warriors are known for their speed and defensive skills, which were apparent last season, and Mitchell expects the team to continue being aggressive along those lines while improving on weaknesses the White County coaching staff identified during the offseason.

"The strength of this team will be its speed and defense," Mitchell explained. "We were very good at those two things last season but struggled to score at times. This year we will continue to lean into those two things as well as being improved on the offensive end."

Over the summer, the team emphasized improving their shooting, although many players were occupied with football com-

mitments, and Mitchell said they haven't been able to get a lot of practice in with those dual-sport student-athletes.

The team's leadership is anchored by four-year starter Tripp Pinion, along-side fellow seniors Gage Stephenson and other key players. Mitchell said Pinion and Stephenson work well together and are capable of motivating their teammates. The Warriors' coach said there is a positive culture among this year's team and the result has been the absence of any problems off the court.

"This is a really good senior bunch that plays hard and works together," Mitchell said.

As the season unfolds, certain matchups are anticipated to be pivotal, with Mitchell identifying Upperman and Stone Memorial as battles the White County teams always look forward to and that he expects the district's top teams to be just as strong as last year. He went on to say that both of those teams were picked ahead of the Warriors in the preseason rankings, due in part to some returning players who are among the top talent in the district, but that he remains confident in the team he will put on the court.

"We are as good as those teams when we play our best. It will just be a matter of staying healthy and making some shots when they're needed," Mitchell said, adding that not finishing as one of the top two teams in the district for the first time in over a decade was something that stung last season. "So, this year to be able to get back to where we want to be we have to go through them."

The goal for the Warriors: reclaim their spot as one of the district's top power-houses. The redemption season begins on Nov, 21 with district playing starting in January.

As the excitement builds for the upcoming basketball season, Coach Michael Dodgen is optimistic about the potential of the White County High School Warriorettes. With 10 years at White County and a total of 24 years coaching basketball, Dodgen is gearing up for another competitive year, especially after last season's impressive 31-4 record and making it to the sub-state level of post-season play.

"We have high expectations for our team this year," Dodgen said. "We have a lot of experience coming back this year and look for them to help lead our younger kids and get better every day."

Dodgen will be supported by assistant coaches Jermaine Jackson and Jaycee Woolbright, both of whom he believes will bring invaluable experience to the team.

"I want both of them to work with our kids every day to make them better basketball players," Dodgen stated, emphasizing the importance of leadership and guidance at the high school level of player develop-

The Warriorettes will be focusing on developing team depth, especially after losing standout players Celeste Reed and Pyper Price to graduation. Reed, who was named Miss Basketball for Class 3A, leaves behind a significant legacy with her 1,500



points and 1,000 rebounds.

"Losing Celeste and Pyper is a big task to overcome," Dodgen said, acknowledging the Warriorettes will be a different team this season. "We will be leaning on several players to handle the leadership not only on the floor but in the locker room."

Among the returning players, senior Ava Jones stands out, who Dodgen said has played at a very high level the past three years. The White County coach said Jones's size and ability to score will give the Warriorettes a good post presence. Dodgen also pointed out juniors Gracie Clark,

Bella Winningham, and Lakelyn Grasty as players he expects to step up this season.

"These three young ladies started every game for us last year," he explained, "and will be counted on heavily to help us get started this year and use their playing experience daily."

Also returning for the Warriorettes are Ashlyn Selby, who Dodgen said came off the bench as a freshman last season and then had a very good summer preparing for this year, Kyra Fox, Kennedy Billings, and Sarah Winfree.

The Warriorettes will face tough com-

petition in their district this season with key games against Upperman, Livingston, Stone Memorial, Cumberland County, and DeKalb county all coming in January.

"Our district schedule is very tough with each team being very good and well-coached," Dodgen said, adding that divisional games will be pivotal in determining their season's success, "It is the best district and Region in the state of Tennessee and this year will be no different."


Dodgen also pointed to the Frank's Shootout, hosted by the White County basketball teams, as one that will bring some great competition to the floor and test his team.

"Frank's Shootout will be a very good tournament that has some very high-level teams coming this year we have Bearden High School, Hutchingson School, South Gibson, York, and Oakland along with other teams," he said.

In the preseason polls, the Warriorettes are seen as strong contenders. The coaches' poll has them tied for first with Upperman, while the media poll places them second.

"This year's district and region will be no different from previous years in terms of competitiveness," Dodgen concluded, emphasizing the high level of play expected but adding that his team is poised to handle both the challenges and opportunities that come their way this season.

As the 2024 basketball season tips off, the White County Middle School Warriorettes, under the leadership of seasoned head coach Marsha Jackson, is gearing up for a challenging year. With 14 years of coaching experience, Jackson is eager to guide the WCMS girls' team through a rigorous schedule.

This season, Jackson is joined by assistant coaches Logan Philips and Lacy Mapes. Philips, who will coach the junior varsity girls, will assist in strategy and player management during games. Mapes, responsible for the 6th-grade girls, will focus on developing fundamental skills and teaching plays essential for future success in the program. Jackson's aspirations for the team are high, but she is confident in the program being built.

As for who the 2024 season leaders will be, Jackson said that the team is stocked with high achievers.

"We have several girls who have worked hard in the off season that will

be key players for us this year. Each girl brings something special for this team," she said. "We have several who are shooters, several who can score on the run, several who are quick and play great defense and a couple who sees the floor very well and a couple who are great rebounders. It is a fun group to coach."

The schedule this year is a particularly tough one for the White County teams, with the addition of formidable Crossville teams and a competitive conference lineup.

"We will have to play our best and hope to come out with a win," Jackson explained, identifying key matchups against Upperman, Prescott, Stone, and Mt. Juliet as potential season changers.

Despite the challenges facing the Warriorettes this season, Jackson believes they have the capability to compete at a high level.

"If we play well, we can definitely be in the top 3 for sure!" she concluded, setting a clear target for the season ahead.


